**A SPECIAL meeting takes place at 7 p.m. Wednesday in Township Hall to discuss a possible consolidation of the police and firefighting duties.**

Glenford Leonard and Robert Deadman, who recently prepared a public-safety report for Canton Township, will attend the meeting to answer questions. No decision will be made that night.

**THE HISTORICAL Society will cosponsor a carnival at New Towne Plaza shopping center, Ford and Canton Center roads, for the week of April 20-25.**

Township officials had hesitated to permit the event unless a local, nonprofit group offered sponsorship. The Township Board accepted the historical society's sponsorship last week.

**CHANGES IN Canton's sign ordinance are official, with the adoption of new guidelines last week.**

The new guidelines will allow larger signs and permit the erection of billboards and tower signs.

**A RED CROSS blood drive will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday in Canton Township Hall.**

The drive is cosponsored by the Western Wayne County chapter of the Children's Leukemia Foundation and the Dingeldej family of Canton.

Jake Dingeldej is director of the Canton Public Works Department. His wife, Mary, received a bone-marrow transplant several months ago in her fight against leukemia.

A similar drive last year raised 200 pints of blood. This year's goal is 250 to 300 pints.

## Skills project goes on despite flak

Some high school teachers call it an administrative "bombshell," but the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education says these teachers will complete the controversial Instructional Skills Program (ISP).

Trustee Tom Yack is upset with many negative comments about the program, recently reported by the Observer.

"I find some of the comments in our newspapers incredible," Yack said. "I think teacher education in this country is a disaster. The objective (of ISP) is to improve education — and that's what we (the board) all want."

"And we ask that it be given half a chance — even half a commitment to do it."

The program, approved by the board last year, includes six half-day, in-service sessions for teachers and administrators. It is designed to

increase the amount of learning in the classroom — and give additional training to staff members. It costs the district \$20,000.

**ELEMENTARY AND** middle school teachers will complete the project by May 19. High school teachers at the Centennial Educational Park, however, attended the first of six sessions and balked at its content, saying the program was a waste of time.

Administrators met Wednesday with a committee of high school teachers who want to change the content of ISP. Middle- and elementary-school teachers have not formally battled administration on this program.

The meeting with the modification committee was a "free exchange of ideas," said Bill Brown, principal at Plymouth Salem High School.

"I thought it was good we were given a chance to examine and given the opportunity to adapt

(the program) to secondary education," Brown said.

**BOARD MEMBERS** want all teachers to complete the program before the end of the school year. A second session for high school teachers is scheduled for April 7, Brown said.

It's too early to tell if the program will be completed by CEP teachers this year, but there is an effort to do so, Brown said.

"I'm more concerned that we do it well and make it meaningful," Brown said.

**RON CARLSON**, a mathematics teacher and member of the committee, said the comments that appeared in the Observer were mild compared to the general reaction of most teachers about the first session. However, teachers believe the first session was totally inappropriate for secondary education.

"The attitude was basically 'Let's do it and

get it over,'" Carlson said of the meeting.

"We suggested several different alternatives and different ways to package it

"They (the administrators) took those suggestions and said they would get back to us next week. I assume that they are going to restructure it where it will have some meaning."

Superintendent John Hoben also is upset about the negative feelings toward ISP. The board is very anxious to complete the program and feels very strongly about its worth to the district, Hoben said.

"**WE FEEL**, essentially, that it (ISP) will lead to better education, and the publicity that they (teachers) are getting is eroding what we are trying to do," Hoben said.

"The bottom line is better instructional skills, and it isn't going to be done by getting at each others' throats."

## Principal slaps student; Tanger parents irate

The parents of a student hit by a principal are expected to express their discontent with how the matter was handled at tonight's school board workshop.

Tanger Principal Carrol Nichols received a written reprimand for slapping fifth-grader Swane Taddonio across the face during recess on March 11.

Marge Taddonio said a written reprimand was insufficient. She will meet with superintendent John Hoben, school board President Carol Davis and Shirley Spaniel, executive director of elementary education, at 7 p.m. tonight.

"We will still be at the school board meeting, regardless of the outcome at the 7 o'clock meeting. We want to make sure what happened is known," Taddonio said.

Other Tanger parents are expected to be in attendance when Taddonio asks the board to request Nichols' resignation and the 7:30 p.m. work session.

**THE INCIDENT** occurred during a soccer game after Swane collided with another student, Taddonio said.

"Swane ran into another child and got up saying, 'The next time a kid

comes in front of me, I'm really going to plow him,'" she said.

At this point, Nichols told Swane to go up against the wall. Swane asked why and Nichols grabbed the youngster with one hand and hit him across the face, from behind, with the other, she said.

Nichols refused comment on the incident, saying he didn't know Taddonio was going to the school board.

Striking a student is in violation of a board policy that bans the use of corporal punishment, unless there is a direct threat of safety.

Taddonio said she learned of the incident after another parent called her to ask if it had really happened. After a meeting with Nichols, she notified Hoben of the incident and asked for action.

**HOBEN'S SUBSEQUENT** investigation resulted in a written reprimand, which said,

"... I feel the offense is serious enough that it warrants a written reprimand. You will cease and desist from this type of action in the future

Hoben was unavailable Friday for comment on the reprimand.

Taddonio agrees the offense is serious and wants further action by the school administration.

## Flood insurance available to residents

When your basement is full of backed-up flood water, you might wish you'd taken out some flood insurance.

Canton residents are eligible to buy federally backed insurance, because the township has adopted flood management regulations.

The insurance is available only in communities that have such a plan. Many persons are unaware of the insurance, officials say.

"This is certainly the time of year that people have (flood coverage) in mind," said Dave Nicholson, a township planner who helped draw up the flood management guidelines.

Homeowners' policies exclude flood damage, said Glee Bohanon, of Farmers Insurance in Canton. However, agencies specializing in homeowners' coverage can process applications for flood coverage.

"YOU HAVE to buy the insurance before the

storm," said Bohanon. "Most people don't think about it until after the storm."

The program is administered by the Federal Insurance Administration in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Minimum cost per year is \$250.

The insurance covers flooding, sewer and debris back-up and water-main breaks that occur because of overflow of a river, stream or ditch, unusual and rapid accumulation of water, and mudslides or collapse of shoreline land.

Broken pipes or sewer lines aren't considered floods.

**THE INSURANCE** covers walled and roofed buildings, as well as mobile homes attached to a permanent site. Property outside the building cannot be insured.

Periodic flooding has been a problem in Canton.

For example, the basements of 350-400 houses in eastern Canton filled with up to two feet of sewer water on April 13, 1979.

The flooding was caused when the ground could no longer absorb moisture because it was already saturated, engineers said. Other factors, according to reports, may have been obstructions in sanitary sewer lines, bridges in drainage ditches and accumulated silt.

Flooding also occurred after a devastating rainstorm in July 1980.

**THE TOWNSHIP** adopted flood-hazard management regulations in 1981, setting up construction guidelines in flood plain areas.

The regulations allowed Canton property-owners to qualify for the insurance. But it's uncertain how many persons are aware of the benefit.

"The information was made available at public hearings that weren't well attended," Nicholson said.

Studies of flooding susceptibility have been done in heavily populated eastern Canton. A map in the planning department denotes high-risk areas.

Nicholson said Canton is classified under federal guidelines as a "zone C" community, indicating minimal flood risk. Rates would be lowest in zone C.

Zone A areas carry a higher risk and a higher premium.

Flood plain maps show areas that would be inundated by a so-called "100-year storm" — the worst storm that is likely to occur in a 100-year period.

**ONLY 20-25** buildings in Canton are within flood plains, according to planners. Most were built before 1965.

However, some subdivisions and mobile home parks are near flood plains. One of the largest is the Pickwick subdivision, north of Ford Road, extending east from Lilley to the area of the I-275 freeway.

The Canton planning commission recently requested a cost estimate for doing a flood plain study in the western portion of the township.

## Tornado safety discussed

Spring means tulips, warm weather and the start of peak tornado activity.

Although tornadoes can occur any time or any place, they are most likely to strike between April and July.

A tornado spotters' meeting will be held at 7 p.m. Wednesday in Plymouth City Hall on Main Street for area persons who want to join Sky Warn, the early-warning tornado system.

Ken Rizzo of the National Weather Service will speak and show training films. Immediately afterward, at 8:30 p.m., a tornado safety class will inform persons about what to do during tornado watches and warnings.

The session is sponsored by the Plymouth Area REACT team, which also serves Canton. REACT is a volunteer emergency response group.

"**MICHIGAN, DUE** to its location on the fringe of what is known as 'tornado alley,' and with its high urban population, is particularly prone to tornadoes of a devastating nature," said Gov. William Milliken in a recent press release on tornado awareness.

Chuck VanVleck, local REACT commander, reminds residents to know the difference between a tornado watch and a tornado warning.

A watch is issued when weather conditions exist for severe thunderstorms which may become tornadoes. A watch is designed to give persons time to prepare and to warn others of the possibility of a tornado.

A tornado warning is issued when weather conditions or radar suggest a very strong possibility of tornado ac-

tivity or after a tornado has been sighted. Persons should take shelter when a tornado warning is issued.

**CANTON'S SEVERE** weather warning siren is three to five minutes long and is repeated at 15 to 20-minute intervals, said Police Chief Jerry Cox. Persons who hear this warning signal should seek shelter immediately and tune into a portable radio for directions.

Shelter should be taken in the following places:

• In a home, the basement offers the greatest safety — under sturdy furniture if possible. Persons without basements should take cover in the

# Auction on radio to be fund-raiser for WSDP

The third annual WSDP Radio Auction has been planned to raise funds for operating expenses to enable the student-operated radio station to continue broadcasting.

Merchandise and services donated from area merchants and by community celebrities will be auctioned off and sold to the highest bidder in the radio audience.

The auction will be broadcast on WSDP (88.1 on the FM dial) on Wednesday through Saturday, April 28-30 and May 1.

The fund-raiser is being coordinated by the 1982 Radio Auction Central Committee, a volunteer group led by Jeffrey Cardinal, Chet Latka and Joe Slezak, co-chairmen.

This year, because of severe budget cuts, proceeds from the auction will have to be used to keep WSDP on the air.

There is a tax advantage to merchants to donate, said Cardinal, plus the good will gained from supporting a worthy and educational program.

Bidders will have the chance to purchase merchandise at less than retail cost. Bidders can claim a tax deduction if the bid is more than retail value.

In 1979 WSDP increased its power to 200 watts, making it the most powerful high-school radio station in the state.

The station, located at Plymouth Salem High School, broadcasts a signal which covers 700 square miles and a population of more than 250,000. The students broadcast each weekday from 9:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m.

## Battle over 'paternalism' Who will parcel federal funds?

A major debate is brewing in 1982 between state administrators and local government officials over how to parcel out federal "block grant" money.

Some state officials say their offices should set spending priorities. They argue that, legally, local governments are creatures of the state.

Local officials call that "paternalistic." Their slogan is "joint determination."

"The federal government should insist the states sit down with local officials to determine how the funds will be used," said John Amberger, deputy director of the Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments. SEMCOG is a voluntary association of local units in seven counties which engages in regional planning.

PRESIDENT REAGAN'S new federalism program calls for taking 57 "categorical grant" programs, where money goes to local governments and schools which apply for them, and consolidating them into nine new "blocks."

Total funds would be reduced by about 25 percent. The money would go to the states to administer. Local officials say frankly they are worried not only about the cuts but that Lansing might decide to parcel out the funds differently — if at all. Examples:

- The Office of Community Development

opment in the Michigan Department of Commerce plans to rate grant applications on a scale of up to 395 points, with 100 big points going to those which provide the most jobs. The Michigan Townships Association contends such a system should be determined politically, not by state appointees; that the system overlooks the need for local facilities in favor of economic development; and that the system would be tilted in favor of large, developed communities and against small ones.

• In discussing federal clean water funds, Howard Tanner, director of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, told the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency: "We feel these limited funds can be best used if targeted to high-priority, statewide implementation efforts, and that any mandatory pass-through would only fragment these efforts."

Amberger quotes the letter with undisguised horror.

MICHAEL GLUSAC, SEMCOG's outgoing executive director, wants the federal government to mandate that the block grant money be passed through the state to local units.

"Here is a program where Congress wrote a law and the communities applied for funds," he said. "Now the issue becomes one of writing regulations for 'pass-through.'"

Adds Amberger: "Now the state wants to snatch it from us."

Glusac said local units have the informal beginnings of a process to develop their positions. It is an eight-member Michigan Council on Intergovernmental Relations.

The top staff person and the president representing each group are:

Michigan Municipal League, James C. Robertson, mayor of Gladwin, and Jack Patriarche; Michigan Association of Counties, Gladwin County Commissioner Sid Ouwinga and Barry McGuire; Michigan Townships Association, president Harry W. Meintz, a township supervisor from Menominee County, and Bob Robinson; and Michigan Association of Regions, Tom Keipert of Roscommon and Glusac.

Said Glusac: "It's very informal. There's no incorporation."

"MCIR is not the answer, but it is a forum. It could be more structured and more formalized. Many states are organizing state advisory councils," he said, citing Tennessee.

"The group meets monthly. Jack Patriarche makes up the agenda. We meet over lunch and talk for two or three hours. It's an informal mechanism to deal with changing federal mechanisms and other problems."

"There is probably more cooperation between local governments than I have ever seen in my lifetime."

AMBERGER ADDS, "If there is no

process, the states will unilaterally make those decisions."

The key, he said, is the term "joint determination," written into the 1974 Clean Air Act. That act requires state and local elected officials, in so many words, to determine jointly their priorities.

"State officials use the vague words 'We shall consult.' Well, 'consult' can mean anything, including the paternalistic announcement, 'Here's what we are going to do.'"

Glusac said, "The state will tell you local governments are creatures of the state. That was once true, but it's outmoded now."

He cited the Michigan Constitution, which mandated home rule for cities in 1908, home rule for counties and multi-jurisdictional cooperation in 1973.

Glusac credits Lt. Gov. James Brickley as head of the governor's Community Development Cabinet for being sensitive to local problems. But he argues that the cabinet is not adequately staffed to be a state office of local government.

Two governors, George Romney and William Milliken, have proposed a state office of local affairs. Always the proposal has died in the Legislature. Local officials find themselves dealing with virtually every department of state government — Transportation, Public Health, Treasury, Commerce and so on.

## Tornado safety observed

center of the house on the lowest floor in a small room, such as a closet or bathroom.

- Mobile home residents should leave the home and go to a prearranged substantial shelter, basement, ditch or ravine.

- Persons in a vehicle should travel at right angles to the path of the tornado. If there isn't time to drive away, get out and go to a basement, ditch or ravine away from the vehicle.

- At work or school, follow advance plans to move to interior hallways or small rooms on the lowest floor. Rooms with large free-span roofs and areas with windows should be avoided.

- In open country, lie flat in a ditch or depression and hold on to something on the ground if possible.

ACCORDING TO the Michigan State Police, an average of 17 tornadoes hit Michigan each year, with the majority occurring during late-afternoon or early-evening hours. Most happen between April and July.

Tornadoes usually come from the southwest at speeds of 20 to 45 miles per hour. Most tornadoes are on the ground less than 10 minutes, while traveling a distance of five miles.

Winds can range between 100 and 300 miles per hour. The destruction is due to the strong whirling, flying debris and partial vacuum in the center of the storm.

Canton Township tests its siren between noon and 1 p.m. on the first Saturday of each month. The test consists of a steady tone for one minute, followed by one minute of silence, then a wavering tone for a minute.

# Public safety deserves a chance

**T**OWNSHIP HALL WILL be packed at 7 p.m. Wednesday when proposed consolidation of Canton Township's police and fire departments will be discussed.

Formal decisions will not take place at this public hearing. It is strictly an informational session to present both sides of this delicate issue. Anyone may attend. Township Hall is on Canton Center, south of Cherry Hill.

Totally consolidating police and fire duties to form one public safety department is a drastic step from the traditional separate services offered to residents. Total consolidation is not good for Canton residents at this time.

But the concept of public safety deserves a chance to work.

Township officials, residents, firefighters and police officers should not let traditional forms of service hamper any decision. That would show a narrow perspective on an innovative concept.

**MANY DRAWBACKS** CAN be found with a public safety department. Fire and emergency services may be delayed because of fewer workers. This must be considered when discussing public safety for a township which has 48,000 residents in 36 square miles — an awfully large area.

However, taxpayers would save money under a public safety plan. Police and fire costs probably would not be cut in half, but these expenditures could be reduced by one-third with this plan.

The traditional service concept demonstrates a lot of wasted time — and a lot of wasted taxpayers' money.

Everyone appreciates the special qualities of firefighters and police officers. They must respond and make split-second decisions that could save a person's life.

But let's face it — those situations are few and far between in Canton, especially with firefighters. A large portion of firefighters' time — and taxpayers' money — can be used patrolling the roads. And Canton is in desperate need of more police cars on the road.

**MANY VARIATIONS** exist on the public safety concept. Police and fire departments don't have to be totally combined. In fact, it would be wrong to totally consolidate both departments. It would cause too much confusion and tremendously hamper services.

Total consolidation also would create morale problems in both departments. Some police officers were trained to be police officers only, and don't want to battle fires. Some firefighters simply don't like the idea of carrying a gun and patrolling roads.

Canton must decide on a public safety program that could be phased in over two or three years.

Make the commitment to the program NOW. Then give those persons interested in learning both fire and police skills the opportunity to be part of the public safety plan. Leave the others alone.

Different hiring procedures should be implemented. Only hire men and women interested in serving as public safety officers. Design a feasibility plan to properly cover the township under the dual-service concept.

**IT'S DIFFICULT** to change. Most persons are afraid of change.

But in these hard economic years, it's time to throw away tradition and try something new.

Public safety is the best way to use police officers, firefighters and — above all — taxpayers' money. It deserves a chance to work.

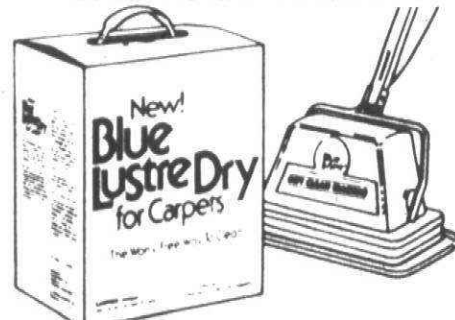

**Omnicom gives poor service**

To the editor:  
This letter is being written to advise our community of the poor service we feel Omnicom (cable television) is giving to its customers. We have been customers of Omnicom since November of 1981.

We subscribe to the full package that Omnicom offers. This service costs \$34.75 per month. To know what is offered with this service we must consult three different television guides. Two are sent to our home: "Premium Channels" and "HTN." "TV Television Magazine" is provided free by local merchants.

The "TV Television Magazine" is by far the most comprehensive guide. However, obtaining it can be and often is a problem. One must also take into account the fact that Omnicom is not publishing this guide. The guide's main purpose is advertising.

The "Premium Channels" guide is barely sufficient. It is mailed bulk rate and often is late. Over two days of viewing is listed on each set of two pages. An entire month's viewing for three channels is on 22 pages. This guide does not list any channels other than premi-

um channels, so its use requires other directories.

"HTN" is a guide for the Home Theatre Network only. This channel probably would not be subscribed to at all because of its poor selection of programming. However Omnicom has thrown in a remote control box with subscriptions to this channel. All but one or two programs on this channel are duplicated on other premium channels each month.

Omnicom customers have been told by sales people that basic service will include a directory channel. We have not seen one yet.

Each day when we sit down to view TV we start by looking in our Detroit Free Press TV Guide. We then consult our "Premium Channels" and "Television Magazine." After our minds have stopped reeling from all the confusion, and we're fairly certain of what is on when, we decide upon what we would like to see.

We'd like to see Omnicom fulfill its obligation to our community. One comprehensive guide for all channels that we subscribe to would be quite reasonable a request. One that should be fulfilled before Omnicom starts requesting more from us — such as an increase in the cost of basic service.

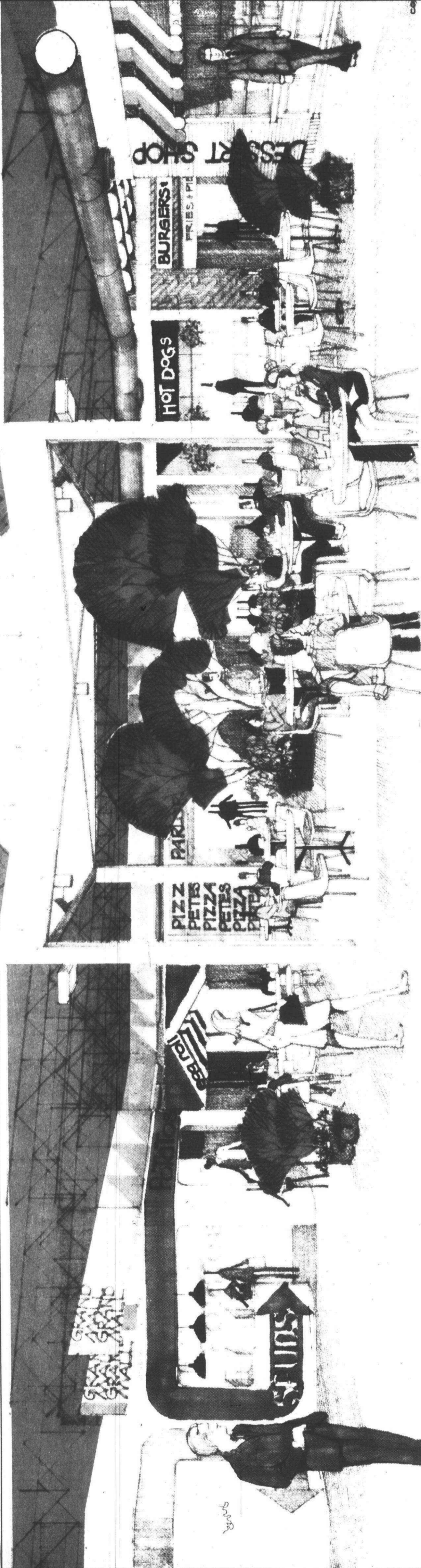

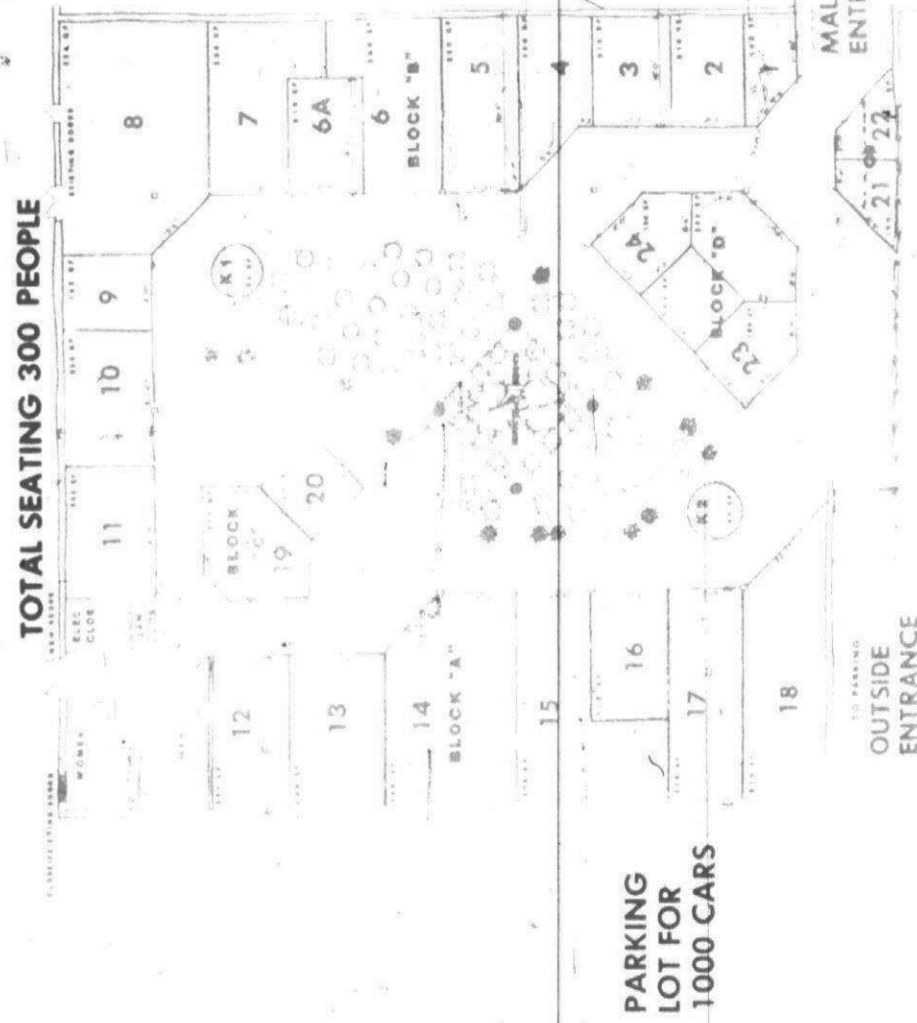

**DRY MILK**

**SWISS BROCCOLI SOUP**

Combine dry milk, flour and seasonings in a 3-quart heavy saucepan. Stir in water and condensed chicken broth until smooth. Bring to boiling over medium heat, stirring constantly. Boil and stir 1 minute. Meanwhile, sauté onion in butter until tender, about 3 minutes. Stir onion mixture and cooked broccoli into thickened mixture. Remove from heat and gradually stir in cheese until melted. If necessary, return to low heat to finish melting cheese. (Do not boil.) Serve immediately.

**CABBAGE LAYERED MEAT LOAF**

For sauce, sauté onion and celery in butter in 1-quart heavy saucepan until tender, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in remaining ingredients. Bring to boiling, stirring frequently. Simmer, uncovered, 15 minutes; set aside. Preheat oven to 325° F. For meat loaf, chop cabbage coarsely. Cook in salted boiling water, uncovered, 5 minutes; drain. Combine bread crumbs, dry milk, water, salt and pepper in a large mixing bowl. Mix in meat. Pat half of meat mixture onto bottom of an 8 inch square baking pan. Combine cabbage and half of the cheese. Spread over meat. Top with remaining meat mixture. Spoon sauce over all. Bake 55 to 60 minutes. Remove from oven and sprinkle with remaining half of cheese. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.

**MICROWAVE METHOD:** Prepare meat loaf and sauce as directed above; however, do not spoon sauce over meat loaf. Microwave meat loaf at High 12 to 16 minutes, rotating dish 1/2 turn after half the cooking time. Spoon sauce over meat loaf; sprinkle with remaining half of cheese. Microwave at High 2 to 3 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

**CHEESY ONION BREAD**

Yield: 2 loaves

Combine 2 cups flour, dry milk, dry yeast, sugar and salt in a large mixing bowl. Heat water and butter until very warm (120° to 130°F). Gradually add to dry ingredients. Beat 2 minutes at medium speed of mixer, scraping bowl occasionally. Beat in eggs. Add 1 cup flour. Beat 2 minutes on high speed, scraping bowl occasionally. Stir in cheese, onion and enough additional flour to make a stiff dough. Turn out on lightly floured surface; knead until smooth and elastic, about 10 minutes. Place in buttered bowl; turn to butter top. Cover; let rise in warm place until doubled in bulk, about 1 hour.

Punch dough down. Divide in half. Roll out each half on lightly floured surface to form a 12 x 8-inch rectangle. Beginning with short side, roll up tightly. Seal seam and both edges. Place seam side down in 2 buttered 9 x 5-inch loaf pans. Cover; let rise in warm place until doubled in bulk, about 45 minutes. Preheat to 375° F. Bake 35 to 40 minutes or until golden brown and loaf sounds hollow when tapped. Remove from pans and cool completely on wire racks. Serve with butter.

Fold whipped milk, fruit and coconut into gelatin mixture. Spoon into chilled crust. Chill several hours or overnight until firm. About 1 hour before serving, prepare topping. For topping, sprinkle 1/2 cup dry milk over 1/2 cup chilled pineapple juice. Beat until foamy. Add lemon juice. Continue beating until stiff peaks form. Spread to within 1 inch of edges. Garnish with orange and pineapple pieces and a cherry.

# How does nutrition affect human development?

any potential for a normal or productive life.

Human development involves all of the biological changes or events that take place in the life of the human from the time of conception until the time of death.

Development is an orderly unfolding of genetic information over time. It depends on two basic factors: first, the normality and quality of the genes, and, second, the impact of environmental pressures — including nutrition.

Nutrition includes not only the basic food necessary for energy, growth and protection, but also those essential materials that cannot be made within the human body but are critical for normal growth and development.

These include vitamins, certain ami-

no acids (the building blocks of proteins), fats, water, and trace elements that are required in varying amounts according to our heredity, ethnic background and stage of development.

Adequate nutrition is important for well-being at every stage in development, but especially during the early life of the organism, when it is more vulnerable to environmental influences than at any other period.

### PREGNANCY AND THE FETUS

One of the most sensitive periods in the development of the human is prior to birth. During pregnancy, the fetus is dependent completely upon the maternal environment for its nutrition, and it is shielded from the external environment by the mother and the placenta.

The fetus gets its nourishment from foods that have been metabolized by the mother. These nutrients are passed to the fetus through the placenta. The placenta effectively screens, facilitates or slows the flow of nutrients to the fetus, in addition to clearing waste produced by the fetus.

Thus the fetus depends for its well-being not only on its own inherent metabolism, but also upon the health of the mother as well as the functioning of the placenta. An extreme disturbance in any of the three can severely affect the fetus.

Both the timing and the severity of any abnormality are critical factors in determining its effect on the developing human being. For example, severe malnutrition of the mother very early in pregnancy can result in spontaneous abortion.

Severe malnutrition late in pregnancy can result in infants who are born too small or, in some cases, too soon. Such low-birthweight babies bear a higher than normal risk of retardation, deafness and other neurological disorders, and they account for a high percentage of the deaths among newborns throughout the world.

The effect on the fetus or newborn can be the same when the mother is well nourished but has a systemic disease (such as hypertension or heart or kidney disease) or when the placenta is malfunctioning.

The importance of special nutrients during the prenatal period is demonstrated by cases in which specific genetic defects prevent the mother of

the fetus from metabolizing an essential nutrient. For instance, in cases of maternal phenylketonuria, the mother is unable to metabolize an essential amino acid, phenylalanine. If her condition is left untreated, her infant is usually mentally retarded.

In the case of galactosemia, the fetus is incapable of metabolizing galactose, a component of milk sugar. If the pregnant mother is not given a low galactose diet, her infant might have cataracts and be mentally retarded.

### NEEDS OF THE INFANT

Following birth, infants are still dependent upon others for food. The caloric, protein and fluid requirements of infants vary according to their maturity, size and whether they were born prematurely. Premature infants, for example, require more water and more protein in relation to their weight than do full-term babies.

However, all newborns require certain specific nutritional elements. Certain amino acids are essential at this time of life but not later on in development. The same is true for such trace elements as iron and zinc, and for certain fatty acids.

The requirements of most newborns for proper growth and development can be met entirely by breast-feeding. However, when breast-feeding is not possible, infant formulas can be effective substitutes. Some infants with certain genetic disorders, such as galactosemia or phenylketonuria, cannot tolerate breast milk and require special formulas.

Individual needs in metabolism also dictate the requirements for calcium, iron and vitamins during infancy. Iron supplements are necessary during the infant's first year to allow proper red blood cell production during this period of rapid growth. Vitamins C and D and certain essential fats are also necessary.

The importance of proper nutrition during infancy becomes strikingly apparent when one considers that infants double their birth weights by age 5 months and quadruple them between 18 and 24 months, by which time toddlers are half their adult height.

### WEANING: RISKS TO TODDLERS

The next most critical period in development is that when the infant is weaned from bottle or breast. Indeed, weaning may be the most critical period in human life, especially in the poorer countries where, because of cultural and economic factors, many children are weaned to a diet high in carbohydrates and low in protein.

In the developing world, weaning is the period during which infants are most vulnerable to protein-energy mal-

nutrition. The lack of not only protein but also energy foods during this critical period, coupled with the additional needs of the growing toddler, is potentially lethal.

It is estimated that in the very poorest countries, more than 200 deaths occur among every 1,000 children aged 1-4. Many of these deaths are associated with inadequate nutrition.

### CHILDHOOD AND PUBERTY

During the period between 2 years of age and the growth spurt just before puberty, calories, protein, vitamins, water and mineral needs are minimal. Appetite during this period is related more to activity than to growth and development. Growth continues, but it often occurs in spurts, usually in the fall and spring, when the appetite and nutrition needs are increased.

With the onset of puberty, however, hormonal changes, growth, differentiation, sexual development and changes in body proportions all affect nutritional needs. Expressed in terms of needs per pound of body weight, more protein, more iron (in the menstruating woman), and more calories are necessary for the rapidly growing adolescent than for the adult.

### NUTRITION AND ADULT LIFE

Good nutrition in the fetus, infant, child and adolescent lays the basis for

a healthy adult life both physically and mentally. Obesity and other ailments of adult life, particularly at older ages, can be prevented if healthy eating patterns have been followed.

Although the effects of nutrition on development are most dramatic in the young, they are by no means confined to this age group. Many millions of adults in the less developed world are unable to do an adequate day's work because they do not get sufficient calories and proteins, vitamins and minerals. Their development in many ways is stunted not only by the irrevocable nutritional deprivations of infancy and childhood, but by chronic undernutrition as adults.

At the other extreme, many of us in richer countries experience impaired health and shortened life because of overconsumption, especially of sugars, salts and fats. Thus diet is a vital factor in human development throughout life.

State and local police are preparing to enforce the law and organizations like the Jaycettes and the Auto Club of Michigan are offering a hand to help parents comply.

The fine for non-compliance is \$10. Points on the driving record are not involved, and indications are that fines will be voided when restraint seats are obtained.

All children up to 12 months of age be buckled into a car seat that meets Federal safety standards, according to Michigan Public Act 117. The child must be properly restrained whether he is riding in the front or the back seat of a car.

Children 1-4 must ride in restraint seats if they are in the front seat and must be in a restraint seat or wear a lap seat belt in the back seat.

Seats manufactured after January 1981 are considered as approved, according to the Michigan Association for Traffic Safety. Seats come in two sizes.

Cradle-type infant seats are for little ones up to 9 months or 19 pounds. They always face the back of the car, because a baby's back is the strongest part of his body and best able to absorb the shock of a crash.

Toddler seats required for children up to 4 have harnesses and shields and can face either forward or back.

**LIZ ADAMS** of Livonia has been buckling her small daughter Corinne into a seat she rented from the Livonia Jaycettes.

"We came home from the hospital without it because Corinne was born Dec. 30, a week early, and we were not able to reach the Jaycettes," she said.

"But I'm very pleased to have the seat now and even more pleased to have the law going into effect. I knew a woman whose grandchild was thrown from the mother's arms and killed in a crash.

"It was such a needless tragedy." Infant seats also are available for rent from the Jaycettes of Garden City and Westland, both joining in the Michigan Jaycette "Buckle Up Baby" program.

**THE AUTOMOBILE** Club of Michigan will donate 600 child restraint seats to State Police, hospitals and community service groups, which then will make them available to the public.

The seats are described as a "universal" type that can be used for newborns and children up to 50 pounds.

"The donation is a natural outgrowth of our 50-year commitment to reduce traffic injuries and fatalities in Michigan," said Maura P. McCartan, Auto Club Livonia manager.

**JAYCETTE RENTALS** are of the infant seat variety only. The Livonia group owns 50 seats — all are in use at this time — and rents them for use until the child is 12 months or 20 pounds. The charge is \$22, \$12 of which is refundable.

Stephanie Allen, 525-3788, is putting names on the waiting list. She recommends that parents try to reserve seats before the baby is born.

Infant seats are being rented by the Canton Jaycettes, who hope to have toddler seats available in a couple of weeks. Rental is \$6 with a deposit of \$15. Project chairwoman Nancy Rentz may be contacted at 453-4702.

Garden City Jaycettes have a rental figure of \$8 and a deposit of \$8. Linda Barnes, whose daughter Becky survived a 1979 crash buckled into a child-restraint seat, is in charge of that program and can be reached at 522-2660.

**IN WESTLAND**, the Jaycette to call is Jeanette Schumacher, 326-1923.

That group has 12 seats, and Schumacher said early this week about half are in use. The price is \$10 deposit and \$15 rental for the time the baby fits the seat.

The larger and longer-in-use toddler restraint seats are not part of the local Jaycette programs.

"It's just too hard to keep track of

them for that long," said Allen. "We've lost some as it is. I start calling when the baby is about 9 months and most people bring them right back, but some are hard to locate.

"I had one mother tell me she had loaned hers to a sister in another state. That doesn't seem right when there people on waiting lists.

The infant seats can be bought for about \$25. The toddler seats range from \$35-\$45.

A representative of Toys-R-Us, which carries a large stock of seats, said the store has noted considerably increased interest, especially in the toddler variety, as the enforcement date for the law approaches.

**POLICE OFFICERS** in this area are prepared to enforce Public Act 117.

State police are to receive 200 seats from the Auto Club, and troopers have been instructed to stop cars in which a child under 4 is riding without proper restraint, ticket violators and loan the driver a car seat.

When the seat is returned and proof of purchase is presented, the ticket will be voided.

Garden City took early action in getting the community ready for the new law. Police Sgt. Roger Wilkes sent out a bulletin to all officers, informing them of the provisions of the law.

During Child Passenger Safety Week March 1-7, he had placemats distributed to restaurants and window and door posters placed around the city to inform the public.

**REDFORD POLICE**, said Chief Mi-

chael Manoog, are being educated on the law through training film and slides that show the result of impact on unrestrained children.

Redford police also will be distributing informational pamphlets.

The \$10 fine to be charged against violators is not intended as a punishment, Manoog said, but rather is meant as a method of encouraging restraints to protect children.

The law, said Lt. James Hornkohl of the Westland police traffic bureau, "is going to save some lives, and it's going to save some accidents, too, because the child is going to be restrained."

He was not sure whether officers would make stops just to enforce that law, he said, but added "They'll look real closely at accidents or other traffic stops."

**MICHIGAN IS** the sixth state in the United States to enact a child restraint law.

So far, less than 10 percent of young riders are properly restrained.

Last year, there were 26 deaths and 3,331 serious injuries among children under 4 as the result of car accidents. The deaths could have been reduced by 90 percent and the injuries by 80 percent with the use of correct restraints, experts have estimated.

There are certain exemptions from the law. It does not apply to vehicles such as buses and taxicabs, or to non-resident drivers.

Exemptions also may be made if the secretary of state determines use of the restraint system is impractical because of physical unfitness, a medical problem or body size. Babies being nursed also are exempted.

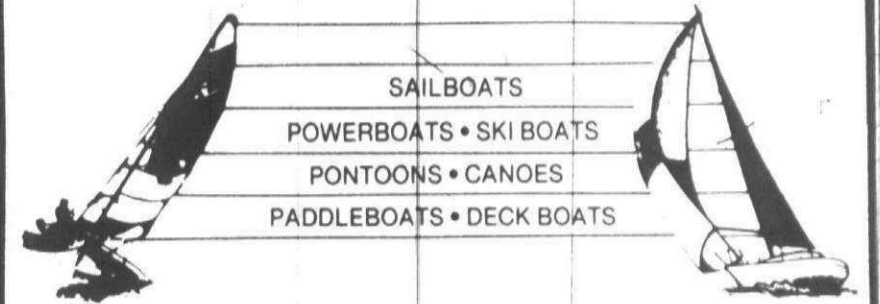

# Cool customers: 1981-82 All-Area cagers

There is no player the caliber of Antoine Joubert on the Observer's All-Area basketball team.

Most coaches would say there are few players anywhere in the same league as the Detroit Southwestern star, including those in the Observer coverage area.

But a team doesn't need a Joubert to be outstanding. Plymouth Salem proved that, nearly beating Southwestern in the state regional semifinals.

One basket in a key stretch of the final quarter and Salem might be in the semifinals instead of the Prospectors. Joubert got his 33 points, but it took 27 floor shots and 19 free throw attempts for him to do it.

The reason: Salem, using six different players, defended him better than any other team has in the state tournament.

That type of player — unselfish, hard-nosed, team-oriented — is what fills this year's All-Area team. There aren't any scoring flashes who put 30 points on the board every game.

But there are a lot of solid, well-rounded basketball players.

The selection, made by the high-school coaches in the area, was a difficult process. Votes were extremely close, and in some cases there may not seem to be much difference between first-, second- and third-team players.

Here it is — the 1982 edition of the Observer's All-Area basketball team.

## FIRST TEAM

**Dave Miller, 6-3½ guard, Plymouth Salem** — Miller was one of the six Rocks who defended Joubert in the Salem-Southwestern game. The senior two-year starter "made all the big plays down the stretch," according to coach Fred Thomann.

Miller finished with the second-highest assist total for a season, a mark held by Rich Hewlett (now attending the University of Michigan). Thomann credits Miller with all the necessary components for a solid player — "ex-

cellent jump-shot shooter, rebounder and defensive player." Miller played a key role in Salem's 20-4 season.

**Tim Fredericks, 6-3 forward, Redford Thurston** — A senior, Fredericks averaged 18.2 points and 14.5 rebounds per game for Thurston. But the effect he had on the team was more evident by what happened when he tore cartilage in his knee midway through the season.

Thurston was unbeaten in the Northwest Suburban League (NSL) with a healthy Fredericks. He missed the Eagles' Jan. 22 game at North Farmington (a loss) and was only about "70 percent" according to coach Gary Fralick for the Livonia Franklin contest a week later (another loss).

Fralick described Fredericks as a "hard worker and very unselfish... a true team player, a total joy to coach." A three-year varsity player, Fredericks connected on 62 percent of his field goals and 71 percent from the free-throw line for the 17-4 Eagles.

**Mike Maleske, 6-7 center, Detroit Catholic Central** — Maleske was another player who went down with an knee injury (he dislocated it) that not only cost him but hurt his team as well.

Despite the injury suffered in a Feb. 9 game against Ypsilanti, Maleske was unanimously voted the team's MVP. CC coach Bernie Holowicki said Maleske "excels in the big game against top players. He thrives on pressure."

Maleske proved that by scoring 27 points, his season high, against Catholic League champions Birmingham Brother Rice. A junior (one of three on the first team), Maleske averaged 18.4 points, 12 rebounds and three blocked shots per game for CC, 14-9 for the season and district champion.

**Bob Stebbins, 6-3 center, Livonia Franklin** — Stebbins had a remarkable season for Franklin.

His size of player normally would be a small high-school forward, but the junior played the pivot for the Patriots. And he played it well, leading Franklin

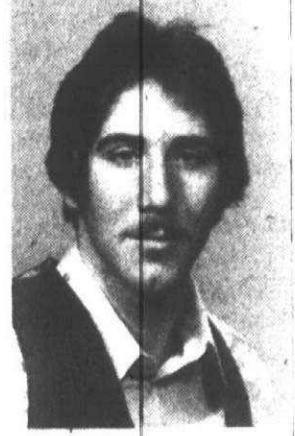

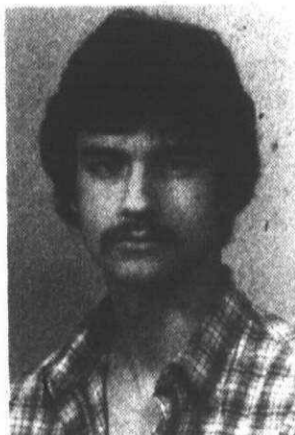

## Group charges prep sports bias

An Ann Arbor group called the League of Parents, Students and Educators Involved in School Athletic Practices has charged the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) with discrimination against females in the structure of rules, decision-making and monitoring procedures.

The allegations were included in a complaint filed Thursday with the U.S. Office for Civil Rights and the Michigan Department of Civil Rights.

Also charged were the Michigan Department of Education and five Michigan school districts — East Grand Rapids, Detroit, North Adams, Farmington and Houghton Lake, as representative of school districts of the state.

**VERN NORRIS**, executive director of the MHSAA, or Jack Cotton, athletic director of the Farmington Public Schools and member of the MHSAA's Representative Council, could not be reached for comment on the complaint (as of Friday).

The charge also alleges that MHSAA rulings crowd most major girls' sports into the fall, out of standard season for some, in order to free facilities for boys during the "proper" season, eliminating field hockey as a tournament sport for girls and causing them to receive little publicity and community support.

"Only four other states — Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota and West Virginia — run basketball, for instance, in separate seasons for the sexes, so facilities are not an insurmountable hurdle," said Marcia Federbush, coordinator of the league.

A PARENTS' group in Montana is now suing the state association over its seasonal irregularities.

The MHSAA is also charged with maintaining shorter seasons for females in several sports, causing girls to receive less training and female coaches to receive less pay.

The citizens' committee initiating the charge also alleges that MHSAA maintains a system of voting on issues and candidates in which principals, superintendents and athletic directors, nearly all male, report on school decisions with a minimum of input from women.

The charge states that only two women are on the Representative Council, both selected by men on the council and limited to short, fixed terms of office, while elected males may stay on for longer terms.

"The MHSAA voting system does not offer even a remote possibility of electing a fully representative body of female and minority members," said Federbush.

THIS YEAR'S MHSAA Handbook shows that 557 Michigan high schools offered golf for boys and only 175 for girls in 1980-81; 84 schools offered soccer for boys and 36 for girls.

The handbook does not specify any system for monitoring or penalizing civil rights violations and does not spell out due process or grievance procedures for students and coaches. These are among the areas needing attention from the Athletic Association, the State Education Department, and the individual school systems, according to Federbush.

Stebbins' desire paid off in 16.5 points, 13 rebounds and four assists per game for the fast-breaking Patriots.

"Bob has the heart," McIntyre said, "to be the pulse of any team he is on."

**Lewis Scott, 6-5 forward, Redford Bishop Borgess** — "Definitely a coach's player," said Bill Croteau of Scott. Croteau should know — he coached Scott this past season.

Borgess did not have an exceptional season (8-13, 1-9 in the Catholic League's Central Division), but Scott sacrificed for his team. He averaged 17.5 points and 13 rebounds per contest and was the team's MVP.

### SECOND TEAM

The team won 18 of 22 games, and Berkey was the leading scorer with a 10.3 average. He was also second in rebounding and the top defensive player.

Berkey's value was evident when bronchitis sidelined him at the end of the season. Stevenson lost three of four games while the senior was ill.

**Eric Sink, 6-6 center, Livonia Bentley** — An "excellent position player," according to Bentley coach Jim Komula, Sink could shoot the hook and re-

bound, playing the pivot as well as any inside player in the area.

A senior, Sink averaged 15 points and 16 rebounds per game for Bentley, 14-9 overall and state district champions. He also displayed "a very positive attitude," Komula said.

**Tom Gomolak, 6-8 center, Livonia Churchill** — Gomolak, a senior, showed great improvement this year through hard work during the off-season. Charger coach Don Albertson said.

It paid off as Gomolak led Churchill in scoring (14.6 points), rebounding (10.1), free throws (58 of 93, 62 percent) and recoveries (133). He was the MVP on the Chargers, who finished with an 8-13 mark.

**Mike Williamson, 6-1 guard, Livonia Franklin** — Speed to burn.

That's the best way to describe Williamson, who possesses "lightning speed," according to coach Jim McIntyre.

He scored nearly 15 points per game and averaged 6.5 assists and three steals. His ability in basketball may not match his talent in baseball, however. A senior, Williamson made the All-Observer baseball squad last year.

**Mike McBride, 6-3 forward, Plymouth Salem** — McBride, a senior and three-year starter, not only led Salem in scoring (15 per game) but also was the team's best defensive player.

His shooting ability was evident during a streak in the middle of the season when he averaged nearly 23 points in a five-game stretch to help Salem capture the Suburban Eight title.

### THIRD TEAM

**John Knight, 6-5 center, Redford Temple Christian** — Knight's defensive play and rebounding were key elements for the most successful team in the Observer area.

Temple Christian, playing in the Michigan Athletic Association of Christian Schools (MAACS), finished 27-0, winning the MAACS tournament for the fourth straight year. Knight, a sen-

ior, led the team in scoring and rebounding and hit 60 percent of his floor shots.

**Dave Rodriguez, 6-1 guard, Detroit Catholic Central** — A senior co-captain and playmaker, Rodriguez ran the offense and called the defensive signals.

Voted by his teammates as best team player, Rodriguez also averaged 19.5 points, six assists and four steals per game. He possesses an excellent outside shot.

**Rich Biskner, 5-11 guard, Redford Thurston** — Biskner's outside shooting touch "really loosened up a zone," according to Thurston coach Fralick.

A senior, Biskner averaged 11.3 points and six assists per game. His ballhandling also frustrated many an opponent in their attempts to press Thurston.

**Dave Houle, 6-4 forward, Plymouth Salem** — Houle, a junior, was hurt early in the season, but when he got well, he "was almost unstoppable," said Thomann, Salem's coach.

A 1977 opinion of the Michigan attorney general said that school districts could not delegate responsibility for athletics to a "private" organization, but could join the organization and adopt its rules. However, the individual districts would be responsible for en-

forcing the association's rules.

Recommendations made in 1979 by the State Task Force on Interscholastic Athletics, appointed by the State Board of Education, have never been reviewed by the board for consideration, as means of solving discriminatory practices.

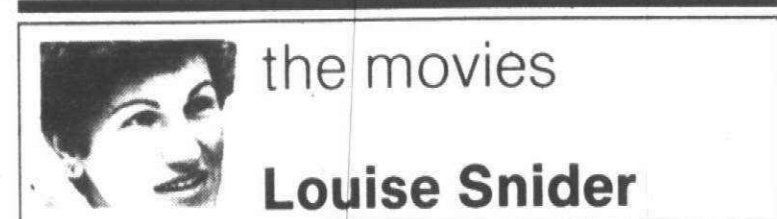

There just might be an Oscar on a Birmingham mantle after the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences announces its awards tonight.

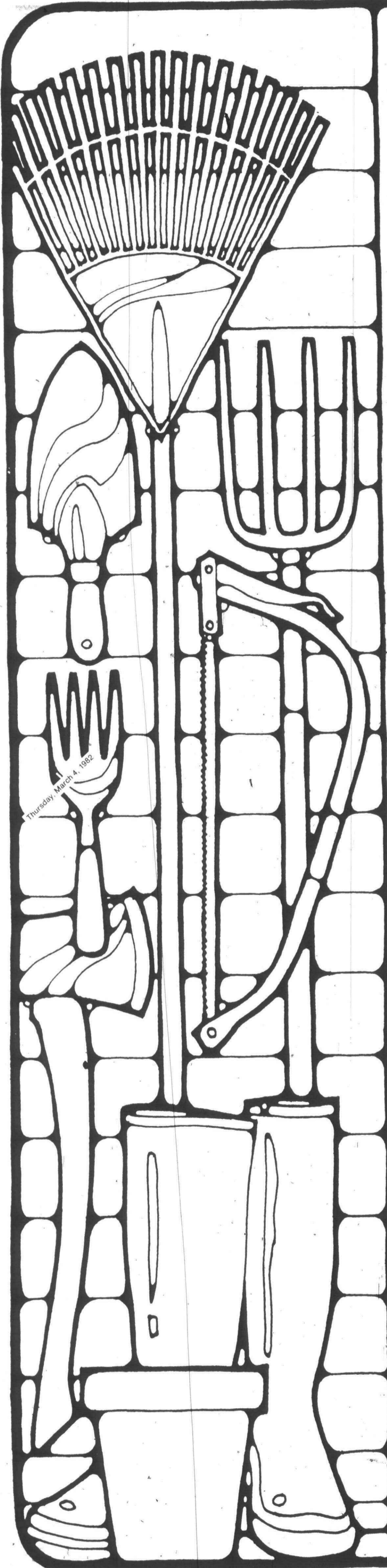

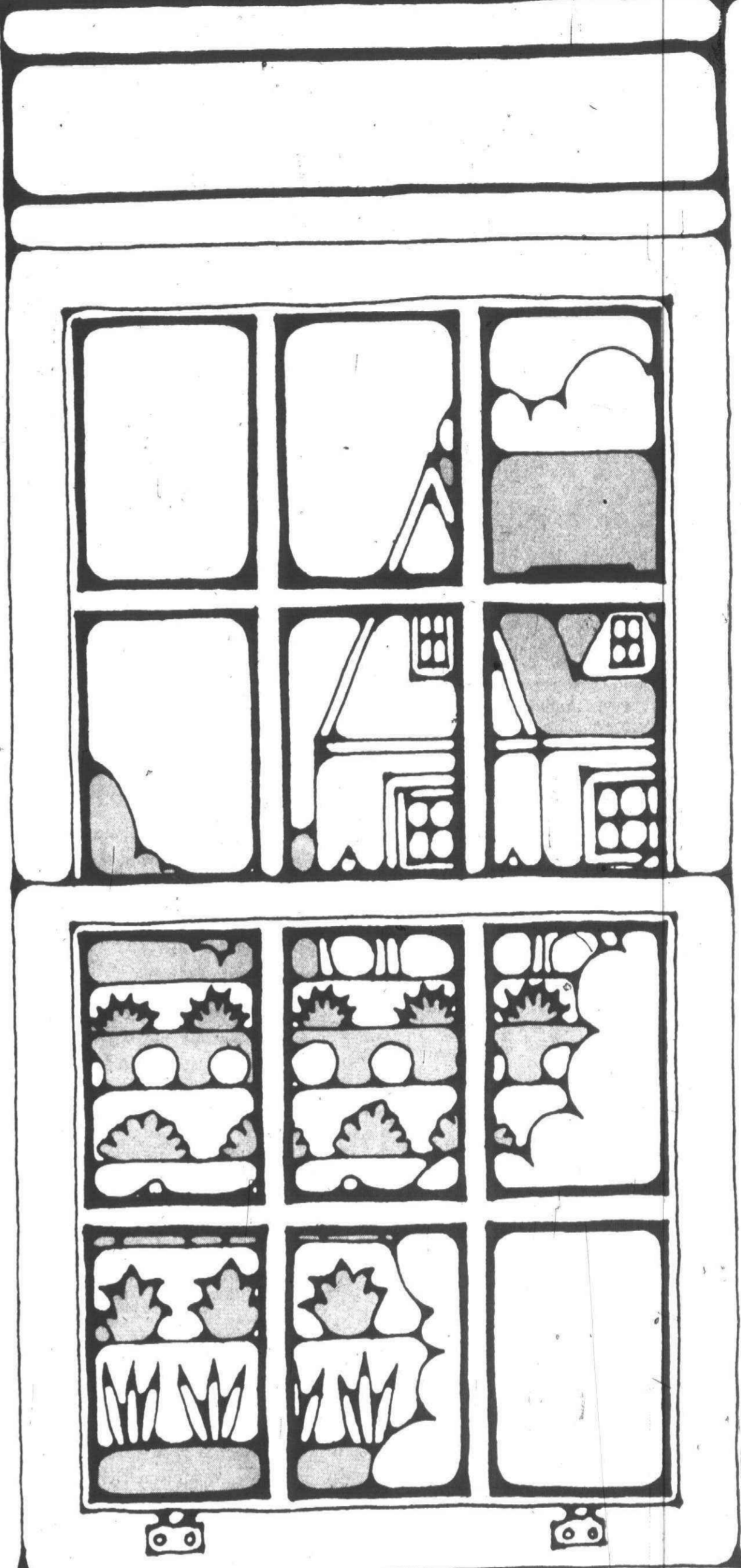
