

































<p><b>Scientific Name</b> <i>Achillea millefolium</i></p> 	<p><b>Common Name and description</b> <b>Yarrow</b> Easy, will spread at a reasonable rate. About 1" high, white flowers. Wants some water. Perennial flower</p>	<p><b>Number 5/1/23:</b>  16 tree pots</p>
<p><b>Amelanchier alnifolia</b></p> 	<p><b>Western serviceberry</b> Needs well drained soil at elevations from 200 – 8500'. Can reach heights of 15 feet. Likes partial shade and supplemental water. Berries are edible and taste like blueberries. Good for birds</p>	<p>3, 5 gallon</p>
<p><b>Amelanchier utahensis</b></p> 	<p><b>Utah serviceberry</b> Is a 3-15 ft. deciduous shrub. It has white bark and small oval gray-green leaves. The white flowers are fragrant, and the small dark purple berries are eaten by birds. It is a good browse plant so protect it from deer until it is big.</p>	
<p><b>Anemopsis californica</b></p> 	<p><b>Yerba mansa</b> A beautiful white coneflower. Likes water so plant near a stream or water a lot. Spreads by rhizomes. Dies back in fall but the big fleshy leaves come back in the spring. The dry leaves have a lovely fragrance.</p>	
<p><b>Angelica lineariloba</b></p> 	<p><b>Soda Straw</b> Parts of this plant are poisonous. It flowers in mid-summer and grows to be 24-48" tall. Attracts bees, butterflies, and birds. It needs full to partial sun and regular water, but don't overwater.</p>	
<p><b>Aquilegia formosa</b></p> 	<p><b>Crimson columbine</b> Pretty red/yellow flowers once in spring/ early summer. A perennial flower. Part to full shade. Wants water-either a watered garden or by a creek. Will reseed, but not too weedy. About 1-2' tall. This will bloom its second year</p>	<p>48 tree pots</p>







<p><b><i>Arabis pulchra</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Beautiful rockcress</b>  A 3-foot-tall perennial with purple flowers. It likes full sun. It is a lot like wallflower but with purple flowers. First to bloom in the spring and self-seeds easily</p>	<p>32 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Artemisia tridentata</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Great Basin Sagebrush</b>  An ever-gray shrub 4 feet tall and wide. Its form is stately, and it stands out in a landscaping situation. It is a nitrogen fixing plant. Needs full sun and good drainage, very drought tolerant. It has volatile oils so keep it 30' away from buildings.</p>	
<p><b><i>Asclepias fascicularis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Narrow leaf milkweed</b>  Easy and invasive! Don't plant this where you don't want it to spread. Needs very little water, the more water, the faster it spreads. Full sun. About 3' tall and as wide as you let it spread. Butterflies like it. Butterflies prefer this to the broad leaf milkweed.</p>	
<p><b><i>Asclepias speciosa</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Broad leaf milkweed</b>  Easy and invasive! Don't plant this where you don't want it to spread. Very pretty in bloom and into the fall and winter. Needs very little water, the more water, the faster it spreads. Full sun. About 3' tall and as wide as you let it spread. Butterflies like it.</p>	
<p><b><i>Baileya multiradiata</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert marigold</b>  12-18-inch biennial. The daisy like flowers form impressive mounds of solid yellow. Blooms all summer. Like dry well drained soil and will self-seed.</p>	<p>46 tree pots</p>





<p><b><i>Betula occidentalis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Water birch</b> Likes moist situations. Grows to 20 feet, with many trunks. Has beautiful fall foliage and smooth reddish bark.</p>	<p>13 tall tree pot</p>
<p><b><i>Calystegia longipes</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert morning glory</b> A vine that likes dry, rocky places. It has showy flowers that are cream to pale pink. Grows to about 1 foot high and wants full sun.</p>	
<p><b><i>Castilleja</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Indian paintbrush</b> Most paintbrush are hemi-parasites, which means they need to live with their host plants. These plants are growing with their sage hosts</p>	
<p><b><i>Cercis occidentalis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>California Red Bud</b> A deciduous shrub that grows to about 12 feet. Has magenta flowers in spring. Likes full sun and regular water in our dry area. Young plants need to have their roots protected from freezing, but older plants do fine.</p>	
<p><b><i>Cercocarpus ledifolius</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Mountain mahogany</b> Extremely slow going evergreen that will eventually get quite large so give it room. Easy care, water monthly on the valley floor. Likes well drained soil. Full sun to part shade. Needs no pruning and very little care. A great evergreen for around here. It has volatile oils so keep it 30' away from buildings</p>	<p>32 tree pots</p>

<p><b><i>Chamaebatiaria millefolium</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Fern bush</b> Has an aromatic herbage and a pretty white flower. Likes full sun and good drainage.</p>	
<p><b><i>Chilopsis linearis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert willow</b> is a large deciduous tree. Can grow to 20 feet- so give it room. Its leaves look like a willow and the flowers like an azalea. It is the last tree to leaf out but will flower until frost. Hummingbirds love it.</p>	
<p><b><i>Clematis ligusticifolia</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Virgin's bower</b> Likes full sun and regular water. It spreads along the roots so gets a little "weedy" but looks nice on a fence or arbor. Let it grow along the ground as a ground cover if you are concerned about fire hazard.</p>	
<p><b><i>Cryptantha confertiflora</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Golden forget-me-not</b> Has beautiful yellow flowers, blooms in June. Likes dry rocky soils and full sun. After it flowers it is a nice boarder plant with grey green foliage</p>	
<p><b><i>Cylindropuntia echinocarpa</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Silver cholla</b> Is a medium size cholla. It blooms with chartreuse flowers in the spring. The stems arise from one main trunk. when the sun hits this cholla, it illuminates its outline very attractively.</p>	

<p><b><i>Datura wrightii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Jimson weed</b> Gets really big, 2 feet high by 2 feet wide by 3 feet long. Dies back completely in the fall. Likes the alkali soil of the valley floor and needs very little water. The leaves smell like peanut butter and all parts of this plant are poisonous.</p>	
<p><b><i>Distichlis spicata</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Salt Grass</b> Is a rhizomes grass that grows about 6" high. It has solid stiff stems so is not a comfortable lawn grass but does well in alkali salty soil and is good at keeping the dust down.</p>	
<p><b><i>Elymus cinereus</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Great basin wild rye</b> One of the easiest of the desert grasses to grow. Does well will regular watering or less. Likes well-drained soil and full sun. The first grass to get growing in spring. Grows to 3 feet tall. Nice golden seeds in fall. Cut it back in the fall.</p>	
<p><b><i>Encelia actoni</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Bush sunflower</b> Beautiful round shaped bush with long stemmed flowers. They like full blazing sun. and very well-drained soil. A nice perennial</p>	<p>13 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Ephedra nevadensis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Nevada ephedra</b> A bluer green than <i>Epedra viridis</i>. If you get the female plant, it can have lots of small yellow flowers in the spring. This plant is used for its evergreen vertical foliage.</p>	






<p><b><i>Ephedra viridis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Green ephedra</b> A beautiful bush with a strong vertical evergreen presence. A nice background plant for the garden. Likes full sun and well-drained soil.</p>	
<p><b><i>Epilobium californica</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert fuchsia</b> This is a nice plant for fall flowers. It blooms late August until it freezes. Likes well-drained soil. It will tolerate regular watering but containerize it or it will spread all over. Less water will help hold it in check. The hummingbirds like it.</p>	
<p><b><i>Eriastrum densifolium</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Heavenly blue</b> A showy plant that grows 1/2 - 1' tall. The flowers grow in dense clusters that catch your eye. Blooms in June. Likes dry gravel and full sun.</p>	<p>4 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Ericameria nauseosa</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Rubber rabbitbrush</b> A 2-3-foot shrub with feathery grey-green foliage. Grows in poor alkali meadow soil from 2500-8500 feet. A nice addition to the garden as it blooms in the fall. It has volatile oils so keep it 30' away from buildings or prune it to a 1' high bush.</p>	
<p><b><i>Ericameria tetrafolia</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Green rabbitbrush</b> A small shrub that grows about a foot high. Stays evergreen throughout the year and blooms very late in the year, or very early in the spring. Resinous sent reminds me of Christmas. It has volatile oils so plant away from buildings.</p>	
<p><b><i>Eriogonum elatum</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Tall buckwheat</b> This plant has low-growing wide leaves. Throws up a 3-foot flower stalk that will have bunches of small white flowers typical to buckwheat's. It is very hardy. Full sun and well-drained soil.</p>	







<p><b><i>Eriogonum fasciculatum</i></b></p> 	<p><b>California buckwheat</b>  A small shrub with white flowers. Likes well-drained soil and very little water. Its flowers, leaves and seeds are all used by butterflies and small birds. White flowers come on in late spring, gradually turn pink in summer, then rust colored in fall. Flowers stay on until the next fall.</p>	<p>10 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Eriogonum nudum</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Nude buckwheat</b>  A slender spike of white, pink or yellow flowers. This plant has a 3-inch (6 cm) base of small leaves from which it grows up into a 3 to 6 foot stem with small flower clusters near the top. It attracts bees, needs full sun and good drainage.</p>	<p>2 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Eriogonum umbelatum</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Sulphur buckwheat</b>  Has yellow flowers, grey foliage. Sulphur Buckwheat needs good drainage to the point of living in gravel. It's very drought tolerant but best with a little water.</p>	
<p><b><i>Eriogonum wrightii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Wright's buckwheat</b>  Is a nice groundcover with slender pale pink flowers. The buckwheat's are very important butterfly plants. It self-seeds easily</p>	
<p><b><i>Erythranthe guttatus</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Common monkey flower</b>  Is a 6-8-inch plant that likes wet soil. It blooms from spring to summer and is well liked by hummingbirds. It goes completely dormant in the winter but comes back in the spring. It does well in shaded areas with a little sun.</p>	<p>22 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Frangula californica</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Coffee berry</b>  An evergreen shrub that grows fast to 6-8 ft. Coffeeberry likes sun to part shade and has low water requirements. The berries turn red, then black. This plant is almost always deer proof.</p>	






<p><b><i>Forestiera pubescens</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert Olive</b> A beautiful tree that can grow to 10 feet. It has attractive fruit that the birds like. It likes to grow along the stream banks and canyons in the valley. Likes full sun and good drainage.</p>	
<p><b><i>Grayia spinosa</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Spiney hopsage</b> Is a common shrub of the high desert that can grow to 5 feet. The leaves are gray-tipped and the stems end in whitish, spine tips twigs. This plant's flower has no petals but bracts, which can be either rosy pink or a whitish cream. It flowers from April to July. It is an evergreen</p>	<p>16 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Helianthus nuttallii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Nuttall's sunflower</b> A beautiful and very tall flower - about 8-foot stalks. Has yellow flowers that bloom in August. It likes full sun and needs occasional deep watering. Birds love it.</p>	
<p><b><i>Hesperoyucca whipplei</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Our Lords candle</b> Is an evergreen shrub. It likes well drained soil but will tolerate partial shade. Plant it where you won't have to work around it as the leaves are quite sharp. It can take up to 5 years to bloom.</p>	







<p><b><i>Lepidium fremontii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert allysum</b> Is a perennial herb that grows to about 3 feet tall. It has white flowers. Likes full sun, well drained soil. Is good for butterfly gardens.</p>	<p>28 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Linum lewisii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Blue flax</b> Grows about a foot high. Blooms in early June. The flowers open in the morning. It will reseed itself and spread. Will tolerate watering.</p>	<p>34 tree pots</p>















<p><b><i>Lonicera involucrata</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Twinberry</b> A shrub that grows to 4 feet. Is found along the streams in the Sierra. Likes moist sandy soil, sun to partial shade. Blooms in the summer and is winter deciduous.</p>	
<p><b><i>Lupinus excubitus</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Inyo bush lupine</b> A little tricky, but worth it. If it lives, it will be around for years as a perennial. Gorgeous purple/white flower spikes in spring. Well-drained soil and some water, but too much will rot it.</p>	<p>7 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Mentzelia laevicaulis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Blazing star</b> Is a flashy yellow flower that can grow up to 6 inches across. The flowers occur only at the tips of the branches and main stem. It likes gravelly well-drained soil. Self seeds if it likes where you plant it.</p>	
<p><b><i>Mirabilis multiflora</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Large four-o'clock</b> Can grow 15 inches tall and 6 feet wide. It opens its blooms in the afternoon and keeps its flowers most of the summer. Is tolerant of most soils. Plant it where it will get plenty of heat and sun. Once established, this plant needs no extra water. Butterflies like it.</p>	<p>5 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Monardella linoides</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Flax leaf mountain balm</b> Flaxleaf Monardella, is a mounding perennial that grows in gravelly soil that is wet in winter and dry in summer. It is a delicate-leaved, lemon scented mint. It likes morning sun and afternoon shade. Flowers are a light pink and attract lots of butterflies.</p>	<p>12 tree pots</p>







<p><b><i>Monardella odoratissima</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Mountain pennyroyal</b>          Pretty light purple flowers in early summer. Low growing-about 10" tall and wide. Nice peppermint fragrance. Wants well drained soil, some water okay. Full sun to partial shade.</p>	
<p><b><i>Muhlenbergia rigens</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Deer Grass</b>          One of the most beautiful bunchgrasses. It likes sandy well drained soil below 7000'. It can handle weekly watering but once mature it doesn't need any water. Prefers full sun or part shade.</p>	<p>6 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Oenothera cespitosa ssp. marginata</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Large white evening primrose</b>          A short-lived perennial. It has white-pink 3" flowers that fade to pink. The 12" leaves are from base only. The delightful fragrance is from the flowers. Likes well drained soil. Protect from deer unless you like stumps.</p>	<p>27 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Oenothera californica ssp. avita</i></b></p> 	<p><b>White desert primrose</b>          Clumps 3 ft. by 10 feet across of 2-inch pink-white flowers are common. Really pretty flush of white flowers in late spring. Small and compact plant about 1' high and across. They like really well drained soil, or they will rot out. Spreads easily.</p>	<p>16 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Oenothera elata</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Tall evening primrose</b>          This plant can grow to 5 feet in height. The flowers open in the evening and wilt by the next morning. It likes moist soil but can become weedy as it self-seeds easily. The seeds of this plant were an important food source for the local Paiutes.</p>	
<p><b><i>Opuntia basilaris</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Beavertail cactus</b>          Plants form clumps 6 to 12 inches high and 1 to 6 feet in diameter. The pink flowers are about 2 to 3 inches in diameter. It likes full sun and well-drained soil, very little water. Slower growing than old man cactus.</p>	<p>16 cactus pots</p>



<p><b><i>Opuntia polyacantha</i> var. <i>erinacea</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Old man cactus</b> Plants form clumps 6 to 12 inches high and 1 to 6 feet in diameter. The yellow flowers are about 2 to 3 inches in diameter. It likes full sun and well-drained soil, very little water. Grows quickly.</p>	<p>13 cactus pots</p>
<p><b><i>Penstemon eatonii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Firecracker penstemon</b> Easy, seems to be long lived for a penstemon. Likes some water during the summer, but don't let the base of the plant stay wet or it will rot. Fairly tolerant and very nice show of red blooms in spring.</p>	
<p><b><i>Penstemon floridus</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Rose penstemon</b> Beautiful tall flower spike about 2 feet tall. Likes sandy well-drained soil. If you overwater it, it will look great for a year and then rot out. Attracts hummingbirds.</p>	
<p><b><i>Penstemon fruticiformis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Death Valley beardtongue.</b> A beautiful shrub with grey foliage. Fragrant white snapdragon like flowers. Needs full sun, very good drainage, and occasional water.</p>	<p>17 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Penstemon incertus</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Western desert penstemon</b> A showy sky-blue perennial that has 2 feet of light green (with a little silver) foliage with 2 foot spikes of blue above it. Needs full sun and good drainage.</p>	

<p><b><i>Penstemon palmeri</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Palmer's penstemon</b> A showy plant that grows about 2' high and sends out 3' flower spikes. The flowers are scented. Needs full sun and well-drained soil.</p>	<p>16 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Penstemon pseudospectabilis</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert Penstemon</b> Grows to 2 to 3 feet. Has evergreen leaves and beautiful magenta flower. Hummingbirds love it. Likes full sun, well-drained soil. Grows in the deserts below 4,000 ft.</p>	<p>48 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Penstemon rostriflorus</i></b></p>  <p>Christopher Christie</p>	<p><b>Scarlet penstemon</b> When in bloom you can hardly see the stems for the flowers! This is a hardy penstemon that will last many years, if you don't water it too much. Likes dry soil and full sun.</p>	
<p><b><i>Populus fremontii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Fremont cottonwood</b> A tree that grows to about 39 to 115 feet. Has pretty green leaves in summer which turn a vibrant yellow in fall. It likes to be in a regularly watered spot.</p>	
<p><b><i>Proboscida parviflora var. hookaminana</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Devils claw</b> Is an annual herb that blooms in summer with lovely pink flowers. The large curved seed pods are used in basketry for their black color.</p>	<p>23 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Prunus andersonii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert peach</b> A deciduous shrub that grows to 3-6 feet. It has rose flowers in early spring. It likes sun, dry conditions, and good drainage. It has a beautiful flower and lovely fragrance. It spreads by rhizomes so plant it where it can spread.</p>	<p>13 tree pots</p>

<p><b><i>Psoralea polyadenia</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Nevada dalea</b> Likes well drained soil. Wants absolute full blazing sun, the hotter the better. Very little water while it gets established, then don't water it ever again! Blooms in mid spring and late summer. Has very pretty dark purple flowers. The odor of this plant is disagreeable to some people.</p>	
<p><b><i>Psoralea arborescens</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Indigo bush</b> Seems to be happy in any well drained soil. Wants absolute full blazing sun, the hotter the better. Very little water while it gets established, then don't water it ever again! Blooms in mid spring with dark purple flowers. The odor of this plant is disagreeable to some people. Slow grower</p>	
<p><b><i>Purshia tridentata</i></b></p> 	<p><b><u>Antelope bitterbrush</u></b> Is a nitrogen fixing evergreen shrub. In spring it is covered with fragrant yellow flowers that bees love. Requires very little water and is important for wildlife. It has volatile oils so plant 30 feet away from buildings.</p>	
<p><b><i>Purshia tridentata</i> <i>Var. galindulosa</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert bitterbrush</b> Is a nitrogen fixing evergreen shrub. In spring it is covered with fragrant yellow flowers that bees love. Requires very little water and is important for wildlife. It has volatile oils so plant 30 feet away from buildings.</p>	
<p><b><i>Ribes aureum</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Golden currant</b> Medium shrub about 6-10'tall. Blooms in spring with fragrant, golden yellow flowers. Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies. The leaves turn red in autumn. Likes partial shade. Likes regular water and slow draining soil.</p>	
<p><b><i>Ribes cereum</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Wax currant</b> A small-med shrub, deciduous. Nice red berries by late summer-good for birds. Full sun to partial shade. Wants some water. Spiny branches.</p>	

<p><b><i>Rosa woodsii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Mountain rose</b> A fragrant rose that needs some summer water and will tolerate a little shade. It has great hips for tea and is an important plant for birds. It grows between 3500 - 11000 feet.</p>	
<p><b><i>Rudbeckia californica</i></b></p> 	<p><b>California coneflower</b> Likes meadows and riparian areas. It has showy long-lasting bright yellow flowers. Needs full sun to partial shade.</p>	<p>16 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Salvia dorii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Purple sage</b> Likes well-drained soil, full sun, and a little water. Blooms in June with fun pagoda-like flowers. Attracts insects and has fragrant foliage.</p>	
<p><b><i>Scutelaria mexicana</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Bladder sage</b> Is a rather spiny 3-foot-tall bush with 1-inch purple flowers. This plant grows on the valley floor. It is found in the open gravelly soils. Likes full sun and good drainage. Don't water it after it gets established.</p>	
<p><b><i>Senegalia greggii</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Cat claw acacia</b> An 8-foot shrub that grows to 7763' in elevation. Can withstand temps down to 15 F. Likes rocky, sandy or decomposed granite and very well drained soil. Full sun. Blooms in the spring and is Semi-deciduous in the summer.</p>	
<p><b><i>Solidago californica</i></b></p> 	<p><b>California goldenrod</b> A spectacular yellow flowered perennial that is very showy in the late summer and fall. It needs sun to partial shade. Plant in areas where the ground is wet in the spring and almost dry in the summer. Spreads from underground roots so give it room to-grow. Self -seeds like crazy and gets weedy.</p>	<p>14 tree pots</p>

<p><b><i>Sphaeralcea ambigua</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Apricot mallow</b>  Easy, wants some water in the summer. Likes well-drained soil. Nice flush of orange flowers early in the summer. Looks ragged by the fall so cut it back in the spring before new growth starts. Full sun is best. About 2' tall.</p>	<p>16 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Sporobolus airoides</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Alkali sacaton</b>  A beautiful bunch grass that grows about 2.5 feet tall. Has delicate inflorescence. It is easy to grow, needs full sun and regular water. Slower to grow than Great Basin Wild Rye. Cut back in the fall.</p>	<p>16 tree pots</p>
<p><b><i>Stanleya elata</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Panamint plume</b>  Full sun and well-drained soil. The leaves are leathery basal leaves and then it throws up nice 3' yellow flower spikes in the spring. Doesn't really need water, but a little will make it look better.</p>	
<p><b><i>Stanleya pinnata</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Desert plume</b>  Full sun and well-drained soil. Nice yellow spikes in the spring. Doesn't really need water, but a little will make it look better. Blooms May through June and if you cut the spent flowers, it will give you another bloom in fall.</p>	
<p><b><i>Stipa comata</i></b></p>  <p>Robert Sivinski photo</p>	<p><b>Needle and thread grass</b>  A low growing bunch grass that has 3-foot stem that produces a flower cluster with mature awns that are 7 in. in length. It tolerates sandy soil and seasonal flooding, likes full sun. Looks really good in a cluster planting and reseeds easily.</p>	
<p><b><i>Stipa hymenoides</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Indian Rice Grass</b>  Grows 4 to 24 inches tall and up to 24 inches wild. Can grow in partial shade and is tolerant of other soils but prefers sandy soil. It is an important food for wildlife. It has been cultivated in Montana under the trade name "Montina" as a gluten-free grain.</p>

The silvery seeds in June backlit by afternoon sun are beautiful. It looks good in groups and you will have a lot of them in a few years with its reseeding qualities.</p>	
<p><b><i>Yucca brevifolia</i></b></p> 	<p><b>Joshua tree</b></p> <p>Needs sun and well-drained soil. Little or no summer water. It will grow 3" a year for the first 3 and then slow down to 1" a year. It is an important wildlife plant.</p>
