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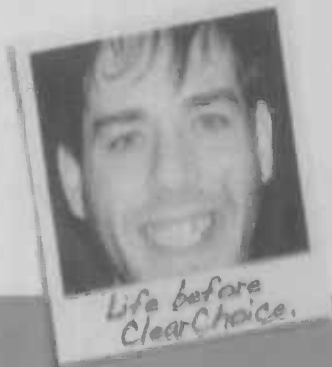

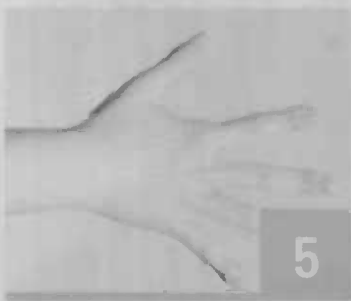

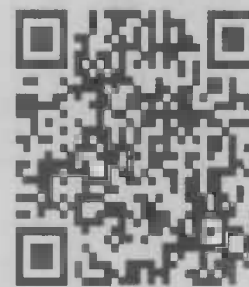

Reporter braves Fear City and lives to tell tale

MORTON GROVE

Heed my advice and get out of Chicago when the world comes to a crashing halt.

If you thought some of today's urban dwellers were odd, wait until you meet the creeps that roam post-apocalyptic "Fear City."

Owners Jim Lichon and Chuck Grendys unrolled a bloody-red carpet Oct. 5 to kick off the destination haunted house's second Halloween season in Morton Grove.

The Emmy-award-winning set-design team converted a 40,000-square-foot warehouse at 8240 Austin Ave. into an urban landscape overrun by creatures more gruesome than the holiday's typical cast of vampires and witches: humans, both dead and alive.

"Reality is scarier (than fiction)," Lichon said. "I like the idea of taking reality and making it screwed-up."

As a scare tactic, it works.

I toured Fear City a week before the opening to experience the freak show firsthand and can attest: This is a fright you want to see.

Those brave enough to withstand the jeers and pleas of the 100-or-so zombie-like actors that inhabit the house are whisked through a world overcome with an unnamed infection.

For 30 minutes a gal pal and I interlocked arms and wandered through dozens of unique scenes that ranged from the seemingly mundane — a hotel lobby with a frantic mother carrying a baby — to the insane — the “Last Show on Earth” is a maze of crazy clowns and neon walls.

We had 20 seconds in each room to soak up a story, like the boy under the stairs who relied on a very-last resort for drinking water and Justin Bieber to get him through the apocalypse.

We got away from his “Baby, baby, ooh ...” crooning as quickly as possible.

Our encounter with people who had become “sick” was just as disgusting; a few times we came close to having fake vomit spewed on us.

At this haunted attraction the devil was in the details. As my friend put it, every scene appeared like a sophisticated set straight out of Hollywood. A blood-strewn butcher shop and ravenous zombies were fake but definitely not hokey.

As a city slicker myself I appreciated the play on a grimy Chicago, though I never hope to encounter a ride on the CTA Red Line like that in Fear City. A tip: Keep your eyes open and hang on.

The more true-to-life the scenario,

the more anxious we felt.

Stumbling through a house jam-packed with food and supplies was like reliving the documentary series, “Hoarders.”

Afterwards I asked Lichon what made the overcrowded cabinets and a full-bellied man shouting from a recliner particularly disturbing.

He explained how a female character purposely whispers, “Don’t judge,” because that’s what we do as strangers in a strange environment.

“We’re trying to play on emotions and feelings,” he said. “It’s weird and totally different.”

How frightening.

“Fear City” and “Hades,” a new addition to the team’s haunted-attraction repertoire, run through Halloween, Oct. 31.

Tickets are \$25 each or \$35 for both attractions. A VIP fast pass is available for rush entry for an extra \$10 and is free with a valid U.S. military ID.

Three percent of all ticket sales will be donated to the Greater Illinois Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.

On Oct. 11, or “10/11/12,” the haunted houses will donate 100 percent of proceeds from the door beyond the first 600 people to enter.

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Zoning officials, neighbors muffle Meineke request

After residents expressed concerns about a proposal to open an auto repair center at 7255 N. Harlem Ave., the Niles Zoning Board on Oct. 1 voted 4-2 against approving a special-use permit to operate the center.

The currently unoccupied property was formerly the home of Master Elevator Company for about 30 years.

Residents who live near the corner of Nora and Chase approached the commissioners, sharing concerns about the safety of children in the area, increased traffic and noise pollution.

"What kind of modifications do you plan on doing to assure that no child gets hurt?" questioned resident Kim Conenna who had a petition opposing the business which contained signatures of concerned neighbors.

"We want to coexist with the neighbors in the best

possible way," said owner George Swytnyk, who desired to open a Meineke at that location.

Swytnyk had agreed to put mirrors and devices that would beep on the garage doors to let people know when a garage door was opening. In addition, people would not see "for sale" signs on cars in the parking lot, he said.

The proposal was to have customers park in the lot across the street from the auto repair center and then have technicians drive the vehicles over to the repair center.

"We don't need to be

concerned with the business," said resident Annette Kennedy. "We need to be concerned with the people."

Kennedy said she was worried about the safety of all the children in the neighborhood as well as the noise that would come from the business.

Another resident asked why another auto repair shop in the area is needed, stating there were several shops already in the neighborhood.

Neighbor Lynn Lullo couldn't be at the meeting, but she sent a letter to the commissioners. In it she said that if Meineke's request

was granted the business would be "a big mess" and would change the entire atmosphere of the residential neighborhood.

Lullo and Conenna said they were also concerned about the negative effect that an auto repair store in that location would have on home values.

Commissioner Morgan Du-biel, who acknowledged that the Zoning Board had heard "some legitimate and serious concerns," voted in favor of approving the proposal as long as certain requirements were met by the petitioner, such as leaving the overhead garage doors closed. ■

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New sign for a new era in Niles

A sign representing the past and the future of the village of Niles now stands in front of Village Hall.

The bright-blue sign that includes a picture of the Leaning Tower YMCA and a white oak tree replaces the former "Nicholas B. Blase Plaza" sign that was taken down in fall 2011.

Rosemary Palicki, village trustee and chairwoman of the Plaza Sign Committee, said the YMCA represents a legacy in Niles and the white oak tree represents the village's commitment to improving the environment.

The new sign, installed late last month, reads: "Village of Niles, Inc. 1899." The village slogan, "Where People Count," appears at the bottom.

Palicki and other residents felt the Blase Plaza sign should be removed after the former mayor was convicted on federal corruption charges. Others believed that the long-time mayor had made a positive impact on the village and that the sign should remain.

The new sign cost nearly \$7,500, including installation, Palicki explained.

"I think it looks great," Trustee Chris Hanusiak said. "It came out even better than I thought it would."

Palicki said the work was bid out to three places and the final decision was made by the village's Engineering Department, which had used

the same company before for other projects.

The Plaza Sign Committee would also like a sculpture to be erected near the new sign. Members are planning to hold a contest for high-school students who live in Niles, inviting them to submit designs.

The winner's design will be used for the sculpture.

Palicki said members of the committee felt strongly that

the contest should involve only high-school students, as opposed to all Niles residents.

"We will be accepting designs until early-January," said Palicki, who noted that the committee likely will make a recommendation to the village board in February.

The sculpture designed by the winner will be installed alongside the sign and the student will receive either a

cash award or scholarship.

Palicki said the art sculpture will be funded through private donations. She said the committee received prices for outdoor sculptures in Skokie to give members an idea of how much the Niles sculpture could potentially cost. It is estimated the price could be as high as \$10,000.

"We would love it if it was less than that," Palicki said. ■



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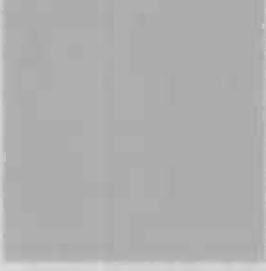
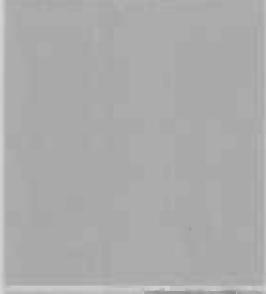
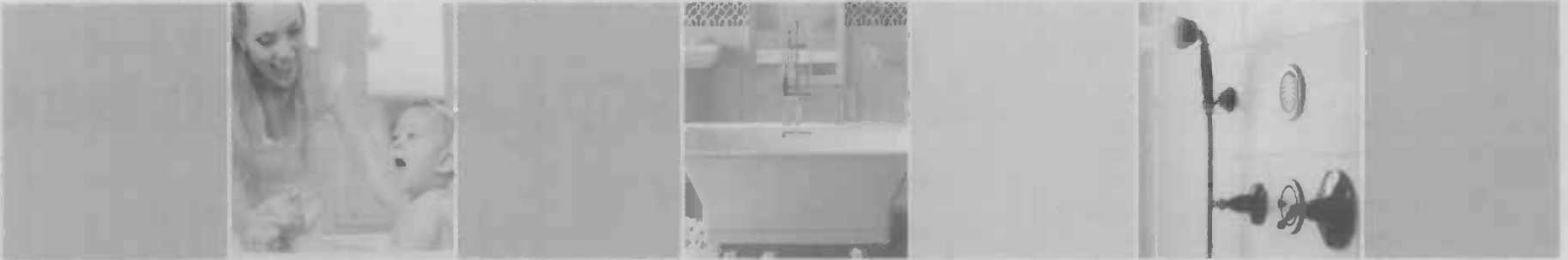

A woman was killed in a fire early-Oct. 8 at a home in north-west suburban Des Plaines.

Firefighters responded shortly after midnight to the report of a fire in the 1000 block of Irwin Avenue, according to Des Plaines Fire Chief Alan Wax.

When crews arrived on scene they found a split-level home "totally engulfed," Wax said.

Homeowner Ronald Kauke told police officers that his daughter was still inside the house, according to a release from Des Plaines police.

Firefighters had the flames under control in about 20 minutes.

The body of a woman was found on the lower level of the home, Wax said.

Kauke's daughter was found dead in the family room, police said.

Sandra Lupi, 49, of the 1000 block of Irwin Avenue, was dead on the scene, according to the Cook County Medical Examiner's office.

An adult man and a police officer were treated for smoke inhalation on the scene, the chief

said.

Des Plaines police confirmed the officer had gone into the house to attempt a rescue and that he was not hospitalized.

Investigators were working to determine the cause of the fire.

Two brothers charged with iPhone theft on N.W. Side

Two brothers were charged Oct. 8 with allegedly stealing an iPhone and a wallet from a man Friday in the Northwest Side Belmont Cragin neighborhood — and one of the men pulled a gun after officers found him at a cell-phone store.

Dion Rutledge, 25, of the 1100 block of North Harding Avenue, was charged with armed robbery with a firearm, possession of a firearm by a felon, two counts of resisting a police officer, possession of cannabis and possession of firearm without FOID, according to a release from police News Affairs.

Delshun Rutledge, 30, of the 2100 block of North Mango Avenue, was charged with one count of armed robbery with a firearm.

Shakespeare District officers responded about 5 p.m. Friday to the 1700 block of

West North Avenue where an 18-year-old man said he was robbed at gunpoint in the 2100 block of North Cicero Avenue after 11:30 p.m. Oct. 4 as he walked home from work, the release said.

One man held the victim at gunpoint while a second man rummaged through his pockets, taking his smart phone, cash and wallet before fleeing, the release said.

The victim told police he tracked his stolen smart phone to a nearby store, the release said.

When they entered the store, the victim identified Dion Rutledge as his attacker, the release said.

As officers began patting Rutledge down for weapons, he pulled a semi automatic handgun from his waistband but was quickly subdued, the release said.

Rutledge was arrested and the weapon, which was stolen, was recovered, the release said. An investigation led to the identification and arrest of Delshun Rutledge.

Both Rutledges were expected to have appeared Oct. 9 in bond court. ■

Communities are hesitant to praise ComEd's new response protocols

COOK COUNTY

Government officials and Commonwealth Edison customers now have power-outage information at their fingertips.

Yet a mild summer meant the utility company's new communication strategies weren't really put to the test, area municipal representatives said.

ComEd recently changed its emergency-response procedures to power outages after community leaders across the Chicago area criticized the company's previous operations.

Village staffs have been working with the Northwest Municipal Conference to come up with recommendations for ComEd on how to improve its outage response, said Mark Fowler, executive director of the conference.

"At first, ComEd was reluctant to participate, but once the company realized the seriousness of the situation, it became engaged," he said. "To ComEd's credit, this time it became very proactive."

After months of work ComEd has changed its procedures to reflect the ideas discussed during the talks, Fowler said, creating new protocols to provide better communication to communities and customers about the status

of outages. It also is planning more-effective dispatching of ComEd Crews during widespread outages.

Previously decisions on power restoration were made at a centralized dispatch office in Joliet, and were based on the number of customers affected.

The system called for ComEd's municipal-affairs representatives to be overwhelmed by calls from more than 20 communities, each asking for updates on power problems.

"It was very difficult for municipal leaders to get accurate and timely information in the middle of crisis," recalled Niles Village Manager George Van Geem.

Last year's unusually extreme weather knocked out power in the town for nearly a week, he said, and there was no streamlined communication plan for dealing with the situation.

ComEd, busy trying to restore electricity, issued general status reports only once or twice a day.

Residents, though, "weren't in the mood for a status report," he said. "They wanted accurate information."

Now, Joint Operation Centers, to be staffed by ComEd and municipal staff representatives, will be opened when an area outage occurs, Fowler said.

They are to serve as communications hubs between the communities affected and the company, he added.

ComEd's northern territory has been divided into three regions:

Northeast, West and South. The Northeast Region is broken into Glenbard, Libertyville, Maywood, Mount Prospect and Skokie-Techny.

Niles, Morton Grove and Park Ridge fall under the Skokie Techny.

The Skokie Techny area also includes: Northbrook, Bannockburn, Deerfield, Evanston, Glencoe, Glenview, Golf, Highland Park, Kenilworth, Lincolnwood, Northbrook, Northfield, Skokie, Wheeling and Wilmette.

Also, ComEd has developed new communication tools, including two-way texting, a smartphone app and a publicly accessible outage map.

The texting and phone app should allow customers to contact ComEd when their power is out and receive updates on work to fix it.

The interactive map will allow customers to learn the number of customers without power, that work that had been done, the probable cause and the approximate restoration time.

Van Geem said the company's "more-up-to-date" communications strategies keep him posted on outages no matter his whereabouts.

"Now when there is a storm and the power goes off, I get a text, email and voicemail at work and home," he said. "I know what ComEd is up to."

But government officials say the new model for disseminating information cannot be fully evaluated until a

major outage occurs.

Park Ridge Mayor Dave Schmidt said that, though he has heard fewer complaints the past summer compared with years past, "it's an imperfect measuring stick."

Communication appears to have improved "but I can't tell for sure until the system is tested," he said. "The weather has been better."

"The storms of 2012 were nothing like 2011," Van Geem agreed.

According to a statement from ComEd: "Electrical-system performance is strong (among the top 25 percent nationally) and we continue to invest in the system to improve performance for our customers. In fact, on average this year, each customer has experienced less than one outage (0.97 according to the System Average Interruption Frequency Index) throughout ComEd's northern Illinois service territory."

Due in part to the infrastructure enhancements and the smart grid technology ComEd has installed since January, customers have experienced 29-percent-fewer interruptions compared with last year for the same time period, 0.98 average interruptions per customer this year (January through September), compared with 1.39 average interruptions the same period in 2011, ComEd stated.

Specifically, according to ComEd:

In Niles, each customer experienced an average of 0.79 outages this year, compared with 1.62 in 2011. ■

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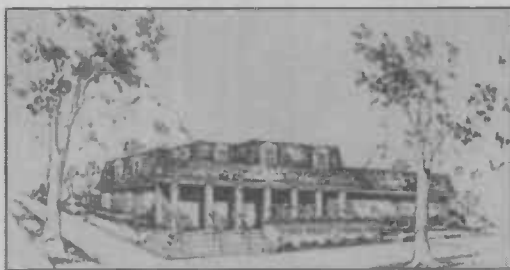
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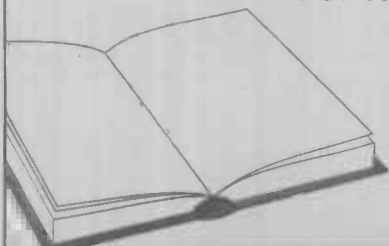

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Avoid errors when taking medications

Every year reports are issued that highlight the dangers of medication errors.

Sometimes these mistakes occur in hospitals or nursing facilities, but many times medication errors can occur in the home. Because seniors tend to take more medications than younger individuals, they are at greater risk.

Pharmacists and other medical professionals say that there are some simple steps that individuals can take to help protect themselves.

Jim True is the pharmacy director for Omnicare of Northern Illinois, a local pharmacy that specializes in providing medications to long-term care and senior living communities in the area. In addition to his professional expertise, he also has worked with his own grandparents to avoid medication mistakes.

"First, I recommend having a note card with all your medications, dosages and how and when they are taken," True said. "I did this with my own grandparents. I recommend a note card because in addition to keeping track, you can tuck it in a purse or in a wallet. Then you have that list if there is an emergency."

True says that an accessible list can help emergency workers or physicians and nurses at the hospital who then would not have to rely on the memory of family members during a crisis. He also advises that having a note card helps when visiting multiple doctors, because it can easily be shared with each physician.

"You should know what you have, why you have it and what to expect when you take it," True continued. "If you are taking a diuretic, you should

know that it may cause you to go to the bathroom more frequently."

Additionally, he recommends trying to remember what medications look like.

"If you know this medication tends to be a round white pill and then your round white pill becomes an orange round pill, then you can say 'Hey, is this right?' It may be the manufacturer changed or it may be that you have been given the wrong medication."

True says that the biggest medication error for most seniors is either missing a dose or doubling up.

"Most seniors aren't taking all their medications in one sitting," True said. "Having a medication organizer — either a weekly organizer, with seven slots, or a daily one that breaks it into several parts of the day — helps to make sure they take their doses. Also there is a visual reminder to show if they have taken everything."

His favorite medication box has 28 compartments, seven days with four different times for medications during the day.

Finally, some medication errors can be prevented by a diligent pharmacist.

True says staying with the same pharmacy will allow the pharmacist or the pharmacy system to check for potential medication interactions or dosing issues. He also recommends having that pharmacy add over-the-counter medications, vitamins and supplements to pharmacy records so that any potential interactions with those items and your prescription medications can be noted. ■

Grand jury investigates disabled Chicago cops in wake of reports

A federal grand jury has begun looking into payments made to Chicago cops on disability in the wake of a Chicago Sun-Times investigation.

The grand jury issued a subpoena last week to Chicago's police pension board, demanding virtually all of its records on disabled police officers, including medical reports, dating to January 2006. It's unclear whether the grand jury also is looking into the disability claims of firefighters and paramedics, who also were part of the Sun-Times investigation.

Policemen's Annuity & Benefit Fund of Chicago officials would not comment on the subpoena, which gives them until Oct. 23 to provide to the grand jury records.

A spokesman said the U.S. attorney's office in Chicago had no comment on the grand jury subpoena, which follows a series of reports about police and fire disability-pay excesses that already had prompted a City Hall crackdown and the suspension of disability payments to one officer.

The Sun-Times' investigation exposed a police and fire disability system in Chicago that does little to get injured officers and firefighters back on the job. In all, the 347 officers on disability leave collected more than \$18 million a year, plus millions more in free health insurance. ■

Illinois sets benchmark for health-care coverage, premiums

Illinois officials chose a relatively lean small-group policy as the benchmark plan for essential health benefits in the state, another milestone in implementing President Barack Obama's health-care law.

Gov. Pat Quinn's health-care council approved Blue Cross Blue Shield's Blue Advantage plan as the benchmark. It will be submitted to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, which will take public comment. Ultimately, the benchmark plan will determine the cost of future premiums and how broad coverage will be for many Illinois patients.

To be sure, other health policies will be sold in Illinois when much of the health-care law takes effect in 2014. But the benchmark acts as a minimum standard for the type of medical services that must be covered in plans sold to individuals and small businesses under the law.

The Illinois governor's council also approved benchmarks for children's vision and dental care. The council chose a federal plan as a model for children's vision care and the state's All Kids coverage as the standard for children's dental care. The Blue Advantage plan is one of the leaner small-group health policies sold in the state, said Colleen Burns of the Illinois Department of Insurance. ■

Federal government to purchase Thomson prison for \$165 million

The federal government has agreed to buy the closed Thomson Correctional Center in western Illinois for \$165 million after the sale was held up for nearly three years, state leaders announced.

Many Illinois leaders — including U.S. Sen. Dick Durbin and Gov. Pat Quinn — supported the purchase because they said it would bring up to 1,100 jobs to Illinois. Federal officials have said it would help alleviate prison overcrowding.

"It means a prison that has been sitting here empty will be used again and create a lot of opportunity for working families in the areas," Durbin said.

The sale of the facility in the tiny Illinois village of Thomson has been stalled for years. Most recently, Virginia Republican U.S. Rep. Frank Wolf, who heads a key House subcommittee overseeing the federal Bureau of Prisons, objected to the purchase because he believed terrorism suspects would be housed there. The Obama administration, which supports the sale, has vowed that won't happen and federal law now prohibits any transfers from Guantanamo Bay to Thomson.

Durbin reasserted that vow, saying transfers from Guantanamo Bay must be housed in a military facility and that Thomson, 150 miles west of Chicago, would not be equipped to serve that purpose. ■

College-prep program helps students be 'best person they can be'

Kids in the Schuler Scholar program will be the first in their families to proudly walk across the stage to receive their college diploma.

The Schuler Scholar Program at Maine East High School chooses two-dozen high-achieving eighth-graders each year to participate in the program. Chosen students are the first in their families to attend college and those who wouldn't be able to go to college without financial assistance.

The goal of the program is to prepare the eighth-graders for admission and success at top-tier colleges and universities during their four years at Maine East.

"There's a very rigorous application process," said Candace Browdy, executive director of the Schuler Scholar Program, created in 2001 by former

Q: How do I prevent food aggression with my dog?

A: Very often, a dog that has become food aggressive will often display other forms of possessive aggression. This may include refusal to give up a bone or toy and perhaps even growling when someone passes an area where food, a bone or toy is located.

Immediate steps are usually necessary when this type of behavior is present. If small children are in the family corrective measures are imperative.

If the dog has been crate trained, feeding should take place in the crate, with the door shut. When possible, make every effort to encourage your dog to "earn" his food. A simple "sit and wait" can help establish your control over the food.

Once the dog has been given his meal, wait 10-15 minutes. If your dog leaves the food, remove it and do not give it back to the dog until the next meal. Do not allow your dog to graze on their food all day.

Do not place the food bowl in a narrow hall way or other confined area, that may require a family member to walk past.

Do not allow begging at the table. If necessary, confine the dog to an area that will prevent access to the table during mealtime.

It may also help to feed the dog by hand until you see some improvement. This can be done by putting a small amount of food in the bowl. When it is consumed, add some more by hand until the right amount is eaten.

Generally, a dog that is food aggressive will show aggression in other areas. It is not something to be ignored.

Instruct your children to leave the dog alone when it is eating. Remember that food in general, is perhaps the most powerful motivator and driving force in animals.

These hints are not all that can be done to reduce food aggression. However, it can be a start if you are experiencing this potentially serious element of dog ownership.

Abbott Laboratories CEO Jack Schuler and his daughter, Tanya Schuler Sharman.

At Maine East there are 19 freshman, 26 sophomores and 12 juniors participating in the program. The program has grown since it started at the school three years ago.

"Our objective is to matriculate to a highly selective college," Browdy said.

The program spends about \$8,900 each year per student for programming during high school to get them well-prepared for college; it also provide \$1,000 college scholarships each year.

Students must show that they receive A's and B's in their classes and students must receive high tests scores, as well. They also receive recommendations from teachers and counselors. A select number of applicants are invited to interview with members of the Schuler staff.

Browdy said they look for students that are first-generation college-bound and may not have the resources, either human or financial, to attend college.

The program provides academic and college counseling, and helps students with the college-admissions process.

Junior scholars from Maine East are involved in summer college programs at colleges such as Princeton, Brown and Johns Hopkins, and are studying communications, medicine, legal studies and other subjects.

Sophomores at Maine East will attend a preparatory class for geometry-trigonometry and participate in a writers camp held by the Writers Theater in Glenview.

Beyond academics the Schuler Scholar Program also exposes youngsters to the arts and cultural events, such as theater and poetry slams, bowling, ice skating and other activities they may not have otherwise been exposed to.

Students also benefit from leadership and personal-development activities. The rising freshmen participate in a 10-day leadership camp in Wisconsin and take a six-week course to prepare them for high-school algebra.

"It helps them develop into the best person they can be," Browdy said. ■

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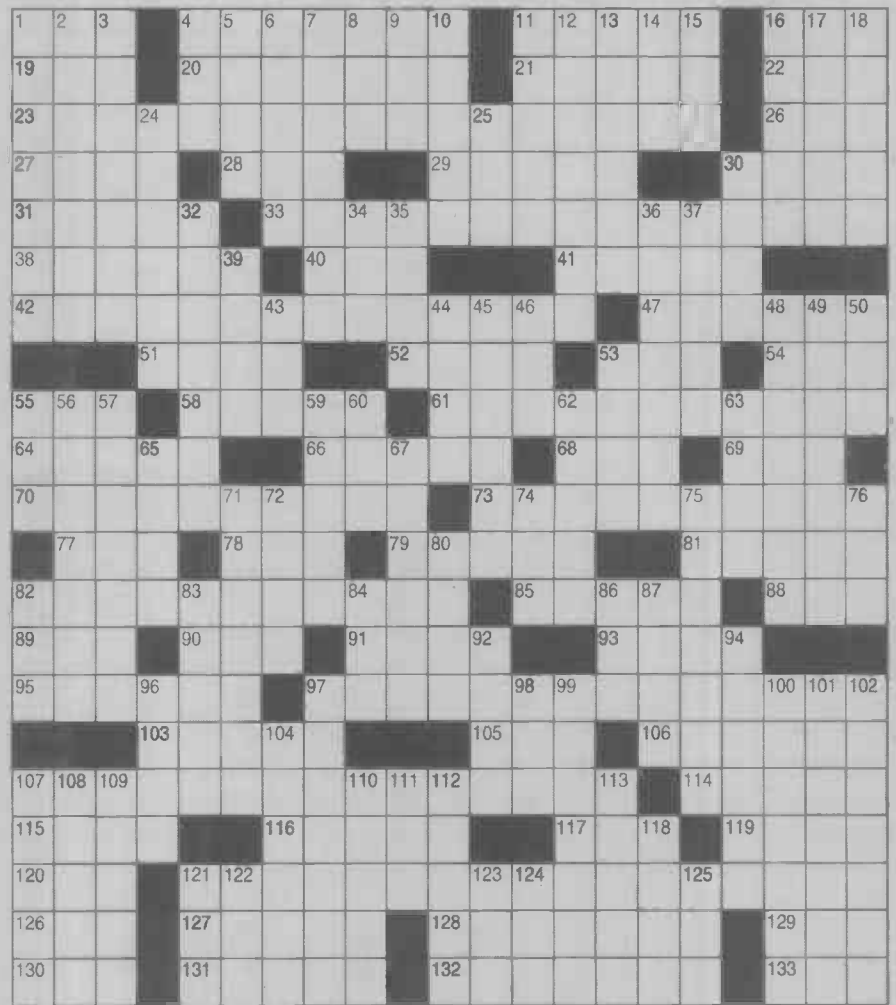

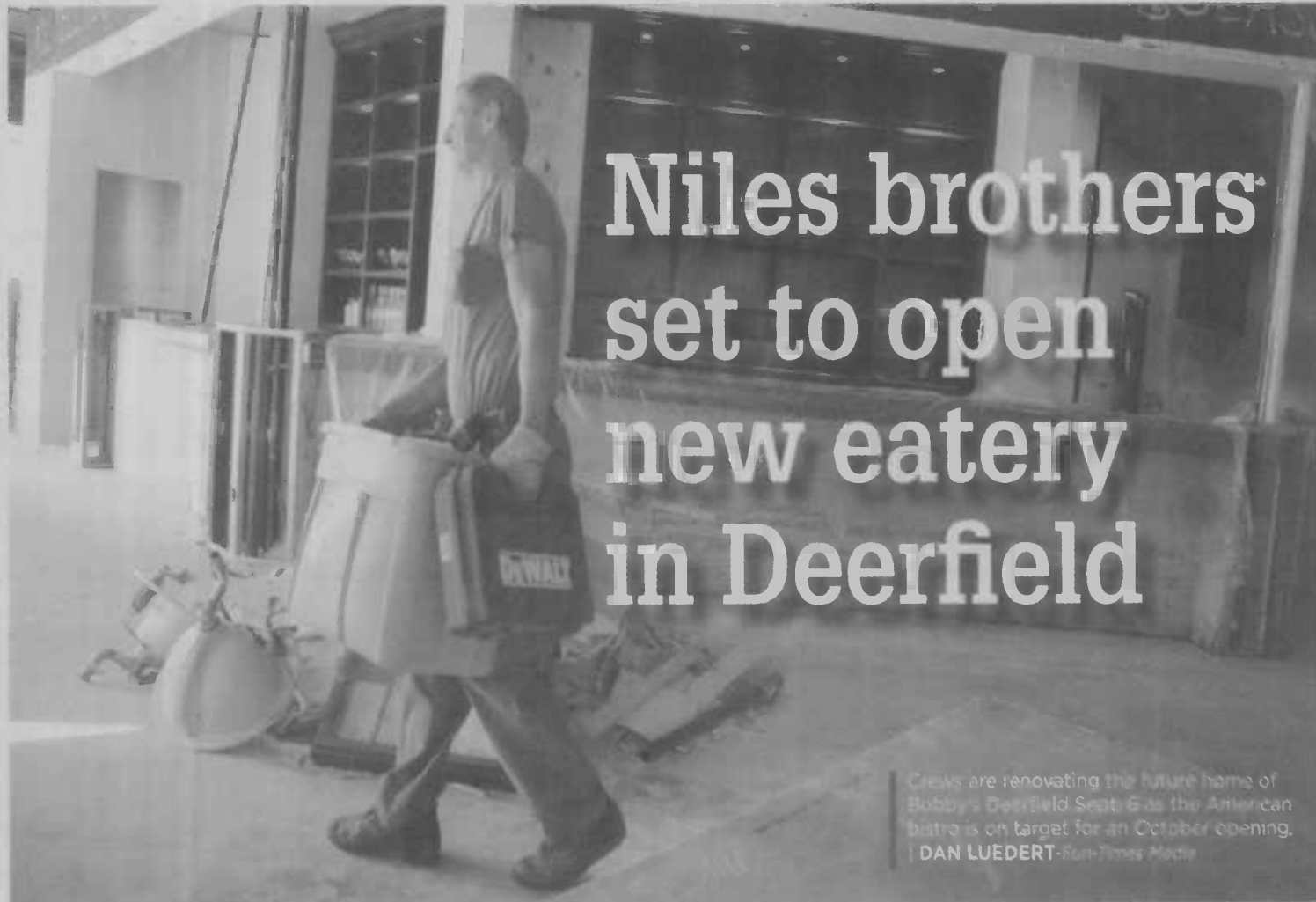
Many of the customers at Augie and Bobby Arifi's Café Lucci Italian restaurant in Glenview have remained loyal clientele and friends for years — and the brothers are confident that trend will continue when they open a new eatery in Deerfield.

casual lunch with friends, Augie said he hopes Bobby's will become Deerfield residents' go-to place to dine and relax.

Bobby's menu aims to satisfy all cravings with items that include jumbo sea scallops pan seared in a porcini crust; Moulard duck liver served in a brandied cherry sauce; grilled marinated portabella mushrooms; and a half-pound ground chuck and short rib burger.

The Arifis explained that they decided to name their new restaurant Bobby's instead of Lucci to allow more flexibility when

changing up the menu. The Deerfield eatery plans to derive many of their menu items from a variety of cultures.

"We call it an American bistro because America is generally influenced by many cultures from across the globe, and that's what our cuisine reflects," Augie said.

Bobby, whom the restaurant is named after, explained that he and Augie haven't taken any shortcuts with the quality and variety of alcohol they'll be serving.

"We're taking a lot of care in

our beverage program," Bobby said.

In addition to offering a large selection of draft beers, Bobby added that they will be using a Cruvinet temperature controlled system to dispense and serve the freshest wine possible.

The Arifi brothers are currently remodeling the space to include a 40-seat bar, comfortable tables and booths and a private room to fit 25 to 30 people.

Longtime Cafe Lucci customers Woody Zwirn and Keith

Jaffee said they are looking forward to dining at the brothers' new place. They added that they anticipate the same family-friendly service they've been enjoying for more than 15 years at the Glenview restaurant.

"When we were growing up, we had our 'place' that we went to — and Café Lucci has become that same kind of place," Augie said. "It's where people to go to feel happy, comfortable, eat well, drink well and celebrate. We're hoping for Bobby's to be that same kind of place." ■

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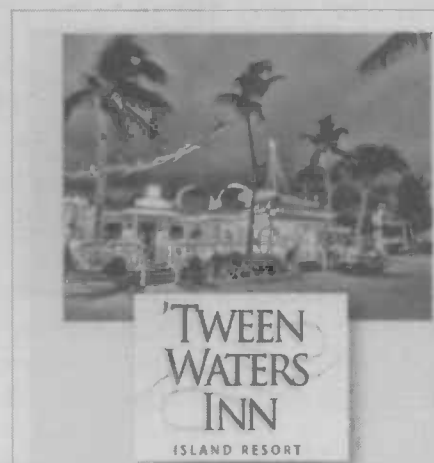

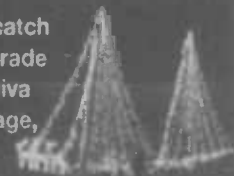

Finding academic success in a cardboard box

How can a box help improve ACT scores? It's a question I've been thinking about lately as I watch high school students start the arduous task of preparing for college admissions.

When I was growing up, it was all about the SATs but since then things have changed, as more schools have adopted the ACT exam. Unlike the SAT, the ACT measures aptitude as well as understanding of basic high

school concepts. Like the SAT, the exam invokes a sense of dread as many students see their academic future riding on this high stakes test.

Daniel Blank understands this issue. The former

second grade teacher and founder of T-H-E Center in Highland Park, is dedicated to helping students of all ages work up to their potential.

In addition to ACT test prep, T-H-E Center offers homework help, one-on-one tutoring and classes for children of all ages. It also includes a special drop-in area for students who need a quiet place to study. Blank believes in engaging kids early in the learning process, making sure they master basic concepts before moving on to more challenging subjects. I recently had a chance to chat with Blank about ways parents can help their kids achieve greater success in school.

WRITE IT DOWN

Blank advocates getting kids to write again.

In the early grades (such as first and second grade) kids are often encouraged to dream up stories during writer's workshops and creative writing activities. However, as kids get older, there are fewer opportunities to write creatively in school.

To keep kids writing, give them journals. Have them write for 15 minutes every day. Keep the topics open-ended and encourage your kids to write about anything they wish as long as they put pen to paper.

"Something magical happens when kids write," says Blank. "They start to think about ideas and stories they never imagined."

Blank also says this practice will help them later when applying to college, since writing college essays is a big hurdle for many applicants.

START WITH GAMES

Get out the Monopoly box because board games are a great way to reinforce academic skills. Whether it's learning how to handle money (Monopoly), think strategically (Risk), or use deductive reasoning (Clue), board games require kids to incorporate fundamental skills to solve higher order problems. Blank also advocates teaching kids chess as it promotes spatial awareness, high-level reasoning and analytic skills.

LEARN THE LANGUAGE OF MATH

Pardon the pun, but math can be a huge problem for many students.

Many of the concepts are abstract, which can be challenging for concrete learners, and since math problems tend to build upon each other, kids can easily get lost.

Blank suggests looking at math as a language. Just as students must first master basic nouns and verbs when learning a new language, students must first master math basics before moving on to more complex problems. Seeing math as a language will also help ground the problems in reality, shedding new light on what is actually being asked.

"It's amazing how much easier math is when students see the problem as something more than just a set of numbers," said Blank.

Don't bruise the bourbon, and other tailgate party advice

It's a sure sign of fall when trails of grill smoke rise above the parking lot of Ryan Field in Evanston on certain Saturday afternoons.

It's tailgate season, and Northwestern University Wildcats fans have back-of-the-truck football party foods tackled. One group of about 50, many of them alums, has huddled in the same spot in the west lot before every Northwestern home game for decades. Their party menu can be just as exciting as a Cats game in overtime.

Glenview resident Marietta Paynter joined them a few years ago with her son John and daughter-in-law Bonita Paynter. Marietta has attended NU home games for 63 years. Her late husband, Northwestern University alum John Paynter, was the director of the NU Marching Band from 1953 to 1996.

Marietta wasn't able to participate in the group's tailgate picnic on Sept. 22. But it was her family's annual day to host, so she made her daughter's Bourbon Baked Beans and sent them to Ryan Field with Bruce and Bonita. "Mom couldn't make it, but her beans did," Bruce said.

The recipe, which is her daughter's, is one that Marietta contributed to *Willie's Wildcat Cookbook* (Northwestern University, 2011, www.WildcatCookbook.com). Her daughter-in-law Bonita produced the front cover layout and design of the 358-page paperback collection of recipes from NU alumni and friends.

Marietta's contributions to the

cookbook could raise eyebrows. Who would think to include strong black coffee in baked beans? "My theme was recipes with unusual ingredients," she said. "You wouldn't think of putting coffee in a crock pot of baked beans, but it works." The same is true of the bourbon, which, in a nod to James Bond, the recipe warns against bruising by stirring too much.

Bruce made brats poked and soaked in beer and his Atomic Cabbage to accompany the beans. He enhances the cabbage slaw by mixing in red cider vinegar dressing while it is boiling. "The dressing seems to attach to the cabbage and onions better when it is added while boiling," he said. "It seems like it activates everything."

This tailgating pack prepares soups and other foods in the kitchen tent while another tent serves as a living room. "We lost our area rug, but that was okay because it was getting old," Wilmette resident Zoe Barron explained with a laugh. She and her husband, Dan, have partied with the group for years:

Dan's Apple Pie Drink, another cookbook favorite, makes frequent appearances at Ryan Field. Barron boils one gallon of apple juice; one half gallon of apple cider; three cups of sugar; and eight sticks of cinnamon. He refrigerates the mixture overnight and adds a fifth of grain alcohol on game day.

"Because of the grain alcohol, you don't realize you are drinking alcohol at all. You think you're eating a piece of apple pie, but then all of a sudden you can't stand up," Zoe Barron joked.

Proceeds from *Willie's Wildcat Cookbook* go to the Wildcat Fund, benefiting all 19 Northwestern athletic teams. ■

Bourbon Baked Beans

(From Marietta Paynter)

4 16-ounce cans baked beans
 ¾ teaspoon dry mustard
 1 cup chili sauce
 1 tablespoon molasses
 ½ cup bourbon
 ½ cup strong black coffee
 1 16-ounce can crushed pineapple, drained
 4 tablespoons dark brown sugar

Combine all ingredients in a 4½-quart casserole. Bake uncovered for one hour at 350 degrees. Stir once or twice. Any more stirring and you bruise the bourbon.

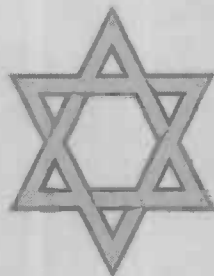

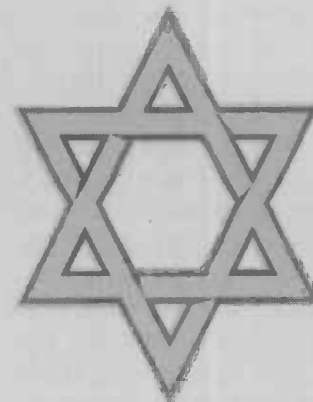

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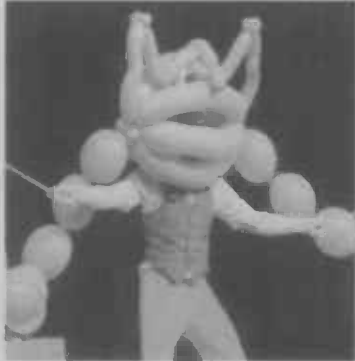

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Secular side: A peek at Bach's private life

"The Worldly Bach: Leipzig 1730" — the title of the program to be presented at the Harris Theater for Music and Dance in Millennium Park on Sunday — decidedly defines the secular nature of the program, distancing itself from the vast amount of liturgical music J. S. Bach composed during his time as a church musician.

A dozen members of the Lincolnwood Chamber Orchestra will make their debut on the stage of the 1,525-seat Harris Theater. "This is very exciting for them," said Philip Simmons, music director of the ensemble that plays regularly in the Lincolnwood Community Center.

The concert is being presented in collaboration with Chicago Syntagma Musicum, led by bass-baritone Andrew Schultze, its artistic director. Schultze has been a member and soloist with the Grant Park Symphony Chorus and teaches at Columbia College and the University of Chicago, as well as having his own private vocal studio. "Andrew and I have a long relationship," explained Simmons. "We've done voice and guitar programs in the area and we took part in festivals

in the Czech Republic. We even had a recording together."

The Chicago Syntagma Musicum is based at the University of Chicago and made up of two or three instrumentalists and about two soloists, depending on the material being played.

The Oct. 14 program includes Bach's Orchestral Suite in B Minor, the "Chromatic Fantasy," Cantata 203 "Amore Traditore," selections from the "Anna Magdalena Notebook," and the ever-popular "Coffee Cantata."

In addition to Schultze, soloists will be soprano Michelle Areyzaga, tenor Wayne Parham, harpsichordist Jason Moy and flutist Mary Stolper.

"There is not enough awareness of Bach's secular music," Schultze insisted. "This concert will show what was happening in his home and in his private life, when he was with his friends." Of special interest is Bach's Collegium Musicum in Leipzig, which had 40 to 60 players and for a period performed weekly at Zimmerman's coffeehouse.

For the "Coffee Cantata" Schultze chose to enrich the blend and pressed Simmons into service. "I wanted to do the Cadillac version of the piece," he said "so I needed more musicians."

His Chicago Syntagma Musicum, established in 2005, is named for a 1620 book called *Syntagma Musicum* by Michael Praetorius.

"Syntagma means a compendium," he said, "and this book is almost encyclopedic in that it explores all aspects of music." He liked the word and became even more fascinated when he discovered that the author's family name in German was Schultze, identical to his own.

"We are not using period instruments," Simmons explained, "but we are trying to get back to the mindset of Bach — what it was like in his time, historically and artistically. My musicians are taking a very serious approach to the music of Bach." ■

PORSCHE CARRERA CABRIOLET IS PERFECT FOR PURE FALL FUN

The 2012 Porsche 911 Carrera Cabriolet is the kind of vehicle that manages to get better while still staying true to a strict sports car heritage created over 50 years and remaining within screaming distance of the wishes of an even stricter enthusiast base.

When the top goes down, 911 fans will recognize the rear-end hump is not as pronounced as the previous model, a visual trick more than any engineering ingenuity. While it may appear the deck-lid height was lowered, it was not — the beltline was raised to compensate for larger wheels, which streamlines the body sides and the rear end in the process.

Featuring the signature rear-mounted flat-six engine, this Porsche embraces its heritage and pays homage to the 1965 original. The new Porsche 911 Carrera Cabriolet delivers a longer body and a more powerful output than previous models and amazingly it manages to shed weight and, expectedly, gain fuel economy in the process.

The purists will not want to hear this, but driving this 911 Cabriolet over a period of a week made me feel like I was riding upon a touring-car platform, though there was never

any mistaking the performance DNA that was just a pop of the accelerator away from putting a big smile on my face.

On the exterior, the 911 Cabriolet says soft-top; however, that is where such basic descriptions are shed. The 911 needs to fly and, unlike other drop-tops, shedding weight was of the highest importance to Porsche engineers, who crafted four rigid magnesium panels into the skeleton that defines the shape of the fabric top. This lightweight treatment not only makes the Cabriolet profile look more like the coupe, but the cabin noise is significantly reduced.

Inside the cabin you have four seats, of which only two are worth talking about. Fine leather covers the seating surfaces while the placement of gauges becomes the star of the show. Straight-forward speedometer and tachometer placement as well as oil and fuel are perfect.

Once I adjusted the power seating positions, the shifter seemed to be fit exclusively to my hand, although that shifter does seem to get in the way of adjusting audio controls. Convenience goes out the door when space is at a premium, and cup holders and space for personal items just do not exist.

Porsche's horizontally op-

posed six cylinders deliver 350 horsepower in the Carrera and 400 horsepower in the Carrera S. Porsche claims efficiency to be up 15 percent, which is even more impressive when you consider it's done without turbochargers.

My 911 Cabriolet delivered outstanding performance with on-demand acceleration and an instant pull that peaks at 7,400 rpm while dancing with the seven-speed PDK dual-clutch automatic transmission.

If looking cool and fast were not enough, my 911 Cabriolet tester's optional sport exhaust system (\$2,995) transformed a rather refined expelling note to an aggressive culmination of sputters, pops and gargles amid a constant audible canvas of throaty rumbling.

The 911's first-ever elec-

tric power steering system has gotten a lot of attention from the critics, who believe the feedback from prior systems is essential to the pure driving experience of Porsche. While there is some merit to the claim, most of 911 Cabriolet buyers are not looking for that as much as they are expecting an effortless driving experience. I found this system to deliver responsiveness and a clean feel on virtually every surface I drove upon.

The Porsche 911 Cabriolet offers all the sophistication and refinement that defines luxury cars, but the performance DNA and look make it a statement vehicle equaled by few others. At a base price of \$94,650 to \$108,950, you can bet your expectations will be met.



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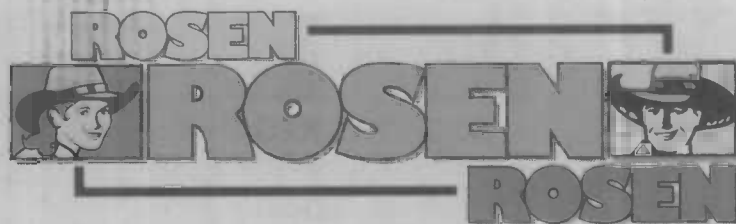
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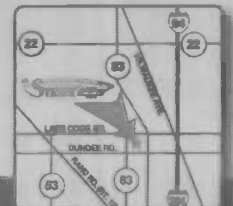

The refinance train is pulling out of the station on what could be the last great run for record low home-loan interest rates this year.

In late September, benchmark 30-year fixed-rate home loans fell to a new record averaged low of 3.40 percent, down from 3.49 percent a week earlier, reported Freddie Mac's Primary Mortgage Market Survey. Last year at this time, 30-year fixed-rate loans averaged 4.01 percent.

Frank Nothaft, vice president and chief economist, Freddie Mac, noted that record-low fixed rate mortgages are helping to keep home buyer affordability high and

fueling a strong refinancing market to support an already improving housing market.

All mortgage types, except the 5-year ARM, averaged new all-time record lows, Freddie Mac reported. Fifteen-year fixed mortgages fell to an average of 2.73 percent in late September from 2.77 percent a week earlier. A year ago, the 15-year fixed-loan averaged 3.28 percent.

"Fixed mortgage rates continued to decline, largely due to the Federal Reserve's purchases of mortgage securities, and this should support an already improving housing market," said Frank Nothaft, vice president and chief economist, Freddie Mac.

Nothaft noted that the S&P/Casè-Shiller 20-city home price index rose 1.2 percent over the 12

months ending in July, reflecting the largest annual increase since August 2010.

Moreover, 16 of the cities saw positive growth, led by Phoenix's 16.6 percent gain. Additionally, new home sales in July and August had the strongest two-month pace since March and April 2010.

Freddie Mac also compiled data on the refinance market which is booming nationwide. Refinancing borrowers clearly preferred fixed-rate loans, regardless of whether their original loan was an adjustable-rate mortgage (ARM) or a fixed-rate mortgage.

In the second quarter of 2012, fixed-rate loans accounted for more than 95 percent of refinance loans, Freddie Mac reported.

■ Of borrowers who refinanced during the second quarter, 30

percent reduced their loan term, while 67 percent of borrowers kept the same term as the loan they had paid off.

■ Eighty-one percent of borrowers traded in a hybrid ARM for a fixed-rate loan during the second quarter, the highest share since the second quarter of 2010.

■ Borrowers who refinanced under the Home Affordable Refinance Program (HARP) were more likely to take out a fixed-rate mortgage. Ninety-five percent of borrowers who were refinancing out of an ARM under the HARP program chose a fixed-rate mortgage.

"The Bureau of Economic Analysis has estimated the average coupon rate on single-family home loans was about 5.0 percent during the second quarter of

2012," Nothaft said. "It's no wonder we continue to see strong refinance activity into fixed-rate loans."

Compared with a 30-year fixed-rate mortgage, the interest rate on a 15-year fixed was about three-quarters of a percentage point lower during the second quarter.

"For borrowers motivated to refinance with low fixed-rate loans, they could obtain even lower rates by shortening their term," Nothaft said. "Further, a shorter-term, fully amortizing loan reduces the loan balance faster and builds home equity sooner."

Colin Egglesfield comes
home to race for a cause*

Google the name “Colin Egglesfield” and along with his IMDB page, US Weekly articles and interview clips from talk shows you’ll also find fan sites, photo galleries and Egglesfield’s own social media pages, all with comments from fans offering everything from marriage proposals to a leg massage after he runs the Chicago Marathon. “It’s flattering,” laughs Egglesfield. “But it can sometimes get crazy when people are describing our honeymoon in detail. But I just try to keep my head down and let my work speak for itself.”

You could say his humility and work ethic are a result of his Illinois upbringing: Egglesfield grew up in Crete, a small suburb 35 minutes south of Chicago. He now resides in Los Angeles, but returns home this month to run the marathon. Though this will be his fifth time tackling the daunting 26.2 mile race, this year’s stint stands out from the rest: He’s running with the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society’s Team in Training to raise money for cancer research.

“A family member of mine was diagnosed with lymphoma, and the treatment they’re getting wouldn’t exist if it weren’t for the work that Team in Training does,” he says. “I want to support them.”

Egglesfield’s path to stardom is like a plot from a movie. He took time off to travel after graduating from the University of Iowa in 1996. But unlike other post-collegiate globe-trotters, he wound up connecting with a modeling agency and suddenly he was walking runways in Versace and Calvin Klein. Tempted by acting, he took classes and fell in love, despite a natural shyness. “I felt like it was a way to be creative and express who I am,” he says.

Since making the leap to acting he’s worked in everything from action-adventure flicks to roles on “All My Children” and the new “Melrose Place.” But it was his role in the 2011 movie “Something Borrowed” that caught the eyes — and hearts — of moviegoers. As Dex, he was trapped in a love triangle between Kate Hudson and Ginnifer Goodwin, and his character didn’t always make the right decisions. “It was tricky to show his struggle in a way where people could identify with it rather than just writing him off as a jerk. But that’s what I like about acting.”

Egglesfield currently does double-duty on TV as Angie Harmon’s younger brother on “Rizzoli and Isles” and Jennifer Love Hewitt’s brother-in-law on “The Client List.” He’s also starring alongside Andy Garcia, Juliette Lewis and Camilla

Belle in the upcoming independent movie “Open Road.” But while his work schedule is packed these days, it didn’t begin that way. “There were days when I was on the last \$10 in my account and I was freaking out about paying rent or buying groceries. Then you book a commercial, and you’re good for another three months. I’ve almost quit this business three or four times,” he says, adding that his family never let him.

So now that he’s made it, he’s brought them along for the ride. His mom, dad, aunt, uncle, sister, brother, sister-in-law and brother-in-law came out to Hollywood for the “Something Borrowed” premiere, walking alongside Egglesfield on the red carpet, and he brings them to visit his sets when they’re in town.

As for his relationship status? “I’ve been struggling so long with my career that I haven’t been in a position to invite a woman into my life. It would have been like, hey, come live with me and my two roommates and let’s make ramen noodles tonight,” he says. “But I’m finally in a position in my life where I can take a woman out on a real date. So I’m dating right now, and it’s good.”

His star may be on the rise, but amid the cameras, red carpets and marriage proposals, Egglesfield is holding tight to his Midwestern roots. “As exciting as it can be out here, I consider myself blessed and fortunate to come from where I come from. There’s a high value on principles, and that’s something I’ll always take with me.”

Units in **222 E. Chestnut** are being snapped up for a song

We already know that location counts — but so does potential. That's likely why unit 8B, a shabby but spacious condo at 222 E. Chestnut, priced at a mere \$525,000 for 2,400 square feet (that's \$219 per square foot right off Lake Shore Drive), sat for three months but just got white-hot now that its stunning upstairs sister, unit 15B, went under contract in five weeks flat (see sidebar). "We've had a series of third showings and two serious offers," says Dream Town Realty broker **Brendan Murphy**. Considering that 8B's floor mate 8A, a touch larger at 2,700 square feet (but also in need of work), sold earlier this year for \$660,000 (or \$244 per square foot), it's an outstanding value. Unit 12A, another 2,750-square-foot space in good shape, is also for sale and currently priced at \$890,000 (\$324 per square foot) but the sellers are moving home to the East Coast and are "motivated to sell," says Baird & Warner broker **Jay Elder**. When you do the math, none are as good a deal as Unit 13, which spans the whole floor for a whopping 5,200 square feet and is priced at \$1.09 million — or \$210 per square foot. "It's the best deal in the area for all that space," says the unit's broker, **Ed Hester** of Dream Town Realty.

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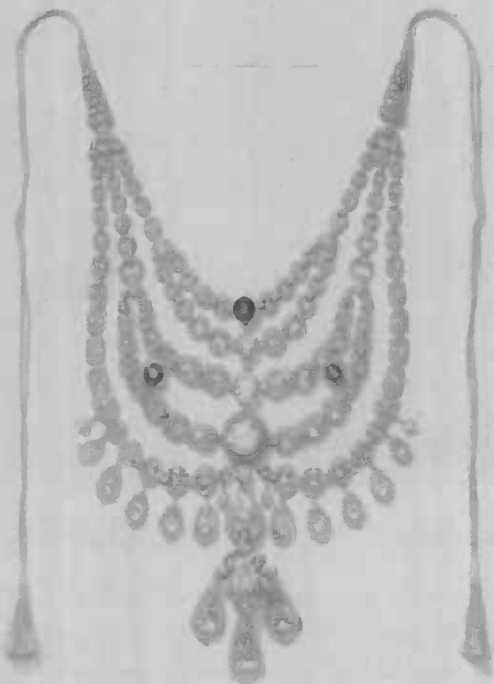


Tales of elephants and kings in 'Maharaja' exhibit

For centuries maharajas were the princely rulers of India, a group of men who weren't shy about wearing jewelry and traveled via elephant.

On Oct. 17, they're journeying to the Field Museum.

"Maharaja: The Splendor of India's Royal Courts," offers visitors a detailed look into the rarified world of the rulers of India from the 1700s to the 1940s, when India achieved independence from colonial Britain.

The exhibit opened in 2009 at London's Victoria and Albert Museum before traveling to a Munich museum and three museums in the United States and Canada.

"Everybody had heard of the word maharaja," said Anna Jackson, keeper of the Asian Department at the Victoria and Albert. "Maharaja sounds very exotic, romantic, wearing jewelry and turbans. You don't really know what it means or who these people are."

Jackson said she and former colleague Amin Jaffer, now international director of Asian Art at Christie's auction house, decided to "pick that stereotype a bit and expose who these people are."

"Maharaja" is a departure in some ways from the Field Museum's typical offerings because it focuses heavily on visual artwork. But fans of the museum's ability to transport visitors to a different time and place, with a heavy emphasis on a unique and foreign culture, won't be disappointed.

"When we look for exhibitions we either look

"We talk about the 1 percent here in this country, this is the 1/10th of 1 percent going on in India at the time," said Skiwerski. "This is the elite, the ruling class. They were very wealthy and that shows."

Elizabeth Oliver, a Ph.D. art history student at Northwestern University who teaches an Art of India class at Columbia College, said that visitors to the "Maharaja" exhibit should remember that the maharajas were "vassal rulers" to the British colonialists.

"As a new viewer to Indian art, these objects should not be seen to represent a sort of timeless, pan-Indian idea of opulence and its relationship to royalty," she said. "While there is plenty of that in India prior to the British Raj, this exhibit should serve as a reminder of the very specific and historically situated manifestations of power and royalty in South Asia."

Most of the maharajas acceded their kingdoms after British rule ended in 1947, creating modern-day India and Pakistan. In 1971, Indira Gandhi stripped them of all their privileges and instituted a tax on them. While the maharajas went through a period of being viewed as "personas non grata," Jackson said that has slowly changed. Some former maharajas are involved in wildlife and cultural heritage programs, she said, and their palaces or estates are popular hotels and tourist attractions.

"People got over the idea that there is something awkward about India's past but that it should be celebrated," said Jackson. "The kings were great patrons of the arts. I think these things are being recognized again for their value." ■

for them to fit to our strengths or we also look to fill in some of the gaps in our collections," said Tom Skiwerski, the Field's project manager for exhibitions. "We have an Indian collection but it's not one of the strongest collections at the museum. This exhibit allows us to represent the Indian culture at the museum."

At the center of the exhibit is Cartier's Patiala necklace, commissioned by a maharaja to show off some family jewels. It took three years to complete and was, at the time, the largest commission Cartier had ever received. The necklace was reconstructed in 2002.

Also included in the exhibit are costumes, weapons and an elephant replica that didn't make the rounds in some of the other North American exhibit venues because of its size.

Museum staff traveled to rural India to learn how to decorate the elephant from a retired elephant dresser and an elephant named Ramu.

The elephants and Cartier jewelry are just part of the opulence of the

A month-long party at Edelweiss

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What began as a local wedding celebration for King Ludwig I in Bavaria in 1810, is today one of Germany's — and the world's — most famous events.

Oktoberfest, which actually starts in September, is one of the world's largest festivals, with more than 6 million people from around the world attending the 16-day event in Munich.

Fortunately, there's no need to cross an ocean to enjoy Oktoberfest. Edelweiss, a family-owned German American restaurant in Norridge, keeps the party going through the first week in November. Chef/owner Matthew Kosch serves authentic German delicacies like traditional Rindsrouladen, Sauerbraten

and several kinds of Schnitzel.

Every Thursday through Sunday until Nov. 3, Oktoberfest revelers will be entertained with oompah-pah bands, beer promotions and rousing raffles for beer steins and other swag.

Reservations are highly recommended, insists Kosch. "The line is out the door so, yeah, reservations would be a great thing." With sprawling digs that seat 300 and a newly-opened beer garden, you can bet it will be a lively visit.

Besides Edelweiss' traditional German staples, certain menu items have been added only for Oktoberfest.

The Koenig Ludwig Schnitzel, for example, is a favorite meal. It centers on pan-seared veal

schnitzel served with nickel-sized asparagus topped with Hollandaise, and potato (\$24.95). Another special is the rich pork goulash served with Kosch's home-made spatzle (traditional thick German noodles) and red cabbage (\$18.95).

And no self-respecting Oktoberfest would be complete without the giant Bavarian pretzel. Topped with melted Swiss cheese, dip bits into German mustard, roasted red pepper and ground mustard dipping sauces (\$7.95).

"It's a family restaurant and I'm glad to keep the German culture going and introduce new people to the cuisine," said Kosch.

82 leading female artists tackle exhibit theme

“The Personal is Political: The Transformative Power of Women’s Art,” a new art exhibit at Oakton Community College’s Koehnline Museum of Art, is a mind-expanding look at how 82 of the nation’s leading female artists interpret that theme.

“We want to present opportunities to view significant works of art and we want students and community members to learn something from the art,” said Judy Langston, Exhibition Curator and Oakton Community College Professor of Art and Graphic Design.

The exhibit is the 2012 expression of an annual show that challenges women artists to create works that engage with and respond to a given theme. This year’s theme, “the personal is political,” honors an election year by drawing on a phrase coined by feminist Kate Millet in her landmark 1970 work, *Sexual Politics*.

“We have several goals with the exhibition,” Langston said. “One is to allow women to speak through their art without being restricted. We run the gamut, from militant works to gentle ones. There aren’t many exhibits like that.”

This year’s call for artists yielded 110 entries from which a jury selected 81 works representing 82 artists, according to Nathan Harpaz, Koehnline Museum Manager and Curator and Oakton instructor of Art History and Museum Studies.

“We started this annual women’s art exhibit many years ago as a little thing and it has become larger and larger,” Harpaz said, adding that it’s now one of his museum’s most well-attended events, representing artists from across the United States.

“Viewers will see very skillful, credentialed artists interpreting the theme in a range of different mediums and styles,” he explained.

Curator Langston refers to the artists exhibited as “the



matriarchs of the art world.
"We have the best of the best, the leading women artists," she said, adding that she hopes their works will inspire both Oakton art students and members of the community, including "women of a certain age who grew up in a different environment."

"The Personal is Political" includes works such as "Grandma on the Line-Buick Plant, Flint," painter Sandra Reibscheid's

tribute to her grandmother who worked in a Michigan Buick plant; "Is There a Justice in the House?," a depiction of three gagged female Supreme Court justices by corporate lawyer and painter Alisa Singer; and "Tales, Myths and Lies," Sari Maxfield's hybrid figure of a fashion model, Disney princess, monster and Hindu goddess.

"The art isn't going to jump off the wall and attack anybody,"

Langston said. "Even if it's a very strong piece, it's something people can approach however they want and not feel threatened."

One of the greatest strengths of the annual women's art exhibition is its coordination with the Oakton Community College program in Women's and Gender Studies, said Harpaz, adding that his museum constantly strives to integrate its shows with the college's academic mission. ■

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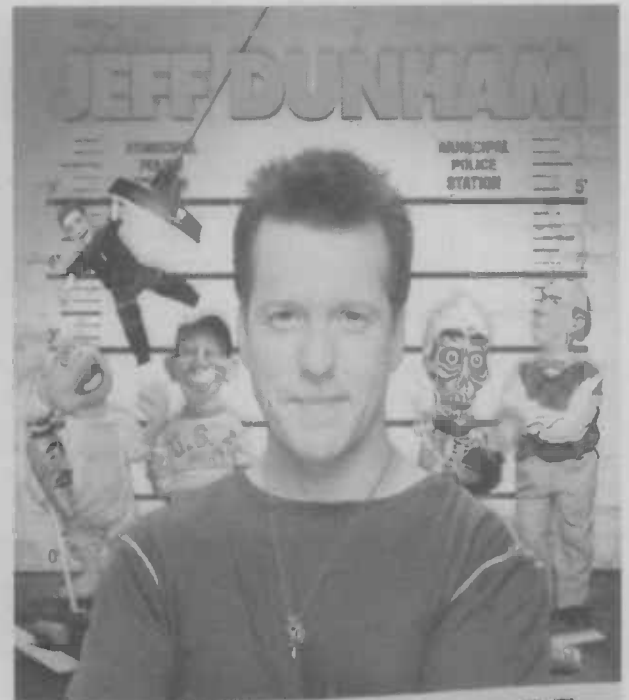

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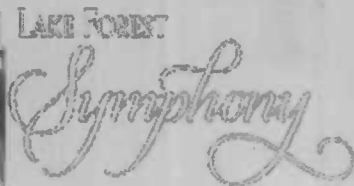

Affleck's best with 'Argo'

Every once in a while, a movie comes along that gets pretty much everything right — and "Argo" is one of them.

Combining real-life espionage drama with a side-order of Hollywood satire, it's never less than fascinating and it's also extremely suspenseful and surprisingly funny. It'll be much more surprising if "Argo" isn't nominated for a Best Picture Oscar.

That shouldn't shock anyone who's been watching actor Ben Affleck prove himself as a director the past five years, starting out strong with the 2007 kidnapping drama "Gone Baby Gone" and topping himself with the bank-robbery thriller "The Town" in 2010.

Both of those films were impressive, but "Argo" is something special. It deftly recounts the little-known true story of a CIA operative who flew into Iran in early 1980 shortly after 52 Americans were taken as hostages from the U.S. embassy to rescue six who had managed to slip away to the Canadian embassy.

Affleck also turns in an effective, low-key performance as Tony Mendez, a former CIA exfiltration specialist — someone who sneaks people out of dangerous situations.

Mendez is summoned as a consultant to a State Department strategy session for rescuing the escapees. After hearing about a plan to get them out by providing them with bicycles and maps to the border, Mendez is confident he can come up with a better bad idea. And he does, after seeing a bit of "Battle for the Planet of the Apes" on TV. He will fly into the country posing as a Canadian film producer scouting desert locations for a sci-fi epic, and fly out again with the Americans posing as members of his film crew.

Mendez knows he's going to have to make his phony movie look as real as possible, so he visits Oscar-winning makeup artist John Chambers (John Goodman, excellent) for some assistance in setting up all the trappings. Old-school producer Lester Siegel (Alan Arkin at his wise-guy best) brings the Hollywood humor to life.

The serious intent, though, never wavers in "Argo." Occasional cutaways to Iran's security forces, first discovering that Americans are missing, then reconstructing their photos from shredded documents, make it clear that time is running out.

The remarkable thing is that Affleck manages to weave the humor, the behind-the-scenes details of espionage and the constant undercurrent of tension into a seamless whole.

Until the final act, that is, when "Argo" is focused entirely on ever-escalating suspense, as Mendez attempts to leave the country with his six escapees, just one or two steps ahead of the pursuing Revolutionary Guard. Is that the way the escape really happened? Somehow, that seems a little doubtful, but what's wrong with that? Clearly, Affleck wanted to tell his story with as much realism and integrity as possible, while still making it work as thrilling, mainstream entertainment. And he's done so, in a way that's entirely satisfying on all counts. Isn't it nice when a plan works out? ■

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Behavioral Questions: Please Don't Tell Me About Yourself!

A seismic shift from skill to attitude has taken place in the hiring world. Technical proficiency, once a guarantee of lifetime employment, has become commoditized in today's job market. Between the global labor market and the high unemployment of the Great Recession, there's a large supply of technically-qualified candidates for almost every available job.

Job skills are necessary, but they're not sufficient. It's attitude – not skill – that is the best predictor of new hire success. In a Leadership IQ study of 20,000 new hires over a three-year period, 46% failed within their first 18 months. And 89% of the time they failed because of attitudinal reasons; technical skills barely made the list.

Hiring for Attitude

How are the best companies hiring for attitude? First, savvy leaders identify the specific attitudes that create success in their unique cultures and environments.

We call these key attitudes "Brown Shorts" – a strange name that pays homage to Southwest Airlines and their culture of fun.

Brown Shorts draws from a story I heard from a former Southwest executive about a round of hiring for new pilots. The interviewer invited this serious bunch to get comfortable in a pair of Bermuda shorts (brown in our story).

The shorts were part of the Southwest summer uniform, but it was an invitation that seemed too ridiculous for many of the pilots who immediately declined the shorts. And that told Southwest that these folks may be great pilots, but they just weren't going to fit a fun-loving culture.

When you model your interview questions around those Brown Shorts, you'll discover who will (and won't) succeed in your organization.

To hire for attitude, you've also got to interview for attitude. And that means ditching interview questions that don't help you assess candidates' attitude. For instance, the best interviewers no longer ask:

- Tell me about yourself.
- What are your strengths?
- What are your weaknesses?



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These questions are too vague, inviting canned answers that don't reveal attitude.

Behavioral Interview Questions

So-called behavioral interview questions are also often ineffective for assessing attitude. Most behavioral questions contain a "tip off" that tells candidates how to give you the "right" answer.

The main issue with behavioral questions is that they rob you of your chance to find out if someone is a 'problem bringer' or a 'problem solver.' Let's say you ask a candidate a pretty typical behavioral question: "Tell me about a time when you had to adapt to a difficult situation."

This question may sound fine, but the word "adapt" ruins it. That single word signals that you only want to hear about a time the candidate "adapted" (instead of the hundreds of times they failed to adapt).

In the case of true high-performer candidates, these folks have plenty of examples to share that describe a time when they successfully 'adapted' to a difficult situation.

If you asked them about a time they "faced" a difficult situation, they're naturally going to tell you not only about the difficult situation, but also about how they adapted to it. For high performers, it's practically impossible to even imagine 'facing' a difficult situation without also successfully 'adapting' to it.

But when you introduce a leading interview question, you're not giving them the chance to disclose that information.

Just remember that attitude is the key driver of new hire success. And if you're willing to rethink your hiring process, your hiring success will skyrocket.

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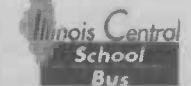

AUTOMATION RESHAPES OPPORTUNITIES FOR MED TECHS

Robotics and automation are helping to fill in the gaps in medical laboratories created by a shortage of medical technologists (MTs). Automated laboratory systems pick up the grunt work that once made workdays dull for MTs. And executives at diagnostic labs are using robotics to help control costs.

Automation Ameliorates Shortage

Staffing shortages are a major challenge for labs.

"We've been able to cope with the shortage, because we've automated or robotized some of what we do in the lab," says Elissa Passiment, executive vice president of the American Society for Clinical Laboratory Science. "But this has done nothing to lessen the need; it has just helped us avoid closing labs."

But some observers say hospitals and other employers of medical technologists are responsible for their own staffing woes. "The shortage of med techs is caused by poor pay and bad working conditions," says John Kershaw, chief operating officer of Sysmex America, a laboratory diagnostic systems maker in Mundelein, Illinois.

In any case, no one foresees a healthcare industry without med techs.

"We don't really see that we're going to be able to reduce manpower, but we can reduce preanalytical errors with automation," says John Sherer, compliance officer for CompuNet Clinical Laboratories in Dayton.

A More Analytical Role

Experts believe automation is turning lab workers into knowledge workers.

"We like to think it's enhancing careers by taking away mundane tasks and allowing technical personnel to concentrate on more important things," says Sherer, who also chairs the American Medical Technologists' federal/government affairs committee. In hematology, for example, "automation allows techs to screen particular cells instead of looking at every cell," he says.

Often, as machines take over one function in the laboratory, medical innovation creates new challenges for human workers.

"As automation takes over routine lab tasks, med techs move into another area where they need special knowledge that hasn't yet been

automated," Kershaw says. "Preanalytic jobs such as transcription and sample sorting may cease to exist." But MTs who want the opportunity can readily move to a more analytical function in the lab.

Penetration Varies

Automation is not distributed evenly over all diagnostic labs in the country. Labs in small, rural hospitals and in physicians' offices have the least automation and the highest MT vacancy rates; big-city medical centers and blood centers have the most automation and less severe staff shortages.

In blood centers, "infectious disease testing and serologic testing has all been automated," says Dr. James AuBuchon, chairman of the clinical transfusion medicine committee at the AABB (formerly the American Association of Blood Banks). "I don't anticipate big future changes, because all the automation that could be brought in has been brought in."

Learning the Systems

Automation might change the training requirements for medical technologists.

To cut costs and reduce errors, "there's

an increasing push for simplification and standardization such that less and less training is needed" for lab workers in blood centers, AuBuchon says. "On the other hand, we will still need medical technologists and technicians, and they will need to be increasingly computer literate."

But given the pace and breadth of technological change, med techs end up getting much of their education on the job. "There are so many different lab automation systems," Sherer says. "It would be difficult to give MTs training for all of them."

And the learning curve will continue to be steep. "In the next five to 15 years, there's going to be an explosion of new tests," Passiment says. "We won't be able to keep up with the demand for medical technologists, even with automation."

a. If after reviewing the completed applications and the SLC finds that there are more qualified applicants than available Class E6 or Class M licenses, then a lottery will be held on November 14, 2012. Should a lottery be necessary, the SLC will distribute procedures regarding the pending lottery to those qualified applicants. The applicants will be notified by the SLC by November 13, 2012.
b. If after reviewing the applications there are fewer qualified applicants than available licenses, then the SLC shall, pursuant to the provisions of the Skokie Liquor Code, review and act upon the applications received, and again open the application period on a first come first serve basis, until such time as the new Class E6 and Class M Licenses are issued.
- 3) A qualified applicant shall be defined, in part, as an applicant with an establishment already in operation OR one that can produce documentation demonstrating an establishment will be operating no later than 12 months subsequent to the awarding of a liquor license. If a license is awarded and an establishment does not open within the 12 month period, the license will be forfeited and reissued to another applicant. In addition, the issuance of a license after it has been awarded is subject to the applicant and the establishment location being in compliance with any and all other applicable local ordinances and laws of the State of Illinois.
- 4) In order to be eligible for a Class E license, regardless of commercial district, an establishment must be a "restaurant," as the word is defined in Section 54-61 of the Skokie Village Code, which may include a restaurant with a bar area.
- 5) In order to be eligible for a Class M license, regardless of commercial district, an establishment must offer retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption off-premises and encompass more than 10,000 square feet but less than 40,000 square feet.
- 6) PLEASE TAKE NOTE, Class E and Class M licenses are only valid for the address for which they are issued and may not be moved to a new location, even within the same commercial district.
- 7) Upon award of a license, payment for a Class E6 or Class M license, in the amount of \$10,000 for a full license or \$4,500 for a beer/wine license, must be made to the Village of Skokie within 48 hours.

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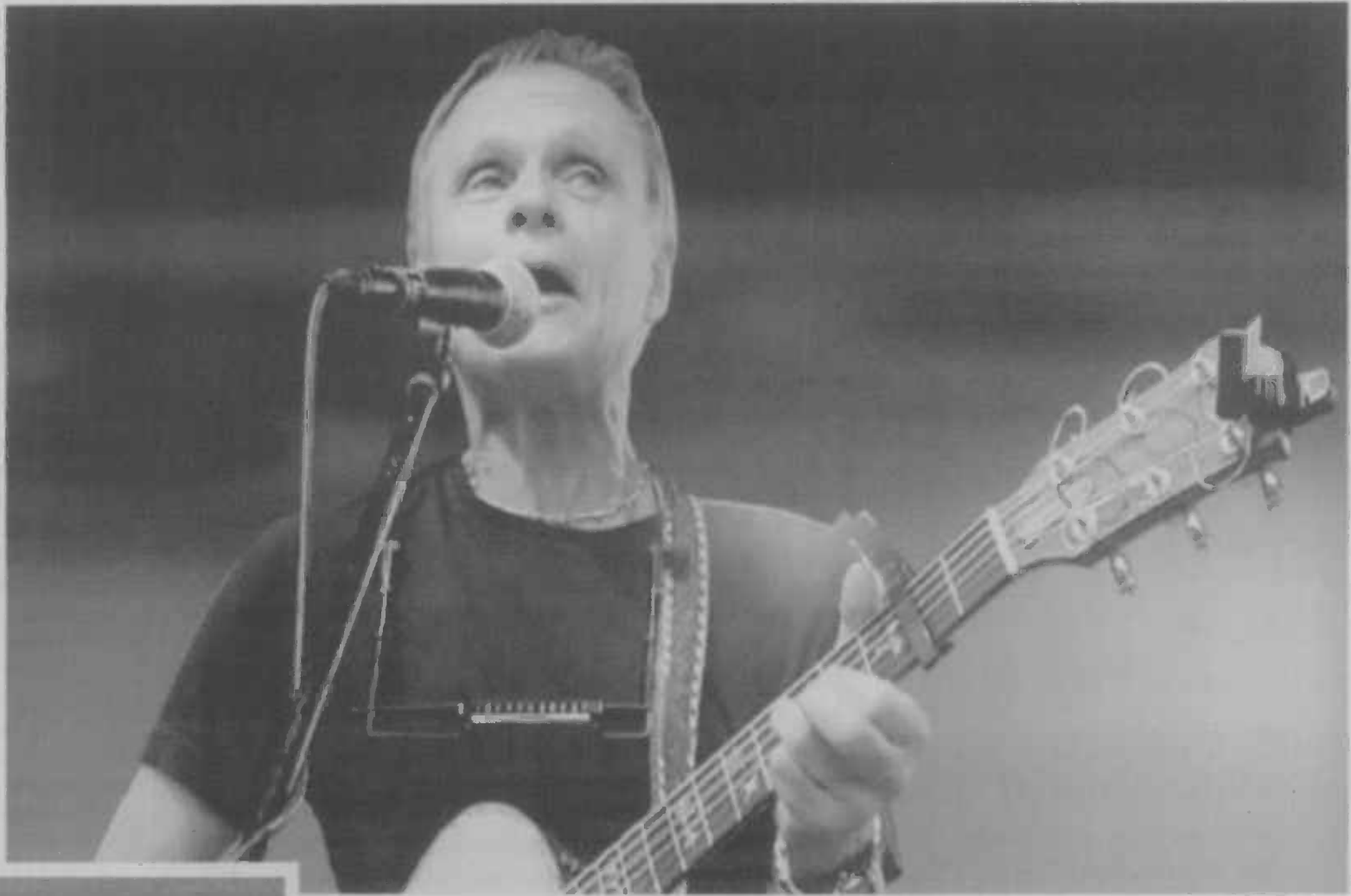

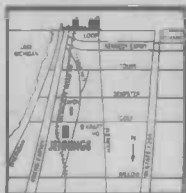

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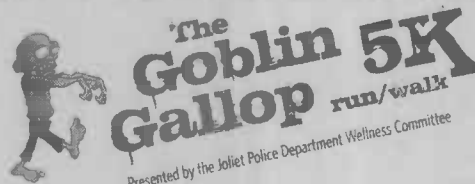
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Maine South going to state tournament for first time

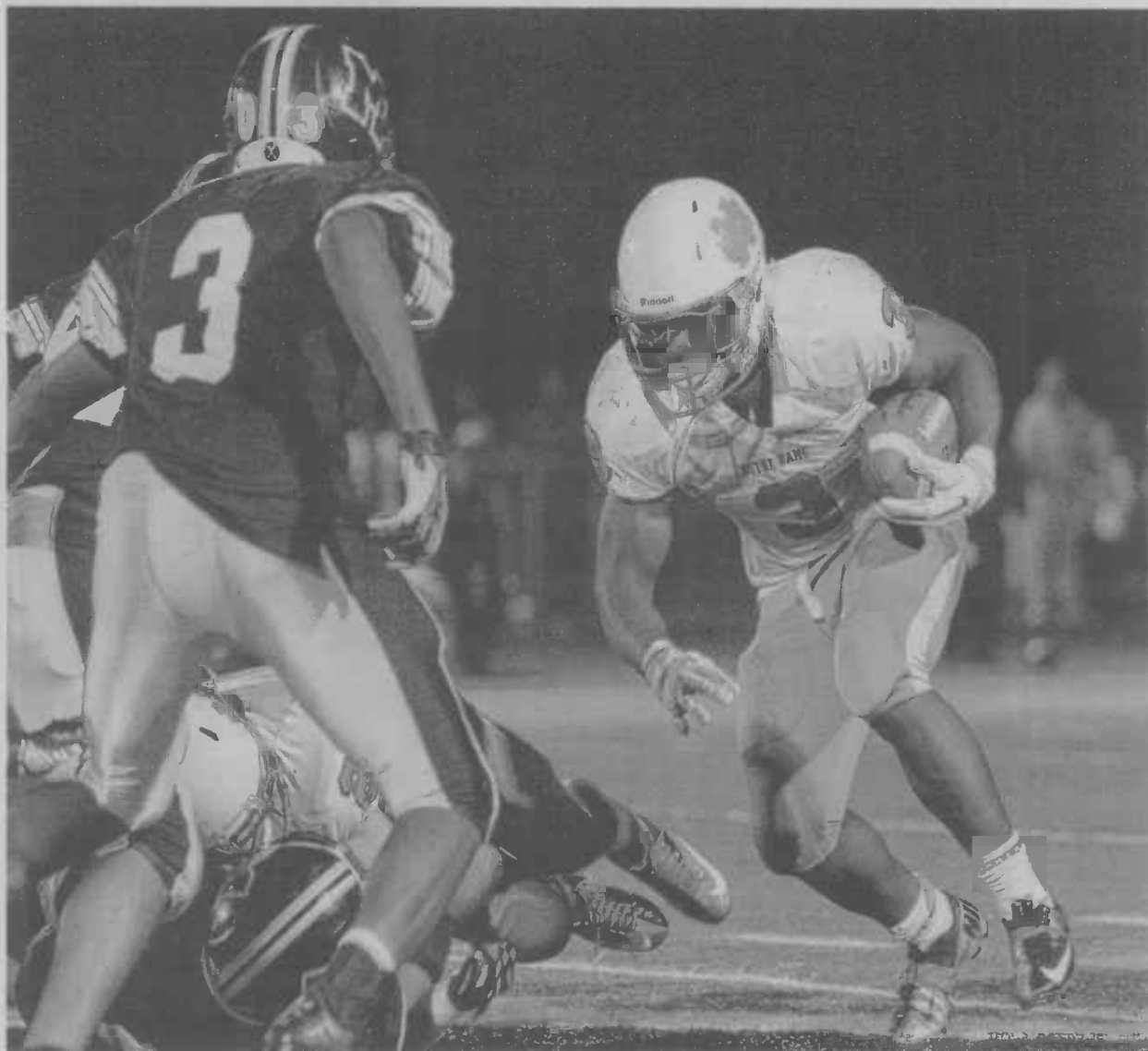

Late drive underscores James' value

One saying that is heard throughout sports is that big-time players make big-time plays in big-time games.

Notre Dame junior running back Chris James

is without a doubt a big-time player. His coach Mike Hennessey simply said, "(James) moves the chains." Through seven games, James has rushed for 1,228 yards and is without a doubt one of the top running backs in the state.

James' value to his team might not have been more evident than it was last Friday night as the



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Dons, in desperate need of a victory for their playoff chances, had the ball down seven with first and goal on Marist's 10-yard line.

After a 4-yard gain on first down by the junior, trainers needed to come on the field to attend to an apparently hurt running back. James, by rule, needed to exit the field for at least the next play, thus leaving Notre Dame without an answer offensively. With the game on the line and second and goal from the 6, the Dons called for a halfback pass by junior Tom Sora which fell incomplete. With James looking "OK" on the sidelines, he surprised most by not entering the game on third down. This put Notre Dame in another passing situation without their top offensive weapon thus leading to another incomplete pass. But finally, on fourth down, the "offense" returned in a "Superman-like" way.

So certainly James was going to decide his team's fate on its final play of the night, but he never got the chance. The 1,000-yard rusher went out into the flat for a pass but the Redhawks defense would not allow the Dons' best offensive player to beat them and quarterback Dan Nagode was forced to throw up a ball into a crowd of defenders which was eventually knocked down.

Try to find another player in the state of Illinois that is looked to carry its team more than James.

But as Notre Dame offensive coordinator Kevin Stenson says, James wasn't satisfied where he was at the end of last season.

"He has a tremendous work ethic," Stenson said. "He put in the work in the offseason."

James notes the work this past offseason he put in is the reason for his success this year.

"I worked hard," he said. "I studied what defenses might do. I worked with my trainer. I worked on everything."

Maybe everything that needs to be known about James could be found in the way he was able to bounce back against Marist. James was on a tear through the first five weeks of the season but ran into a hungry Nazareth team in week six. The Roadrunners held the Dons' star to just 37 yards rushing, but Friday night against Marist he carried it 32 times for 173 yards and a touchdown.

The way he responded against the Redhawks in week seven can be attributed to his mental toughness, according to

Stenson.

"He's able to bounce back," Stenson said. "He wants the ball, and he can't get enough of it."

No one knows what the next two weeks will hold for the Dons, but one thing is for certain. James will do whatever it takes for his team to reach the playoffs, and if Notre Dame is unable to make it, James will be back next year and will almost for certain be better than he was in 2012 and more motivated than ever to get a taste of the postseason. ■

Lopez serves as Vikings' leader

Things could hardly be better for the Niles North girls volleyball team.

The Vikings are 22-4 and 6-1 in the Central Suburban League North, which is good for second place behind Glenbrook North, which they will meet in two weeks. Niles North also has the No. 5 seed in a sectional it will host starting October 24th and turned in a solid performance at the Glenbrook North Discovery Tournament over the weekend, finishing fifth out of 16 teams with a 4-1 record. According to Lopez, a captain is most useful when things are difficult.

"It's very important to shake off errors. I always stress that," Lopez said. "To be a good volleyball team one of the most important traits you can have is the ability to shake off errors."

Senior Rachel Matthies, who has played with Lopez on the varsity team since their sophomore year, says she is grateful that Lopez is the team's leader.

"Andrea is a great leader on and off the court," Matthies said. "She helps pick us up when we're down and makes sure our focus is always on the game. If somebody messes

Last year's disappointment propels Spartans to state

Ever since the end of last season, all the Glenbrook North boys golf team wanted to do was get back to the sectional tournament and erase the memory from Hilldale Golf Club, where the Spartans finished fifth and failed to qualify for the state tournament.

Led by junior Nick Hardy's 2-over 73, Glenbrook North shot 302 at Winnetka Golf Club to win the New Trier Sectional title Monday. The Spartans are back in Bloomington for the final weekend of the year for the first time since 2010 and the third time since 2006.

"I didn't let last year enter my mind," said Hardy, who tied for first with New Trier's Jack Junge and Loyola's Michael Hultquist. Junge earned medalist honors with a birdie on the first playoff hole. "I treated this like a normal round. We've been playing well, so I was feeding off of that."

Hardy made three birdies against three bogeys and one double bogey.

"We learned a lot from last year," Ohr said. "We were very upset, but it made us a

better team. We didn't get ahead of ourselves all year. We have stay focused."

Nobody was happier for the boys than coach Justin Gerbich, who's been with the team for its last three state appearances.

"These guys are battle-tested," he said. "There was some pressure on us, but we are in a very different place than we were last year."

Glenbrook North has never won a state championship in boys golf. The program's best

finish was third during the 1971-72 school year.

But considering the stakes, the Niles West junior couldn't help from smiling.

Lee is going to the state tournament for the third season in a row after shooting an 8-over 79 on a cool

and windy day at the Class 3A New Trier Sectional. He made one birdie, but Lee managed to avoid making too many mistakes.

"I didn't play too well, but I was able to grind it out and put up a good enough score," Lee said. "I definitely played worse than at the regional. I just had to find a way (Monday)."

The state tournament is Friday and Saturday in

Bloomington at the Den at Fox Creek Golf Course. Lee's best performance came last year when he tied for 86th as a sophomore.

"It's a great feeling to go back," he said. "When you're a freshman, you go in and give it your best shot. Then, the expectations rise. I had more

pressure on me this year than before.

"I am happy to get there again."

Lee learned the game from his father Richard, who runs the golf operations for the Skokie Park District. After getting schooled at Weber Park, a par-3 course in Skokie, Lee started playing tournament golf while he was in elementary school.

"My dad is my inspiration," he said. "We've worked a lot on my game together. Of course, we've fought, but I know he always has my back."

Lee, who shot an even-par 70 at Sportsman's Country

Club at last week's regional tournament, was one of 10 individuals to earn an at-large bid to the state tournament. The cutoff was 81.

Glenbrook North won the team title with 302. New Trier (306) and Loyola (308) also qualified as teams.

New Trier's Jack Junge, Loyola's Michael Hultquist and Glenbrook North's Nick Hardy all tied for first place with 73s. Junge, a sophomore, earned medalist honors with a birdie on the first playoff hole. ■
