Sister cities co-broadcast from both leaning towers

Niles, Illinois and Pisa, Italy will take their sister-cityhood a step further next month.

Amateur radio clubs in both locations will set up and operate ham radio stations from each city's leaning tower.

Ham operators worldwide will attempt to contact both towers using both voice and Morse code. Those making successful contacts will win a special Pisan Tower Award.

The event is organized by the Metro Amateur Radio Club of

Niles. Mike Dinelli, the group's secretary, is also event organizer.

"We expect to make contact with over 2,000 radio amateurs worldwide during this event," Dinelli said.

Metro Amateur Radio Club provides amateur radio classes at Niles' Leaning Tower YMCA.

Morton Grove works to ease cultural fears

Information just released from the 2000 census shows just how necessary cultural awareness has become to serve a multicultural public like Morton Grove.

Census data released May 14 shows that one-third of Morton Grove residents were born in other countries, with a full one-half of those coming from Asian nations.

Only 58 percent of Morton Grove's residents responded to a census question that English is the primary language spoken in their homes. Some 18 percent admit that they do not speak English well.

Recognizing this diversity, Morton Grove has positioned itself to eliminate as many cultural barriers between residents and officials as possible.

The police department helps officers understand various cultures through its diversity training program.

Agreement reached for soccer field

The park at Emerson Middle School will be redeveloped as a soccer field now that an agreement has been reached between School District 64 and Park Ridge Recreation and Park District.

The agreement outlines field use, maximum costs, and areas of responsibility. The park district will pay for field construction, not to exceed \$450,000, of which \$225,000 will be repaid to the district over a three-year period by the Park Ridge Youth

Soccer Association.

District 64 will pay for water used at the site and is responsible for maintaining and cleaning restrooms that service the field.

District 64 will pay \$3,000 per year to the park district to help the district absorb its share of expenses. That amount could increase each year depending on the percent increase of a consumer price index.

Fred Schroeder, superintendent of District 65, said that the

29-year-old surrounded by children when arrested; Remains in jail, court appearance set for June 7

Sex offender arrested in Des Plaines park

A 29-year-old Des Plaines man registered as a sex offender was arrested by Des Plaines police at Apache Park when an alert officer noticed a man surrounded by a group of children, aged 4 to 14.

Estebon Diaz told police that he was recently released from prison after serving a sentence for raping an 11-year-old girl.

In actuality, Diaz was charged with a home invasion on the 2000 block of Pine Street in his neighborhood, and with the criminal sexual assault and battery of a 25-year-old woman. A juvenile female had been present but was gone when he attacked the woman, according to Des Plaines police.

Diaz served part of a four-year sentence then registered with the police department as a

sex offender on his early release in March.

He is charged with two felonies, knowingly being in the presence of children and living within 500 feet of a playground.

Diaz appeared in Cook County Court Skokie Division May 9 and is being held in Cook County jail. His next court appearance is scheduled on June 7.

Glenview Hangar One compromise reached

Plans for the redevelopment of former Glenview Air Station's Hangar One into a retail and entertainment space have been approved by the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency, which has issued a letter allowing redevelopment to proceed.

Cody Wright is happy with the outcome. Wright is the I.H.P.A.'s cultural resources manager whose efforts were dedicated to preserving the hangar's historic appearance.

"We feel that the building will still impart its cultural and historical significance to the passers-by or visitor," said Wright.

The hangar, built in 1929, was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1998; however, after the air base closed in 1993, the state historic preservation agency said that parts or all of the hangar could be demolished.

if economics demanded.

So when developer DDR Oliver McMillan announced that the anchor tenant, Von Maur, wanted to demolish the hangar's facade in favor of its own style entryway, preservationists reacted strongly.

Following one year of negotiations and about 20 design submissions, there is a Hangar One plan that flies with everyone.

The central control tower and the towers atop the two side wings will remain.

The two hangar doors will be replaced by storefront glass windows for Von Maur and Galvan's, another anchor store.

Recessed areas will be provided to permit a view of the building's historic roof line.

The building's interior will be gutted to accommodate the retail

His mother, Lynn Joyce, remembered her young son's enthusiasm for taekwon do, the Korean martial art. She had enrolled him on his fifth birthday and he went on to win many awards.

The party, arranged by the class' room mother, Diane Bodzin, included a lunch of McDonald's Happy Meals. Magic tricks were performed by Ronald McDonald, with cake and soft drinks donated by Dominick's and Jewel Foods.

Bodzin presented Lynn Joyce with a container of flowers and suggested she plant them where they might provide memories of her son.

"I'll plant them near my door," said Joyce.

Melzer School in Morton Grove is part of Elementary School District 63 and serves students in Niles, Des Plaines.

Rescued cat begins his second life

A cat rescued by Larry Siegel of Des Plaines and Stephen Kieck of Arlington Heights continues to improve while convalescing at Save-A-Pet Shelter in Grayslake.

The cat, thought to have been born in the wild, just chose the wrong place to hang out on April 13.

He was reportedly beaten and tossed in the air, resulting in severe blunt trauma to the head, damage to an eye, plus flesh and whiskers torn from his face.

Said Siegel, "My neighbor's only reason for beating the cat was he didn't want him hanging around his house."

The cat received initial care at Animal 911, where it was noticed he also suffered from a severe respiratory infection that left him unable to eat or drink.

After cleaning wounds and administering intravenous fluids and painkillers, the cat was taken to Save-A-Pet for further treatment.

"He has gained weight and purrs whenever someone comes near his cage, but his eye and cheek are still quite swollen," said animal intake coordinator

Notre Dame High School announces May Don of the Month

Notre Dame High School for Boys' Senior, **John Bowler** (60631/St. Juliana) has been named Don of the Month for May by the School's National Honor Society.

To be eligible for Don of the Month, the student must be a senior and be involved in multiple extracurricular activities. The Don of the Month must exhibit qualities consistent with those that students in National Honor Society embody: academic excellence, strong character, demonstrated leadership and commitment to service.

Bowler helped lead the Dons' basketball team to a 24-4 record, East Suburban Catholic Conference (ESCC) title, and the York Sectional championship game at Elmhurst. The 6-foot-8, 240 pound center was named Notre Dame's and the ESCC's Most Valuable Player for averaging 19.7 points and 9.6 rebounds per game. During the season, Bowler eclipsed the 1,000 point mark for his career and eventually finished with a three-year total of 1,231 points. He will attend Eastern Michigan University on a full NCAA Division I basketball scholarship this fall.

Community service is a requirement for Notre Dame students. Bowler helped teach physical education classes at his grade school, St. Juliana, as a junior. He is now doing similar work at Notre Dame as part of the Senior Leader Program.

Bowler is a Big Brother at Notre Dame. The Big Brother program matches freshmen with upperclassmen. The purpose of the program is to build community among the students while offering specific assistance to freshmen in their transition to high school. Bowler is also in the Letterman's Club.

Bowler earned Cum Laude Honor Roll status for the fall semester by accumulating a grade point average of at least 3.20 but no higher than 3.49 with no grade lower than C.

Cook County/Public Health offers tips/Mosquito Control

With warmer temperatures on the way, one of public health's priorities is preventing mosquito-borne illness. Concerns over infection of West Nile Virus came to light when the virus was first detected on the east coast in 1999. Active during the months of June through October (when the mosquito population is at its peak), about a dozen diseases spread by mosquitoes are found in the United States. Mosquitoes become infected after biting a bird that harbors the illness; and human infection may occur after being bitten by an infected mos-

quito. These arboviral (insect-borne) diseases are not transmitted from person-to-person. In Illinois, the two most common arboviral diseases are St. Louis and LaCrosse Encephalitis. Encephalitis is an inflammation of the brain and can be caused by viruses and bacteria, including viruses transmitted by mosquitoes. Typically, these viruses cause few, if any symptoms. Most people who become infected recover fully, never knowing they were infected. West Nile Virus was first detected in Cook County during the autumn of 2001. Currently, no human cases of West Nile Virus in Illinois exist.

Occasionally, the viruses can cause serious complications. Symptoms may include headache, high fever, muscle aches, stiffness in back and neck, disorientation, convulsions and coma. Diagnosis is made through a blood test, but no specific medication exists to treat or cure the disease.

"The best defense against arboviral disease is personal protection," said Dr. Karen L. Scott, Director of the Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH). "Residents should eliminate potential breeding sites that may harbor disease-carrying insects."

CCDPH offers these suggestions:

- Remove or empty water in old tires, tin cans, buckets, drums, bottles or other places where mosquitoes might breed.
- Empty plastic wading pools at least once a week and store indoors when not in use. If unused, drain swimming pools and keep dry during mosquito season.
- Change water weekly in bird baths, plant saucers and trays.
- Store boats covered or upside down, and remove rainwater weekly.
- Water bowls used by pets should be emptied and refilled daily.
- Fill holes around home that may retain water.
- Keep gutters around home in good repair to avoid water build-up.
- Keep weeds and grass cut short as adult mosquitoes look for shady places to rest during hot daylight hours.
- Be sure screens in homes and buildings are intact and tight-fitting to prevent entry of insects.
- Apply mosquito repellent containing not more than 30% DEET primarily to clothing. Use sparingly on exposed skin. Follow directions on container.
- Keep skin covered when traveling through wooded areas. Wear long-sleeved shirts, pants and socks.

In Illinois, the state health department regularly conducts surveillance on the bird population, while CCDPH monitors the human population for illness. Since the discovery of West Nile Virus in the U.S., state and local efforts have been stepped-up to monitor for indications of the virus. Consumers need to be aware of new scams

Chicago - May 21, 2002 - A new scam has been identified in which consumers are advised by phone that they are eligible for a refund under the Firestone tire recall program. Consumers are told they are qualified for refunds from \$200 to \$286.

The reported calls have been received by consumers in eight states to date (Indiana, Louisiana, California, Connecticut, New York, Alabama, New Hampshire and Georgia) and have used a variety of ruses to obtain personal information on consumers. None of the consumers contacted owned recalled tires or had requested a refund, but all were asked for personal information such as confirmation of their address, social security number, birth date and bank account numbers, and in one instance the address where her husband worked.

"We do not contact customers by phone to tell them they qualified for a refund" assures Larry Perdue, Manager of Bridgestone Firestone Customer Retention Services. He went on to say, "if they submitted a refund request or reconsideration request under the Agreed Final Judgment with 50 attorney states generally they are notified in writing."

(NU) - If you haven't purchased a garage door opener during the past 10 years, you may be in for some surprises.

New models incorporate advanced technology to provide homeowners with high levels of security, safety and convenience.

For example, Craftsman garage door openers and remote controls feature 3.5 billion access codes, which are factory pre-programmed. It would take up to 1,500 years to repeat one of these codes, making it nearly impossible for someone to open your garage door with a different remote control.

Rolling code technology provides additional security. Every time the garage door is opened, the remote and opener change the access code. Rolling codes protect against devices known as code-grabbers which thieves use to steal signals transmitted from garage door openers.

A keyless entry system on some Craftsman models allows you to open the garage door by using a keypad instead of a key. A private four-digit code is set from thousands of available combinations and can be changed anytime. The keypad is mounted outdoors on the garage doorframe and has a hinged lid for weather protection.

'Help! My Neighbor's Lawn Is Better Than Mine'

(NU) - What's the big secret? Why do some lawns always seem to look better than others? Chances are, if you stop to ask your neighborhood lawn guru, you will discover three keys to lawn success.

First, mow your grass taller. By adjusting your mower height to a higher setting, you will help your lawn grow deeper roots to match the increased leaf growth. With deeper roots, your lawn will be better able to withstand hot, dry weather. A taller lawn also will be a better competitor against new weeds.

Second, water only when your lawn really needs it and water long enough to get the moisture down deep. When you leave footprints on your lawn, this means your lawn could use some water. A deep watering will encourage deep roots. Run your sprinklers long enough to put down one-half inch of water twice a week. Figure out how long to run your sprinklers by measuring the water that catches in an iced tea glass on your lawn.

Third, don't let your grass starve. Aside from the basics of mowing and watering, the single

most important thing you can do for your lawn is to provide proper nutrition by fertilizing it. One or two feedings a year make a marked improvement. However, you can see the difference between a so-so lawn and a truly beautiful lawn with four or five feedings a year.

There is a big difference in how different fertilizers work, even if they have the same nitrogen-phosphorus-potassium (N-P-K) numbers on the bag, so get a brand you can trust. Then follow the schedule on the back of the package so that you are feeding with the right product at the right time of year to keep your lawn problem-free.

That's all there is to it. You too can become the neighborhood lawn expert if you mow tall, water deep and follow an annual feeding schedule of four or five feedings.

Control consoles mounted inside the garage now include a "vacation" button that locks out all hand-held remote controls while you are away from home. One model has a built-in infrared sensor to detect motion in the garage, which automatically turns on the opener's work light.

Some garage door openers also come with a wireless opener monitor that alerts the homeowner if the garage door has been left open. A sensor is mounted on the garage door and a monitor is positioned inside the house within 350 feet of the sensor. A flashing red light on the monitor indicates the garage door is open, and a steady green light shows the door is closed.

Homeowners have a choice of three main types of Craftsman garage door drive systems: belt, screw or chain. Belt drive is the quietest because there is no metal-to-metal contact. The belt is made of the same wear-resistant materials used in steel-belted tires. Screw-driven garage door openers are maintenance-free in all types of climates. Their polyethylene screw mechanisms do not require grease that can freeze or attract dust and grime. Chain-driven garage door openers work on the same principle as a bicycle sprocket and chain. More chain-driven openers are sold than any other type.

Today, all garage door openers include reversing sensors to prevent accidents caused by the garage door hitting an obstruction.
