Hey what a great day it was on Saturday, September 24th; unbelievable weather and lots of people out helping with the community clean-up and meeting with Mayor and Council. We had six of eleven members of Council attend; those that could not make it did send regards. Mayor Melissa Blake, Russell Thomas, Mike Allen, Jane Stroud and Donny Scott all commented on how beautiful it was out in Saprae Creek and how nice it was to attend an event where the people were so positive and friendly. I hope you got a chance to talk to some of the Councillors and let them know what we are concerned about in Saprae Creek and on Draper Road.

While the Residents Association waited patiently for their operating fund cheque from the RMWB, it reminded me that the RMWB administration is getting a lot of complaints about how slowly we are paying our bills. 

Geared towards ages 0-5, a great way for your child to socialize with similar aged children by way of interactive stations, craft time, circle time followed by in a light snack.







Overview

- A recognized sport or cultural organization
