## SUMMARY OF DIRECT CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES -- PART IX-A

1,323,371 people visited the J. Paul Getty Museum free of charge during FY04. In addition to presenting works of art the permanent collection and temporary exhibitions (a total of 19 during the fiscal year), the Museum provided a wide variety of free interpretive materials, programs, and services on a daily basis. These included printed materials and an audioguide for the galleries, gallery and architecture tours, Art Information Rooms, a Family Room, the Art Access system, an orientation film, and a variety of printed materials including maps and visitor guides. The Museum published 33 new titles during FY04.

In addition to the activities listed above, which are available to all visitors on a daily basis, the Getty Museum provided a variety of other free activities and services. They included:

- 4 large-scale Family Festivals, which featured art-making activities, gallery activities, storytelling, and a lively variety of community-based music, dance, and theater performances related to current exhibitions. Approximately 30,511 people attended during the fiscal year.
- Storytelling, Getty Getaway Days, Artful Weekends, Art Detective Cards and Art Adventures, programs
  offered in English and Spanish, served families with children. A total of 617 visitors were served by
  Storytelling, 6,471 by Getty Getaway Days, 5,341 by Artful Weekends, and 4,285 by Art Adventures. In
  addition, the Family Room, a hub for families during their visit, was entirely redesigned and renovated,
  and reopened in August 2004 for visiting families. During FY04, 102,225 visitors were served in the
  Family Room.
- The School Program served approximately 78,950 students and teachers during FY04. We spent \$98,564 on bus transportation for Title 1 schools, providing approximately 328 bus rentals this year.
- The teacher development programs served local educators and community organizations to help them
  integrate art education into their activities. In FY04, 70 local K-5 teachers participated in the Art &
  Language Arts program, 755 K-12 teachers and chaperones participated in the Teacher Collaboration
  Workshops, and 139 utilized the Teacher Resource Center. The Open Workshops for K-12 teachers had
  99 participants and the English as a Second Language program had 3,110 participants.
- The Museum provided 24 lectures (5,038 attendees), 14 seminars (740 attendees), and 70 Artist-at-Work Demonstrations (5,116 attendees) free of charge.
- The Museum provided gallery tours to 72 community groups (non-profit organizations), totaling 1,806 visitors. Transportation services provided four buses during the course of the fiscal year.
- There were 37 free performing arts programs (27,722 attendees) in FY04 including the series Friday
  Nights at the Getty, Summer Sessions, Garden Concerts for Kids, and Sounds of LA. In addition to free
  performances, there were 17 ticketed performances (4,569 attendees) in FY04 including Gordon Getty
  Concerts, Selected Shorts, and theater performances.

#### **Paintings** Conservation

The Paintings Conservation department carried out work on several recent acquisitions, including Titian's *Portrait of Alfonso d'Avalos*, Murillo's *Vision of St. Francis of Paola*, and Lucas Cranach the Elder's *A Faun*

and his Family. The study and treatment of Salvator Rosa's Allegory of Fortune, which presents numerous difficult conservation issues, was continued.

A number of outside projects were carried out as part of the department's ongoing program of providing conservation services to other institutions. These included study and treatment of a *Self-Portrait* by Sir Joshua Reynolds from the Yale Center for British Art, and completion of the *Mass of St. Gregory* by Rafaellino del Garbo, which was returned for exhibit to the Ringling Museum in Sarasota, Florida.

Work was completed on the treatment of *The Virgin of Belen* by Bartolomé Esteban Murillo from the Portland Art Museum in Oregon. It was placed on exhibit in the galleries for six months prior to its return to Portland.

Development of a support council for the Paintings Conservation department continued. Current membership stands at twenty-three, and critical support was slated for a number of worthy outside projects, as noted below:

• Two very large paintings by Jean-Baptiste Oudry, a *Lion* and a *Rhinoceros*, from the Staatliche Museum in Schwerin, Germany are currently undergoing a complex conservation treatment. The work involves cleaning, consolidating flaking paint, stretching on new strainers, filling, and retouching. The paintings will be displayed in a special exhibition at the Getty planned for spring 2007. The exhibition will travel to the Museum of Fine Arts in Houston prior to return of the two paintings (and the exhibition) to Schwerin.

• Six paintings from the Kröller-Müller Museum in Otterlo, the Netherlands, came to the Getty in the fall of 2003: Tintoretto, *Portrait of a Man*; Pissarro, *The Rainbow*; Cézanne, *Road Leading to a Lake*; Signac, *House Under Construction*; Il Gaetano, *Self-Portrait*; and Cranach, *Portrait of John the Steadfast*. The pictures were accompanied by the conservator from the Kröller-Müller, who worked as a guest in the paintings conservation department for three months at the beginning of the project. The three nineteenth century paintings have been exhibited in the galleries, and will be returned to the Netherlands at the end of October 2004. The three old master paintings will be placed on view once their treatments are completed.

The second volume in the Getty Conservation Institute's *Readings in Conservation* series was edited by Mark Leonard and David Bomford (Senior Restorer, National Gallery, London). Work on the manuscript was completed during FY04, and the manuscript is scheduled for appearance in late 2004.

A protocol was developed by the department outlining procedures to be followed in the event of a chemical attack on paintings collections. The project aimed to better prepare the professional community for such an eventuality. The results of the project have been shared with other museums in the United States and abroad.

All members of the department participated in a variety of symposia and offered specialist and public lectures in a variety of venues, ranging from Yale University to Düsseldorf. A 'Tear Repair Workshop' was held for twenty guest conservators for three days in April of 2004. Instructors included members of the Getty staff, as well as guest professors from Dresden and Houston.

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#### **Paper Conservation**

Hundreds of objects from the Getty Museum's collections were conserved and prepared for display in the 12 annual rotating exhibitions of Photographs, Manuscripts, and Drawings:

Nine Teske photographs, on loan to the Getty Museum from the Teske Archives, were conserved by the Department and consequently included in the *Teske* exhibition. Paper Conservation also participated in numerous special exhibitions beyond the rotating exhibition schedule, such as the Richard Ross Villa photographs show.

One of the largest projects undertaken by the Department of Paper Conservation in FY04 was the conservation work for the exhibition *Photographers of Genius*. This was the first special exhibition at the museum drawn entirely from the museum's own collections, in this case the photographs collections. All of the photographs conservators, including Ernie Mack, Martin Salazar, and Marc Harnly, and Mountmaker Lynne Kaneshiro devoted hundreds of hours to this exhibition. The work included the conservation treatment of over 70 photographs for the exhibition and catalogue; the matting and framing of 170 photographs; and the design and fabrication of mounts for numerous books, albums, and stereographs.

Another large project for the department in FY04 was the course Damaged and Deteriorated Photographs Compensation for Loss. Paper Conservation hosted and coordinated this weeklong workshop that was one of an ongoing series of courses in photographs conservation funded primarily by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. This particular workshop brought together 25 conservators from thirteen countries to study the important subject of inpainting practices and techniques for photographs.

Martin Salazar and Marc Hamly began a research project on the photographs of Gustave Le Gray and the coatings found on them. This was done as a contribution for the upcoming publication *Coatings on* 

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*Photographs.* This project examined the large collection of Le Gray photographs in the JPGM collections as well as other notable collections, including the Biblioteque Nationale de France, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, Musee d'Orsay, Mediateque de Paris, the Victoria & Albert Museum, the National Galleries of Scotland, and the Harry Ransom Center in Austin. A major component of this study was the scientific analysis of over fifty Le Gray prints in the Getty Museum's collection in collaboration with Dusan Stulik of the Getty Conservation Institute.

In association with *Illuminating the Renaissance*, which was first exhibited at the Getty Museum in FY03 before traveling to the Royal Academy in London in FY04, Nancy Turner delivered several lectures:

- The Suggestive Brush: Painting Techniques in Flemish Manuscripts from the Collection of The J. Paul Getty Museum at the 2-day international symposium held at the Getty in September 2003, "Illuminating the Renaissance: Burgundian Identities, Flemish Artists, and European Markets." Nancy's talk was met with such enthusiasm that she was invited to deliver her paper twice again at the Courtauld Institute of Art in London and at Magdalen College, Oxford, for a special meeting on conservation topics for the Oxford Bibliographical Society. Her paper will be published in a volume of proceedings from the conference.
- A presentation at a second Flemush exhibition symposium held at the Courtauld Institute, London in February 2004 on "Technical Analysis of the Stein Quadriptych: a Preliminary Report," co-delivered with Abigail Quandt of the Walters Art Gallery.

As a result of her two talks at the Courtauld, Nancy was then asked to speak at a one-day colloquium organized by the Courtauld Institute and Manuscripts Research Group in London on the ways in which technical analysis can inform art historical research into illuminated manuscripts. She also collaborated with former GCI scientist David Scott on the pigment identification of major loan objects to *Illuminating the Renaissance*. The manuscripts analyzed included the Stein Quadryptich from the Walters Art Gallery, two Cardinal Wolsey manuscripts from Oxford college collections (Magdalene College and Christ Church College Libraries), the Arenberg Missal from a private German collection, and Flemish manuscripts in the Getty's collection, including the Brandenburg Prayerbook, and leaves by Simon Bening and Simon Marmion.

Reporting on part of her ongoing research of the Museum's pastel collection, Nancy Yocco gave a lecture at the seminar *Issues in the Conservation of 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> Century Pastels*, sponsored by the JPGM Department of Paintings.

Along with Brian Considine, Marc Harnly consulted with the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels to provide advice on the conservation of a large-scale print in their shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

#### **Decorative Arts and Sculpture Conservation**

The Decorative Arts and Sculpture Conservation department's conservators collaborated on and participated in the Getty Museum's "Houdon Marble Study Symposium," held in December 2003, which invited curators, conservators and scholars from the National Gallery of Art (US), the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Bowes Museum, the Huntington Library and Art Collections, and the Louvre Museum to study and discuss Houdon's marble works. The symposium featured marble sculpture lent by the collaborating museums which were on display in the "Jean-Antoine Houdon' Sculptor of the Enlightenment" exhibition that opened in November

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2003.

Assistant conservator Julie Wolfe performed restorative treatment on the Bowes Museum's Houdon sculpture, Bust of a Child, before its display in the "Jean-Antoine Houdon: Sculptor of the Enlightenment" exhibition.

Associate conservator Jane Bassett performed technical studies of seven Houdon bronzes, on loan for the "Jean-Antoine Houdon: Sculptor of the Enlightenment" exhibition by the Museu Calouste Gulbenkian, the Huntington Library and Art Collections, le Musée d'Art et d'Histoire de Langres, and L'Ecole Nationale Superieure des Beaux Arts. A co-authored paper on her findings is being proposed for publication.

Assistant conservator Arlen Heginbotham performed technical analysis and research on two gilt furniture mounts from the Huntington Library and Art Collections, to support their upcoming Catalogue of French Art.

Head conservator Brian Considine acted as a field reviewer for conservation grant applications for the Institute of Museum and Library Science's 2004 Conservation Project Support Grants program.

In February 2004, Brian Considine organized and taught a 2-part marquetry course for the public, held at the Getty Museum.

Assistant conservator Arlen Heginbotham organized a marquetry workshop sponsored by the American Institute for Conservation of Historic & Artistic Works (AIC), which was taught by furniture conservator Yannick Chastang at New York University in March 2004.

Arlen Heginbotham began and continues to perform research in collaboration with the University of Southern California's Biochemistry Department's Professor Michael Quick on antibody staining and paint binder identification. He supervised a volunteer researcher, one of Professor Quick's students, who assisted with scientific analyses. He is planning to publish his findings.

As a member of the AIC's Objects Communication Committee, Julie Wolfe performed editing on colleagues' papers for publication in non-conservation journals. In June 2004, she was elected to serve as the AIC Objects Group Chair, a three-year position serving as Group Chair in the first year, Program Chair during the second year, and Emeritus Chair in the final year.

In May 2004, Julie Wolfe began and continues to perform research on fillers used in Acryloid B-72 for marble loss compensation.

Brian Considine was a group leader for the AIC Wooden Artifacts Group's (WAG) Furniture in France II, a three-week study tour of French furniture-making workshops and private and public art collections. Julie Wolfe was a participant in the study group. Both Brian and Julie contributed to a report of the trip to be published by WAG.

Arlen Heginbotham supervised the department's fulltime Graduate Intern. They primarily collaborated on XRF analyses of pieces of the Museum's furniture collection that are being included in the forthcoming Baroque Catalogue, to be published by Getty Publications.

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Julie Wolfe supervised the department's Multicultural Summer Intern. The intern assisted with her ongoing marble fillers project, and is scheduled to return in the fall of 2004 to continue working on the project as a volunteer.

The Getty Research Institute (GRI) anchors the Getty's research mission and its goal of advancing scholarship in the fields of art and art history. It exists to bring together all the resources and activities required to advance understanding of the visual arts taken in their widest possible significance. The Research Library and the Getty Research Institute provide valuable support for scholars through a residential scholars program and extensive research collections, which include manuscripts, archives, photographs, artists' books, architectural models, two million study photographs, and 900,000 volumes of books, periodicals, and auction catalogues. Access to the collections and to scholarship conducted at the Research Institute is made available at the local, national, and international levels through active publications and exhibitions programs, online databases, and a wide range of public programming that includes lectures, performances, and symposia.

#### The Research Library

The Research Library was open to serve outside patrons more than 54 hours per week. 4,023 readers were registered to use the Library during those hours. Research Library staff answered 41,581 reference requests 78% (32,414) of which were made by outside patrons. The Research Library circulated 70,842 items, 42% (29,714) of which circulated to outside patrons. The Interlibrary Loan unit received 2,344 requests from other libraries and academic institutions and filled 64% (1,490) of those requests.

The Research Library recorded 17,038 visits by outside patrons to the collections. Outside browsers worldwide performed approximately 160,000 searches remotely on the Research Library's online catalog that is available via the Web. The Research Library loaned 108 items for public exhibition to outside institutions.

The Chief Librarian's Office hosted or co-sponsored the following activities:

- Hosted a plenary session and reception at the Getty for approximately 150 members of the Society for the History of Authorship, Reading, and Publishing (SHARP) during the society's annual conference.
- Sponsored, with GCI leadership, a reception for 2,000 archivists from academic, historical, corporate, and special archives in conjunction with the annual conference of the Society of American Archivists (SAA).

The Research Library's Special Collections and Visual Resources Department waived its reproduction fees for the use of images in 126 scholarly publications.

The *Research Library's Technical Services Department* donated 102 auction catalogs to the Research Library at the Natural History Museum in Los Angeles; and 494 auction catalogs were donated to the Arts Library at the University of California, Santa Barbara.

## The Research Library's Research Databases Department manages three projects:

The **Bibliography of the History of Art** (BHA), is jointly published by the Getty and by the Institut de l'Information Scientifique et Technique (INIST) in France, and collaborators in ten European countries contribute material to the Research Institute for inclusion in it. The BHA was increased by over 22,000 records

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this year, bringing the total to about 297,000 records. That database is available through DIALOG, Research Libraries Information Network (RLG), NISC International, Inc., and Ovid Technologies, Inc. The last printed volume was issued in early 2001 (it is now available electronically only).

The *Project for the Study of Collecting and Provenance*, which includes the Provenance Index databases, provided training, photocopies, books, and software to local, national, and international collaborative partners. The Project staff also provided training and updates on the software system used by the Provenance Documentation Collaborative (an international project overseen by the Project focusing on the documentation of works of art). The Provenance Index Databases, totaling over 1,000,000 records, are available to the public free-of-charge on a newly designed Web site:

<u>www.getty.edu/research/conducting\_research/provenance\_index/</u>. The Web site includes new guides on how to do provenance research and a guide to current conferences and other events related to the history of collecting and provenance. The staff continues to perform provenance research, at no charge, on paintings at the request of museums, curators, private individuals, scholars, and dealers.

The Avery Index to Architectural Periodicals produced at Columbia University added over 70,000 records to its database last year, and the database now includes over 540,000 records. The database is distributed through the distributors Cambridge Scientific Abstracts (CSA), EBSCO Publishing, NISC International, Inc. and Research Libraries Information Network (RLG).

#### **Digital Resource Management and Vocabulary Program**

The Digital Resource Management and Vocabulary Programs provided mentoring and training, including workshops and on-site meetings, to staff from numerous non-profit cultural organizations during fiscal year 2004:

Organizations that received mentoring in Fiscal Year 2004 include the Barnes Foundation in Philadelphia (including site visits and a sponsored visit of Barnes staff to the Getty Center); the Los Angeles County Museum of Art; the Autry Museum of Western Heritage (including a day-long series of meetings at the Getty Center); the Southwest Museum; the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) of the U.S.; OCLC; the School of Information Studies, UCLA (participation in curriculum development, master's program portfolio reviews, and other activities); the Digital Library team from the University of Southern California (USC), including a half-day meeting at the Getty Center; ARTstor (including meetings at the Getty and at the ARTstor offices in New York); RLG; the German Museum Association; the State Museums of Berlin; the Victoria & Albert Museum; the Art Institute of Chicago (including several telephone conferences and reviews of working documents); the Museum Computer Network, the Harvard University Art Museums, the United States Department of Defense; the American Library Association; the National Institute of Multimedia (Japan); the Herzogin Anna Malaia Bibliothek (Weimar).

The three Getty vocabulary databases (Art & Architecture Thesaurus®, Union List of Artist Names®, Getty Thesaurus of Geographic Names®) continued to be available on the World Wide Web free of charge. Average usage for all three vocabularies for fiscal year 2003 was around 150,000 queries per month, with users from all fifty United States and many foreign countries; the preponderance of usage of the Getty vocabularies on the Web is from dot edu and dot org institutions. The Getty vocabularies are used by cataloguers, researchers,

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students, and the general public.

Digital Resource Management and Vocabulary Program online publications, including Introduction to Imaging, Introduction to Metadata, Introduction to Vocabularies, and A Guide to the Description of Architectural Drawings, are made available free of charge on the Web and are typically among the top 20 Research Institute online resources accessed by users. The digital library resources or image collections, for which project management and production is provided by Digital Resource Management, are available free of charge on the Getty Web site.

#### **Research & Education and Contemporary Programs & Research**

The unifying theme for this scholar year was *Markets and Value*. The theme focused on theoretical approaches to assigning value in art and on empirical studies of how emotive, cognitive, and economic values have been intertwined in the history of art. Participants pursued their individual projects, conversed in the weekly working group, attended lectures and other events, took part in workshops, and informally shared their ideas with staff and with one another. In September eight Getty scholars arrived at the Getty Research Institute, joining six Fellows already in residence. Eleven Visiting Scholars also took part in the scholar year, working at the Research Institute for periods of one to three months.

During Fiscal Year 2004 the Research Institute awarded a total of 55 grants; to participants in the scholar year (25), the Intern and Graduate Intern Program (1), and Library Research Grants (29).

#### **Lecture Series**

Exhibition Lecture. Exile and Cunning: The Many Worlds of Alexander Liberman (September 16, 2003). In conjunction with the exhibition Photographs of Artists by Alexander Liberman, Francine du Plessix Gray presented a lecture on Liberman's life and work.

Better Homes (and Gardens) in a City of Reasonable Hedonists (November 19, 2003). Kurt Forster opened the conference "Building Paradise: Exile Architects in California" with a lecture on the Los Angeles quest for an architecture as free of conventional constraints and as rich in tangible qualities as possible.

The Birth of the Photography Market: A Snapshot from the '70's (February 4, 2004). Jori Finkel, Senior Editor at Art + Auction magazine, explored the rise of the photography market: the role of adventurous dealers and collectors, the construction of vintage prints and limited editions, and the effect of supply and demand on prices.

Art, Branding, and Art History\_(February 26, 2004). Hans-Jörg Heusser, Director of the Swiss Institute for Art Research in Zurich, offered that the integration of art and artists in the world of business, coupled with contemporary artists' attention to branding phenomenon, might encourage art historians to reconsider the modernist separation of art and economics.

Is There a Glory Formula? Willi Bongard's Kunstkompass and Other Guides for Art Investment (March 16, 2004). Michael Hutter, Getty Visiting Scholar and Professor of Economics at Witten/Herdecke University in

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Germany, discussed Willi Bongard's Glory Formula and Kunstkompass - projects which his widow, Linde Rohr-Bongard, continues to this day.

El Greco Defending Byzantine Art: Remarks on a Paradox (March 23, 2004). Nikolaos Chatzinikolaou, Professor of Art History at the University of Crete, Greece, gave a presentation concerning a remark by El Greco on the margin of a page in Vasari's second edition of the *Vite* and how this affects our image of his aesthetic ideology and his perception of his own identity.

In the Desert of Desire: The Nature of Culture and the Culture of Nature in Las Vegas (April 22, 2004). William Fox presented this lecture in connection with the Markets and Value scholar year theme.

Curator's Choice: From the Special Collections of the GRI - Artists' Books (December 2, 2003, and February 10, 2004). Joyce Pellerano Ludmer focused on the Research Library's recent acquisitions of artists' books, including those created locally and worldwide, as well as examples of precursors from the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

*Curator's Choice: Mystical Memory in the Manly Hall Collection* (May 25, 2004). David Brafman examined illustrated books in the Research Library's Manly Hall Collection to consider the impact that the evolution of mnemonic systems had on both their design and intellectual value system.

Works in Progress. Every year the Research Institute hosts a series of presentations-usually by local scholarson work in progress in art history and the humanities. The purpose of the series is to promote discussion of current issues, topics, and themes among interested scholars and students. There were nine of these events during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004.

#### Workshops

Art History and the Archive (October 10-11, 2003, and January 23-24, 2004). The Research Institute collaborates annually with the Clark Art Institute on "Art History and...," a pair of workshops devoted to a problem of timely importance in the field of art history. In October the workshop topic was "Art History and the Archive." Selected scholars and staff from both institutes met at the Clark to explore the role of the archive as both "a place" and "a logic" in the work of art historians and artists. In January the workshop took place at the Research Institute.

Consortium Seminar "Collecting Value" (December 13, 2003 – March 20, 2004). Getty Scholar Mark Meadow taught this graduate seminar on the Renaissance Wunderkammer, the origin of modern museums. The seminar explored a new model for understanding museums as places in which works of art circulate in a dynamic matrix of overlapping value systems. This seminar met the standards for accreditation at the five consortium schools: the University of California, Los Angeles; the University of California, Riverside; the University of California, Irvine; the University of California, Santa Barbara, and the University of Southern California.

Allegories of Fortune (March 1, 2004). This workshop-linking the GRI theme Markets and Value to the J. Paul Getty Museum collections-brought together a small group of invited participants to view and consider the thought-provoking paintings of Salvator Rosa and Dosso Dossi, both titled Allegory of Fortune.

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Approaches to the History of Collecting (April 3, 2004). The aim of this workshop was to explore the interconnections, disjunctions, and potential collaborative approaches within the area of the History of Collecting by bringing together some of the most active and influential scholars, each representing a different position.

(Un)Stable Strategies V: Writing the History of Art Now (April 16-17, 2004) was the fifth in an ongoing series of dissertation workshops for doctoral candidates working in the history of art and related fields. Participants, selected through an application process, linked their specific research projects to current methodological and theoretical issues in visual studies.

Walls of Algiers: Artistic, Cultural, and Urban Forms in the Colonial and Postcolonial City (May 27-28, 2004). This workshop brought together nine scholars to examine Research Institute archives dealing with Algiers, to incorporate archival materials into their own research, and to present papers on specific aspects of the city.

#### Conferences

The International Society for 18<sup>th</sup> Century Studies Quadrennial Congress (August 4, 2003). In collaboration with the J. Paul Getty Museum and the UCLA Center for 17th and 18th Century Studies, this conference-day offered to 700 attendees five concurrent panel sessions on various topics related to eighteenth century studies, a plenary session with featured speaker Tom Crow, and opportunities to visit related galleries in the J. Paul Getty Museum.

Mencia de Mendoza (September 2-4, 2003). Co-sponsored by the Generalitat Valenciana, the Fisher Gallery (USC), and the Program for Cultural Cooperation Between Spain's Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports and United States Universities, this conference provided an insight into one of the most important Renaissance collectors in Europe. The limited information that exists regarding her collection suggests that it comprised one of the most sophisticated assemblages of art of its time.

College Art Association (February 19, 2004). A Getty-sponsored panel discussion took place at the CAA's annual meeting in Seattle. Thomas Crow and several Getty Scholars in residence discussed their Markets and Value projects.

Beauty and Truth for Sale: the Art of the Dealer (March 29-30, 2004). This conference focused the status of dealers from early-modern period to the present and how they have shaped markets, artists, and the value of artworks.

#### **Film Screenings**

*Proteus* (January 27, 2004). Director David Lebrun was present and answered questions about his documentary *Proteus*, which explores the nineteenth century's engagement with the undersea world through science, technology, painting, poetry and myth. The central figure of the film is biologist and artist Ernst Haeckel (1834-1919), who found in the depths of the sea an ecstatic and almost mystical fusion of science and art.

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*Tsukiji* (February 24, 2004). Getty Artist-in-residence Allan Sekula presented his documentary film about the legendary Tokyo fish market.

#### Markets and Value Film Series:

Artists on Film Trust Hannah Rothschild and Robert McNab (October 15, 2003). Rothschild and McNab, founders of the Artists on Film Trust in London, presented a survey of documentary film and video footage of artists, including some of the earliest known film footage of artists such as Monet, Renoir, and Picasso. Rothschild spoke movingly of the attempt to preserve this invaluable cultural patrimony, which is rapidly disintegrating in many national and institutional archives.

Modern Art in Los Angeles. Beat Film: Kenneth Anger, Curtis Harrington and Larry Jordan (October 30, 2003). Avant-garde cinema played a particularly vital role in helping to define what came to be known as the "Beat" movement. These filmmakers, whose work defined the cinematic avant-garde of Los Angeles in the immediate post-war period, appeared in person to discuss their films, the challenges of making what were highly controversial works for the time, and the "scene" in 1950s Los Angeles. More than two full days of group and individual oral history sessions were conducted with the participants.

Bucket of Blood (December 17, 2003). This event overlapped with the Research Institute's ongoing "Modern Art in Los Angeles" project, specifically this year's focus on the Beat era in Los Angeles, and the Markets and Value scholar-year theme. Roger Corman, Joe Dante and Dick Miller candidly discussed the aesthetic and cultural value of what were often termed exploitation films, especially how they complicate the categorizations through which cinema defines itself as an artistic medium.

*Chi-hwa-seon* (January 22, 2004). This film screening was followed by a conversation between Korean art historian Insoo Cho and Korean film scholar David James. The focus of the discussion covered many pertinent *Markets and Value* themes, such as how the aesthetic value of an artist's work is related to the social and political climate in which he lives, the state of contemporary Korean cinema, and the current marketability of previously overlooked or marginalized cinemas.

Dreams That Money Can Buy (February 13, 2004). This was a rare screening of Hans Richter's 1947 Dreams that Money Can Buy, one of the earliest feature-length experimental films ever made. The seven "dreams" that comprise the film were a collaborative effort between Richter and numerous other artists, including Max Ernst, Man Ray, Marcel Duchamp, Fernand Leger, Alexander Calder, John Cage, Paul Bowles, and Edgar Varèse. Drawing on material in the Research Institute's Hans Richter and Arnold Eagle papers, Anne Friedberg introduced the film, providing information about Richter and his collaborations with Dada and surrealist artists in Germany and America.

America's Pop Collector (March 2, 2004). After the film screening Getty Scholar Serge Guilbaut and filmmaker John Schott discussed how the Scull auction was the first contemporary art auction to gain national media attention, how it foreshadowed the tremendous rise in sale prices during the art boom of the 1980s, and the complex forces that shape the production, reception, and evaluation of art.

#### **Other Public Events**

Modern Art in LA. The Beat Years (November 18, 2003). As part of the Getty's continuing project of

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documenting and preserving the art history of postwar Los Angeles, this event comprised more than three full days of group and individual oral histories with Shirley Berman, photographer Charles Brittin, artist George Herms, curator Walter Hopps, and poet David Meltzer. The culmination was a sold-out public discussion that settled a number of outstanding myths surrounding the Los Angeles art world of the 1950s, and featured a preview of an epic poem by Meltzer with Herms's accompaniment on a homemade drum set.

Performance and Panel: Art & Language and The Jackson Pollock Bar "Theses on Feuerbach" (March 6, 2004). Commissioned by the Research Institute in conjunction with the "Markets and Value" research theme, the English collaborative practice Art & Language developed a script interpreted by the German performance group The Jackson Pollock Bar.

Open Studio: Here is Something Just as Good (June 1, 2004). Getty Artist in Residence Raymond Pettibon displayed and discussed his current work.

The Getty Conservation Institute (GCI) works internationally to advance conservation and to encourage the preservation and understanding of the visual arts, including historic buildings and sites. The Institute serves the conservation community through scientific research, education and training, field projects and the dissemination of search results.

#### SUMMARY OF DIRECT CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES-PART IX-A

Research, education, field work and dissemination of information related to international, multidisciplinary projects were initiated or continued in North and Central America, the Mediterranean region, Europe, the Middle East and China.

Between June 28 and July 3, 2004, the Institute and the Dunhuang Academy organized a conference entitled "Conservation of Ancient Sites on the Silk Road, II: Wall Painting Conservation, Site, and Visitor Management." The purpose of the conference was to disseminate the results of the last 10 years of collaborative work between the Getty and the Dunhuang Academy and to provide a forum for the exchange of ideas on the conservation and management of cave temple sites in China and along the Silk Road. The conference sought to bring together hundreds of specialists in relevant aspects of cultural preservation and to forge closer collaboration between professionals from the East and West.

In November 2003, the GCI and the Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center at the University of Texas at Austin organized an international symposium on research related to *View from the Window at Le Gras* (1826)—the world's first permanent photograph from nature—and the work of its creator, Joseph Nicéphore Niépce. More than one hundred participants attended the symposium and a number of new research initiatives and ongoing research projects were presented.

During fall 2003, the second regional group of mosaic maintenance trainees returned to the Roman site of Makhtar, Tunisia, for the third part of their training course in the maintenance of in situ archaeological mosaics. The course was a collaboration between the GCI and the Tunisian Institut National du Patrimoine (INP) to train technicians on stabilization and routine maintenance of in situ archaeological floor mosaics.

Didactic panels were installed at the site of Copan, Honduras to explain to visitors the conservation activities related to the Hieroglyphic Stairway.

The Institute and World Monument Fund continued a joint initiative to address issues concerning architectural monuments and archaeological heritage sites in Iraq that have been damaged, looted or are under continued threat. As part of this initiative, the Getty jointly funded reinstallation of protective roofing over the archaeological site at Nineveh.

The following three reports were published and posted free of charge on the Getty's website: Grosse Île and the Irish Memorial National Historic Site, Hadrian's Wall World Heritage Site, and Port Arthur Historic Site. These case studies represent the culmination of many years of research with Parks Canada, English Hentage, and Australian Hentage Commission. They examine the role of values in site management and provide examples that describe and analyze the processes that connect theoretical management guidelines with management planning and its practical application. They are intended as didactic materials and for use by institutions, by professionals in the field, and for teaching.

An illustrated glossary for the graphic documentation of in situ floor mosaics was developed by the GCI and the Israel Antiquities Authority and posted free of charge on the Getty's website in December 2003.

An annotated bibliography on conservation and management of archaeological sites was compiled by the GCI and posted free of charge on the Getty's website in September 2003.

In April 2004, the GCI published a guidebook, Incentives for the Preservation and Rehabilitation of Historic

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#### SUMMARY OF DIRECT CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES--PART IX-A

Homes in the City of Los Angeles, to assist homeowners and prospective owners of older homes in Los Angeles in identifying financial, tax, and regulatory incentives of benefit to owners of older residential properties. It is designed to help property owners to learn whether they might be eligible for such incentives and to understand how to gain access to them. Copies of the guidebook are available free of charge on the Getty's website.

The following publications were completed: Managing Change: Sustainable Approaches to the Conservation of the Built Environment; Solvent Gels for the Cleaning of Works of Art; Personal Viewpoints: Thoughts about Paintings Conservation; and Preventative Conservation of Photograph Collections.

Three issues of *Conservation, The Getty Conservation Institute Newsletter* were distributed free of charge to approximately 8000 international professionals in conservation and related fields and members of the public concerned about conservation.

The GCI hosted eight conservation guest scholars who conducted their own research on topics ranging from Planning and Management of Historic Sites to Seismic Strengthening of Stone Masonry in Architectural Heritage.

As part of the ongoing public lecture series *Issues in Conservation*, the GCI presented five lectures, including the following topics: "Exceeding all Preconceptions: Twenty-One Years with the Rothko Chapel Paintings," "Preservation Follies: Inventing the Near and Distant Past," "Bibliotheca Alexandrina: From Antiquity to the 21<sup>th</sup> Century," "Revolution of Forms; Cuba's Forgotten Art Schools," and "The Restoration of the French Republic's Buildings in Rome."

# RELATIONSHIP OF ACTIVITIES TO THE ACCOMPLISHMENT OF EXEMPT PURPOSES--PART XVI-B

Line Relationship

1. (a) The Getty Leadership Institute for Museum Management is an intensive, four-week residential program designed to provide middle- and senior-level museum professionals with training in the leadership, management and business skills required for the successful operation of museums.

1. (b) The Getty put on numerous public performances including "Selected Shorts" a series of readings of classic and contemporary short stories as well as theater and dance performances designed to attract an audience that might not otherwise visit the museum. The J. Paul Getty Museum's Summer Concert Series and Friday Night Concerts introduce audiences to music that might not otherwise be performed in the Los Angeles area. Each concert is accompanied by a lecture and extensive program notes to place the music in historical perspective against works of art in the Museum's collections.

1. (c) The Getty Museum provides a variety of professional development workshops, community collaboration workshops and teacher collaboration workshops to help local educators and leaders integrate art education into their activities.

1. (d) Royalties are received from three sources. The **Bibliography of the History of Art** provides the most comprehensive English language indexing and abstracting service for articles, books and exhibition catalogues on Western art from late antiquity to the present. Art and Architectural Technical Abstracts is a major source reference in conservation, publishing 2,500 abstracts per year covering technical examination, investigation, analysis, restoration preservation and documentation of works of historic and artistic value. The Avery Index to Architectural Periodicals contains 470,000 records and is distributed worldwide.

1. (e) The Museum makes audioguides available to its visitors for a small charge. These random access units allow visitors to take a personalized tour of the collections by offering commentary and perspectives on works of art in the collections by curators, scholars, educators, artists and local leaders in both English and Spanish.

1. (f) Upon request, the Museum and the Research Institute make available photographs and slides of works of art in its collections. These photographs are provided free of charge to scholars and arts institutions. A nominal charge is made for other requests to offset production costs. From time to time the Getty hosts gatherings of local charitable and non-profit institutions. Amounts charged for these events offset Getty's facilities and security expenses.

10. The Museum bookstore makes available to the public a wide variety of general art books as well as publications, prints and postcards specific to the Museum's collections. Additionally, scholarly publications produced by J. Paul Getty Trust Publications, the Research Institute and the Conservation Institute are available from the bookstore.
