He died March 31, 1888 and is buried in Weakley Cemetery near New Albany, Kans. Her mother was Elizabeth Hoket Gable, who was born in Greene Co., Tenn., and died in Platte Co., Mo.

Elias Thomas Maxwell was born Jan. 18, 1855 in Clay Co., Mo., near Liberty. He died Oct. 26, 1909. He married Harriett Belle Busby Sept. 3, 1884. Their children were Maurice Busby and Susan Beatrice Maxwell. Maurice Busby Maxwell married Minnie Virginia Ward and Susan Beatrice Maxwell married Melvin Edson. George Washington Maxwell was born Oct. 26, 1856 at Trading Post, Linn Co., Kans. and died Feb. 1945. He married Catherine (Kate) Butts on Feb. 21, 1883. Their daughters were Orpha and Orme Maxwell. Orpha Maxwell married Fred Gump and their children were Massena and Georgia Lois. Orme married Walter Ogle and their children were Audra, Kathryn, Orpha Pearl and Robert. The son of George and Catherine Butts Maxwell was Zor Maxwell who married Zelda Hudson. They had no children. Zor was a veteran of World War I. Letitica Elizabeth Maxwell was born Nov. 24, 1858 at Trading Post, Kans. and died Sept. 23, 1942. She married Oliver P. Hedge Aug. 5, 1885. Their children were Glenn born Sept. 2, 1887 and Zuma Josephine born June 18, 1889. Glenn married Consouella Justice and they had no children. Zuma married George M. Grimes and was divorced from him and took back her maiden name of Hedge. There were no children from this marriage.

* Came with his wife and four oldest children to Wilson County, near New Albany in 1865.

Francis Maxwell born May 3, 1850 at Trading Post, Kans. and died Oct. 11, 1860.

Martha Maxwell born Sept. 2, 1861 at Trading Post, Kans. Died Nov. 21, 1943. She married Sanders Badgley Mar. 19, 1882 and their children were Burr, Basil and Otto Badgley. Burr married Edna Hicox and there were no children. Basil married Clintie Stallings and there were no children. Otto married Velma Busby and their children were Bernie Dale Badgley and Betty Jo Badgley.

Ulysses Simpson Grant Maxwell was born April 5, 1865 at New Albany, Kans. and died Nov. 3, 1930. He married Dora Wilson on Jan. 9, 1886. Their children were Tabitha, Zoe and Robert. Tabitha married Braden Dunham and their only child was Billy Dunham. Zoe married Lowell Jones and their only child was Donald Jones. Robert died when he was a small child.

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Schuyler Maxwell born Nov. 2, 1868 at New Albany, Wilson Co., Kans. and died Sept. 16, 1872.

Ellen Mae (Ella) Maxwell born May 6, 1871 at New Albany. Died Dec. 22, 1944 (buried at Forest Lawn Cemetery, Los Angeles, Calif.) Married Mason Wilson Jan. 9, 1886, and their children were Elizabeth and Vera. Her second husband was Cyrus Busby whom she married July 3, 1907. There were no children from her second marriage. Elizabeth (Bessie) married Cleveland Polson and their two children were Grant and Bonnie Polson. Vera Wilson married Alvin McCall and their two children were Arthur and Shirley McCall. Arthur Robert Maxwell was born Feb. 3, 1874 at New Albany, Kans., and died in 1942 at Nashua, Montana. He is buried in the cemetery at Glasgow, Montana. He never married.

FAMILY OF BARNABAS GABLE

Barnabas Gable was born in 1770 in Pa., and married Elizabeth Cohen on Dec. 18, 1795 in Greene Co., Tenn. His name appears on the muster roll of a company of gunmen under the command of Capt. Daniel Ross in the service of the U. S. commanded by John Coffee from Sept. 24, 1813 to Dec. 24, 1813, during the War of 1812. Each non-commissioned officer, musician and private travelled 114 miles to Huntsville where they were mustered into service. beth Cohen was born in 1780 in Fa., and died in Greene Co., Tenn. The children of Barnabas and Elizabeth Cohen Gable were: Hiram Gable, born 1810, Greene Co., Tenn.; Barnabas Gable, born Feb. 14, 1812, in Greene Co., Tenn., married Mary Henderson. Removed to Platte Co., Mo. in 1839 and to Kansas in Feb., 1855; Elias Gable, born in 1813 in Greene Co., Tenn., and died Mar. 31, 1888, and is buried in the Maxwell family plot at Weakley Cemetery, Wilson Co., Kans. He married Elizabeth Hoket, born in Greene Co., Tenn. and died in Platte Co., Mo.

Elias Gable and Elizabeth Hoket Gable removed from Greene Co., Tenn. to Platte Co., Mo. in 1832 or 1833. Their children were: Henry Gable, born Jan. 28, 1832 in Greene Co., Tenn. and died July 23, 1910 at Edmond, Okla. (Okla. Co.). He married Abigail Bowers Feb. 25, 1897. (He was a prisoner of war at Galveston, Tex. during the Civil War, having been captured at Poison Springs, Ark. during a battle for supplies there.)

The second child of Elias and Elizabeth Hoket Gable was Elizabeth Jane born Oct. 13, 1833, Platte Co., Mo., and died April 9, 1909. She married Eli Roach. The third child of Elias and Elizabeth Hoket Gable was Tabitha Gable, born Mar. 3, 1835, Liberty, Mo., married Robert Maxwell April 2, 1854 at the Christian Church in Carthage, Mo. She died Mar. 15, 1922. The fourth child of Elias and Elizabeth Hoket Gable was William Gable, born Feb. 1; 1838, at Platte Co., Mo. He married Harriet Odum and died Feb. 29, 1908.

A. M. DRAKE IS FOUND DEAD IN BED

Well Known Resident of Walnut Township in Reno County Dies Without a Struggle

A. M. Drake, who made his home with his son Homer, was found dead in bed Friday morning, death having evidently occurred about three hours before he was found. Mr. Drake has been an asthma sufferer for years, and the few days before his death he was quite uncomfortable. However, he was no worse than he had been many times before, so no especial uneasiness was felt concerning his condition. His son went to his bedroom door and looked in on him a couple of times during the night, but thought his father was just sleeping comfortably. Instead, he had passed away, apparently without a struggle.

Funeral services were held at the Salem church Saturday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Reeves. The Alden male quartette sang several numbers during the services. The body was laid to rest in the family lot in the Peace Valley cemetery. The following obituary was read at the funeral.

Arthur Mervin Drake, oldest son of Francis and Jane Drake, was born near Liberty, Ind., November 25, 1854, and passed this life March 29, 1929, age 75 years, 4 months and 4 days.

He was married to Carrie H. Christman September 17, 1882, near Eaton, Ohio. To this union was born four sons, Ed, Chester, Homer and Dewey.

Dewey died at the age of sixteen months in 1898. Mrs. Drake preceded her husband in death on May 8, 1919.

For a while after her death, he resided in Alden later moving to Hutchinson with his son, Chester. For the last five years he has made his home with his son, Homer, at whose home he passed this life.

Since childhood he has been a sufferer of asthma, the disease that was the direct cause of his death.

In search of better health he and his family moved to Tennessee, and from there moved to near Alden, Kansas.

Funeral services for the late Mrs. A. M. Drake, of Alden, were held in the Methodist church in Alden Saturday and were conducted by Rev. W. L. Hinshaw, of this city, assisted by Rev. Coppedge, of Alden. A quartette sang four hymns. The body lay amid a profusion of lovely flowers that had been sent with messages of sympathy from many friends, and the large concourse of relatives and friends present at the service bespoke the esteem in which Mrs. Drake had been held. Burial was made in the Peace Valley cemetery.

NAMES OF SOLDIER DEAD OF CIVIL WAR ONCE AGAIN TO BE RECORDED IN STONE ON WAR MONUMENT HERE

Following long hours of painstaking work the time scarred and obliterated names on the soldiers' monument in the court house park have been deciphered or supplied from official army lists and the roll of Centerville's heroic soldier dead of the Civil war is again complete.

Miss Clara Pullman, daughter of Veteran D. J. Pullman, aided by members of the G. A. R., has brot the list of names to completion. They were first inscribed on the soldier's monument in the park many years ago. Cut in marble, they have been practically obliterated by the work of the elements in wearing away, to a small extent, the stone. Now they are to be renewed by being cut into granite and placed once again on the shaft. The section of marble which held the names formerly will be removed to make way for the more lasting stone.

These names which the men themselves first cut forever on the honor roll of this nation, mean much to Appanoose county. They are an heritage to be carefully preserved. In nearly every instance some family or some person in Appanoose county can feel a glow of pride at the mention of a name inscribed on the monument. They were fathers, grandfathers, and great-grandfathers, or uncles to hundreds of people now living in this county.

The list of names that will adorn the new granite place in the monument and which are now gathered together in readable form for the first time in many years, is as follows.
