


Following voting on the fire-

#### **Kiwanis Updated On Lottery**

FORT LORAMIE - Johnnie Wilder, the Dayton regional manager of the Ohio Lottery Commission, was the featured speaker at the Aug. 18 meeting of the Fort Loramie Kiwanis Club.

Wilder traced the development of the Ohio Lottery from its inception in 1983 to the present day operation which has become a multi-million dollar activity. Ohio, which is one of 22 lottery states, began sales in 1984 and the present staff includes 275 state employees who work with over 6,000 state lottery agents. Each agent receives a percentage of the total dollar sales in his authorized agency. Approximately 50 percent of the profits is returned to the ticket buyers in prize money. Approximately 35 percent of total sales or 6½ cents of each \$1 of profit is contributed from lottery sales to the Ohio General Fund.




#### State Fair Winner
