BUILDING A GRAND KNIGHT

As we zero in on the month of June (and my birthday!), I thought it would be appropriate to talk about being the Grand Knight. The idea of assuming that officer position and its responsibilities does turn off a lot of members. But it doesn't have to be that way. Supreme's Duties of Council Officers list five things a Grand Knight should do: preside over meetings, appoint program and membership directors, appoint committees as needed, countersigns checks, and be responsible for the Exemplification Team That's it!, Yet, it seems he does much, much more, and I believe that is the challenge to our Council members. I believe we have gotten into the habit of letting the officers, particularly the Grand Knight, handle (or juggle) too many balls in the air at one time. Hence, that discourages members interested in the position.



What do we do about it? I have some suggestions and if they appear to go against our current policies and procedures, maybe it is time to update them. This month (June), we as a Council will create a new calendar and budget for the upcoming Columbian Year. My thought is that we should have a committee consisting of the current GK, DGK, FS, and a Trustee or two to create both. Another thought is that the keys could be in the possession of the warden. That person would be responsible for opening and closing of the Parish Center or gym (and storage areas). This follows logically since he currently sets up and takes down after meetings. Does that mean he only does it by himself? No, everyone should help pitch in. When it comes to events like St. Patrick's Day, the chairperson should have the keys. If we are to continue to have premeeting meals and snacks, a meal committee should be in place to handle that—a group of 5 guys would be great, so the primary responsibility of the meal can be rotated. Once again though, everyone should help with the cleanup. The list can go on, but I'll leave you with another thought—events that we have on the calendar should have a designated chairperson (or persons) well before the event occurs, or honestly, gentlemen, we shouldn't hold it. Events take a while to put things together and it is not the responsibility of only the officers (especially the Grand Knight) to do so. Anyone can chair an event. Not sure what to do? Those of us who have done these things before can help you get there. Quality events will benefit from your fresh input.

Okay, I'm getting off my soapbox—for now. Think about my proposals and let's consider putting these ideas (and more) into action to help us build a stronger council and attract a few more Knights to consider joining us.

ROSES FOR OUR MOTHERS/WIVES

Over Mother's Day weekend, the knights were tasked to sell 10 dozen roses with the proceeds going to the Sacramento Life Center. Founded in 1972 and located in the Arden area, the Sacramento Life Center is a state licensed and nationally accredited medical clinic whose mission is to offer free women's pregnancy health services, along with community resources and referrals, in a compassionate, non-judgmental environment.. They are committed to ensuring all women and teens, especially those who are pregnant and lack support, have access to medical care, resources, insurance, baby supplies and parenting support, for two years after the baby is born. Ninety-five percent of the mothers served are low-income. Women may come to the Life Center feeling alone and afraid, and leave with an entire support network.





With the hard work of the knights who worked at our three St. Mel Masses on

Mother's Day weekend, we are happy to say we **SOLD OUT** all 10 dozen of our roses, raising over \$1,200!! Many knights bought roses for their moms / significant others and the feedback from the moms was overwhelmingly positive.
