## PENSAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### MINISTER'S ADDRESS TO AGRICULTURAL COMMITTEE

The Minister of State at the Department of Agriculture, Mr. Lorcan Allen, T.D., visited Dungarvan last week where he addressed members of the County Committee of Agriculture at their adjourned monthly meeting. Having read from a prepared script the Minister then faced a question and answer session which covered many of the problems at present facing the agricultural community in the county.

In his replies to some of the more thorny aspects the Minister displayed his ability to kick for touch while in one or two issues he just simply stonewalled. When asked by Cllr. James A. Walsh to comment on the fact that the bacon factory in Cappoquin was allowed to die because of the outdated policy of the DA in regard to the bacon industry, the Minister replied that he was unable to comment as he was not familiar with the facts.

When Deputy Eddie Collins raised the matter of Clover Meats Ltd. and whether the Government were prepared to give a commitment if the firm struck financial trouble, the Minister stated that the Government had already given such a financial commitment. Deputy Collins welcomed this news but I have since been informed that this assurance was something which the Minister might have been wiser not to have given.

The Minister told Cllr. Jimmy Quirk that the 30 day test regulation would have to remain in force for a while longer as progress in the longer TB eradication scheme had not been as good as expected. Cllr. Quirk pointed out that a big number of farmers were suffering because of this regulation and sought to have the test period extended to 60 or 90 days.

When Cllr. Willie McDonnell referred to the problems which faced fruit and vegetable producers, the Minister agreed that we were importing more of these than we should. He thought that the problem was being aggravated by "dumping" carried out by a number of producers going to Europe which would otherwise be returning empty but he added that they had no proof of this. In this regard the Minister also said that the presentation of fruit and vegetables by home producers left a lot to be desired.

The Minister wound up the session by thanking the Committee for inviting him to attend the meeting and added that he hoped to be around a little while longer. An obvious allusion to the coming general election and the prospects of the government of the day were returned to power, remarking: "I had to get that plug in."

Apart from the Minister's visit, history was made at the meeting as it marked a breach in the former all-male preserve for the first time when Mrs. Mary Shanahan, Kilmeadon, as the nominated representative of the I.C.A., became the first woman to become a member of and to sit at a meeting of the Committee.

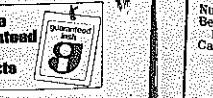

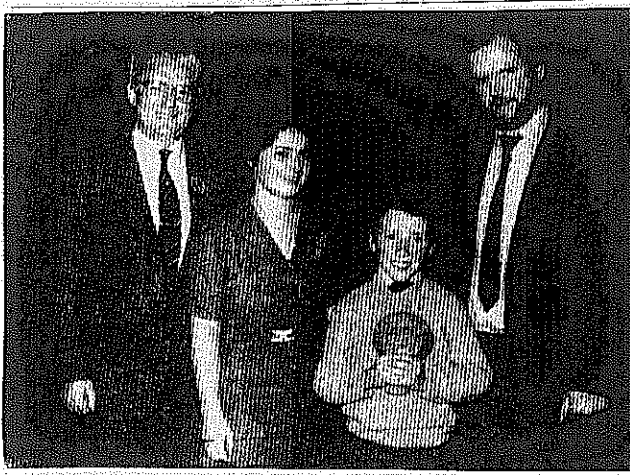

**MILK PRICE SURVEY**  
The prices of milk released by the Agricultural Institute quantifies the differences in milk prices between Ireland and some other E.E.C. countries. The report, written by Michael Keane and Eamonn Flinn of the Institute's Marketing Department, also sets out to explain the reasons why Ireland is so much lower in Ireland. One measure of milk prices used in the study is the percentage of the E.E.C. target price achieved in each country. In Ireland, in the period 1978 to 1980, the average achieved was about 86, while in several other continental countries the corresponding figure was between 96 and 99 per cent. Prices are also compared in pence per gallon. Because of the inflation in most countries, higher levels of fat in milk and protein content amount to nearly 30 pence per gallon.

However, when these factors are taken into account, the difference between Ireland and other E.E.C. dairying countries—Denmark, Germany, France and the Netherlands—this corresponds with the difference of about 10 percentage points in the attainment of the target price.

This seven pence difference has been further broken down in the study among the different factors, viz. transport, milk constituents, processing costs, profit retention in Irish Co-Operatives, product mix, small home market, returns particularly for butter on the British market, distance from the main port and storage and interest charges. Almost all of the differences in the study correspond to the differences in the milk price under these headings.

The authors state that the results of the study raise several policy issues. They feel that milk payment schemes should include an element of payment for the milk producer should be known to farmers early in the year. Secondly, our seasonal production pattern affects seven of the nine items arising in the study. Previous studies of seasonality indicated that in the milk price, the higher returns arising would be negated by higher costs of production. It is still the case that prices are lower than E.E.C. levels are available. Thirdly, a review of the relationships between the marketing and manufacturing arms of the industry seems to be necessary. The authors also query the policy of continuing to accept low returns on the UK butter market and the low fat levels of Irish milk. The detailed draft of the report is available to all E.E.C. farming organisations for comment prior to the preparation of a final report for publication. The study is being financially assisted by the Irish dairy industry and the Agricultural Trust.

FARMERS WELCOME MILK STUDY FINDINGS

Mr. Donald Cashman, President of the I.F.A. and Anthony Leddy, President of the I.C.M.S.A. in their initial reaction to the findings of the study being undertaken by An Foras Tachtála, both Presidents of the industry have welcomed the report. They stated that not alone do the findings report quantify the price received by Irish dairy farmers, but more importantly, they indicate the extent of the gap which can be achieved, however further research may be required in specific areas.

In his opening remarks, Mr. Cashman stated that the findings of the report clearly demonstrate the need for greater investment by the State in progeny testing and the need to provide aid for greater use of milk recordings. It is difficult to explain why there has been no significant improvement in this vital area during the past 20 years.

Mr. Cashman and Mr. Leddy agreed fully with the recommendations on milk collection and processing costs which is what there is need for greater efficiency in these areas. In the past three years the percentage increase in these costs has been greater in Ireland than in any other of the EEC countries examined.

£400,000 In Sheep Headage Grants In Last Five Years

In the course of his address to members of the Co. Waterford Committee of Agriculture in Dungarvan last week, Mr. Lorcan Allen, T.D., Minister of State at the Department of Agriculture referring to the sheep-farming sector said that the Government had recently decided to increase the headage payments for sheep in 1981 under the Disadvantaged Areas Directive by the equivalent of £2 per ewe. This would be in addition to any sub-subsidies which will be payable for the 1981-82 marketing year which began on April 5 under the Sheepmark Regulations.

This premium, the Minister added, would again depend on the level of the wool price. He said that under the Sheep Headage Schemes, stock owners in Co. Waterford had received grants amounting to nearly £400,000 over the past five years. Mr. Allen then referred to the losses sustained by sheep farmers through attacks on sheep flocks by marauding stray dogs and he said that they were engaged in this legislation which would be ready in about six months and added, "I hope it will do away with the massive number of stray dogs which have been in the country and which no one seems to want."

BOVINE T.B. ERADICATION

The Minister also referred to the Bovine T.B. and Brucellosis Eradication Schemes and said that as a measure of assistance to the farmers in the cost of pre-mortem tests which were a heavy financial burden on the farmer, a total of £8 million would be provided towards these expenses.

YOUNG FARMERS

Mr. Allen concluded his address as follows: "I understand that about 50 young people are to be farming each year in Co. Waterford. The high standard of courses available through the advisory service gives an excellent opportunity to make farming a worthwhile profession. It is of vital importance for the future of the industry that these entrants are identified and provided with every facility to help themselves with the knowledge and skills so necessary for successful farming in the present time.

"Over the past five years, 169 young people from the county spent a year at agricultural colleges and 35 girls at rural home economics colleges, all with scholarships awarded by the Committee. In the same period 129 students attended farm schools and 100 completed farmer training courses under EEC Directive 101. This prompts me to pay tribute to the good work of Co. Committees whose contribution to the development of agriculture over the past half century has not always been fully appreciated. With the inception of ACOT the role of the Committees takes on a new emphasis. With a membership broadened by the inclusion of representatives of the rural organisations, the Committee will now draw up the annual advisory and training programme they consider necessary to meet the needs of the county. They will also make recommendations to ACOT whenever desirable to improve the effectiveness of programmes locally.

"I know that ACOT and the Committees have entered upon their new journey with optimism and enthusiasm and that co-operation between these bodies for the benefit of Irish agriculture is excellent."

Growers who wish to have seed potato crops inspected for certification are reminded that application for inspection must be made on the appropriate form and that the completed form should reach the Potato Inspector not later than 15th May. Prospective growers should note that crops will not be inspected unless they are grown from Nucleus Seed or Foundation Seed or from the produce of such seed obtained from an approved source. A seed crop will not be certified unless all the growers land on which potatoes are grown is shown to be free from Potato Root Rot, Beltworm as a result of laboratory examination of the soil.

Forms of application and information about the conditions of certification may be obtained from the local Potato Inspector or from the Department of Agriculture (Section 21), Agriculture House, Dublin 2. It should be noted that from 1st June, 1981 it shall be an offence to sell seed other than certified seed.
