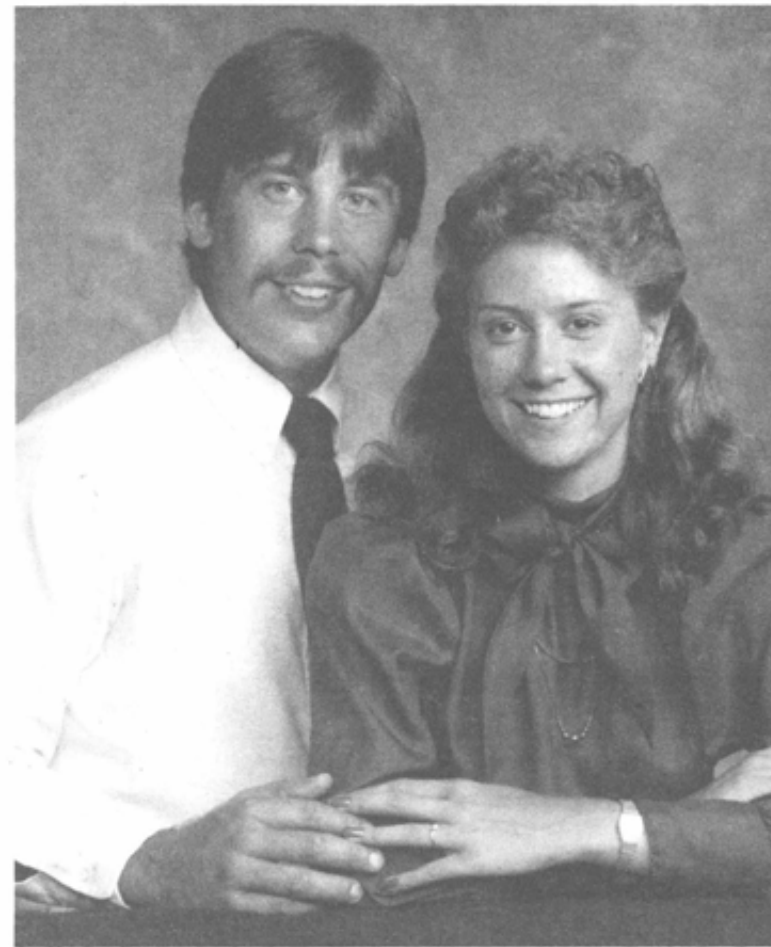

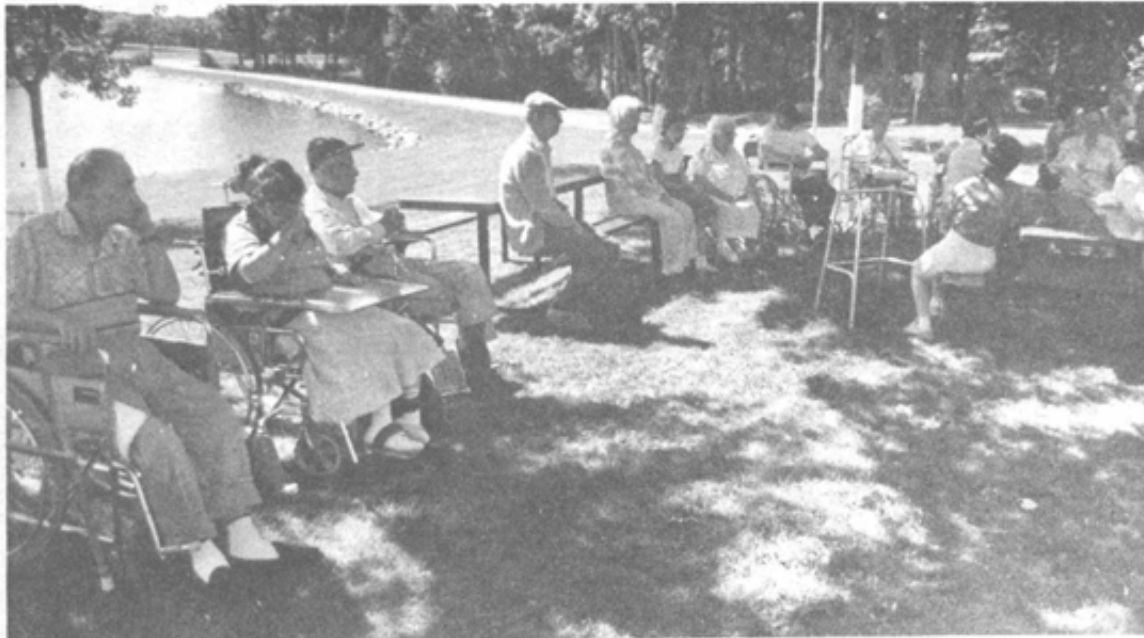

Minster Holds Council Meeting

Minster council members met last week and decided to develop a well field on the Schmittmeyer property northwest of the village. The decision was made after hearing recommendations and alternatives concerning the well field development by Kevin Wolka. Wolka is an engineer from Toledo.

It was recommended that the present wells be used as water supply sources and that a pump test be done on well No. 1. Upon completion of this test the village must then get approval of the well field as a designated water supply source.

Council members also signed a contract to install a traffic signal at Main and Seventh streets, operational by the end of November. They will meet with EPA in Columbus Monday, Aug. 24, to discuss Minster's wastewater treatment plant permit requirements.

Mayor Elmer Weaver appointed William Metropulos, Village Clerk Vern Nabor and Councilman Rick Schwartz to a computer committee to investigate how best to meet the computer needs of the village.

Approximately 50 percent of the profits is returned to the ticket buyers in prize money. Approximately 35 percent of total sales or 6½ cents of each \$1 of profit is contributed from lottery sales to the Ohio General Fund.

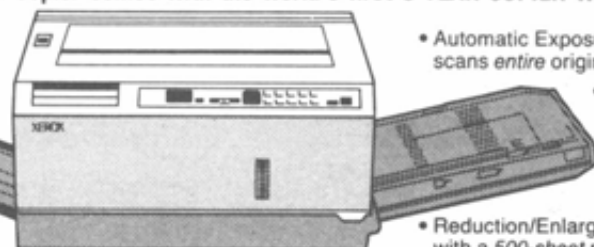

14-Revised the elementary fee schedule as follows:

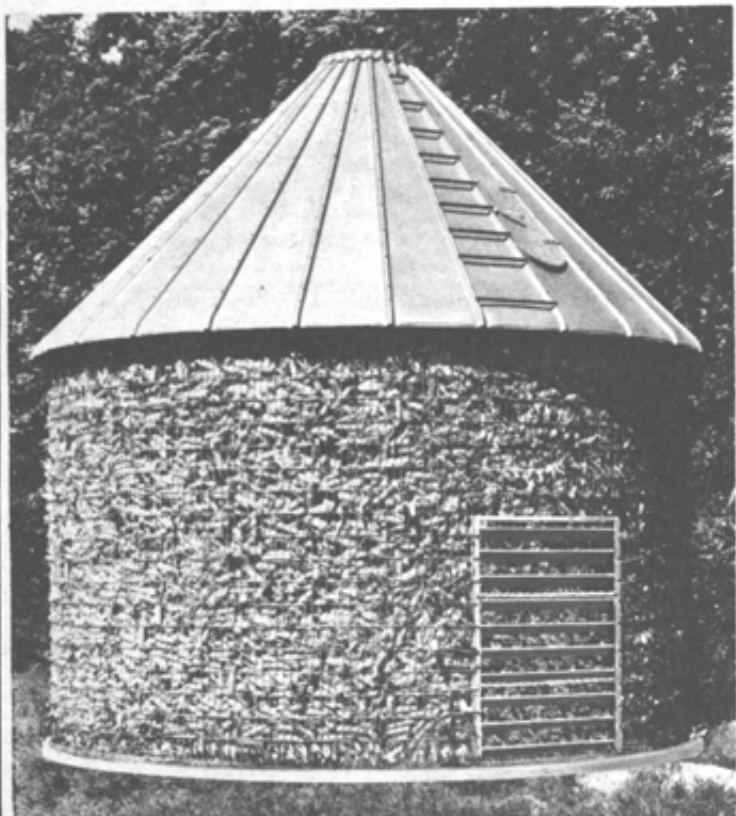

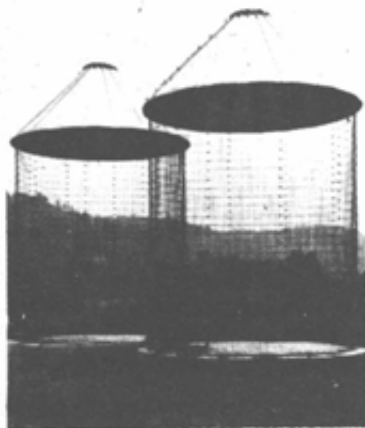

Childbirth Classes Offered

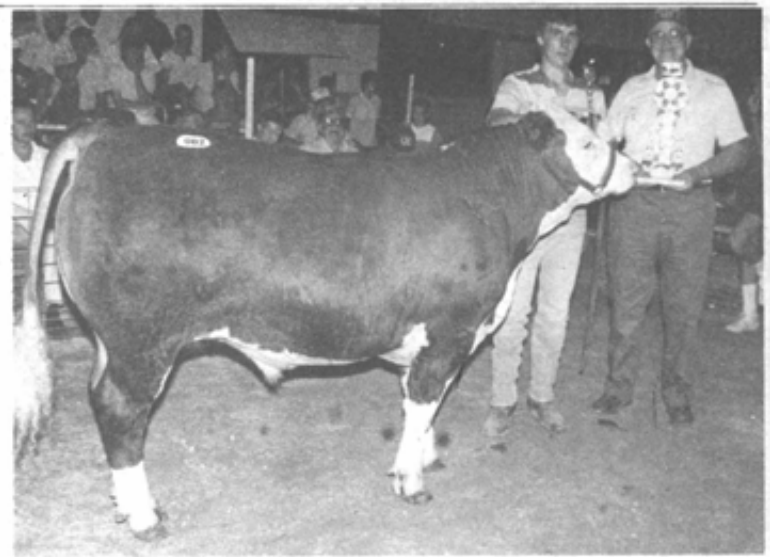
