Honour for Cappoquin-Born Priest in Australia

We take the following account of the elevation of Mr. Prendergast to the rank of Domestic Prelate in a South Australian Cathedral.

Mr. Prendergast is very well known locally, being brother of Mrs. John Moloney, Ballinacorney, Dungarvan and Mrs. Mangan, Carrizacour, Lismore and brother of Mr. John Prendergast, Lyle East, where he was born and reared.

His attendance estimated at 100,000, he attended the function organized to honour Mr. Prendergast's elevation to the rank of Domestic Prelate.

His Lordship Bishop Gallager, Bishop of Port Pirie, presided at the ceremony in St. Mary's Church, when Mr. Prendergast was invested with the mitre and crozier. Rev. Fr. Whivalla, gave the oration and explained the significance of the honour conferred on His Holiness, the Pope.

Mr. Prendergast, in his address of service to the Cathedral Church in South Australia, said:

"The function in the Cathedral of Port Pirie, on the evening of August 7th, was a most happy and successful one. It was presided over by His Holiness, the Pope, who was accompanied by the Archbishop of Adelaide, the Bishop of Port Pirie, and the Bishop of Melbourne. The ceremony was attended by a large number of the clergy and laity of the diocese. The Bishop of Port Pirie, in his address, said that it was a great privilege to have a Cappoquin-born priest elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate. He said that Mr. Prendergast was a man of great piety and charity, and that his elevation was a just reward for his many years of faithful service to the Church and his fellow-creatures."

INCREASED ENTRIES IN HORSE AND HOME CRAFTS SECTIONS BEST SHOW IN YEARS

THE President, Mr. A. Hunt; the Chairman, Mr. E. Maher; the Vice-Chairman, Mr. C. Dempsey; the efficient Secretary, Miss K. O'Brien, and the hard-working Committee can feel pardonably proud of the wonderfully successful Show held last week.

Excellent weather conditions favoured Dungarvan Agricultural Show on Thursday of last week on a wonderful crowd turned up to enjoy what proved to be one of the most successful shows in recent years.

A noteworthy feature was the tremendous increase in the number of entries in the horse section. Instead of an entry of between 75 and 90 horses, a total of 150 appeared on the programme. Standards all round proved exceptionally high.

This being the first show at Dungarvan since the lamented death of Mr. Jack Lynch, Vice-President and one that did so much for the well-being of the show, a period of two minutes' silence was observed just prior to the parade of hounds by Dungarvan Harriers Hunt Club under joint masters T. Kieley and L. Morrissey.

The parade of hounds, as usual proved to be a colourful affair and drew prodigious applause from the big audience. Home industries showed another big jump in the number of entries. There was a welcome revival in traditional crafts.
