Anthony F. Earley Jr.

Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, DTE Energy

Anthony F. Earley Jr., 51, is chairman and chief executive officer of DTE Energy (NYSE: DTE), a diversified energy company involved in the development and management of energy-related businesses and services nationwide.

Earley joined Detroit Edison as president and chief operating officer in March 1994. His responsibilities included a broad range of utility operations, as well as focusing on developing the workforce skills and workplace culture needed for Detroit Edison to be successful in a changing utility environment. He was also actively involved in Michigan's efforts to restructure the electric utility industry in the state.

From 1989-1994, Earley served as president and chief operating officer of the Long Island Lighting Co. (LILCO), an electric and gas utility in New York. Prior to 1989, he served LILCO in several other positions, including executive vice president and general counsel. Earley joined LILCO in 1985 from the law firm of Hunton & Williams, where he had been a partner. A member of that firm's energy and environmental team, he had participated in the licensing of both nuclear and non-nuclear generating plants and represented a substantial number of nuclear utilities in rulemaking actions before the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

Earley earned a bachelor of science degree in physics, a master of science degree in engineering and a law degree, all from the University of Notre Dame. He served as an officer in the United States Navy nuclear submarine program where he was qualified as a chief engineer officer.

Earley is a member of the board of directors of Mutual of America Capital Management Corp., Comerica Bank and Henry Ford Health Systems. He is on the board of directors of Detroit Renaissance, New Detroit and the United Way Community Services. He is involved in a number of educational and civic organizations, including the advisory council for the College of Engineering at the University of Notre Dame, the board of trustees of the Detroit Zoological Society, the board council of Loyola High School, and the executive board of Cornerstone Schools.
