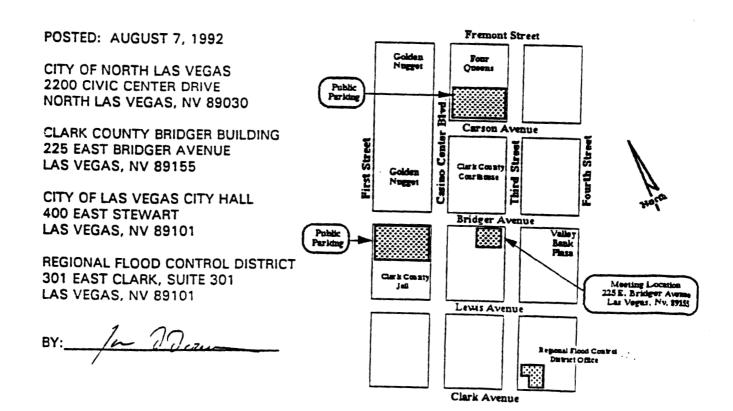

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that staff recommends re-electing Deanna Lefko as Secretary to the Board. Commissioner Woodbury moved to re-elect Michael Harris as Chairman, Thalia M. Dondero as Vice-Chairman, and Deanna Lefko as Secretary. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

- 4A) ACTION TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN A CONTRACT WITH G. C. WALLACE ENGINEERING INC. TO PREPARE A RIGHT-OF-WAY ACQUISITION PLAN FOR THE TROPICANA/FLAMINGO WASHES PROJECT AREA 1

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that staff had negotiated a professional services contract with G. C. Wallace for Area 1 (the northern portion of the project) of the Corps of Engineers' Tropicana/Flamingo Washes Project. The contract was reviewed by the District Attorney's office and staff recommended approval.

Commissioner Goynes moved for approval. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that the contract was for the southern half of the Tropicana/ Flamingo Washes project. Staff had negotiated a professional services contract with Church Engineering of Nevada, Inc., which had been reviewed by the District Attorney's Office. Staff recommended approval.

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that the City of Las Vegas had requested additional funding in the amount of \$50,000 for right-of-way and design engineering costs incurred during the zoning and final preparation of the plans and specifications. The Second Supplemental Interlocal Contract was reviewed by the District Attorney's office and staff recommended approval.

6A) ACTION TO ACCEPT A PRESENTATION FROM CLARK COUNTY ON THE RAWHIDE CHANNEL CROSSING

Denis Cederburg, Clark County Public Works, introduced John Catanese, the Project Manager, who made a presentation to the Board on the proposed Rawhide Channel Crossings at Pecos Road, Sandhill Road, and Mountain Vista Street, planned for construction this Fall.

In Commissioner Dondero's absence, Chairman Harris commented that this project is one which Commissioner Dondero was interested in seeing completed.

Commissioner Woodbury moved to accept the presentation. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

6B) ACTION TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN THE FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF THE RAWHIDE CHANNEL CROSSING

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that staff recommends approval of this request for additional construction funding required for the first phase of this project.

Commissioner Woodbury moved for approval. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

7) ACTION TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN THE INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR DESIGN OF THE SUNSET DETENTION BASIN. COLLECTION SYSTEM AND OUTFALL

Ms. Bax-Valentine explained that this Interlocal Contract will provide pre-design and acquisition funding for the project. Staff recommended approval.

Commissioner Woodbury moved for approval. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

8) ACTION TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN THE INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR DESIGN OF THE RAMPART STORM DRAIN

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that staff recommends approval of the City of Las Vegas' request for \$65,000 to fund the design of the Rampart Storm Drain.

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that staff recommends approval of the Interlocal Contract for the design and right-of-way costs for oversizing the Buffalo Channel. She explained that the project is jointly funded with the Regional Transportation Commission.

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that staff recommends approval of the request to increase funding by \$26,000 for the Gowan Outfall and Conveyance System project.

Denis Cederburg, Clark County Public Works, made the presentation on Phase V of this six-phase project.

Councilman Bletsch moved to accept the presentation. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

11B) ACTION TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN THE INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF THE VAN BUSKIRK CHANNEL PHASE V IMPROVEMENTS

Councilman Bletsch moved for approval. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

VOTE: 6 AYES - 0 NAYS

12) ACTION TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN THE INTERLOCAL CONTRACTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1992/93 ANNUAL MAINTENANCE PROGRAMS IN CLARK COUNTY AND THE CITIES OF BOULDER CITY, HENDERSON, MESQUITE, AND NORTH LAS VEGAS

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that the City of Las Vegas' Interlocal Contract for their Maintenance Work Program had been approved at the previous Board meeting. She explained that approval would synchronize the work plans with the new fiscal year; therefore, ensuring completion of the work during each fiscal year period. Staff recommended approval of the Maintenance Work Programs and the Interlocal Contracts.

Chairman Harris moved for approval and authorization of the contracts. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

VOTE: 6 AYES - 0 NAYS

13) ACTION TO APPROVE A REQUEST FROM THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS FOR A CONTRACT MODIFICATION ON THE BUFFALO CHANNEL - WESTCLIFF DRIVE TO SUMMERLIN PARKWAY

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that the increase in costs will allow the City's contractor to begin working 24-hour shifts on the precast structures, resulting in a minimal disturbance in road access and traffic flow. Staff recommended approval.

Councilman Higginson moved for approval, commenting that this would allow the work to be completed in about two (2) working days. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

14) <u>ACTION TO APPROVE A REQUEST FROM THE CITY OF MESQUITE FOR CHANGE ORDER NO. 2 ON THE TOWN WASH DETENTION BASIN</u>

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that the Town Wash Detention Basin is now complete and this final change-order, for approximately \$76,651.73, brings all the quantities up to what they actually were in the field. Staff recommended approval.

Councilman Leavitt moved for approval. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

III. ADMINISTRATION

15) ACTION TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF A WEATHER RADAR RECEIVER

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that the \$18,175 request is to purchase a special piece of weather-related equipment. She explained that NRS 332.115 paragraph 1 (a), allows the purchase to be exempt from the competitive bidding process. The District Attorney reviewed the item and staff recommended approval.

Councilman Bletsch moved to approve. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

VOTE:

6 AYES - O NAYS

16) <u>ACTION TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF FLOOD WARNING/DATA COLLECTION EQUIPMENT</u>

Ms. Bax-Valentine explained that this purchase, in the amount of \$52,834, is primarily for alert and precipitation gauge equipment. The equipment will be installed during the 92/93 fiscal year. She explained that NRS 332.115 paragraph 1 (d), allows the purchase to be exempt from the competitive bidding process. The District Attorney reviewed the item and staff recommended approval.

Councilman Higginson asked if the equipment is to replace existing equipment. Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that the equipment will be used for new sites.

Councilman Bletsch moved to approve. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

VOTE: 6 AYES - 0 NAYS

17) ACTION TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN A JOINT FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH THE U.S. GEOLOGICAL SURVEY (USGS) FOR THE COLLECTION OF PRECIPITATION AND STREAMFLOW DATA

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that all the combined streamgauge stations are cooperatively funded with the USGS. She explained that the District has an annual contract with the USGS to provide for the maintenance of those stations and the District's portion of the contract for the 92/93 fiscal year is \$112,500. Staff recommended approval.

Chairman Harris moved to approve. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

VOTE: 6 AYES - 0 NAYS

18) <u>ACTION TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF IDENTIFIED COMPUTER</u> EQUIPMENT TO UPGRADE THE DISTRICT'S SYSTEM

Ms. Bax-Valentine explained that the purchase, in the amount of \$41,067.31, will allow for the upgrade of the District's system and improve the GIS system's capacity. Staff recommended approval.

Chairman Harris moved to approve. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

VOTE: 6 AYES - 0 NAYS

19) ACTION TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO SIGN AN INTERLOCAL CONTRACT WITH CLARK COUNTY AND THE REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION FOR REAL PROPERTY LEASE ADMINISTRATION

Ms. Bax-Valentine indicated that a similar item to continue the lease at the District's current location in Clark Place (301 East Clark, Suite 301) is also on the Regional Transportation Commission's agenda. The District's portion of the shared lease is

\$92,740 and the negotiated contract would extend the current lease for three years. Ms. Bax-Valentine added that in a subsequent agenda item there would be a presentation on other available options. Staff recommended approval of this lease.

Chairman Harris commented that the Board did not have many choices on this particular item. Councilman Higginson asked for clarification on the lease and leasing options. Ms. Bax-Valentine explained that the contract is for a sub-lease with Clark County, which actually holds the lease with Clark Place. She further explained that during discussions held with Clark County, it was conveyed that should the District decide to relocate sometime in the future, the County would have no problem occupying the vacated offices. The arrangement was relatively flexible for the District.

Councilman Goynes moved to approve the lease. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

VOTE: 6 AYES - 0 NAYS

20) RECEIVE A REPORT ON THE STATUS OF LEASED OFFICE SPACE AND PROJECTED SPACE NEEDS; DIRECT STAFF AS DEEMED APPROPRIATE

Chairman Harris inquired if the RTC and RFCD were going to present a unified report, or if each planned to present a separate report. He called for a legal opinion concerning acceptance of a unified report. Chris Figgins, Deputy District Attorney, commented that Mr. Weinrich could participate in the District's presentation. Chairman Harris commented that this would facilitate action of the RTC's agenda item on the same subject.

Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that four alternatives were identified for future shared office space for the RFCD and RTC. The options were expanded upon in both the agenda back-up and a hand-out titled "Analysis of Option 4." Ms. Bax-Valentine made the presentation, reiterating the written information presented to the Board. She requested that the Board narrow down the alternatives and direct staff to further investigate the second and third alternatives: buying a building versus buying and renovating. She explained that with direction from the Board, staff would be able to provide the Board with firmer costs and timing schedules at a later date.

Councilman Higginson commented that alternatives two or three would be the most viable ones to explore, stating that it would be wise to discontinue leasing as it does not generate anything of value. He pledged the City's efforts and Redevelopment Office staff to assist in locating land and/or a building near the County Government Complex or downtown Las Vegas. Upon Chairman Harris' suggestion and Councilman

Bletsch's concurrence, Councilman Higginson stated that the District could also make an application for funding assistance through the City's Redevelopment Offices. Furthermore, he would assist in arranging a joint meeting to begin the process of looking at the alternatives.

Councilman Bletsch added that today's real estate climate is the very best to begin moving on this project. She further stated that both the RFCD and the RTC need more space, and will continue to grow. With this in mind, she suggested that it may be advantageous to overbuild, renting the excess space to another entity until the space is needed by staff. Councilman Bletsch said that staff should consider building their own meeting chambers, which could also be used by their renters, and to build plenty of parking.

Councilman Higginson asked if parking needs were considered, or if the calculations were based solely on the square footage of office space required. Ms. Bax-Valentine answered that it was for office space requirements.

Chairman Harris agreed that options two and three would be the best to pursue, adding that it would be conducive to relocate the District and the Commission into their own space, the only restriction being that the entities remain downtown.

Responding to Chairman Harris' question concerning whether or not authorization for RFPs would be in order, Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that at this time, it was staff's intention to give the status report and request specific direction on which alternative to pursue. She indicated that an RFP was not required at this stage of investigation.

Councilman Higginson motioned that staff proceed to further investigate the second and third alternatives. Additionally, he suggested staff schedule a presentation for the October or November Board meeting, at which time the alternatives would be reviewed and more specific direction given.

Councilman Goynes inquired if this Board was going to vote before hearing from the RTC, since he was interested in the RTC's point of view as compared to the District's. Kurt Weinrich, Director of the Regional Transportation Commission, addressed the Board stating that his staff had worked very closely with Ms. Bax-Valentine and her staff to develop these alternatives, and had reviewed the numbers associated with each option, particularly looking at RTC's future space needs. Mr. Weinrich stated that he and his staff "whole-heartedly concur" in the report presented by the District and will take any direction this Board gives at this time.

Councilman Higginson restated his motion for staff to proceed with alternatives two and three, to meet with City staff to start developing some alternatives, and to bring them back to this Board at the time staff feels they are ready. There being no further discussion, the motion carried.

21) RECEIVE A REPORT ON AN AWARD PRESENTED BY THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES FOR THE DISTRICT'S FLOOD SAFETY AND INFORMATION PROGRAM

Chris Figgins, Deputy District Attorney, stated that upon review of the NRS governing the District, if a unanimous approval between the Board and the entity in which jurisdiction the project is being built is obtained, the project can proceed. Otherwise, each entity within the hydrographic area (defined as meaning "the drainage basin of a stream and its tributaries as described on the Master Plan) must individually approve the project.

Since the wording warranted either a very broad or very narrow interpretation of hydrographic area, Chairman Harris requested that an agenda item be presented at the next Board meeting which would suggest how this could be addressed at the next Legislative Session of the State. Ms. Bax-Valentine stated that staff will prepare the item as requested.

There being no further business, Chairman Harris adjourned the meeting at 9:24 a.m.

EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Clark County Regional Flood Control District (CCRFCD) desires to have a Master Plan Update prepared for the Moapa Valley. The study area is located approximately seventy miles northeast of Las Vegas, Nevada, and includes the communities of Moapa, Glendale, Logandale and Overton. The presently adopted Master Plan for the Moapa Valley consists of a system of levees, dikes, channels, storm drains, bridges and flood plain management. This update will review the adopted plan, evaluate other alternatives, include designs that have been undertaken and produce a document that approaches a predesign of the flood control facilities for Moapa Valley.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

TASK I PROJECT MANAGEMENT

A. PROJECT INITIATION

Subtask I.A1. Meet once with CCRFCD staff for an initial project meeting to be held within 15 days of the Notice to Proceed.

B. PROJECT MONITORING AND REPORTING

Subtask I.B.1. Monitor project progress, conduct up to 7 monthly status meetings at CCRFCD office, prepare and distribute minutes.

C. PROJECT PRESENTATION

- Subtask I.C.1. Attend two meetings each of the Moapa Town Advisory Board, the Glendale Town Advisory Board and the Moapa Valley Town Advisory Board.
- Subtask I.C.2. Present the Draft Master Plan Update and Final Master Plan Update to the Moapa Town Advisory Board, the Glendale Town Advisory Board and the Moapa Valley Town Advisory Board.
- Subtask I.C.3. Present Final Master Plan Update to the Technical Advisory Committee, the Citizen's Advisory Committee, and the Clark County Regional Flood Control District Board.

Subtask II.C.1. Review design efforts underway or completed since the last update including the West Levee on the Muddy River, Logan Wash Diversion Berm and Channel, and Cooper Crossing Improvements.

TASK III HYDROLOGIC AND HYDRAULIC ANALYSIS

A. UPDATE EXISTING HYDROLOGY MODELS

- Subtask III.A.1 Review existing HEC-1 model for the Lower Moapa Valley and update hydrologic parameters as needed to comply with the "Hydrologic Criteria and Drainage Design Manual". A new statistical analysis of the Glendale gage on the Muddy River will not be performed. The study area for the Lower Moapa Valley will include the area between the Nevada Fish and Wildlife Diversion Dam and the Wells Siding Diversion Structure.

- Subtask III.B.2 Develop flood control alternatives for the Upper Moapa Valley for the communities of Moapa and Glendale. This is to include preliminary facility sizing, project hydrology, hydraulics necessary for sizing facilities, right-of-way needs, and planning level cost estimates.

TASK IV RECOMMENDATIONS AND REPORTS

A. PROVIDE RECOMMENDED FACILITIES PLAN

Subtask IV.A.1 Provide a recommended facilities plan for both the Upper and Lower Moapa Valley to include facility size, location, appurtenances, alignment and permitting concerns.

- Subtask IV.B.1. Develop planning level cost estimates for the facilities in the recommended plan including construction, land acquisition, engineering and administration.
- Subtask IV.B.2. Develop a construction phasing plan to provided balanced flood control protection for the Upper and Lower Moapa Valley and to ensure compatibility between projects during the construction phase.

C. DEVELOP ROW ALIGNMENTS AND DESCRIPTIONS

- Subtask IV.C.1 For facilities in the recommended plan, develop alignments and right-of-way requirements.
- Subtask IV.C.2. Provide maps and legal descriptions for all right-of-way necessary to construct the recommended facilities. Preliminary plan and profile sheets will be developed for all Phase I facilities using available topographic mapping. Environmentally sensitive areas impacting flood control facilities will be identified.

D. EVALUATE IMPACT ON DESIGNATED FLOOD HAZARD AREAS

Subtask IV.D.1. Identify areas removed from designated flood hazard areas by the recommended plan.

F. PREPARE FINAL REPORT

- Subtask IV.F.1. Prepare and deliver to the CCRFCD 25 copies of the Draft Master Plan Update for the Moapa Valley including base mapping, hydrology models, hydraulic calculations and appendices.
- Subtask IV.F.2. After receipt of written comments from the CCRFCD, prepare and deliver 50 copies of the final Master Plan Update for the Moapa Valley.

The fee for services will be based on salary cost plus 140% of said salary costs. AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CLARK COUNTY REGIONAL FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT AND

JAMES M. MONTGOMERY, CONSULTING ENGINEERS, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this _____ day of _____ 1992, by and between the CLARK COUNTY REGIONAL FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT") and James M. Montgomery, Consulting Engineers, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "CONSULTANT"), for the preparation of a flood control Master Plan update for the Moapa Valley (hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT desires to develop an updated hydrologic analysis and Master Plan for the Moapa Valley, and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT is experienced and is knowledgeable in the preparation of such master plans, and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT and the DISTRICT recognize the need to coordinate the PROJECT with the agencies in the Las Vegas Valley with flood control jurisdiction, FEMA, and the Corps of Engineers, and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT is properly registered and qualified in accordance with the Nevada Revised Statutes and has the personnel and facilities necessary to accomplish the PROJECT within the required time, and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to set forth the responsibilities, terms, and conditions of completing the PROJECT,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and terms contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION I

RESPONSIBILITY OF CONSULTANT

A. The CONSULTANT shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion, and coordination of all services furnished by the CONSULTANT, its subcontractors and subconsultants and its and their

principals, officers, employees, and agents under this AGREEMENT. In performing the specified services, CONSULTANT shall follow practices consistent with generally accepted professional and technical engineering standards.

В. It shall be the duty of CONSULTANT to assure that all work products are technically sound and in conformance with all pertinent and current federal, State, and local statutes, codes, ordinances, resolutions, including NRS 543 and other regulations--in particular, the Federal Endangered Species Act. If, during the term of this contract, there are any changed or new laws, ordinances, statutes, rules, or regulations not known or foreseeable at the time of signing this contract which become effective and which effect the cost or time of performance of the contract, CONSULTANT shall immediately notify DISTRICT in writing and submit detailed documentation of such effect in terms of both time and cost of performing the contract. Except for an extension of time, no payment or compensation of any kind shall be made to consultant for damages caused by such changed or new laws, ordinances, statutes, rules, or regulations, including, but not limited to, those which may arise due to delay, disruption, acceleration, or inefficiency. Upon concurrence by DISTRICT as to the effect of such changes, an adjustment in time of performance and/or compensation for an increase or decrease in labor, materials, and equipment directly required to be in compliance will be made. If any discrepancy or inconsistency should be discovered between the contract and any law, ordinance, regulation, order, or decree, CONSULTANT shall immediately report the same in writing to DISTRICT, who will issue such instruction as may be necessary. The CONSULTANT shall, without additional compensation, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in its recommended plans, policies, designs, drawings, and other sections of the PROJECT. It is also understood and agreed by both parties that if any variation in measurements, calculations, or observations of a quantity due to mistakes by CONSULTANT hereinafter referred to as "erroneous work," is found, the CONSULTANT will expeditiously perform the necessary work, at no expense to the DISTRICT, to correct the erroneous work. The reviewing process by the DISTRICT during the progress of the PROJECT will not relieve the CONSULTANT's obligation for erroneous work in the preparation of the different section of the PROJECT. Any revisions or

updates of the PROJECT after submittal would be considered outside the scope of services for this agreement.

- C. The CONSULTANT will be responsible for holding monthly progress meetings with the DISTRICT. Minutes of these meetings and a summary of the PROJECT status will be submitted by the CONSULTANT to the DISTRICT with each monthly invoice for professional services.
- D. It is agreed that any and all documents prepared and submitted by the CONSULTANT to the DISTRICT, and all information required of the CONSULTANT by the AGREEMENT, become the property of the DISTRICT. The CONSULTANT may retain copies and reproducible copies of all documents produced as a result of the PROJECT. In the event of the termination of the AGREEMENT, all documents produced shall be and become the property of the DISTRICT. The CONSULTANT agrees to surrender all such documents to the DISTRICT.
- E. The CONSULTANT agrees that its officers and employees will cooperate with the DISTRICT in the performance of services under this AGREEMENT and will be available for consultation with the DISTRICT at such reasonable times and with advance notice so as to not conflict with their other responsibilities.
- F. The rights and remedies of the DISTRICT provided for under this section are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under other sections of the AGREEMENT.

SECTION II DISTRICT'S RESPONSIBILITY

A. The DISTRICT agrees that its officers and employees will cooperate with CONSULTANT in the performance of services under this AGREEMENT and will be available for consultation with CONSULTANT at such reasonable times with advance notice as to not conflict with their other responsibilities.

- B. The services performed by CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT shall be subject to review and approval by DISTRICT General Manager. The DISTRICT General Manager may delegate any or all of the General Manager's responsibilities under this AGREEMENT to appropriate staff members, and shall so inform CONSULTANT by written notice before the effective date of each such delegation.
- C. The services to be performed by the CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT shall be subject to periodic review by DISTRICT's General Manager. The review comments of DISTRICT's General Manager shall be reported in writing to the CONSULTANT by the DISTRICT's General Manager. To prevent an unreasonable delay in the CONSULTANT's work, the DISTRICT's General Manager will endeavor to examine all documents and will make authorizations in writing to the CONSULTANT to proceed with work within 10 working days of receipt of such documents. It is understood that the DISTRICT's representative's review comments do not relieve the CONSULTANT from the responsibility for the professional and technical accuracy of all work delivered under this AGREEMENT.
- D. DISTRICT shall, without charge, furnish to or make available for examination or use by the CONSULTANT as it may request, any relevant data which the DISTRICT has available, including as examples only and not as a limitation:
 - 1. Copies of reports, maps, plans, surveys, records, and other documents pertinent to flooding, flood control facilities, public properties, property developments, and other physical features related to the PROJECT.
 - 2. Copies of previously prepared reports, publications, design hydrologic and hydraulic data, flooding information, flooding data, rainfall/runoff data, representative local drainage requirements (i.e. subdivision, planning and zoning regulations, ordinances, codes, criteria, and special agreements or procedures), analysis and computation manuals, computer programs, other documents and information related to the PROJECT and services specified by this AGREEMENT. CONSULTANT shall return original data provided by the DISTRICT.

- E. Upon written request from the CONSULTANT, the DISTRICT shall reasonably assist CONSULTANT in obtaining data and documents from public officers or agencies and from private citizens and business firms whenever the DISTRICT determines that such material is necessary for the completion of the services specified by this AGREEMENT. DISTRICT shall provide the CONSULTANT with a list of names of individuals, agencies, or any other parties that should receive written communication related to the PROJECT from the CONSULTANT.
- F. CONSULTANT will not be responsible for accuracy of information or data supplied by the DISTRICT or other sources, but will use such data to the extent such information or data would be relied upon by a reasonably prudent professional engineer.

SECTION III SCOPE OF WORK

- A. Services for the PROJECT to be performed by the CONSULTANT shall consist of the work described in Exhibit A which is attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this AGREEMENT.
- B. The DISTRICT may at any time, by written order, make changes within the general scope of this AGREEMENT and in the services or work to be performed by CONSULTANT. If such changes cause an increase or decrease in the CONSULTANT's cost or time required for performance of any services under this AGREEMENT, an equitable adjustment shall be made and this agreement shall be modified in writing accordingly. Any claim of the CONSULTANT for adjustment under this clause must be asserted in writing within 30 days from the date of receipt by the CONSULTANT of notification of changes unless the DISTRICT grants a further period of time before the date of final payment under this AGREEMENT.
- C. No services for which an additional compensation will be charged by the CONSULTANT shall be furnished without the written authorization of the DISTRICT.

SECTION IV COMPENSATION AND TERMS OF PAYMENT

- A. Once each month, the DISTRICT shall pay the CONSULTANT for services performed under Section III, Scope of Work. Invoices are prepared and submitted on a monthly basis and are due upon receipt. Payment is past due thirty (30) days from the invoice date. In the event the District fails to make any payments, the CONSULTANT may cease work immediately until payment for the invoice and service charge is made. An additional charge at the rate of 1-1/2 percent per month will be charged against invoices which are past due.
- B. Compensation and Method of Payment for Engineering Services are:
 - The DISTRICT shall pay the CONSULTANT on a time and materials basis under the CONSULTANT's fee schedule which is attached hereto as Exhibit B and by this reference made a part of this AGREEMENT.
 - 2. The maximum cost to the DISTRICT for engineering services accomplished under this AGREEMENT shall not exceed \$120,000 unless the DISTRICT receives a written request, with justification, and the DISTRICT approves a change in scope and an increase in compensation. If approved, a supplement to this AGREEMENT must be executed. An estimated cost based on a detailed breakdown of the cost by tasks, and direct costs is shown on Exhibit C, which is attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this AGREEMENT. The cost figures presented in Exhibit C are only estimates, and are not intended to limit the compensation to be paid for any individual task. Payments will be made to the CONSULTANT on a monthly basis upon receipt of a progress report and itemized invoices for work accomplished.

SECTION V TIME AND PERFORMANCE

- A. The Project Schedule for work under this AGREEMENT is attached as Exhibit D and by this reference made a part of this AGREEMENT. Work shall begin immediately upon receipt by the CONSULTANT of Notice to Proceed by the General Manager. All work shall be completed 260 calendar days from the executed date of this AGREEMENT. The CONSULTANT will provide the DISTRICT's representative a progress report in conjunction with the monthly invoice.
- B. The DISTRICT and CONSULTANT recognize the scope of work as detailed in Exhibit A--SCOPE OF SERVICES and as outlined in Exhibit D--Time Schedule can be altered by unforeseen events which may occur. Therefore, a supplement to this AGREEMENT will be prepared, negotiated, and executed when the CONSULTANT establishes, and the DISTRICT agrees, that there has been, or is to be a significant change, including but not limited to:
 - 1. Scope, complexity, or character of the services to be performed such as additional meetings and coordination over those identified in Exhibit D, analysis of additional alternatives, or preparation of additional reports.
 - Conditions under which the work is required to be performed, such as a change in standards or a change in available base data which would require additional work.
 - 3. Duration of work if the time period for completion of the work warrants such adjustment.
- C. An alteration required by the DISTRICT which results in changes in the scope of work will also be specified in a supplemental AGREEMENT which will set forth the nature and scope thereof and payment therefor.
- D. Neither party shall be considered in default in the performance of its obligations hereunder, or any of them, to the extent that performance of such obligations, or any of them is prevented or delayed by any cause, existing or future, which is beyond the

reasonable control of such party. Delays arising from the actions or inactions of one or more of CONSULTANT's principals, officers, employees, agents, subcontractors, subconsultants, vendors, or suppliers are expressly recognized to be within the CONSULTANT's control.

SECTION VI MISCELLANEOUS

- A. The CONSULTANT and its subconsultant(s) shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting reports, and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred and/or work performed and that such evidence shall be made available for inspection by the DISTRICT at all reasonable times during the AGREEMENT period and for three years from the date of final payment.
- B. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by either party by seven (7) calendar days' written notice in the event of substantial failure to perform in accordance with the terms hereof by the one party through no fault of the other party. If said termination occurs prior to completion of the PROJECT, the CONSULTANT shall deliver to the DISTRICT all documents, calculations, and all other work performed whether complete or incomplete. Thereafter, the DISTRICT will reimburse the CONSULTANT for all services performed prior to such notice, provided the services performed are satisfactory to the DISTRICT. Termination shall be by written notice, which will be sent by certified mail. Such notice will be deemed effective after the third business day of the mailing post date, or hand delivered, in which case such notice will be deemed effective upon receipt of the written termination to the CONSULTANT or the DISTRICT.
- C. The CONSULTANT does hereby agree to indemnify, defend, and save harmless the DISTRICT from loss, damage, liability, cost, or expense caused by the CONSULTANT, its employees, agents, or consultants and/or subconsultants arising out of the negligent acts, errors, omissions, or intentional misconduct of the CONSULTANT in connection with this AGREEMENT.

- D. During the life of this AGREEMENT, the CONSULTANT shall not engage the services of any person or persons who are currently employed by the DISTRICT without the DISTRICT's prior approval.
- E. The CONSULTANT shall at all times maintain control over and have complete responsibility for all work performed under the AGREEMENT. Any attempted assignment or rights or delegation of duties under this AGREEMENT, without the written consent of the DISTRICT, shall be void.
- F. The CONSULTANT shall submit for review and documentation purposes copies of all subconsultant agreements.
- G. The CONSULTANT shall place his professional engineer stamp on the final master plan update substantiating that the work has been accomplished under the direct supervision of a professional engineer and in accordance with acceptable professional standards.
- H. The CONSULTANT, at its own expense, shall obtain and maintain, for the duration of the Contract, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property or other losses which may arise from or in connection with CONSULTANT negligence or fault in the performance of the work hereunder by the CONSULTANT, his agents, representatives, employees, or subcontractors of any tier.

The CONSULTANT will provide the DISTRICT with certificates of insurance for coverage as listed below and endorsements, establishing coverage required by this Contract within ten calendar days after approval by the DISTRICT'S Board. The certificate of endorsements for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer and licensed by the State of Nevada.

The CONSULTANT will:

 Maintain commercial general liability coverage at limits of no less than \$10,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence and \$10,000,000 annual aggregate for bodily injury (including death), personal injury and property damages. The coverage shall be on an "occurrence" basis only and not on a "claims made" basis; and the coverage must be provided on ISO commercial liability or on ISO broad form comprehensive general liability forms with no exceptions to the coverage for bodily injury, personal injury, board form property damages, premises operations, severability of interest, products and completed operations, contractual and independent contractors. The DISTRICT, its officers, employees and volunteers must be expressly covered as additional insureds.

- 2. Maintain automobile coverage at limits of no less than \$10,000,000 combined single limit "per accident" for bodily injury and property damage for all owned automobiles, non-owned automobiles, hired automobiles, or any automobile. The DISTRICT, its officers, employees, and volunteers must be expressly covered as additional insureds.
- 3. Maintain professional liability insurance at limits of no less than \$10,000,000 per occurrence and \$10,000,000 annual aggregate to insure against claims for losses arising out of the services rendered by the CONSULTANT, its agents, representatives or employees pursuant to the CONSULTANT'S Contract with the DISTRICT. "Claims made" insurance coverage will continue for a period of three years beyond the term of the Contract. Any retroactive date must coincide with or predate the date of the Contract and may not be advanced without the DISTRICT'S consent. The CONSULTANT'S professional liability insurance must provide coverage for the CONSULTANT'S subcontractor if the subcontractor does not maintain professional liability insurance in the same amounts and manner as required for the CONSULTANT.

All deductibles and self-insured retention shall be fully disclosed in the certificate of insurance. No deductible of self-insured retention may exceed \$250,000 for commercial general liability, \$0 for automobile, or \$3,000,000 for professional liability without the written approval of the DISTRICT. If aggregate limits are imposed on bodily injury and property damage, then the amount of such limits must not be less than twice the amount of the limits required herein. All aggregates must be fully

disclosed and the amount entered on the required certificate of insurance. Any notice given to the CONSULTANT with respect to exhaustion of limits of insurance shall also be sent to the DISTRICT. The adequacy of the insurance supplied by the CONSULTANT, including the rating and financial health of each insurance company providing coverage, is subject to the approval of the DISTRICT.

- Maintain Nevada Industrial Insurance and Occupational Disease Acts; such insurance will protect it and the DISTRICT from claims made by the CONSULTANT due to work related injuries.
- 5. The CONSULTANT'S insurance shall be primary as respects the DISTRICT, its officers, employees, and volunteers. Any other coverage available to the DISTRICT, its officers, employees and volunteers shall be excess over the insurance required of the CONSULTANT.

The insurance requirements specified herein do not relieve the CONSULTANT of his responsibility or limit the amount of his liability to the DISTRICT or other persons and the CONSULTANT is encouraged to purchase such additional insurance as it deems necessary.

- 6. The insurance certificate supplied by the CONSULTANT must provide for a 30-day notice to the DISTRICT before the implementation of a proposal to cancel the required insurance coverage. This notice requirement does not waive the insurance requirements contained herein. In addition, CONSULTANT shall notify DISTRICT within 30 days of any reduction in coverage or limits.
- 7. If the CONSULTANT fails to maintain any of the insurance coverage required herein, then the DISTRICT will have the option to either terminate the Contract; declare the CONSULTANT in breach; purchase replacement insurance; or pay the premiums that are due on existing policies in order that the required coverage may be maintained. The CONSULTANT is responsible for any expenses paid by the DISTRICT to maintain such insurance and the DISTRICT may collect the same from the

CONSULTANT or deduct the amount paid from any sums due the CONSULTANT under this Contract.

J. PROJECT Staffing

CONSULTANT shall provide the DISTRICT with a list of the CONSULTANT's employees who will be performing work on the PROJECT. This list shall indicate the employee's name, classification, and hourly billing rate. This list will be used by the DISTRICT in reviewing and evaluating changes as a result of CONSULTANT's fiscal year increases (decreases) will be provided to the DISTRICT.

K. Governing Law

Nevada law shall govern the interpretation of this AGREEMENT.

L. Notice

Any notice required to be given hereunder shall be deemed to have been given when received by the party to whom it is directed by personal service, hand delivery, or U.S. mail at the following addresses:

BACKGROUND:

This Supplemental Agreement amends the Scope of Work for environmental services provided for under the Agreement dated August 18, 1988 between the District and Dames & Moore. The Scope of Work is amended to include the preparation of Environmental Assessments (EA) for the flood control facilities identified for the Goodsprings and Searchlight areas. The need for project-specific environmental analyses for these facilities was identified in the programmatic Outlying Areas Environmental Assessment prepared by Dames & Moore. The Board authorized a Supplemental Agreement with Dames & Moore for the preparation of the Outlying EA on October 10, 1991.

The estimated cost for the preparation of the two EAs is \$75,897. Under the existing Agreement with Dames & Moore, the total cost of services contracted for is \$1,227,996. Due to agency acceptance of plans developed by Dames & Moore and the District, many of the contracted services are no longer necessary. Additionally, other contracted services have been completed at a lesser cost than was estimated. Owing to these facts, the services identified in this Supplemental Agreement can be provided without increasing the cost of the contract.

The Clark County Regional Flood Control District (District) has requested a proposal from Dames & Moore for two work efforts: (1) the preparation of a site-specific Environmental Assessment (EA) of impacts resulting from implementation of the District's Flood Control Master Plan in the town of Goodsprings, Nevada and (2) preparation of a similar document addressing the town of Searchlight, Nevada. These studies were determined to be necessary in the analysis completed for outlying Clark County Flood Control Projects. In addition, this amendment addresses changes in the scope of work since the original contract between the District and Dames & Moore was executed in 1988. Our work scopes and estimated costs are outlined below.

I. GOODSPRINGS & SEARCHLIGHT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS

The Clark County Regional Flood Control District's Flood Control Master Plan recommends a combination of detention basins, channels, levees, and designated floodways throughout Clark County to decrease peak flows in the major washes and improve conveyance capacities. Implementation of some of the features in the Master Plan would require rights-of-way on federal lands; an EA must be completed before applications for those rights-of-way can be processed. These site specific EAs will address the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), as addressed by the programmatic EA process developed by the District and accepted by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

The tasks, schedule and costs presented in this proposal are based on experience Dames & Moore has acquired in the preparation of numerous EAs in Clark County. Assumptions regarding the scope of work required are outlined in the following sections.

A. Scope of Work

Each EA process will consist of the following 11 tasks:

- 1. Project Start-Up/Public Meeting
- 2. Baseline Inventory
- 3. Impact Assessment and Mitigation Planning

- 4. Draft EA Preparation
- 5. BLM Review of the Draft EA
- 6. Revise and Finalize EA
- 7. BLM Compliance Check
- 8. Print EA
- 9. Notice of Availability and Public Review Period
- 10. BLM Decision Record
- 11. Progress Meetings

Task 1: Project Start-Up

Project start-up will begin immediately upon authorization to proceed from the District. Dames & Moore will:

- prepare the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the District and the BLM
- conduct a project start-up meeting with the District, Dames & Moore, BLM, Clark County Department of Public Works, the appropriate Town Board, and other involved agencies identified by the BLM and the District
- advertise and hold a public meeting to receive comments relevant to the preparation of the EA
- prepare a written project description, including committed mitigation measures based on specific information provided by the District
- prepare an outline of the EA, to be approved by BLM
- prepare a management plan presenting available data, maps, schedules, formats and procedures for completing the EA to be provided to the District and Dames & Moore study teams



Task 2: Baseline Inventory

Using the Outlying EA as a base, the project study team will compile a baseline inventory of environmental resources and data for the following disciplines or resource concerns:

air quality
geotechnical resources (geology, soils and seismicity)
mining and claims research
water resources and floodplains
hazardous and solid waste
biological resources
land use and jurisdiction (including recreation and transportation)
visual resources
socioeconomics/public safety issues
cultural resources (archaeology, history, and Native American resources)
paleontological resources

Most of the inventory will be compiled from existing data sources, primarily the Environmental Assessment of Outlying Clark County, but previous EISs and EAs, maps, reports and literature may also be used. Agencies will be contacted as appropriate for information. Field reconnaissance is expected to be limited to evaluations for hazardous materials, biological resources, cultural resources, and paleontological resources.

The Outlying EA baseline inventory and the most current project description will be used as the basis for assessing impacts and planning mitigation strategies.

Task 3: Impact Assessment and Mitigation Planning

Potential impacts of the proposed flood control facilities will be assessed for each resource of concern.

Mitigation measures that could reduce or avoid impacts were identified in the outlying EA, based on potential for impacts. Mitigation discussions will be similar to those in the EIS prepared for

the Master Plan flood control facilities and include regulatory or permitting processes required for specific projects (including Section 7 consultation for threatened and endangered species; Section 106 consultation for cultural resources and preliminary site assessments for hazardous materials).

Potential cumulative impacts of the project will be characterized as to level and extent.

Task 4: Prepare Draft EA

An administrative draft of each EA will be prepared for review by the District and BLM. Resource specialists will prepare individual resource sections, which will be compiled, reviewed and edited by project management personnel. Non-resource sections, such as purpose and need, project description, and alternatives description, will be prepared by project management personnel. It is assumed that only the proposed projects and the no-action alternative will be assessed in the EAs. Graphics will be black and white.

Ten copies of each draft EA will be printed and distributed for internal review to BLM and District personnel.

Task 5: BLM Review of the Draft EA

The BLM coordinator for the project will review each EA and request reviews from appropriate resource staff members. The District will review each EA concurrently with BLM. Reviewers will prepare written comments. Given the prior involvement of the reviewers in the document and approach planning process, comments are expected to be editorial in nature rather than those requiring substantial revisions.

Task 6: Revise and Finalize EA

Dames & Moore will revise each EA as necessary, in response to written comments received from BLM and the District. A master copy of the document, showing revisions made, will be retained in Dames & Moore's project files.

Task 7: BLM Compliance Check

The revised EA will be checked by the BLM project coordinator to ensure that requested revisions have been made to the document. Dames & Moore suggests that a meeting be held with the BLM and the District to review the revisions and answer questions at that time. This would expedite the compliance check and final approval of the EAs.

Task 8: Print EA

Dames & Moore will print up to 30 copies of each EA after final approval. A minimum of 10 copies will be printed first; additional copies can be made as requests for documents are received.

Task 9: Notice of Availability/Public Comment Period

Dames & Moore will draft a Notice of Availability (NOA) for BLM's review and approval. We will also prepare a mailing list for the NOA, based on direction from BLM. The NOA will be mailed out during the EA printing, and will state that recipients have 15 days to request a copy of the EA if they wish to review it.

Following the 15-day NOA period, agencies and the public will have 15 days in which to review the EA and provide written comments to BLM.

Task 10: BLM Decision Record

Based on the EA and comments received, BLM will prepare its Decision Record for the project. Dames & Moore will help to expedite the Decision Record by providing BLM with word processing of the document.

Task 11: Progress Meetings

Four progress meetings are planned for each EA. These meetings should include personnel from the District, Public Works, the BLM, and Dames & Moore project management staff. It is assumed that the meetings will be held at the BLM office. Dames & Moore will schedule the meetings and provide written meeting summaries to attenders. Meetings are planned for milestones in the project; project start-up; after development of the management plan; following District review; and following BLM review.

B. Schedule

Each EA process will run concurrently and will be completed within 30 weeks, or approximately 7 months. The proposed schedule for each task is outlined below:

C. Project Management and Organization

The EAs for Goodsprings and Searchlight will be managed out of the Las Vegas office of Dames & Moore. Ken MacDonald will serve as the Project Manager, and will be assisted by Dr. Phillip Davis as Project Coordinator. Senior technical review will be provided by Dean Hargis.

Most of our resource staff members are based in Las Vegas, or have worked extensively in the southern Nevada in the past. Resource specialists will report directly to the Project Manager.

Technical support for the project will include word processing, administration, technical illustration and cartography, and report production.

D. Estimated Costs

Dames & Moore will perform the scope of work outlined above on a time-and-materials basis in accordance with the terms and conditions outlined in our existing contract with the District.

Based on the assumptions outlined in this proposal, our total cost for completing separate EAs for both Searchlight and Goodsprings is estimated to be \$75,897. These costs include labor and expenses, and are allocated by task, or closely related groups of tasks, as shown below.

On the basis of the proposed flood control improvements, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has issued a conditional letter of map revision for this area. Advertisements for construction bids for the Unnamed Wash flood control facilities will occur in August, 1992 and construction should begin in November, 1992. VARIANCE REQUEST FOR LOT 71 OF LAUGHLIN ESTATES UNIT 1

Clark County has requested a variance from the elevation requirement in the "Uniform Regulations for the Control of Drainage" for Lot 71 of Laughlin Estates Unit 1. Staff understands that the property is located in a Special Flood Hazard Area labeled "Zone AO (Depth 1; Velocity 5 FPS)" on Panel 32003 2015B of the September 29, 1989, Clark County, Nevada, Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM).

The basis for the variance request is as follows:

- 1. The fill required by the Regulations would make this property significantly higher than adjacent lots.
- 2. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has issued a Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMR) for the Unnamed Wash Flood Control Improvements.
- 3. Clark County has created a Special Improvement District and the Regional Flood Control District has provided funding for construction of the Unnamed Wash Project.
- 4. Clark County expects to advertise for construction of the Unnamed Wash Improvement Project in August 1992 and construction is anticipated to begin in November 1992. The construction of the project will remove Laughlin Estates from the Special Flood Hazard Area.

Staff believes that Clark County's variance request is from Section 10.100 (B) (1) (a) of the Regulations which states:

"New construction and substantial improvement of any residential structure shall have the lowest floor elevated to a minimum of eighteen (18) inches above the base flood elevation. If the base flood elevation is specified as a depth, it is to be measured from the 'highest adjacent grade.' "

Highest adjacent grade is defined in Section 8 of the Regulations as:

"... the highest natural elevation of the ground surface prior to construction next to the proposed walls of the structure."

Staff comments on the variance request are as follows:

- 1. FEMA has issued a CLOMR; a letter of belief that once the project is built, the FIRM would be revised to remove the Special Flood Hazard Area in Laughlin Estates. The FIRM, however, is not officially revised by FEMA until the project is constructed and supporting documentation is provided to FEMA for final review.
- 2. The variance request is not specific as to which sections of the Regulations the variance is being requested. Staff has assumed that the variance is to Section 10.100 (B) (1) (a), as stated previously.

3. Staff has not been provided with information pertinent to the variance request, such as the proposed grading plan and proposed elevation of the lowest floor; therefore, it is not certain if the variance request is for the eighteen (18) inches above the base flood elevation, or for a variance to the entire section in the Regulations.

4. Section 13.010 (A) of the Regulations states in part the following:

"Variances from any provision of the Regulations may be granted, as a minimum, <u>under</u>

the conditions specified by FEMA and shall consider all technical evaluations delineated in these Regulations..." (underline added)

Variance conditions specified by FEMA as found in 44 CFR Ch.1. §60.6, section (a), paragraphs (2) through (6) state:

- (2) "Variances may be issued by a community for new construction on a lot of one-half acre or less when it is contiguous to, and surrounded by lots with existing structures constructed below the base flood level, in conformance with the procedures of paragraphs (a) (3), (4), (5) and (6) of this section;
- (3) Variances shall only be issued by a community upon (i) a showing of good and sufficient cause, (ii) a determination that failure to grant the variance would result in exceptional hardship to the applicant, and (iii) a determination that granting of a variance will not result in increased flood heights, additional threats to public safety, extraordinary public expense, create nuisances, cause fraud on or victimization of the public, or conflict with existing local laws or ordinances;
- (4) Variances shall only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary, considering the flood hazard, to afford relief;
- (5) A community shall notify the applicant in writing over the signature of a community official that: (i) the issuance of a variance to construct a structure below the base flood level will result in increased premium rates for flood insurance up to amounts as high as \$25 for each \$100 of insurance coverage and (ii) such construction below the base flood level increases risk to life and property. Such notification shall be maintained with a record of all variance actions as required in paragraph (a) (6) of this section; and
- (6) A community shall (i) maintain a record of all variance actions, including justifications for their issuance, and (ii) report such variances issued in its annual or biennial report submitted to the Administrator."

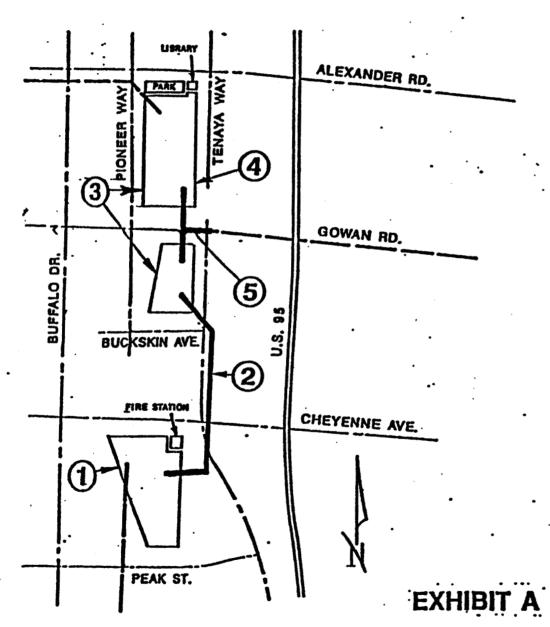

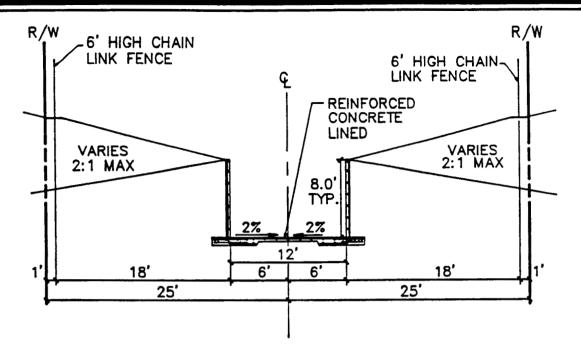

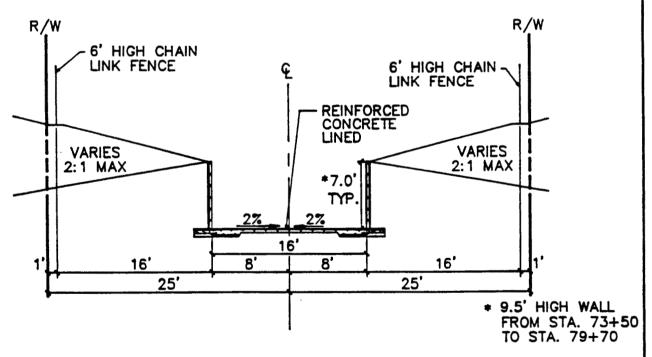

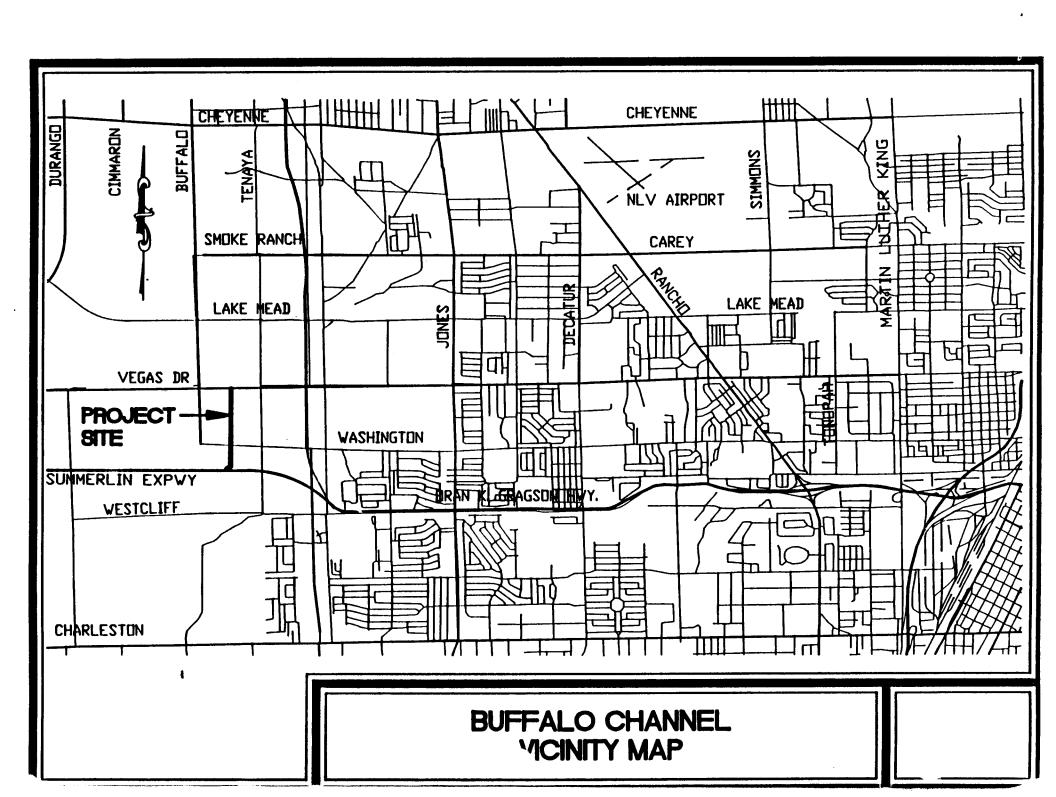

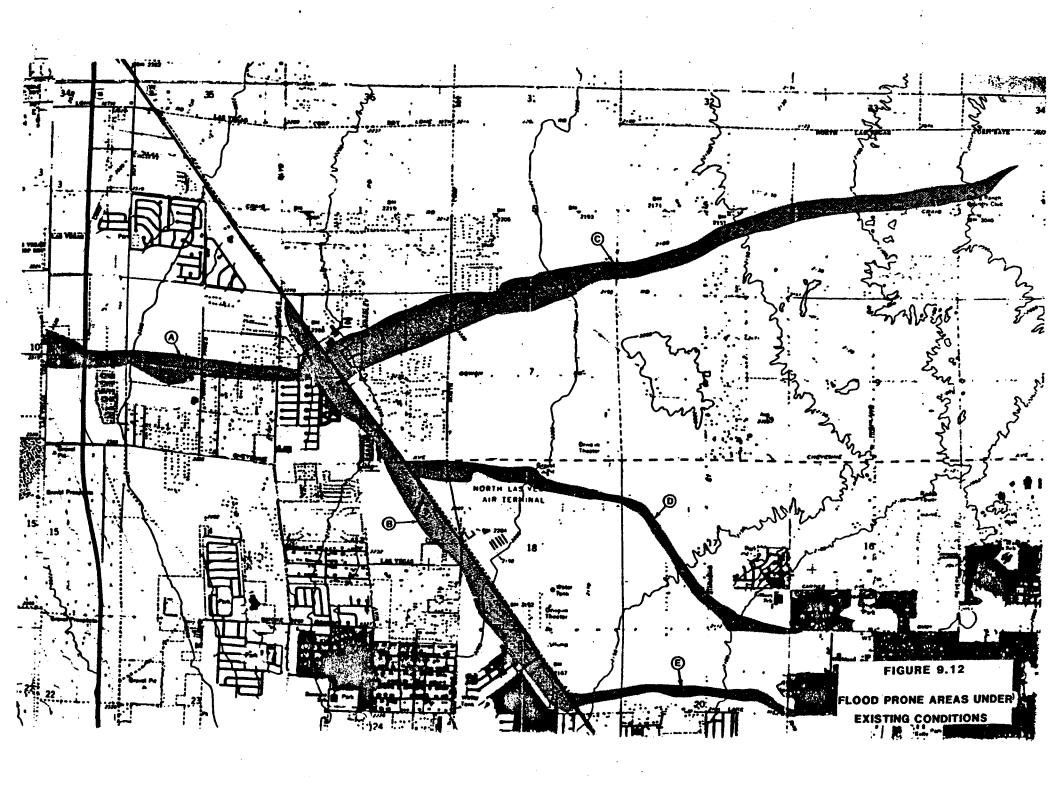

INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION 1 2 OF BUFFALO CHANNEL - SUMMERLIN PARKWAY TO VEGAS DRIVE THIS INTERLOCAL CONTRACT, made and entered into this 3 , 1992, by and between the City of Las Vegas, a Municipal 4 Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY"; and the Clark County Regional 5 Flood Control District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT". 6 WITNESSETH 7 WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 543 of the Nevada Revised Statutes, the 8 DISTRICT may approve a project to design and construct flood control 9 10 improvements; and WHEREAS, the PROJECT is a regional facility described in the DISTRICT 11 12 Master Plan Update as the Buffalo Channel, Reference Numbers GOSO0344, 0394, 13 0395, and shown on Exhibit "A" (hereinafter called the "PROJECT"); and WHEREAS, the PROJECT is a priority project approved by the Clark County 14 15 Regional Flood Control District on its bond project list; and 16 WHEREAS, the PROJECT has regional flood control significance and is located in the same hydrographic area as Clark County, the City of Henderson, the City 17 of Las Vegas, and the City of North Las Vegas; and 18 WHEREAS, engineering design and right-of-way engineering are completed and 19 20 it is the desire of the CITY to begin construction of this PROJECT. NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants, conditions, agreements, 21 and promises of the parties hereto, the DISTRICT authorizes the CITY to proceed 22 23 with construction of this PROJECT as it is mutually understood and agreed as

follows:

SECTION I - SCOPE OF PROJECT

This INTERLOCAL CONTRACT applies to flood control facilities associated with the Buffalo Channel. The PROJECT shall consist of the construction of a section of the Buffalo Channel from Summerlin Parkway to Vegas Drive. The DISTRICT Master Plan designation of the PROJECT is "Buffalo Channel", Numbers GOSO0344, 0394, 0395 Structure Number and is further identified and shown on the attached Exhibit "A".

SECTION II- PROJECT COSTS

The DISTRICT agrees to provide funding for PROJECT costs within the limits specified below:

- 1. Construction engineering at a cost not to exceed \$145,500.
- 2. Construction at a cost not to exceed \$2,100,000.
- Total cost of PROJECT not to exceed \$2,245,500.

A written request must be made to the DISTRICT and a Supplemental Interlocal Contract approved to increase any of the amounts noted above prior to payment of any additional funds.

SECTION III - GENERAL

- The DISTRICT shall be shown on the title sheet of both the plans and specifications as the funding agency.
- 2. The award of bid for this PROJECT shall occur no later than January 31, 1993. The CITY will take all reasonable steps possible to avoid delays in the construction of DISTRICT-funded projects.

PROJECT delays more than four months, as measured from the award date, may be subject to a formal review by both the Technical Advisory Committee and the DISTRICT Board of Directors. At the review, the CITY will have an opportunity to present information relative to the delays, measures taken to avoid the delays and the likelihood of those delays continuing. The Board will make a determination, in view of the delays and limited available funding, whether PROJECT funding should continue. In the case that the Board chooses to discontinue funding, the Board may cancel any Interlocal Contract(s) associated with the PROJECT and discontinue funding for the remainder of the PROJECT. Funding already spent or appropriated by the CITY will not be required to be refunded to the DISTRICT. Project funding can be reconsidered at any time when the CITY can demonstrate that the PROJECT can proceed on an acceptable schedule.

- 3. The CITY will comply with the Local Purchasing Act, Chapter 332 of the Nevada Revised Statutes.
- 4. The CITY, its employees and representatives shall at all times comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, statutes, rules and regulations in effect at the time work is performed on the PROJECT.
- 5. The CITY will require appropriate financial security for PROJECT construction.
- 6. The CITY shall provide all impacted entities and the DISTRICT with the opportunity to provide the CITY with input relative to the

following processes: scope of services development; consultant selection; design, construction and maintenance review; and monitoring of the effectiveness and impacts of facilities on flood flows.

- 7. Any and all applicable portions of the current editions of the DISTRICT's Policies and Procedures, the Hydrologic Criteria and Drainage Manual and the Uniform Regulations for Control of Drainage adopted by the DISTRICT will apply in developing this PROJECT unless specifically superseded by the Interlocal Contract.
- 8. Purchases of right-of-way in excess of that actually needed for construction will not be allowed unless a comparison between the cost of excess acquisition and needed acquisition, including damages, indicates that benefits from such a transaction would result. Title to residual property will be vested in the name of the CITY. Revenues derived from the sale of these properties, less the cost of the sale of these properties, will be forwarded to the DISTRICT.
- 9. Administrative settlements and acceptance of counter offers involving right-of-way may only be made following a review approval by the DISTRICT.
- 10. The DISTRICT will make payment to the CITY, its contractor or its consultant each month for project costs as outlined in SECTION II -PROJECT COSTS. Invoices must identify and allocate all costs to the

categories noted below:

- a. Right-of-Way
 - 1. Design and Surveying
 - Appraisals, negotiations, land acquisition, legal fees, escrow stamps, recording fees, etc.
- Pre-design Engineering (all work prior to design, excluding right-of-way)
- c. Design Engineering
- d. Construction (all work after award of construction contract)
- 11. Accurate documentation of all work performed and payments made will be maintained by the CITY for a period of three (3) years in hard copy form after final PROJECT approval and payment. Following the three-year period, the CITY shall keep records for permanent storage in original form or in microfilm/fiche media.
- 12. The DISTRICT reserves the right to review and/or audit all records pertaining to all PROJECTs both during and after PROJECT completion.
- 13. The CITY will be responsible for any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense caused by the actions or inactions of its employees, consultants, contractors or agents arising under this Contract and hereby holds the DISTRICT harmless therefrom.
- 14. Any costs found to be improperly allocated to this PROJECT will be refunded by the CITY to the DISTRICT.
- 15. The CITY, as the administering agency, will provide the DISTRICT

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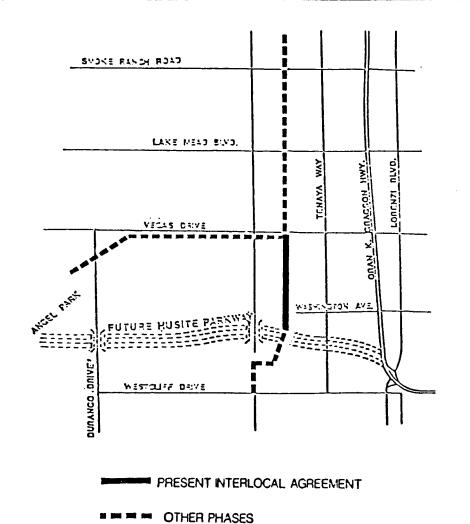
with the information required in NRS 543.580 and shall present that information orally to the Citizens' Advisory Committee, Technical Advisory Committee and the Board of Directors.

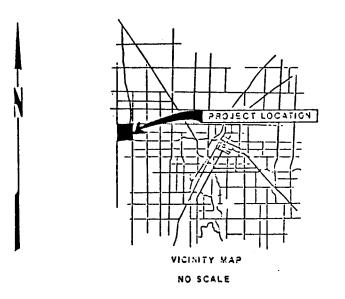
- 16. The items covered in SECTION II PROJECT COSTS must be completed to the satisfaction of the DISTRICT prior to January 31, 1994. The DISTRICT may, at any time thereafter, grant extensions or terminate this Contract after thirty (30) days notice and may require all sums advanced to the CITY be repaid.
- 17. The CITY at its own discretion may use the services of a consultant for the completion of work identified in SECTION I SCOPE OF PROJECT and the DISTRICT will not be a party to such an agreement. However, the use of any consultant will not entitle CITY to additional funds beyond that specified in SECTION II PROJECT COSTS as hereinabove set forth.
- 18. The CITY will provide the DISTRICT with preliminary plans, specifications and cost estimates for review and comments.

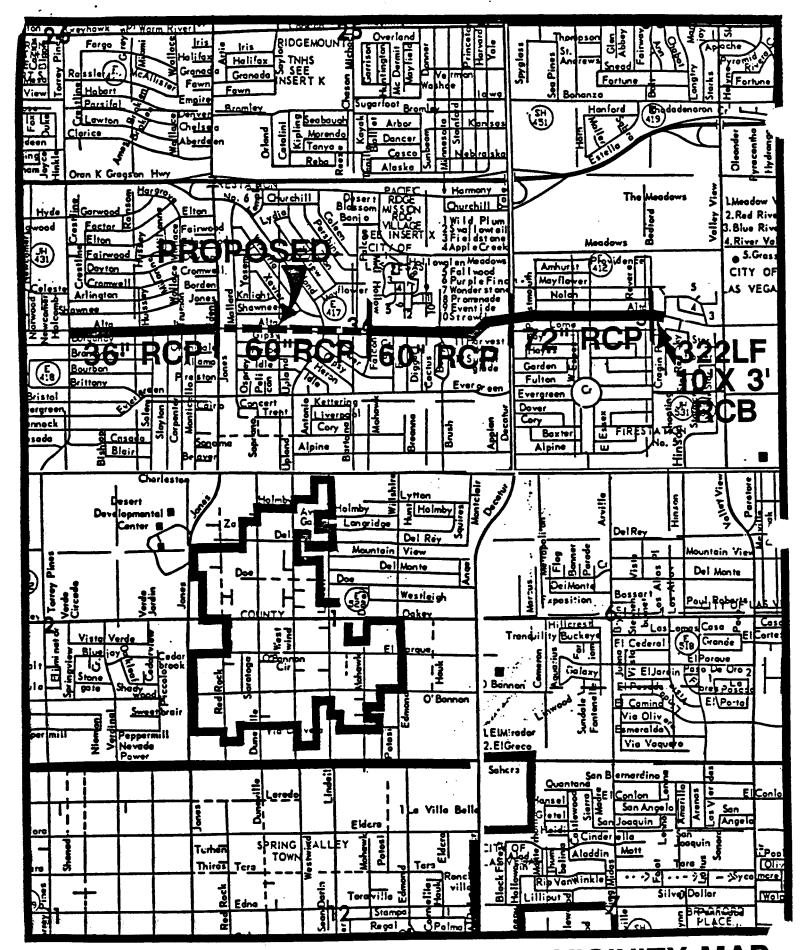

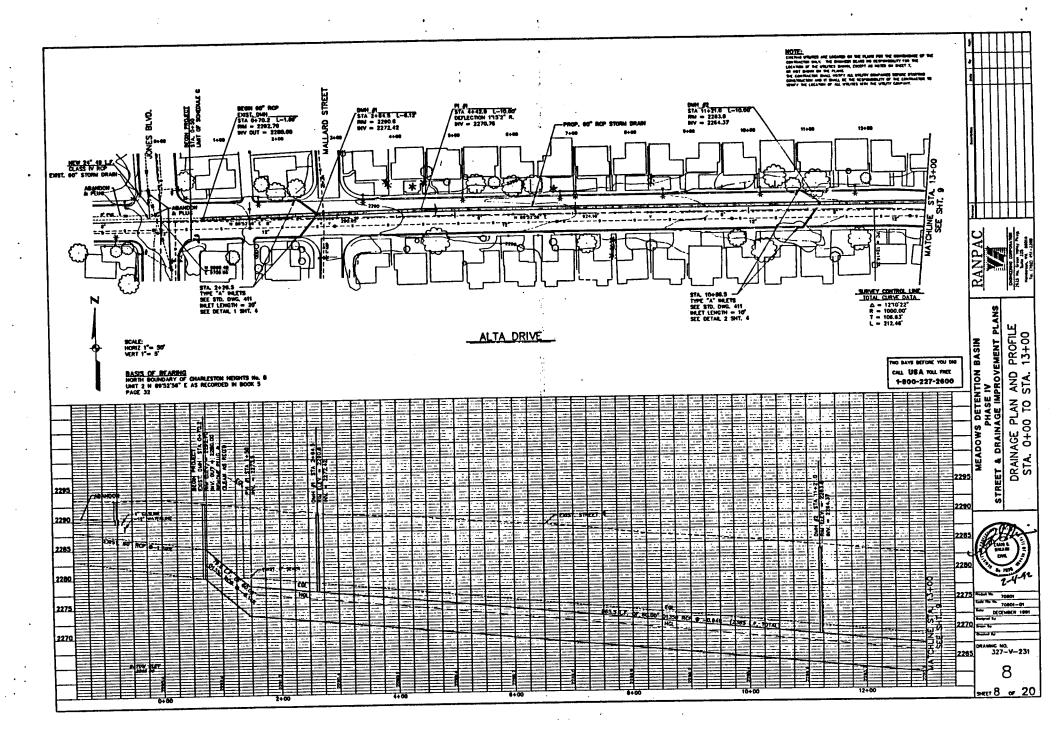


MEADOW - ALTA STORM DRAIN VICINITY MAP EXHIBIT A

MEADOWS-ALTA STORM DRAIN (FALCON LANE TO JONES BOULEVARD)

The following cost analysis is to comply with NRS 543.580. This analysis compares an estimate of cost to control floodwaters along Alta Drive from Torrey Pines to Bedford Road (approximately two miles) to the cost of purchasing land along this same two-mile route. The primary impetus for this project is safety. Just west of Falcon the street cross-section had an inverted crown to facilitate conveying the peak flows within the street right-of-way. The flow depth was approximately 2.2 feet deep traveling 10.5 fps for 1080 cfs.

Presently, during storm events the street is not safe for travel.

Upstream of the proposed section, the City of Las Vegas has placed a 36-inch pipe in Alta Drive from Torrey Pines to Jones Boulevard (1/2 mile). Below the proposed section the City has begun construction from Falcon Lane to Bedford Road that includes 60-inch pipe from Falcon Lane to Decatur Boulevard and 72-inch pipe to Bedford (1.0 miles) with 322 feet of 10'x3' RCB into the channel.

The proposed 60-inch diameter pipe from Falcon Lane to Jones Boulevard is designed to convey 422 cfs. This segment will connect the segment existing east and west segments of this project greatly improving safety in the roads during a storm event.

For this analysis we have assumed that the traffic route along Alta Drive from Torrey Pines to Bedford Road would need to be rerouted since the street is not considered safe to travel during even low frequency storms. The lots along Alta Drive were assumed to be 100-feet deep along the 2-mile stretch from Torrey Pines to Bedford Road. Since the lots would not have access if Alta Drive were closed due to safety concerns, an alternative to the Project would be to buy these lots. INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR 1 2 CONSTRUCTION OF THE 3 MEADOWS-ALTA STORM DRAIN (MEADOWS - PHASE V STORM DRAIN) 4 THIS INTERLOCAL CONTRACT, made and entered into as of the day of 5 , 1992 by and between the Clark County Regional Flood Control District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT" and City of Las Vegas, a 6 7 Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY". 8 WITNESSETH 9 WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 543 of the Nevada Revised Statutes, the 10 DISTRICT may approve a project to design and construct flood control improvements; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the PROJECT is a regional facility described in the Master Plan 13 with the following structure numbers obtained from the Master Plan: MEAL 0060 (Falcon Lane to Jones Boulevard along Alta Drive) hereinafter referred to as 14 15 "PROJECT"; and 16 WHEREAS, the PROJECT is identified and shown on the attached Exhibit "A": 17 and WHEREAS, the PROJECT is shown on the DISTRICT's Fiscal Year 92/93 Project 18 List: and 19 WHEREAS, the PROJECT has regional flood control significance and is located 20 21 in the same hydrographic area as Clark County, City of Henderson, the City of Las Vegas and the City of North Las Vegas. 22 NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants, conditions, agreements 23

and promises of the parties hereto, the DISTRICT authorizes the CITY to proceed with the PROJECT as it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

SECTION I - SCOPE OF THE PROJECT

This INTERLOCAL CONTRACT applies to all costs for preparation of bid package, construction administration, construction engineering, and construction costs to place in service the Meadows Alta Storm Drain (Falcon Lane to Jones Boulevard). The basic improvements shall consist of floodwater facilities including piping and inlet systems, and other appurtenances as may be necessary to control floodwaters. The improvements shall be funded through DISTRICT funds as herein described. This PROJECT is further identified and shown on the attached Exhibit "A".

SECTION II - PROJECT COSTS

The DISTRICT agrees to provide funding for PROJECT costs and shall not exceed the limits specified below:

- Construction costs shall not exceed \$892,300.
- 2. Preparation of bid package, construction administration and construction engineering shall not exceed \$62,500.
- Total PROJECT cost shall not exceed \$954,800 which includes all items described in Paragraphs 1 & 2 above.

A written request must be made to the DISTRICT and a supplemental interlocal contract approved to increase any of the amounts noted above prior to payment of any additional funds.

SECTION III - GENERAL

1. The DISTRICT shall be shown on the title sheet of both the plans and specifications as the funding agency.

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- 2. The award of bid for this PROJECT shall occur no later than January 31, 1993. The CITY will take all reasonable steps possible to avoid delays in the construction of DISTRICT-funded projects. PROJECT delays more than four months, as measured from the award date, may be subject to a formal review by both the Technical Advisory Committee and the DISTRICT Board of Directors. review, the CITY will have an opportunity to present information relative to the delays, measures taken to avoid the delays and the likelihood of those delays continuing. The Board will make a determination, in view of the delays and limited available funding, whether PROJECT funding should continue. In the case that the Board chooses to discontinue funding, the Board may cancel any Interlocal Contract(s) associated with the PROJECT and discontinue funding for the remainder of the PROJECT. Funding already spent or appropriated by the CITY will not be required to be refunded to the DISTRICT. Project funding can be reconsidered at any time when the CITY can demonstrate that the PROJECT can proceed on an acceptable schedule.
- 3. The CITY will comply with the Local Purchasing Act, Chapter 332 of the Nevada Revised Statutes.
- 4. The CITY, its employees and representatives shall at all times comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, statutes, rules and

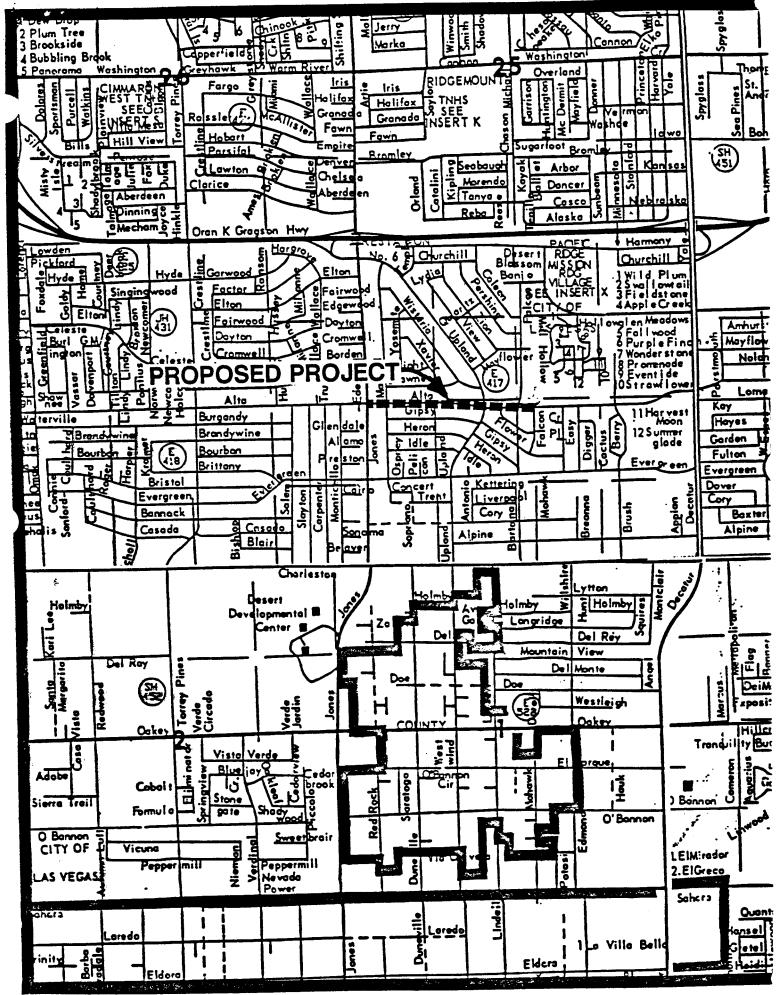
- regulations in effect at the time work is performed on the PROJECT.
- 5. The CITY will require appropriate financial security for PROJECT construction.
- 6. The CITY shall provide all impacted entities and the DISTRICT with the opportunity to provide the CITY with input relative to the following processes: scope of services development; consultant selection; design, construction and maintenance review; and monitoring of the effectiveness and impacts of facilities on flood flows.
- 7. Any and all applicable portions of the current editions of the DISTRICT's Policies and Procedures, the Hydrologic Criteria and Drainage Manual and the Uniform Regulations for Control of Drainage adopted by the DISTRICT will apply in developing this PROJECT unless specifically superseded by the Interlocal Contract.
- 8. Purchases of right-of-way in excess of that actually needed for construction will not be allowed unless a comparison between the cost of excess acquisition and needed acquisition, including damages, indicates that benefits from such a transaction would result. Title to residual property will be vested in the name of the CITY. Revenues derived from the sale of these properties, less the cost of the sale of these properties, will be forwarded to the DISTRICT.
- 9. Administrative settlements and acceptance of counter offers

- involving right-of-way may only be made following a review approval by the DISTRICT.
- 10. The DISTRICT will make payment to the CITY, its contractor or its consultant each month for project costs as outlined in SECTION II -PROJECT COSTS. Invoices must identify and allocate all costs to the categories noted below:
 - a. Right-of-Way
 - 1. Design and Surveying
 - Appraisals, negotiations, land acquisition, legal fees, escrow stamps, recording fees, etc.
 - Pre-design Engineering (all work prior to design, excluding right-of-way)
 - c. Design Engineering
 - d. Construction (all work after award of construction contract)
- 11. Accurate documentation of all work performed and payments made will be maintained by the CITY for a period of three (3) years in hard copy form after final PROJECT approval and payment. Following the three-year period, the CITY shall keep records for permanent storage in original form or in microfilm/fiche media.
- 12. The DISTRICT reserves the right to review and/or audit all records pertaining to all PROJECTs both during and after PROJECT completion.
- 13. The CITY will be responsible for any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense caused by the actions or inactions of its employees,

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- consultants, contractors or agents arising under this Contract and hereby holds the DISTRICT harmless therefrom.
- 14. Any costs found to be improperly allocated to this PROJECT will be refunded by the CITY to the DISTRICT.
- 15. The CITY, as the administering agency, will provide the DISTRICT with the information required in NRS 543.580 and shall present that information orally to the Citizens' Advisory Committee, Technical Advisory Committee and the Board of Directors.
- 16. The items covered in SECTION II PROJECT COSTS must be completed to the satisfaction of the DISTRICT prior to June 30, 1994. The DISTRICT may, at any time thereafter, grant extensions or terminate this Contract after thirty (30) days notice and may require all sums advanced to the CITY be repaid.
- 17. The CITY at its own discretion may use the services of a consultant for the completion of work identified in SECTION I SCOPE OF PROJECT and the DISTRICT will not be a party to such an agreement. However, the use of any consultant will not entitle CITY to additional funds beyond that specified in SECTION II PROJECT COSTS as hereinabove set forth.

Therefore, the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) has proposed a 50/50 cost-sharing of oversizing from their proposed 8'x4' reinforced concrete box so that these facilities can be put in at their 100-year ultimate size at this time. We have included a City of Las Vegas ranking for this Project and also, for reference, rankings of other projects in this hydrographic basin. A letter of intent from NDOT is also attached.

Tom Chiatovich, P.E., Chief of Flood Control for the City of Las Vegas, and I have discussed the Nevada Department of Transportation's (NDOT) proposal of a 50/50 cost-sharing agreement for the additional costs over and above NDOT's proposed 8' x 4' reinforced concrete box (RCB) for the I-15/Sahara Avenue Interchange project as laid out in your letter dated June 11, 1992. Both the District and the City of Las Vegas are interested in pursuing an agreement for the oversizing of the RCB.

As the "Lead Entity" in the implementation of District flood control facilities within the Central Basin in which the RCB is situation, the City of Las Vegas has requested to be a party to the agreement. The agreement should be between NDOT, the City of Las Vegas and the Clark County Regional Flood Control District.

In that NDOT, the City and the District will all have a financial interest in the District's 1-15 Freeway System, it is understood that the agreement will contain language that future NDOT improvements to I-15 from Desert Inn Road, to and including the I-515 Interchange, will allow for the continued implementation of the I-15 Freeway Channel System within NDOT's right-of-way as depicted in the District's Master Plan. It is also understood that both the City and District will continue to implement the flood control system presently depicted in the Master Plan, as Central Basin programmed funding permits. At this time, it is anticipated that connection to the segment proposed as part of the I-15/Sahara Avenue Interchange would occur ten to fifteen years from now.

The District Attorney's office entered into extensive negotiations with the attorneys representing the owner. The issue to be resolved involved severance damages resulting from construction of the proposed open configuration of the flood control channel for an approximate distance of 1,575 linear feet.

The basis for settlement involves the extension of twin castin-place concrete pipes to accomplish underground construction across the majority of the channel area.

This will allow the owner to retain access from the northerly portion of the ranch, including the horse training track, to the corral and pasture areas situated along the southerly boundary of the proposed flood control channel. Underground construction will terminate at a point necessary to allow the required hydraulic transition from the underground pipes to the existing Muddy River Channel.

In exchange for underground construction, Mr. Newton has agreed to execute a permanent easement to accommodate the proposed flood channel. The owner has also agreed to replace the irrigation ditch which would be obliterated by channel construction, and to remove and later replace existing pasture fences within the project area.

The Public Works Acquisitions Office agrees with the District Attorney's opinion that the proposed settlement is reasonable and in the best interest of the County to accept it. The estimated increase in construction costs of \$200,000 is offset by the owner's concession to forego any cash settlement, in favor of retaining access across the majority of the project area via underground construction, which will also eliminate the cost of right-of-way acquisition through a condemnation action; and also eliminate two low-water crossings which would be necessary with open channel configuration.

The parties involved in the condemnation of Wayne Newton's Logandale Ranch property have reached a proposed settlement which they would like the County Commission to consider. The condemnation case involves a taking of a strip of property across Mr. Newton's ranch which is approximately 130 feet wide and over 1500 feet long. The purpose of the taking is to install a large open drainage channel for flood control purposes. The gist of the proposed settlement is that Mr. Newton will dedicate all of the land required for the project along with an unrelated parcel on Gubler Drive in Logandale which the County needs for road purposes in exchange for the County spending the extra money required to change the open channel into an underground facility.

Under the terms of the agreement, Mr. Newton will dedicate all the land necessary for the County to build most of the project underground by burying two ten-foot pipes across most of the property with approximately 150 feet of open channel where the project meets the Muddy River. Mr. Newton has also agreed to remove and later replace all of his pasture fences that in the area of the project as well as replace his irrigation ditch which will be destroyed by the construction of the project. Both of these items were to be paid by the County in the original proposal.

In exchange for Mr. Newton's dedication, the County will agree to a change order to put the project underground as described above which will increase the construction cost by \$200,000.00.

I feel the settlement is reasonable since the County will spend the same amount of money or less than the way the project is currently designed and the property owner will also be benefitted by having the project underground.

The County's appraiser in this action estimated the value of the take at \$58,500,00. The appraiser for the land owner appraised the value of the take and severance damages to equal \$232,580.00. Our office estimates that acquiring the property through a condemnation trial will result in a verdict of \$150,000.00 to \$160,000.00. The County would also have to pay our court costs and interest which would be approximately \$10,000.00. Public Works has proposed

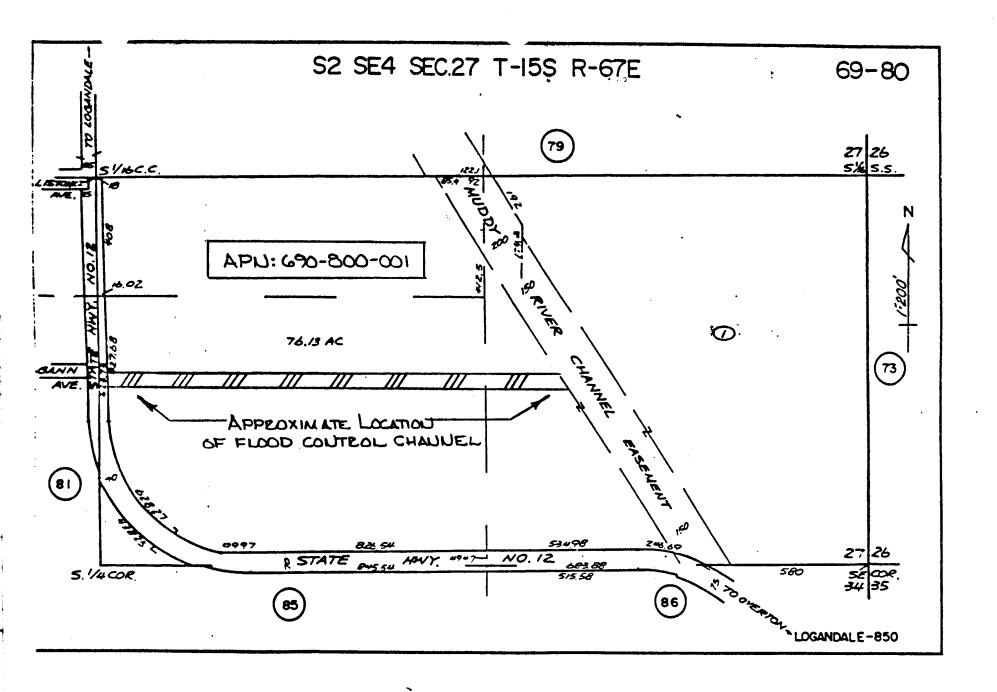

two low-water crossings (bridges) across the open channel which would cost the County approximately \$40,000.00 to build. These crossings would not be necessary if the project is put underground. Mr. Newton has also agreed to dedicate a strip of land on Gubler Drive for road purposes which would probably cost us between \$2,200.00 and \$5,000.00 to acquire plus related court costs.

Mr. Newton's dedication of the land required and his agreement to replace his irrigation ditch and fencing at his own expense will cause the County to spend the same or less to complete this project and, as a result, I believe the settlement is reasonable.

Mr. Newton's dedication of the land required and his agreement to replace his irrigation ditch and fencing at his own expense will cause the County to spend the same or less to complete this project and, as a result, I believe the settlement is reasonable.

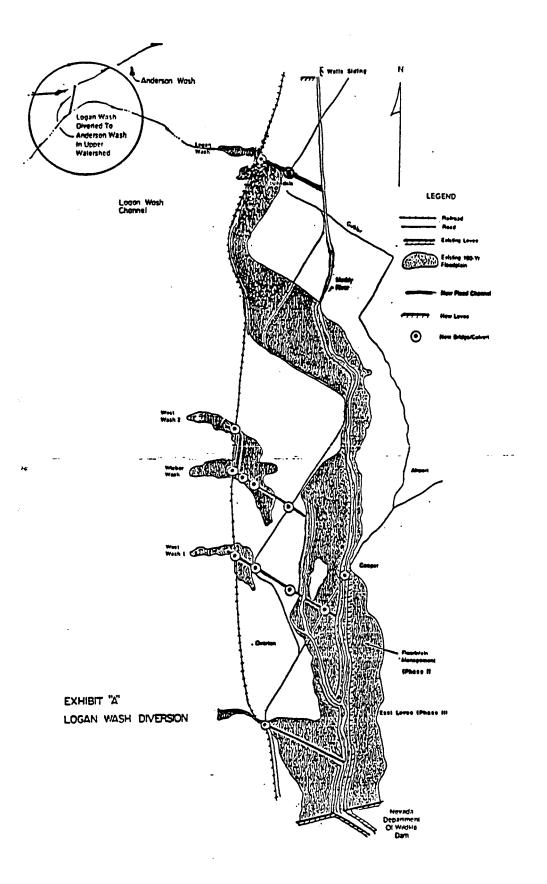

Progressive Contractor, Inc.'s error occurred on bid item 612.01 and appears to involve listing a tump sum (LS) unit price instead of the specified linear foot (LF) unit price. Correcting this error pursuant to Paragraph 7.A. of the Instructions to Bidders would revise the bid submitted by Progressive Contracting, Inc. from \$778,300.00 to \$293,024,064.00. Progressive Contracting also had an extension error on bid item 406.01.

Max Riggs Construction Company Inc.'s error occurred on bid item 502.01 and appears to involve listing a lump sum (LS) unit price instead of the specified linear foot (LF) unit price. Correcting this error pursuant to Paragraph 7.A of the Instructions to Bidders would revise the bid submitted by Max Riggs Construction Company, Inc. from \$978,175.80 to \$25,138,175.80.

Since the errors noted can be attributed to unintentional oversight, MEA, Inc. recommends that formal notice be given to both bidders requesting formal clarification of their bids.

If the information received supports the lump sum (LS) unit price basis in their bids then MEA, Inc. recommends award to Progressive Contracting, Inc. based on their apparent low bid of \$778,060.00. 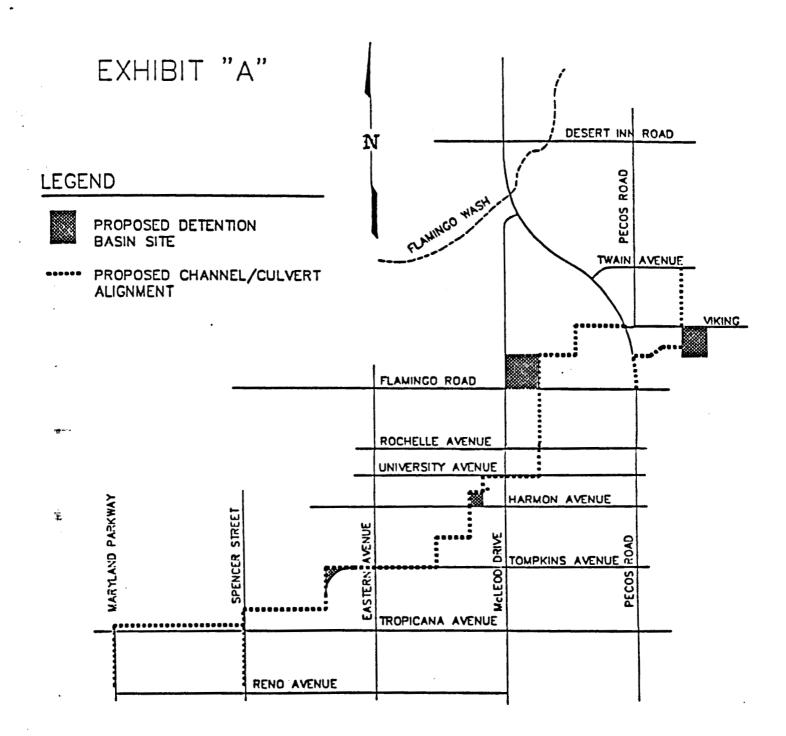

THIS SUPPLEMENTAL CONTRACT, made and entered into this ______ day of ______, 1992, by and between the CITY OF HENDERSON, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "CITY", and the Clark County Regional Flood Control District, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, on March 12, 1992, the DISTRICT approved an Interlocal Contract to provide funds for the construction and construction engineering of the Union Pacific Railroad Channel as shown on the attached Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the original license agreement with the Union Pacific Railroad which allows the City to construct the PROJECT in their right-of-way requires modification to accommodate the PROJECT as designed; and

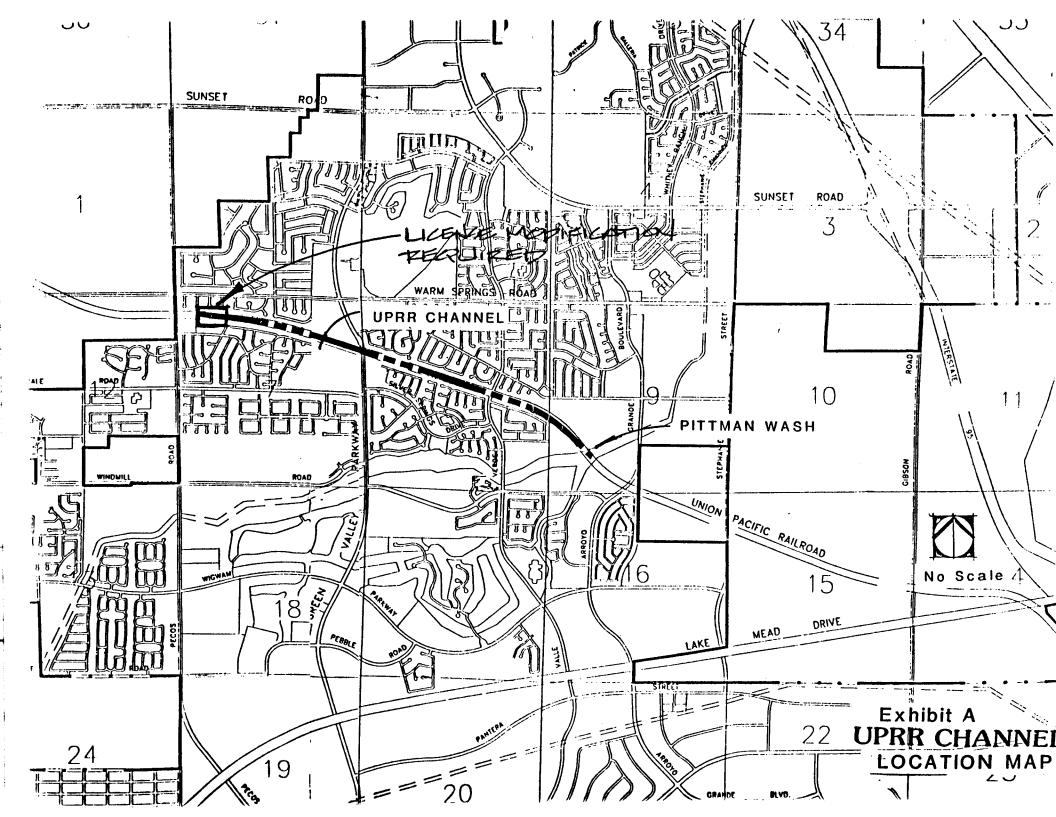

Attached is an agenda item requesting Supplemental Agreement Number 1 for the construction of the Union Pacific Railroad Channel. This supplemental agreement is required in order to allocate money under the original agreement for the payment of a processing fee to the Union Pacific Railroad to modify the license under which the Union Pacific Railroad Channel is being constructed. The modification will extend the license an additional 1000 feet to the west and allow the construction of a pipeline instead of an open channel.

The City of Henderson and the Union Pacific Railroad have had an agreement for the construction of the Union Pacific Railroad Channel within the railroad right-of-way since 1987. Because of the topography the western 1000 feet of the project will be a pipeline rather than a channel as specified in the 1987 agreement. The Railroad was contacted concerning this change and they agreed to supplement the original 1987 agreement to accommodate the pipeline. For this they required a processing fee of \$35,635.00. A copy of the proposed agreement with the Railroad is attached for your reference.

This supplemental agreement does not increase the total amount of the March 12 agreement, but reallocates the funding categories within the agreement. We are also requesting that the City be allowed to seek reimbursement from the District for the payment of the fee to the Railroad. This will allow us to execute the modification to the license with the Railroad in a timely manner and avoid potential delays to the construction of the project. We recognize that any payments to the Railroad prior to the approval of the supplemental agreement would be at the City's risk.

SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of the day of ______, 1992, by and between UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, a Utah corporation (hereinafter the "Railroad Company"), and CITY OF HENDERSON, a municipal corporation of the State of Nevada, to be addressed at City Hall, 240 Water Street, Henderson, Nevada 89015-7200 (hereinafter the "Licensee").

RECITALS:

By instrument dated September 4, 1987, the parties hereto or their predecessors in interest (if any), entered into an agreement (hereinafter the "Basic Agreement"), identified as Audit No. 141918, as supplemented and amended, covering the construction and maintenance of a proposed concretelined drainage channel herein and in the Basic Agreement called "Drainage Facilities" on Railroad's right-of-way at or near Henderson, Clark County, Nevada.

The parties now desire to modify the Basic Agreement, as supplemented and amended, by adding exhibit print A-1 to include a 30-inch reinforced concrete pipeline between Mile Posts 6.01 and 6.20, amending Section 2 to add the pipeline encroachment, and adding Section 18 to provide for the modification, relocation or removal of the pipeline at Licensee's sole expense.

AGREEMENT:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED by and between the parties hereto as follows:

Section 1. SUBSTITUTION OF PRINT.

The print dated May 12, 1992, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", shall be and hereby is substituted for the print dated May 2, 1988, attached to the Basic Agreement, and from and after the effective date herein whenever the term Drainage Facilities is used in the Basic Agreement, or any amendment or supplement thereto (if any), such reference shall be deemed to include both the Drainage Facilities and Pipeline as shown on Exhibit "A-1" hereto attached.

Section 2. AMENDMENT OF SECTION 2 OF BASIC AGREEMENT.

Effective as of the date first herein written, Section 2 of the Basic Agreement is amended to read as follows:

"It is expressly agreed that this license and permission is granted solely for the purpose of Licensee's, or its contractor's, at Licensee's sole cost and expense, furnishing all necessary labor, materials, tools, equipment and instrumentalities and excavating, constructing, installing, and thereafter maintaining and using its proposed concrete-lined drainage channel, together with all appurtenances thereto, including, but not limited

to, its proposed maintenance access roadway, double 4' x 6' box culvert at Green Valley Road, and a pipeline drainage encroachment (hereinafter collectively called "Drainage Facilities"), to conform substantially to specifications, notes and cross sections shown on Exhibit "A", located on and along a southerly 30-ft. portion of Railroad's right-of-way between Mile Posts 6.2 and 8.02, as shown on Exhibit "A", and pipeline encroachment between Mile Posts 6.01 and 6.20, as shown on Exhibit "A-1", and is expressly subject and subordinate to the present and future right in Railroad, its successors, assigns, lessees, grantees and licensees to maintain, use, operate and renew on, beneath or above surface of Premises any telephone, telegraph power, communication or signal lines, poles and/or appurtenances, fiber optic communications, tracks, roadways, pipelines, structures, improvements or facilities of similar or different character, as now located; and to construct, install, establish, and thereafter maintain, use operate and renew on, beneath or above the surface of Premises, any or all said things."

Section 3. ADDITION OF SECTION 18 TO BASIC AGREEMENT.

Effective as of the date first herein written, Section 18 is added to the Basic Agreement to read as follows:

"RELOCATION OR REMOVAL OF PIPELINE

- "(a) The license herein granted is subject to the needs and requirements of the Licensor in the operation of its railroad and in the improvement and use of its property, and the Licensee shall, at the sole expense of the Licensee, move all or any portion of the Pipeline to such new location as the Licensor may designate, whenever, in the furtherance of its needs and requirements, the Licensor shall find such action necessary or desirable."
- "(b) All the terms, conditions and stipulations herein expressed with reference to the Pipeline on property of the Licensor in the location hereinbefore described shall, so far as the Pipeline remains on the property, apply to the Pipeline as modified, changed or relocated within the contemplation of this section."

Section 4. ADMINISTRATIVE HANDLING CHARGE.

The Licensee shall pay to the Railroad Company an administrative handling charge of THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$35,635.00).

Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Supplemental Agreement shall be effective as of the date first herein written.

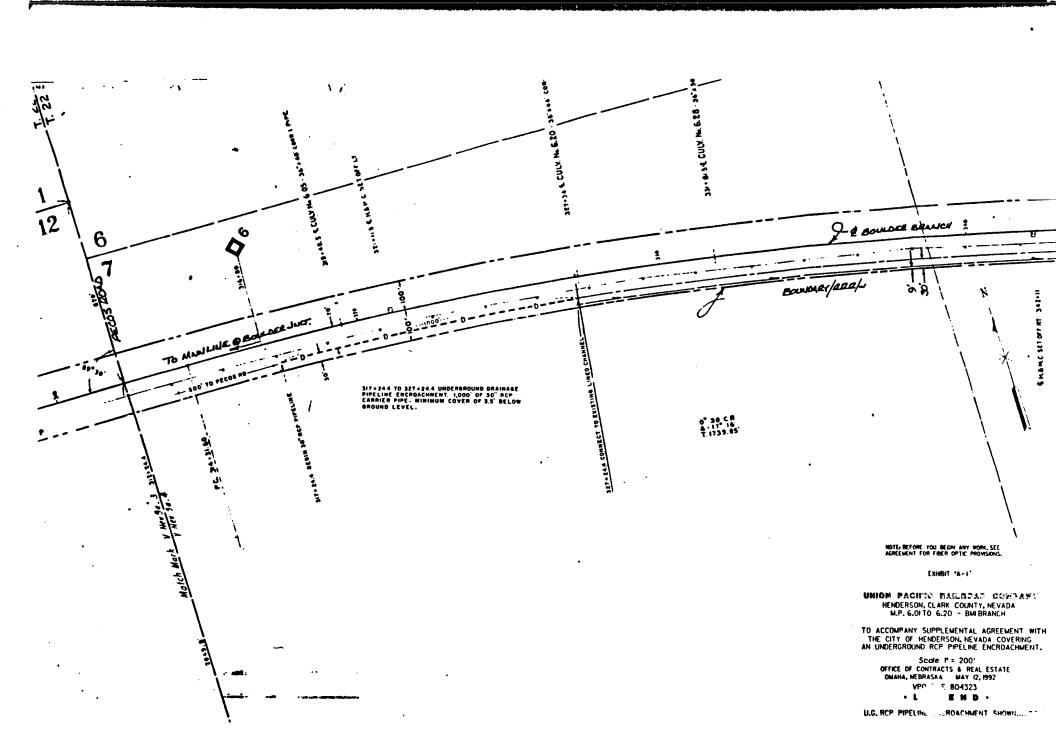

1. SECTION II - PROJECT COSTS is deleted in its entirety and the following is inserted in lieu thereof:

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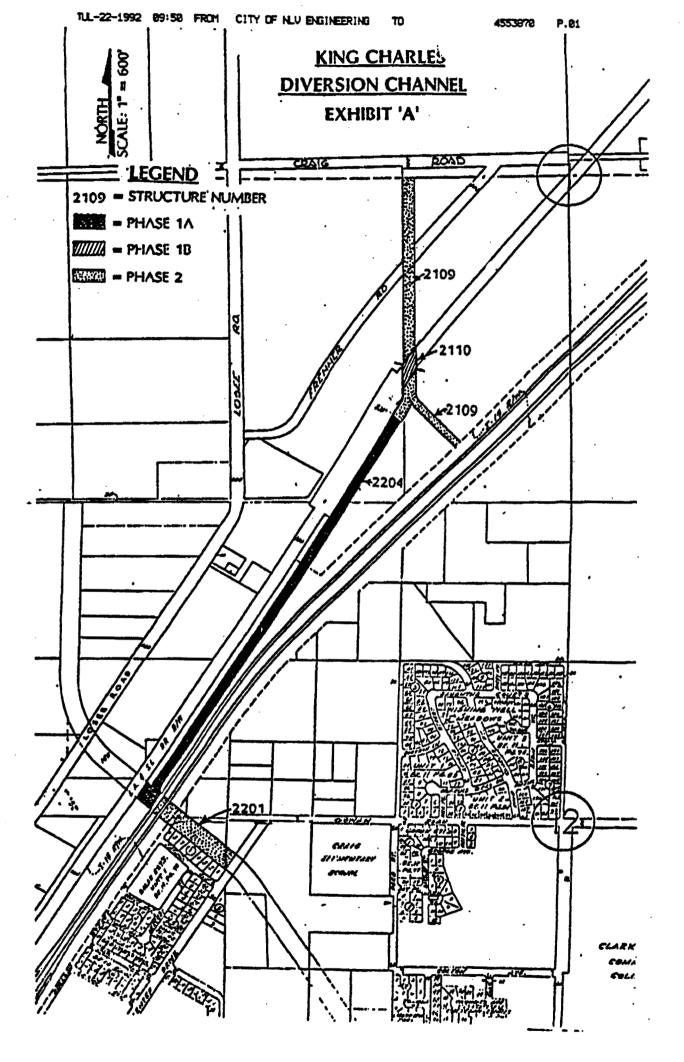
- A. Cost of construction for this project shall not exceed \$2,232,800 except as provided in the following paragraphs B, and C.
- B. Engineering design not to exceed \$24,500. Funds not used for this purpose may be used to increase maximum amount for construction, as included in paragraph A, above.
- C. Contract supervision and administration, field staking, construction inspection and testing to insure compliance with contract documents of a cost not to exceed \$183,300 or 8.3%. Funds not used for this purpose may be used to increase maximum amount for construction, as included in paragraph A, above.
- D. The total cost for this Agreement shall not exceed \$2,440,600.
- A written request must be made to the DISTRICT and a supplemental interlocal contract approved to increase any of the amounts noted above prior to payment of any additional funds.

- 3. The remainder of the original INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT, the SUPPLEMENTAL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT, the SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT and the THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT shall remain unchanged.
- 4. The Clark County Regional Flood Control District agrees that a portion of the additional funding provided by this FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT is to be used to fund work accomplished prior to the date of this FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT.

The Interlocal Agreement for construction of the adjoining project (Sandhill Road to Virgil Street) has been approved by the Regional Flood Control District. Based on this approval the City of Las Vegas has eliminated the inlet structure and associated work items on the Sandhill Road Outfall Structure. By eliminating the costs to build the inlet structure on this project and the costs to remove the inlet structure on the next project, the total savings in project costs for the two projects will be over \$150.000.

The Contractor encountered saturated soil conditions in the bottom of the trench for the triple 12' X 8' Reinforced Concrete Box Culvert. To stabilize the soil, the Contractor had to over-excavate the saturated soil and replace it with drain rock. Extra cost to the Contractor to do this work is \$61,891.85. Estimated savings by eliminating the inlet structure and the relocation of the 42" sewer and associated costs of other bid items are \$92.868.00. The net reduction in project costs is \$30.976.15.

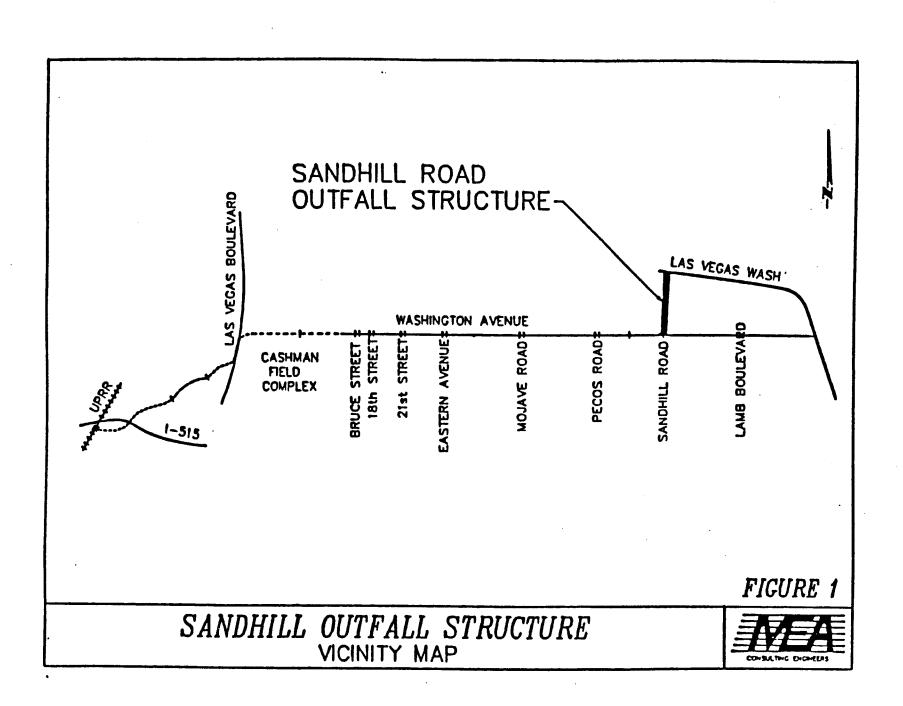

Section 1. NRS 543.360 is hereby amended to read as follows:

543.360 Acquisition, construction and operation of projects and improvements; conservation of water. The board may:

- 1. By the affirmative vote of two-thirds of its members, acquire, construct, improve, extend, maintain and operate:
- (a) Projects and improvements for the control of flood and storm waters of the district and the flood and storm waters of streams which have their sources outside of the district but flow into the district. Such a project or improvement must not be acquired unless it is included in the master plan.
 - (b) Projects which mitigate the adverse effect of the acquired projects.
- (c) Projects which are required as a result of the proposed alteration or diversion of a natural watercourse identified in the master plan for the control of drainage.

- (D) Give proposed location of deposit area and name and address of person which will receive excavated material and evidence that the property owner is willing to receive the material (if off-site).
- (E) Be accompanied by plans and specifications as required in Section 34.045.
 - (F) State the estimated quantities of earthwork involved, excavation and fill.
 - (G) Be signed by the permittee or his/her authorized agent, who may be required to submit evidence to indicate such authority.
 - (H) Give such other information as required in Section 34.045.
 - (I) A soils engineering report shall be required unless waived by the Designated Official.

34.030 Plans and Specifications: The Local Administrator may require that plans and specifications be prepared by a professional licensed to practice in the State of Nevada in accordance with Nevada Revised Statutes, Chapter 625. Each application for a grading permit shall be accompanied by two sets of plans and specifications. The plans shall be drawn to scale upon mylar or good quality, reproducible paper and shall be of sufficient clarity to indicate the nature and extent of the work proposed and shown in detail that they will conform to the provisions of this Chapter and all relevant laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.

The Local Administrator, or his designee, shall endorse in writing or stamp the plans and specifications "APPROVED". Such approved plans and specifications shall not be changed, modified or altered without authorization from the Designated Official and all work shall be performed in accordance with the approved plans. The first sheet of each set of plans shall give the location of the work and the name and address of the owner or developer and persons by whom the plans and specifications were prepared.

The plans and specifications shall show, but need not be limited to, the following information.

- (A) A general vicinity map of the proposed site.
- (B) Show property limits and accurate contours of the existing ground and details of the terrain referenced to a point approved by the Local Administrator. Whenever possible, elevations shall be in accordance with the established U.S. Coastal and Geodetic Survey, and the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929. Accurate contours beyond the property limits shall be displayed when appropriate to depict impacted topography and drainage impacts.

- (C) Show limiting dimensions, elevations and finished contours to be achieved by the proposed grading.
- (D) Show locations of all existing or proposed buildings, structures, fences, block walls and retaining walls on the property where the work is to be performed and the location of any buildings, structures, fences, block walls and retaining walls on land of adjacent owners which may be affected by or affect the proposed grading operation or site drainage.
- (E) Show locations and dimensions of all easements.
- (F) Show impacted utilities.
- (G) Delineate drainage which will impact, or be impacted by, the proposed grading.
- (H) Identify all existing and proposed surface and subsurface drainage devices, walls, channels and other protective measures to be constructed with, or part of, the proposed work.

The soils engineer shall review the final plans and specifications of the project and attest to, in writing, the soils reports applicability to the proposed project. The written information provided by the soils engineer shall be submitted for acceptance to the Designated Official, or his designee.

34.040 Additional Information Required: The Designated Official may require additional information such as an engineering geology report, or a drainage study. These studies and reports shall be approved by the Designated Official prior to the issuance of a grading permit. When specified by the soils investigation report, the Designated Official shall require a groundwater study.

34.045 Report Content: Plans, computations and specifications shall be prepared by a professional licensed to practice by the State of Nevada in accordance with NRS 625. The soils investigation report, groundwater study, and engineering geology report shall contain, but not be limited to, the following information.

(A) Plan Content:

- (1) A general vicinity map of the proposed site.
- (2) Show site limits and approximate contours. Whenever possible, elevations shall be in accordance with the established U.S. Coastal and Geodetic Survey, and the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929.
- (3) Location of explorations and field test locations.
- (4) Depth to groundwater if less than 15 feet that may affect the proposed development.

Page 19, Section 6.1(f) Landscaping and Aesthetic Enhancement of Projects:

Costs for landscaping and aesthetic enhancement will be allowed when specifically covered by Interlocal Contract. The amount of District funding and scope of such enhancements shall be established by the Board at the time the project is presented. Funding from the District shall be limited to the amount established by the Board. This amount, and the proposed scope of the work, must be specifically identified in the Interlocal Contact.

In the event that bids for the proposed work are less than the amount authorized by the Board, no more than the bid amount may be expended. If bids for the proposed work are higher than the amount specified in the Interlocal Contract, the entity may request that the Board increase the amount of funding authorized for the proposed work.

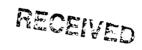

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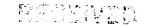

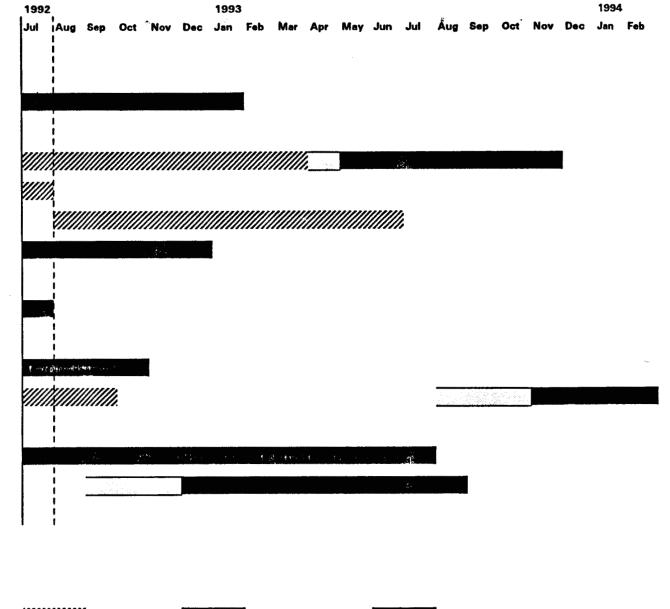

#### FLOOD AWARENESS & SAFETY STATUS AS OF 7/31/92

Flood Awareness Week RFCD Board declared week of May 10-16 as Flood Awareness Week. Letters went out to other entities requesting a like declaration or proclamation. Governor Bob Miller declared the same week for the entire state of Nevada.

**Entity Participation** 

All entities proclaimed the week of May 10-16, 1992 as Flood Awareness Week. Coordination was accomplished by RFCD staff. Clark County Personnel Dept. and the Las Vegas City Manager's Office agreed to publish an article in their employee newsletters. Clark County Public Works distributed flood awareness information and brochures at the Meadows Mall on May 29, 30 & 31.

Billboard

Three messages are being used. DONREY began the first placement starting 4/25 (9 posters @ 25% showing). During May we will had a 16 poster showing (50%); June includes 24 posters @ 75%; July - 24 @ 75%; August -24 @75%; Sept. 16 @ 50%. Work is being performed by MBD with Donrey as a subcontractor.

Milk Cartons

One million milk cartons were printed and distributed in May as a donation by Anderson Dairy. Coordination was made by MBD.

Newspaper Wrappers

Review Journal newspapers will be wrapped in bags printed with a flood safety message on rainy days. 160,000 will be distributed on each rainy day. The bag printer has had a delay in the shipment of the 2 million bags, originally scheduled for receipt in July. MBD now expects the bags to be available in early August. Work is being accomplished by MBD.

Earth Fair

Saturday, April 25th @ Sunset Park. RFCD invited Red Cross, Metro Search & Rescue, and the Nat'l Weather Service to join RFCD in presenting the dangers of flash floods to about 35,000 attendees. RFCD distributed literature; showed video footage; and had a master plan, project illustrations and project models available. Clark County sent some flood insurance flyers for distribution. A banner was printed for the booth and for future use. Work was performed by RFCD staff.

Meadows Mall Booth

MBD arranged with the Meadows Mall for a booth on Saturday, May 9. Rusty the Fox from the Fox 5 Kid's Club was present to hand out our coloring sheets. Regional Flood Control Staff manned the booth and answered questions about flood control, in addition to distributing literature.

Information Fairs

On Sunday, May 17th, RFCD participated at the Our Lady of Las Vegas Safety Fair arranged by the Knights of Columbus. Rusty the Fox assisted in the distribution of flood awareness materials by RFCD staff.

Red Rock Visitors Center

On Saturday, August 22, the District will be giving a presentation to children ages 6-12 at the Red Rock Recreation Center. The National Weather Service and Rusty the Fox have also agreed to join forces in informing the children about the dangers of flash floods. The Bureau of Land Management is sending out press releases and will coordinate the event.

Community Visits

The General Manager has teamed with Randy Oakes from Metro Search & Rescue in making visits to community groups such as Kiwanis, Optomists and Soroptomists to discuss the flood safety and the District's efforts.

Metro Police, Crime Prevention Bureau, has offered to utilize our flood safety video in their presentations to children's groups.

Fox 5 Kids Club

The "Info-mercial" has been produced and is now on the air. "Info-mercials" will run 12 times per week each week through the six-month period of April-September. Rusty the Fox has been available for several of the visits to children. Fox 5 placed our flood awareness message on the front cover of the May edition of the Kids Club Newsletter. Fox 5 Kids Club, McDonalds and RFCD sponsored a coloring/maze contest. RFCD staff arranged to distribute 20,000 copies to schools, SafeKey programs, and the libraries. Fox 5 and MBD arranged for McDonald's to collect the completed forms. RFCD staff has discovered, through the school visits, that most of the young children are familiar with the flood safety messages which are played on the Fox 5 Kids Club.

Kids Video

Channel 10 broadcast the video to public schools over the closed circuit channel at end of April. Channel 10 notified the teachers about the broadcast through a flyer. RFCD sent a letter to each principal asking for their cooperation. RFCD responded to several requests for additional information and for additional copies of the tape. Work coordinated by RFCD staff.

Visits to Kids

RFCD visited about 15 schools, Safe Key Programs, libraries, and other groups over the '92 flood-prone period. CAC has been asked to participate and one CAC member volunteered to assist at two events.

Maze/Coloring Contest

Fox 5 Kids Club, McDonalds and RFCD sponsored a coloring/maze contest which includes flood safety information. RFCD staff arranged to distribute 20,000 copies through schools, SafeKey programs, The Lied Children's Museum and the libraries. Fox 5 and MBD arranged for McDonald's to collect the completed forms. The coloring and maze sheet was designed by MBD, with the cost of printing paid by the District. A winner was drawn from each of three age divisions: 4-6, 7-9, and 10-12. Laughlin residents Megan Schaefer (6), and Michael Ziegler (8), along with Natalie Ann Christensen (10) of Las Vegas received dinner for four at McDonald's and a family pass at Scandia Family Fun Center.

Las Vegas Sanitation Billings

Artwork and printing was completed for a two sided bill stuffer (one side-artwork, second side-flood safety info). Sanitation was sent the first 10,000 to go out in May billings. They will insert 10,000 per month after. Assisted by Dennis Moyer, Tom McCaffrey, Mario Garcia and Frank Pearce @ City in obtaining this distribution. Arrangements were made by RFCD staff.

County Sanitation

They have agreed to use a bill stuffer in their quarterly billings. Arrangements were made by RFCD staff.

Nevada Power

A flood safety message was included in Nevada Power's Community Events brochures which went out in July. The utility estimates a distribution of approximately 300,000. Arrangements were made by RFCD staff.

Brochures

An updated brochure has been completed and is being distributed. Design and printing accomplished by MBD.

Media Manual

An informational manual was made available and/or distributed to the major news agencies which provides data and definitions about floods, desert storms and the District. We have received positive comments from the media. Work was accomplished by RFCD staff.

Interview Scheduling

Letters went out to local interview programs and news directors about flood awareness week and inviting interviews with the Board members and General Manager. Numerous requests have resulted. Work by RFCD staff.

TV Paid

We received equivalent of 122-paid spots during Flood Awareness Week and the week preceding. An additional 122-free spots were committed over the next couple of months. MBD produced four spots: two 10-second, and two thirty-second, which can also be used in future years. Work by MBD.

Sky View Traffic

This includes radio spots on Sky View Traffic and includes sponsorship of 10-second public service announcements over 18 local radio stations, 2 am, 2 pm/ every other week for twenty-two weeks from mid-April to mid-September. The first broadcast started the morning of 4/13. In addition, MBD was able to secure some free TV traffic sponsorships on Channel 13 (2), Channel 8 (6), and Sky View Traffic. Chopper Tom also want add'l updates of flood event information which he'll broadcast. Work by MBD staff with updates to Chopper Tom by RFCD staff.

Electronic Message Boards

Americana Realty has agreed to place a message on their Board on Sahara near Jones in inclement weather. We will continue to approach others for time. Work by RFCD staff.

Radio PSA's

On days of flooding, messages are faxed to local radio and TV stations to ask them to air PSA's and information about road closures and other dangerous conditions. These notifications have also generated interview requests. The National Weather Service also notifies the news via API wire. Work by RFCD staff.

Science Fair

A convention will be held for the science teachers in the State of Nevada in November. We have made our intent known to the School District that we would like to have the opportunity to present a program for the teachers. Work to be accomplished by RFCD staff.
