On Whose Shoulders I Stand

There's a song I find myself remembering. I don't remember who wrote it. But the lyrics are about "standing on the shoulders" of those who came before us, touched by their vision and the wisdom they've shared. No doubt the reason I've recently been drawn to remember this song is because I rely quite a bit on the meaningful experiences I've shared with mentors and teachers who have helped shape my rabbinate and upon whose shoulders I stand when I look out to you at my new congregation.

There's no doubt my own home rabbi, Dannel Schwartz, has been among the most loyal friends and teachers I have ever and will ever know. I am standing on his shoulders, for as a teen he taught me how positively a rabbi could be a part of a young person's life, and whether at joyous times or times of sadness, his vision and love have been a constant and profound influence.

Because of all the work I have shared on behalf of the Reform Jewish movement, colleagues who have led the teams on which I've worked, rabbis such as Allan Smith, Chaim Stern, z"l, Daniel Frelander, Rex Perlmeter and Jan Katzew have encouraged me to foster deep and abiding relationships in the communities I've served, and hold true to my convictions. Indeed I feel blessed for having had the opportunity to share time with these rabbis, teachers and people of all faiths who have impacted the rabbinate I share with you.

But for those who have asked me why I ultimately chose to become a rabbi, I have told you that I wanted to teach, to do so with depth, and to stay in the lives of my students over a long period of time. In the studies I have shared with many wonderful teachers, I have become fascinated with the way in which Jewish faith and theology converge and diverge, and with the opportunity we have to imbue our time alive with *kedusha*, a sense of holiness. For me, God is the rock of my existence, and the people and experiences I encounter the quarry which shapes and hews the offerings I can make with my life. My rabbinate is about helping people find the "rock" and "quarry" that shapes their way of living and learning.

These ideas were intellectually born for me while I was a student of Torah at the Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR), the seminary of our Reform movement. The College-Institute is where I first studied Jewish Communal Service in 1993 and then continued my studies for the rabbinate in 1996.

The President of HUC-JIR, Rabbi David Ellenson, has been such a gifted teacher to me since I first met him two decades ago. So indeed if I am standing on the shoulders of my rabbi and so many other leaders I've encountered, I am carrying in my arms my notebook from Rabbi Ellenson's classes, and in my heart the memories of the love of Jewish learning and teaching he taught me, and the caring supportive way he has long stood by me. Indeed I am hardly alone in saying this! Rabbi David Ellenson is universally respected in the Jewish community for his gifted intellect, his challenging coursework, and for his demand of depth and scholarship alongside *mentschlikeit* and decency from his students.

I am so deeply appreciative that Rabbi Ellenson is coming to share with Anshe Chesed Fairmount Temple and with me the installation weekend we will share on Dec. 3-5. For the synagogue, having this leading movement rabbi speak to us as we begin a new chapter in our history is a reminder of our role at Anshe Chesed as a proud and leading Reform Jewish synagogue. But for me, at this awe-inspiring moment in my rabbinate, it is another chance to stand on Rabbi Ellenson's shoulders (spiritually speaking!) and continue to receive the encouragement he and so many supportive and loving mentors have shown me. He will share the sermon at the Shabbat service of my installation on Friday, Dec. 3, followed by a children's installation ritual at our Chanukah Dinner and Celebration on Saturday evening, Dec. 4, and our Fairmount Temple Mitzvah Day on Sunday, Dec. 5.

What a wonderful celebration we can and will share together. I hope you can join us or in some way utilize this moment in temple's history, to remember upon whose shoulders you stand, and go forward as one community in strength!

This concert, spurred by the arrests of two women—one for carrying a Torah and the other for wearing a tallis, is conceived as a voice of the Diaspora Jewish Community asking Israel some honest questions. It will be under the artistic direction of David Gooding and will feature area cantors, including Cantor Sager.

The *Sacred Rights, Sacred Song* concert, sponsored by the Immerman Foundation of the Jewish Federation of Cleveland, is an opportunity to raise awareness and raise our voices in concern to support organizations that are working to make social change in Israel in the area of spiritual civil rights. 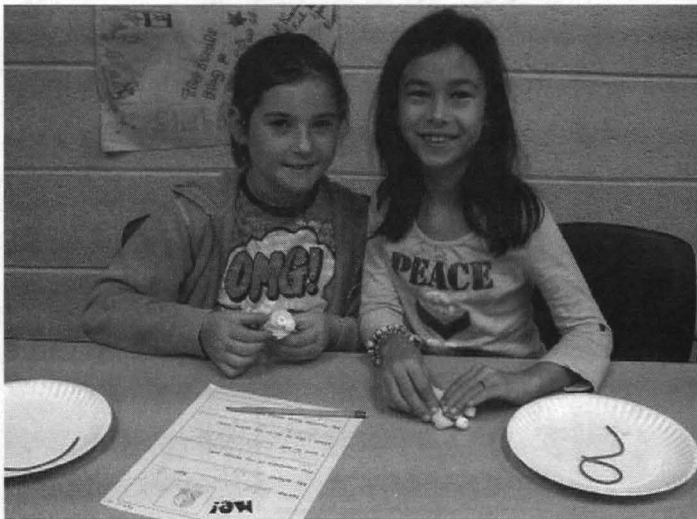

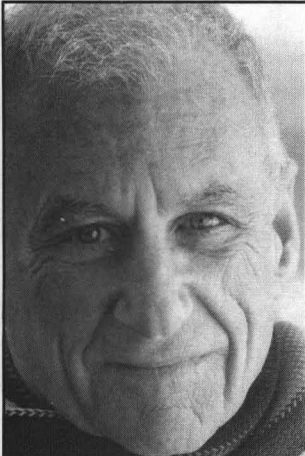

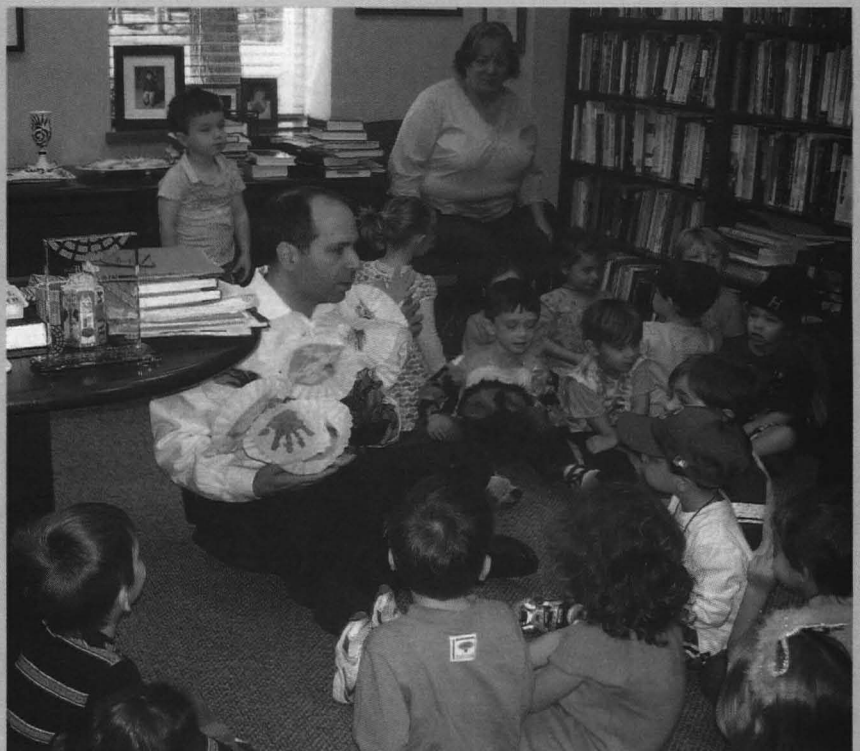
