



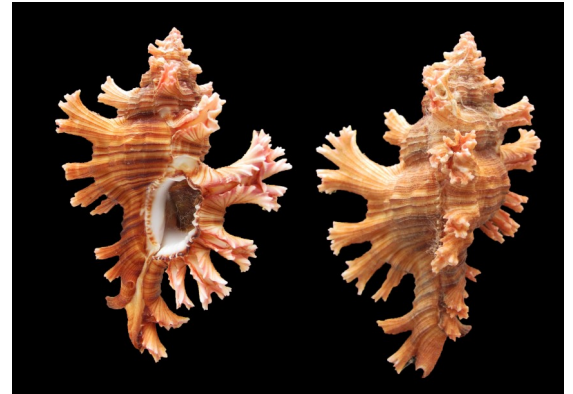

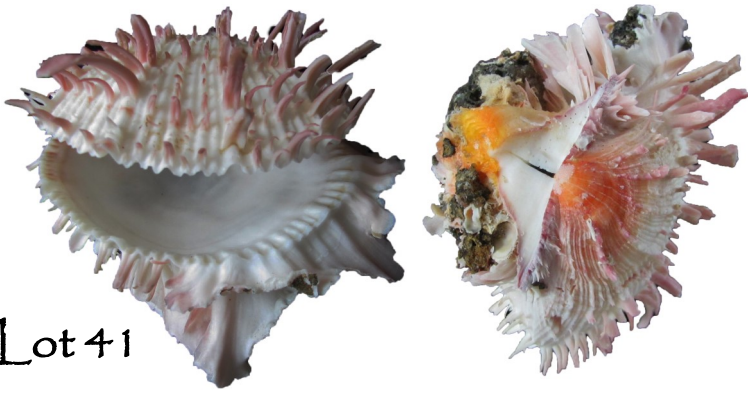

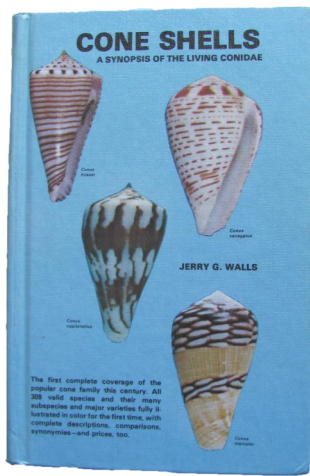

A must have book for these two popular Genera of shells.

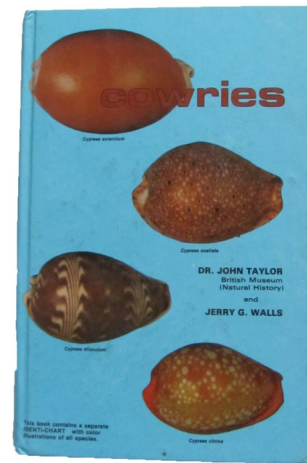

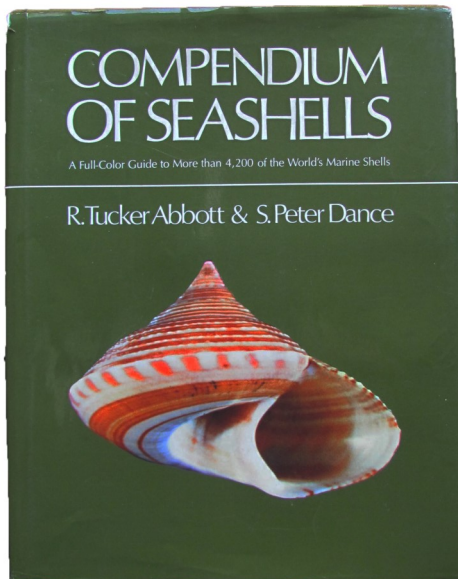

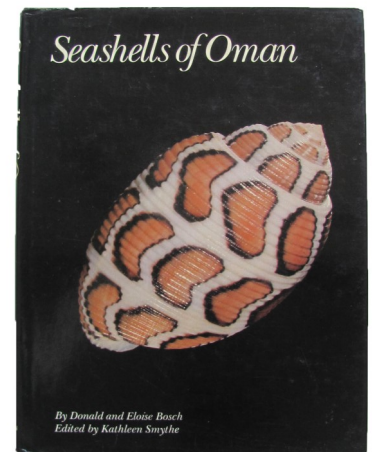
Compendium of Seashells; Abbott & Dance

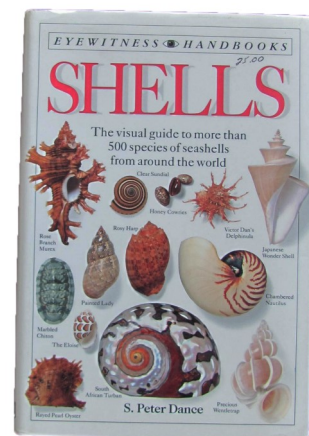

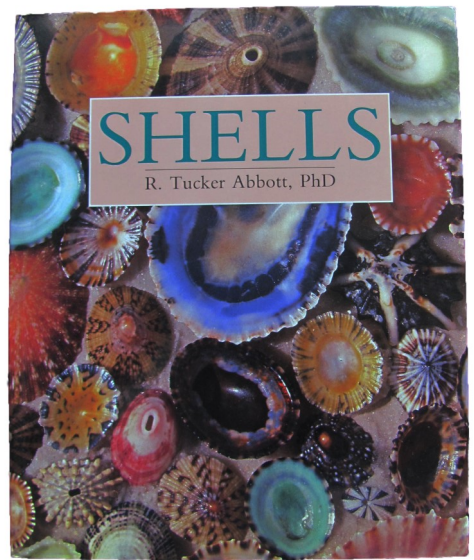

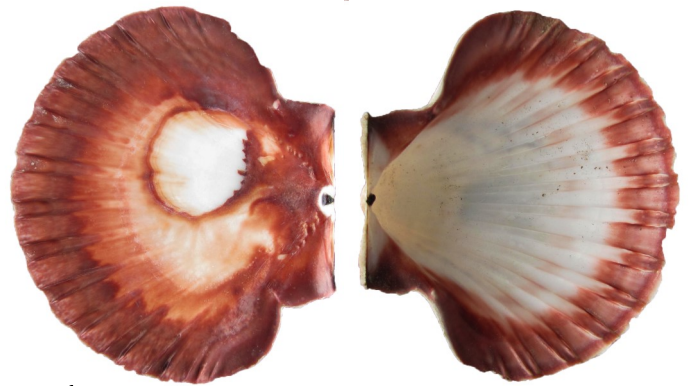
