Friday, July 9, 6:15 p.m. Kabbalat Shabbat Welcoming Rabbi Robert Nosanchuk

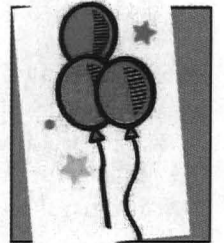

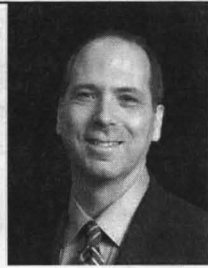

Connections Are Made Slowly

In May, I had the privilege of being invited to address the Annual Meeting of Fairmount Temple. What a festive atmosphere was present that morning, as we entered accompanied by the congregational band's joyous music! I noticed many different generations of congregants, and I listened carefully with them to reports on the temple's financial status, its leadership nominations, and an award honoring contributions of temple volunteers. I looked around me and felt proud of having made the trip to Cleveland to look through a window into my future as the new Senior Rabbi at Anshe Chesed Fairmount Temple.

Yet I also realized (then and now) that building a relationship between a new rabbi and his or her temple is a slow-building process. Over the coming months leading to my installation later this year, I hope to connect with many of you, individually and in groups, to become acquainted and begin to plan our temple's future together.

But our truly being "at home" as rabbi and temple will require additional efforts! We will need to exercise patience, thoughtfulness and initiative - and be willing to act on those values and actions. For example, when a personal crisis arises, it can take time to feel comfortable that your new rabbi is "up-to-speed" and ready to support you during a family illness or after a death. On the other end of the lifecycle spectrum, in the coming months, I will officiate at my first Fairmount Temple B'nai Mitzvah, Hebrew baby namings and weddings as well! I am aware that even at happy occasions, it takes a while to get used to the idea that someone who only recently met you can adequately express the personal touch that makes such moments just what you want from your temple. I promise you my very best efforts - work that will make you proud.

For what excites me most about this upcoming period in my rabbinate is the chance to learn from you and not simply teach or preach to you. I want to know from each of you - my congregation, my fellow staff and clergy, our temple leaders and individual members - what drives your involvement within the Jewish community. This will take a great deal of time - but the process of listening and learning from each other promises to be truly rewarding for both of us. And yet I am especially looking forward to dreaming with you and pledging with you to grow the work of *chesed* (loving kindness and compassion), the value that is the namesake of our synagogue, a value that our world so vitally needs.

I am joining Fairmount Temple as a rabbi. But at the same time, I also hope you realize I am also coming to temple with my family, and we have joined a new synagogue for the same reasons that many join. We are here - my wife Joanie Berger, my son and daughter Zachary and Hope - to make new friends, create lasting Jewish memories, and contribute in our own way to the wonderful achievements of this community. So let us build connections with one another - and come to enjoy sharing this temple's future together!

I am thinking now of an excerpt from the poem I shared at the Annual Meeting, composed by Marge Piercy. The poem is called "The Seven of Pentacles," in part of which she writes:

"Connections are made slowly, sometimes they grow underground. You cannot tell always by looking what is happening. More than half the tree is spread out in the soil under your feet... So weave real connections, create real nodes, build real houses. Live a life you can endure: Make love that is loving. Keep tangling and interweaving and taking more in... reach out, keep reaching out, keep bringing in. This is how we are going to live for a long time: not always, for every gardener knows that after the digging, after the planting, after the long season of tending and growth, the harvest comes."

I hope you will find these words meaningful, and that this summer brings you and your family many sweet blessings. I look forward to our making connections together in the months and many, many years to come.

ISRAEL—HERE WE COME!



On July 20, 44 members of the Fairmount Temple community, representing 13 families and three generations, will embark on an 11-day trip of Israel, led by Rabbi Joshua Caruso and congregant Rick Leibovich.

Jewish novelist Anne Roiphe wrote, “We do have a contribution to make, and to do that we must hold on to our identity, to our place, to our Jewish souls from generation to generation. Israel is where the story began, and we need Israel, the central pillar of our house now.”

Our beloved land of Israel has played a significant and central role in the evolution of the Jewish people. Even when Jews did not inhabit the land of Israel, our people regarded it as a touchstone. It was more than simply a physical space; it was a spiritual oasis during times of oppression and exile. No Jewish text typifies this sentiment more than the Passover Haggadah, which concludes with a message of hope: *Next Year in Jerusalem*. As a Jew and a rabbi, I believe it is incumbent upon every Jew to make the sacred pilgrimage to our eternal homeland. My first trip to Israel opened my eyes and my heart to how Judaism could impact me as a person of the world. My commitment to social justice was inspired by the example our people set when they journeyed across the desert in hopes of reaching the Promised Land. The State of Israel was created so Jews did not have to live under foreign oppression – so we didn’t have to feel like strangers anymore.

This summer, more than 40 participants will join me in a life-changing journey to the State of Israel – many will arrive as strangers, all will return home with a transformative love for the Promised Land. We will walk the same land our ancestors traversed thousands of years ago, and come to know Israel as a living museum of the Jewish people. Our trip to Israel is finally going to happen! We have been waiting a long time for this special family trip. My wife, Ellen Halfon, and I have both been to Israel before, most recently in the summer of 2008 with the Fairmount Temple Israel trip. We went without our kids, while they were at summer camp. Throughout the experience, Ellen and I would comment to each other that we wished the kids were with us. We wondered how they would respond to different things we saw. We knew that we wanted them to experience Israel; in fact we began saving for this trip over 10 years ago, when our oldest daughter, Shaina, was in kindergarten. Now she is 15, and Adin and Mira are 13 and 11. We feel this summer is the window of opportunity when all three are the right age to appreciate the significance of what they will see in Israel.

We are also excited about the other families who will be joining us on the trip, with children of a broad age range. This will give our children the chance to share this experience with their peers. My parents will also be joining us for their first Israel adventure. We are grateful that we were able to participate in the Gift of Israel program, which allowed us to save a significant portion of the trip cost for our children. The Gift of Israel is a matching funds program; the family puts money into a savings account every year, which is then matched with funds from Fairmount Temple and the Jewish Federation of Cleveland. Now the time is right. Although this is my fifth trip to Israel, including a yearlong experience after college, I imagine that, in some ways, it will feel like the first time, as I experience the trip through the eyes of my children.

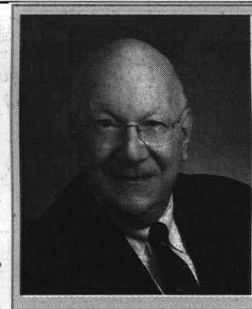

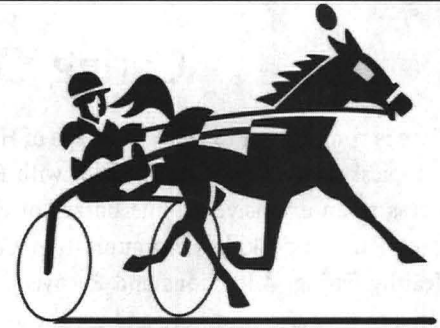

BROTHERHOOD NIGHT AT NORTHFIELD

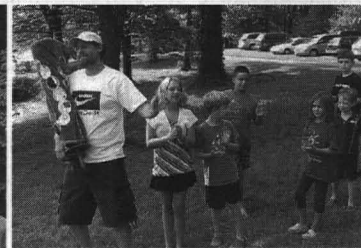
Saturday, July 24, 6 p.m.

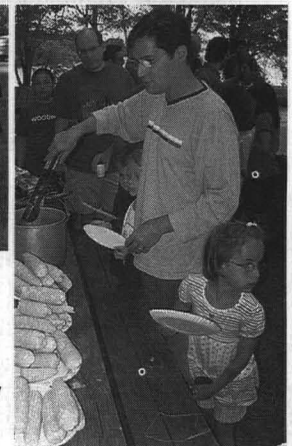
