*Caragana tibetica* Kom., a tussock-forming leguminous shrub growing on slate scree overlooking the Yellow River, on the northern slopes of the Gyü-par range, elevation 10400 feet.

The Gyü-par valley looking south southeast from a bluff 11300 feet, showing spruce forest (*Picea asperata* Mast.) on the slopes to right, the only region in which the Gyü-par Range is forested. The triangular peak in the distance under the clouds is the second highest of the range and is called Gyü-par sher-nying.
