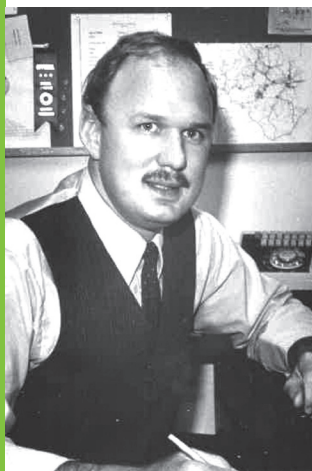
Welcome to Haywood County Schools for the 2022-23 school year. I am so proud of our school system and school community. No one has done more during the last two years to provide support and opportunity for our students and employees. We ended the 2020-21 school year ranked 10th among the state's 115 school systems in academic performance. Our performance during the 2021-22 school year was also strong. We are anxiously awaiting the release of our 2021-22 school year performance from the state.

Like much of North Carolina and the rest of the nation, we have experienced very challenging times. COVID-19 and significant civil unrest created volatile and unpredictable times. When COVID-19 hit, we made a conscious decision to do as much as we could for the community, our students, and our staff. We returned to in-person learning in October of 2019, five days a week. Most school systems only opened four days a week and 25 school systems in the state were closed for in-person learning for a year. We were able to provide many in-person and extracurricular activities early on, with very minimal school-related spread.

As we continue moving forward, I want to remind everyone to be kind, be smart, and be safe. I ask everyone to take personal responsibility for their health and their behavior. Haywood County Schools is a place for students to learn and have a variety of extracurricular opportunities. Haywood County Schools is not a place to criticize, embarrass, or discredit others for their race, sex or personal, political, social or religious beliefs.

I hope you have a wonderful school year. We are ready to serve our students with quality learning and extracurricular opportunities. We are counting on you to help us become even better.

Partners in Education

In May, the Haywood County Schools Foundation awarded 93 Pisgah, Tuscola, and Haywood Early College high school seniors with more than 120 scholarships totaling \$400,500. Scholarship amounts ranged from \$500 to \$48,000.

Currently, the Foundation manages more than 60 scholarships. Scholarships may be endowed or funded annually. Criteria for awarding the scholarship are designed by the donors and the Foundation board of directors. Endowed scholarships are generated through the investment of permanently-held principals so that only the income from the principal is used for scholarship awards.

BACK HOME IN HAYWOOD



Tuscola alumna Sarah Smart is returning to her stomping grounds this fall as the school's new agriculture/horticulture teacher.

Smart graduated from Tuscola in 2017 and received the Haywood County Schools Foundation's James and Betty Scott Memorial Scholarship. She moved to Raleigh and attended North Carolina State University where she majored in agriculture science with minors in agriculture business management and animal science.

During her freshman year of college, Smart's world was turned upside down when she was diagnosed with cancer.

"When I had cancer in college, it was the overwhelming support of people here who helped me. I think my life would be totally different if I didn't have that help," Smart explained. "Now I want to help the kids. I want them to understand ag, be critical thinkers and problem solvers."

Smart is now cancer free and looking forward to her next chapter in life on the hill at Tuscola.

"Other jobs I had applied for around Raleigh just didn't make my heart sing," Smart said. "I want to be home close to my family and be apart of teaching the next generation about the importance of our local agriculture community."

Smart is no stranger to agriculture. Along with getting a formal education at NC State, Smart grew up on her family's dairy farm in the Crabtree community where she milked, took care of calves, and helped with vegetable production.

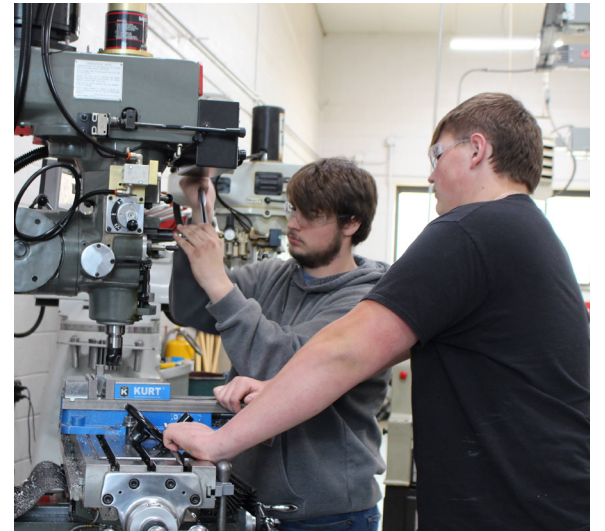
This semester, Smart will teach agri-science, horticulture I, and animal science I. Next semester, she will teach horticulture I and II and animal science I courses.

During each class, Smart will go over a wide variety of topics from food science to animal behavior to propagation techniques. Smart plans to incorporate hands-on and group activities into all of her classes.

Smart hopes to build upon the school's well-established agriculture and horticulture programs.

"I'm passionate about educating others about agriculture and preserving the heritage of farming," Smart said. "Part of my job is to reach the students and bridge the gap between students and farmers in the community."

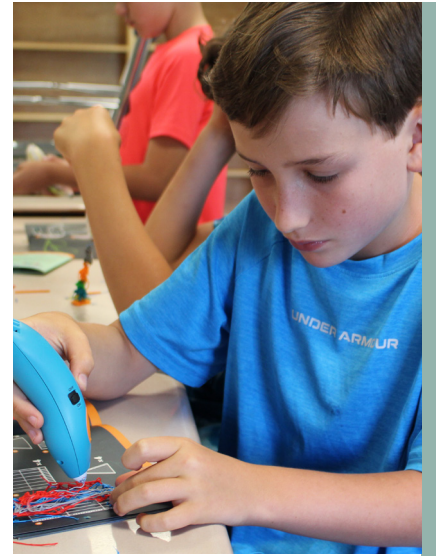
