## **Gerard M. Anderson**President and Chief Operating Officer, DTE Energy Resources

Gerard M. Anderson, 43, is president and chief operating officer of DTE Energy Resources, one of the three major business units of DTE Energy (NYSE: DTE), a diversified energy company involved in the development and management of energy-related businesses and services nationwide. He is responsible for the company's more than 11,000 megawatts of generation and the associated fuel supply organization. He also is responsible for the company's subsidiaries focused on energy projects and services (DTE Energy Services), energy trading (DTE Energy Trading), coal marketing and transportation (DTE Coal Services), non-regulated power generation (DTE Generation) and biomass energy (DTE Biomass Energy).

Anderson joined Detroit Edison — the principal operating subsidiary of DTE Energy — as vice president, non-utility business, in 1993. As chief executive officer of DTE Biomass Energy, DTE Energy Services, and DTE Energy Coal Services, he led efforts to expand the company's landfill gas power generation business, to supply projects and services to large industrial, institutional and commercial clients, and to provide coal and transportation services to utilities and industrial customers. In April 1997, he became executive vice president, DTE Energy, where he directed the company's \$11 billion power generation, power marketing, coal supply and marketing activities.

Anderson was senior engagement manager, McKinsey & Co., Inc., an international management consulting firm, from 1988-1993. There he worked closely with the senior management of companies, focusing on the energy sector and financial institutions. In 1986-87, he worked for an economic forecasting group, The Research Seminar in Quantitative Economics, and the U.S. Congressional Budget Office. Anderson also worked at R.T.K.L Associates, Inc. and The Collaborative, Inc., serving as an engineer and project manager for these two architectural/engineering firms from 1981-1985.

Anderson earned a bachelor of science degree in civil engineering at the University of Notre Dame. He also earned a master of business administration degree and a master of public policy degree from the University of Michigan.

Anderson is involved in various local community and civic activities, and he serves on the board of trustees and executive committee of The Nature Conservancy, Michigan chapter; the Michigan Greenways Initiative, and the Michigan Thanksgiving Day Parade Company.
