

Garino, the artistic director for The Shakespeare Project of Chicago, and professional actors captivated a packed-room at the Niles Public Library with a theatrical reading of "A Woman Killed With Kindness" on Friday, Jan. 18.

"It's a very meaningful play," said Garino, about the play written by Thomas Heywood, a Shakespeare contemporary. Garino said Heywood has written more than 200 plays, but unfortunately only a handful survived over the past 400 years.

The Shakespeare Project of Chicago is presenting theatrical readings in its 18th season, free of charge, at the Niles Public Library, Newberry Library in Chicago, Highland Park Public Library and the Wilmette Public Library until April.

"A Woman Killed With Kindness" is about a young wife who commits adultery. When her husband finds out, instead of divorcing her or killing her and her lover, he tells her to live on one of the houses on his estate but she could not speak to him or the children ever again. In the play, the woman chooses to starve to death and the man decides to forgive her on her death

bed.

"The play is really about forgiveness and what it costs to you," said Barbara Zahora, who plays the main woman character in the play. "It's a very interesting piece."

Zahora, who has been a professional actor for 10 years, said the Niles Public Library has been very good to them.

"I think they're excited to have us," said Zahora, of Naperville. The Friends of the Niles Public Library provide the refreshments at the readings.

Garino is a founding member of The Shakespeare Project of Chicago, and since 1995 he has acted in or directed more than 50

theatrical readings.

Garino is glad they are able to bring high quality plays to local libraries free of charge.

"This is a play that nobody knows," said Garino. "I've been doing Shakespeare most of my life. To get a chance to work on a new play from the same period and see the great job the actors do is really exciting."

Garino explained that instead of focusing on elaborate sets, they concentrate on the characters and true meaning of the plays. He said that audience members have told them that they have truly understood the plays for the first time during their intimate readings.

The group also has an Education Outreach program in which actors perform a

50-minute Romeo and Juliet and 50-minute Hamlet performances at local universities and schools. The audience members are able to talk with the actors after their performances.

"One of our missions is to make these performances and these stories available to a wide audience and people who can't afford to see professional actors at the Goodman Theater," shared Zahora.

Garino has been the artistic director of the Shakespeare Project of Chicago for three years and was associated director for a few seasons. He has also worked with the Steppenwolf and Organic Theatre companies, Pegasus Players, the Body Politic, Oak Park Festival Theatre and Illinois Shakespeare Festival. He

has directed various performances for the Shakespeare Project, including "Antony and Cleopatra," "A Midsummer Night's Dream," "A Woman of No Importance" and his own adaptations of Shakespeare's sonnets and songs.

Garino attended the National Shakespeare Conservatory and has a Bachelor of Arts in Theatre Arts from Hofstra University in New York and a Master of Fine Arts degree in acting from Illinois State University. He is a member of the Screen Actors Guild and a member of the Actor's Equity Association.

The next theatrical reading at the Niles Public Library will be "Twelfth Night" by William Shakespeare on Friday, Feb. 22 at 7 p.m. ■

Landlords, cops team up to keep properties crime-free

On Feb. 13, a group of Niles landlords will be getting up early in the morning to meet with the police officers.

But it won't be because they're in trouble. Quite the opposite, actually — they'll be there to take a class that will help them keep their properties crime-free.

The class is part of the village's Crime-Free Housing Ordinance. Adopted in 2008, the law created a multi-pronged approach designed to address crime on Niles rental properties. Modeled after a 1992 ordinance passed in Mesa, Ariz., it strove to balance the interests of the residents, the landlords and the law enforcement. Village officials are confident that the policy has been successful.

The original Mesa ordinance was written in response to growing concerns about apartment buildings turning into hotbeds of drug trade, gang violence and other criminal activities. The approach proved to be successful enough to be copied throughout United States — including in Chicago's northwestern suburbs.

The Niles version of the ordinance was originally proposed in 2007 by Sergeant Robert Tornabene, the Training and Public Information Officer at Niles Police Department. As originally conceived, the ordinance would have required all landlords to attend six-hour classes where they would be trained to deal with code violations, health hazards and tenant-inflicted property damage on their

property. It would teach them about state and local landlord/tenant laws, show them how to screen tenants and instruct them on legal ways to evict tenants for engaging in illegal activities in their buildings.

While the final version of the ordinance didn't require landlords to attend classes, it provided incentives. Niles landlord licenses come with fees — owners of multi-unit properties pay \$20 per unit, while owners of single-family homes or attached dwelling units pay a flat fee of \$100. Landlords who attended classes would get a 10 percent discount.

Tornabene recalled that the initial response to the resolution was positive.

"The landlords and most recent

renters had no complaints about it," he said. "I know that some of the renters that were repeat offenders had the problem with it because they knew the rules were going to be enforced [more systematically]."

That said, he made a point of explaining that there were incidents where classes could be mandatory.

"In the event that they have multiple incidents occurring in the property, [landlords] could be required to take classes," said Tornabene.

According to Tornabene, the Crime-Free Housing program succeeded in one important way:

"It's reduced [the number of] our repeat offenders dramatically."

Overall, Tornabene is happy with the way his proposal worked out. ■

Dealing with Alzheimer's

Losing a parent to Alzheimer's disease gave Laurie Sampson a new perspective on life.

"I realized I was making a lot of money and doing of things for myself, but wasn't doing much for anyone else," she said.

Last summer Sampson left her job as an accountant to pursue a career in elder care services. Now a client care manager with Senior Helpers of Niles-Lincolnwood, she pairs caregivers with seniors for in-home assistance across the north Chicagoland area.

"It's very difficult sometimes but it's very rewarding," Sampson said of her new post. "I love what I'm doing."

Q: What do you like the most about your job?

A: At the time when my father had Alzheimer's, I had no education about and understanding of the disease. So the best part about my job is that I get to educate families about the stages of the disease, and to let them know that nothing that is said or done by an Alzheimer's victim is a personal attack. It's the disease.

Q: In what ways do caregivers improve an elderly person's life?

A: I get this question all the time and, for some reason, people think of caregivers as someone who takes care of the elderly who cannot take care of themselves. This is not it at all. We teach all of our caregivers to allow the senior to do as much as they possibly can without help, and even to encourage them to do things they think they cannot do. It's about independence

and self-respect. We will help when needed but our focus is on what people can do, not on what they cannot do.

I remember with my own father how a loving family member made

him feel childlike. He used to always say to me, "Laurie, please tell her I can do it myself." If a person can do something on their own we should not take that from them. That is what we try to do at Senior Helpers.

We want seniors to be independent and, if they no longer need us, how great is that?

Q: What effect does Alzheimer's disease have on families?

A: As a daughter of an Alzheimer's victim, I can tell you first hand it is devastating, especially in the later stages of the disease when the language ability is lost. If you know about the disease, you know that curse words and negative language outlast nearly everything else. You can't understand how your loved one who adored you is now using expletives at you. I had taken it personally and it hurt a lot, but the truth is the part of the brain that guards "taboo" things is one of the last to go. So now I understand and it's not personal at all.

Q: How can family members cope with caring for a loved one who suffers from dementia?

A: Please go to the free seminar series with dementia care specialist Teepa Snow in March at Advocate Lutheran General Hospital in Park Ridge. She is the only person who has been able to explain Alzheimer's to me in a non-technical way that I could understand. Believe me, it will help so much.

But, if that's not possible, join a support group. There are many in our area. Contact the Alzheimer's Association or the Alzheimer's Foundation. They are both non-profit organizations and they are there to help. Don't rely just on family or friends. This is a baffling disease and you need people who have been there and are on the cutting edge of new treatments. ■

'Da Barber,' groomer of cops and mayors, dies

One of Mary Lou Rempala's favorite childhood memories of her father, Lorenzo Marucci, involved a place considered to be a second home: his Niles barbershop.

After playing in a park one rainy afternoon, Rempala and her mud-strewn bicycle took refuge at the small storefront shop at 7542 W. Oakton St.

Seeing this messy girl parade through the shop, a young boy getting his hair cut asked why she could bring her bike inside but he could not.

"That's my daughter, that's why," Marucci simply told him.

Many years later the boy, Greg, would become Rempala's husband.

That was Marucci's magic: He

knew how to keep people around. During his 50 years in the barbershop business, it was his generous spirit and warm personality that earned him a loyal following of customers and friends.

Lorenzo Marucci, fondly nicknamed "Da Barber," died Jan. 20 from pneumonia and the flu. He was 75.

Though Marucci and his family had moved from Niles

to Bloomingdale decades ago, he continued to work nearly daily at the shop he opened in 1961.

"He had a great worth ethic," Rempala said. "He worked until he died. That was important to him."

Marucci had learned to be a barber in Italy shortly before

immigrating to the United States. He initially found work in downtown Chicago, but knew after a few months the hustle and bustle of the city wasn't for him. So he took a job shining shoes with Florsheim Shoe Company, and worked evenings as a barber in Niles.

When the barbershop where he worked went up for sale, Marucci jumped on the opportunity to own it and didn't look back.

As the pace of life quickened, Marucci's style of business didn't change. An old-fashioned shave and haircut, marked by personalized service, was his trademark.

"He was a hell of a worker," recalled John Mirabelli, of Addison, who met Marucci five decades ago at Florsheim.

The hours-long wait at Lorenzo's Barber Shop didn't bother the five or six men who often waited in line for a cut and shave.

Marucci became the barber of choice for Niles police and fire personnel, as well mayors Nicholas Blase and Robert Callero. Former Niles trustee George Alpgianis called Marucci an "icon of the community."

"He probably cut hair for half of Niles for years," he said.

Marucci, a notable workhorse, was a family man, too, friends said. He and his wife, Dolores, were married 51 years.

Mirabelli said it was Marucci's good company that attracted people to him, and ultimately, the barbershop.

"He was the life of the party," he said. "He'll be missed." ■

Barbaglia's love story began 54 years ago, when Barbaglia met his late wife in Detroit Michigan on a blind date.


Szydoski said he took wonderful care of Carole, who passed away last January.

Top Dist. 64 officials will work for raises

Top officials at Park Ridge-Niles School District 64 are going to have to start working for their raises, under a new plan adopted by the school board on Monday.

Administrators were previously given the same raises that the teachers received, but the new program is merit-based.

Under the new plan, the superintendent would determine what the raise would be, ranging from 0 to 4 percent. The average salary

increase for administrators will be no greater than 2.75 percent.

Board Member Anthony Borrelli felt the average salary increase should be no greater than 2 percent as opposed to 2.75 percent, which was proposed by Board President John Heyde.

"Boards in general have struggled with giving employees a raise for no reason," said Supt. Phillip Bender, who said the new program will show the public why the

administrators get a raise.

Bender said exempt employees, such as school psychologists and the public relations director for the district, would also receive the merit-based raises.

Heyde said that the plan will apply to the 2012-2013 school year and the following school year. The board wants to see a rubric created with criteria for evaluating the employees.

"This is kind of a new concept in the world of

education," said Bender. He said he doesn't expect many employees will receive more than 2 percent the first year, but he predicts more deviation in future years.

"The people are going to have to earn it," said Bender.

During the pre-board meeting on Monday evening, two members of the Community Finance Committee made a recommendation to lower student fees.

Annie Jerome said that committee compared the

fees to 23 comparable school districts and found Park Ridge-Niles Dist. 64 school fees to be the highest.

Jerome said they recommend reducing the registration fees from \$227 to \$125 for grades one to five and from \$315 to \$150 for grades six to eight. Jerome said other options would be to phase in the same reduction over a four-year time period, or to make a reduction but to a lesser extent. ■







Riders weary as Metra prices jump again

It was one of the few things Metra riders could count on: The discounted 10-ride pass.

No matter how many times the fares went up and how many other policy tweaks the agency introduced, Metra continued to promote 10-rides as a cheaper, more flexible alternative to one-way tickets.

That changed on Friday, when Metra's new 10-ride fare policy went into effect. In an effort to help raise funds for capital projects, the transit agency got rid of the tickets' built-in discount, raising 10-ride prices to match the cost of 10 one-way tickets. Metra argued that, even though 10-rides no longer offered a better value, they still had advantages over one-way tickets.

But that did little to relieve the riders' concerns. Commuters that spoke to Pioneer Press complained that the hike came too soon after across-the-board fare increases in February 2012, and placed unfair financial burden on people who could least afford it. But at the same time, most seemed content to make the best of the situation.

For most of its existence, a 10-ride ticket cost the same as eight one-way tickets. Over the last few years, Metra tried to maintain the proportion in order to encourage customers to switch to 10-rides, which would cut down on agency's printing costs.

That started to change when Alex Clifford became Metra CEO in early February 2011. When fares went up last February, 10-ride prices were raised so that they would be worth about nine one-way tickets. In December, Metra's board voted to eliminate the discount entirely.

While Metra acknowledged that the price increase could discourage customers from buying 10-rides, the

agency argued that the passes still had advantage over one-ways. They could still be shared between several people, and it would be more convenient than having to buy 10 separate tickets.

But for riders, those advantages weren't enough.

Aside from the village that gave it its name, the Morton Grove Metra station serves Skokie, Niles and parts of Lincolnwood. Like Park Ridge, the station is located in Fare Zone C. With the fare hike, the price of a 10-ride to Chicago went up from \$38.25 to \$42.50.

While most of the riders used Metra to get from Morton Grove to Chicago, a sizable portion of riders took the train from other suburbs to work at and around the village.

Rodney Walat lives in Fox Lake and

takes Metra to work in Morton Grove. On Thursday, he said that while wasn't pleased about the fare hike, he had no choice but to live with it.

"Unfortunately, I live far enough away from here that I have to take the train," Walat said. "I wish I could get back at [Metra], but I can't."

Karoon Panosyan, of Skokie, used 10-rides to get to Chicago, but she said that it will change now that the price has increased.

"I'm going to start buying a monthly, which I guess is what [Metra] wanted," she said Friday morning.

Naiha Walia, of Prairie Grove, was just one of the many riders who shared Panosyan's feeling that Metra was trying to steer them toward monthly tickets.

"I feel they want more people to buy monthlies," she said. "That way, they

got all the money up front."

Nate Delman, a Skokie resident, said that he already switched during the last year's fare hike.

"I used to buy 10-rides when it was eight rides [per ticket]," he said. "But when it went up, I decided to buy monthly."

But that's not a realistic option for everyone. Alex Larson, a manager at Des Plaines-based Specialty Store Services warehouse, passes through the Morton Grove station on the way to work. While he can afford the monthly pass, he's worried about how this will affect his employees.

"A lot of my employees can't afford to put that much money up front," he said.

If they want to get Chicago, Morton Grove riders have another public transit alternative. PACE's Route 250 passes within walking distance of the station, linking the riders to the Dempster Yellow Line station. If riders use Chicago Cards or CTA transit cards, the entire trip would only cost \$2.00.


But it's an alternative most riders prefer not to take.

"I live right by the Skokie [CTA] station," said Panosyan. "The CTA takes longer."

The effects of Metra's fare hike won't be felt right away. Ten-rides purchased between Nov. 17, 2012 and Jan. 31 will be valid until Feb. 28. The 10-rides purchased before then are valid for a year after expiration. That means that 10-rides at the pre-hike prices could still be in use until Nov. 16.

In the end, none of the riders who spoke to Pioneer Press expressed any real desire to stop using Metra. As she stood on the outbound platform Thursday, waiting for the train to arrive, Park Ridge resident Betty Wagner summed up her feelings about the fare increase by citing the company's slogan.

"Of course I'm not happy," she said. "But Metra is still the way to really fly. It beats traffic." ■







How Illinois lawmakers voted in Congress before Jan. 31, 2013.

Major roll call votes in the Senate

SECRETARY OF STATE

Senators voted, 94-3, to confirm Sen. John Kerry, D-Mass., as the 68th U.S. Secretary of State. He took office on Feb. 1. Republican Senators John Cornyn and Ted Cruz of Texas and James Inhofe of Oklahoma cast the “no” votes. A “yes” vote was to confirm Kerry. **Sen. Richard Durbin: Yes; Sen. Mark Kirk: Yes**

DOLLAR-FOR-DOLLAR DEBT HIKE

Voting 54-44, senators tabled (killed) an amendment to require one dollar in future spending cuts for every dollar increase in the national-debt limit. That limit deals with the past as it applies to money already appropriated by Congress. A “yes” vote was to kill the amendment to HR 325. **Sen. Richard Durbin: Yes; Sen. Mark Kirk: No**

DEBT-LIMIT WAIVER

Senators voted, 64-34, to waive the statutory debt limit until May 19, allowing the Treasury to borrow above the current \$16.4 trillion limit until then. A “yes” vote was to send President Barack Obama a bill that also denies pay to lawmakers if they fail to pass a fiscal 2014 budget by April 15. (HR 325) **Sen. Richard Durbin: Yes; Sen. Mark Kirk: No**

HURRICANE SANDY AID

Voting 62-36, senators sent President Obama a bill to appropriate \$50.5 billion in disaster aid, most of which would provide immediate and long-term help for areas of Connecticut, New Jersey and New York struck three months ago by Hurricane Sandy. This is emergency aid and thus deficit spending. A “yes” vote was to pass HR 152. **Sen. Richard Durbin: Yes; Sen. Mark Kirk: No**

EGYPT AID CUTOFF

Voting 79-19, senators tabled a bid to end F-16 aircraft deliveries and other U.S. military aid to Egypt and its shaky Muslim Brotherhood-led government. A “yes” vote was to kill the amendment to HR 325 (above) on grounds it would upend U.S.-Egypt relations, hurt Israel and worsen chaos in the Middle East. **Sen. Richard Durbin: Yes; Sen. Mark Kirk: Yes**

DISASTER-AID OFFSET

Senators rejected, 35-62, an amendment to pay the \$50.5 billion cost of HR 152 (above) by cutting the same amount from discretionary spending programs - both military and non-military - over the next nine years. A “yes” vote was to cut non-entitlement spending to keep Hurricane Sandy aid from adding to the national debt. **Sen. Richard Durbin: No; Sen. Mark Kirk: Yes**

1. CHEMICAL BIOLOGICAL ATTACKS

Members voted, 395-29, to renew for five years several post-9/11 programs to develop and deploy medical countermeasures in the event of chemical, biological, radioactive or nuclear attacks against the U.S. A “yes” vote was to send HR 307 to the Senate.

City inspector general billed taxpayers \$270,625 last year

Faisal Khan, the City Council's handpicked inspector general, personally billed Chicago taxpayers for \$270,625 in 2012 — and \$305,500 since Khan started work on Nov. 13, 2011. That's \$44,415-a-year more than Mayor Rahm Emanuel's annual salary of \$216,210; \$108,769 more than the \$161,856-a-year paid to the city's full-time Inspector General Joe Ferguson; and nearly \$10,000 more than the the \$260,004 paid to Police Superintendent Garry McCarthy.

Records provided to the newspaper in response to a Freedom of Information request show Khan picked up the pace in the latter part of the year. He billed for: \$34,250 for 137 hours in August; \$24,750 for 99 hours in October; \$27,187 for 105.7 hours in November; and \$20,000 for 80 hours in December.

With a \$60,000-a-year budget, no staff and ground rules that tied his hands, Khan was hired in November, 2011 to spend the next four years investigating City Council corruption.

The Rules Committee approved Khan's nomination only after being assured that Chicago's first-ever legislative inspector general would be a part-time employee without benefits paid \$250-to-\$300-an-hour while continuing to practice law on the side. It hasn't turned out that way. ■

Backers seek quick approval for \$675 million in road projects

Legislators have \$675 million in unanticipated money available to spend on Illinois transit projects but must act quickly if they want to see road-graders moving this spring, supporters said.

In Illinois, where financial news has rarely been rosy in recent years, backers of roads projects have difficulty understanding the holdup. The money isn't exactly free, but it comes at no additional cost to taxpayers.

Contractors for road-building and bridge repair are hired for the warm-weather construction season beginning in March, officials said, so the window to add projects financed with the nearly no-strings money is sliding shut.

There's a \$175 million infusion of federal money after Congress adopted a new national transit strategy last summer. Another \$500 million of state money is available this year, from healthy motor-fuel tax revenues, previous transportation projects that ended up costing less than budgeted and work scheduled for later years that could be bumped up.

"In the political vernacular, this should be a no-brainer," said Doug Whitley, president of the Illinois Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Transportation for Illinois Coalition. ■

Joint Chiefs: Looming budget cuts would 'hollow' military

The military's top leaders are warning Congress that automatic spending cuts looming in March would force the Pentagon to slash operating budgets, weakening the armed forces and possibly forcing furloughs of 800,000 civilian employees.

The Joint Chiefs say in a letter to Congress that the cuts would create a "hollow force" and would require aircraft to be grounded and warships to return to port.

Troops on the front lines would continue to receive the support they need, despite a cut to the Pentagon's overall budget of more than 7 percent, the chiefs said. But those cuts feel more like 20 percent because they're crammed into the second half of the budget year and funding for uniformed personnel and combat operations is exempt.

The looming cuts are the price to pay for the failure of a 2011 budget "supercommittee" to agree to deficit cuts to replace the automatic reductions.

There's a growing sense of resignation that the country's political leaders will be unable or unwilling to find a way around looming automatic cuts to both the Pentagon and domestic agencies even though there's common agreement that the cuts would threaten the recovering economy. ■



Scouts grow up on gay rights

It's a start.

The Boy Scouts of America, following the national tide of acceptance toward gays in American life, was considering this week lifting its ban on gays in scouting.

But the final decision would be left up to the religious, civic and educational groups that run Cub Scout packs and Boy Scout troops across America.

Some 69 percent of those organizations are faith-based, with two of the top three largest being the Mormon and the Roman Catholic churches, accounting for about 30 percent of the nation's 2.7 million Scouts. Many local troops and churches, however, have expressed support for the change.

President Barack Obama supports gay marriage, as do 53 percent of Americans, according to a Gallup poll released in December. Nine states plus the District of Columbia allow for it.

Discrimination based on sexual orientation is enshrined in law and banned in the military.

It only makes sense to rid it from the most American of institutions, the Boy Scouts. ■

Hey Scouts: Drop ban, follow oath

I was mistaken.

When the Boy Scouts of America last October released files on sexual abuse of Scouts by adult leaders that occurred over decades, I figured that was the beginning of the end for the organization's policy banning openly gay Scouts and leaders.

But if protecting boys from sexual predators was one of the reasons for the ban, it obviously didn't work.

And it really couldn't work, because pedophile and homosexual is not the same thing.

So now the Boy Scouts are considering a change in policy and removing the mandatory ban. The change would allow the local sponsoring organizations to determine whether to allow gay Scouts or adult leaders.

I can understand why the national

office would pursue that policy. Although it is a national organization, most individuals experience Scouting through their local sponsoring organization, from local churches to veterans' groups.

But that policy would probably create a crazy quilt of policies just in northern Illinois. Some local charters would change their policy, other wouldn't.

The current rationale is that homosexuality is inconsistent with the Scout oath and law, by which all Scouts abide. But is it?

The Scout oath says: "On my honor, I will do my best, to do my duty to God and my country, and to obey the Scout Law; to help other people at all times; to keep myself physically

strong, mentally awake, and morally straight."

The Scout law is: "A Scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent."

The BSA policy says that the fact someone is gay automatically means they

can't abide by the Scout oath and law, particularly the morally straight and clean and reverent parts.

Conversely, being straight means you automatically fit in. In both cases, behavior plays no role in the matter. The files released last October show how that sweeping generalization worked out.

There are aspects of what some call a gay lifestyle that are open to criticism on moral grounds — cruising bars; one-night stands, nameless hookups

— but the same criticisms can be made about aspects of a straight lifestyle.

Most adult Scout leaders are parents. More and more today, gay couples are raising their children. Should they be denied from participating in Scouting — even at the simplest level of going on a weekend campout — with their son?

Of course not.

Even straight, married couples fall short of the moral high bar set by the Scout oath and law. The last time I wrote about this issue, the headlines were full of the Monica Lewinsky scandal. President Clinton, I wrote then, would hardly pass the test of being a role model for boys considering his human failings.

The issue isn't about gay or straight. The issue is protecting boys and teaching them how to live the Scout oath and law. ■



Check, please: Chess makes comeback at Maine South

The room is practically silent, but the tension in the air, the concentration of competition, is palpable.

There is no cheering section here — no one utters a word.

They simply watch.

This isn't your average high school sport. Outsiders might even argue that it actually isn't a real sport. But for players like Patrick Daleiden, chess is the real deal.

"I definitely consider it a sport," said Daleiden, a Maine South High School senior who reignited interest in chess at his school last year when he pursued a revival of the chess team, inactive since 2007.

"There was one tournament where there were four other guys on the team and we had matches over two days. The matches were a maximum of four hours long. It was over a three-day weekend and I thought I was going to have Monday to do homework. I was more sick than I've ever been, just because it was so mentally and physically exhausting."

Daleiden, like other members of the team, started learning chess as a child. His mother, he said, wanted him to learn the game and even hired a coach to teach him the finer points.

As a student at Maine South, Daleiden, having friends who played, expressed interest in bringing back the school's competitive chess team and reached out to teacher Kevin Hurley, coach of the Maine South Math Team.

"The credit to getting the team where it is really belongs to Pat because he put himself out there," Hurley, who now sponsors the chess team, said. "He wanted something for him and his friends and was willing to do what was required to make it happen."

The team, which has won five out of seven matches this school year, currently boasts about 16 to 17 participants, with eight players competing in each match.

"That's been phenomenal," Hurley noted. "The seniors this year have really been the driving force behind this. Because they're so into it, I get into it."

The Maine South Chess Team is a member of the North Suburban Chess League, which is comprised of 14 schools within two divisions. Schools in Maine South's division include Niles North, Niles West, New Trier, Maine West and Evanston Township High Schools, as well as Notre Dame College Prep and Northridge Prep.

On Jan. 26, Maine South hosted a three-round tournament in the school's library, with each player given 45 minutes to make all of their moves.

Eleven players are also gearing up for the state competition on Feb. 8 and 9 in Peoria.

The team does not receive funding from Maine South or High School District 207, so everything from game pieces to competing in tournaments is funded by the group itself,

largely with help from Hurley and parents.

"It's been a lot of fun," said team member Connor Mullane, who learned chess from his cousin around the age of 13. "I hadn't played any competitive chess, so this was my first time at it."

Ir-Jene Shan, a freshman, got his start playing Chinese chess with his grandfather before taking up the Western version of the game.

"I hadn't played chess in a while, and I thought (the team) would be fun," he said.

Before they played competitively, the students acknowledged that they primarily played against family and friends.

"Anybody can definitely learn how to play chess and be good at it," noted player Marko

Bogicevic.

One stereotype people seem to have about chess players is that they are not athletic, Daleiden said. But he insists it's not true.

"I would say more than half our team is a very athletic group," he said. "It's just putting their intellectual adeptness into play."

For now, chess appears to be a male-dominated sport, with only a handful of girls taking part in the Jan. 26 tournament at Maine South. Hurley said he hopes to see that change.

For the players, Hurley also wants the chess team to be "an experience they remember for the rest of their lives."

"Have fun — always, always, always. That's the number one thing I always say," Hurley said. ■

Eating pie for profit

Pizza-lovers of all ages from Skokie and beyond flocked to Niles West High School Thursday night to taste pies from 13 local pizzerias before voting for their favorite during the third annual "Pizza Wars" event, which raised more than \$8,400 for the District 219 Education Foundation for Excellence.

Since the first Pizza Wars was hosted three years ago, the event has grown into a wildly popular evening among the Niles Township community, and each year it gets bigger.

More than 800 people attended this year, compared to 500 last year and 300 the first year, said Alyse Burman, fundraiser for the 219 Education Foundation.

"We're excited to have made our goals, and next year we hope to get even more pizza-makers to attend to help up double this year's figure," Burman said. "The foundation does an amazing job providing the tools students need for education — we believe education is something that should never be neglected."

The 219 Education Foundation's goal of nearly doubling last year's proceeds of \$4,300 was exceeded even before all the ticket sales were added up Friday, and that number will increase even more on Saturday because Village Inn owners Mark Collins and Randy Miles announced plans to donate 20 percent of all sales made on Jan. 19 back to the 219 Foundation.

Although each restaurant that participated brought between 25 and 100 pizzas each, the pies were running low by the end of the night.

David Bulwa, manager of Father and Son Italian Kitchen in Skokie, brought 100 dessert pizzas topped with berries and sweet sauce that had a steady

stream of sweet-toothed guests lining up at his booth throughout the night.

Funds raised by the 219 Foundation have also been used to purchase refurbished computers, school supplies and breakfast foods for students in need.



Falling in love over lemon chicken

Champagne, oysters, foie gras and chocolate are all well-known aphrodisiacs that have undeniably romantic qualities, but in my experience, foods of love are intensely personal.

Romance can come to life over a bowl of tomato soup just as easily as it can over a box of chocolates.

When my now husband and I first began dating, I had three jobs and very little money to show for it. My oppressively tight budget

impacted every aspect of my life. In fact, to avoid starvation, I'd coax my younger brother into stealing canned soup from my parents' house and deliver it in secret to my tiny apartment. I just didn't have the heart to tell my mom and dad I was having trouble making ends meet.

I had to heat my stolen soup in my microwave

because I couldn't afford to turn the gas on in my apartment; if just one bill had come in the mail I would have been in the red. Rather than risk a financial implosion, I opted to rely on a microwave, toaster and a Crock-Pot to get me through my monthly meals.

Creative cooking hadn't become a part of my life just yet and I relied heavily on the 1975 edition of *Rival Crock-Pot Cooking* to get me through most of my early dates with my husband. While I avoided dishes like Bologna-Baga Bake and Swiss Crab Casserole for obvious reasons, I became a fast fan of the Lemon Herbed Roasted Chicken on page 72. I prized the simple recipe for its short ingredient list and

Love-Inspired Lemon Chicken Piccata for Two

This lemon chicken comes together so quickly that it's easy to stay focused on the romance of Valentine's Day. I like to serve this timeless meal with whole grain angel hair pasta and a quick sauté of zucchini, mushrooms and grape tomatoes to bring some color to the plate.

2 skinless and boneless chicken breasts, trimmed
 ½ cup all-purpose flour
 1 ½ teaspoons of salt
 ½ teaspoon of white pepper
 1 tablespoon of unsalted butter
 2 tablespoons of olive oil
 ½ cup of low-sodium chicken broth
 ¼ cup of white wine
 3 tablespoons of fresh squeezed lemon juice
 2 tablespoons of capers, drained
 ¼ cup of chopped Italian parsley
 Salt and black pepper to taste
 2 lemon wedges for serving

Place the chicken on a clean work surface. Butterfly each chicken breast by holding the knife parallel to the cutting board and slicing down the length of the chicken. Nearly cut through to the other side, but leave a "hinge" intact; open the breast like a book. Cover each open breast with plastic wrap and pound with a mallet, rolling pin or heavy bottomed saucepan until they are 1/2-inch thick. Cut each breast in half lengthwise to yield four pieces of chicken.

Combine the flour, salt and white pepper in a small shallow dish. Dredge the chicken in the flour and coat well on both sides. Heat the butter and the olive oil over high heat in a skillet large enough to hold the four pieces of chicken. When the foaming subsides, shake the excess flour off the chicken and add it to the skillet. Cook until golden brown (about 2 minutes) on one side. Flip the chicken and brown on the second side until golden (about 2 minutes). Remove the chicken to a plate and reserve.

Gradually add chicken broth and the wine to the pan while whisking constantly. Take care to scrape up the browned bits from the bottom of the pan to bring flavor to the dish. Add the lemon juice and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to a simmer and return the chicken to the pan. Simmer the chicken in the sauce until tender and cooked through (about 5 minutes per side).

Place 2 portions of chicken on each of two warmed dinner plates. Whisk the capers and parsley into the sauce and season with salt and pepper. Spoon the sauce over the chicken and serve with lemon wedges, vegetables and pasta if desired.

bread into lemony broth. We fell deeply in love over plates of that stringy Crock-Pot chicken.

To this day, lemon chicken is our food of love and the *Rival Crock-Pot* cookbook I used to romance my husband is proudly housed in the china cabinet in our dining room. It is always opened to page 72.

The numbers tell the story

Despite some advancements, heart disease is still No. 1 killer

After working as an emergency room physician for more than three years, Dr. Jamie Harlan has seen the gamut of heart disease.

Harlan, who is a physician with Presence Saint Francis Hospital in Evanston, says he sees at least three to five patients per shift with chest pain. But it's not all bad news.

"I think the population knows a lot more about it [heart disease] now, so they are more aware [and this] actually helps us," Harlan said.

Patients are being more proactive about their symptoms, he said. Rather than waiting and seeing what happens, they take action by coming to the ER where tests can be done. This has resulted in earlier diagnoses, which leads to improved survival rates.

Nevertheless, heart disease remains the No. 1 killer in the United States — for both men and women — according to the American Heart Association.

Prevalence

The Centers for Disease Control and Pre-

vention reports that heart disease accounts for 25 percent of all U.S. deaths and it is a leading cause of disability.

The American Heart Association reports that one in three women is living with cardiovascular disease, including nearly half of all African-American women and 34 percent of white women. The CDC reports that 64 percent of women who die suddenly from coronary heart disease have no previous symptoms. And women often will not get help until it's too late.

"Women tend not to access healthcare because they are the care givers," said Sandy Mickulich, nurse practitioner at Advocate South Suburban Hospital's Heart Failure Clinic in Hazel Crest.

Limited access to information about treatment and prevention can also play a role.

"Certain groups are possibly under-served and under-treated which creates a prevalence of heart disease," said Dr. Matthew Sorrentino of University of Chicago's School of Medicine.

In addition, many people who have heart disease have another major health issue, such as diabetes or kidney disease.

"[High cholesterol, obesity, heart disease,

diabetes] ... it's all intertwined," Mickulich said.

Awareness, prevention

Doctors recommend you know where you stand with lab values such as blood pressure, cholesterol, blood sugar, height, weight and body mass index. And put your bad habits in neutral.

"Bad habits accumulate over time like the plaque in our arterial walls ... over time, we are more likely to develop heart disease," said Jean Owen Alves, registered nurse and nutritionist for the Rush Nutrition and Wellness Center in Chicago.

Smoking, high blood pressure and high LDL cholesterol are key risk factors for heart disease.

"If a patient stops smoking, they can significantly reduce their risk," Sorrentino said.

And in fact, taking care of your heart can

reduce your risk for diabetes.

"If you lose 10 percent of your body weight, you can decrease your blood pressure ... and if you lose weight, you decrease your risk of developing diabetes," Mickulich said.

Alpha Phi advocates for women's heart health

According to the American Heart Association, heart disease is the number one killer of women. Many people, however, mistake the signs as symptoms of the flu, acid reflux or normal aging. However, shortness of breath, dizziness, extreme fatigue or pressure in the upper abdomen, back or lower chest can be subtle symptoms of heart disease. Check with your doctor to ask about your personal risk. If you experience these warning signs, call 911.

Alpha Phi, an international women's fraternity, works to promote heart health education, especially for women.

In 1946, Alpha Phi International adopted cardiac care as a priority. In 1986, the organization created the Alpha Phi Foundation in part to support heart care. The foundation's Heart to Heart Grant, which is currently in its 20th year, funds education and research that supports improving women's heart health. The recipient, chosen by a team of medical professionals and the foundation's board of directors, will be announced late this February.

"The \$50,000 award enables medical

professionals to better understand gender differences in heart health and increase their expertise in heart disease prevention and treatment in women," said Ann Carstensen, executive director, Alpha Phi Foundation.

Alpha Phi is an international leader in the collegiate Greek community. The organization has raised more than a million dollars annually from donations and events put on by the 157 chapters. Alpha Phi members are encouraged to promote awareness of women's heart health, especially during American Heart Month in February. Alpha Phi's Beta chapter, based at Northwestern University in Evanston, holds an annual fundraiser called the Mud Olympics, which is the most widely attended Greek philanthropy event at the university. Last year, the event raised almost \$3,000.

Additionally, the Beta chapter is currently planning its annual Red Dress Gala, which raised almost \$5,000 for the foundation last year.

"Some more established chapters raise tens of thousands of dollars from this event," said Elyse Aussenbaugh, president, Alpha Phi Beta chapter. "The gala is fairly new for us; it's our third year doing it."

The black-tie event will take place on Feb. 22. The \$75 ticket includes dinner, cocktails, entertainment and door prizes as well as information to boost awareness and prevention of heart disease in women. The event is open to the public. Email betaredress@gmail.com for more information.

"This year, we are going to give away free CPR classes that were donated through the Northwestern Emergency Medicine Organization's work with the Evanston Police Department," said Emily MacArthur, director of internal philanthropy and Red Dress Gala co-chair. "It's a two-hour class that could really save someone's life."

In addition, Carstensen said that, as 88 percent of heart attacks happen at home, the foundation will unveil a pilot CPR training program this spring that will hopefully help increase survival rates.

"The foundation's ultimate goal is to teach

and empower Alpha Phi's more than 175,000 members with the lifesaving skills and knowledge," she said.

The statistics are staggering. Helping to keep women healthy is the driving force that keeps the Alpha Phi Foundation promoting the understanding and prevention of heart disease.

"I think heart disease is frequently overlooked, but it kills one in three women," Aussenbaugh said. "I am proud to be an Alpha Phi partly because of the awareness we raise with regard to heart health."

Women will have the opportunity to take part in heart-health screenings,

including tests for blood pressure, body mass index, cholesterol and blood sugar. The event also will include town hall-style question and answer sessions in English and in Spanish. Throughout the morning, there will also be interactive workshops on heart-healthy living, including a cooking demonstration and a Zumba class.

Blonde ambition

Jenny McCarthy's in the bathtub at her Fulton River District apartment, circulating a mountain of bubbles with her hands.

It's an appropriate setting for the longtime star: As she gears up for the launch of "The Jenny McCarthy Show" Friday at 9:30 p.m. on VH1, McCarthy, 40, is ready to come clean.

"The thing is, I couldn't have done a talk show before now, because I needed to go through my own life experiences," she says. "I can't fake anything, nor does the audience want that. I'm going into the show saying, 'Here's me, here's all of me.' I am smart, I am dumb, I am secure, I am insecure. I'm all of those things, and hopefully people will see that."

Splash readers who follow her daily blog (Splash.suntimes.com) have caught onto the fact that McCarthy is more complex than you'd expect from a six-time Playboy cover girl: She is street smart, self-aware, sincere. McCarthy is a guy's girl who can tell a raunchy joke or talk football, but also your best girlfriend who is ready to dig into love, life and motherhood.

The show's format is "a cocktail party with celebrities:" a DJ spins, a hunky bottle-boy named Ben serves drinks and go-go dancers perform in the background — until McCarthy and her guests join them on the dance floor as the credits roll. McCarthy says she's hoping viewers want to join the party. "On Friday nights, before you go out you can throw it on, or stay home and drink with me," she says.

She pulls out her laptop to play a test run of the show. It's fast-paced. She's snapping her fingers as she describes jumping between segments and party games — like one in which McCarthy and her guest chat with their heads pressed together as they nestle on the floor, making the show feel like a pajama party.

On other shows, "it's like clap, clap, clap, a teleprompter read of a monologue, scripted bits for two segments," she says. "My show is nonscripted and fun. I think we're going to pull the audience we deserve: a pop-culture loving, US Weekly-reading, hip audience."

VH1 has coined a term for this target: adultsters. To McCarthy, they are people like her "who have to be adults because they have to work and they have kids, but they still want to party and have fun. That's so our generation: putting your kids to bed and crawling out the window and going to a club."

Taping in New York was unavoidable — the show has been in preproduction for two years, and by the time McCarthy moved to Chicago last spring it was too late to shift things here. "The great thing about show business is in success, you can tell them anything you want," she says. "So if my show is a real success, it's coming here and they know it."

Over the next couple of months, McCarthy will fly in and out of New York for tapings. It's a setup that works perfectly for her 10-year-old son Evan, who lives with her in west-suburban Geneva. "The whole goal was to move out here so he could have friends — he didn't have any in LA," she says. "So now we live next door to my best friend Julie and her three boys, and my friend Colleen, and when I'm gone, he has his friends and that's

the way it should be."

On weekends, McCarthy and Evan stay in a penthouse at Trio Apartments where they host football-viewing parties and she enjoys the occasional single girl's night on the town. It's the life she envisioned for herself when she decided to move here almost a year ago.

"One of the things I always say to people when they ask me about the move is that in Los Angeles, I felt like I was looking for my life," she says. "In Chicago, I'm now living my life. Since I've moved here, I've realized this is the way it's supposed to feel. There's supposed to be joy in where you're living."

She's enjoying all aspects of her life here: "I love the sports teams, I love the food, I love the people, I love the nightlife, I love the schools," she says. "Everyone I meet here, I feel like we're related. Chicago people have

an essence about them."

And that is what makes her more than willing to pick up where Oprah Winfrey left off as the city's celebrity face. "If I can help spread word to America how great we are, I will gladly take that job," she says.

To that end, McCarthy has no little plans: "By the end of the summer I'd love nothing more than to be shooting 'The Jenny McCarthy Show' downtown. And then I want my production company to create shows without me in them that highlight Chicago." She's pitching ideas right now such as "Sex and Our City" about the singles' scene, and "Cupid's Assassins," where "a group of tough chicks gets back at girls' boyfriends who cheated on them and hurt them."

If McCarthy has her way, the spotlight will be on Chicago for a long time.

AUTO PALOOZA

SEVEN TRENDS that will define driving in 2013

More than a million people will devour the cornucopia of mechanical delights at this year's Chicago Auto Show. The exposition, which runs from Feb. 9 to 18, is the largest of its kind in North America and, at 105 editions and counting, it's also the longest running.

The bazaar boasts extreme indoor test tracks, charity drives, vehicle giveaways, celebrity appearances and even its own smartphone app. But for all the hoopla, at the core it's still all about the cars. And for attendees, it's the first opportunity to see exotic new features that will soon be standard elements of the driving experience.

With the help of Dave Sloan, the show's general manager and the president of the Chicago Auto Trade Association, we've zeroed in on the trends that will define the cars of the next few years. Buckle up — driving has changed for good.



GROUND-UP REDESIGNS OF OLD FAVORITES

Last year there was the Dodge Viper. This year, leading the charge is the Corvette Stingray, which debuted at the Detroit Auto Show in January. The first 'Vette to sport the hallowed aquatic label since the 1980s, the speedster has been completely redesigned outside and in, sporting a stiffer aluminum frame, leather-and-carbon-fiber dashboard and svelte interior details among many other features.

"It's one of those cars that epitomizes the Chicago Auto Show," Sloan says.

"People love seeing them in person. For some, this may be the first place they've gotten a glimpse of that Corvette."

This is just the beginning: Ford is unleashing an all-new Mustang next year for the legendary car's 50th anniversary.

AUTONOMOUS DRIVING

We've seen vehicles like the Land Rover Evoque and the Nissan Pathfinder parallel park themselves if aligned correctly in front of an open space. But Audi's recently announced Piloted Parking system takes the concept even further, promising to drop you off at the mall, park itself and return to pick you up, all with a swipe of your smartphone. Before we know it, 2040 — the year the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers estimates that 75 percent of cars on the road will be driverless — will be here.

But Sloan urges balance. "It's important to think about Americans and their love of automobiles. While too much time is spent inching along the Kennedy, there's still the steering wheel, the gas pedal and the thrill of the open road."



DRIVER ASSISTANCE

Here's a quick case study in how intelligent cars are getting: The Cadillac XTS's seat vibrates when you veer over the painted lines. The Mercedes-Benz C-Class sounds an alarm when it feels you getting sleepy. The Infiniti JX brakes automatically when someone runs into your path.

"Most of the cars on the road today are 10 years old or older," Sloan says. "And drivers will be surprised at the kind of active safety options that are now available."



PLUGGED IN

Digital radio website Pandora was one of the first to make waves as a hardwired app in the Ford Fiesta. Drivers simply pair their smartphones with their cars, and a selection of musical goodness appears based on their preferences for a certain song or artist. Everyone calls it something different: Ford's Sync, Audi's Connect and Chrysler's similarly named Uconnect. But most vehicles offer comparable options, including phone integration and control, voice commands, entertainment and — get this — Wi-Fi hot spots.



MORE PROGRESS FROM THE AMERICANS

GM and Chrysler quickly emerged from their federally backed Chapter 11 bankruptcy, and the positive uptick continued last fall when Ford announced 1,200 new jobs at its assembly plant in Flat Rock, Mich. Coincidentally, that campus is also unique for handling the necessary steps to manufacture and deliver Mustangs, which lets the American giant save by not having to ship the muscle car all over the country for modifications.

Elsewhere, there's a surge in the compact market (see Chevrolet's Cruze, Sonic and Spark), edging out foreign automakers like Suzuki. "Everyone's getting back into small cars," Sloan says. "And they're not econo-boxes; they're capable cars with great styling and a lot of content."

TITANS OF TRUCKING

The big rumbling around Chicago this year involves the first glimpse of the new Toyota Tundra — a line that hasn't gotten a significant overhaul since 2007. Last year, the 2013 Ram cleaned up at the award shows in the absence

of much competition. But in the fall, Chevrolet/GMC announced a third-generation Silverado and a second-generation Canyon. With rumors of a 2015 Ford F-150 based on this year's Atlas Concept, all the heavy hitters will be in one arena.

"This year is the first time the four big players will all be on the show floor, if you count the Atlas," Sloan says. "It's fun when automakers, even though they have different cadences, go head-to-head."



BIG PERFORMANCE, SMALL PACKAGE

With even tighter EPA regulations on fuel efficiency, car manufacturers are downsizing their engines. (See: Volkswagen and Ford going from the V-4 to the petite V-3.) But that doesn't mean they're losing oomph. By using smarter materials like aluminum, as seen in the Range Rover and the Stingray, manufacturers are shedding weight like wrestlers.

"They've figured out ways with interior packaging, safety and technology to make them lighter but no less safe, all without sacrificing performance," Sloan says. "That's great engineering."



Glunz Tavern honors the past with a contemporary spin

Coq au riesling

Reopening Glunz Tavern felt like a matter of destiny for **Barbara Glunz** and her son, **Christopher Donovan**. The 48-seat Old Town tavern was launched in 1888 by Glunz's grandfather, Louis Glunz I. Prohibition forced its doors shut, and they've remained so since, but the family held onto the space; Glunz grew up above it and now runs the adjoining wine and spirits shop, House of Glunz. She has immersed herself in her grandfather's passions: wine, food and hospitality. "I can see that my whole life has been leading up to this," she says of the opening.

The new incarnation of Glunz Tavern reflects that devotion. It's a comfortable neighborhood spot that manages to feel nostalgic and homey without seeming stale. Relics of the original space abound — Glunz and Donovan preserved the original oak floors and tin ceiling, and they adorned the walls with old family photos and antique signs. But the Tavern's menu, crafted with help from **Butcher & the Burger's Allen Sternweiler**, is a more contemporary take on German, French, American and Austrian classics.

Highlights include the wiener schnitzel and pan-fried spätzle (\$24) and the bleu cheese burger (\$12). Glunz supervised the composition of each dish — she tasted whitefish from three suppliers before choosing one. "If you get really great food, you don't have to do very much with it," she says.

They crafted the drink menu just as deliberately. "You're just as much pairing the drinks with the food as the food with the drinks," says Donovan.

As Glunz culled the wine selection from small distributors around the globe, Donovan handpicked an eclectic assortment of spirits, ranging from the House of Glunz's exclusive Bin #821 blended malt Scotch whisky to Van Winkle Special Reserve. When developing the cocktails — most of which are pre-Prohibition classics — he looked to his great-grandfather's original recipes, including one for a Manhattan that he found scrawled on a cocktail napkin.

Donovan and Glunz say preserving the Glunz legacy is what drives them. "We've put so much of ourselves into it because it's about our family's history," says Donovan. "The brand is us. So it's gratifying to see people respond to that."



Switching gears

Rally race car driver **Bill Caswell** reveals his favorite Chicago pit stops

If the past few years of **Bill Caswell's** life sound like the stuff of movie scripts, that's because they are. From 2004 to 2009, the University of Chicago business school graduate crunched numbers as an investment banker. But after hours and on the weekends, he retreated to the suburbs to tinker with cars in the garage of his mom's Kenilworth home. In June 2009, the recession provided him with the perfect excuse to hang up his suit and focus on his passion full time. Caswell bought a \$500 clunker on Craigslist, fixed it up, entered the World Rally Championship, where he raced against professionals driving cars worth nearly a half a million dollars — and finished third.

Then Hollywood came calling. **Jeremy Renner** (right) bought the rights to his story, and Paramount Pictures will begin production on the film later this year. Caswell moved to San Diego in 2010 to live with his now-wife, Melanie, a dermatologist, but he still flies back to Chicago for one week every month to work in his mom's garage. "I can do car stuff all day, and then have dinner with her," he says. "It's not easy or practical, but I get to sleep right next to the cars and then start working again within minutes of waking up." Not only that, but Caswell craves a dose of his hometown. "I love Chicago not for its tall buildings or its lakefront — it's the people," he says.

When he's not on the track or under a hood, the 39-year-old is busy developing his lifestyle brand, **Build Race Party**, as well as writing for **Jalopnik.com** and **Wired.com**. Next month he'll compete in the World Rally again, but this time around, he'll be driving a new car. While he's in town putting the finishing touches on his ride, we asked him to take us for a Sunday spin.

4 P.M.

To blow off steam, Caswell loves to race go-karts at Chicago Indoor Racing (301 Hastings, Buffalo Grove). It's crowded at night, so he prefers afternoon outings.

5 P.M.

By this point, he's worked up an appetite, so he heads to Zocalo (358 W. Ontario) for dinner. "I can get plenty of Mexican food in San Diego, but this place is always phenomenal," Caswell says.



7 P.M.

Before going back to the suburbs, Caswell and his crew visit Hopleaf (5148 N. Clark) for its "ridiculous selection of kick-ass craft beers."







Pickup wars heat up

Despite high gas prices, full-size pickups are still hot sellers, with 1.6 million sales, and an overall increase of about 9 percent. Domestic pickup trucks accounted for more than 90 percent of those sales, clearly demonstrating when it comes to workhorse pickups, American buyers prefer domestic brands.

With so many sales at stake, all of the domestic automakers have invested plenty of money into updating and improving their trucks.

Here's a look at the domestic pickups' 2012 sales, and their product outlook:

Ram

Ram (formerly Dodge) always has been the underdog in the domestic pickup wars, consistently finishing third behind Ford and Chevrolet. Yet the brand has made some important strides along the way. The "big rig" styling introduced in 1994 and continued to this day changed how pickups look.

The Ram 1500's 2009 redesign added refinement not previously seen in pickups thanks to a

smoother riding coil spring suspension, and included the unique RamBox storage system with cargo space in the bed rails.

Ram upped the ante considerably in 2012 by introducing the 2013 Ram, which is, in our opinion, the most refined pickup on the market.

"We made a ton of improvements when we launched the truck in '09, but we knew no one else was going to stand still," said Bob Hegbloom, director of the Ram brand. So Ram improved its pickup after a short five-model year cycle.

The 2013 Ram 1500 went on sale in October, and the new design helped Ram post a 20 percent year-over-year sales increase, the biggest in the industry by far. Ram also gained 1.9 percent of market share for a total of 18.2 percent.

Chevrolet/GMC

While Ram and Ford have updated their trucks in the past few years, the Chevrolet

truck from hood to hitch," said Maria Rohrer, director of marketing for Chevy trucks.

Ford

The F-Series is the king of the truck market for good reason. Ford redesigned the F-150 in 2009, and revamped the entire engine lineup for the 2011 model year. The star of the engine lineup is the EcoBoost 3.5-liter turbocharged V6 that many believe is the best full-size half-ton pickup engine.

Keeping the F-Series fresh paid off with some 645,316 sales in 2012, up 10.3 percent from 2011. The truck gained 0.4 percent market share to 39.4 percent.

Ford revealed the Atlas Concept vehicle, pointing to a possible design direction for the next F-150. "With 36 years as America's best-selling pickup, we are committed to setting the agenda in the truck market," said Raj Nair, Ford group vice president, global product development.

Silverado and GMC Sierra, which are essentially the same truck, haven't been redesigned since 2007, with little improvement along the way.

Despite being the same for years, both pickups sold well in 2012, but they lost ground to the competition. Sales of the Silverado rose only 0.8 percent and it lost 2.1 percent of market share, dropping to 25.5 percent. The Sierra fared better. Sales were up 5.4 percent and it lost only 0.3 percent market share to finish at 9.5 percent.

The good news is GM showed the redesigned 2014 Chevrolet Silverado and GMC Sierra at last month's North American International Auto Show in Detroit. The new trucks, which are due this summer, look like they will address several of the current models' issues.

Small vehicles get big play at auto show

Small cars are nothing new to the Chicago Auto Show.

Since the rest of the world has been enjoying fine small cars for some time, many of the new U.S. offerings are based on existing overseas products, tweaked for American preferences.

Looking at 2012 sales figures, small cars were some of the largest gainers. Smart, which has had a difficult time finding acceptance with their quirky Fortwo, saw a 92 percent sales increase for the year. Fiat, after a lackluster launch in mid-2011, saw their petite 500 end a successful year with a 59 percent year-over-year increase in December sales. And Toyota's Scion division saw a 49 percent better sales year with help from their city-sized iQ.

Japanese automakers are some of the most seasoned small car veterans. At last month's North American International Auto Show in Detroit, Honda Motor Company's president and CEO Takano Ito said, "I believe that small cars will be our future."

Getting small at Honda isn't limited to cars, as Ito's Detroit comments preceded the introduction of the Urban SUV Concept. Based on the Honda Fit, it is a full nine inches shorter

than the Honda CR-V, and scheduled for production in 2014.

Detroit also saw the introduction of the 2013 Nissan Versa Note, a new hatchback version of the Versa sedan, one of the best-selling subcompacts. Chevrolet found itself with a hit on its hands when it introduced the subcompact Sonic to replace the Aveo, then followed up last year with the even smaller Spark mini car. The 2013 Spark is one of the more versatile tiny cars with a five-door hatchback configuration.

At the Los Angeles Auto Show in November, Chevrolet announced the Spark EV, an all-electric powered Spark going on sale this summer as a 2014 model. Since the electric Spark is an adaptation of an existing gasoline-powered car it's significant as so far the other electric-only highway worthy vehicles available from major automakers at present, the Nissan Leaf and Mitsubishi i, are purpose-built models.

Another already small car launching an electric version is the Fiat 500e. Last month the Environmental Protection Agency rated the Fiat 500e at 108 highway MPGe (how far a vehicle can travel on the electric equivalent of a gallon of gas), which is the highest of any electric vehicle on the U.S. market.







@properties posts record year in 2012

Riding the housing recovery while taking market share from rival firms, Chicago real estate company @properties posted its highest sales volume in company history in 2012. @properties led all city brokers in residential sales for the fourth consecutive year and captured the No. 2 position for market share on Chicago's North Shore.

In the city of Chicago, @properties had reported sales of \$1.988 billion based on 5,088 transaction sides, an increase over 2011 of 34 percent and 31 percent respectively. The firm outpaced the overall market, which experienced year-over-year growth of 19 percent in the number of transactions and 27 percent in dollar volume. @properties finished the year with 38 percent more market share than the No. 2 firm in the city.

On the North Shore, @properties had reported sales volume of \$668.5 million, an increase of 60.6 percent over 2011. Only three years after opening its first North Shore office, the firm steamed into the No. 2 position for market share in the area. @properties' Winnetka location was the top-producing single office on the North Shore in 2012 with sales volume of more than \$335.5 million. The company also opened two new offices: Lake Forest and Highland Park.

Regionally, @properties' total reported residential sales volume for 2012 was \$2.943 billion, third highest among all real estate brokers in Northern Illinois and less than 2 percentage points behind the No. 2 company.

Sales figures are based on closed transactions reported through Midwest Real Estate Data, LLC (MRED), the local multiple listing service. The

data does not include rental transactions or off-market sales. Factoring in those transactions, @properties' 2012 volume exceeded \$3.2 billion, according to company co-founder Michael Golden.

"2012 was a recovery year for housing and we were well positioned to take advantage of the increased activity in the marketplace," said Golden.

"As expected, the investments we made in marketing, training and new offices during the downturn paid major dividends as the market righted itself. We were bullish going into 2012, and things just kept getting better and busier as the year progressed," added Thaddeus Wong, @properties co-founder.

In addition to for-sale residential brokerage, 2012 was a busy year for @properties' other service lines. The company brokered more

than 4,500 rental transactions, expanded its commercial real estate group, and continued to be the city's leading firm for the sales and marketing of new-construction and condo-conversion developments.

@properties' Developer Services division has written more than \$30 million in new contracts since taking over sales and marketing for The Legacy at Millennium Park, a 356-unit high-rise at 60 E. Monroe St., in February 2012. @properties also closed out sales at Six North Michigan across from Millennium Park, and is nearing sellout at Ten East Delaware in the Gold Coast with only four units remaining.

"The demand for new construction is strong, but there is limited inventory. We've been talking to quite a few developers who are looking at putting a shovel in the ground again," said Golden.

Common surprises in real estate dealing

When contingencies are involved, expect the unexpected

Purchase offers usually aren't accepted as written. Commonly, buyers and sellers engage in the equivalent of a tennis match, countering back and forth until they meet a mutually agreeable purchase contract. At this point, you might be inclined to think the negotiation phase of the transaction is over.

That may have been the case decades ago. But the home sale process has become more complicated over the years. Today, it might be more appropriate to say that the negotiations are over when the transaction closes. That is, if there aren't any after-closing issues, like a leaky roof that

wasn't disclosed that could require more negotiation.

After a purchase contract is signed — including all the addenda and counteroffers — it is said to be ratified. A ratified contract is binding on both parties and usually can't be unilaterally changed by one party without agreement from the other party. Any modification to a ratified purchase contract needs to be in writing. Verbal agreements to sell real estate are not binding.

Most purchase contracts include contingencies that provide buyers a time period to comply with certain parts of the transaction. The most common contingencies are for inspections and investiga-

tions, loan approval, appraisal of the property, and the sale of another property.

Usually, if the buyers use their best efforts to satisfy these contingencies but are unable to do so, they can withdraw from the contract without penalty and have their good faith deposit returned to them.

You should fully understand any purchase offer you sign as well as the impact of the buyers removing or not removing contingencies before you sign the contract. Not all contingencies contain the same language.

For example, some inspec-

tion contingencies give the sellers the right to remedy a defect; others allow the buyers to withdraw from the contract for any reason at the end of the inspection contingency period. Any questions should be directed to a real estate attorney.

Even though the ratified contract is legally binding on both the buyer and seller, circumstances can change during the transaction that may result in renegotiation. The most common occurs when the buyers' inspection contingency is due. If buyers' inspections reveal new infor-

mation about the property, the buyers may agree to remove the inspection contingency but only if the sellers repair defects or contribute financially to repairs.

This puts the contract in limbo and requires good faith negotiation to salvage the transaction. Otherwise, the buyers and sellers agree in writing to cancel the contract. The sellers put their home back on the market and the buyers look for another home to buy.

Not all buyers renegotiate the contract when the inspection contingency is due. If the sellers have provided presale inspection reports and thorough disclosures before the buyers made an offer, it's less likely that the buyers will make further requests from the sellers.

Another trigger for further

negotiations can occur when an appraisal ordered by the buyers' lender values the property at a price that's lower than the purchase contract price. The effect of this is that the buyers' lender will lend less than it said it would before the appraisal was done.

Buyers who feel they overpaid for the property may be more inclined to request a reduction to the appraised value and hold firm at that price.

If the sellers won't agree, the transaction will fail.



Are suburban new home sales in comeback mode?

New home building in Chicago's suburbs is finally in come-back mode after a more than five-year slump, a top housing analyst reported.

However, the city of Chicago appears to be running behind the trend, noted housing analyst Tracy Cross of Schaumburg-based Tracy Cross & Associates, Inc.

A total of 2,569 new homes were sold in the 10-county metropolitan Chicago area in the first three quarters of 2012. This translates to a seasonally adjusted, annualized pace of 3,221 units sold, reported Cross.

This annualized sales rate is 11.1 percent higher than the 2,899 sales recorded in all of 2011, and 3.9 percent higher than sales volume of 3,101 units in all of 2010.

However, Chicago posted a seasonally adjusted, annualized rate of only 505 new-homes, townhomes and condominiums sold through the third quarter of 2012, a decline of 10.6 percent over the sales rate of 565 units through the same period in 2011.

In the suburbs, new-home sales activity during the January-through September 2012 period rose 16.4 percent to an annual rate of 2,716 units compared with the 2,334 units sold during the same period in 2011.

The increase in the suburbs was fully due to heighten volume in the single-family detached home sector which moved upward to an annualized pace of 1,664 units through the third quarter of 2012 from 1,218 sales during the same period in 2011, Cross reported.

The average price of a new single-family home sold in the Chicago-area marketplace during the third quarter of 2012 was \$285,135, an increase of 4.8 percent year-over-year.

"To emphasize the upturn

in suburban single-family home sales, 19 developments in the region are now on pace to record 25 or more sales in 2012, including five which are averaging three or more sales on a monthly basis," Cross said.

Through the third-quarter of 2012 following publically held development companies, were leading the suburban home-building revival: Pulte Group (367 sales), D.R. Horton (333 sales), Ryland Homes (242 sales), K. Hovnanian (189 sales), and M/I Homes (184 sales).

"Collectively, these five companies accounted for 51.2 percent of total sales activity in the region as a whole, a rather significant rate of capture considering that there are 116 separate home-building companies currently operating in the Chicago region's production new-home market," Cross said.

Meanwhile, with a rental-apartment construction boom in full swing downtown, there now are only 33 new-construction townhome/condominium developments in active sales mode in Chicago.

"This partially explains the significant drop in new housing sales volume in 2012, compared with 2011 when there were 62 active developments," Cross said. In 2006, at the height of the condominium boom in Chicago, there were 242 developments actively selling condos and townhomes in Chicago.

Despite the dramatic drop-off in city housing sales, Appraisal Research Counselors Ltd. reported several new and converted downtown condominium developments

in Chicago are currently selling well.

Appraisal Research reported that the following downtown buildings were sales volume leaders in the third quarter of 2012:

- 235 W. Van Buren in the Loop. (26 units sold in this new-construction high-rise at an average price of \$310 per square foot).
- 200 North Dearborn in the Loop. (22 units converted apartment units in this high-rise sold at an average price of \$240 a square foot).
- Trump Tower in River North. (21 new units sold in this mixed-use tower at an average price of \$677 per square foot).
- Aqua in the Loop. (19 new units sold in this mixed-use high-rise at an average price of \$514 a square foot).
- Van Buren Lofts in the West Loop. (13 adaptive-reuse loft units sold at an average price of \$199 per square foot).
- One Place in the South Loop. (12 new units sold at an average price of \$312 a square foot).

"Both entry-level and luxury condominium buyers in Chicago have a rather interesting list of choices," noted Gail Lissner, vice president of Appraisal Research. "Prices at these city developments range from \$199 to \$677 per square foot and buyers can choose from adaptive-reuse lofts, high-rise apartment conversions, and both new-construction and mixed-use towers."

Bayside's principal goes bad in 'Breaking Belding'

Mr. Belding transforms from compassionate, rule-following high school principal into a crazed drug lord in "Breaking Belding."

Written by Pete Mandra, the "Saved by the Bell" meets "Breaking Bad" hour-long parody opens Saturday at Gorilla Tango's Skokie Theatre.

The innocent characters of America's beloved '90s sitcom follow the general storyline of "Breaking Bad," minus the extreme violence of the Emmy-nominated drama. After being diagnosed with cancer like "Breaking Bad" high school chemistry teacher Walter White, Mr. Belding teams up with his student Screech to cook meth in Max's Diner — paying homage to Gus Fring at Los Pollos Hermanos in the AMC series.

"The play will show how a disease will change all your ethics and morals," said director Shane Abbott, "how the skills we have can be used for good or bad, how and why you make those choices and continue to make those choices even when things are pretty apparent you're going down the wrong road."

In taking on the role of Mr. Belding, Casey Freund walks a fine line portraying two men in similar situations from polar opposite television shows,

"One of the great things about doing the role, you find where you make the transitions from one role to the other, and also where you combine the two," Freund said.

Abbott cautioned his cast to not directly imitate actors from either show because he wanted a fresh spin for the hybrid play. He admits at first being stumped about how to pull off such a dichotomy.

"It's been an amazing, great directing problem — how to tell the story and how to be faithful to these childhood characters," he said.

Abbott did not want to denigrate the "Saved by the Bell" characters and promises fans will see the original Bayside 6 they grew up watching. Zack Morris is still most concerned

about his hair and making sure Kelly Kapowski goes to the dance with him. Lisa Turtle is worried about money as always. Screech Powers is in love with Lisa. Jessie Spano is the overachiever. A.C. Slater may not be as buff as admirers remember, but he's still A.C. Slater.

"What will be interesting is seeing how people take the 'Breaking Bad' mix in. It's a very adult and complicated issue that you are inserting into a pretty vanilla world," Abbott said.

A melting pot of the rest of the "Breaking Bad" characters, Zack and crew say and do things the drama's followers will recognize from the series. One of the most iconic "Breaking Bad" scenes is when Walter

White tells his wife, "I am not in danger, I am the danger."

"When you hear that within the context of what we're doing in the play it's hilarious," Freund said. "Mr. Belding says that to Kelly. Finding these little gems of comedy amidst a lot of darkness is fun."

Mixing a classic comedy with a modern-day drama also highlights how television has changed over the decades.

"We have gone really far," Abbott said. "With 'Saved by the Bell,' everything got tied up in a nice bow at the end. Whereas 'Breaking Bad,' their problems never seem to get solved. You're yelling at them saying, You can solve these with some 'Saved by the Bell' techniques!"

Abbott, who has directed 10 plays for Gorilla Tango, said "Breaking Belding" is the craziest.

"You can get real highbrow about it and talk about how it's the metamorphosis of man returning back to visit darker roots," he said. "Or you can just say it's a weird play." ■

"Ice skating is the big question mark," Hansen said. If the pond is frozen, it is "such a magical place to skate."



Musicians vanish, gender wars rage at PRCO concert

"The "Farewell" is Haydn's Symphony No. 45, a work unique in that composer's vast output.

It seems that Haydn's patron Prince Esterhazy had kept the court musicians for an extended time at his summer palace. The men, missing their wives, wanted to return home. So in the final movement of the piece, musicians one by one left the stage, until Haydn and his concertmaster were the only ones left.

"The prince got the message," said Edgar Muenzer, founder and music director emeritus of the Park Ridge Civic Orchestra, adding that the whole court moved back to its original home the next day. The orchestra, under his baton, will play Symphony No. 45, complete with vanishing musicians, next Sunday.

The "Kiss" portion of the title refers to Cole Porter's lively 1948 Broadway musical "Kiss Me Kate," excerpts of which will be sung by the husband and wife team of Kathleen and Peter Van de Graaff.

"There will be some wonderful songs," explained Muenzer. "It's Cole Porter's greatest hit and the only of his musicals to run more than 1,000 performances on Broadway." That show won five Tony Awards in 1949, including Best Musical and Best Original Score for Porter. Its 1999 Broadway revival won five more Tony Awards in 2000, including Best Revival



She teaches at Lake Forest College.

Peter Van de Graaff, who recently returned from a seven-concert tour in China, was appointed program director of WFMT in December. He has been a soloist in Salzburg's International Vocal Symposium and sang with the Czech State Symphony, under Paul Freeman. He has appeared with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, the Houston Symphony, the Omaha Symphony, and many other American orchestras, working under conductors such as Pierre Boulez, Thomas Wikman, Jane Glover, Victor Yampolsky, Daniel Hege, and Nicholas Kraemer.

In addition the afternoon program will include Hindemith's powerful "Symphonic Metamorphosis" on Themes by Carl Maria von Weber.

"We had a fundraiser and one of the auction items was the opportunity to choose a piece for our orchestra to play," said Muenzer, who was named 2002 Conductor of the Year by the Illinois Council of Orchestras for his work in Park Ridge. "Our clarinetist Matthew Haster selected the Hindemith and won the bidding. So we are playing that."

The community orchestra has about 60 members, but seven more have been added for this program. "The Pickwick was built as a movie theater, so the stage is not very large," Muenzer concluded. "That's about all the musicians we can fit." ■



You know what to expect in a movie with a title like "Bullet

to the Head," and that's precisely what this brutally hard-hitting testosto-saga delivers — unapologetic carnage unencumbered by anything like redeeming social value. There are a couple of bonuses, though, that up the entertainment value. "Bullet" was shot with old-school style buy '80s action maestro Walter Hill ("48 Hours") and the wisecracks deployed by still-macho-after-all-these-years Stallone are actually kind of funny. The plot is so generic/absurd that it's hardly worth mentioning — as hit man Jimmy Bobo, Stallone teams up with a naïve young detective to bring down an evil real-estate tycoon.

STAND UP GUYS

Christopher Walken, Alan Arkin, Al Pacino, Julianna Margulies

The best thing about "Stand Up Guys" is Al Pacino,

Christopher Walken and Alan Arkin (together for the first time) as retirement-age tough guys out for one last hurrah. Doc (Walken) is living a quiet life of painting sunsets until his best friend Val (Pacino) is released from prison — where he's spent 28 years because he refused to implicate anyone in an armed-robbery shootout. Doc treats Val to an evening of hookers and hardcore partying, but there's a problem. A vengeful mob boss has ordered Doc to kill his friend or die with him. The three Oscar winners make it all work fine, though, despite the extremely improbable places the script takes them, lending far more substance to their characters than this otherwise ho-hum tragic-comic crime drama deserves.

WARM BODIES

Falling in love can be complicated, even if you're not dead. Fortunately, though, in writer/director Jonathan Levine's horror-comedy romance "Warm Bodies," angst-ridden young zombie R (Hoult) isn't going to let a little thing like lifelessness stop him. And the result is the first unexpected charmer of the new year. As charming as a brain-eating zombie movie can be, that is. R falls for Julie (Palmer) after eating the brain of her boyfriend, as his awakened heart slowly restores his humanity in general — along with the rest of the zombie community. That's a game changer for the post-apocalyptic world, where the surviving humans are losing their battle with the zombies and the bonies — a faster, meaner, nastier breed of the living dead.

QUARTET

★★★½

Rated

PG-13 for brief strong language and suggestive humor

Maggie Smith, Tom Courtenay, Billy Connolly, Pauline Collins

"Quartet" is a light piece of work, but it's meant to be that way, with just enough melancholy mixed in to keep the story from turning to treacle. Dustin Hoffman, in his directorial debut, along with an ideal cast, make that delicately balanced formula work to perfection. The film is set in an unbelievably posh, charity retirement home for retired opera performers and classical musicians, where the residents put on a benefit concert each year to help make ends meet. When their resident superstar becomes

ill, it looks like the show is over, until the equally celebrated diva (Smith) reluctantly moves in — much to the dismay of the three singers who used to sing with her in a famed quartet. Smith refuses to sing again, however, and sparks fly with her ex-husband, whom she jettisoned to advance her career.

BROKEN CITY

R for pervasive language, some sexual content and violence

Russell Crowe, Mark Wahlberg, Catherine Zeta-Jones

Dramatically ho-hum, morally abysmal and ridiculously complicated, "Broken City" is the kind of movie where nothing is as it appears, there's a double-twist to just about every character and unrelentingly noir is the name of the game. New York City mayor Hostetler (Crowe) hires Billy Taggart (Wahlberg), a disgraced former detective turned sleazy private eye, to find out who's having an affair with his wife (Zeta-Jones). Or so it seems for about 10 minutes before the surface plot unravels with one nasty complication after another, until the plot threads are so snarled it takes Taggart upwards of an hour to sort things out — and even when he does, things still don't make a lot of sense. Though the deep-noir mood established by director Allen Hughes is some compensation. If "Broken City" were as credible as it is moody and atmospheric, it might be more worthwhile. Unfortunately, it's about as convincing as the mayor's orange tan. ■



Movie Review

'Side Effects' thrilling, but sometimes hard to swallow

It's possible that the cool, cerebral "Side Effects" might be too clever for its own good, but how long has it been since you last saw a movie that really kept you guessing?

Another way to look at it is that you get three or four or five different genres for the price of one movie in this narrative chameleon. Don't like the way the story's going? Don't worry, it will be heading someplace completely different soon.

Directed by Steven Soderbergh ("Magic Mike," "Contagion," "Ocean's Eleven"), who has announced that this will be his final theatrical release before shifting to the greener pastures of TV, "Side Effects" begins as a domestic/medical drama and stays put for a good long while. Lulling us into a false sense of security, story-wise.

The film opens with faithful wife Emily (Rooney Mara, "The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo") preparing to welcome home her husband Martin (Channing Tatum) after he has served five years in prison for insider trading. It's a dismal homecoming, though, because the stress triggers Emily's latent depression and she attempts to kill herself by driving her car into a parking-garage wall.

In the emergency room, she meets sympathetic psychiatrist Dr. Banks (Jude Law), who agrees not to hospitalize her if she will become his patient. Largely based on the recommendation of Emily's former psychiatrist, Dr. Siebert (Catherine Zeta-Jones), Banks prescribes a new

antidepressant named Ablixa and all goes well — until disturbing side effects begin to emerge. First Emily becomes manic, then she starts sleepwalking and then something extremely shocking occurs that results in her being arrested.

After that, "Side Effects" seems to settle into becoming an issues-oriented drama, as Banks learns, too late, about a long history of dangerous side effects associated with Ablixa. Tormented by his conscience, he remains sympathetic to Emily, despite the fact that her arrest is having a very bad effect on his career, his marriage and his psyche.

And then everything changes.

In all the plot twists and turns outlined above, there's no clue whatsoever that "Side Effects" is really something altogether different — a cold-blooded, calculating (and absurdly complicated) crime thriller.

Some may find that revelation a deliciously wicked treat while others may feel that their chains have been rattled shamelessly up to that point by Soderbergh and screenwriter Scott Z. Burns ("Contagion," "The Bourne Ultimatum.") Either way, they'll probably be fascinated to learn the whole story as the denouement plays itself out, while halfway expecting some other development to come along and transform the movie into an 18th-century costume drama.

Spoiler alert: That doesn't happen. ■

Why Do these Companies Hire Veterans?

Answer: Job Skills

You'd think that employers would find a tremendous source of skills in people who can:

- Jump from planes to quickly subdue enemies on the battlefield.
- Collaborate in confined quarters to operate complex nuclear technologies at great ocean depths.
- Simultaneously translate sensitive communications from any of a hundred languages.

And the fact is -- you'd be right.

Veterans of the US Armed Forces are a deep font of talent. In addition to their broad range of technical skills, veterans have a well-deserved reputation for soft skills and admirable qualities.

But matches between highly-skilled veterans and the companies that need them aren't always easy to make. While tools such as the Military Tools Translator and Veterans Talent Index can help, millions of former servicemen and women still have difficulty finding work, especially veterans of the Iraq War.

For those who served post-9/11, the unemployment rate rose to 11.7 percent in September 2011 from 10.2 percent 12 months earlier, according to a Bureau of Labor Statistics report. Meanwhile, even through prolonged recession and stagnation, employers say skilled candidates are often hard to find.

These four employers hire veterans for their diverse job skills:

Prudential: Helping Skilled Veterans with a Challenging Translation

Prudential Financial has found its military recruitment program to be a great investment in human capital. The Armed Forces are renowned for their copious use of acronyms; similar skills may be described in completely different terms in the corporate world.

Cyrell Johnson, an Army veteran, employee of the US Bureau of Reclamation and president of the Student Veterans Organization of Colorado Technical University, completed his service as a Special Forces paratrooper in 2001. He experienced this confusion firsthand. "I found it difficult leaving the military and entering the job market, finding the right job that matched my skills."

Prudential's solution? "We work with organizations that help veterans better communicate their skills to employers," McDaniel says. The US Chamber of Commerce's Hiring Our Heroes campaign is one such program to help companies hire veterans.

Siemens: Large-scale Recruitment for Broad Array of Technical Challenges

Siemens has begun using aggressive military recruitment to fill a large talent gap. "We've had 3,000 open requisitions for a long time in engineering, sales and so on," says Mike Panigel, senior vice president of human resources at Siemens, a global electronics and engineering firm with U.S. headquarters in Washington, D.C. "We've brought in 530 veterans in about a year, from service and field technicians to marketers and project engineers."

Siemens finds veterans to be a superior pool of candidates. "Technicians coming out of the military have worked on complex, expensive, large equipment," says Panigel. "They know how to accomplish a mission and they're diverse. Altogether they are a great source to recruit."

PPL: Mining a Rich and Rare Vein of Nuclear Knowhow

The answer to finding reliable nuclear engineers is clear for energy company PPL Corp.

"Nuclear power is a unique source for electric generation, with lots of safeguards and compliance issues," says Neal Coy, military recruiter with Allentown, Pa.-based PPL. "Navy nuclear vets understand this, because they've dealt with uranium." PPL recruits veterans as plant operators, technicians and instructors, among other roles.

"We target three military bases that house individuals who are likely to have the qualifications for our jobs," says Coy. "We go to military job fairs and participate in Transition Assistance Program classes to talk about the transition to civilian employment and how to interview."


Through the military recruitment process, PPL keeps an eye out for candidates who appear able to overcome the organizational culture shock they will likely face.

Alpine Access: Flexible Work for a Diverse Veteran Workforce

Disabled veterans are another significant labor pool with varied skills to offer private-sector employers.

"We recruit people who might not be able to work outside the home," says Stacey Orin, manager of flex recruiting at Alpine Access, a Denver-based third-party call center whose customer service representatives are home-based.

Orin says veterans have what it takes to put in long shifts, speaking with customers, satisfied and otherwise. "One of the things we look for -- and find -- in veterans is the ability to communicate and to focus on the job at hand," says Orin.






With their opening round loss to Houston in the 2012 NFL playoffs, the Cincinnati Bengals hadn't won a postseason game since 1991, longest drought in the league. But it could be worse. At least the Bengals made it to two Super Bowls in the 1980s. How about the Detroit Lions? Since 1957 – a span of 55 years – the Lions have won exactly one playoff game. Detroit is the only franchise in continuous existence since the start of the Super Bowl in 1967 that has never even appeared in the game.

Detroit is tied for third all time in most consecutive seasons without a playoff win with 33, from 1958 through 1990. New Orleans also went 33 years, from 1967 through 1999. Any guesses which franchise holds the record, and how long it is. The answer is the Cardinals, first in Chicago and then in St. Louis (now in Arizona) – a dreadful 50 years, from 1948 through 1997 without a postseason victory. In second place is Pittsburgh with 37 years (1933 through 1971), winningest team in the Super Bowl era with six titles.

When its members were in eighth grade at Gemini Junior High School, the Maine East girls basketball junior class was well aware of the challenge it was about to undertake.

"We always knew Maine East was losers," Blue Demons junior center Shaylee Sloan said. "Maine Easy, that's what they called us because it was so easy to beat us. And then our eighth-grade year, Maine East's (coaches) came to our school and we were like, 'We want to change it. We want to get a banner and do some things.'"

After two lean years which saw Maine East continue its residence in CSL North's basement, the program's status has been altered this season largely because of the Blue Demons' junior class.

Maine East starts four juniors — Sloan, point guard Jazlene Gonzalez, guard Elanta Slowek and forward Maria Protic — alongside freshman guard Janelle Alba Garner. Those five players play the majority of the minutes at their respective positions and have been able to lift the program out of its futile state.


Maine East is currently 4-5 within the CSL North and is guaranteed to finish above last place in the conference for the first time since joining the league in 1972, according to Blue Demons coach Karol Hanusiak.

Still, Hanusiak knows that her squad, which only has two seniors this season, is capable of accomplishing more.

The fifth-year coach started challenging her

Despite decades of losing and finishing at the bottom of the CSL North, Maine East's current group of juniors expected to change the program. They experienced a great deal of success in eighth grade at Gemini, and have kept that confidence as they spearheaded the program's revival.

"We kind of turned the (Gemini) program around while we were there," Protic said. "We were first in conference, record-wise. We were like, 'We're playing these same girls in high school. There's no reason why we shouldn't be continuing to beat them while we're here.'... We always go back to eighth grade, like 'Do you remember when we did this? We can do that again. Nothing's changed.'" ■

players to elevate the program to new heights in the preseason. Some of those goals, like reaching a regional championship game for the first time in 11 years and winning a regional championship, remain.

Maine East is the No. 8 seed in the Class 4A Loyola Sectional. It opens postseason play in the Evanston Regional against No. 10 Niles West at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday.

"One of the first things we did at the beginning of the season was I said 'Look up at the banners. When's

the last time Maine East has won the conference?' " Hanusiak said. "They were looking and looking. 'Never.' 'Yeah, never. How would you like to have a banner with your year on there? When's the last time Maine East has won a regional championship?' They figured out it was 1982. So, all of these things are in play. This year, we got to double-digit (wins). We're going to keep rolling."

Maine East was 10-14 going into Monday's home game against Ridgewood.



Niles West sophomore Easter adjusting to varsity foes

Niles West almost pulled off one of the shockers of the girls basketball season, taking conference-leader Evanston to overtime before ultimately falling 41-37.

The fact that Evanston was celebrating its Senior Night on Jan. 31, which included an emotional pregame ceremony, may have contributed to the Wildkits' lack of focus.

But the Wolves, who fell to 4-17 overall and 2-7 in CSL South play, certainly played their part. In fact, Evanston head coach Elliot Whitefield said the visitors from Skokie actually deserved to win.

One of the key performers for Niles West was sophomore Julia Easter. The 5-foot-10

forward finished with 12 points, including a pair of three-pointers in the fourth quarter and overtime combined, and seven rebounds.

For much of the contest, Easter was matched up against likely Division I-bound Evanston center Alecia Cooley, who scored just eight points on 4-for-14 shooting. Cooley had nine rebounds as well.

"For a sophomore, (Julia) is really growing into the part of a varsity basketball player," Niles West head coach Tony Konsewicz said. "She's got to play the Cooleys of the world, girls who are seniors. This is baptism under fire. (Easter) is really learning how to use her body defensively, and how to use her speed and quickness. She'll only get quicker and stronger."

Last week's contest between Evanston and Niles West was a far cry from the first meeting of the season between the teams, when the Wildkits won 51-25 on Dec. 14.


Easter termed the rematch with the Wildkits as one of her better performances, and said the game of basketball is slowing down for her. That represents a change from the beginning of the season, when Easter said she was so overwhelmed she had trouble breathing.

Still, Easter said there are times when she gets so caught up in the game or the opponent that she loses focus.

"I'm a young player and sometimes have mental lapses," she said. "I have to work on that during the offseason and season."

Older teammates said they have been pleased with Easter's progress.

"Being a young player, she's picked up good habits," senior guard Molly Kleppin said. "She works hard in practice every day. She really helped us (against Evanston). She hit some huge shots and played some tough defense on posts who are much bigger than her. I'm really proud of her." ■

Nickell will have to swim at or below 48.09 in the

sectional to reach state. Niles West head coach Dan Vander Jeudgt believes the senior is on track to do so.

"We said (to Drake) at (the meet with Evanston), 'You have to go 49 if you want to

get to 48.09. You have to go 49 at this meet before we start your taper, and he did," Vander Jeudgt said. "He's got to go faster to get to state. The qualifying time is unbelievably fast as a flat start. He

swam (49.06) off the relay. I think the possibility (to qualify) is right there for him."


Nickell will start to scale back his training this week in order to be well-rested for the sectional. He's confident that tapering, and shaving, will give him the extra boost he needs to make state, to be held at New Trier Feb. 22 and 23.

"I taper well," Nickell said. "I always drop a second, and I think I'll make it."

In sectionals last season, Nickell dropped time in the 100 butterfly but still came up two seconds short of state qualification. Early this season, Nickell and Vander Jeudt decided the swimmer's focus should be on the 100 free because Nickell was closer to qualification in that event than any other.

Since then, Nickell has done nothing but improve, building up to his season-best time against Evanston.

"This is the fastest he's been," Niles West senior Eric Himmler said. "It's absolutely incredible. It's really great.
