

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

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


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INTRODUCTION

The southwestern United States is not abundantly provided with watercourses. The single most important river is the Colorado. It enters the state of Arizona from the northeast, flows through a series of deep canyons, and emerges in the vicinity of Grand Wash Cliffs near the northwestern corner of that state. Here its flow is impeded by Hoover Dam, with the expanded waters forming Lake Mead, this country's largest man-made reservoir. The Colorado then flows almost due south through low desert country, serving as the boundary between Arizona and Nevada (and farther southward, the boundary between Arizona and California). Near the extreme southern tip of Nevada, the river's flow is again impeded by a closure, Davis Dam, forming a second smaller reservoir, Lake Mohave. The river eventually empties into the Gulf of California, some 40 miles south of the international boundary.

Historically and geologically, the Grand Wash Cliffs mark the lower (western) terminus of the Grand Canyon. From this spectacular escarpment to Davis Dam, a distance of some 160 miles, the Colorado River, Lakes Mead and Mohave, and adjacent lands constitute a major portion of the Lake Mead National Recreation Area (LMNRA). To the east of Grand Wash Cliffs, LMNRA's boundaries are extended to include two essentially disjunct regions: a part of the Hualapai Indian Reservation south of and bordering the Colorado River, and north of the river, a portion of the high elevation Shivwitz Plateau. Nearly 1.5 million acres in northwestern Arizona and southern Nevada are encompassed within the boundaries of LMNRA (frontispiece).

In order to document the occurrence and distribution of the flora and fauna of LMNRA, the U. S. National Park Service, in cooperation with the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, instituted a Resources Basic Inventory. The present report is part of that larger study and includes information on the vascular plants within the recreation area. The annotated list of taxa, which forms the bulk of this report, has been compiled on the basis of actual collections, collections cited in literature, and observations. Preceeding this list are brief descriptions of the prevailing physical features, early botanical activities within the area, and the major perennial vegetation types.

PHYSIOGRAPHY

The topography of the recreation area is varied, a reflection of its location astride the boundaries of two different physiographic provinces (Fenneman 1931). To the west and south of Grand Wash Cliffs is the Basin and Range Province, with a landscape characterized by numerous, mostly isolated, north-south trending desert mountains. These are generally steep, rugged and sparsely vegetated. Valley basins, bajadas and playas are associated topographic features. Land forms within this portion of LMNRA generally lie below the 915 m (3,000 ft.) level, but elevations range

from near 150 m (500 ft.) at river level near Davis Dam to as much as 1645 m (5,400 ft.) on nearby ranges (i.e., the Newberry Mountains).

Another portion of LMNRA, north and east of Grand Wash Cliffs, lies within the Colorado Plateau Province. This is a high elevation tableland, deeply incised in this area by the Colorado River. Near this easternmost boundary, the river is around the 490 m (1,600 ft.) level. It is flanked on either side by deep, rugged, lateral side canyons that drain surrounding higher elevations. To the north of the river are exposed two well-marked tables or benches: the Sanup at approximately 1400 m (4,600 ft.), and the Shivwitz at the 1830 m (6,000 ft.) level. The Shivwitz extends northward into Utah as a gently rolling tableland, marked by occasional lava-capped buttes. One of these, Mt. Dellenbaugh, rises to 2,132 m (6,990 ft.), and is the highest point in LMNRA.

HISTORICAL ACCOUNT OF BOTANICAL ACTIVITIES

Over the years the area encompassed by LMNRA has been visited by numerous professional botantists. However, published records of these expeditions are few.

In the 1800's several botanists travelled the historic route from Santa Fe to southern California, observing and probably collecting plants in the area of "the Great Bend of the Colorado River". From information compiled by Ewan (1950), the first of these professional botanists may have been Gambel in 1841. Others were Fremont in 1844; Bestor, who accomplished the Emory expedition of 1846; and Rothrock of the Wheeler survey party in the early 1870's. Of these, reports of collections are available for Rothrock, in his "Notes on economic botany" and "Catalogue of plants" (Rothrock 1878). Fremont, during his second expedition, collected around 1,400 specimens, but more than half of these were ruined in a flood. Only a small portion of those saved were usable; these have been recorded by Torrey (1845).

Other early botanists of note include the Frenchman Remy (Ewan 1950), who, in 1855, passed through the area enroute from Salt Lake to St. George and Los Angeles; also, the surgeon-naturalist Newberry, attached to the Ives exploring expedition of 1856. Newberry ascended the Colorado River from its mouth to Fortification Rock, a landmark located near the bend of the Colorado River (Ives 1861). In 1870, Edward Palmer travelled southward from Salt Lake, making many collections along the way (McVaugh 1956). Palmer made stops at Calville (a site now submerged under the waters of Lake Mead) and Eldorado (Canyon), before proceeding on to Ft. Mohave. He was in the same general vicinity again in the spring of 1877.

A.L. Siler, a Mormon traveller from Kane County, Utah is reported by Ewan (1950) to have collected cacti in the 1890's along the walls of the Grand Canyon. His collections are deposited in the Gray and Missouri Botanical Garden herbaria.

In 1891, naturalists associated with the Death Valley Expedition made excursions within the modern day boundaries of the recreation area. Coville, the chief botanist of the expedition, spent eight days in March exploring the Las Vegas valley, Las Vegas Wash and the Black Canyon of the Colorado River. The following month, C. Hart Merriam and Vernon Bailey departed Cajon Pass, California, following a route through Las Vegas valley, Las Vegas Wash, St. Thomas, Overton, and the Virgin River to St. George. Bailey separated from the party and travelled southward through Detrital Wash and the Dolan Springs area of Arizona. Collections made by these parties have been recorded in North American Fauna (Merriam 1893), and in Coville's "Botany of the Death Valley Expedition", 1893.

Collectors in the early 1900's included L. N. Goodding and Marcus Jones (Ewan 1950). Goodding, in 1902, followed the Muddy River south to the Virgin and Colorado Rivers and the Las Vegas Wash. His collections are preserved in the Rocky Mountain Herbarium and at the New York Botanical Garden. Jones collected widely in the western United States. According to his own account (Jones 1965), his first trip into present day LMNRA actually occurred in 1894, and was related to his acceptance of a seasonal position with the U. S. government to explore the region of the Grand Canyon of the Colorado. In April of that year he collected along the Muddy River and in the Grand Wash and Pierce Ferry areas. Jones returned to the same general region in April of each year from 1903-1905, and collected in Eldorado Canyon in 1907. A set of his valuable collections is housed in the herbarium of Rancho Santa Ana Botanic Garden.

During the next 40-year interval little botanical exploration was conducted within the boundaries of the recreation area. However, the Spring Mountains in western Clark County, Nevada were being examined intensively in the mid 1930's and early 1940's. This work resulted in a flora of the Charleston (Spring) Mountains by Clokey, in 1951.

In more recent years the inner gorge of the Colorado River within Mohave County, Arizona has been the site for the majority of botanical effort in LMNRA. Among the first to work in this area were Clover and Jotter (1941, 1944), who studied cacti and prepared a checklist for the riparian community. Martin (1971) and Martin et al. (1973) studied the vegetation along this section of the river. Phillips and Phillips (1974) and Phillips (1975) have provided information on plants occurring in the lower Grand Canyon. The Museum of Northern Arizona and Carothers et al. (1974) compiled a bibliography and preliminary checklist for the lower Grand Canyon region. Information concerning late Pleistocene and modern plant communites have been provided for the Canyon area by Laudermilk and Munz (1934), Phillips and VanDevender (1974), VanDevender and Mead (1976), and Phillips (1977).

Additional information concerning the flora of Clark County, Nevada has been provided by Deming (1953). This checklist was compiled primarily from the work of Clokey (1951) in the Spring Mountain Range. One of the few copies of Deming's manuscript is included in the special collection of the library of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. Jonez and Summer (1954) published a partial list of plants collected by them in the Lake Mead region. Among the more recent publications treating the botany of Clark County, and relating in varying degree to LMNRA are those of Bradley (1966, 1967),

Bradley and Deacon (1967) and Bradley and Niles (1970). These papers treat the northward extension of Sonoran Desert elements, a geographical analysis of the flora, biotic communities, and the ecology of Las Vegas Wash. Papers by Mehringer (1965) and Leskinen (1969) discuss aspects of late Pleistocene vegetation in southern Nevada.

VEGETATION TYPES

As noted above, the established boundaries of LMNRA outline an area whose physical features are characteristic of, and transitional between, two physiographic provinces. This same area is also transitional in regard to its vegetation, for it supports plant life characteristic of three of the four North American deserts, the Great Basin, Mojave, and Sonoran.

The area encompassed by LMNRA occurs primarily in what has been geographically and biologically designated as the Mojave Desert. Vegetation characteristic of this region is therefore most common and widespread, usually at low to mid elevations (600-1200 m, 2,000-4,000 ft.). But elements of the other two deserts merge and overlap in at least some portion of LMNRA. At the higher elevations (generally above 1200 m, 4,000 ft.) there occur Great Basin vegetative types that enter the area from the north. At the lowest elevation zones (below 600 m, 2,000 ft.) are occasional plants representative of the more southern Sonoran Desert.

The predominant feature of the vegetation is its shrubbiness. Tree forms occur with regularity only on the higher elevation plateaus (Sanup and Shivwitz), the upper reaches of the Newberry Mountains, as occasional stands of Joshua-trees, along well established watercourses, or at spring/seep sites. Elsewhere, the terrain is marked by shrub communities. These are dominated by one to several shrub species that exhibit similarity in life form, height and color, and impart an impression of monotony.

During Spring months the apparent monotony of this perennial vegetation may be relieved by the appearance of large numbers of ephemeral, herbaceous plants. Their occurrence follows periods of moderate to heavy winter rains; and although they are short lived in nature, they form a conspicuous seasonal element of the desert vegetation.

For the purpose of this report the perennial vegetation of LMNRA has been divided into eight vegetation types, each of which is characterized by one or more dominant species.

Creosote-bush type.

Creosote-bush (<u>Larrea tridentata</u>) alone or with its most common associate, bur-sage (<u>Ambrosia dumosa</u>), dominates Mojave Desert communities, and is the most abundant and widespread type within the recreation area. It forms nearly pure stands on intermountain plains, lower bajadas and fans, from the lowest elevations to approximately 1100 m (3,500 ft.). Its best development occurs in coarse, well-drained soils with a total salinity of less than 0.02% (Shantz and Piemeisel 1924). Rainfall over the area is 150 mm (6 in.) or

considerably less, resulting in a simple community physiognomy with low species diversity and usually broad spacing of shrubs. <u>Larrea</u> and <u>Ambrosia</u> may comprise as much as 90-100% of the vegetation, with the remaining small percentage made up of other shrubs and cacti.

At higher elevations (upper bajadas) creosote-bush gives way to black-brush (<u>Coleogyne</u>) type, and in lower basins it may be replaced by the salt-bush (<u>Atriplex</u>) type.

The more common subdominant taxa include:

Atriplex canescens (four-wing salt-bush)

Krameria spp. (ratany)

Lycium spp. (wolf-berry)

Encelia farinosa (brittle-bush)

Ephedra nevadensis (Mormon-tea)

Yucca schidigera (Mojave yucca)

Eriogonum fasciculatum (buckwheat)

Opuntia basilaris (beaver-tail cactus)

Thamnosma montana (turpentine-broom).

In arroyos or desert washes that dissect the terrain these same species may attain a more robust form. Here they are joined by the more typical desert wash species:

Acacia greggii (catclaw)

Salazaria mexicana (bladder-sage)

Psorothamnus fremontii (indigo-bush)

Prosopis glandulosa var. torreyana (mesquite)

Hymenoclea salsola (burrow-bush)

Chilopsis linearis (desert-willow).

Salt-bush type.

In lower regions of basins and valleys (and occasionally on slopes), where soils are heavier and salt content rises to around 0.2% (Shantz and Piemeisel 1924), creosote-bush is replaced by this type. Under these conditions one or more shrubby species of salt-bush assume dominance: Atriplex polycarpa, A. confertifolia (shad-scale), A. hymenelytra (desert-holly), and A. canescens (four-wing salt-bush). The phreatophytic mesquite (Prosopis glanulosa var. torreyana) and Haplopappus acradenius var. eremophilus are often present as subdominants.

If a dry lake or playa has been formed within the basin the salt-bush occurs in a circular zone, giving way near the playa edge to more salt tolerant and succulent members of the chenopod family, e.g. Allenrolfea spp. (iodine-bush), Suaeda spp. (seep-weed) and Nitrophila occidentalis. The playa itself is usually devoid of plant life.

Areas as described above are not extensive within LMNRA, but occur in widely scattered sites within the creosote-bush and black-brush types. Salt-bush type may also occur at the restricted seep/spring sites within the recreation area. In these places the species enumerated above are joined by typical phreatophytic vegetation, e.g. Pluchea sericea (arrowweed) and Tamarix spp. (salt-cedar).

Black-brush type.

In many places in LMNRA black-brush (<u>Coleogyne ramosissima</u>) replaces creosote-bush on upper bajadas or on old alluvium overlain with limestone-derived rocks. It tends to occupy a zone elevationally intermediate (1100-1500 m, 3,500-4,900 ft.) between the creosote-bush so typical of the lower Mojave Desert and either the Great Basin sagebrush or pinyon-juniper types of the higher elevations. The climate is colder than that of the lower creosote-bush areas, and snow is common for short periods in winter. Annual precipitation is approximately 200 mm (8 in.).

This type is relatively simple floristically. <u>Coleogyne</u> occurs as nearly pure stands, with the grayish-black shrubs rather closely spaced and averaging about 60 cm (2 ft.) in height. Common associated perennial species are:

Yucca baccata (banana yucca)
Yucca brevifolia (Joshua-tree)
Eurotia (Ceratoides) lanata (winter-fat)
Thamnosma montana (turpentine-broom)
Ephedra viridis (Mormon-tea)
Salazaria mexicana (bladder-sage)
Salvia dorrii (sage)
Menodora spinescens.

Joshua-tree woodland type.

This type is unique to the Mojave Desert; its distribution nearly outlining the extent of this phytogeographic region. Joshua-tree (Yucca brevifolia) usually occurs at the same elevational zone as black-brush, but occupies the more loose, less rocky soils of gentle slopes. The structure is one of Joshua-tree overstory and an understory of various shrubs, often black-brush. Other common perennials are:

Larrea tridentata (creosote-bush)

Salazaria mexicana (bladder-sage)

Hymenoclea salsola (burrow-bush)

Ephedra nevadensis (Mormon-tea)

Yucca baccata (banana yucca)

Menodora spinescens

Thamnosma montana (turpentine-broom)

Eurotia (Ceratoides) lanata (winter-fat)
Grayia spinosa (hop-sage)
Atriplex spp. (salt-bush).

True Joshua-tree woodland is uncommon in the recreation area. An extensive population in the Meadview-Grapevine Mesa region is a northern extension of what may well be the largest and finest stand of this plant.

Riparian type.

This vegetation type is restricted within LMNRA to margins of permanent watercourses. It is characterized by typical palustrine species and various phreatophytes that establish themselves in areas of silt-sand build up with high moisture content. It is well represented in Las Vegas Wash, on the banks of the Muddy, Virgin and Colorado Rivers, and in scattered lakeshore regions. It is also present at many of the seeps or springs, where, depending upon the mineral content of the available water, it mixes with elements of the salt-bush type. Tree, shrub and perennial herb species are included:

Salix spp. (willow) Tamarix spp. (salt-cedar) Populus fremontii (cottonwood) Prosopis glandulosa var. torreyana (mesquite) Prosopis pubescens (screw-bean mesquite) Typha spp. (cat-tail) Pluchea sericea (arrow-weed) Distichlis stricta (salt-grass) Phragmites australis (reed) Juncus spp. (rush) Carex spp. (sedge) Atriplex spp. (salt-bush) Suaeda spp. (seep-weed) Allenrolfea occidentalis (iodine-bush) Anemopsis californica (yerba-mansa).

Sagebrush type.

Big sagebrush (<u>Artemisia tridentata</u>) forms the dominant cover over portions of the Shivwitz, and to a lesser extent, the Sanup Plateaus. This typical Great Basin type occurs predominantly above 1500 m (4,900 ft.), in deeper, well-drained soils. Near the 1800 m (5,500 ft.) level, and on more rocky surfaces, this shrubby type gives way to an arborescent xeric woodland of pinyon and juniper. At its lower limits it commonly forms a narrow ecotone with the black-brush type. Annual precipitation ranges from 250-300 mm (10-12 in.). Common associates are:

Artemisia arbuscula (low sagebrush)
Gutierrezia sarothrae (snake-weed)
Chrysothamnus spp. (rabbit-brush)
Atriplex confertifolia (shad-scale)
Coleogyne ramosissima (black-brush)
Eurotia (Ceratoides) lanata (winter-fat).

Pinyon-juniper woodland type.

Occurrence of this type in LMNRA is restricted to one small area (the Newberry Mountains) at the southern boundary, and to high elevations atop the Sanup and Shivwitz Plateaus. Pinyon (Pinus monophylla) and juniper (Juniperus osteosperma) form this xerix woodland, with best development taking place on rocky, shallow soils, generally at elevations between 1375 m (4,500 ft.) and 1950 m (6,500 ft). Annual precipitation averages around 350 mm (14 in.). Juniper tends to dominate in the lower parts of the range, while at higher elevations pinyon achieves codominant status. The aspect is one of general openness, with scattered trees and a shrub understory of black-brush (Coleogyne) or big sagebrush (Artemisia).

In local regions with deeper soils and greater water content a brushy type of vegetation may occur, so as to obscure or interrupt the open aspect so characteristic otherwise. Principle shrub associates include:

Quercus gambelii (Gambel oak)
Quercus turbinella (scrub oak)
Amelanchier utahensis (Utah serviceberry)
Cercocarpus spp. (mountain-mohagany)
Rhus trilobata (squaw-bush)
Ceanothus greggii
Garrya flavescens (silk-tassel)
Arctostaphylos spp. (manzanita).

Ponderosa pine woodland type.

Ponderosa pine or western yellow pine (Pinus ponderosa) is restricted in occurrence to the Shivwitz Plateau, at 1800 m (6,000 ft.) and higher. Its best development takes place in deep soils along drainage bottoms, where annual precipitation averages around 450 mm (18 in.). In general it forms an open woodland with an understory comprised of a mixture of shrubs and herbs. But in some plateau regions dominance may be shared by the tree form of Quercus gambelii (Gambel oak), or this broad-leaved species may even replace ponderosa pine in localized areas. The most common associates are:

Quercus gambelii (Gambel oak)
Quercus turbinella (scrub oak)
Cercocarpus spp. (mountain-mohagany)
Artemisia tridentata (big sagebrush)
Chrysothamnus spp. (rabbit-brush)

Arctostaphylos spp. (manzanita) Amerlanchier utahensis (Utah serviceberry).

ANNOTATED LIST OF TAXA

The following checklist of vascular plant taxa has been compiled from actual collections, observations, and literature citations.

Collections are primarily those made over the years and during the course of this study by personnel at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. They form part of an extensive regional herbarium maintained at the university. These entries in the checklist are identified by collection number alone (i.e. without herbarium designation). Entries designated by the abbreviation (UNLV) only, represent observations made by members of the study team, or in a few instances, specimens without a collector's number that are on deposit in the University of Nevada's herbarium.

The checklist also references collections made by National Park Service personnel and retained at the headquarters in Boulder City. These are designated by the abbreviation (LM).

In the case of literature citations, no verification of identifications has been attempted. These entries are identified according to the herbarium in which the specimen is reported to be deposited. Abbreviations for these herbaria are shown below. Pertinent literature references occur in the bibliography of this report.

In some instances the checklist includes taxa that are not definitely known to occur within the boundaries of LMNRA. These are listed because they have been located in nearby or contiguous areas, or are otherwise so disposed to warrant their inclusion.

No plant list is ever complete or without error. The study team will appreciate receiving all additions or corrections to it.

ASPIDIACEAE

Woodsia oregana Eat.

Perennial herb; occasional in rocky places at higher elevations.

Mohave Co: Leary 2249, north-facing crevice, rim near head of Ambush Canyon (Paw's Pocket), Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Leary 2205, north-facing volcanic cliff, with Brickellia and Huchera, summit of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6900 ft. Clark Co: none.

PTERIDACEAE

Adiantum capillus-veneris L.

(Venus-hair fern)

Perennial herb; common in seep areas at lower elevations.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), Rampart Cave area. Clark Co: Nickell 626, bottom of Bridge Canyon, Newberry Mountains, 2800 ft; Bostick 3121, bank of the Colorado River, 5 miles below Hoover Dam, 700 ft.

Cheilanthes covillei Maxon

(lip fern)

Perennial herb; occasional in rocky places at lower elevations.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Niles & Leary 1962, beneath granitic boulder, peak south of summit of road between Carp and Kane Springs Wash, north end of Meadow Valley Mountains, 5600 ft.

Cheilanthes feei T. Moore

(lip fern)

Perennial herb; occasional in limestone at lower elevations.

Mohave Co: Leary (UNLV), north-facing sandstone cleft in Paw's Pocket, Whitmore Canyon, 3900 ft. Clark Co: Niles & Leary 1878, in rock crevices, south-facing limestone hills, south end of the Virgin Mountains, 0.5 mile north of Whitney Pocket, 3100 ft.

Notholaena cochisensis Goodd.

(cloak fern)

Perennial herb; rare in rocky places at lower elevations.

Mohave Co: Leary 1813, south-facing sandstone rubble, Paw's Pocket, Whitmore Canyon, 3900 ft. Clark Co: none.

Notholaena parryi Eaton

(cloak fern)

Perennial herb; occasional in rocky places at lower elevations.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), Rampart Cave area; Leary 1808, in crevice at base of large sandstone boulders, Paw's Pocket, Whitmore Canyon, 3900 ft. Clark Co: Mauer 11, Grapevine Canyon, Newberry Mountains; Bostick 3271, 2.5 miles west of Rogers Spring, Muddy Mountains, 2000 ft; Leary 1725, north-facing side of wash in cleft of metamorphic rock, near entrance to recreation area, Eldorado Canyon, 1800 ft; Leary 1762, north-facing limestone crevice, ridge northeast of junction of North Shore road and West End Wash, 2100 ft.

Pellaea truncata Goodd.

(cliff-brake)

Perennial herb; occasional in rocky places at lower elevations.

Not collected or observed during this study within the boundaries of LMNRA, but McDougall (1973) and Kearney and Peebles (1960) report its occurrence in Mohave County.

Arabis gracilis Greene

Brassica tournefortii Gouan.

(mustard)

Annual; uncommon, known only from a single roadside collection along the southern portion of the recreation area. March.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Holland 1620, in coarse gravels, at the junction of U.S. highway 95 and the Empire Wash road, Newberry Mountains, 2600 ft.

Capsella bursa-pastoris (L.) Medic.

(shepherd's-purse)

Annual; occasional invader of disturbed moist habitats throughout the recreation area. March-May.

Mohave Co: Holland 1271, 2 miles south of the road to Mt. Dellenbaugh on the road to Twin Point, Shivwits Plateau, 5800 ft. Clark Co: Schramm (UNLV), in disturbed soils 3 miles northeast of Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2500 ft.

Caulanthus cooperi (Wats.) Pays.

Annual; common in dry washes and on gravel slopes in areas of limited exposure throughout the lower elevations. March-May.

Descurainia obtusa (Greene) O.E. Schultz (tansy-mustard)

Annual; uncommon in limestone, known from a single locality but probably more widespread. July.

Erysimum repandum L.

(wallflower)

Annual; common on disturbed clay soils on the Shivwits Plateau. June-July.

Mohave Co: Leary and Niles 2156, very common in old reservoir, 8 miles east of Mt. Trumbull, 6400 ft; Leary 2188, fire camp north of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6200 ft. Clark Co: none.

<u>Lepidium</u> <u>densiflorum</u> Schrad.

(pepper-grass)

Annual; known from a single locality on the Shivwits Plateau, but probably more widespread. June.

Mohave Co: Holland and Niles 608, in Green Spring Canyon, 5 miles east of Mt. Dellenbaugh, 6000 ft. Clark Co: none.

Lepidium fremontii Wats.

(pepper-grass)

Perennial herb; common on many soil types below 4000 ft. throughout the recreation area. March-May, November.

S. highway 95 at junction with state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2500 ft; Holland 367, 1 1/2 miles southeast of the 3-Kids Mine, River Mountains, 1600 ft; Grater (LM), on gypsum, 8 miles northeast of Henderson; Poyser 72, Quarry Canyon, 1/2 mile northeast of Boulder Beach, River Mountains.

Lepidium lasiocarpum Nutt.

(pepper-grass)

Annual; widespread in dry gravel washes and on steep slopes at the lower elevations. March-May.

Lepidium montanum Nutt. var. glabrum C.L. Hitchc.

Perennial herb; uncommon, known only from the vicinity of Cane Spring, Shivwits Plateau. May-September.

<u>Lesquerella intermedia</u> (Wats.) Heller

(bladder-pod)

Perennial herb; locally common at the higher elevations. May-June.

Dellenbaugh road and the road to Twin Point, Shivwits Plateau, 5800 ft; Holland and Niles 652, common, 6 miles west of Grassy Mountain, on road to Mt. Lesquerella palmeri Wats.

(bladder-pod)

Annual; common in coarse gravels in washes and on disturbed roadsides throughout the lower elevations of the recreation area. March-May.

Clark Co: Holland 1619, Empire Wash, 3 miles east of the recreation area boundary, Newberry Mountains, 1800 ft; Holland 1095, 5 miles east of U.S. highway 95 on the Empire Wash road, 2800 ft; Gullion (LM), along U.S. highway 95, 11 miles north of Searchlight.

<u>Lesquerella</u> <u>tenella</u> Nelson

(bladder-pod)

Annual; reported only from the lower Grand Canyon.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), occasional in side canyons in the Grand Canyon and at Pierce Ferry. Clark Co: none.

Lobularia maritima (L.) Desv.

(sweet-alyssum)

Perennial herb; uncommon, known from a single locality. March-April.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Anderson 32, 2 miles west of Nelson's Landing, along state highway 60, 1000 ft.

Sisymbrium altissimum L.

Annual; common and widespread in disturbed soils throughout the lower elevations. March-May.

Mohave Co: Carothers (MNA), Diamond Creek, mile 225L. Clark Co: Holland 811, roadside along U. S. highway 95, just north of state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2800 ft; Holland 194, occasional, 1/2 mile west of Hemenway Harbor, 1400 ft.

Sisymbrium ambiguum (Wats.) Pays.

Perennial herb; occasional to common on the Sanup and Shivwits Plateaus. May-June.

Mohave Co: Holland 1238, at the Sanup Plateau trailhead, 1 mile north of Twin Point, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Phillips (MNA), common on both rims (Grand Canyon) at 1475 m. Clark Co: none.

Sisymbrium irio L.

(London-rocket)

Annual; occasional in disturbed sites at the lower elevations. Flowering throughout the year.

Mohave Co: Holland and Niles 619, in Green Spring Canyon, 5 miles east of Mt. Dellenbaugh, 6000 ft. Clark Co: Holland 180, Hemenway Wash, 1 mile west of state highway 41 along a powerline road, 1650 ft; Leary 91, in gravelly soil, 4.5 miles north of state highway 77, in Sacatone Wash, Newberry Mountains, 2500 ft; Gullion (LM), disturbed soils at the Spirit Mine, 11 miles west of Davis Dam, Newberry Mountains.

Stanleya pinnata (Pursh) Britton ssp. pinnata

(prince's-plume)

Perennial herb; common and widespread throughout the recreation area. April-May.

Mohave Co: Holland 1263, at the trailhead to the Sanup Plateau, 1 mile north of Twin Point, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Phillips (MNA), common on steep rocky slopes in the canyon at about 400-500 m and on the Sanup Plateau, 1475 m. S. 95 along state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2800 ft; Holland and Schramm 881, 2 miles north of West End Wash, in the canyon above the Anniversary Mine, 2200 ft.

Streptanthus cordatus Nutt.

Perennial herb; in $\underline{\text{Coleogyne-Artemisia-Juniperus}}$ at the higher elevations. May-June.

Mohave Co: Holland 1240, at the Sanup Plateau trail head, 1 mile north of Twin Point, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Phillips (MNA), found only on the Sanup Plateau at 1475 m. Clark Co: none.

Streptanthella longirostris (Wats.) Rydb.

Annual; common and widespread throughout the lower elevations. February-May.

Mohave Co: Grater (LM), Willow Beach, 600 ft. Clark Co: Holland and Schramm 1556, 1 mile west of Hiko Spring along state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2600 ft; Holland and Schramm 870, in the canyon above the Anniversary Mine, 2 miles north of West End Wash, 2200 ft; Holland 104, in wash gravels, 3/4 mile northeast of Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2500 ft; Berg 34, 5 miles east of Henderson along state highway 41.

Thelypodium integrifolium (Nutt.) Endl.

Biennial; uncommon in the lower Grand Canyon, not yet located in LMNRA. July-August.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), rare in open seep areas near Muav Caves (450 m) and at Juniper Seep (mile 268, 375 m); Clover (MO), Lake Mead, 2 miles above Emory (Columbine) Falls. Clark Co: none.

Thelypodium lasiophyllum (H. & A.) Greene var. lasiophyllum

Annual; common in dry washes and slopes of the low mountain ranges along Lakes Mead and Mohave. March-May.

Thelypodium wrightii Gray

Annual; common at springs and seeps in the northeastern portion of the recreation area. April-August.

Thlaspi arvense L.

Annual or biennial herb; uncommon, known in southern Nevada only from Las Vegas Wash. 1900 ft.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Hiatt (UNLV), a weed in a cultivated field, Mormon Church welfare farm, powerline road, Las Vegas Wash, 1700 ft.

Thysanocarpus curvipes Hook. var. eradiatus Jeps.

(lace-pod)

Annual; common in areas of limited exposure at most elevations. April-May.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co; Holland 486, 1 mile east of Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2500 ft; Niles 1056, common in moist sites in canyon bottoms, vicinity of Sacatone Wash, Newberry Mountains, 2800 ft.

CAPPARACEAE

Cleome lutea Hook.

Annual; locally common in disturbed soils along the roads on the Shivwits Plateau. July-August.

Mohave Co: Holland 694, in Wolfhole Valley, 37 miles south of St. George, Utah, 5000 ft; VanDevender and Mead (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash. Clark Co: none.

Cleome serrulata Pursh

Annual; similar in habit to \underline{C} . $\underline{\text{lutea}}$, found in roadside gravels or other areas of disturbance. $\underline{\text{June-September}}$.

Mohave Co: Holland 747, 30 miles north of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 4500 ft. Clark Co: none.

Wislizenia refracta Engelm.

Annual; uncommon, reported from only a few localities along the Colorado River. March-October.

Mohave Co: Grater and Collins (LM), Willow Beach, 600 ft; Clover (MO), Separation Canyon. Clark Co: none.

RESEDACEAE

Oligomeris linifolia (Vahl) Macbr.

Annual; common in rocky or clay soils at the lower elevations. March-May.

Mohave Co: Holland 401, in large gravel wash, 5 miles north of Katherine Landing, 750 ft; Phillips (MNA), scattered on Lake Mead mud flats. Clark Co: Leary 1704, in clay soils on ridge northeast of Hamblin Mountain, Black Mountains, 2300 ft; Leary 1510, near the entrance to LMNRA, east of Frenchman Mountain, 1600 ft; Holland and Schramm 1586, 1 mile southwest of Davis Dam, eastern exposure of the Newberry Mountains, 800 ft; Niles 981, eastern edge of the Eldorado Playa, north of the turn-off to Nelson, 1900 ft; Holland 160, 1/2 mile east of Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2500 ft.

CRASSULACEAE

Dudleya arizonica Rose

Perennial herb; locally common in the granitic outcrops of the Newberry Mountains. May-June.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Holland and Niles 528, on south-facing slopes of Spirit Mountain; Newberry Mountains, 4900 ft; Holland, on the walls and crevices of Bridge Canyon, 1/4 mile east of state highway 77, 2500 ft; Littlefield 257, in cracks of rocks, Sacatone Wash, Newberry Mountains.

SAXIFRAGACEAE

Fendlera rupicola Gray

Shrub; uncommon, on eastern exposures of the canyons in the northeastern portion of the recreation area. June-July.

Mohave Co: Leary 2252, local stand, just below rim in volcanic soils, at Ambush Canyon (Paw's Pocket), 6000 ft. Clark Co: none.

Fenderella utahensis (Wats.) Heller

Shrub; in blackbrush associations on the west side of Parashant Canyon. April-May.

Mohave Co: Holland and Fries 1693, eastern exposure of Parashant Canyon, 4000 ft. Clark Co: none.

Heuchera rubescens Torr.

Perennial herb; uncommon in rock crevices at the higher elevations of the Shivwits Plateau. June-July.

Mohave Co: Leary 2245, on north-facing slope in volcanic soils at the rim of Ambush Canyon (Paw's Pocket), 6000 ft. Clark Co: none.

Heuchera versicolor Greene

Perennial herb; known only from the Mt. Dellenbaugh summit. June-July.

Mohave Co: Leary 2206, on north-facing slopes at the summit of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6800 ft; Holland and Niles 633, summit of Mt. Dellenbaugh, in cracks of igneous rocks, Shivwits Plateau, 6990 ft. Clark Co: none.

Ribes cereum Dougl.

(currant)

Shrub; locally common at the summit and along the northern exposure of Mt. Dellenbaugh. May-June.

Mohave Co: Holland 1276, on the north-facing slope of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6400 ft. Clark Co: none.

CROSSOSOMATACEAE

Crossosoma bigelovii Wats.

Shrub; uncommon, known within the recreation area only from the lower Grand Canyon.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), scattered on rock faces at lower elevations; found at the mouth of Rampart Cave (535 m), near Columbine Falls (400 m) and in dry side canyon on the north side of the river. Clark Co: none.

Crossosoma parviflorum Robins. & Fern.

Shrub; rare. The plant has been proposed for a threatened status (Smithsonian Institution, 1975).

Reported from our area (Kearney and Peebles, 1960) from Quartermaster Canyon and the Black Mountains of Mohave County. It has not been collected or observed during this study.

ROSACEAE

Amelanchier utahensis Koehne

(service-berry)

Shrub; occasional in rocky habitats on the Shivwits Plateau. May-June.

Cercocarpus montanus Raf.

(mountain-mahogany)

Shrub; known only from the base of the upper Grand Wash Cliffs. March-November.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), scattered at the base of the upper Grand Wash Cliffs, 1585 m. Clark Co: none.

Chamaebatiaria millefolium (Torr.) Maxim.

(fern-bush)

Shrub; known from a single collection along the rim of the Shivwits Plateau, probably more widespread. July-November.

Mohave Co: Holland 327, at the Sanup Plateau trailhead, 1 mile north of Twin Point, 6000 ft. Clark Co: none.

Coleogyne ramosissima Torr.

(blackbrush)

Shrub; common and widespread, forming almost pure stands in Whitmore and Parashant Canyons, also on the Sanup Plateau in Arizona and in the Newberry Mountains of southern Nevada. April-May.

Mohave Co: Holland 1258, in limestone soils at Twin Point, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Phillips (MNA), in nearly pure stands on level ground along both rims of the lower Grand Canyon, 2475 to 1800 m; VanDevender and Mead (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash. Clark Co: Holland 1134, head of Sacatone Wash along the recreation area boundary, Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3400 ft; Holland 969, Roman Wash, 1/2 mile south of Empire Wash, Newberry Mountains, 3000 ft; Holland (UNLV), occasional, 1 mile west of Red Mountain, River Mountains, 3000 ft; Holland (UNLV), common on the Mormon Mesa, 2200 ft.

Cowania mexicana D. Don var. stansburiana (Torr.) Jeps.

(cliff-rose)

Shrub; common in rocky outcrops at the higher elevations. May-June, October.

Perennial herb; the common <u>Astragalus</u> of disturbed sites along the North Shore road from West End Wash to Overton. April-May.

Astragalus sabulonum Gray

(milk-vetch)

Cassia armata Wats.

(senna)

Shrub; common in dry washes throughout the lower elevations of the recreation area. March-June.

Mohave Co: Grater (LM), Willow Beach, 700 ft. Clark Co: Holland 1312, in dry riparian gravels with Acacia, Psorothamnus and Yucca, 6 miles west of U. S. highway 95, on state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 3000 ft; Holland 114, common in wash gravels, 1 mile east of the 3-Kids Mine along state highway 41, River Mountains, 1800 ft; Bostick 3384, mouth of Keyhole Canyon, Eldorado Mountains, 3500 ft; Poyser (LM), Hemenway Wash above Boulder Beach; Coville (US), great bend of the Colorado River.

Cassia covesii Gray

Suffrutescent perennial; uncommon to occasional in sandy soils throughout the lower elevations of the recreation area. April-October.

Mohave Co: Holland 709, roadside species with Pinus ponderosa, Artemisia tridentata, Penstemon barbatus and Calliandra humilis, 2 miles north of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6200 ft. Clark Co: none.

Dalea mollis Benth.

Annual; locally common in sandy soils from Boulder City south to the Newberry Mountains. February-April.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), in sandy soils just north of the Katherine Landing ranger station, 1000 ft. Lotus salsuginosus Greene ssp. brevivexillus (Ottley) Munz

(deer-vetch)

Perennial herb; common in granitic soils of the Newberry Mountains. April-June.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Nickell 491, in the bottom of a sandy wash below Hiko Spring, Newberry Mountains, 2200 ft; Nickell 563, 3 miles north of state highway 77, on the Christmas Tree Pass road, Newberry Mountains, 2600 ft.

Tetracoccus hallii Bdg.

Shrub; uncommon, known only from a single locality along the eastern exposure of the Newberry Mountains. April-May.

Dellenbaugh fire camp, Shivwits Plateau, 6200 ft; Leary & Leary 1630, common in overgrazed area with Artemisia, 1.5 miles south of Crepe Spring, Grassy Point, Shivwits Plateau, 5500 ft; Holland 587, with Artemisia, Townsendia and Leucelene, at Wolfhole Lake, 33 miles south of the Utah State line, 5000 ft; Wallis & Mitchell (LM), near NPS fire camp, 1/2 mile west of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau. Clark Co: none.

TAMARICACEAE

Tamarix L.

(tamarisk, salt-cedar)

Shrub or tree, March-August.

According to Baum (1967), the genus <u>Tamarix</u> is represented in our area by several species. The evergreen tree, <u>T. aphylla</u> (L.) Karsten, is commonly planted around habitations for shade and as a wind break. It may occasionally escape from cultivation. Throughout low to mid elevations in the recreation area, along watercourses, at springs and seeps, and usually in saline soils, there often occur extensive stands of one or more of the following species: <u>T. ramosissima</u> Ledeb., <u>T. parviflora</u> DC. and <u>T. chinensis</u> Loureiro.

VIOLACEAE

<u>Viola</u> <u>nuttallii</u> Pursh

(violet)

Perennial herb; locally common in clay soils, a single locality on the Shivwits Plateau. May-June.

Perennial herb; common in washes and canyons draining into Lake Mead. March-June.

Clark Co: Holland & Niles 193, in disturbed soils along the road to the sewage treatment plant along the eastern exposure of Lake Mead, 1500 ft; Nickell 617, 3 miles north of state highway 77, on the Christmas Tree Pass road, Newberry Mountains, 2400 ft; Trelease 50, 1/2 mile north of Lake Mead, along state highway 41.

Mentzelia affinis Greene

Annual; known only within the recreation area from Christmas Tree Pass. April-May.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), 3 miles south of Temple Bar. Clark Co: Holland & Schramm 905, with Pinus monophylla, Juniperus californica and Coleogyne, 1 mile west of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3600 ft.

Mentzelia albicaulis (Hook.) T. & G.

Annual; common and widespread throughout the area. March-June.

Mohave Co: Holland 1297, in limestone with Artemisia, Juniperus and Fallugia on the western exposure of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6400 ft; Holland 1246, common in limestone with Juniperus osteosperma, Agave utahensis and Yucca baccata at Twin Point, 14 miles south of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Holland & Niles 639, 1/2 mile southwest of the summit of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6400 ft; Holland & Bostick 393, common with Hymenoclea, Krameria and Lycium in a large gravel wash 5 miles north of Katherine Landing, 750 ft; Phillips (MNA), common on flat shelves in the Grand Canyon, especially below Rampart Cave, 3 miles south of Temple Bar. Clark Co: Leary & Leary 1553, in a broad wash near the pumping station along the northern end of the River Mountains, 2000 ft; Holland 1098, Empire Wash road, 5 miles east of U. S. highway 95, western exposure of the Newberry Mountains, 3000 ft; Holland 110, in lateral tributary of Bootleg Canyon, 3 miles northwest of Boulder City, River Mountains, 3100 ft.

Mentzelia involucrata Wats.

Annual; known only from the Newberry Mountains, but scattered at the low elevations. April-May.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Holland & Schramm 1101, with Larrea, Ambrosia and Encelia, on dry south-facing slope along Empire Wash, Newberry Mountains, 1000 ft; Holland 899, open hillsides along the road to the smoke tree stand, 1 mile north of state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 1700 ft.

Mentzelia nitens Greene

Annual; widespread throughout the lower elevations of the southern extension of the recreation area. March-May.

Mohave Co: Holland & Bostick 410, with Porophyllum and Peucephyllum in a large wash 5 miles north of Katherine Landing, 700 ft; Phillips (MNA), sandy areas at Pierce Ferry. Clark Co: Holland 835, in Larrea-Ambrosia along state highway 77, between Bridge Canyon and Hiko Spring Wash, Newberry Mountains, 2500 ft; Holland 790, Empire Wash, 1/4 mile west of Lake Mohave, Newberry Mountains, 2800 ft; Holland 497, with Acacia, Hymenoclea, Krameria and Ambrosia, 10 miles east of U.S. highway 95 along the northern exposure of the Newberry Mountains, 1800 ft.

Mentzelia puberula Darl.

Perennial herb; occasional in washes and canyons at the lower elevations. April-October.

Clark Co: Leary, Meyer & Fiero 1793, in Pinto Valley, Black Mountains, LMNRA, 2100 ft; Leary 1748, with Aristida and Encelia virginensis at the pass west of Nelson, Eldorado Mountains, 3500 ft; Leary & Leary 1689, with Petalonyx parryi, Ephedra torreyana, Coldenia hispidissima and Phacelia palmeri near the Valley of Fire State Park, at the junction of state highways 12 and 40, 1600 ft; Holland & Schramm 1018, with Stanleya, Fagonia and Gaura in the canyon above the Anniversary Mine, 2 miles north of West End Wash, 2800 ft; Holland & Schramm 1516, occasional in rocky outcrop with Eriogonum heermanii, Cryptantha racemosa and Penstemon bicolor on the northern exposure of Red Mountain, River Mountains, 3400 ft; Niles 1092, south-facing canyon side, Bridge Canyon, Newberry Mountains, 2300 ft.

Mentzelia pumila (Nutt.) Torr. & Gray

Biennial; scattered throughout the Arizona Strip. April-June.

Mohave Co: Leary & Leary 1654, with Psilostrophe sparsiflora, 1.5 miles south of Crepe Spring, Grassy Point, Shivwits Plateau, 4600 ft; Holland 1410, with Aguilegia chrysantha, Mimulus guttatus and Penstemon bridgesii on the floor of Green Spring Canyon, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Phillips (MNA), rare on rocky slopes of intermediate elevations. Clark Co: Leary & Niles 1846, with Larrea, Ambrosia and Eriogonum inflatum, 215 miles past the Riverside exit of interstate highway 15, toward Riverside, 1600 ft; Holland 991, uncommon with Baileya, Ephedra and Psorelea in red sands along the western edge of the Virgin River, 2 miles above its confluence with the Muddy River, 1200 ft.

Mentzelia tricuspis Gray

Annual; common throughout the lower elevations. March-May.

Mohave Co: Holland 395, with Acacia, Krameria and Lycium in a large wash, 5 miles north of Katherine Landing, 750 ft; Phillips (MNA), 3 miles south of Temple Bar, scattered on rocky talus slopes above side canyons in the Grand Canyon. Clark Co: Leary, Meyer & Fiero 1800, common in conglomerate of a wash just east of Sandstone Spring, Pinto Valley, 2000 ft; Holland 974, 1/4 mile north of Empire Wash and 1/2 mile west of the Lake Mead boundary, Newberry Mountains, 3000 ft; Holland 13, 2 miles north of the Boulder Beach visitor center on the west side of state highway 41, River Mountains, 1600 ft.

Mentzelia veatchiana Kell.

Annual; occasional in isolated populations at the lower elevations. March-May.

Mohave Co: Leary & Meinke 32, beneath north-facing cliff along road from U.S. highway 93 to Willow Beach, 1200 ft. Clark Co: Holland 1021, in sandy soils with Larrea, Yucca and Acamptopappus at the entrance to Empire Wash, Newberry Mountains, 2800 ft; Nickell 19, in granitic outcrop in Sacatone Wash, 5 miles north of state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2800 ft.

Petalonyx parryi Gray

(sandpaper-plant)

Shrub; scattered in gypsum soils along the northern portions of the area. April-May.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), common in gypsum soils at the Mobil and Wahl Yee lease sites, 5 miles northeast of Grand Wash Bay, 2500 ft. Clark Co: Leary & Leary 1612, with Ephedra torreyana, Phacelia palmeri and Coldenia hispidissima in gypsiferous-sandy soils near junction of state highway 40 and 12, near Valley of Fire State Park, 1600 ft; Leary & Niles 1887, abundant in gypsum soil with Phacelia palmeri, Psorothamnus fremontii and Atriplex confertifolia, 2 miles north of Devil's Throat, Gold Butte area, 2300 ft; Holland 130, in gypsiferous soils, 1 mile west of the Las Vegas Wash ranger station, 1350 ft; Niles 879, northwest corner of the Valley of Fire State Park, 2000 ft; Williams 557, Rogers Spring, 10 miles west of Las Vegas; Hop 67, near state highway 41, 4 miles east of Henderson.

Petalonyx thurberi Gray thurberi

(sandpaper-plant)

Perennial herb; widespread in the southern portions of the recreation area. June-July.

Clark Co: Leary & Niles 1892, in reddish sandy soil of wash with Hymenoclea and Psorothamnus fremontii, 1/4 mile north of Devil's Throat, Gold Butte area, 2300 ft; Holland 1333, in wash gravels with Psorothamnus spinosus, Acacia greggii and Bebbia juncea at the mouth of Grapevine Canyon, 4 miles north of state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 800 ft; Holland 225, along U. S. highway 93, 1 mile east of Boulder City, in disturbed roadsides, 2250 ft; Nickell 227, 2 miles east of Railroad Pass, U. S. highway 93, 2100 ft; Clover & Jotter (MO), common near Boulder dock; Deming (UNLV), near Hoover Dam.

CACTACEAE

Coryphantha vivipara (Nutt.) Britt. & Rose var. arizonica (Engelm.) W.T. Marshall

Succulent; scattered populations located primarily on the Shivwits Plateau. June-July.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), local stands in the vicinity of the junction of the roads to Twin Point and Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Leary 2200, stems forming a cluster of 12 heads, with Juniperus, Pinus and Artemisia, 1 mile north of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 6300 ft; Phillips (MNA), scattered on both rims but not found within the Grand Canyon. Clark Co: none.

Coryphantha vivipara (Nutt.) Britton & Rose var. rosea (Clokey) Benson

Succulent; rare. This plant has been proposed for a threatened status (Smithsonian Institution, 1975). May-July.

Known from mountain areas of southern Nevada and California, and reported from near Peach Springs, Mohave County (Benson, 1969). The plant has apparently not been collected within LMNRA, but is to be expected in limestone substrates at higher elevations.

Echinocactus polycephalus Engelm. & Bigel. (cottontop cactus) var. polycephalus

Succulent; common and widespread from the lake shore to 2500 ft. throughout the recreation area. August-September.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), common on western exposures and rocky slopes in the vicinity of South Cove; VanDevender and Mead (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Phillips (MNA), common on steep, rocky slopes and open, dry side canyons in the Grand Canyon and on the rims; Clover and Jotter (MO), abundant 2 miles above Emory Falls and at Spencer Canyon.

Clark Co: Holland (UNLV), common in open exposures of the lower elevations of the Newberry Mountains; Coville (US), Valleys of the Virgin and Muddy Rivers.

Echinocereus engelmannii (Parry) Lem. (hedgehog cactus)
var. chrysocentrus (Engelm.) Emgelm. ex Rumpler

Succulent; widespread between 3000 and 5000 feet throughout the recreation area. March-May.

Mohave Co: Leary & Leary 1663, common on south-facing alluvial fan in blackbrush community, 1 mile east of Andrus Point, Shivwits Plateau, 4200 ft; VanDevender & Mead (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Phillips (MNA), common on the rocky slopes, flat shelves, dry side canyons and rims of the Grand Canyon; Clover & Jotter (MO), 2 miles above Emory Falls; Surprise Canyon, mile 205 and mile 193. Clark Co: Holland 884, Sacatone Wash, 1/4 mile east of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3500 ft; Coville (US), Muddy Mountains.

Echinocereus engelmannii (Parry) Lem. (hedgehog cactus)
var. variegatus (Engelm.) Engelm. ex Rumpler

Succulent; reported by Benson (1969) from the southern Grand Wash Cliffs area. During this study, efforts to locate this variety within LMNRA have been unsuccessful.

Echinocereus fasciculatus (Engelm.) L. Benson (hedgehog cactus) var. fasciculatus

Succulent; rare, few specimens observed in weathered sandstone areas in lower Whitmore Canyon.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), uncommon in sandstone with Coleogyne, Artemisia and Holacantha at the Exxon Uranium lease site at the mouth of Whitmore Canyon; Holland (UNLV), occassional on the road to Twin Point, 2 miles south of the LMNRA boundary, Shivwits Plateau. Clark Co: none.

Echinocereus triglochidiatus Engelm. (mound cactus)
var. melanacanthus (Engelm.) L. Benson

Succulent; reported from the Arizona Strip portion of the recreation area. May-July.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), observed several many-stemmed mounds in Parashant Canyon, 4 miles below the rim; Holland (UNLV), located at the summit of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau. Clark Co: none.

Echinocereus triglochidiatus Engelm. (mound cactus)
var. mohavensis (Engelm. & Bigel.) Benson

Succulent; the common variety in Nevada, found in the Newberry Mountains and in the Gold Butte area. May-June.

Mohave Co: Leary & Leary 1615, 1/2 mile west of Crepe Spring, Grassy Point, Shivwits Plateau. Clark Co: Holland & Niles 534, with Pinus, Coleogyne and Calochortus in areas of limited exposure along the western edge of the recreation area, Newberry Mountains, 4800 ft; Holland & Schramm 1139, in granitic outcrop 1/4 mile west of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3600 ft.

Ferocactus acanthodes (Lem.) Britt. & Rose (barrel cactus)

Succulent; common and widespread below 4000 feet throughout the recreation area. May-June.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), common in the lava flows of Whitmore Canyon, 3800 ft; Holland (UNLV), at the base of the upper Grand Wash Cliffs; Holland (UNLV), scattered in the vicinity of Pierce Ferry, 3600 ft; VanDevender & Mead (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Phillips (MNA), common on rock faces, steep rock slopes, dissected lower slopes and flat areas within the Grand Canyon; Clover & Jotter (MO), Lava Falls, Separation Canyon and mile 193. Clark Co: Holland (UNLV), common and widespread in the granitic substrate of the Newberry Mountains; Holland (UNLV), common in the Gold Butte area along the western exposure of the Overton Arm of Lake Mead.

Mammillaria microcarpa Engelm.

Succulent; known in the recreation area only from the Newberry Mountains. August-September.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), scattered over rocky areas in the Grand Canyon and common at Rampart Cave. Clark Co: Holland (UNLV), observed in Empire Wash, 1/4 mile east of the LMNRA boundary, Newberry Mountains, 3300 ft.

Mammillaria tetrancistra Engelm.

Succulent; scattered throughout the lower elevations of the recreation area. August-September.

<u>Mohave Co</u>: Holland (UNLV), common, rocky volcanic slopes in the vicinity of South Cove, 2000 ft; Holland (UNLV), infrequent in gravels and on rocky slopes surrounding Willow Beach, 1200 ft; Clover & Jotter (MO), abundant at Spencer Canyon, Separation Canyon, and 2 miles above Emory Falls.

Clark Co: Holland (UNLV), common in granitic outcrops, 1/4 mile north of state highway 77, near the Christmas Tree Pass road, Newberry Mountains, 2200 ft; Holland & Schramm (UNLV), few plants in crevices of volcanic rocks near the summit of Red Mountain, River Mountains, 3600 ft; Nickell 534, 1/4 mile west of the Juniper Mine, western slope of the Newberry Mountains, 3300 ft; Coville (US), Las Vegas Wash.

Neolloydia johnsonii (Parry) Benson

Succulent; widespread and variable, known from many localities within the recreation area. April-May.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), scattered at intermediate elevations on rocky hillsides in the Grand Canyon; Clover & Jotter (MO), abundant south of Pierce Ferry. Clark Co: Leary 1705, in light gypsiferous soils with Larrea, Ambrosia and Peucephyllum on the north ridge of Hamblin Peak, Black Mountains, 2500 ft; Holland 1229, with Larrea, Ambrosia, Acamptopappus and Yucca, 1/4 mile north of Empire Wash in metamorphic rock, Newberry Mountains, 2800 ft; Holland 515, on alluvial slopes, 1/4 mile east of Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2800 ft; Holland (UNLV), in limestone substrate along the southern exposure of the Muddy Mountains, 2800 ft; Holland, Niles & Schramm (UNLV), occasional along the road to Gold Butte, 17 miles south of Riverside, 3000 ft.

Opuntia acanthocarpa Engelm, & Bigel, var. coloradensis Benson

(cholla)

Succulent; common and widespread at elevations below 4000 feet, forming dense thickets in the Newberry Mountains. May-June.

Mohave Co: Leary & Leary 1837, common in limestone with Coleogyne, Ephedra, Larrea, Agave and Fouquieria near Cane Spring, Shivwits Plateau, 2800 ft; Holland (UNLV), common at the base of the Grand Wash Cliffs, near Pierce Ferry, 2800 ft; VanDevender & Mead (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Phillips (MNA), common on the flat shelves and lower slopes within the Grand Canyon and lower rims; Clover & Jotter (MO), mile 205, Quartermaster Canyon and Surprise Canyon. Clark Co: Leary & Niles 1896, with Yucca shidigera, Yucca brevifolia, Thamnosma, Acamptopappus, Larrea and Opuntia echinocarpa, 6.2 miles south of St. Thomas Gap in Horse Spring Wash, Gold Butte area, 3300 ft; Holland & Schramm 1163, a dense stand 1/2 mile west of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3600 ft; Holland & Bostick (UNLV), with Cirsium neomexicana, Asclepias sublulata and Larrea in Empire Wash, 22 miles east of U. S. highway 95, Newberry Mountains, 700 ft; Holland, Niles & Schramm (UNLV), common on gentle alluvial slopes in the Devil's Throat area in the vicinity of Gold Butte, 2600 ft; Clover & Jotter (MO), Boulder Dock; Coville (US), Virgin River Valley.

Opuntia <u>basilaris</u> Engelm. and Bigel. var. <u>basilaris</u>

(beavertail cactus)

Succulent; probably the most common and widely distributed cactus in the recreation area, found in all plant associations. March-May.

Mohave Co: Holland and Fries (UNLV), common at the proposed Exxon Uranium lease site at the mouth of Whitmore Canyon, 3500 ft; Holland, Niles and Schramm (UNLV), in gypsum soils, 3 miles northeast of Grand Wash Bay, 2500 ft; Holland & Blake (UNLV), in Grapevine Canyon, 12 miles south of Pierce Ferry in the southern Grand Wash Cliffs, 3400 ft; Holland (UNLV), a white-flowered form observed 1/4 mile south of Katherine Landing in volcanic outcrop, 700 ft; VanDevender and Mead (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Phillips (MNA), common on flat shelves, lower slopes, and dry side canyons at low elevations; Clover and Jotter (MO), miles 193, 205, abundant at Spencer Canyon, 2 miles above Emory Falls. Clark Co: Holland (UNLV), abundant in red sands in the Valley of Fire State Park, 2800 ft; Holland, Niles and Schramm (UNLV), common in alluvial gravels, 17 miles south of the Riverside bridge on the Gold Butte road, 3000 ft; Holland (UNLV), common at Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2800 ft; Holland 885, with Larrea, Acamptopappus and Yucca shidigera, 1/2 mile east of the LMNRA boundary, Newberry Mountains, 3200 ft; Holland and Niles 625, road to the smoke tree grove, 1 mile north of state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 700 ft; Clover and Jotter (MO), Boulder Dock; Coville (US), Valley of the Muddy and Virgin Rivers.

Opuntia basilaris Engelm. & Bigel. var. treleasei (Coult.) Toumey

(beavertail cactus)

Succulent; apparently a rare plant. It has been proposed for an endangered status (Federal Register, 1976). March-May.

Benson (1969) reports the variety from below Hoover Dam, on the Arizona side of the Colorado River. It is not known to occur elsewhere within the recreation area, but is reported from other localities in Arizona and California.

Opuntia bigelovii Engelm.

(teddybear cactus)

Succulent; reported only from the Nevada portion of the recreation area, where it occurs in an almost pure stand along the road to Cottonwood Cove. April-May.

Mohave Co: VanDevender and Meade (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Clover and Jotter (MO), mile 193 and Spencer Canyon. Clark Co: Holland and Schramm 1153, with Larrea, Ambrosia and Encelia in Empire Wash, 3 miles west of Lake Mohave, Newberry Mountains, 2500 ft; Holland (UNLV), River Mountains, 4 miles northwest of the NPS visitor center, 2500 ft, the northern-most distribution of the species in Nevada.

Opuntia chlorotica Engelm. & Bigel.

(prickly-pear cactus)

Succulent; uncommon, but found in a variety of habitats within the recreation area. May.

Mohave Co: Holland and Fries (UNLV), occasional on the proposed Exxon Uranium lease site, at the mouth of Whitmore Canyon, 3500 ft; Holland and Fries (UNLV), on the Knight lease areas in Parashant Canyon, in predominately blackbrush areas, 3700 ft; Holland and Blake (UNLV), in Grapevine Canyon in the lower Grand Wash Cliffs, south of Pierce Ferry, 3500 ft; VanDevender and Meade (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash. Clark Co: Holland and Schramm 1337, in granitic soils with Quercus turbinella, Coleogyne and Nolina 1/2 mile north of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3800 ft.

Opuntia echinocarpa Engelm. & Bigel. var. echinocarpa

(cholla)

Succulent; common and widespread below 5000 ft. throughout the recreation area. April-May.

Mohave Co: Holland and Blake 535, on open hillsides with Larrea, Ferocactus and Psorothamnus along the Pierce Ferry road, 2.6 miles north of the LMNRA boundary, 3100 ft; Holland and Fries (UNLV), locally common with Coleogyne, Chrysothamnus and Gutierrezia at the proposed Exxon lease site at the mouth of Whitmore Canyon, 5500 ft; Phillips (MNA), scattered on flat shelves in the Grand Canyon; Clover and Jotter (MO), mouth of Spencer Canyon. Clark Co: Leary and Niles 1895, with Yucca brevifolia, Yucca schidigera, Thamnosma, Acamptopappus and Larrea, 6.2 miles south of St. Thomas Gap along the Gold Butte road in Horse Spring Wash, 3300 ft; Holland and Whitney 939, with Opuntia basilaris, Ambrosia and Croton, in sandy soils, 2 miles west of Davis Dam, along state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 1500 ft; Holland (UNLV), scattered among volcanic boulders at Railroad Pass, 4 miles west of Boulder City, River Mountains, 2700 ft; Holland (UNLV), in red sands with Atriplex hymenelytra, just south of the Valley of Fire visitors center, 2600 ft.

Opuntia erinacea Engelm. & Bigel. var. erinacea

(prickly-pear cactus)

Succulent; uncommon, known from only a few localities in and around the recreation area. April-May.

Mohave Co: Holland and Blake (UNLV), in limestone substrate in Grapevine Canyon, south of the recreation area in the lower Grand Wash Cliffs, 3300 ft; Holland and Fries (UNLV), with Coleogyne, Yucca bacata and Artemisia at the proposed Exxon Uranium lease site at the mouth of Whitmore Canyon, 3500 ft. Clark Co: Leary and Niles 1897, with Coleogyne, Yucca schidigera, Yucca brevifolia and Thamnosma, 7.6 miles south of St. Thomas Gap in Horse Spring Wash along the Gold Butte road 3500 ft; Holland 1230, with Coleogyne, Opuntia chlorotica and Quercus turbinella in granitic outcrops, 1/4 mile west of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3600 ft; Holland and Niles 532, with Pinus monophylla Echinocereus triglochidiatus and Coleogyne on the western slope of Spirit Mountain, Newberry Mountains, 4600 ft.

Opuntia macrorhiza Engelm.

Succulent; in a ponderosa pine woodland on the road to Twin Point, Shivwits Plateau. June-July.

Mohave Co: Holland and Bostick (UNLV), in clay-rich soils with ponderosa pine, on the road to Twin Point, 1 mile south of the Mt. Dellenbaugh road, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft. <u>Clark Co</u>: none.

Opuntia phaeacantha Engelm.

var. major Engelm.

(prickly-pear cactus)

Succulent; reported from the Newberry Mountains, the Shivwits Plateau and Grand Canyon. April-June.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), occasional in weathered sandstone at the proposed Exxon Uranium lease site, Whitmore Canyon, 3500 ft; VanDevender and Meade (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Phillips (MNA), scattered on ledges in steep side canyons above Emory Falls. Clark Co: Holland and Schramm 1235, with Juniperus californica, Coleogyne and Acamptopappus, 1/4 mile west of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3600 ft; Holland and Niles 531, with Keckiella, Juniperus and Coleogyne, on the southwestern exposure of Spirit Mountain, Newberry Mountains, 4200 ft.

Opuntia polyacantha Haw.

(prickly-pear cactus)

var. rufispina (Engelm. & Bigel.) Benson

Succulent; occasional in varied habitats on the Colorado Plateau. April-June.

Mohave Co: Leary and Leary 1803, in an overgrazed meadow with Erodium and Salsola along the LMNRA boundary in Whitmore Canyon, 4000 ft; Holland 664, abundant with Yucca brevifolia along the road to Pierce Ferry, 10 miles northeast of U.S. highway 93, 3500 ft. Clark Co: none.

Opuntia ramosissima Engel.

(pencil cactus)

Succulent; common in varied habitats at low elevations. May.

Mohave Co: Holland and Bostick (UNLV), with Larrea-Ambrosia, 5 miles north of Katherine Landing, 700 ft; Holland (UNLV), common in sandy soils, 10 miles north of U.S. highway 95, on the road to Pierce Ferry, 3500 ft. Clark Co: Holland and Schramm 1234, in open sandy area, with Larrea, Ambrosia, Opuntia basilaris and Croton californica, 1 mile southwest of Davis Dam along state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 800 ft; Bench 23, near Railroad Pass in the foothills of the River Mountains, 3000 ft.

Opuntia stanlyi Engel.
var. parishii (Orcutt) Benson

(cholla)

Succulent; uncommon in the recreation area, but a few plants located along the southern extension. May-June.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Holland 1370, occasional in sandy soils with Larrea, Krameria and Ambrosia at the junction of Piute Wash and the Empire Wash road, Newberry Mountains, 2600 ft; Holland, scattered with Echinocereus engelmannii, Neolloydia johnsonii and Larrea on the hillsides north of Searchlight, 3800 ft.

Opuntia whipplei Engelm. & Bigel. var. multigeniculata (Clokey) Benson (cholla)

Succulent; rare. This variety has been proposed for a threatened status (Smithsonian Institution, 1975).

Reported by Benson (1969) from the lower Grand Canyon, from Diamond Creek to Peach Springs Wash; also occurring on hillsides west of Las Vegas. The plant was not collected or observed during this study.

<u>Calylophus hartwegii</u> (Benth.) Raven (evening-primrose) ssp. <u>lavandulifolius</u> (T. & G.) Towne & Raven

Perennial herb; not found in the recreation area, but collected on the northern portion of Shivwits Plateau. June-July.

Mohave Co: Holland & Niles 660, in limestone outcrop with Gilia multiflora, Penstemon pachyphyllus and Artemisia, 5 miles west of Grassy Mountain, near the road to Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits Plateau, 4700 ft. Clark Co: none.

Camissonia boothii (Dougl. in Hook.) Raven ssp. condensata (Munz) Raven

Annual; common and widely distributed below 3500 ft. throughout the recreation area. March-May.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), in deep sand with Hesperocallis and Palafoxia, 1/2 mile northwest of the Katherine ranger station, 850 ft; Holland (UNLV), in coarse gravels along the pavement, Willow Beach campground, 1100 ft. Clark Co: Holland 280, in coarse granitic soils with Viguiera, Fouquieria, Larrea and Cassia on the powerline road south of Bridge Canyon, Newberry Mountains, 2400 ft; Holland 983, in granitic soils with Tetradymia, Opuntia and Yucca, 1/4 mile north of the water channel in Sacatone Wash, Newberry Mountains, 3200 ft; Holland 142, in gravelly soils with Psorothamnus, Larrea and Krameria, 1 mile east of Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2400 ft.

<u>Camissonia</u> <u>brevipes</u> (Gray) Raven ssp. brevipes

Annual; widely distributed throughout the region. March-May.

Mohave Co: Cooper (GH), "the most densely villous and succulent individuals within the ssp. brevipes are found in Mohave County, Arizona and Clark County, Nevada in the region about Hoover Dam." Clark Co: Holland 845, common in granitic soils with Cassia, Eriogonum fasciculatum and Nolina bigelovii, 1/4 mile south of Bridge Canyon, Newberry Mountains, 2500 ft; Holland 785, common with Acamptopappus, Coleogyne and Juniperus, 1/4 mile west of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3400 ft; Fisher 473, scattered on road shoulders at Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2200 ft; Hop 26, along state highway 41, 2 miles east of Henderson, River Mountains, 1600 ft.

Camissonia brevipes (Gray) Raven ssp. pallidula (Munz) Raven

Annual; widely scattered at the lower elevations throughout the recreation area. April-July.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), locally abundant in the lower Grand Canyon, miles 270, 272, 274, 275, 276, 278 and 280. Clark Co: Holland & Schramm 880, common with Larrea, Ambrosia, Krameria, Amphipappus and Neolloydia along the North Shore road, 2 miles northeast of West End Wash, Muddy Mountains, 2000 ft; Nickell 561, in granitic soils, 1/2 mile west of Hiko Spring, just off state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2400 ft; Niles 872, Coyote Pass, Valley of Fire State Park, 2000 ft.

Camissonia californica (Nutt. ex T. & G.) Raven

Annual; reported only from the vicinity of the Newberry Mountains where it is restricted to granitic soils. March-May.

Clark Co: Holland 1051, common with Juniperus, Coleogyne and Nolina at Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3600 ft; Holland 926, in granitic soils with Yucca, Eriogonum fasciculatum and Larrea, at the head of Pipe Springs Canyon, 2800 ft; Holland 830, abundant in coarse gravels with Hyptis, Tamarix and Ambrosia eriocentra in Bridge Canyon, 1 mile west of state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2400 ft.

Camissonia chamaenerioides (Gray) Raven

Annual; scattered throughout the lower elevations of the recreation area. March-June.

Mohave Co: Holland & Bostick 405, with Larrea, Psorothamnus and Acacia, 5

miles north of Katherine Landing and 1/2 mile east of Lake Mohave, 750 ft. Clark Co: Holland 1103, scattered with Larrea, Ambrosia, Asclepias and Tricoptilium incisum, in Empire Wash, 1/2 mile west of Lake Mohave, Newberry Mountains, 800 ft; Holland 1059, uncommon in disturbed soils with Camissonia multijuga and Baileya at the junction of state highway 77 and the Christmas Tree Pass road, Newberry Mountains, 2300 ft.

Camissonia claviformis (Torr. & Frem.) Raven ssp. aurantiaca (Wats.) Raven

Annual; widely distributed throughout the lower elevations of the recreation area. April-May.

Mohave Co: Holland 492, common with Psorothamnus fremontii, Acacia greggii and Hyptis emoryi in wash gravels 5 miles north of Katherine Landing and 1/4 mile east of Lake Mohave, 800 ft; Phillips (MNA), found only at Pierce Ferry, 365 m; Cooper (GH), Lectotype, Fort Mohave, Mohave County, Arizona. Clark Co: Leary 29, in gravelly soils in Sacatone Wash, 5 miles north of state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 1500 ft; Holland 923, with Coleogyne, Optuntia acanthocarpa and Eriogonum fasciculatum, 1 mile west of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 2600 ft; Nickell 598, common 1/2 mile west of Hiko Spring, just off state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2400 ft; Trelease 29, 3 miles south of Railroad Pass, River Mountains; Berg 36, Boulder Beach, 1 mile from the shore of Lake Mead.

Camissonia confertiflora (Raven) Raven

Annual; rare, according to Raven (1969), known from a single locality to the northeast of LMNRA. April.

Mohave Co: McClintock (CAS), in cinder soil, on east side, base of Vulcan's Throne, Toroweap Valley, Grand Canyon National Monument. Clark Co: none.

Camissonia exilis (Raven) Raven

Annual; rare, reported along the northern boundary of LMNRA (Raven, 1969). June.

Mohave Co: Munz (POM), in gypsum, near Cottonwood Spring, east base of Virgin Mountains, 3500 ft. Clark Co: none.

Camissonia multijuga (S. Wats.) Raven

Annual or biennial; common, mostly in disturbed roadside gravels and gypsum soils throughout the lower elevations of the recreation area. Flowering throughout most of the year.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), scattered in side canyons (Columbine Falls) and

flat areas in the Grand Canyon; Holland (UNLV), in gypsum soils with Larrea, Psorothamnus and Sphaeralcea at the proposed Mobil and Wahl Yee oil and gas lease sites, 3 miles northeast of Grand Wash Bay, 2200 ft; Clover & Jotter (MO), Separation and Spencer Canyons. Clark Co: Leary 1738, common along large wash with Larrea, Ambrosia, Aristida and Encelia, at the entrance to the recreation area in Eldorado Canyon, Eldorado Mountains, 1800 ft; Leary & Leary 1671, common with Larrea, Hilaria, Ambrosia and Prosopis, 3 miles south of Overton on state highway 12, 1500 ft; Leary & Leary 1569, in gypsiferous soil with Larrea, Ambrosia, Psorothamnus and Enceliopsis at the junction of state highway 41 and the North Shore road, LMNRA, 1700 ft; Holland & Schramm 1623, along the edges of alluvial slopes with Hymenoclea, Encelia and Hyptis in Empire Wash, 1 mile west of Lake Mohave, Newberry Mountains, 900 ft; Holland 1219, scattered with Brickellia, Opuntia basilaris and Nolina in Bridge Canyon, 1/2 mile west of state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2400 ft; Holland 995, common in alkaline gravels with Anulocaulis leiosolenus at the junction of the North Shore road and the turn-off to Stewart Point, 1500 ft.

Annual; common in sandy soils throughout the lower elevations of the recreation area. April-September.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), on lower slopes and in side canyons in the Grand Canyon. Clark Co: Leary 1893, in sandy soil, 1/4 mile north of Devil's Throat off Gold Butte road, 2300 ft; Holland 1204, with Haplopappus cooperi and Krameria parvifolia, 1/2 mile east of U. S. highway 95 on the Christmas Tree Pass road, 2800 ft; Holland 1191, in granitic soils, 1 mile east of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3200 ft; Holland 113, in sandy soils, 1 mile southwest of Boulder City, 2200 ft.

Stephanomeria pauciflora (Torr.) Nutt.

Perennial herb; common and widespread throughout the low mountain ranges of the Lake Mead area. May-September.

Mohave Co: Phillips (MNA), on lower slopes and in side canyons in the Grand Canyon. Clark Co: Leary 1684, 2 miles north of the junctions of state highways 40 and 12, near the Valley of Fire State Park, 1600 ft; Holland 1523, in roadside gravels, 1 mile north of Railroad Pass, River Mountains, 2700 ft; Holland 1322, 3 miles west of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3300 ft; Holland 1065, in rocky outcrops, just west of Davis Dam along state highway 77, 750 ft; Nickell 607, 1/2 mile north of Grapevine Canyon, on the Christmas Tree Pass road, Newberry Mountains, 2600 ft.

Stylocline micropoides Gray

Annual; common in the southern, low elevation areas. February-May.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Leary 1721, with Larrea and Ambrosia on ridge northeast of Hamblin Mountain, Black Mountains, 2700 ft; Holland 1559, in coarse gravels, 1 mile north of Hiko Spring, along state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2600 ft; Holland 1031, in small wash, 1/2 mile east of U. S. highway 95, on the Empire Wash road, Newberry Mountains, 2600 ft; Holland 472, with Eurotia, Yucca and Castilleja at the summit of Red Mountain, River Mountains, 2900 ft; Nickell 638, 1 plant found, 1/2 mile west of Hiko Spring, Newberry Mountains, 2500 ft.

Taraxacum officinale Wiggers

(dandelion)

Perennial herb; common in meadows on the Shivwits Plateau. May-August.

Mohave Co: Holland 1301, in clay soils with Hymenoxys richardsonii, Convolvulus arvensis and Corydalis aurea, in the large meadow just north of the Mt. Dellenbaugh fire camp, Shivwits Plateau, 6200 ft. Clark Co: Holland (UNLV), in lawns at the park housing area northwest of Boulder Beach, 1300 ft.

Tetradymia canescens DC.

Shrub; occasional north of the recreation area and probably within the boundary on the Plateau. July-August.

Mohave Co: Holland 695, with Cleome <u>lutea</u> and <u>Asclepias</u> <u>subverticillata</u> in Mainstreet Valley, 49 miles south of St. George, Utah, 4500 ft. Clark Co: none.

Tetradymia stenolepis Greene

Shrub; known within the recreation area only from the Newberry Mountains. May-August.

Mohave Co: none. Clark Co: Holland 1432, in granitic soils with Larrea, Yucca, Krameria and Acamptopappus in Sacatone Wash, 3 miles east of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3000 ft; Gullion (LM), guzzler S-2, 9 miles west-southwest of Davis Dam, Newberry Mountains, 2680 ft; Littlefield 46, Dead Mountains, south of Christmas Tree Pass, 5000 ft.

Thelesperma subnudum Gray

Perennial herb; locally common north of the recreation area and to be expected within our area. May-September.

Mohave Co: Holland 1302, with <u>Eriogonum ovalifolium</u> and <u>Juniperus osteosperma</u> in limestone soils, on road to Mt. Dellenbaugh, 55 miles south of St. George, Utah, 5000 ft; Holland 688, with <u>Pinus ponderosa</u> and <u>Artemisia tridentata</u>, 4 miles northwest of Mt. Dellenbaugh, Shivwits <u>Plateau</u>, 6000 ft. Clark Co: none.

Townsendia exscapa (Richards) Porter

Perennial herb; known from a single locality on the Shivwits Plateau but probably more widespread. April-June.

Mohave Co: Holland 1264, in limestone soils with Rhus trilobata, Menodora scabra and Viola nuttallii, at the junction of the Twin Point and Mt. Dellenbaugh roads, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft. Clark Co: none.

Tragopogon dubius Scop.

(goats-beard)

Perennial herb; common in ponderosa pine forests throughout the Shivwits Plateau. May-September.

Mohave Co: Holland 1413, with Pinus ponderosa, Geranium richardsonii and Hymenopappus lugens at the Mt. Dellenbaugh fire camp, Shivwits Plateau, 6200 ft. Clark Co: none.

Trichoptilium incisum (Gray) Gray

Perennial herb; occasional in areas of desert pavement at the lower elevations of Lake Mead. February-May, October-November.

Mohave Co: Holland 397, on rolling hills of desert pavement 5 miles north of Katherine Landing, 750 ft; Holland, in talus on the southern exposure of Fortification Hill, 1200 ft. Clark Co: Leary 1801, wash at the east end of Sandstone Spring, Pinto Valley, Black Mountains, 2000 ft; Holland 1605, with Larrea, Encelia, and Opuntia basilaris on desert pavement in Empire Wash, 2 miles west of Lake Mohave, 800 ft; Holland (UNLV), on desert pavement at the Fire Mountain launch site, 1 mile south of the mouth of Eldorado Canyon, 700 ft.

Trixis californica Kellogg

Shrub; known only from the lower Grand Canyon, not yet found in Nevada. February-April.

Mohave Co: VanDevender (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Phillips (MNA), on steep rocky slopes within the Grand Canyon (450 m), but not seen at Pierce Ferry or on the rims; Ives (US), Diamond River Canyon. Clark Co: none.

Verbesina encelioides (Cav.) Benth. & Hook. (crown-beard)

Annual; known only from north of the recreation area. May-December.

Mohave Co: Holland 693, with Cleome <u>lutea</u>, <u>Tetradymia</u> <u>canescens</u> and <u>Asclepias</u> <u>subverticillata</u> in Wolfhole Valley, 37 miles <u>south</u> of St. George, Utah, 5000 ft. <u>Clark Co</u>: none.

Viguiera deltoidea Gray var. parishii (Greene) Vasey & Rose

Shrub; common in rocky outcrops along the southern extension of the recreation area and in the lower Grand Canyon. February-June, September-October.

Mohave Co: VanDevender (ARIZ), Peach Springs Wash; Phillips (MNA), on rocky slopes and in dry side canyons in the Grand Canyon; Grater (LM), open flats at the rim of Quartermaster Canyon, 5500 ft. Clark Co: Holland 1532, with Eriogonum fasciculatum and Hyptis emoryi at the junction of Christmas Tree Pass road and state highway 77, Newberry Mountains, 2000 ft; Holland 918, in granitic outcrops, in Sacatone Wash, 1/2 mile east of Christmas Tree Pass, Newberry Mountains, 3600 ft; Bostick 3184, granitic cliffs at Keyhole Canyon with Haplopappus cuneatus, Eldorado Mountains.

Viguiera multiflora (Nutt.) Blake

Perennial herb; common in all habitats on the Shivwits Plateau. May-September.

Mohave Co: Holland 1421, with <u>Desmanthus cooleyi</u>, <u>Psoralea tenuiflora</u> and <u>Pinus ponderosa</u>, along road to Mt. <u>Dellenbaugh</u>, <u>2 miles northwest</u> of the fire camp, Shivwits Plateau, 6000 ft; Holland 718, in the large open meadow just north of the fire camp, Shivwits Plateau, 6200 ft; Grater (IM), Rampart Point, Grand Wash Cliffs, 5500 ft. Clark Co: none.

Xanthium saccharatum Wallr.

(cocklebur)

Annual; common along river channels throughout the recreation area. February-October.

Mohave Co: Holland (UNLV), on sandy shelves along the Colorado River below Hoover Dam, 650 ft. Clark Co: Leary 1861, along drainage ditch, near cultivated fields, 0.6 mile from the Riverside bridge, 1500 ft.

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
