## REPORT IN DUNGARVAN NEWSPAPER CONDEMNED

### No Allowances For Chairman And Vice-Chairman Of Health Board

A Dungarvan newspaper report that claimed the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the South Eastern Health Board were in receipt of respective annual allowances of £500 and £350 was condemned by Mr. C. Curran at Monday's meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan.

Mr. Curran said he had no desire to infringe on the freedom of the press but they must also ensure that things published in the papers were accurate. From the report he now referred to it was clear that he personally was in receipt of an annual allowance of £500 from the South Eastern Health Board but that was not so in his case as a reflection on himself and also on the County Council. He reiterated that the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Health Board were not in receipt of the special allowance referred to in the report and added that this had done him great harm.

### NOT ENTITLED TO ALLOWANCE

"All I have in the world is my character and I hope to take that to the grave with me," Mr. Curran went on "I am not entitled to an allowance and will not be claiming anything other than my ordinary travelling expenses. Also since I lost the Chairmanship of the County Council certain people have been speaking about the expenses I was supposed to have been getting out of it. Let me state categorically that last year I got the sum of £92 for travelling expenses while other members of the Council got once and a half times that, which they were entitled to."

The discussion ended without further comment.

## ROADWORKERS DEDUCTED—BUT THEY DON'T KNOW FOR WHAT

To endorse explanatory slips about income tax and other deductions with the pay cheques of County Council employees would mean installing machinery costing in the region of £7,000, the members of the Council were told at last Monday's monthly meeting in Dungarvan.

The suggestion that these slips be included with employees' cheques was made by Mr. C. Curran who said on occasions massive reductions were made in roadworkers' pay and they didn't know what the deductions were for. He felt if they were explained on a pay slip it would help the situation.

Mr. F. J. O'Leary, County Accountant, said there were 236 Council employees and it wouldn't be possible to provide these slips manually. To provide the machinery necessary would be very costly, in the region of £7,000 and if it was to be used for that purpose only it wouldn't be an economic proposition. They were investigating however what was being done elsewhere and would have a report for a future meeting.

Mr. Curran said that at a cost of £7,000 he wouldn't even consider it.

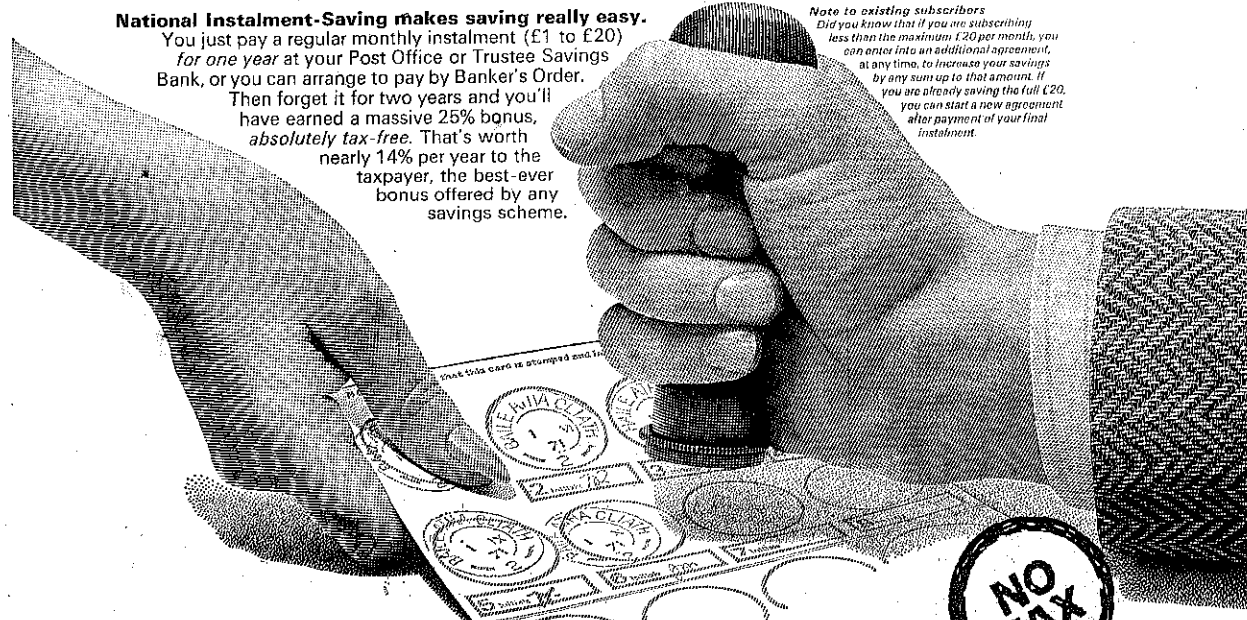

### THRILLING SENIOR HURLING FINAL ENDS IN DRAW

St. Mollerans (Carrickbeg) came oh so close to creating hurling history at Walsh Park, Waterford, on Sunday last. Looking poised for victory with a four points lead with only five minutes to go the Mollerans, last year's intermediate champions, were on the brink of achieving what no other club in the County has so far achieved the winning of a senior hurling title in their first year in the grade.
