14-year-old nabbed Connection in arson, burglaries

A 14-year-old Canton girl has con-fessed to the arson of the Herbert and Ann Wilson residence, 1334 S. Lotz Road, which burned to the ground May 17, say Canton police and fire officials.

The house, in an area between Cher ry Hill and Palmer Roads just east of I-275, was valued at \$80,000.

Witnesses had said they saw a 12 to 14-year-old girl riding a bike away from the scene and looking back at the house about noon. 30 minutes before flames began shooting from the

The girl is the only child of a couple

ment complex, located a mile away from the Wilson house.

Because the girl is a juvenile her identity is protected.

Police talked to the girl's parents after the Wilsons and a neighbor tracked the girl's identity. The neighbor had found a young girl in his barn recently and reasoned it may be the same one seen pedaling from the Wilson home.

THE WILSONS and the neighbor looked through a middle school yearbook and saw the photograph of a girl who fit the discription.

Canton Det. Eddie Tanner, who contacted the girl's parents and brought the girl in for questioning Wednesday

Tanner talked to her, and she admitted to breaking into the Wilson residence and starting the fire," said Canton acting Lt. Alex Wilson. "She says she found a liquid in a blue container in the garage and started the fire with that accelerant. She set the bottle beside the fireplace and started a fire in the fireplace. Forecasting life

CEP grads grade the options

Thirteen years of school, that's 2340 days, or some 14,040 hours, finally paid off for graduating Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton High School seniors. They were honored with diplomas in

commencement ceremonies last week. Ten 1984 high school graduates were interviewed by the Observer. Their outlook on the future gives some hint as to

what this next generation is all about. College plans are uppermost in everyone's mind - choosing where to go is a big decision.

Pam Burton, 17, a Plymouth-Canton graduate, can easily pick and choose where she wants to go, with her 3.8 grade-point average.

She was accepted at several prestigious schools, among them the University of Michigan, Harvard and the University of Chicago, where she was offered a full scholarship

"I chose Brown, in Rhode Island, because of their graduation requirements." Burton said.

She plans to study both history and language, and eventually go to law

"I don't know that I want to be a lawbut it's good background. The skills law school teaches you are very important analytically

Burton also has a Rotary Scholarship to study in Zimbabwe, Africa, for a

"I'm struggling with my parents who maimed or killed. They have a different concept of Zimbabwe:

'I wanted to go to Europe, but when they got my application not that many countries were left," said Burton.

"Secondly, I passed the test for financial aid and will get \$15,200 to pay for college, and I'll be earning \$600 a month in salary



Police seek rapist

was sexually assaulted Monda" in a wooded area near the I-275 bike path south of Joy Road.

Canton police said the victim was riding her bike on the concrete path when a white male in his mid-to-late 30s jumped out from behind some bushes, knocking the girl off her bicycle. He forced her into the woods, where she was sexually assaulted, said acting Lt. Al Wilson.

The victim was threatened with physical harm but saw no weapon. he said.

The suspect, 5-feet-9 and 150 pounds, escaped on foot. He is clean shaven and has neatly-cut, brown hair trimmed over the ears.

Investigation at dead end

Police are asking for help in solving an attempted murder, arson and breaking and entering May 17 that left Roy Hicks, 63, of Canton with a fractured eye socket, lacerations and bruises to the head and face, an injured jaw and dislocated shoulder

Hicks of 5285 Denton Road was asleep at about 11:30 p.m. when two men entered his home through an unlocked window, beat him with a metal bar and lamp, ransacked several rooms and ignited a cardboard box in the living room before fleeing possibly in a pick-up truck.

Hicks, who'd been beaten unconscious, regained consciousness in time to retrieve a shotgun and chase the suspects from the living room. No shots were fired, and the blaze was extin-

A small portable TV and radio were found on Hicks' front porch. No other items were taken.

The homeowner later was hospitalized at Ypsilanti's Beyer Hospital, and currently is recuperating at his home, between Michigan and Geddes roads. Hicks, who lives alone, underwent eye surgery and still suffers from a painful shoulder WITHIN A WEEK of the incident, police arrested one of "two

but released him after questioning.
"We have a lot of evidence and have not ruled out our suspect. But we just can't make the final connection to bring it all





Mild turmeric makes fine eating

If the black-and-white photo of this delicious bread were in color you'd be able to see what a beautiful golden hue it has. How does it get that way, you ask? Saffron? If it

were saffron it would have an unusual flavor and the bread would seem worth its weight in gold_ No, the spice in this recipe is turmeric. This is the root which gives curry powder and the yellower hot dog mustards their color. Turmeric adds some flavor as well, but it isn't distinctive. The orange-colored turmeric root is a member of the ginger family and is used in the preparation of vegetable pic-

kles, corn relish and baked goods. Which brings us back to the bread. Golden Turmeric Bread makes fine eating spread with lots of softened butter or margarine, and its onion and caraway flavors make it a natural for sandwiches — from vegetable-cream cheese to turkey-tomato.

• Use shiny metal pans, or those with a nonstick finish. If you use glass baking equipment, lower the oven temperature by 25 degrees.

• Use the right shortening for the job. Cake

batter made with butter is hard to blend and the cake comes out heavier and flatter than one made from shortening. . Don't overcrowd the oven. If you are baking three cake layers, arrange them so no pan is direct-

ly over another. Also, don't use a cookie sheet that is too large for the oven. Allow two inches on all sides to permit heat circulation. Often, baked foods must cool a bit before being moved from pans. Don't be impatient - follow directions so the food leaves the pan easily without







Sigourney Weaver is the nicest thing about 'Ghostbusters'

pening weekend records of "Star Trek III" While it has some unny moments and will probably provide an enjoyable hour and hree-quarters, it isn't as funny as it ought to be considering its reported \$32-million cost

Against a backdrop of some pretty spectacular special effects three parapsychology researchers, Dr. Peter Venkman (Bill Mur-). Dr. Raymod Stantz (Dan Akroyd) and Dr. Egon Spengler (Harold Ramis), are kicked off campus by the mean dean of some in-named New York university

In the inimitable Aykroyd Murray Belushi "Saturday Night Live" offhand, indifferent style that disdains audiences, the three set up business as commercial ghost exterminators. The Orkin

He never had such customers either, as the ghostbusters' first client is the very attractive Dana Barrett (Sigourney Weaver), who lives in an apartment building that is the gateway for demons

WEAVER IS pert and most engaging as a young, symphony orchestra performer facing the excitement, challenge and difficul-ties of a lovely, single girl living in New York. She also comes on strong as the sultry vamp possessed by the Sumerian demigod

Watching her is well worth the price of admission. In fact, more

of her and less of the boys wouldn't have bothered me at all. The movie's great strength is Weaver and the supporting cast. Murray and Aykroyd lack the intensity and commitment that would have made this a non-stop laugh riot. Perhaps if John Beushi had appeared, as was the original plan, there might have

been greater consistency As it is, every so often, just as things are picking up, Murray and Aykroyd seem to lose interest and throw away their lines as they walk away from the audience. This on-again, off-again energy level characterizes the entire production.

As an example, down the hall from Dana Barrett lives a wimpy accountant, Louis Tully. Rick Moranis plays him very funny and intense, when he's in his own element, throwing a cut-rate party for his clients (it's tax-deductible) with generic goodies (great savings and they're just as good).

BUT. WHEN possessed by demons he just lies there and funny nerd to humorless blob is typical of the film's offstride pac-

The ghostbusters hire Janine Melnitz (Annie Potts). She's their cute, Brooklyn, gum-chewing-and-not-as-dumb-as-she-pretends secretary with excellent timing but, unfortunately, limited lines. William Atherton is properly intense and myopic as Walter Peck, the man from the EPA. His name is the butt of several unworthy Murray/Akroyd jokes indicative of the level of humor and disrespect for audiences implicit in their performance.

But the special effects are very well done and there certainly is a lot of pleasure and entertainment in watching visually convinc ing ghosts and demons cavort. The catchy title song is already popular and most audiences will find "Ghostbusters" a pleasant
