# Mosquito population up 800 percent in two weeks

Mother Nature doesn't want you to enjoy your summer cook-

If you didn't get the hint from the blistering heat, she's now dispatched armies of mosquitoes.

The North Shore Mosquito Abatement District reports one of the largest booms of biting mosquitoes in recent history, with some estimates suggesting no similar outbreaks in the last 20 years.

The district checks 11 traps in the area, and within a week's time, the number of mosquitoes

increased by about 800 percent. A July 20 sampling caught 750 mosquitoes, compared with 6.200 on Aug. 6.

The breed of mosquito is extremely aggressive. To make matters worse, they're "daybiters," said Dave Zazra, communications manager for NSMAD.

They're activated, so to speak, by quick flood waters like the ones last month. The larvae only need a few days to get their wings, and before long, they're biting every piece of exposed skin they can find.

High floodwaters last month triggered an unprecedented number of hatchlings, Zazra said. And it's not just freshly laid

eggs. Mosquitoes lay their eggs in damp soil, just above the water line in flood-prone areas. A dryer season means the eggs will stay put, but when the rain eventualy submerges them, they spring to life, Zazra said.

"Eggs that were laid several years ago could be hatching now,"

Luckily, the currently airborne batch of mosquitoes is not the breed that carries West Nile Virus, although Zazra said those ones could be on the way soon.

# Freshmen get new required school supply: laptops

When freshmen students enter the doors of Niles West and Niles North high schools for the first day of school Tuesday, they'll be equipped with a new piece of technology that will forever change the way District 219 students learn in the classroom.

As part of District 219's Anywhere/Anytime Learning Initiative, which aims to integrate a higher level of technology-based learning into the classroom, each student will receive a new Dell Mini Netbook computer that they can use at any time.

The 2010-11 school year will be the first time the three components of Anywhere/Anytime Learning — teaching, hardware and infrastructure - will be implemented in the schools.

District 219 is the first school district in the area to distribute laptop computers to students and plans to continue giving them to each freshman class every year until all students have integrated the technology into their curriculum in the year 2014.

After running a successful pilot program during the 2009-10 school year that tested Netbooks in several classrooms, the district moved forward with plans to purchase Netbooks for the incoming freshmen classes.

The cost of the 10 pound Netbooks, \$375 apiece, is covered by student fees. The district purchased 1.200 Netbooks, and will distribute 1,000 at the start of the school year. The remaining 200 are reserved for transfer students, said District 219 Chief Technology Officer Guy Ballad

Ballad described the technol-

ogy-based learning as a cost-effective move for the district.

"We're giving the students a running start to learning technology," Ballad said, "We feel that we're going to be able to save money on consumables in the long run-for example, we no longer have to print the student handbook because now we can give it to them digitally."

In preparation for the increase in Internet usage at the schools, wireless systems have been beefed up to handle the extra load, and both buildings are 100 percent wireless-equipped, Ballad said.

Although the devices will change the way students learn by putting endless amounts of information at their fingertips, district officials emphasized the focus is on the curriculum, which was revised during the last school year to include the technology integration and how best to engage students in new ways.

To prep the 400 teachers at Niles North and Niles West for the change, they were encouraged to attend two refresher courses in technology that explain in detail how to navigate the Netbooks

"Training is a huge piece of this. Almost 200 of our teachers have enrolled in the courses, including 70 percent of all freshman teachers" Ballad said. "The courses explain how to integrate the technology into the curricu-

For those teachers who haven't gone through the training, a condensed course will be offered in the fall, and district officials plan to have all teachers trained by

# Second health fair kicks off third year for parent center

The third year of Niles Township's English Language Learner Parent Center will begin with a Back To School Health Fair from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Friday at the facility at 9440 N. Kenton Ave.

The center introduced the health fair last year for the first time in August, and Director Corrie Wallace knew that it had found a useful and important annual kickoff event to the school year.

"Last year was very successful," Wallace said. "We saw a lot of interest from families so we knew we vanted to run this again."

More than 50 people from 25 families made doctor appointments last year during the all-day event. The health fair inspired the center's health awareness education classes, which are still up and running.

This year, four doctors will be at the fair compared to only two last year. But dental exams, part of last year's health fair, will not offered because not enough people signed up aliead of time, Wallace said.

NorthShore University HealthSystem donated \$3,200 for the fair, money to offset the expense of physicals although doctors are donating their time.

Those from Niles Township interested in a physical for themselves or a family member can call the ELL Parent Center at (847) 568-7611. People can also come to the fair Friday without having first called although an appointment is preferable, Wallace said.

Niles Township ELL Par ent Center has welcomed about 500 people in its small home attached to Skokie School District 68's offices. The center opened in July 2008 as a response to the change in demographics in Niles Township, which became liome to the largest growing population of immigrants and refugees in the Chicago area.

The Niles Township Superintendents Association, with the support of most of the township's school boards, created a funding plan for the center, which was formed to serve the needs of families with schoolchildren arriving from other countries.

"The Center serves as a welcome resource for parents to support them in advocating for their children's academic achievenient," the center website states.

It offers English classes, access to community services, specially designed workshops and programs crafted to meet parent needs and encourage parental involvement and leadership in the community at large.

But the economy has impacted the center in at least one way, Wallace admits. The center partners with Oakton Community College in providing English as a second language classes, but state funding to Oakton has practically dried

# **Economy pressures** putting food pantry in a state of crisis

Although no one asking for food is ever turned away, the shortage means less food is handed out, according to Cynthia Carranza, director of the Niles Township Food Pantry.

"I've had to reduce the amount of food I give to people because I'd rather give more people less food than said. less people more food," Carranza said. "We can't be as generous as we'd like."

The food pantry typically distributes between 60,000-70,000 pounds of food to 3,000 people who live in Skokie, Lincolnwood, Golf, Morton Grove, and Niles each month, but that number has increased by 39 percent during the past three





Dear Fixer: I made several bids for a rental car on Priceline.com — none of which, to my knowledge, was accepted. I gave up and went elsewhere to reserve a car, fearing that due to the Fourth of July holiday weekend, I might not be able to get one at all or for

a reasonable rate.

I went out of town and used the rental car.
However, when I returned home and checked my bank account, I noticed a charge of \$138.54 from Priceline.com.

I tried to call Priceline but could not get through to anyone without a request number. So I contacted them through their website. They responded by e-mail, saying I needed to talk to a customer service representative at their toll-free number.

I called, and through a lousy connection and after an initial dropped call, I spoke with someone who had no answer for me and refused to do more than hide behind a prewritten statement.

I explained that it makes little difference that they had accepted my bid if I am not informed of it. How was I to know they had made a reservation — which I would have gladly used, since I instead spent \$217 for a rental car from another company.

Not only did I not receive a confirmation e-mail, but on July 1, the day following the day my request was supposedly accepted, I received an e-mail from Priceline

asking, "Still looking for a rental car in downtown Chicago?" If you can help in any

If you can help in any way, I'd appreciate it. James Slevin

Dear James: We asked Priceline spokesman Brian Ek if he could tell us what happened, and this is what we found out:

Normally, with rental carbids, the consumer gets a response (accepted or not) on the screen within 60 seconds or less. They also can click the tab in the upper right corner of the welcome screen that says "check your request" to see whether a bid has gone through.

He wasn't sure what happened here, but it was obvious that you weren't trying to scam anyone. Because of that, Priceline agreed to issue a one-time refund of the \$138.54, which you've already received.

Dear Fixer: In January, I made a reservation at the Red Roof Inn in New York City using VIP/free night certificates for three nights.

This reservation had to

be made through the corporate office and had to be approved by the management of the individual hotel. I jumped through these hoops and got the reservation confirmed.

In March, I had to adjust the dates slightly and again reconfirmed the use of the free night certificates.

Two weeks before my trip, on June 25, I again reconfirmed the reservation through the Red Roof Inn 800-number and printed a sheet detailing the confirmation numbers from the Red Roof website.

However, when I

attempted to check in on July 9, I found out this hotel is no longer a Red Roof Inn and is now called the New York Manhattan Hotel, run by Apple Core Hotels. I was told that this transition happened on June 1.

I was never notified of this change, and as of June 25, this reservation appeared normal on the Red Roof Inn website. The person I talked to while reconfirming the reservation made no mention of this transition.

Of course, they would not accept the certificates.

I spent over 30 minutes on the phone with Red Roof Inn and talked to a supervisor. After several conversations between Red Roof Inn and the hotel manager, I was told that nothing could be done and that I was on my own.

I was left with the choice of finding another hotel at the last minute or staying at this hotel and having to spend over \$500 instead of having a free stay.

After an exhausting day of travel with my family, we decided to stay at this New York Manhattan Hotel.

Both of these organizations have left me hung out to dry and have no intention of helping me further. Is there anything you can do?

Dear Bob: It seems these people were so busy with the changeover they forgot to mention it to you — even though it sounds like you're a diligent guy and took all the right steps to confirm the reservation before heading to New York.

The Fixer is happy to say that in the end, common sense prevailed. After we contacted Red Roof Inn and told them your story, they had their guest relations and franchise folks look into what happened. Soon after, you received word from a customer relations representative that the credit card charges will be reversed — so your hotel in the Big Apple will have been free after all.

# Gun ban's defeat will backfire on society

In an earlier piece, I noted my background as a retired federal law enforcement officer and the brother of 20-year-old Michael, who was fatally shot in a robbery aboard a CTA train in 1972. I also described my working with families of handgun victims through programs both in the Cook County State's Attorney's office and the Victim Advocacy Project in the Illinois Attorney General's office.

I do not recall any of them calling for more guns in our society for self-protection.

In controversial decisions by the narrowest of margins, the U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that the Second Amendment is about self-defense and guarantees the right of citizens to possess a gun in the home. The court never mentioned handgun suicides, domestic shootings, children getting hold of guns, guns getting stolen from the home, or gang members taking family guns for a drive-by shooting. It overlooked that these laws were passed by legislative bodies after much debate and then were upheld by many court reviews over a period of 30 years. In the case of Oak Park, the ban also was ratified in a referendum.

The decision could have been written by the National Rifle Association. It failed to note that under the Chicago ordinance, 15,000 guns seized from persons illegally carrying them were destroyed, and the community was in fact just a bit safer. This ordinance did not purport to solve a national gun epidemic or even the city's

gun problem when so many come from out of state. Perhaps now Chicago can model its gun policy after Texas, Virginia and Florida regions that have large numbers of guns and lead the country in gun suicides and homicides.

Since colonial times we settle conflicts with guns. If the court had relied on its analysis on her-story instead of a biased view of his-story in colonial times, perhaps the decision would have reflected contemporary issues. Surprisingly, this backward court decision did not justify the ownership of guns to defeat

In the years ahead, the courts will be inundated with cases about the Second Amendment pushed by both sides. Sooner or later there will be another Virginia Tech shooting, another Northern Illinois incident, or another political assassi-

At some point America has another tradition after trying to work under sometimes onerous Constitutional limits and court decisions, finally opting to amend the Constitution and to change the court personnel.





### SCOTT PILGRIM VS. THE WORLD $\star$ $\star$ $\star$ 1/2

A hard-rocking, ultra-hyperbolic, videogame-saturated, often very funny, hipster romance, faithfully adapted from Bryan Lee O'Malley's six-volume series of cult-hit graphic novels. Ironic-vulnerability poster boy Michael Cera ("Youth in Revolt") is nicely suited for the title role of a 23-year-old Toronto slacker/rock musician who falls in love with the hipster chick of his dreams (Mary Elizabeth Winstead), then learns he must defeat her seven Evil Exes in mortal combat if he wants to have her. Director/co-writer Edgar Wright ("Shaun of the Dead") revels in a dy namic visual (and narrative) style that owes much to video games in

addition to comic books, action films, sitcoms, music videos, etc., all samnled with a knowing hipster sensibility. The upside of all that nonstop pop-cultural input is that "Pilgrim" is never lacking for style. The downside is that so much emphasis is placed on spectacle that emotional involvement and character development are given short shrift. "Scott Pilarim" may be entirely superficial but it's apparently superficial by choice. And having made that choice, it's generally clever and genuinely exhilarating from time to time. It doesn't have a lot to say, but at least it says it with maximum pizzazz. (BI) (112 min.) Rated PG-13 for stylized violence, sexual

### INCEPTION $\star$ $\star$ $\star$ 1/2 Characters spend a lot of time

sleeping in this movie, but not because things are dull. Occasionally confusion ves but never dull. This spectacularly complex, cerebral summer blockhuster from writer/director Christopher Nolan ("The Dark Knight"), may not tie up apparent loose ends with the mathematical precision of his brilliant "Memento" (though it will probably take multiple viewings to be sure). It's also emotionally tepid and it disappoints, just a bit, in the final moments. But this is still a must-see - a welcome challenge compared to the spoon-fed plots of standard-issue formulaic products Nolan begins with a formula: One Last Big Job for a weary, homesick corporate espionage super-thief (Leonardo DiCaprio) with a guilty secret, who steals secrets from dreaming mega-executives; but he plays mind-bogglingly original variations on that theme. Cobb (Di-Caprio) and his team of shared dreamers (Joseph Gordon-Levitt Ellen Page and Tom Hardy) play fast and loose with reality as a matter of course, but the climactic Big Caper, which involves planting a new idea in someone's mind instead of merely uncovering a secret, requires navigation of a dream within a dream within a dream and subconscious sugges tion amounting to deep Freudian psychotherapy in a hostile subconscious with their lives at stake. ### **MAO'S LAST DANCER** \* \* \*

The melodrama eventually goes over the top and the political posturing, on both sides of the communist/capitalist fence, is generally heavy-handed and simple-minded, but "Mao's Last Dancer" still satisfies if you're looking for a good cry - or a dazzling celebration of dance.


Directed by Bruce Beresford ("Driving Miss Daisy") and scripted by Jan Sardi ("Shine"), "Last Dancer" is based on the best-selling memoir by Li Cunxin, who trained as a ballet dancer during China's Cultural Revolution, became an international star after defecting to America during the disco era (yes, you get to see him boogieoogie-oogie) and now. apparently, is a successful stockbroker in Australia. Which is about as far away as a guy can get from an

Mao's Red Guard. Li's story begins in 1972, when Chinese officials arrive in his warm, happy and wholesome rural village and select the 10year-old boy as a candidate for Madame Mao's Beijing Dance Academy in Peking.

# **Benz reinvents** luxury with 2010 E550



combos and a choice of either burl walnut or black walnut interior trim accents.

Inside the cabin of the H-Class, old-world luxury is a term used a lot by Mercedes officials and it is one phrase that fits. My rester had a natural beige leather interior, wonderful pleated leather door panels with a high contrasting black ash polished wood trim. You will not be able to ignore the attention to detail, the outstanding fit and finish, and overall ambience created in the E-Class.

I really enjoyed the huge panoramic moon roof, it opened up the cabin and made it feel larger than it is - which not is small by any standards. Head and legroom was generous; seating surfaces were firm and comfortable during long rides.

There is no shortage of high-tech electronics, and the COMAND climate/entertainment control system is a good example of high form meeting function. It took a couple days 10 get accustomed to the COMAND system, but once I did it was intuitive.

Mercedes-Benz has always touted its goals in setting the standard in safety; this sedan has intelligent body shell technology with up to 30 percent greater stiffness. A newly developed suspension system has automatically adjusting shock absorbers that vary for different driving settings.

The E-Class sedan has two gasoline engines and a 3.0-liter BlueTEC diesel, which Mercedes claims is the world's cleanest diesel engine.


A 3.5-liter V-6 offering 268 horsepower, found in the E350, and a 5.5-liter V-8 that delivers 382 horsepower with 391 pound-feet of torque, found in the E550, will feed any

cravings drivers may have for speed and acceleration. Both engines are mated to a sevenspeed driver-adaptive automatic transmission that was nothing short of speciacular.

I found driving and ride characteristics to be comfortable and responsive. This is a Mercedes and I anticipated a lush cruiser feel - and that's what I got. Options are not necessarily the first thing you think of with the Mercedes line, but my tester had several, including Parkironic, driver

dynamic multi-contour seat with massage. metallic exterior paint (a must) as well as the premium package, sport package and driver assistance package to round out one heck of a luxury sedan.

Base priced at \$56,300, my tester with all those options pushed the final sticker to more than \$69,000. Relatively speaking, in the luxury class of sedans with this kind of safety and technology buyers are ensured one thing - a fine ride and a classy companion.



# Ford brings Boss back for 2012

Ford gave the green light only once before: In 1968, management approved a special Musiang a car that sacrificed nothing in s quest to be the best all-around oad-going performance machine ever created by Ford Motor Co. That car became the 1969 Mustang Boss 302, and it remains one of the world's most sought-after :xamples of American perfor-

Forty-two years later, Ford has given the green light again. The team of Ford engi-

neers, designers and stylists - all Musiang enthusiasis to the core - that created the groundbreaking 2011 Musiang GT has distilled a new model o its purest form, strengthening, lightening and refining each estem to create a race car with license plate. Its name: the 2012 Musiang Boss 302.

"The decision to build a modern Boss was not entered imo lightly," said Derrick Kuzak, group vice president, global product development. "The entire ream at Ford felt the time was right and with the right ingredients, the world-class 2011 Mustang could support a successful, race-bred, worthy successor to the original Boss 302."

To celebrate the racing heritage of the new Musiang Boss 302, Ford will also offer n limited number of Boss 302 Laguna Seca models, named for the track where Parnelli Jones won the 1970 Trans-Am season opener in a Boss 302. Aimed at racers more interested in ontrack performance than creature comforts, the Boss 302 Laguna Seca has increased body stiffness, a firmer chassis sei-up and an aerodynamics package carried over almost in its entirety from the Ford Racing Boss 302R.

Led by Mike Harrison, the 7-8 engine team approached Boss from the top down: With 412 horsepower from 5.0 liters, the 2011 GT engine was already an incredible performer. But to achieve the high-rpm orsepower that would make the engine competitive on the track, a new intake was essential. The resulting runnersn-the-box plenum/velocity stack combination the engine team developed was impressive enough that it got the green light after one short drive.

Helping the intake build power, revised camshafts using n more aggressive grind are actuated with the same twin ndependent variable camshaft ning (Ti-VCI) mechanism

used on the Mustang GT. More aggressive control calibration yields 440 horsepower and 380 pound-feet of torque while still offering a smooth idle and low-end torque for comfortable around-town driving.

In keeping with the Boss mandate to provide the besthandling Musiang ever, the Musrang GT suspension system has been further refined. Higher-rate coil springs on all four corners, stiffer suspension bushings and a larger-diameter rear stabilizer bariall contribute to the road racing mission. Boss models are lowered by 11 millimeters at the from and 1 millimeter at the reat versus the Musiang GT.

The real key to handling, though, is in the adjustable shocks and struis, standard on all Boss Musiang models. Dirching the weight and complexity of electronic wizardry, the Mustang team opted for traditional race-style hands-on adjustability for the shocks - similar to the Gabriel shocks available on the original Boss 302.

To complement the suspension, the speed-sensitive elecrronic steering system has been retuned to maximize feedback and road feel to the driver. The driver is also given the option of fine-tuning the steering feel to his liking by selecting one of three settings through the instrument cluster memi: comfort, normal and sport modes help offer track-tuned steering when desired without sacrificing low-speed mancuverability in parking situations and everyday commuting.

Working in concert with the suspension upgrades, Boss 302 receives unique, lightweight 19inch black alloy racing wheels in staggered widths: 9 inches in front, 9.5 inches in the rear. The Pirelli PZero summer tires are sized specifically for each end of the vehicle, with the front wheels receiving 255/40ZR-19 rires while the rear stays planted thanks to 285/35ZR-19 rubber.

Brembo four-pision front calipers act on 14-inch vented rotors up from. In the back, standard Musiang GT brakes are upgraded with a Bossspecific high-performance paul compound. Combined with vented brake shields and unique antilock brake system runing, Boss drivers ger maximum control and rapid, repeatable fade-free stops in road and rave situations alike.


Not since Ed Umansky finished 23rd his senior season has the program sent someone to Detweiller Park. That could change this fall, because of Gathoon Garmoos.



Feeder program for Niles North, West underway

Niles West boys swim eoach Dan Vander Jeugdt looked jealously at other local high schools that were reaping the benefits of district-sponsored feeder programs.

"It's the way all the schools do it. Glenview, New Trier — it's how **C**OHO works in Deerfield," Vander Jeugdt said. "It's the way all the swim programs are run. The backing of the (school) district really helps."

In those communities, schools provide facilities where young swimmers train. Certified instructors, . with the Leaning Tower often with ties to the local high school, ensure eonsistency in coaching for swimmers — from youth level right through varsity swimming, and beyond.

Distriet 219 now has such a program. This spring, NorthWest Aquaties was formed, and the organization, which is affiliated with USA Swimming, took its first strokes forward this summer. The program is part of the district-wide finitiative to improve high school athleties and fuel eommunity sports pro-

That's the deadline to host Niles North's home opener against Glenbrook South on Sept. 16



North athletic director Karl Costello said the builders expect to have the facility ready on time.

"Right now, we feel confident," said Costello last week during a tour of the site. "All the info we have from the construction company and architect is that we should be able to get back in Sept. 10. Everyone is committed to getting the job done."

Costello said the contingency plan is staging the home football opener at Niles West. However, the main grandstand does not need to be completed prior to Sept. 10 for soccer games on the field.


Even before the first shovel of dirt, district officials and representatives of Chicago's Legat Architects visited other high schools and local colleges to get
