Cullen microcephalum Dusky Scurf-pea. A trailing perennial herb found in southeast of NSW.



Lasioglossum (Chilalictus) lanarium Halictid Bee on
Podolepis jaceoides Showy Copper Wire Daisy.



Swainsona galegifolia Smooth Darling Pea. A long flowering perennial pea. A worthy garden plant.



Ranunculus lappaceus Common Buttercup. A perennial herb that is found across eastern Australia.



Calytrix tetragona Common Fringe Myrtle. A widespread species found across SE Australia.



Rutidosia leptorrhynchoides Button Wrinklewort. A rare perennial grassland and woodland species.



Leptospermum rotundifolium Round-leaved Tea Tree. Larger flowers make this an attractive species.



Jacksonia scoparia Winged Broom Pea. Sometimes called Dogwood. A small somewhat open tree.



Pelargonium Sp. Striatellum Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be formally described endangered species.



Rhodanthe anthemoides Chamomile Sunray. Shown last month, this plant is near the Forest 20 entrance.



Chrysocephalum semipapposum Clustered Everlasting. A multi-stemmed perennial daisy.



Grevillea iaspicula Wee Jasper Grevillea. A tall shrub endangered in it's natural habitat.
