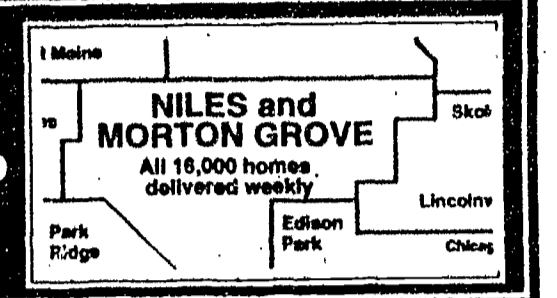

Worker hurt in attic fire

One person was slightly hurt and a house sustained approximately \$50,000 in damage after an attic fire June 10 in the 5400 block of Warren Street in Morton Grove.
A construction worker doing stucco work on the exterior of the single family home noticed smoke about 12:40 p.m. and called the fire department. The man suffered a first-degree burn to his hand as he tried to determine the source of the smoke. He received medical attention at the scene but was not taken to a hospital.
A moderate amount of smoke was escaping from the roof by the time fire fighters arrived, according to fire department Chief Ralph Czerwinski. Firefighters cut ventilation holes in the roof to release the gas and smoke from the structure while extinguishing

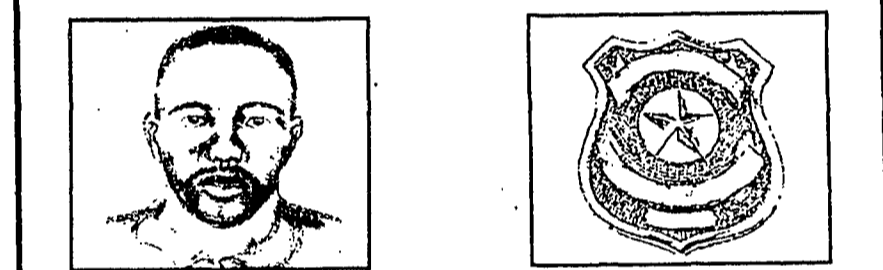
Man arrested for impersonating police officer; Victim fails to identify rape suspect in police line up

Despite an arrest of a suspect by Niles Police last week, the search continues for the man suspected of a series of armed home invasions in the northern suburbs and north Chicago, several which have resulted in sexual assaults.
A 35 year-old security guard from Chicago's north side was arrested at a martial arts studio in Niles, when employees grew suspicious after a man meeting the description of the suspect told them he was a police officer.
The wanted man, who has attacked women of Asian descent or women who could appear to be Asian, has posed as an FBI agent, a telephone repair man, and a census worker.

Board members discussed the possibility of replacing Niles North and Niles West's separate newsletters with a seasonal district-wide magazine providing information on both high schools to area residents. While board officials disagreed as to whether or not parents would prefer to receive information on both schools, PR Coordinator Brian Nolan said that as area residents are all taxpayers, it is the board's prerogative to provide all district information, whether they (residents) want it or not.

District President Robert Silberman suggested publishing two editions of the magazine with shared district information, but each customized according to the school. Thus, the magazines would contain identical information on shared upcoming events, but publications for residents in, say, the Niles North area, would specify information about that school, such as it's honor roll list. In addition to the magazine, Nolan also proposed publishing an annual report, making press kits available, and updating the district's Web site, all to better inform residents, as well as prospective home buyers, about news relevant to the district.

Resurrection's Dr. Grande proactive in educating public on need for colorectal cancer screening

Anthony A. Grande, M.D., a gastroenterologist on staff at Resurrection Medical Center, held up a copy of *Time* magazine with a photo of Katie Couric on the cover and told his audience, "If everyone had a colon screening at age 50, colon cancer deaths could be reduced -- and 30,000 to 40,000 lives a year saved."

Even that sound advice, though, wouldn't have saved the life of Jay Monahan, husband of Couric, anchor of NBC TV's *Today* show. Monahan died in January, 1998, just two weeks after his 42nd birthday. Since her husband's death, Couric has launched a national campaign to educate people to get tested for colorectal cancer. She's helped start an organization -- the National Colorectal Cancer Research Alliance -- to spread the word that colorectal cancer is treatable and beatable if caught in time.

Though not yet a household name, Dr. Grande is no less fervent than Katie Couric in his effort to tell people what they need to know about the disease that's one of the deadliest, yet potentially most curable. "As the *Time* article pointed out," Dr. Grande said, "most

Americans hardly ever think about colon cancer, if they think of it at all. And it's definitely not a subject most people want to talk about. But that was true of breast cancer just a few years ago -- and now look what's happened. If we're going to reduce the number of deaths from this disease, we've got to educate people enough to get them thinking and talking about colorectal cancer, so they will make sure they get tested on a regular basis, just as more and more women are having annual mammograms."

Dr. Grande led off a panel of health care professionals who recently gave a free two-hour evening presentation at Resurrection Medical Center on minimizing the risk of developing colorectal cancer. The crowd who came to hear Grande and the others speak probably were not the people who would have benefited most from information dispensed by Grande that night.

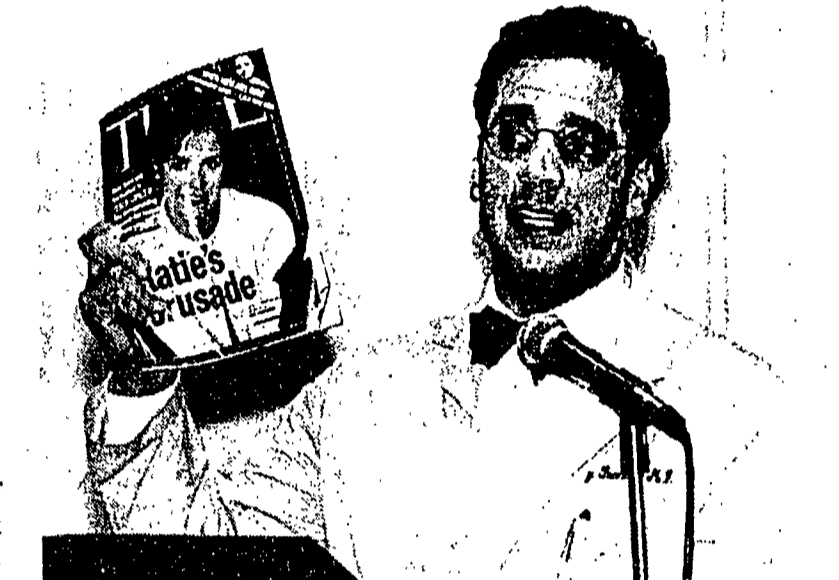
"Too often I get the impression I'm preaching to the choir -- telling people the stark truth about colorectal cancer who probably already know a lot of what I'm saying. We need to somehow reach the people who aren't listening and make them

know how extremely important it is to get screened for colorectal cancer. Each year, 130,000 new cases of colorectal cancer are diagnosed. If caught early, 50 to 75 percent of deaths from this disease could be prevented," Grande said.

"People need to get screened -- at least by the age of 50, and at age 40 if they have any risk factors. A family history, a blood relative who has had colon cancer or colon polyps, is the single most important risk factor. There are several types of screening tests, so it's important to talk with your doctor about which one is best for you."

"Everyone who turns 50 should ask their doctor for a fecal-occult blood test kit. It's easy to use in the privacy of home and detects the presence of small quantities of blood in the stool, which could be a signal of colorectal cancer. The test kit comes with simple but thorough instructions to follow several days before beginning the test, such as not eating red meat. Following the instructions can reduce the chance of a false-positive result," Dr. Grande explained.

In conjunction with an annual

fecal-occult blood test, a flexible sigmoidoscopy should also be done at age 50. A sigmoidoscopy is a long, flexible lighted tube about the diameter of a finger. It is used to examine the rectum and approximately the lower third of the colon (large bowel) for polyps and cancer. If a polyp is found, it can be sam-

pled through the scope and tested at a lab. A flexible sigmoidoscopy can be performed in a doctor's office and does not require any anesthesia or sedation. Prior to the procedure, an enema is required to empty the rectum and lower colon for the examination to be accurate and complete. The procedure takes about five to 15 minutes to perform and should be repeated every five years, beginning at age 50, for people who have no other risk factors.

A colonoscopy is a procedure done by a gastroenterologist. A long, flexible lighted tube -- a colonoscope -- is used to view the entire colon for polyps or cancer. A bowel cleansing preparation is required before the procedure. At the front end of the colonoscope is a tiny camera which can send images of the colon to a TV screen. If a polyp is found, it can be removed during the procedure and sent to a lab to determine if it is cancerous. A colonoscopy requires the patient to be sedated. The procedure takes about 30 minutes.

As a substitute for a colonoscopy, a physician may recommend a double-contrast barium enema. The procedure is done by a radiologist in a hospital on an outpatient basis. After cleansing the colon, a soft, flexible tube is inserted into the rectum and a barium solution goes through the tube into the colon. Male infertility factor for one in 25 men

Infertility is defined as the failure of a couple to become pregnant after one year of regular, unprotected intercourse. In both men and women, the fertility process is complex, and in approximately forty percent of cases, male infertility is the major factor. Infertility affects one in 25 American men.

A normal, mature sperm consists of a head that contains the man's genetic material--his DNA--and a tail that lashes back and forth at great speed to propel the head forward at about four times its own length every second. The ability of a sperm to move forward rapidly and straight is probably the most significant determinant of male fertility. Usually more than 40 million sperm are delivered into the ejaculate at any given time, but even under normal conditions only 15% are healthy enough to fertilize an egg.

What causes male infertility? Unfortunately, even when male infertility is diagnosed, its cause cannot be established in most cases. More than 90% of male infertility is caused by low sperm counts, poor sperm quality or both.

Low sperm count can be caused by a variety of defects and may vary widely over time, so a single test that reports a low count may not be a true result. Temporary low counts can be caused by

high fever, stress, various drugs, lack of sleep, chemotherapy or overheating.

Sperm motility is the ability of the sperm to move. If motility is slow, not straight forward or both, the sperm will have difficulty penetrating the egg. If 50% or more of the sperm have normal motility, then the sperm is at least average in quality.

Exposure to radiation and x-rays affect any rapidly dividing cell. It may take up to two years to resume normal sperm production.

Varicocele (varicose veins of the testicle) Found in 15% to 20% of all men and in 25% to 40% of infertile men.

Drugs and medications have been known to affect sperm production. Cocaine or heavy marijuana use appears to temporarily reduce the number and quality of sperm by 50%. Anabolic steroids also impair sperm production. Many prescription drugs also affect sperm production.

Smoking and alcohol consumption

Virtually all cases of male factor infertility can be treated effectively using one of a number of techniques," said John Rapaport, M.D., director, Assisted Reproductive Technology, Lutheran General Hospital. "There are a number of ways to improve sperm quality. Some methods include therapy with vitamin supplements or hormones, removing offending agents like alcohol or toxins, and surgery."

The In Vitro Fertilization Program at Lutheran General Hospital, Park Ridge, has been a recognized leader in the treatment of infertility since 1989, and has served over 1,600 couples resulting in over 600 live births to date.

Accredited by the College of American Pathologists and the American Society of Reproductive Medicine, Lutheran General Hospital's state-of-the-art IVF laboratory houses 12 incubators--each patient has their own; 2 embryo freezers for cryogenic preservation of embryos; and 7 storage tanks that hold frozen embryos and sperm.

Advanced procedures such as Assisted Hatching, and ICSI, are performed at Lutheran General Hospital with the newest micromanipulation technology equipment. Blastocyst Transfers are also done, resulting higher occurrences of implantation and lower rates of multiple births.

bleeding, fatigue, onset of abdominal pain, and change in bowel habits or in the shape or size of the stool -- often thin or pencil size.

Close relatives of a person who had polyps or colon cancer before age 60 or persons with any one of several chronic digestive conditions have a higher than average risk of developing colorectal cancer and should have a more comprehensive examination with either a barium enema or colonoscopy," Dr. Grande advised.

There are a number of lifestyle changes people can make that may reduce the risk of developing colon cancer. These include eating less fat and more fiber, doing vigorous, regular exercise; avoiding alcohol consumption; maintaining an ideal body weight; quitting smoking; and if you're a postmenopausal woman, considering hormone replacement therapy.

Colorectal cancer is a serious, deadly disease -- but the good news is that regular colorectal cancer screening can save many lives -- if people will just do it," Dr. Grande concluded.

Up in Smoke - The truth about tar and nicotine ratings

Why do some smokers choose "low tar" and "light" cigarettes? Because they think these cigarettes may be less harmful to their health than regular cigarettes.

The Federal Trade Commission wants you to know that cigarette tar and nicotine ratings can't predict the amount of tar and nicotine you get from any particular cigarette. That's because how you smoke a cigarette can significantly affect the amount of tar, nicotine and carbon monoxide you get from

your cigarette. Research indicates that many smokers of "low tar" or "light" cigarettes compensate by taking deeper, longer, or more frequent puffs from their cigarettes. The amount of tar and nicotine a smoker actually gets also can increase if the smoker unintentionally blocks tiny ventilation holes in cigarette filters that are designed to dilute smoke with air.

When it comes to "low tar" and "light" cigarettes, the FTC wants you to know: The tar and nicotine number

used in advertising and on packaging are determined using a smoking machine -- a smoking "robot" so to speak -- that smokes every brand of cigarettes exactly the same way.

The numbers do not represent the amount of tar and nicotine a particular smoker may get. First, people don't smoke cigarettes the same way the machine does; second, no two people smoke the same way.

Many lower tar cigarettes have filters with very small vent holes in the sides that allow air to dilute the smoke in each puff. It's easy for smokers to cover the

holes unknowingly; that results in them getting more tar and nicotine.

It's impossible to tell from the ratings the amount of tar and nicotine a smoker will get from any cigarette. Smokers of lower nicotine cigarettes tend to compensate for the lower nicotine by taking deeper and more frequent puffs than they would from a regular cigarette.

The amount of tar and nicotine smokers actually get depends on how deep and how often they puff on the cigarette and whether they block the vent

holes. Smoking "low tar" or "light" cigarettes does not eliminate the health risks of smoking. If you're concerned about the health risks of smoking, stop smoking.

The amount of tar and nicotine you get from your cigarette depends on how you smoke your cigarette. Don't count on the numbers. There's no such thing as a safe smoke. - Do not request or accept a substitute for the prescribed lens

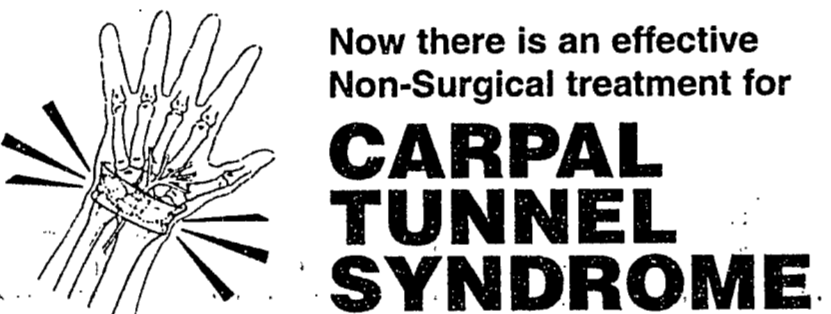
without checking with your eye care practitioner first.

- Check the expiration date on the product immediately upon receipt of your order.
- Make sure your prescription is current and has not expired before placing your order. The online supplier should confirm this with every order.
- And finally, if a problem results from the order, visit your eye care professional immediately.

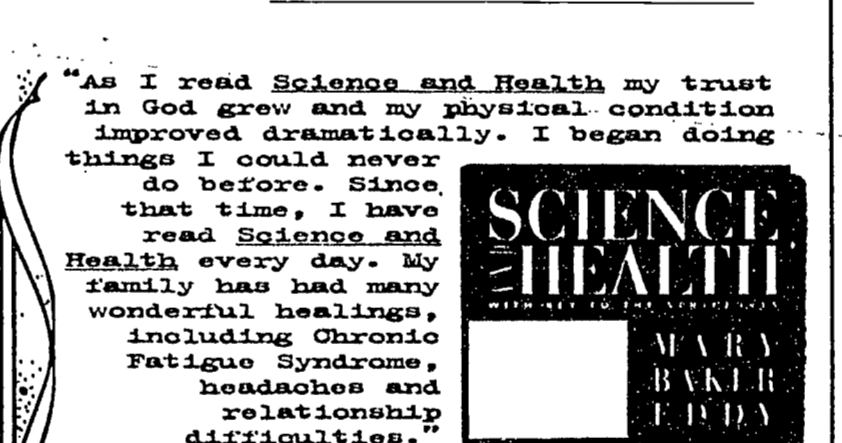

"It also gave me a core of 25 teachers to draw on for professional support as well as their classrooms full of potential pen pals and research buddies for my students to communicate with."

Make the Minutes Count

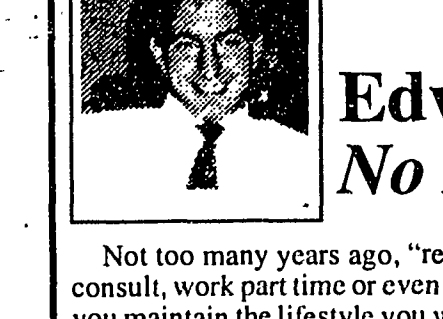

As you may know, Roth IRA earnings grow completely tax free, provided you've had your account for at least five years. That's a big plus, but there are other benefits. You can make contributions as long as you're working. With a traditional IRA, you cannot make any contributions past age 70-1/2. However, as long as you continue to earn income, you can contribute up to \$2,000 a year to a Roth IRA. And if you have at least \$4,000 in earned income, you can also contribute to your spouse's Roth IRA, even if he or she doesn't have any earned income. You won't be forced to make withdrawals. Once you reach 70-1/2, you have to make minimum withdrawals each year from a traditional IRA, even if you don't need the money. Plus, you'll have to pay income taxes on your withdrawals. A Roth IRA has no such requirement; you can keep the money in your account for as long as you choose. Your family pays no income taxes on inherited Roth IRA funds. You may not outlive the money you have accumulated in your Roth IRA. If that happens, you can leave the assets in the account to your heirs, and they won't have to pay income taxes on it. (However, Roth IRA proceeds may result in increased estate taxes.) On the other hand, your heirs would have to pay regular income taxes on any money they withdraw from an inherited traditional IRA. Of course, you may already be contributing to a traditional IRA. Should you convert this account to a Roth IRA if you plan to continue earning income during your retirement years? There's no one right answer for everyone. But you need to be aware that you will have to pay income taxes on the entire converted amount. That could be a significant impact on your tax situation; you may be better off withdrawing the funds you need each year from your traditional IRA and paying income taxes on the withdrawals. Even if you choose this route, you can still open a new Roth IRA. Before you make any IRA moves, you'll need to consult with your tax advisor. But if the Roth IRA is appropriate for you, you'll find that it can be an excellent investment for your retirement years - even if you're not really "retired."

DIABETES SCREENING
 Non-insulin-dependent diabetes is gradual in onset and usually occurs in adults over age 40. Some of the warning signs are: blurred or any change in vision, tingling or itchy skin; slow healing of cuts and bruises; and drowsiness. How to tell if you need a new air conditioner

Is this the year you replace that old air conditioner? Or, would it be cheaper to keep it repaired as long as possible? The answer will be different for different homeowners in different parts of the country. However, in many cases, a new air conditioner can save enough in electricity costs to pay for itself.

With air conditioners, energy efficiency is measured in terms of Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio, or SEER. It works just like miles per gallon on a car. A higher number means greater energy savings.

How old is your air conditioner? If it is more than seven years old, it probably is not a high-efficiency model. If your air conditioner is seven to 10 years old, it may be rated at 8.0 to 10.0 SEER. If it is more than 10 years old, it may achieve only 6.0 or 7.0 SEER.

Many modern air conditioners, such as the Tempstar Smart-Comfort 2400, achieve SEER ratings as high as 15. This means the new air conditioner may use just half as much electricity as one that is 15 years old. Even if you have a fairly new 10 SEER air conditioner, you can cut your electricity costs

substantially with a new 15 SEER model. "Where do you live? In the southern United States, but summers will keep your air conditioner working hard from April to October. Farther north, you may need air conditioning only a few weeks out of the year. The hotter your climate, the more electricity your air conditioner will use. And, the more electricity it uses, the more you can save with a new air conditioner."

While deck failures are uncommon, the Oakton accident pointed up the need for close attention before and after a deck is built. Here are some tips on deck maintenance to prevent such a failure.

Before hiring a deck contractor, homeowners should check references, go look at the builder's work and verify that the builder is properly licensed. You should also insist that the contractor secure a building permit. A building permit will ensure that the deck is inspected for proper construction and attachment to the house.

Insist that the lag screws securely anchor the deck ledger beam to the framing of the house.

A couple of years ago at an Oakton, Va. townhouse, two dozen people were taken to local hospitals when the deck they were partying on broke away from the house, knocking the guests to the ground.

The accident occurred because the framing for the house lacked a band board to which the lag screws were supposed to be attached. After the deck collapsed, Fairfax County building officials immediately revised their inspection procedures for decks.

After the deck is finished, check the connections of the supportive structure annually. If any of the lag screws move easily, get an expert to check it out right away.

Once the deck is installed, you need to seal it with an oil-based, water-repellent sealer. Staining the deck will preserve its beauty and lifespan. The re-sealing should be done every year.

'Grasscycling' - Better for your lawn

Between April and November, homeowners spend much of their free time caring for their lawn. This means regular mowing, an activity that some people enjoy as exercise but most find a chore.

While standard practice used to mean raking the clippings and putting them in plastic bags for disposal, the current trend in lawn care is "grasscycling."

What is "grasscycling"? Actually, it's not new. It's what homeowners did for years and is just now enjoying a revival. Grasscycling is the natural recycling of grass clippings on your lawn. Simply put, it means letting the clippings lie on your lawn where they can recycle into the soil. You don't need a special mower to make grasscycling work. When you mow, don't use a catch bag and don't rake the clippings when you're done.

Thirty years ago, it was widely believed that grass clippings caused thatch and that removing them slowed thatch development. Since then, multiple studies have shown that thatch is composed of grassroots, not

blades of grass. There are lots of good reasons to start grasscycling. Besides slowing the development of thatch, grasscycling improves lawn quality and saves time, work and money.

Studies conducted with homeowners who stopped bagging their clippings found that grasscyclers spent an average of seven hours less on yard work during the grass-cutting season because they didn't spend any time bagging the clippings.

Grasscycling saves money on fertilizer, trash bags, and reduced wear and tear on their mowing equipment. Grasscycling does not spread lawn disease. Disease spores are present whether or not grass clippings are raked and disposed of.

owner of the martial arts studio contacted authorities. The owner knows quite a few of our guys, and knew that he (the man arrested) wasn't one of us," said Zimmerman.

The man apprehended not only meets the attacker's physical description (med-to-light complexioned black male, approximately 6 ft. tall, in his late twenties to early thirties, with a medium build), but upon arrest, police found a badge, handcuffs, and a pellet gun.

At least two of the women attacked have been handcuffed. "We had every reason to include or eliminate him based on this information," said Zimmerman, who emphasized that the man arrested was not the security guard pulled over in Niles last week (reported in the last edition of The Bugle).

The man was held by Niles Police, but released when he was not identified in a line-up.

A former history teacher at Glenbrook North from 1982 to 1992, Fry was convicted of disorderly conduct after he was arrested for prowling on the rooftop of a Northbrook student.

The boy's father contacted police after seeing a man dressed as a Ninja reaching toward the boy's bedroom.

While the incident resulted in a paid suspension until Fry resigned his tenure with District 265 and agreed to have no contact with its students, Fry received a favorable recommendation from the district which in turn allowed him to be hired in Wisconsin.

Washington C.A.R.E.

Children are often criticized as being a self-centered part of our society. This is certainly not true of the students of Washington School.

In light of the man's release, members of the Taiwanese American Chamber of Commerce are offering \$15,000 in donations raised for information leading to the arrest of the attacker, bringing the total reward to \$30,000.

An anonymous donor from the Asian community originally offered \$10,000 and the FBI added an additional \$5,000 last week.

Chicago area police have expanded their search to include Hispanic men of African descent after one of the victims told police that her attacker conversed with her in that language. People with information can call 1-800-458-1002.

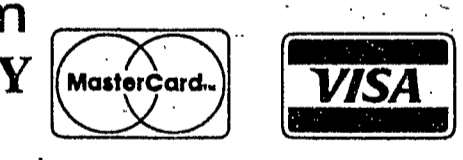
