## Chamber pursues political clout

Say it loud. I'm political and I'm proud.

That message came through clearly Wednesday night when Robert LaBrant, manager of political action programs for the Michigan State Chamber of Commerce told Canton business people to get more involved in the political process or be left in the wake of other special interest pressure groups.

"The chamber shouldn't try to be all things to all people," LaBrant said. "If

all you want to be is the sponsor of the local trout fishing contest or the Santa parade, then fine, continue to be a namby-pamby organization. But, for a chamber not to get involved in politics because it doesn't want to be the center of controversy, that's shortsighted."

About 35 business people in attendance at the meeting in the Super Bowl conference room gave divergent opinions on the extent of political involvement the chamber should engage in.

SOME CHAMBER members, such as George Bradley, husband of Anne Bradley, township treasurer and owner of B&K Lawn Sales, thought the chamber could make the most impact by endorsing local political candidates.

"Either you get involved in politics or you don't," said Bradley, "and I think the local chamber should."

But most of those present felt the chamber should refrain from endorsing township candidates and concentrate on proposed state and federal legislation that would affect

Most members also liked LaBrant's suggestion that the chamber form a "mini-PAC" (Political Action Committee) to endorse and finance pro-business candidates running for the legislature.

Even LaBrant, who kept pounding home the point that "politics" is not an obscene noun, thought it might be a mistake for the chamber to start backing and bankrolling township candidates:

"I think the chambers are going to most successful in state campaigns. It

would probably be a mistake for the local chamber to get involved in the local election if there's not a history of interest group involvement in Canton elections."

Twp. Supervisor Harold Stein, who was on the speakers' panel, thought it perfectly reasonable for the local chamber to endorse and contribute to local candidates.

"Support without obligation is what I received from business and unions in the last campaign," Stein said. "I worked with them both. It's not so much to control a candidate or what he supports, but to lend support to philosophies we share."

But restraint about getting involved in local elections "may be ancient history," LaBrant said, by the 1980's. Before that time comes, he said, labor unions, teachers associations and astute chambers will be deeply involved in even the smallest races.

LaBRANT SINGLED out three labor organizations as the most influential interest groups in Michigan: the AFL-CIO, the UAW and, a newcomer to the political scene, the Michigan Education Association (MEA).

The only way for the business community to compete, said the tough-talking LaBrant, is for the chamber of commerce in every community to establish a political arm in the form of a political action committee.

He advised the Canton chamber to begin by forming something called a "mini-PAC," which could legally raise up to \$500 to support a chamber-endorsed candidate. If individual donations are \$20 or less and the total does not exceed \$500, the expenditure report to the state is an easy, one-page process. LaBrant even left a kit complete with the proper forms with chamber officials.

IF THE CHAMBER decided to form a political action committee, bylaws

## Modern turkey is a guinea pig

When you bow your head and say grace at the table and then sit back to feast on the luscious looking brown bird in the center of the Thanksgiving setting, it may come as a surprise to you that you will be whetting your appetite on the guinea pig of the fraternity.

No other bird in the world has been the object of experiments through the years than the turkey. And the bird on which you will feast is a far cry from the bird on which the Pilgrims feasted on their first Thanksgiving back in 1621.

The bird on which they dined was a tall, skinny creature with long legs and a slender body. It didn't have the lure of the bird we have on these modern Thanksgiving Days. It was a wild bird, taken right out of the backwoods. But it was the favorite then—and it has been a favorite ever since.

In those days the turkey was what is known as a "bronze" turkey and its only beauty came when the Tom turkeys released the fan of feathers much like the peacock.

BUT THAT TYPE of turkey has just about reached the limbo of forgotten things since the experimenters (breeders) went to work to develop a "new" bird.

In the early days the "bronze" turkeys were judged by their feather patterns. It was of great importance that the tail feathers of both hens and toms had clear white tips and that the second color was a sharp black band and that there was not a brown separation between the white and the black bars. No one in those days was concerned about the "meat" on the bird.

Then, about 40 years ago, it was learned that an Englishman named Jesse Throssel, had brought from England to British Columbia a bird that changed the entire feathered industry. He had selected the birds without regard to feather patterns and centered his attention on meat.

Now the feathered pattern was forgotten and the breeders centered their activities on the "meat." It wasn't long until the "broad breasted" bronze turkey came into being.

HERE AGAIN THE breeders made a switch. By this time a white turkey, known as the Beltsville white turkey and the entire industry underwent might be termed a revolution.

It was found that the white turkey

did not have the large pointed breast bone possessed by the bronze birds and that it would be a better subject for the production of meat. The lack of the pointed breast bone made it pos-

sible to concentrate on development of the breast.

With this wild chase for "meat" the bronze turkey was pushed into the background and is now seen only

rarely. In the mad rush of the breeders they soon found themselves with a problem. The breasts became so large that the

## Canton copter company starts metro shuttle flights

There's two stewardesses on board and room for eight passengers, but don't expect a Salisbury steak dinner to be brought to your reclining seat. The destination on this seven-minute flight is Metropolitan Airport or the Hyatt Regency Hotel and air fare is \$9.72.

Barney and Marge Stutesman of Westland, owners of the Detroit Helicopter Airlines Co. have invested about \$200,000 in two re-manufactured passenger helicopters this past year in starting an air shuttle that should eventually service downtown Detroit,

Troy's Executive Airport, Southfield's Northland area and Dearborn's Hyatt Regency hotel complex.

Home base of the helicopter company is Canton's Mettetal Airport. The unassuming hangar is also the home of another one of Stutesman's businesses, Hi-Lift Helicopters, which makes aircraft available to industry for lifting and transporting heavy equipment.

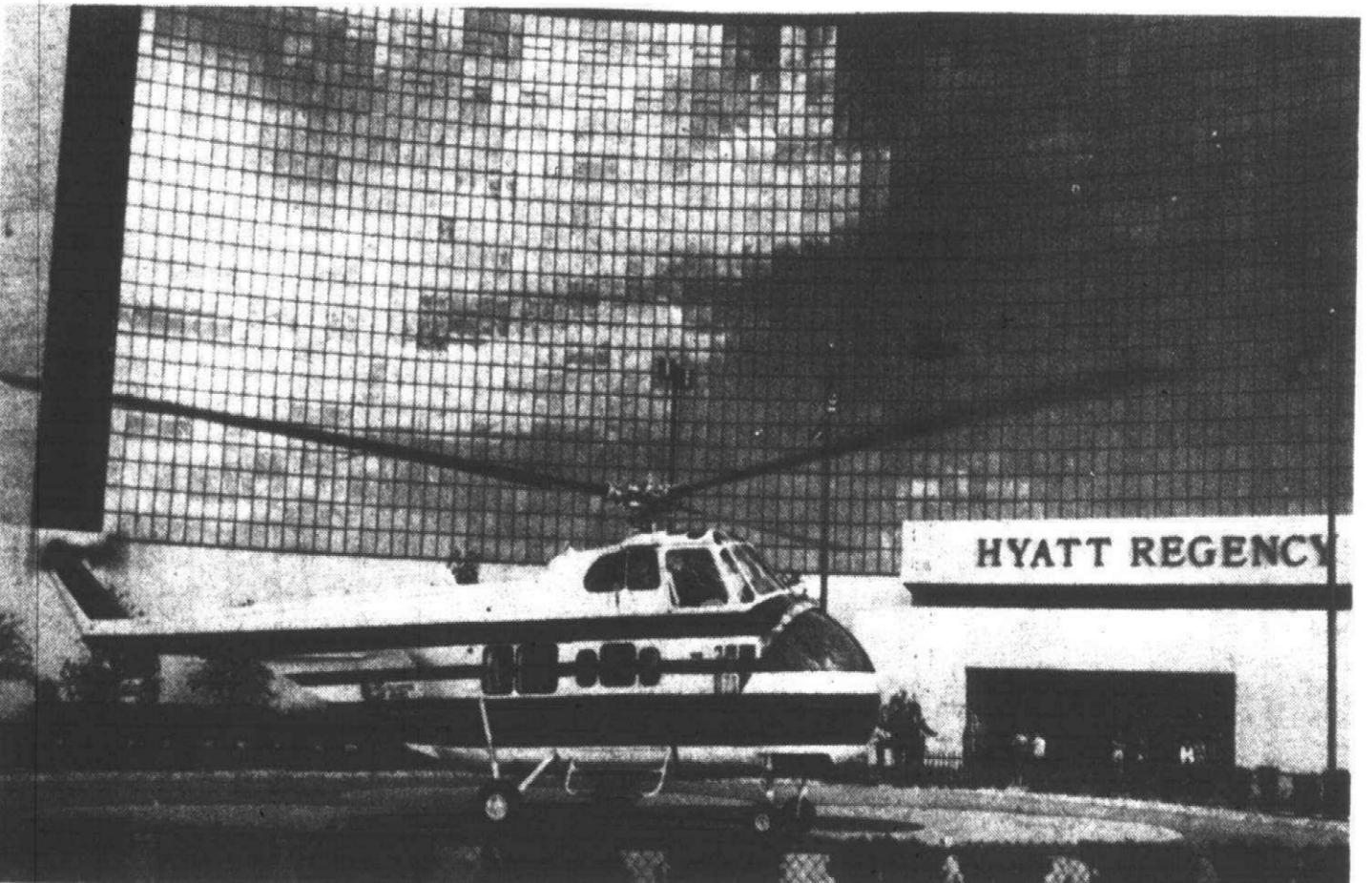
The helicopter airline company made its maiden flight Oct. 8. At present, the flights are only between Metropolitan Airport and the Hyatt Regency. But Stutesman says he's talking to Southfield and Detroit city

councils about establishing an approved landing site in both locations.

The Troy airport has already given him tentative approval, Stutesman said, but no flights will be made to Troy until Southfield and Detroit are added to the itinerary.

In Detroit, Stutesman believes he will be landing at a heliport on the southeast corner of the Cobo Hall roof. In Southfield Stutesman is looking at an unused parking lot for use as a heliport.

## Get politics off bench, LWV urges

A petition drive to modify the selection process for judges of the Michigan Supreme Court and Michigan Court of Appeals is being started by the League of Women Voters of Northville, Plymouth, Canton, Novi.

The league will be circulating petitions to place on the November 1978 ballot a constitutional amendment to change the selection process.

The league believes selection of qualified judges should be free from political pressures, says Neva Carter of Canton, president of the local league.

Standards the league feels necessary to achieve in the judicial area include: Nonpartisanship in the selection of judges; and, selection of judges by a combined method of original appointment to the bench and subsequent elections.

Like all league positions, this position on the judicial branch stems from member study and consensus.

JO ANN HUBBARD, state chairperson of the drive, states that judicial appointment isn't a new idea.

"One common misconception about the judicial branch is that the elective judiciary is a part of the American heritage, but this isn't the case. If the men who founded our nation and wrote the constitution were to come back today they would find many surprises, but none more than the elective judiciary. They never thought of such a thing," says Ms. Hubbard.

They provided in the federal and the first state constitution for appointment by the governor, subject to some kind of check or control by a council or a legislative body. It wasn't until three quarters of a century after our nation was founded that the vogue of popular election for short terms swept into the judiciary. Within 20 years a reaction set in and there has been dissatisfaction and debate ever since."

A COALITION NAMED Michigan Citizens to Take Courts Out of Partisan Politics has set as its goal 266,000 valid signatures to be delivered to the Secretary of State.

The coalition consists of the LWV, State Bar of Michigan, Michigan Chamber of Commerce, Common Cause, Michigan Farm Bureau, and Michigan Council of Churches.

The proposed amendment would create a nine-member judicial nominating commission which would consist of six public members and three

# Older home being transformed

One of the oldest homes in City of Plymouth—the frame home on this southwest corner of Deer and Maple Streets—is undergoing a facelifting that will take it out the residential classification and place in the office ranks.

The transformation is the idea of retired Wayne Circuit Judge George Bowles and his wife, Catherine, who plan to make the old structure a combination office and home in that they will have the apartment on the upper floor.

"We've been thinking about a move like this ever since we moved into the Plymouth area several years ago,"

Bowles said, "and now with my work close to my home I will be able to live a nice leisurely life."

WHEN THE JUDGE moved into the new quarters they will be known as the George Bowles Professional Corporation and one of his lessees will be Joseph H. Dillon, who has been on the legal staff of the Chrysler Motor Co. for years.

In making the move Bowles is bringing into reality his great feeling for the Plymouth community and plans to spend the remainder of his time as a smalltown expert on the legal problems and the many twists of the legal profession.

In moving to the new quarters Bowles will be parting company with

John Vos, who has shared the office space in the stock exchange building since it opened more than a year ago.

"I have always liked it out here," he said, in speaking of the forthcoming move. "And this will give Mrs. Bowles and myself the kind of a set-up that we think will be ideal."

"We plan a great many changes in the exterior in the next year or two. We plan to follow the Plymouth pattern and no doubt it will fit into the colonial theme."

BOWLES RECALLED that he started the practice of law in 1945, four years after graduating from the University of Michigan. Most of his time was spent in labor

relations. He finally was elected to the Circuit Court in 1957 and served with distinction until his retirement from the bench in 1976.

Since their move to the Plymouth community Mrs. Bowles, who has a master's degree from Eastern Michigan University, has been a reading specialist for Plymouth-Canton schools.

They have three children and as Bowles puts it: "We have now reached the stage where we can be content in our own home and still will be close to my desk (the law telephone will be kept downstairs)."

The move into the new office is scheduled on Dec. 1.

# Eddie Edgar testimonial's held to fete Stroller on 80th birthday

A special testimonial was given Friday for W.W. "Eddie" Edgar on the occasion of his 80th birthday on Nov. 19.

Guest speakers paying tribute to Edgar came from Livonia, Plymouth, Detroit and Washington, D.C. for the special program held at the Friday luncheon meeting of the Rotary Club of Plymouth.

Among those who rose to the occasion to wish Edgar well on his 80th were:

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), State Rep. Robert Law (R-Livonia), Harold Fisher of Canton, Sister Lauriani of Madonna College, Sister Modesta of St. Mary Hospital, Neal "Doc" Fenkel, Hal Middlesworth of the Detroit Lions, Fred Delano, managing editor of the Observer and Eccentric, John Reddy, general manager of the Observer and Eccentric, Paul Carey of WJR Radio, Edgar Hayes, former Detroit Free Press sports writer, and Emory Daniels, editor of the Plymouth Observer.

## THE OFFICIAL TRIBUTE of the Plymouth Rotarians read as follows:

"The Rotary Club of Plymouth, colleagues and friends recognize the many years of unselfish service given by W.W. Edgar to his community, church, profession and friends.

"Eddie lives the Rotary motto 'Service Above Self' and he has been living it for a number of years now. His record includes service to the Detroit Free Press, City of Livonia, St. Mary Hospital, Madonna College, Greater Detroit Bowling Proprietors Assn. and local amateur college and professional sports to mention activities with which we are familiar. Eddie is currently serving the Observer and Eccentric Newspapers as well as this Rotary Club."

FISHER, WHO runs a Real Estate office in Plymouth, was one of the original members of the board of trustees when Schoolcraft College was organized.

Fisher recalled the service Edgar gave as a member of the college's advisory committee on public relations during the days of its organization.

"As far as community service is concerned, I have never heard of W.W. Edgar printing one negative word about any community endeavor with which he was involved, including Schoolcraft. Eddie is a positive man who has given a lot to the progressive spirit of the Plymouth community. He exemplifies the choice of wearing out instead of rusting out, and we wish him many more years of wearing out."

Sister Lauriani pointed out Edgar was one of the original backers of Madonna and was instrumental through the years in helping the college get money from the Michigan College Foundation. She presented a plaque in appreciation for his ongoing support to Madonna.

Middlesworth, public relations director for the Detroit Tigers who worked with Edgar in the sports department of the Free Press, noted that "Eddie holds the alltime record for attending the most opening day games of the Tigers as a sports writer. In fact, he's been attending so many Tiger games that we decided to burn down the press box and build Eddie a new one."

Sister Modesta, of the lab department at St. Mary Hospital, appeared as a representative for hospital administrators Sister Columbine and Sister Mary Calasantia. She noted Edgar's association with St. Mary Hospital goes back 24 years when he was assistant general chairman of the campaign committee, and recognized his efforts through the Plymouth Rotary Club to donate several kidney machines to the hospital.

Delano commented: "All of you share with me, I'm sure, my estimation of W.W. Edgar as being one of the kindest, capable and hard working people in any walk of life." Delano then noted that Saturday was the 54th straight time Edgar has covered University of Michigan Football game—a feat that was noted during Saturday's game against Ohio State or the many contributions he's made in the area of community service. Carey, who announces the Tiger games on radio, praised Edgar's loyalty for two decades with WJR for broadcasting the bowling news on the Bob Reynolds sports show.

Rep. Law brought birthday greetings from the Michigan Legislature and commented: "I've known Eddie as a very straight-forward and honest person who always tells it like it is."

Daniels commended Edgar for being an excellent, hard-working journalist in 1977. "Eddie sets his personal goals of at least four features and four columns per week. A lot of people one-third Eddie's age cannot match that record. I'm proud to have Eddie on my staff and salute him for the great journalist he is in 1977."

PURSELL RETURNED from Washington, D.C., to commend Edgar for his community service to Plymouth and Livonia. "I've known Eddie for a number of years and he has been a continuing leader in the background boosting the community, be it Livonia or Plymouth."

Pursell referred to the fact Edgar was a member of the first Livonia City Council and served as council vice-president, was a leading supporter for incorporation and a member of the charter commission, and helped organize the Livonia Chamber of Commerce. Those contributions were recognized last year with the re-naming of the Ford Ice Arena to the W.W. Edgar Ice Arena.

In remarking on Eddie's long life, Hayes remembered when "Someone once told Eddie, 'You can't take it with you' to which Eddie replied: 'Then I won't go.'"

WHEN EDGAR finally was given the microphone to make a few remarks, he said he was only sorry his mother couldn't be there. "She celebrated her 21st birthday the day I was born and if she were alive today would be 101.

After recalling some of the thrills of his life—including helping Joe Louis get started in boxing and watching him gain the heavyweight championship—Edgar remarked: "Yes, they

say you can't take it with you but this is a moment I will take with me to the grave."

After spending 24 years with the Free Press, Edgar joined Observer Newspapers in 1964 and has served as columnist, reporter, feature writer and as editor of the Plymouth Observer. He now is a feature writer and author of The Stroller and In the Pocket, a bowling column.

Through the years he has rubbed elbows with such greats as Gar Wood, Joe Louis, Ty Cobb, Mickey Cochrane, Gus Dorais, Walter Hagen, Fielding Yost and many others.

After leaving the Free Press in 1948, he spent 16 years as executive secretary of the Bowling Proprietors of Greater Detroit. He began his bowling radio broadcast in 1964 and continued until this year when Reynolds left WJR.

Reynolds also sent a personal message to Edgar Friday as did Will Perry of U-M who described Eddie as "one of the state's greatest natural resources."

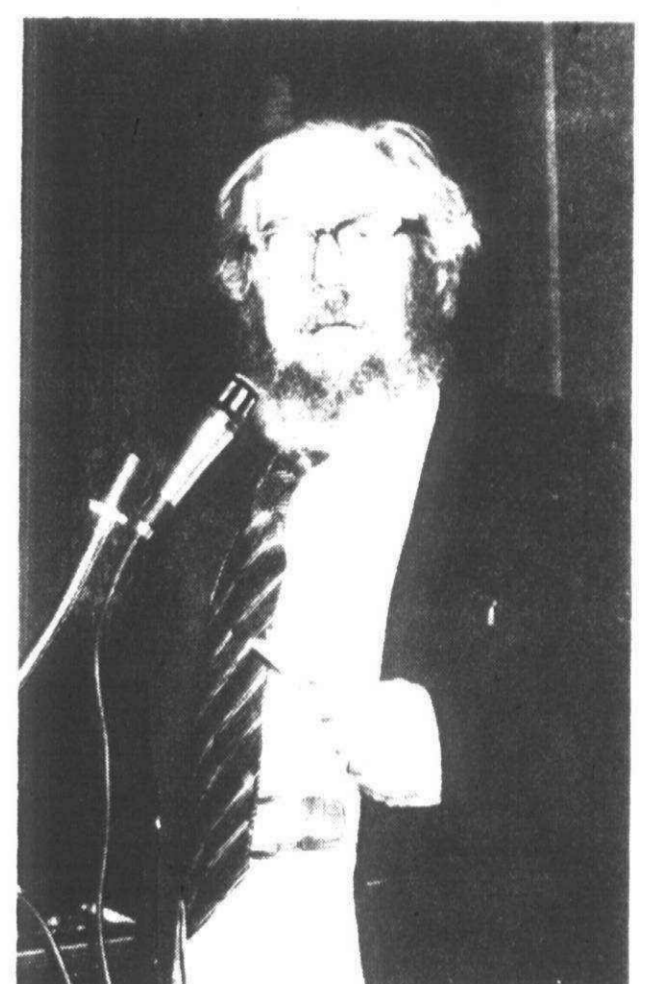

# Copter company takes off

THE BUSINESS GAMBLE by Stutesman looks like it's going to pay off. In the first few weeks, the business to and from the hotel has been excellent. Heavy convention traffic in the first week caused Stutesman to put both helicopters in operation to accommodate the commuters. Last Friday the operation transported 50 people.

"The load depends on the activity at the Hyatt Regency," Stutesman said. "When they're busy with conventions we're busy."

But Stutesman isn't content to just shuttle travelers between Dearborn and the airport. In order for the service to pay its high upkeep and inspection costs, he says he must service all four planned locations.

The earliest flight leaves the Hyatt hotel at 7:08 a.m. and arrives at the airport seven minutes later.

"There's not even time for people to light up a cigarette, so we keep the no-smoking sign on," explains Stutesman. In all, there are nine flights being run daily and more stops scheduled when

Stutesman receives clearance from the three city councils.

BEFORE HE STARTED the Detroit area helicopter service, Stutesman ran a copter flight school that trained private pilots and many police pilots. That certified school has ended although Stutesman still offers some flight lessons upon appointment.

Helicopters can also be chartered at a price of \$400 per hour. Rock groups that have rented the helicopter include Led Zeppelin, The Who, the Beach Boys, War, LaBelle, Peter Frampton, and Harry Chapin.

Marge Stutesman, co-owner and wife of Stutesman, said most people who take their first helicopter ride are surprised at the stability of the craft and the plush seats.

"For some reason people expect a helicopter to be rough," she said.

"It is noisy," said her husband, "but you've got to realize there's an 800 horsepower piston engine operating right above your head."

## Price range

bird scarcely could waddle along. To make matters worse, the broad breasted hen no longer could sit on the nest for mating.

The poor bird, now the tool of the breeders, were robbed of what little fun there was when it was decided that artificial insemination was the key to reproduction.

The hen was not alone in the experiments. The Toms who liked to strut before the hens with the snood curled down over their beaks, were forced to give up much of the snood. Today you don't see much strutting of the Toms.

NOW, ANOTHER PROBLEM developed. With the large breasts the legs no longer could carry the weight around. There was nothing to do but concentrate on building bigger and meatier "drum sticks."

The need of larger legs and "dark" meat became more acute in our present spiraling economy when turkeys are one of the cheapest types of meat available.

Not everyone wanted to roast or fry a turkey, so the turkey raiser encouraged such commodities as turkey hash and turkey rolls with the result that there is a year-round demand for turkey meat.

practicing lawyers with no more than five members from the same political party. Commission members would be appointed by the governor with the advise and consent of the Senate.

The commission would submit to the governor a list of three nominees to fill vacancies in the Supreme Court or Court of Appeals and the governor would have to make his appointment from this list.

At the general election nearest the expiration of two years from the date of appointment, the justice or judge would serve out the balance of the term. Thereafter he or she would have to stand for retention election at the end of each term to a maximum of three years.

will have to be changed to strike the present stipulation that the group will be non-political and not endorse candidates.

Ms. Perna, former president of the chamber Bart Berg, Al Daly and John Schwartz indicated that they felt the chamber would probably endorse and finance candidates in state races at the next election.

But Flossie Tonda, school board member, and Dennis Fassett, newspaper editor, both wondered if the foray into the political spectrum will split the business community and harm the chamber. Ms. Tonda wondered if the chamber would be predominantly pro-Republican in its endorsements.

LaBrant replied that although business traditionally "shows a Republican bias," Democrats can be made

more responsive to business through lobbying backed up with sizeable contributions. Politicians suffer from "the Capistrano syndrome," LaBrant said, "they like to return."

Robert Pitzaferrro, an aide to State Sen. William Faust (D-Westland), nearly got into an argument with LaBrant when he told chamber members that "the mother's milk of politics is money." Pitzaferrro called some of LaBrant's remarks about labor reactionary and said it sounded like he were endorsing the buying of votes. LaBrant countered that there was nothing amoral or corrupt about lending financial support to a candidate who will vote for legislation that is in the best interest of business.

"Some people are awfully naive," LaBrant said, "when it comes to how politics works."

## Schoolcraft reserves Feb. 27 for millage vote

Schoolcraft College has reserved Monday, February 27 for a special election on a property tax increase,

although some trustees are uncertain about whether to go through with it. Several want to see what a profes-

sional pollster can tell them next month about voters' attitudes and possible strategies.

Most K-12 school districts hold millage elections in late winter or early spring so that they can have more certain knowledge of their financial resources as they negotiate with employee unions and prepare budgets in June.

# S'craft president becomes example

Hoping to set an example for several hundred Schoolcraft College employees, President C. Nelson Grote agreed to pay part of his health insurance costs under the new four-year contract approved last week by the board of trustees.

The union, composed of secretarial and clerical personnel, has been working without a contract since June 30.

The college failed to establish the principle in recent negotiations with middle management personnel, but got one concession: The middle managers agreed in writing to pay 25 percent of the cost increase next year if the Faculty Forum will agree to do the same.

Thus, the college's chief target is the Faculty Forum, whose contract expires in August of 1978.

THE BOARD has been able to impose employee participation on executive and classified personnel.

Grote's contract calls for him to pay, beginning Jan. 1, \$5.36 from every two-week pay check toward the health program. Coverage includes hospital-surgical for the employee and dependents as well as vision and dental care.

Grote's contract was extended to June 30, 1981.

Administrators at the two-year community college, which includes the K-12 school districts of Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville and Plymouth, are thinking in terms of asking for one mill (\$1 per \$1,000 of state-equalized valuation). The college currently has 1.77 voted mills.

DECISION DAY for the eight-member board of trustees will be the meeting of Dec. 14. The tentative decision to reserve Feb. 27 was made unanimously at last Wednesday's board meeting.

A Lansing professional pollster, working with volunteers from the college, will conduct surveys of regular voters and the public later this month. Those results, if conclusive, may guide trustees on whether to go ahead.

After losing twice at regular June elections, the Schoolcraft board is considering Trustee Mark McQuesten's suggestion of holding a special election before Schoolcraft's regular semester ends around May 1, when students are still on campus.

ONE THING trustees hope to learn is whether a Saturday or a Monday election would be more advantageous.

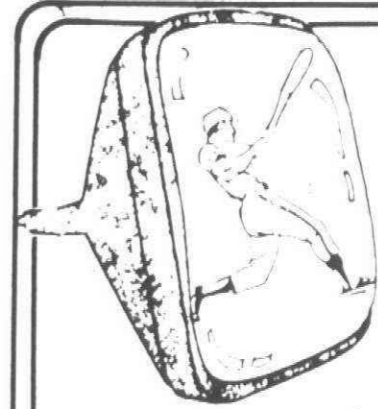
Saturday elections have proven expensive because of overtime costs, noted trustee Gerald Cox. Yet Northville has held Saturday votes with some success.

Vice-chairman Ron Cowden said that if a poll shows voters are unlikely to support a millage increase, "I'll be guided by that."

Board Secretary Nancie Blatt added that a poll may even guide the board into holding off its request for a year.

EVEN AS the board was contemplating a way to raise more funds to support a building program, a dissident group of students was asking for a 25 percent refund of tuition and fees.

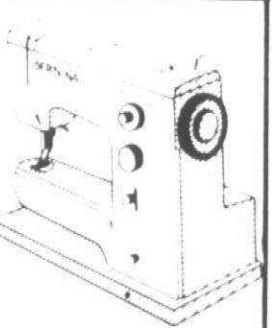

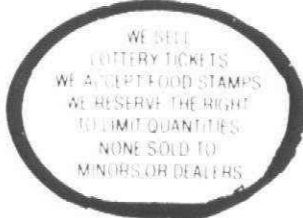

# Tips given for safe driving in winter

While most of winter's cold weather is still ahead, it isn't too early for local drivers to review recommended measures for handling winter's seasonal driving difficulties.

And a good starting point is traction problems on snow and ice.

Winter driving research, conducted annually by the National Safety Council's Committee on Winter Driving Hazards, has already gathered sound information on the proper ways to start, go, turn, and stop on ice and snow.

The NSC skid test recommendations also are endorsed by the International Association of Chiefs of Police and by road service crews who have to rescue stalled or ditched motorists who

weren't "winter-wise" in winter's ways.

**PULLING TRACTION** is the way your car is able to start and keep going in snow or on ice, and pulling traction is directly related to the kind of tires or traction aids used. NSC test findings have developed these facts:

- Conventional snow tires offer only a 28 per cent improvement in pulling power as compared with regular highway tires on ice; but they provide half again as much traction as regular tires on loosely packed snow.
- Reinforced tire chains pull four times better than regular tires on snow; seven times better on ice.

If you are stuck in snow, turn your

front wheels back and forth to push snow away from your tires. Shift to the highest gear; and, with a gentle foot on the throttle, try to ease out without spinning your wheels.

**STOPPING**—a major problem on ice or packed and polished snow—also depends on tires or traction aids.

- Conventional snow tires offer no advantage over regular highway tires in stopping on ice.
- Reinforced tire chains are best—cutting braking distances in half on glare ice.

Regardless of traction aids, "pump" your brakes to slow or stop. This technique helps to maintain steering control.

**DON'T BE** overconfident just

because you have special tires or chains on the rear wheels.

Traction aids are of little value in cornering unless they are used on all four wheels. Otherwise, the front end skids out and you lose steering control.

The way to steer is steady and smooth—anticipating all maneuvers well in advance. Sudden lane changes or turns can put you into a spin.

In no case can speeds on winter-slick roads begin to approach those on dry pavement regardless of the traction aids used. That's why police officers in the Plymouth-Canton area take a dim view of drivers who don't know the way to adjust their speed to conditions—especially when conditions aren't the best.

# Salem's Moshimer tabbed Observer's top grid coach

Plymouth Salem's head football coach Tom Moshimer has been named Observerland's coach-of-the-year for the 1977 season.

There was little doubt about the number one coach selection this season as Moshimer led his gridders to a perfect 9-0 regular season before bowing in the state quarterfinals to Portage Central two weeks ago.

The Rocks, winners of the Suburban Eight League for the second time in

the past four years, were the only undefeated team in Observerland and were ranked among the top teams in the state for the latter part of the year.

Undefeated seasons aren't uncommon for Moshimer by any means. He turned the trick just three years earlier with the 1974 Salem gridders, who posted an identical 9-0 state-rated record.

Moshimer, who is always quick to give credit to his staff and talented ballplayers, has been a student of the wishbone option offense which he

brought to Plymouth in 1972.

The Salem grid coach came to Plymouth from Dundee High School as the head man 11 years ago.

Although he has missed placing in the upper division of the tough Sub-8 conference only once in 11 years, Moshimer's real successes in Plymouth started six years ago when he introduced the wishbone.

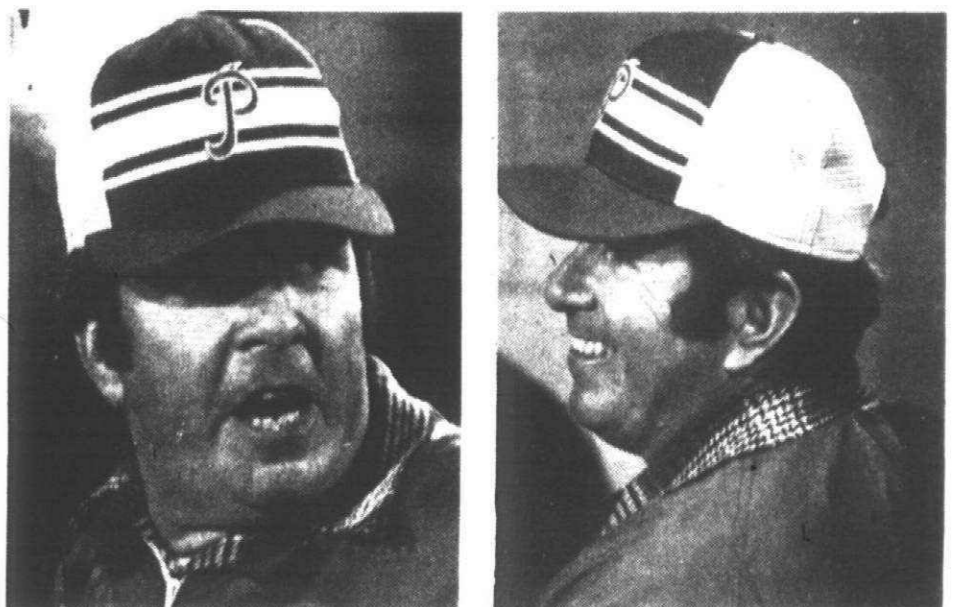
Since the 1972 season, Moshimer has compiled a 40-15 mark in the six years with the triple-option offense.

A graduate of Northville High School

and Michigan State University, Moshimer, 42, teaches mathematics at Salem High School.

The Rocks began the fall season with a narrow 6-3 non-league victory over Livonia Franklin and proceeded to win seven straight Suburban Eight League games before closing the regular season with a 35-13 victory over Western Six League champion Farmington Harrison.

Salem won the Sub-8 conference by two games over Dearborn Edsel Ford and Trenton.

Since then, McIntyre has coached in Michigan at a number of area junior high schools. His records over the years have varied with each successive team. "There have been some good clubs," he said.

McIntyre got the job at Franklin through an agreement with Visser. Visser asked McIntyre to take over the junior varsity job for one year. After that, Visser said he would step down and the varsity job would be McIntyre's.

McIntyre was officially given the position of head coach in mid-summer after Visser decided not to stay on for another year.

"I'm pleased with the new position but I had to decide if I wanted to get

back into high school coaching or not. That was the tough part," McIntyre said.

"I am looking forward to the season ahead. We'll be a young team but I think we can get something generated during the season," he continued.

Not only will Franklin have a new coach but the team itself will be very young with just three seniors on the club, McIntyre said. It could turn out to be a long winter for the Patriots.

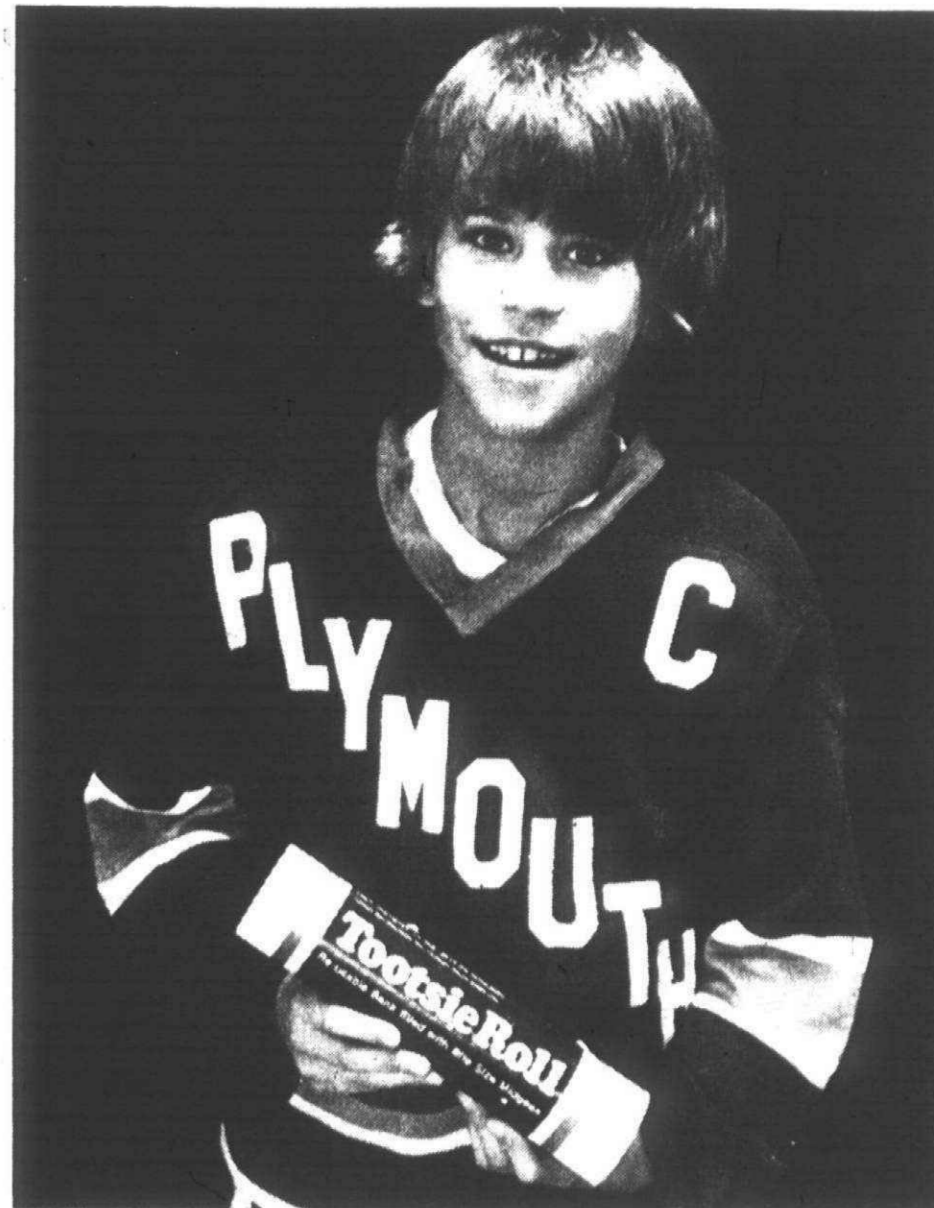

# Experienced Rocks eye 5th Sub-8 crown

To say "winning has become a tradition for Plymouth Salem basketball" would not only be a worn-out cliché used by sportswriters but also an understatement of what Rocks' basketball is all about.

Since Salem head basketball coach Fred Thomann came to Plymouth in the 1972-73 season, his teams have broken every Plymouth record in the book.

Thomann's "worst" season was his first where his team finished with a (believe-it-or-not) 15-6 record. He has owned the Suburban Eight League trophy for the past four years and has won the last four of five Christmas tournaments—including the last three in a row.

His teams have truly been the envy of all others in the western suburbs.

So, as another Salem basketball season approaches, with the opening game at 8 p.m. Tuesday night at Walled Lake Central, what does Thomann have to offer Plymouth fans this time around?

Well, it's the same old story—another experienced, sound team which not only is favored to win an unprecedented (and remarkable) fifth straight Sub-8 title, but also could be considered one of the best teams in the state.

"We have an extra good group this year," Thomann said. "All the kids have good court concepts. Some may score more than others but the job of winning games gets done in practice—and we've had good practices."

The obvious strength is in expe-

rience where Thomann has nine returning lettermen back from a 17-5 season of a year ago.

Thomann said he has confidence that all nine can step on the court and do the job now.

The only returner who won't have that opportunity when the season opens is junior Rich Hewlett who is still sidelined from a broken collarbone suffered when playing quarterback for the Rocks late in the grid season.

Hewlett started last season as a sophomore at guard. Thomann says it's up to the doctors when Hewlett returns. "It could be as early as Thanksgiving and as late as mid-December," the Salem mentor said. Thomann stressed Hewlett would not be rushed into the lineup.

Heading the list of returning players are co-captains Tom Ellinghausen and Mike Christie.

Ellinghausen, younger brother of Jim who is a former all-stater at Salem and currently in his sophomore season at Ohio State University, is a three-year starter who was the Rocks' leading scorer as a junior last year. He also was a all-Sub-8 and all-Observersland selection.

Christie was a starter early last year but was injured and then came off the bench during the majority of the season. He has exceptional quickness and strong offensive moves from his guard position.

Doug Agnew and John Broderick, both members of the Salem football team, are strong defensive players at guard and forward respectively.

Matt Etienne is a returning junior

who saw some action off the bench as a sophomore guard last year.

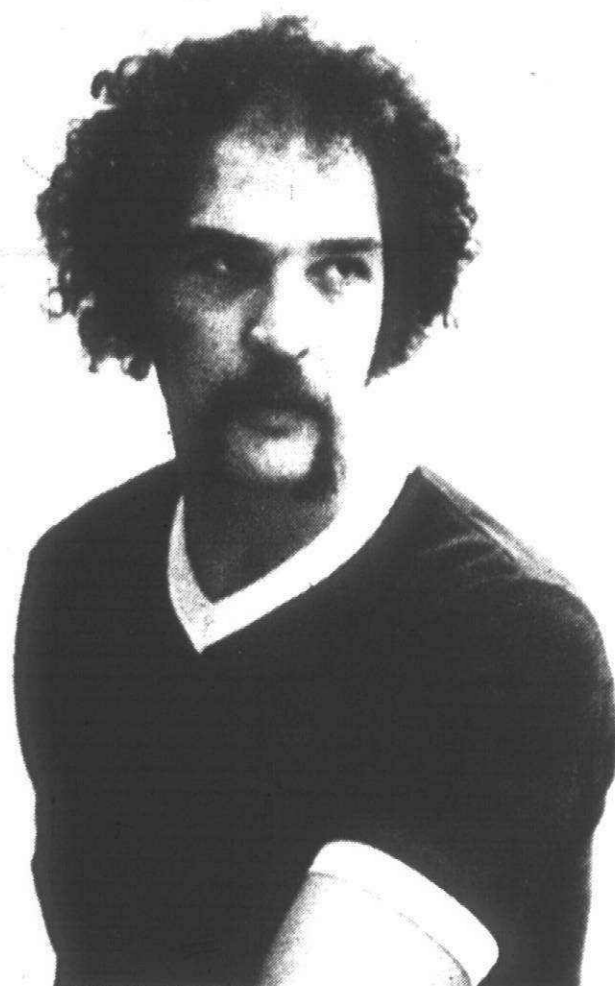
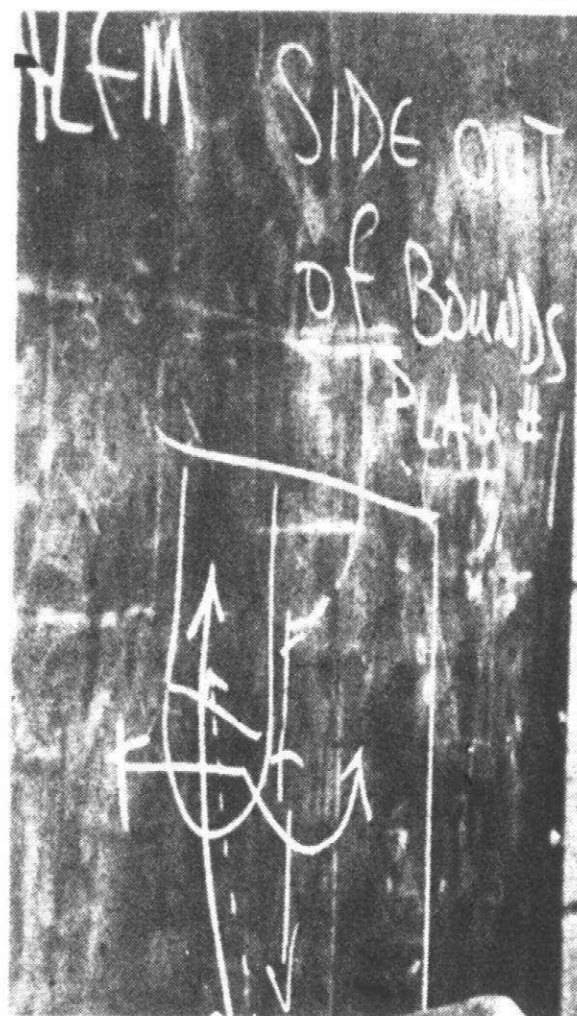
Steve Horton and Bob Hissom are two forwards who saw little action last year but have shown improvement. Dave Monk is another returning senior who saw little action as a junior but could be productive as a swing player.

Among the five newcomers on the 14-man squad are juniors Paul Dillon, Kevin Kelliher, Bill Thimm, Barry Owens and John VanWagoner. These five players are all members of last year's junior varsity.

Thomann said all the newcomers are smart players but must develop competitiveness as part of the learning situation this year.

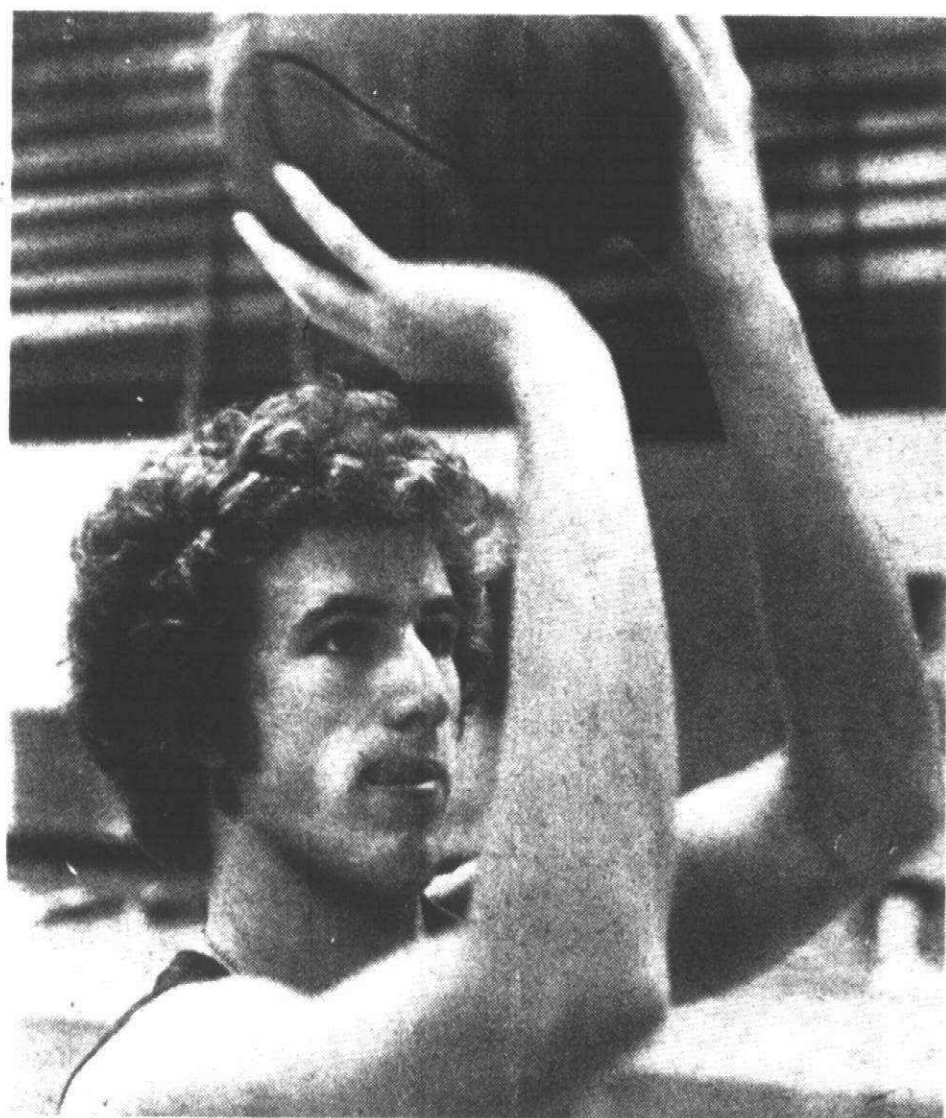

# 4 area cage teams vie for NWS honors

The Northwest Suburban League has always been known for its fierce competition in all high school sports and boys basketball is no exception. The

"We're going to be very green this year but I think our consistency will be a strong point," Croteau said.

Thurston will run a 1-4 offense and a man-to-man and variety-of-zone defense.

As for the league, Croteau said that North Farmington and Glenn will be the teams to beat.

JOHN GLENN will bring to the season the experience of four returning players. Three of the four were regular starters, while one played part of the time.

Center Tom Jurewicz, and Pat McBride and Daran Armstrong in the backcourt all have the experience that Glenn will need to contest for the league title. All three are seniors with good height.

Doug Martin, a senior, rounds out the four at guard. He played part of the time for the Rockets last year.

Other players with some experience for Glenn include Mitch Preston, a senior forward and Ed Bates, a senior guard.

Brad Summers and Brad Jennings should also see action for the Rockets.

Both came up from the junior varsity squad. Summers is a senior center and Jennings is a junior forward.

"A strong point for the team is our fine shooting but the key to how well we do will be our ability to rebound. We need stronger rebounding and more work on the defensive angle of the game," said coach Gordon Davis.

In the league, Davis said that North Farmington will be the toughest team. "We have experience and quickness but we are not very big," he said.

THE PATRIOTS, according to new Franklin coach Jim McIntyre, have enthusiasm and aggressiveness on their side in addition to the experience of a number of returning players.

"We are very enthusiastic. But we need to play and gain experience. We shall be a young team in general," said McIntyre.

John Zannis and Pat Golem will lead the Patriots in their bid for the league title. Both are senior forwards with good height.

The Patriots also have two juniors with experience in John McCool and Jim Wilson. McCool is a center, while Wilson is a guard.

Other hopefuls for Franklin include Glenn Murray, senior guard; Tom Hollandsworth, senior guard; Matt Thomas, Gary DeYonker, Jeff Reich and Ray Singer.

Thomas, DeYonker, Reich and Singer are all juniors and look strong for the Patriots.

"Our strong points include our defensive aggressiveness, enthusiasm, and good team spirit," McIntyre said.

"As for weak points, we need to be able to cover everything on both ends of the court. More specifically on the boards."

According to McIntyre, the league race will probably be a dogfight between North Farmington and Glenn.

"Our lack of experience will show at times during the season," the coach concluded.

GARDEN CITY East will have to make up in quickness what it lacks in height, said coach Billy Joe Young. The Panthers of East will also count heavily on the shooting ability of its more experienced players, Young said.

East has four returning starters with experience. However, only three will see action early in the year because Joe Emery has an injury.

Jim Dizakan heads the list of returners. He will start at forward. Steve Topalan and Brian Slaven are the other key players for the Panthers. Both are guards. All three returners are seniors.

East also has three potential starters in Mike Kossick, at center, Tim Taylor, at forward, and Todd Arner, at guard. All three are juniors.

Rich Roy, Rodney Bentz, and Dave Berger are also good possibilities for the Panthers according to coach Young.

"Height and lack of experience will be our weak points. But I'm very pleased with the team's attitude and the progress they are making as a team," Young said.

## Skateboarding stays popular

In recent years, Churchill, Salem, Stevenson and Thurston were paired by luck of the draw where

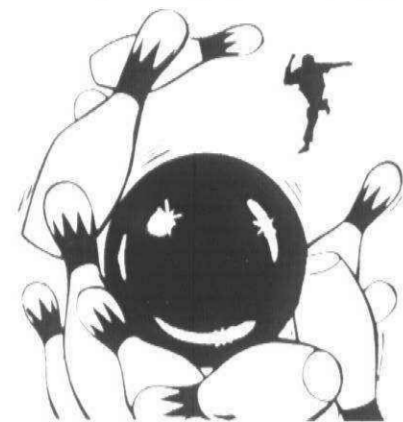
the losers of the first round played in the consolation game and the winners matched up for the championship battle.

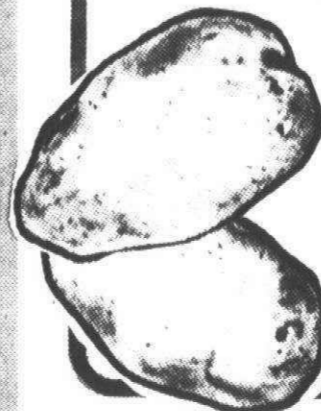

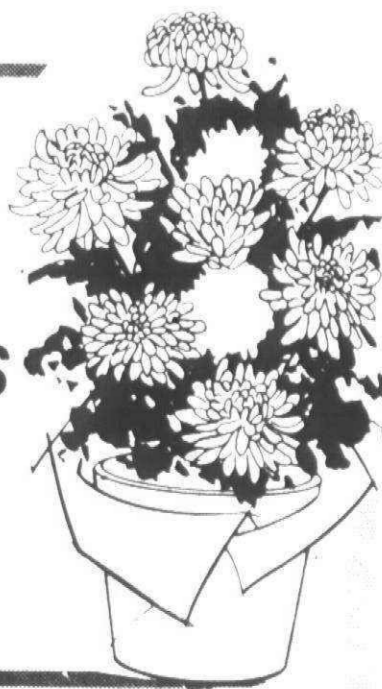

According to Ms. Panko, the play was part of a language arts class

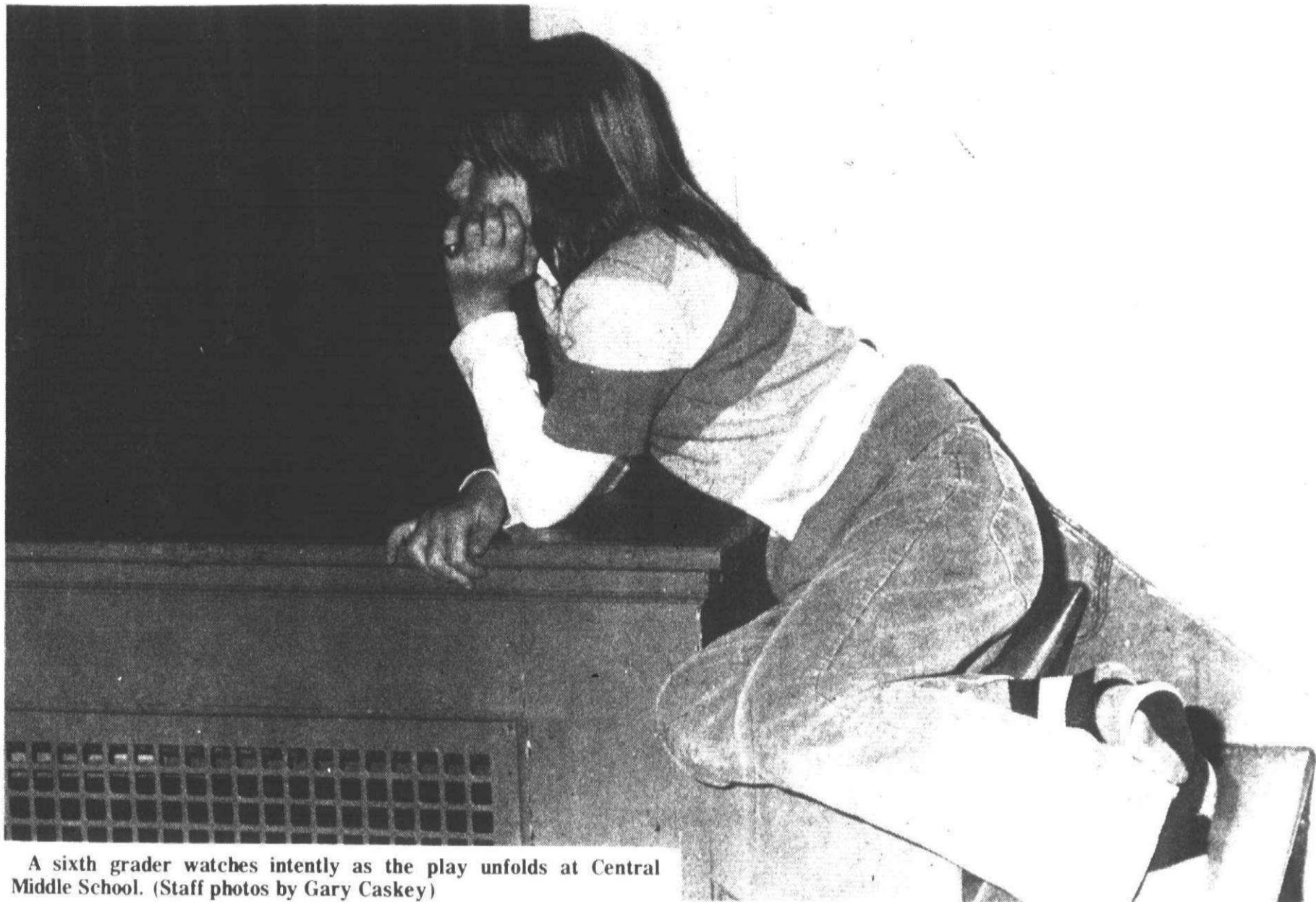
assignment. "We try a very positive approach with this program," she said. "We are student-centered rather than subject-centered."

# 'Roseland' action moves slowly

"Roseland" (PG) is a movie that makes television look good. It is incredibly slow, dreary and trite. Comprised of three separate episodes, the movie is held together by its single locale, the old Roseland Ballroom in New York City, and its narrator, Cleo (Helen Gallagher), the dance instructor at the Roseland.

With the exception of a few exterior scenes, the entire movie was shot amid the faded elegance of the Roseland, a place that appears as a haven for lonely and older singles, widows, widowers.

With this kind of basic situational material, a movie can develop and heighten situations to create socko drama or it can get caught in them as if they were interesting enough in themselves. They're not, and Roseland isn't socko.

The first episode completely lacks dramatic tension. It proceeds as if someone almost had an idea for "The Twilight Zone" but never worked it through. Teresa Wright plays a prim widow who dislikes but pursues a coarse widower (Lou Jacobi).

She is attracted to him because when they dance together she sees a youthful vision in the mirror of herself and her late husband.

THE SECOND episode concerns the ploys of a gigolo and his mini-harem. Christopher Walken is the well-groomed, smooth-talking gigolo. He is pampered by a wealthy, middle-aged woman (Joan Copeland), while he charms a deserted wife (Geraldine Chaplin), and still hangs around with Cleo, who "taught him everything he knows."

When the attractive and unbelievably naive wife, who has just found a full-time job, invites him to live with her, rent-free, while she moonlights as a waitress at night to pay for his dancing lessons and support him in the style he desires, the audience is left scoffing and smirking.

We're finally moved from boredom to incredulity to laughter, not because the last episode is so funny, but because it is so terrible.

Lila Skala, as a cultured and gusty older woman with a thick Viennese accent, is terrific in an awful role. This last act is nearly a monologue as she recounts her desire to win the Peabody dance contest at the Roseland. Unfortunately, the dialogue she has to work with is so dreadful, no performer could compensate for it.

THERE IS a difference between a writer who has an ear for natural speech and one who has an ear for banalities. Constructing a monologue out of banalities while trying to delineate a highly individual character makes that character look ridiculous.

It's as if King Lear were to recite his problems on the level of a letter to Ann Landers.

There are some fine actors in "Roseland," but they have nothing to work with in this dull film. It's enough to make one long for sex and violence.

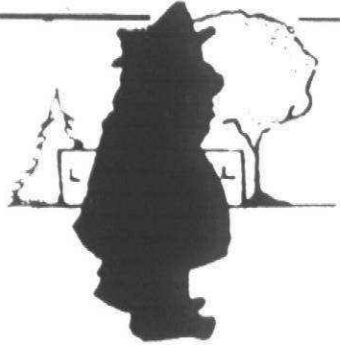

## A flag for Uncle Byron

"Old soldiers never die. They just fade away."

Those immortal words, spoken by the late Gen. Douglas MacArthur in his emotional farewell address before the U.S. Congress more than a quarter of a century ago, came rolling back through the years the other afternoon in a small funeral home in the little town of Algonac on the banks of the St. Clair River.

The Stroller and his mate were attending services for her Uncle Byron Ames and we were expecting the ordinary small town ceremonies for a man who attained the age of 83 years even though he had served overseas on World War I.

But what a touching reaction we had when members of the Fred Quandt Post No. 3901, Veterans of Foreign Wars filed into the room the night before the service and stood guard at their comrade's casket.

UNCLE BYRON had lived the life of a recluse during the past 12 years and we rather expected that the visitors at the services would be few.

But the veterans, in full uniform, changed that. Not only did they stand guard at the casket, but changed the guard every 10 minutes much the same as the tradition at the tomb of the Unknown Soldier in the nation's capital.

It was a touching sight, and from these men in uniform we learned more about Uncle Byron than we ever had to know.

They were quick to tell us that he was the oldest member of the post and one of the most respected, though because of his ill health, they hadn't seen much of him in late years.

"You know," Beaver Smith, one of his old buddies said, "He was the only one drafted from the lake freighters for World War I. We went overseas and were buddies for a long time."

Another spoke up to tell us that Uncle Byron was the veteran responsible for keeping the American Legion alive in Algonac. "Yes," he said, "and if it wasn't for him there would have been no American Legion post here. And he was a big help, too, in organizing the VFW and making possible our nice hall and club house. He was a charter member and we always will remember him."

And so it went as many of the veterans came by to express their sympathy and tell us about some of the contributions Uncle Byron made to the

post and the community during his younger days.

It was at the funeral services, though, that they really showed their affection of the little fellow who had done so much for them even after serving overseas under the Stars and Stripes.

ON THE DAY of the funeral they came in full uniform. One by one they passed the bier and saluted. Then they stood guard throughout the services. At the graveside they took charge and with full military honors they gave Uncle Byron a 21-gun salute as taps sounded in the distance.

At the conclusion, when the last farewell was said, they carefully removed the American flag from the casket, folded it tightly, and handed it to the Stroller's help mate, Uncle Byron's closest blood relative, hers to keep in memory of him.

Back at the VFW hall the Ladies Auxiliary served a lovely luncheon for the mourners and my lady couldn't find words to express her appreciation for the military services.

All the while there was something touching about every move. One by one the old soldiers passed and expressed their grief at the death of their oldest member.

Finally, the Stroller's lady who had watched over her Uncle Byron for years and never missed calling on him during our summer vacations, broke her silence.

"Is there something I can do in the way of a memorial to Uncle Byron," she asked one of the officers. "I certainly would like to do something tangible to show my appreciation."

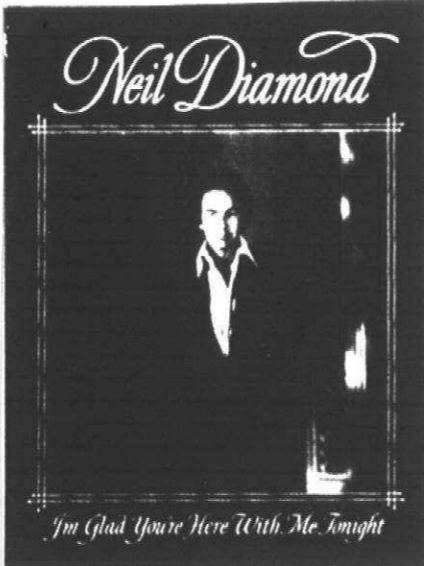
"One of the finest things you could do," the officer told her, "would be to return the flag to the post in his honor and we would fly it on our flagpole in memory of Byron."

She agreed. And when the veterans, in their uniforms, lined up in parade order, she calmly walked up to the commander and, with rear dimmed eyes, said, "Mr. Commander and gentleman, I would like to present this flag to the VFW Post in memory of my Uncle Byron. May it fly in his honor until it is tattered and torn."

With a salute, the flag was accepted. And all the while the Stroller stood at her side any by the looks on the faces of the men who served in the armed forces with him, the immortal words of Gen. MacArthur, in his farewell address more than a quarter of a century ago, seemed to be born again.

In the future on our summer vacation trips to the St. Clair River we will always be looking for Uncle Byron's flag waving in the breeze.

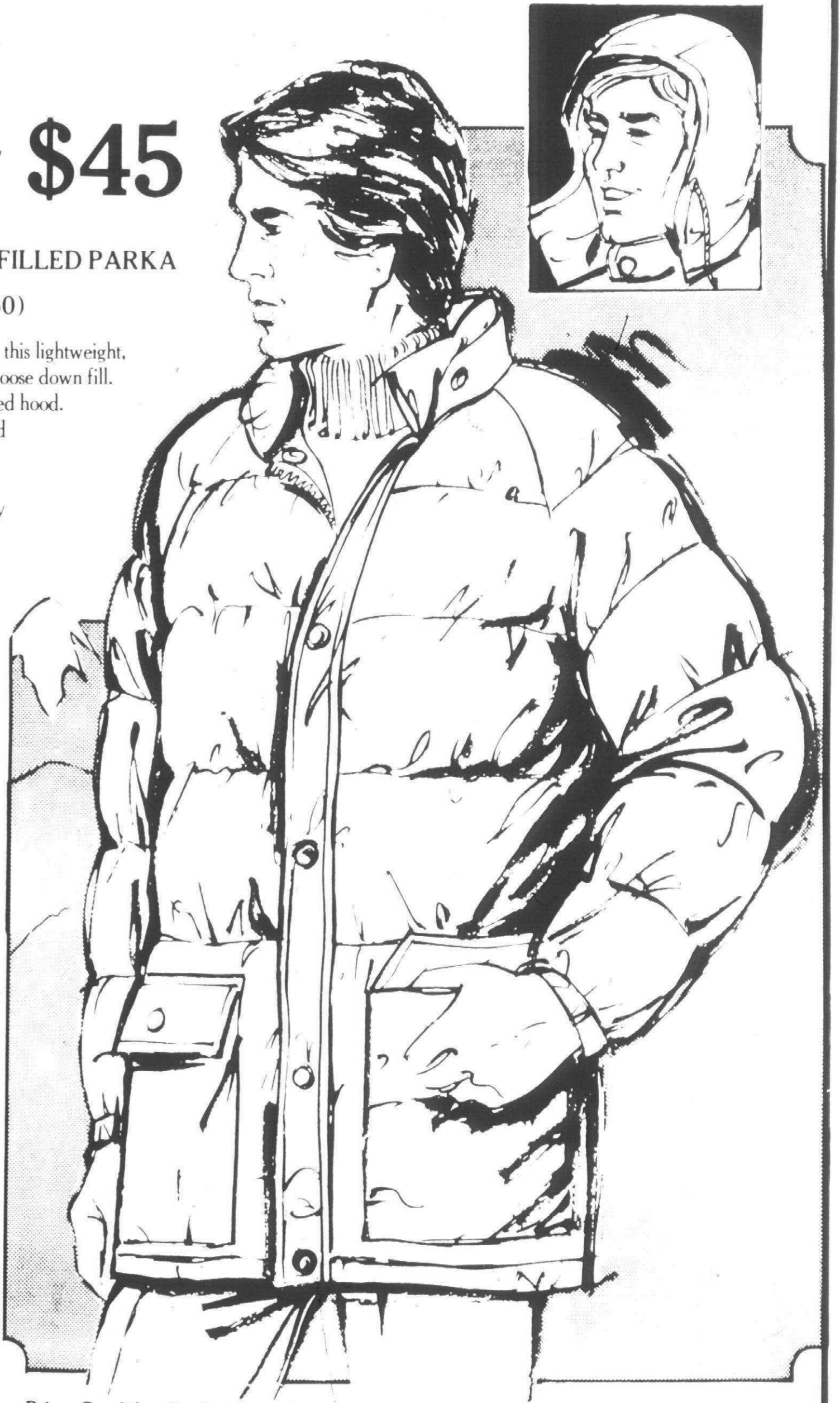

## SC trustees repeat poll on size of board

The question of whether Schoolcraft College should have seven or nine members on its board of trustees is still unresolved in the state legislature.

A senate bill would reduce the eight-member board to seven.

A house bill would raise it to nine.

The board learned in a new poll taken last week that college trustees prefer nine. The vote was 6-2, with Vice-chairman Ron Cowden and Trustee Leonard Wozniak in the minority. It voted again because two new trustees have come aboard since the last poll last December.

Wozniak is one of the new trustees. The other, Harry Greenleaf, backed a nine-member board.

STATE REP. Robert Law (R-Livonia) visited the board meeting last Wednesday and said he would carry the board's message back to a conference committee, consisting of three senators and three representatives, who hope to settle the differences.

Members include Sens. Gary Corbin (D-Flint), Jack Faxon (D-Detroit) and R. Robert Geake (R-Northville), a former Schoolcraft trustee; and Reps. Jackie Vaughn (D-Detroit), Daisy Elliott (D-Detroit) and Ruth McNamee (R-Birmingham).

Law said Geake favors seven members; Rep. Jack Kirksey (R-Livonia) leans toward seven; and Law himself leans toward nine.

THE SENATE, which originates college legislation and appropriations by tradition, favors seven members because all but one of the other 28 community colleges in Michigan have seven-member boards.

Schoolcraft Chairman Paul Kadish called "uniformity for its own sake flimsy."

Schoolcraft had a seven-member board when it was organized—three

elected at large and one from each of the four member K-12 districts. When a fifth district joined the college pact, the board was increased to eight members.

But that makeup violated the U.S. Constitution by providing for a malapportioned board—the Livonia district, with half the population, had the same representation as Clarenceville and Northville, with five per cent each of the population. In a 1971 lawsuit, the college agreed to elect its trustees at large and to seek remedial legislation

# They're diverse and determined at Houston

HOUSTON—"At least they can't say they gave a woman's conference and nobody came."

So said Eleanor Smeal, president of the National Organization for Women (NOW) as upwards of 20,000 people poured into Houston, jamming every hotel and motel.

Thirty Houston churches are housing women here for alternate meetings, the "pro-family" sessions for those who oppose the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA), abortion and other feminist causes.

But many have been greeted with "no room at the inn."

On Friday, two planes from Detroit Metro Airport brought both pro and anti-feminists here. When a Missouri television crew appeared at Houston Airport, the Michigan groups quickly took sides.

Some brought out huge banners saying "Stop ERA." Similar signs and buttons for Equal Rights were displayed. It was all good-natured, however, and the camera crew wound up with a film of a spirited group singing "Hail to the Victors," something they could all agree on.

The conference is mandated by legislation sponsored by former Congresswoman Bella Abzug, "to identify the barriers that prevent women from participating fully in all aspects of national life and to develop recommendations for means by which such barriers would be removed."

The recommendations made here will be forwarded to the Carter administration.

Women probed areas like the arts and humanities, battered women, child abuse, child care, education, credit, the disabled, employment, ERA, media, minority women, older women, rape, reproductive freedom, rural women, sexual preference and

the creation of a cabinet-level woman's department.

**LAURA, DONNA** Maryann, Odessa, Delilah, Jean, Suzanna, Maria, Luisa and Penny—each as different as their names.

They are mothers, daughters, farmers wives, insurance agents, students, lawyers and legislators.

"Women hold up half the sky," read the inscription on a bright blue balloon. The slogan originated in the Peoples Republic of China. In Houston it seems as though they hold up more than their share of sky and concerns too.

Maryann Mahaffy, a Detroit councilperson and active 17th district Democrat, came as one of the 200 nationally-selected delegates-at-large.

She was also nominated to be a floor leader.

"I hope the focus here will be on agreement," she said. "I want to see the conference hone in on economic issues, such as credit problems, pension, and divorce discrimination."

"The economic burdens of women homemakers are heavy. They have no retirement, no pension."

Patricia Barbour, national director of Happiness of Womanhood, said her group is also concerned about homemakers.

An alternate delegate, she represents an anti-feminist view expected to be vocal but among the minority of those gathered here.

"I'm a Mrs.," she said, "and Ms. means miserable."

Mrs. Barbour said she came to the meeting so her voice as an ERA opponent would be heard. "I feel we are the majority," she said, adding that the kitchen table in her Detroit house is her group's office because the group has no federal funding.

**FOR LAURA CALLOW** of Livonia, an observer, support of the ERA is paramount. "I came to Houston because it's historic," she said. "I'm concerned about consensus, but I will not be intimidated."

Mrs. Callow is co-chairperson of ERAmerica and she believes this meeting is going to help women understand why they need ERA.

Also boosting ERA are Joan Silver and Sally Posthill of Plymouth.

Mrs. Silver, a Business and Professional Women's organization member, is an insurance representative for ITT and has a grown family.

"What's important is that ERA is for everyone," she said, "not just women. Coming here is vital because if you don't communicate, nothing happens, and if we can communicate, that's progress."

Mrs. Posthill is active with the League of Women Voters, and although busy with three children and a part-time job, came to support ERA.

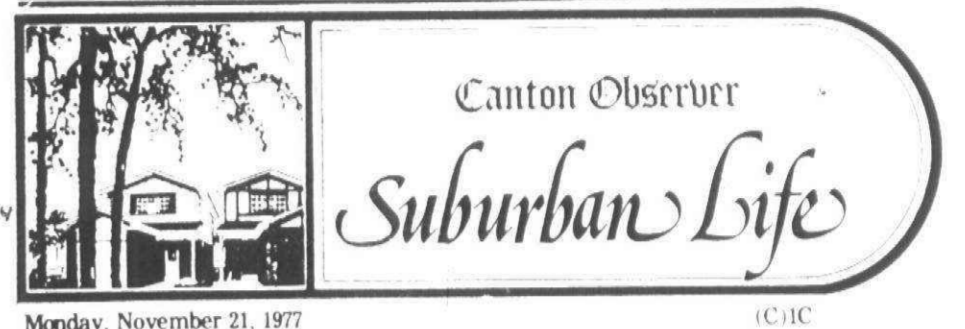
Not a homemaker or a businesswoman, Donna Watson, of Ferndale, said she came to Houston because her future is at stake in the decisions being made.

The former Southfield resident is a graduate student in developmental psychology.

"Three years ago I identified myself as a lesbian," she said. "The woman's movement is not a trivial thing. I'm not here because I thought it might be fun. What's happening concerning gay rights here is pertinent to my future. I may want to teach at a public university some day. For other women, whether or not they can get an abortion is a matter of life and death."

**PATRICIA BURNETT**, a delegate, is the chairperson of the Michigan Women's Commission and has long been involved in women's issues.

"I'm on the Michigan Women's Commission and on Happiness of Womanhood's national board and we don't want ERA; it opens too many doors," she said.

Shirley Monson of Farmington Hills, a NOW activist and member of several Jewish women's organizations, used part of her conference time to attend the black caucus.

"Someone asked me if I was passing," she quipped, but added she had been a member of the NAACP for many years.

Reggie Gerstman of Ann Arbor is a social worker, formerly working in the Livonia office of the Family Services of Detroit and Wayne County.

"I am going to attend meetings here for women psychotherapists," she said. "I deal with women going through divorce in my private practice. It's essential for me to be part of this very important event."

They're the conference's most diverse group. They're the oldest in average age with three women over 55. Michigan's delegation went to Houston determined to be heard.
