Human remains found at property of missing man

Neighbors in a quiet Leesburg retirement community were stunned Sunday when Lake County sheriff's investigators discovered a body buried in the yard of a homeowner who reportedly has been missing in recent weeks.

Sheriff's officials said the death is "suspicious." There's concern that it may be the body of the missing homeowner, Jesse Wachter, 63.

"At this point, we do have a body that has been located at the property," Lt. John Herrell, sheriff's spokesman, said Sunday afternoon as yellow crime-scene tape and vehicles of the medical examiner and LCSO authorities surrounded the cream-color home at 181 North Lake Drive, in the Mid-Florida Lakes community.

"The identity of the victim has not been identified, nor has the cause of death been determined," Herrell said.

"It is obviously suspicious. We are treating it as a suspicious death investigation," Herrell said. "With neighbors reporting that they haven't seen this man in recent weeks, that would lead us to suspect that it could be him, but obviously we are not going to assume or reach to any conclusions."

Herrell said crime-scene investigators were working to exhume the body while detec-

tives had a warrant to search the home for evidence that might help determine what took place.

The investigation initially began after 8 p.m. Jan. 11 when the Sheriff's Office received a report from a neighbor, who told deputies that someone was at the house loading items on a trailer. This concerned the neighbor since Wachter hadn't been seen recently.

Deputies responded and stopped the vehicle, which happened to be Wachter's truck, and found that the trailer it was pulling contained Wachter's motorcycle, golf cart and appliances.

The truck was being driven by Wachter's son, Jesse Jordan, 28. Jordan's girlfriend, Jessica Thigpen, also 28, was a passenger in the truck.

Herrell said both Jordan and Thigpen admitted to being drug addicts, and deputies found the pair in possession of drugs. They were both arrested and taken to the Lake County Jail.

Herrell said a cadaver dog was brought to the home Jan.

Students learn to build the future

Lake Tech offers programs aimed at manufacturing jobs

C.A. Vossberg is facing a predicament that has never happened before: In the next five to 10 years, more than half of his staff is up for retirement, leaving him with a huge gap to fill in his workforce.

Vossberg is president of Electron Machine Corporation in Umatilla, which employs 21 people. The company manufactures and designs industrial control instrumentation.

"Our average employee has been with us for 30 years," he said, explaining that in the next three years, workers will begin retiring. "I need to figure out how to replace them."

The challenge, Vossberg said, is finding "skilled workers living nearby."

"When I do hire somebody, it is a significant investment on the company's behalf," he said. "I don't want them to turn around a year later and go for greener pastures."

Numerous manufacturing industries in Lake County are facing several problems finding the right workers. It can be difficult

to find people with the right job skills in the county, and there is often no program available to train workers who want to fill those positions, according to county officials.

Manufacturers were "actually having to go outside of Lake County to advertise for available jobs," said Commissioner Leslie Campione.

Seeking a solution, Lake Technical Center officials last year broached the idea of building a Center for Advanced Manufacturing to county leaders, with plans to train workers in manufacturing, machining and welding.

Sen. Alan Hays, R-Umatilla, and Rep. Larry Metz, R-Groveland, helped secure \$1 million in funding for the center.

The center is expected to be operational beginning in the fall, providing specialized training in "fabrication, machining including CNC, milling, welding," among other areas, according to Diane Culpepper, director of Lake Tech.

From combat boots to cowboy boots

Combat Boots to Cowboy Boots is a catchy name, and that's what director Jen Elliott had in mind to attract veterans interested in a certified equine training/job placement program geared to help them transfer their military skills to working on horse farms in the region.

She knows of large ranches looking to hire veterans willing and able to do physical work.

"The job market is hot;

there are more jobs (available on horse farms) than I have veterans," Elliott said. "There are hundreds of jobs — part time, full time — and to get somebody that is stable and reliable is really a big deal."

In the Ocala area alone, Elliott said, there are more than 600 horse farms and 29,000-some people employed in the industry. She believes many Lake and Sumter counties ranches also could benefit from veterans trained in horse handling and safety; horse

grooming; equine psychology and educated on ranch maintenance and farm equipment and repair.

A former nurse in the mental health field, Elliott said veterans inspired her to start the program after she repeatedly heard: "I don't want mental health, I want a job."

She spent time coordinating Combat Boots to Cowboy Boots and now runs the 40-hour, five-week training course from her 17-acre horse farm

in Ocklawaha, where veterans can receive hands-on experience while working with the farm's rescue horses.

The training is offered from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., Tuesdays, and from 1 to 5 p.m., Thursdays. A new session is set to begin within a couple of weeks.

"Horses are different in the morning than they are in the afternoon," Elliott said. "I do a lot of horse psychology because I think you can't work on a horse farm and not appreciate horses; they are very sensitive."

She believes there are similarities between horses and combat veterans.

"Horse and combat veterans are alert, they work in a group, they look to a leader, they bond slowly with outsiders, they're nonverbal and they are hyper vigilant," she said of being alert. "Hyper vigilance is the No. 1 key that you talk about with the veterans coming home."

"They are a natural fit for horse farms, and this is a strength-based program. A lot of things that the veterans come back with, I can use and

make them better here; I can use the hyper vigilance and channel that to read a horse."

Elliott said her horses have benefited from the attention from the veterans who have gone through the program.

"The horses are so much better because they were used to only me handling them. When people would come, they would be nervous, but now they are calm. It's a win-win, and I have learned with rescue animals that it's not enough that you love the animal, they have to learn that other people will love them, too."

She also believes the horses are a confidence booster for the vets.

"With these guys, I really see a transformation," she said. "There is a bond between the horses and the vets; this program is a real confidence builder when you can move a 1,200 pound horse with a finger. And it's peaceful here. We don't rush them, and it's a wonderful transition program."

Veteran Steve Lawrence, 26, was one of the first to go through the program after coming home from serving in Iraq.

"I really enjoyed it

and it calmed my mind; I really enjoyed being outside with the horses," he said.

Combat Boots to Cowboy Boots also is open for older veterans who want to come out to the farm to help groom horses or be around the animals.

Vietnam veteran Tom Sanderlin of The Villages enjoys spending time on Elliott's horse farm. He has found being around the horses has helped with his mild symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

"I definitely encourage this program," he said. "One of the things that you do with PTSD is that you shut down people and emotions. Most people don't understand, but the horse understands."

"I consider my animals to be nurturing," said Elliott, who noted there is no charge for the veterans to be in the Combat Boots to Cowboy Boots program.

"I think that they have paid enough," she said of the vets' military service.

is to train and prepare the skilled workforce for our region to assist the manufacturing companies that are already here so they can grow, and when their employees leave, we can replace them," Culpepper said. "We also want to train the skilled workforce available to attract new companies to relocate to Lake County."

Robert Chandler, the county's economic development and tourism director, said the center is the beginning of something much bigger.

"When you look from a comprehensive standpoint, this is one piece of a larger strategy, which is really to make Lake County a dominant location in the state for manufacturing," he said. "The biggest challenge for manufacturers today, especially in Lake County, is finding workers."

About 6.6 percent of the county's workforce is comprised of manufacturing, higher than the regional average of 5.5 percent, according to the U.S. Census.

By comparison, in Osceola County, the manufacturing workforce is at 3.8 percent; Orange County is at 4.2 percent and Seminole County is at 6.1 percent.

11 and alerted on the property, signifying that there was a body buried there. Crime-scene personnel then began excavating the site.

Neighbor Andrew O'Neil came home Jan. 12 to find deputies had used the carport of his home as the starting point for blocking off the crime-scene area.

"I've never seen police here, especially right here in my carport," he said. "This is just shocking."

Other neighbors in the community of 1,000-plus homes gathered in clusters and admitted they were stunned.

"Mercy, mercy," said Elizabeth Satterfield, who has lived at Mid-Florida Lakes for nearly 10 years. "Nothing liked this has ever happened that I know of."

Satterfield said Wachter lived by himself but that others might have moved in, while O'Neil said he had seen Wachter and his son together in what appeared to be happy times.

"I always thought they were a close-knit family and I'd seen them fishing like a father and son thing. I'd see Jesse and his son always out there with their fishing poles," O'Neil said. "They would always wave and I'd wave back."

And while some folks found pets they wanted to adopt and take home, it worked the other way around for Frank and Marianne Delbo. The pair of 56 years of marriage said they were adopted by Sarah, a cute brown Chihuahua.

"We got here and she took right away to him," Marianne said of the dog jumping on her husband's lap. "She adopted him right away."

Sarah was one of several dogs provided by Max's Pet Connection Inc., a small dog rescue, which saved Sarah from being euthanized from a Umatilla kill-shelter.

"We have had a nice bunch of people looking at the dogs, and obviously adoptions are wonderful," said Maxine Hirsch of Max's Pet Connection.

Pat Sturdivant, president of Plantation Paw Prints Dog Club, noted there are many dog and cat lovers in her community.

"There are just under 5,000 hous-

es here and half of the people have dogs and cats, so we're talking about a bunch of pets," she said, pleased by the turnout of the first pet expo.

Variety of vendors were on hand, too, offering a wide array of services, including dog and cat adoptions, a low-cost vaccine clinic, free nail trims for dogs, a dog obedience demonstration and more.

"This is the first time we've ever had something for the pets," she said. "It's a nice place to see things and learn about new health issues."

Sturdivant is the proud owner of two cocker spaniels who are 10½ year old sisters, Taffy and Sandy.

"They are inseparable. If one has a veterinarian's appointment, the other one has to go for moral support. They eat together, they sleep together and they are really, really sweet," she said.

Taffy has been blind for three years.

"She navigates through the house well and Sandy helps her," Sturdivant said. "It's so sweet, it's like Taffy has her own little guide dog."

GROVELAND

136 plants found in grow house

One hundred and thirty-six marijuana plants were found in Groveland this week in what police are calling the biggest grow house there in recent memory.

The plants were found inside a house at 1185 Singleton Circle, police Lt. Scott Penrose said. The residence was a rental property that was entirely reconfigured as a grow operation with no living space inside, he added.

According to a press release, a Groveland police officer was on routine patrol and discovered the plants when she spotted an open door at the house in the Green Valley West subdivision around 10:47 a.m. Sunday. The officer thought the house was being burglarized and noted the pot plants were in plain view.

A search warrant was obtained and the house searched around 3:30 that afternoon, according to Penrose.

The investigation is

still active and no one has been charged at this time.

The Drug Enforcement Administration says Florida has more indoor marijuana grow houses than anywhere in the country. Despite high rent and set-up costs for a grow house, a mere 50 plants with at least three growing cycles a year can easily net growers as much as \$300,000 a year, authorities say.

Officials wrapping molestation case

Prosecutors reported Jan. 10 they are almost finished closing a case against a former deputy fire chief who died in December amid charges of lascivious child molestation in Sumter County and similar accusations in Hernando County.

Cecil "Brad" Burris, 55, had been with Sumter County Fire Rescue since 2003 and also served as a fire marshal there, before he was terminated in 2012 after he was arrested on charges of molesting and touching a 16-year-old girl.

He had been released from the Sumter County jail in

lieu of \$75,000 bail and was awaiting a February pre-trial hearing on the lewd and lascivious charges.

The Sumter County Sheriff's Office apparently started its investigation after the Department of Children and Families received a complaint against Burris. The arrest affidavit added the sheriff's office responded to South Sumter High in Bushnell, where the girl told detectives about the inappropriate touching.

Burris later admitted touching the girl's breast, genital area and buttocks, the arrest affidavit added.

Burris died of natural causes, according to the Assistant State Attorney Angelina Rodeo, who was prosecuting the case.

Rodeo said Burris could have faced 60 years in prison but turned down a plea offer for 30 years.

Rodeo said a woman contended as a 9 year old that Burris had molested her in Hernando County but the case was dropped. It reopened after Burris was arrested in the Sumter County case.

Hernando County officials couldn't be reached Jan. 10.

Dieters beware: Cookies coming to a booth near you

The world's largest girl-run business — Girl Scout cookie sales — will be in full swing next month at different booth locations in Lake and Sumter counties, where cookie lovers can get their hands on their favorite once-a-year treats.

Cookies will sell for \$4 a box.

Many troops are taking pre-orders now from residents who don't want to miss out on getting their favorites.

There are two authorized Girl Scout cookie bakers in the U.S., and the cookies offered by scouts in Lake County differ from Sumter. The start and duration of their cookie sales also varies.

Girl Scouts in Lake County (part Girl Scouts of Citrus Council) will run their booth sales Feb. 7 to Feb. 23, and they will be selling Thin Mints, Peanut Butter Sandwich, Shortbread, Thanks-A-Lot, Peanut Butter Patties, Caramel Delites, Cranberry Citrus Crisp, Lemonades, and a new gluten-free cookie in some select areas.

"We are one of eight councils in the country who are piloting the Gluten Free Chocolate Chip Shortbread. They are only available at cookie booths (not through pre-orders), sold at \$5 a box, and available in limited quantities," said Jenn Hollern, director

of marketing and digital media for Girl Scouts of Citrus.

Hollern said the scouts' Troop to Troop Military Program allows cookie buyers to purchase a box of cookies to send to active duty military abroad and locally, and she noted the Girl Scout cookie program is the most popular program.

"More girls participate in this program than any other program throughout the year," she said.

Girl Scouts in Sumter County (serviced through the Girl Scouts of West Central Florida) will be doing their booth sales Feb. 21 to March 16. Their cookie lineup includes Do-Si-Dos, Dulce de Leche, Samoas, Tagalongs, Thank U Berry Munch, Thin Mints, Trefoils and Savannah Smiles. Through the years, the Thin Mints — the crispy chocolate waters dipped in a mint chocolate coating — has



been the most favorite Girl Scout cookie among many folks throughout the U.S.

"The Girl Scout

Thin Mints was the second-highest selling cookie in the country for 2013, even though it was only sold for part of the

first quarter," Hollern said, noting the Thin Mints came second to the Oreo Double Stuff.

Girl Scouts also have gone high tech with their cookie sales, according to Jennifer Medeiros, public relations and media manager for Girl Scouts of West Central Florida. She said beginning Feb. 21, Sumter County residents can visit www.gswcf.org to search for a Girl Scout Cookie booth nearest to their zip code. Cookie fans with smart phones can download the free Girl Scout Cookie Locator app (Kellogg) by searching for "Cookie Locator" in the iPhone App Store or Android Market Place.

"Using this app, customers can map their way to nearby cookie booths, get details and fun facts on their favorite Girl Scout Cookies, and more," Medeiros said.

Through participation in the Girl Scout Cookie program, Medeiros said girls have the opportunity to learn goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills and business ethics.

Proceeds from the sales help girls earn money for Girl Scout activities and fund community projects that benefit a variety of local causes. The funds stay in the community.

Arrest made in Sumter 'Jane Doe' murder

An arrest was made Tuesday in the murder of a woman who was shot to death and whose body

was found decomposed in Sumter County last year.

Ralph Penrod, 62, was taken into custody Tuesday morning at a mobile home park on Park Drive in Tavares. He remained in the

Lake County jail on murder charges without bail.

Sumter County Sheriff's officials said they would release details on how their investigation led to Penrod's arrest as well as the victim's

identity at a press conference Tuesday morning.

The body was found April 22 of last year behind Wendy's on State Road 44 off Interstate 75 in Wildwood, in a wooded area known for

homeless people.

According to interviews last year with detectives still trying to solve the case, they had simply given

Growth a challenge to hospitals' CEO

Don Henderson, president and CEO of Central Florida Health Alliance, is overseeing construction projects and new challenges as Leesburg Regional Medical Center and The Villages Regional Hospital experience a growth spurt — something that is unique compared with many other states.

"Nationwide, I would say that it is unusual, absolutely," said Henderson, who will mark

his second year on Feb. 1. "Overall our market is growing; and the growth of The Villages especially is one of the fastest-growing areas in the country, so we are trying to respond to that and keeping up with the growth is challenging."

The challenges are most prevalent from January to April, he said, when both hospitals experience a 30-percent upswing in population from seasonal residents in Lake and Sumter counties. "The winter contin-

ues to be very challenging for both hospitals, especially with the big snowbird population that comes in," Henderson said. "What we try to do is to make sure that the resources at both hospitals are adequate to meet the community demand, and sometimes the demand is so sudden."

As a result, the CEO said the both hospitals have worked hard to

streamline emergency room operations; add additional nursing and doctors; and have worked closely with EMS personnel in both counties to meet patient demands.

About 60 percent of both hospitals' patients are Medicare recipients, and it plays a role in the services that are provided.

"Medicare is changing the rules and I would like to think it is for better patient care, but it is probably

Gay couples sue to overturn marriage ban

MIAMI BEACH — Six gay couples filed a lawsuit Tuesday seeking to overturn Florida's ban on same-sex marriage, the latest in a series of cases across the country that contend such prohibitions are unconstitutional and effectively relegate gay partners to second-class status.

The lawsuit was filed in Miami-Dade Circuit Court on behalf of the couples by Equality Florida Institute Inc., a civil rights organization that works for fairness for gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people. The lawsuit claims Florida's gay marriage ban violates the U.S. Constitution's guarantees of equal protection and due process.

The couples, many of whom have children and have been together for years, said they see no reason to be forced to move to a state that permits same-sex marriage when they have built lives in Florida. Vanessa Alenier, who is raising a 5-year-old son with partner Melanie

Alenier, said they decided to share the same last name to come as close to marriage as possible — but the same-sex ban blocks that final step.

"We want our son to understand that his family is secure and just as respected as any other family," said Vanessa Alenier. "Melanie and I have worked so hard to build and protect our family, but nothing can come close to matching the protections that marriage provides."

Similar claims have been made in other states, including Oklahoma and Utah, where judges recently struck down gay marriage bans as discriminatory. Elizabeth Schwartz, an attorney working on the Florida case, said there are about 40 lawsuits pending around the country seeking to

With a Leesburg rabies alert in effect for the next 60 days, at least two local residents say they got the runaround Tuesday after finding a sick raccoon staggering around their Winona Avenue neighborhood.

"I've been calling people telling me I think I have a rabid raccoon in my yard that is acting crazy, laying down, then getting up

and wandering around and then falling back over," said Gene Elton, who made calls to city and county officials, Lake County Health Department, animal control services and even the police department.

Neighbor John Leavers reported the same thing.

"They don't want to do anything about it," he said. "I thought the city of Leesburg

the woman the name of "Jane Doe" since the body had a 'Jane' tattoo on the left shoulder. But with no teeth or any identification found on her, officials with the sheriff's office sought the public's help in identifying the body.

In an interview at the wooded site last year where detectives believe the body was dragged, Dr. Erin Kimmerle, a renowned professor of anthropology at the University of South Florida, described the victim as between 50 and 70

years old and between 5-foot-4 and 5-foot-9, heavy set with long and slightly curly, auburn hair.

Kimmerle also said the woman had osteoarthritis and a lower spine and pelvis that were fused, as well as a number of healed injuries and fractures — but nothing that officials believe the woman sustained prior to the shooting incident that left her dead.

Sheriff's spokesman Lt. Bobby Caruthers said the forensic anthropologist, as well as the dead woman's family and Sumter County detectives, will be at today's press conference.

for cost reasons and they are classifying more and more regular admissions by what they call observation admissions," he said, noting it's also a reflection of technology for the length of patients' hospital stay. "The length of stay for most patients is usually four to five days but Medicare basically says if you stay less than two days now, you're classified as an observation."

To meet this new category of patients, Henderson said the LRMC plans to add 29 private/observation rooms on the ground floor of the hospital, site of what is the current administrative offices. The administration staff will be moved behind the Urgent Care Center on the LRMC campus that is currently under construction.

"The Urgent Care Center is a new service that we have never offered to the community at the Leesburg campus," Henderson said. The facility will feature an in-house lab, X-ray, and other services.

"We plan to do a lot of our preoperative work there, and also function as a preoperative testing facility, and that will be very convenient," he said.

Over in The Villages, he noted the TVRH is preparing to add on to its facility with more patient rooms.

"Our best information is that The Villages, which has crossed the 100,000 (population) mark and it may get up to about 120,000 in the next three to five years, so that's a 20 percent increase in population," Henderson said. "Early next year in 2015, we are going to open our first phase of our expansion at The Villages Hospital, which we'll add 60 beds to the facility."

He said TVRH could eventually go as high as 310 in the second phase of construction.

"We think that once we get up to the 280 to 300 beds that we will be adequately sized to serve the growth of the community," he said.

Currently, both hospitals have 560 beds, including the rehabilitation hospital, and about 3,000 employees, including more than 350 medical staff members. There also is a community board of 16 members who govern operations, including eight from Leesburg and eight from The Villages.

"More than 30 percent of our current board is practicing physicians in the community," he said. "The physicians have a lot of say so and input into our leadership structure."

Henderson said emphasis is place on allowing the sister hospitals to provide a range of services that complement each other," he said.

"Our cardiac surgery program continues to grow, and that's our leading service at the Leesburg hospital. We were very excited in that last year we performed over 760 open-heart procedures, which my by account, ranks us as the No. 3 largest heart program in the state, and that volume continues to grow."

The orthopedics program continues to be very strong, too, he said.

"One of the things that you can look for us to do in the near future, is to offer partial-knee replacement in both communities," Henderson said,

noting this could be within three months as an outpatient procedure. "Partial-knee replacement is very exciting. It's a much less invasive procedure than the traditional knee replacements. You can actually get in and get out and have your procedure done within a day; and it's a big breakthrough and we are very excited about it."

The women and children's area of LRMC also is growing.

"We have two main obstetrical programs, but we do more deliveries at the hospital (LRMC) than anywhere in Lake County, and we are excited because we have been working with the two local medical groups in having more obstetricians come to the area," he said. "The demand is there to grow the obstetrical program."

Henderson said LRMC delivered 1,700 babies last year, which was 200 more than the previous year.

"We think that it could go even higher. We do twice as many deliveries as the closest hospital to us," he said. "Women's health care is a very big thing."

Henderson said LRMC also is focused on its pediatrics program.

"We have the only pediatricians that stay in-house 24/7. This is the only hospital in the region where the doctors are actually staffing the hospital on a 24-hour basis, so that gives us a level of care for both the babies that are being born as well as the children who get the winter respiratory diseases."

The CEO also expressed his views on the Affordable Care Act and how it will affect families, small businesses and how own employees.

"I think the big impact for Obamacare is yet to be felt because so many of the provisions were deferred until 2015, but I am a bit worried because I think that insurance premiums for many of the small businesses will go up and that has got me significantly concerned," Henderson said. "And as a large employer, we don't know what will happen with our premiums because the law brings in new requirements..."

"The stories that we are hearing from the Lake County community especially, is that people are seeing much higher premiums. We're seeing higher premiums and we are seeing higher out-of-pocket deductibles across the board, and that causes concern because the deductible are so high from \$5,000 to \$10,000 per family that it's creating issues for us and we're are concerned. The question is 'Are people going to be able to afford these new higher requirements?'"

Henderson recently met with a community group about the Affordable Care Act, and he heard from small business employees.

"There were folks jumping up from the audience saying 'If I have higher premiums, I'm going to have to pass higher deductibles on to my employees,'" he said.

"So yeah, we worried about it," Henderson said. "It's a challenge to make sure that all of the local residents get the health care that they need."

The one thing you can't afford to do in bridge is to play your cards automatically, which is what many players do all too often. The primary goal of every deal — to make or defeat the contract — does not allow room for mechanical play.

Today's hand provides an example of the type of error that can result from too casual an approach to the play. West led the king of clubs, East

signaling for a club continuation by playing the eight. West continued with the queen and shifted to a spade. Declarer won, forced out the ace of trumps and shortly thereafter finished with 10 tricks.

However, the contract would have gone down one against a more inspired defense. East should have recognized that in addition to the three obvious tricks for his side — two clubs and the trump ace — a spade ruff might well be needed to defeat the contract, and he should have adapted his defense accordingly.

All East had to do was to overtake West's king of clubs with the ace at trick one and return the nine of spades. This sequence of plays — clearly marking East with a singleton spade — would have left declarer with no recourse.

The best South can do is to take the spade return with dummy's jack and lead the ten of trumps, making it appear as if he was planning to take a finesse. But East, having none of this, would alertly rise with the ace and lead a club to his partner's queen. West would then return a spade to put the contract down one in what would amount to the just another workmanlike job by the defense.

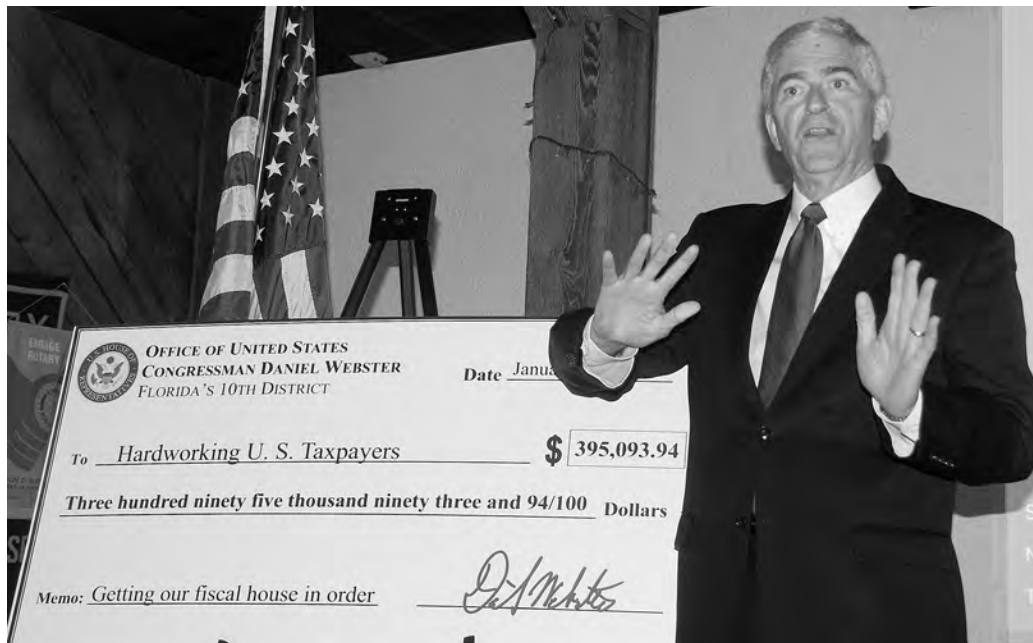
County: Extend sales tax

Lake County commissioners said Tuesday they will ask voters to extend a penny sales tax set to expire in 2017 to meet infrastructure needs such as new sidewalks and roads. If the tax is not extended by way of a ballot referendum in the next couple of years, property taxes will go up, Commissioner Jimmy Conner said. "There is no way around it."

Revenue from the penny sales tax is divided equally between the cities, county and school district. Commissioners made their declaration during a retreat at the county's Emergency Communications and Operations Center in Tavares. Some School Board officials have suggested asking for 50 percent of the sales tax revenue instead of a third. Others have proposed going out

Rep. Webster returns thousands to Treasury

U.S. Rep. Daniel Webster, R-Winter Garden, unveiled a large \$395,093.94 check in Leesburg on Tuesday to show the amount he is returning to the U.S. Treasury as part of his crusade to nix what he calls wasteful spending in Washington, D.C. The money represents savings the congressman said he has made in office budget cuts from appropriated funds provided by the federal government to buy equipment and run his offices in Tavares, Cl-

ermont, Winter Garden, Winter Haven and Washington D.C. "They (lawmakers) have these principles that if it's appropriated, spend it," Webster told a small crowd at Beacon College in Leesburg on Tuesday, his first stop of the day followed by planned trips to meet constituents in Clermont, Auburndale and Winter Garden. "Fraud is against the law, abuse is against the law, waste — at least in Washington — is rewarded," he said. "They spend it just for one reason, because it's appropriated. I wanted to

prove that was wrong and that it doesn't have to be that way." His mission is to lead by example. "Here is \$395,093.94 that we are turning back out of one little account. And you say that's not enough to pay down the debt? Yeah it is. Multiply this by 434 other members of congress and multiply it by the 10-year window that we're talking about, and now you're into the billions of dollars," Webster said. "The senate gets three and four times the amount

Convenience store shooting turns fatal

A man has died from a weekend shooting at a Leesburg convenience store, in a case in which his brother was detained by police and later released. Lake jury orders Baptists to pay \$12.5M

The jury verdict was returned on Saturday. An attorney for the man, who is remaining anonymous, says the jury understood the "devastating" impact of the abuse. The young man is now in his 20s and attending college.

end bans on same-sex marriage.

Florida voters enshrined a ban on same-sex marriage in the state constitution in 2008. It states that in Florida "marriage is the legal union of only one man and one woman as husband and wife," and no other unions can be recognized.

The Florida Family Policy Council, which led the push for passage of the amendment, noted that it was adopted by 62 percent of voters that year.

"Gay activists cannot win in the marketplace, so they have resorted to trying to find renegade courts who have little respect for the rule of law to create social change that would never happen through the people or their elected representatives," said John Stemberger, the group's president and general counsel. "We will spend as much time and money as necessary to oppose those who seek to redefine marriage in Florida."

The lawsuit's advocates, however, say attitudes toward gay marriage have changed in Florida and elsewhere since 2008, with many opinion polls showing broad support for ending same-sex bans. Former Florida Gov. Charlie Crist, a Republican-turned-Democrat who is seeking is old job once again, said in a statement he backs the lawsuit.

"No one would want to be told they can't marry the person they love. It's an issue of fairness and I'm proud to support it," said Crist, who hopes to challenge incumbent GOP Gov. Rick Scott in the fall election.

The law will be defended in court by the office of Attorney General Pam Bondi, a Republican.

Because they cannot marry, gay couples in Florida do not share many rights and responsibilities with opposite-sex couples. For example, gays often cannot make health care decisions for an incapacitated partner.

would be interested in this, since there has been a rabies alert, but animal control said they only deal with domestic animals and the police department said 'that's not what we do.' Then they gave the number of two private places that I could pay to have it taken care of. What's the purpose of city government if not to take care of public safety?"

Both men said they feel like they've been getting the runaround.

Leavers said he doesn't know if the raccoon has rabies, but he was concerned about the animal's odd behavior of stumbling and lying down along the side of the road in broad daylight.

"It doesn't seem like it is acting like a raccoon would," he said.

"I called city animal control and they said they don't mess with wild animals," Elton said. "And I called a wild animal place and they said they couldn't come out unless I paid them a fee. I don't feel like I should owe them a charge."

Leavers also was told he could pay to have the raccoon removed, which he doesn't feel it should be residents' responsibility.

Greg Workman, public information coordinator with Florida Fish and Wildlife, said his agency does not have officers who go out on calls like this.

"We don't have officers that go out and do that,

but we do refer you to a licensed trapper that will go out and do that, but they will probably charge you," Workman said.

Leavers and Elton believe the city should have handled the situation after a rabies alert was issued earlier this week in the Leesburg area by Florida Department of Health in Lake County in response to another raccoon that tested positive for rabies on Jan. 15.

Lake County Animal Services and was informed of the concern about the latest raccoon was a Florida Fish and Wildlife issue.

"But they (Lake County Animal Services) did say if there was contact with a human or pet, that they would respond," Pappacoda said.

The Animal Services Division noted earlier this week that it is required to temporarily suspend the use of the night-drop kennels because of the rabies alert for the next 60 days in an area of Leesburg bounded by:

■ Lake Griffin to the north

■ Lake Harris to the south

■ The Lake Griffin-Lake Harris 441 Connector to the east

■ Canal Street to the west

of money that we have, and you multiply that times 100, and then then four times that they get, it turns into a huge,

huge amount of money and it adds up.”

Webster said the money he was returning was part of a total of \$1.25 million — \$1,250,093.94 to be exact — of what he has returned to the U.S. Treasury since 2011. He

also rolled back his salary to his 2008 pay and gave a check for the difference to the U.S. Department Bureau of Public Debt last week, continuing the tradition that he began three years ago.

“I’m on this crusade to reward those who will find waste,” said Webster. “If it’s appropriated, we really don’t have to spend it.”

Dr. George J. Hagerly, president of Beacon College, praised Webster’s mission.

“I think if the congressman can get momentum behind his idea, it’s going to become more symbolic and save literally millions of dollars that are our taxpayer dollars,” Hagerly said.

facility.

She leaves and comes back with a Styrofoam cup and hands it to the man.

The victim put the cup to his mouth and hands it back to Hill. However, when Hill tried to give the cup back to the man, he

pushes Hill's hands back. The report added that Hills threw the cup at the man, which resulted in the "victim jumping up and down, appearing to be in distress."

After that, the video stops.

According to the report, Carlton Palms placed Hill on suspension, pending an investigation into the in-

cident. However, the report adds the sheriff's office is still trying to obtain a subpoena to view the tape again after staff refused to give it to them.

Florida's Agency for Persons with Disabilities filed a complaint against Carlton Palms in late 2012 after four abuse incidents, three of which resulted in arrests of its employees.

Lyles was arrested Sunday on two charges of sexual battery on a victim under 12 years old for two separate alleged sexual acts while they were in the shed on Saturday.

He remained in the Lake County jail Tuesday in lieu of \$50,000 bail.

on their own to ask for funding from the whole penny sales tax.

Conner said at the meeting the school board can "decide if they want to be part of this or not."

"They can be part of the one third, and if they don't want to be part of it, we will do it without them," he said.

Commissioners Leslie Campione and Sean Parks supported more funding from the county's portion of the sales tax going toward sidewalks.

"We should move as aggressively as we can on the sidewalk plan out of the penny sales tax, understanding there is going to be budget constraints," Parks said.

At the last commission meeting, commissioners voted 3-2 to approve a one-time payment of \$5,218 to fund courtesy busing for 104 students from the Skyridge subdivision who attend Lake Minneola High School until the end of the school year.

At the end of December, the School Board wrote a letter to county commissioners requesting \$27,877 for past and current costs of busing through the end of the school year. The request was made,

according to the letter, because of the lack of adequate sidewalks at Lake Minneola High School.

Tuesday's retreat was an annual event designed to allow commissioners to share their goals and priorities for the upcoming year, while also weighing in on the challenges.

Commissioner Welton Cadwell suggested expanding the Municipal Service Taxing Unit for parks and libraries countywide.

"Everybody needs to be chipping in," he said of the special taxing district.

Cadwell said the county's libraries are starved for money, and the new taxing district would take some pressure off the general fund.

It is about "saving the core backbone of these departments," he said. "We are talking about closing some libraries. We have to do something different."

There is no MSTU for libraries, according to Stephen Koontz, budget director.

"The MSTU that has previously been established is for parks and stormwater," he wrote in an email.

The MSTU brought in \$3.7 million in fiscal year 2013.

Parks said he believed there would be support for the special

taxing district in Clermont.

Further, Cadwell also brought up the need to look at the long-established CRAs in cities to determine when they are up for renewal."

In response, Campione said it is important to tread carefully in this area, not to affect the relationships the county has with the cities.

Community Redevelopment Areas are tools for redevelopment of specific areas and they do not increase taxes, according to county officials.

Speaking of his priorities, Conner said the renewal of the penny sales tax, which brought in \$11.8 for the county's portion in fiscal year 2013-14, remains one of his top priorities.

While sidewalk improvements and roads are important uses of the sales tax revenue, Conner said public safety needs are also critical. He noted that Lake EMS' decrease in revenues because of fewer patient transports.

"We budgeted two ambulances and we are only buying one because transports are down," he said. "You have all seen how important public safety is to people."

Also, Conner said he had discussions with Sheriff Gary Borders about implementing a MSTU specifically for public safety.

"Just based on the first meeting, he has got some needs and he is getting some information for us," he said.

Another snowstorm hits the urban Northeast

PHILADELPHIA — A swirling snowstorm clobbered parts of the mid-Atlantic and the urban Northeast on Tuesday, grounding thousands of flights, closing government offices in the nation's capital and making a mess of the evening commute.

The storm stretched 1,000 miles between Kentucky and Massachusetts but hit especially hard along the heavily populated Interstate 95 corridor between Philadelphia and Boston, creating perilous rides home for mil-

lions of motorists.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration said 10 inches of snow had fallen just outside Philadelphia in Drexel Hill by Tuesday evening and there was about 6 inches in Philadelphia. The National Weather Service said parts of New York City also had about 6 inches.

The snow came down harder and faster than many people expected. Forecasters said some places could get 1 to 2 inches an hour, with wind gusts up to 50 mph. A blizzard warning was posted for parts of Massachusetts, including Cape Cod.

Highways in the New York City metropolitan area were jammed, and blowing snow tripled or even quadrupled drive times.

"I just want to get to

the Bronx," motorist Peter Neuwens lamented. "It's a big place. Why can't I get there?"

In Jersey City, N.J., Stanley Gaines, wearing just a thin jacket

and huddling beneath an overhang as snow stung his face, said he had been stuck for more than an hour waiting for a ride home from his appointment at a Veterans Affairs clinic.

"I'm waiting on anything I can get: a taxi, a shuttle, a bus," Gaines said, squinting to read the destination on an approaching bus in near white-out conditions. "I didn't really pay attention to the weather this morning because there was no snow on the ground, and now — this!"

In White Plains, N.Y., Anthony Schirrone pulled over his car to

scrape snow from the windshield.

"I just did this five minutes ago," he said. "But it's coming down too fast."

Forecasters said the storm could bring up to 14 inches of snow to Philadelphia and southern New England and up to a foot in New York City, to be followed by bitter cold as arctic air from Canada streams in. Washington was expecting 4 to 8 inches.

As of Tuesday evening, there was mostly light snow across Connecticut, Rhode Island and eastern Massachusetts from the Boston area southward.

State victories create dilemma for abortion foes

TOPEKA, Kan. — Opponents who have chipped away at abortion with state-level restrictions are facing a dilemma in some of the places where they have been most successful: Do they continue with that approach or seek more dramatic policies that risk court rulings that could undo previous gains?

For the last several decades, anti-abortion groups have focused on putting relatively small limits on the procedure state by state, especial-

ly in conservative places with Republican-dominated legislatures. Those efforts intensified in 2011 after the GOP made election gains in state capitols across the country.

But as groups on both sides of the debate mark Wednesday's anniversary of the 1973 Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion, anti-abortion majorities in the GOP-controlled Kansas Legislature and elsewhere are under pressure to take bigger, broader steps.

"That debate is nationwide right now," said Jennifer Mason,

communications director for Personhood USA. "Many of my peers are frustrated with the past 40 years of an incremental approach."

Bills passed in 2013 restricted women's access to abortion medication, restricted insurance coverage for abortion and imposed new requirements on abortion clinics and providers. A new law in Texas forced the closure of several clinics by requiring doctors who perform abortions to have admitting privileges at a nearby hospital. It is being appealed.

Brutality of Syria war casts doubt on peace talks

BEIRUT — Syria's conflict was sparked by an act of brutality — the detention and torture of schoolchildren who spray-painted anti-government graffiti in a southern city. In the three years since, the conflict has evolved into one of the most savage civil wars in decades.

The atrocities have been relentless. Protesters gunned down in the streets. An opposition singer whose vocal cords were carved out. Beheadings and mass sectarian kill-

ings. Barrels full of explosives dropped from warplanes onto bakeries and homes.

It will be hard enough to find a political solution to Syria's crisis at an international peace conference convening in Switzerland on Wednesday, given the vast differences between the government of Syrian President Bashar Assad and the opposition. But in a nation drowning in blood, reconciliation and justice over the atrocities seem even more distant.

"The ethical and moral fabric of this society has been stretched

to beyond breaking point," said Amr al-Azm, a U.S.-based Syrian opposition figure and professor at Shawnee State University in Ohio. "For a country to recover from such a traumatic rupture of the very glue that holds it together is not easy."

brutality, three prominent international war-crimes experts said they had received a huge cache of photographs documenting the killing of some 11,000 detainees by Syrian authorities.

David Crane, one of the three experts, told The Associated Press that the cache provides strong evidence for charging Assad and others for crimes against humanity — "but what happens next will be a political and diplomatic decision."

In the 55,000 digital images, smuggled out by an alleged defector from Syria's military police, the victims' bodies showed signs of torture, including ligature marks around the neck and marks of beatings, while others show extreme emaciation suggestive of starvation. The report — which was commissioned by the Qatar government, one of the countries most deeply involved in the Syrian conflict and a

major backer of the opposition — could not be independently confirmed.

"It's chilling; it's direct evidence to show systematic killing of civilians," said Crane, former chief prosecutor of the Special Court for Sierra Leone.

New York-based Human Rights Watch said Tuesday that the United States has focused too strongly on bringing the warring parties into peace talks at the expense of putting "real pressure" on the Assad government to end atrocities and hold to account those responsible. The group also accused Russia and China of shielding their ally Syria from concrete action at the United Nations.

"The mass atrocities being committed in Syria should be a parallel focus of the peace process," Kenneth Roth, executive director of Human Rights Watch, told reporters Tuesday in Berlin.

Investing in our most vulnerable

Gov. Rick Scott says Florida should increase funding for child-protection services. That's an about-face for him, but he's right — and we hope state lawmakers will agree.

Last year, South Florida suffered a tragic surge in deaths from child abuse and neglect. Various factors contributed to the increase, but one — lowered funding for child social services, due to budget cuts fostered by Scott — was especially noticeable.

The cuts, combined with other effects of the long recession, had once again pushed child-welfare caseloads too high, making it harder for the system to carry out its protective mission. In Florida, that system is a decentralized partnership of local, community-based care organizations and law enforcement, overseen by the state Department of Children and Families.

The 2013 child deaths brought management shake-ups at DCF. The agency's new interim leader, Esther Jacobo, initiated a diagnostic review by the respected Casey Family Programs, which made numerous recommendations — including the addition of caseworkers and staff to treat and investigate cases more comprehensively. That means more money is needed.

It appears the governor is following the Casey report. Lawmakers should cooperate with this effort when they pass a budget later this year. We are, after all, talking about the most vulnerable of Florida's children — typically poor, neglected or abused and with few resources to defend their rights.

In announcing his proposed funding increase last week, the governor's office said an additional \$31 million would "support critical services for children by hiring more than 400 new child protective investigators. We are also investing \$8 million to support sheriffs" conducting child protection investigations.

In another welcome development, the governor's office said Scott "is recommending restoring all nonrecurring funding for substance abuse and mental health programs. These programs play an integral role in preventing child abuse and supporting healthy families."

Hear, hear. These are important, welcome and overdue steps.

For too long, Florida government has been told to stop "throwing money" at the child welfare system and "do more with less."

The limitations — and dangerous results — of that mantra are all too clear, and most recently showed up in deaths of defenseless children. It's time to see child-protection expenditures for what they are: necessary investments in our future.

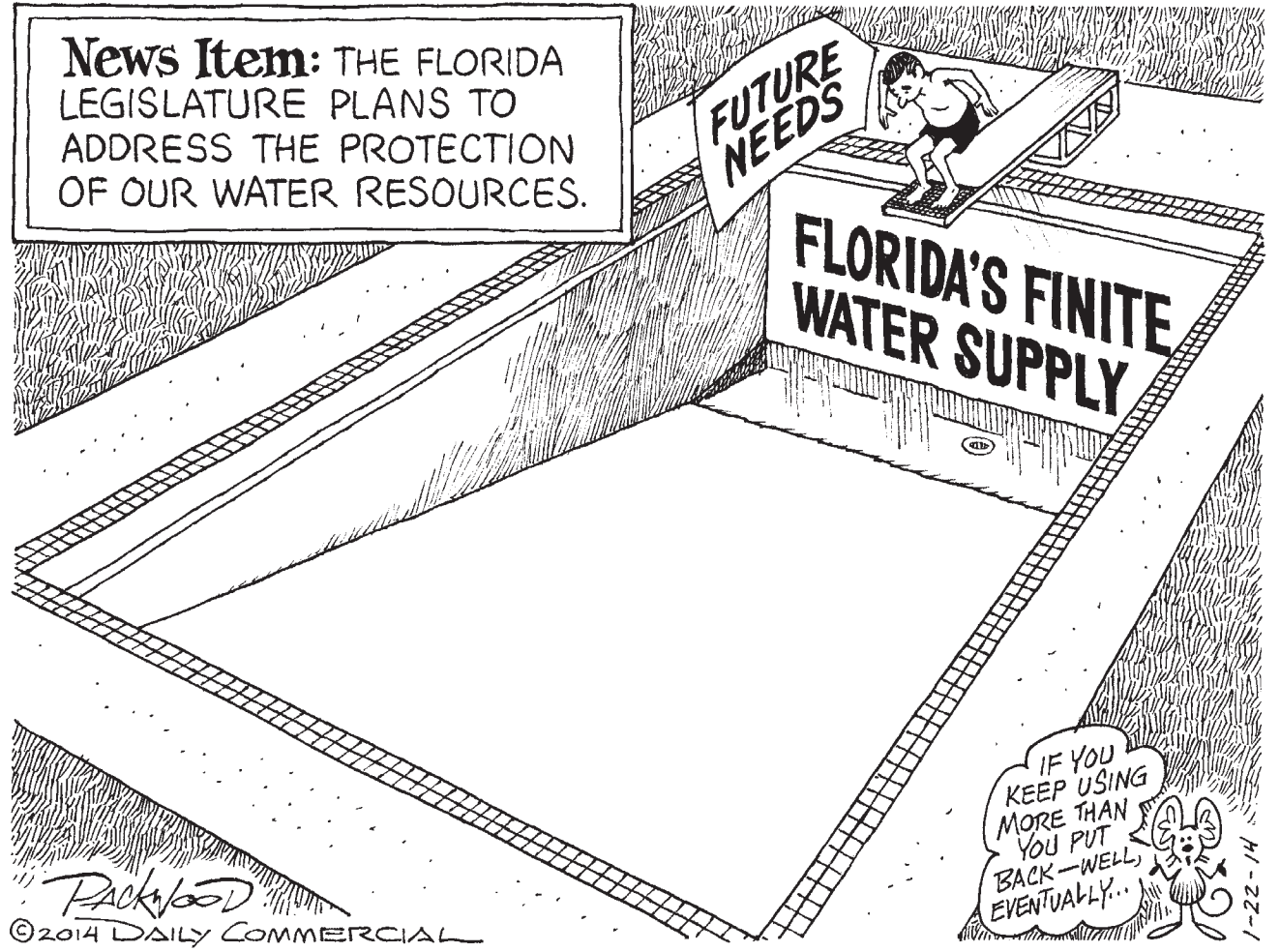

OTHER VOICES Officials still playing Benghazi blame game

When anything bipartisan comes out of a polarized Washington, one should be grateful. That's why a Senate Intelligence Committee report on the September 11, 2012 attacks in Benghazi, Libya, that killed U.S. Ambassador Chris Stevens and three other Americans represents progress of sorts.

The committee, chaired by Sen. Dianne Feinstein, (D-CA), faults the State Department and intelligence community for failing to prevent the attacks. The committee determined that the U.S. military command did not know about a CIA annex in Benghazi and that, writes The Washington Post, "...the Pentagon didn't have the resources in place to defend the State Department compound in an emergency." This communications failure between agencies, supposedly solved after the September 11, 2001 attacks, had not been. If it had, the report found, Benghazi likely could have been prevented.

Sen. Feinstein criticized some Republicans on the committee for adding a section in the report called "additional views," in which they intimate that then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton was culpable in the attacks. In a statement, Feinstein, wanting the record clear, said the accusation was "patently false" and that Clinton was "not mentioned a single time in the 58-page bipartisan section of our Benghazi report."

Yet, in an October 16, 2012 interview with CNN in Peru, Clinton said about Benghazi, "I take responsibility. I'm in charge of the State Department's 60,000-plus people all over the world, 275 posts."

So, Clinton was "in charge," but not at fault, is that it?

In her additional views entry, Sen. Susan Collins (R-ME), said, "To be clear, the responsibility for the attack lies with the attackers themselves. Unfortu-

nately, the promises of the president and other senior administration officials to bring any of the attackers to justice have ringed hollow thus far. The report finds that more than a year after the attack, the terrorists who perpetrated the attack have still not been brought to justice."

It was reported in September 2013, "Intelligence officials have a general idea of where they are hiding. And the military has a contingency plan to snatch them... But the fledgling Libyan government, which has little to no control over significant parts of the country ... has rebuffed the Obama administration's efforts to arrest the suspects."

The report contradicts claims by the administration that the attacks were sparked by an anti-Muslim video and concludes that individuals associated either directly with al-Qaida or one of its affiliates were involved and likely planned and carried out the attacks.

What is needed is for Speaker John Boehner to appoint a select committee, modeled after the Senate Watergate Committee, with subpoena powers to ques-

tion under oath witnesses and those in charge?

According to an exclusive report from Breitbart.com, three relatives of those killed in Benghazi, including Pat Smith, the mother of Foreign Service Officer Sean Smith, have written Boehner asking that he name a special committee. Co-signers include "scores of conservative and military leaders." Pat Smith has said President Obama and Secretary Clinton promised her they would find out what happened to her son. So far she has heard nothing.

A New York Times editorial writes, "The report, parts of which were blacked out, says there is no indication that the CIA ... knew of a time or place for a specific attack. It describes the attack as 'opportunistic' and not 'a highly coordinated plot.' This dovetails with an investigation by the Times, which found that the attack was triggered in part by spontaneous anger over an anti-Islamic video." The Times has a lot invested in its incorrect position and to issue corrections might take gallons of ink.

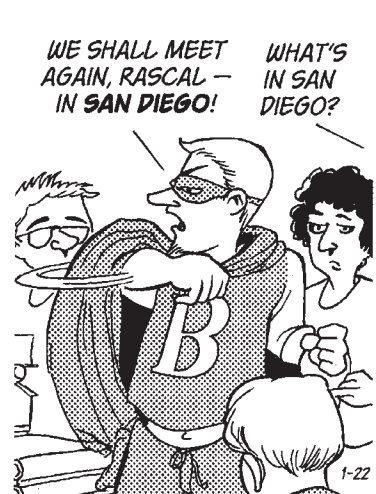

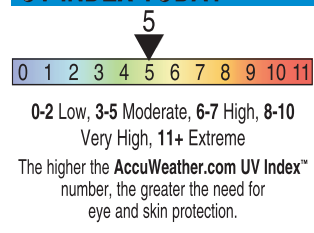

Norway's curlers to show off funky pants

So what will be the must-see moments at the Sochi Olympics?

How about snowboard star Shaun White performing his latest trick — the frontside double-cork 1440. Or Evgeny Plushenko's quad jump, the signature move of the Russian figure skating superstar. And be sure not to miss Mikaela Shiffrin — the American skiing sensation — slicing her way through the women's slalom.

When it comes to curling, there's no doubt what the show-stopper will be.

Yes, Norway's men's team is back with their crazy, funky pants. And they'll be more outrageous than ever when the players emerge for their first game at the Ice Cube.

"Put it like this, you'll not see me wearing them," Norway coach Pal Trulsen told The Associated Press

"Except maybe at a bad-taste party or something."

The Norwegians — Thomas Ulsrud, Torgor Nergard, Christoffer Svae and Havard Vad Petersson — caused a stir at the Vancouver Olympics in 2010 when they took to the ice for the tournament's opening game against Canada sporting bold,

diamond-printed golf pants in their nation's colors. With curlers having always worn basic black uniforms, tradition was thrown out of the window.

Spectators couldn't believe what they were seeing. The pants became one of the talking points of the games, quickly going viral. Even the Norwegian monarch, King Harald V, received a pair.

A Facebook page dedicated to 'The Norwegian Olympic Curling Team's Pants' peaked at 695,000 followers during the games, according to its founder Anthony D'Orazio —

that figure is currently back down to close to 540,000 but is sure to grow before and during Sochi. Two of the biggest clusters of followers are in China and Brazil.

Norway's emboldened curlers — trend-setters in their own right — are taking some new patterns over to Russia.

Four have already been revealed — one has a zig-zagging chevron print, and another is black and flowery and called "rosemailing" — and several more will be unveiled throughout the Olympics. It's all very top-se-

cret at the moment, but prepare to be amazed.

"Because we know them, we probably won't be shocked," said British curler Anna Sloan, who has become good friends with the Norwegian team. "But trust me, it will be good."

Initially stunned, World Curling President Kate Caithness has embraced the pants, which have added a whole new dimension to curling.

"I am a traditionalist, I must be honest," Caithness said in a telephone interview with the AP. "But after I saw them in Vancouver, I

actually liked them. They brought focus to our sport, these crazy pants.

"It would be awful if all the teams were wearing them — it would look like a circus. But I think it's a trademark of the Norwegian team only and we like it that way."

Svae hopes so, too. After all, it was he who came up with the idea in the first place.

The long-time Norway international curler was unhappy at the black-and-gray colored uniform his team had been given for Vancouver, and asked its equipment sponsor a month before the Olympics to make them some colored pants. There wasn't enough time, so he went online to find some goofy golf pants.

He happened upon Loudmouth, an American sportswear company known for its flamboyant attire. Golfer John Daly and rock singer Alice Cooper are customers.

"It's definitely been life-changing for us," Svae said. "Not so much in the everyday but when we travel around the world for curling, it doesn't always matter if we do well or not, people still think that we win stuff because we are always in the media."

"I don't think you'll

see a lot of the other teams do the same that we did," Svae added, "they feel it's our thing."

Larry Jackson, the CEO of Loudmouth, says his company's server went into meltdown several times during the 2010 Olympic final, such as the onslaught of traffic from customers wanting to snap up some pants.

"Sales have gone off the charts," said Jackson, who adds that Loudmouth has "a few interesting pants" planned for Sochi.

"It's all red, white and blue. I do believe it's going to be considered even more loud."

Norway's men will be among the favorites for gold in Sochi. But even if they come up short for the second straight Olympics, they have already made their mark in curling's long history.

"It feels as in some way we have contributed to the development of the sport," Svae said. "Maybe not so much on the ice, but certainly off it."

Ex-Cowboys player's crash case heads to jury

DALLAS — Jurors on Tuesday began deliberating the intoxication manslaughter case against former Dallas Cowboys player Josh Brent, who is accused of drunkenly crashing his car during a night out and killing his passenger, who was a close friend and teammate.

The jury got the case after lawyers delivered their closing arguments to a packed courtroom. Among those watching were Stacey Jackson, whose son Jerry Brown was killed in the December 2012 wreck, and Cowboys linebacker Sean Lee. Jackson has publicly forgiven Brent, whose sentence could range from probation to 20 years in prison if he is convicted.

Brent and Brown, a linebacker on the Cowboys' practice squad who also played with Brent at the University of Illinois, were headed home from a nightclub where they had been partying with fellow Cowboys when Brent lost control of his Mercedes, causing a fiery accident. Officers who arrived on scene said Brent was seen trying to pull Brown's body from the wreckage.

Prosecutors say Brent was driving as fast as 110 mph at the time of the crash and that blood tests showed his blood alcohol content was 0.18 percent, which is more than twice Texas' legal limit

to drive of 0.08 percent. Prosecutors allege that the burly, 320-pound defensive tackle had as many as 17 drinks on the night of the crash.

Brent's attorneys contend that the blood tests used by police were faulty and that Brent couldn't have drunk nearly that much alcohol.

Prosecutors Jason Hermus and Heath Harris called on the jury Tuesday to send a message about the serious nature of Brent's alleged crime, saying drunken drivers put the public in danger.

Hermus stood in front of Brent, hit the table and shouted: "They shouldn't be driving, no exceptions, no excuses!"

Hermus replayed police dash cam video of Brent losing his balance and stumbling

as he tried to walk in a straight line. He referenced footage of Brent telling an Irving police officer that he was "buzzed" and nightclub security video that appears to show Brent holding up two bottles of Champagne.

"You can see with your own eyes, time and time and time again, that he is not normal," Hermus said.

Harris held up an undamaged glass bottle of unopened Cognac found in the wrecked Mercedes. He stood next to Brent, raised the bottle as if to chug from it and told jurors that on that night, Brent was "in the club, turning it up."

"This is almost like a poster child case for intoxication manslaughter," Harris said.

Brent's attorneys argued that prosecutors were misleading the jury. They cited a defense expert's testimony that the Dallas County crime lab had used expired fluid to process Brent's blood and came up with an incorrect result.

"In the history of mankind, there has never been created such a thing as an in-

fallible machine," defense attorney Kevin Brooks said. "It doesn't exist. Has never existed. Planes crash. Computers don't boot up. Cars stop running."

LPGA gets 2 commissioners for the price of 1

No one paid much attention to Mike Whan and Jon Podany the first time they were on the same team.

Now the top two executives at the LPGA Tour, they were aspiring quarterbacks as freshmen at Miami of Ohio. Neither had any idea how often, or where, their paths would cross over the next 30 years. It was only clear it most likely would not be on the football field.

"When we walked on, there were probably 14 quarterbacks in camp," Podany said. "Eight guys were on a full ride,

and six of us were walk-ons. A couple of them left and said, 'This is crazy.' We were killing ourselves. It was tough to get time on the scout team as a freshman.

"But Mike and I ... I remember him distinctly," he said. "Because he had one of those Peyton Manning-type face-masks that was a little deeper — I'm not sure if it was by choice or just happened to be the helmet he got — and because he had a

unique name."

Whan painted a bleaker outlook of their days with the Red-

Hawks. "I lasted about three weeks," Whan said. "Jon lasted about three

years. He's a much better athlete."

The LPGA Tour starts this week with the PureSilk Bahamas Classic on Paradise Island, and while the attention is on the tour's current version of the Big Three — Inbee Park, Stacy Lewis and Suzann Pettersen — the former walk-on quarterbacks just might be the biggest stars.

Whan starts his fourth full season as the commissioner. Podany is the chief marketing officer of the LPGA. Both were finalists to be LPGA Tour commissioner. The tour wound up with the ultimate two-for-one deal.

Whan is the consummate salesman, with a deep belief in the product and whose every word teems with energy. Podany packs 15 years of experience at the PGA Tour, where he was highly regarded in business development and brand management.

It was a good job, a stable job with one of the strongest and most financially sound organizations in sports. And it was a big risk for Podany to leave for the LPGA Tour, which was reeling financially from the stubborn style of Carolyn Bivens, who was forced out after four years.

That changed one day when an old friend stuck his head in the door.

Whan had gone to PGA Tour headquarters to meet with Commissioner Tim Finchem when he stopped by to see Podany. The new commissioner couldn't take his eyes off the ultimate black book — in this case, a large, white board in Podany's office that was filled with PGA Tour corporate partners.

"Jon said, 'You love that board, don't you?' I said, 'I need all that stuff,'" Whan said. "We went to lunch. I started talking and I was selling. Jon said, 'Are you really asking me to come work there?' I said, 'I need you.'"

The final pitch was personal. Podany has three daughters, all very athletic. Whan asked him to consider a job that matters to young female athletes.

It worked. "It was a big risk at the time," Podany said. "But it was a unique opportunity to do something together. I felt like with my PGA Tour experience, I could bring something to the LPGA Tour. Having three daughters was a factor, too. I felt like the opportunity to have an impact in the women's world could be something they found value in."

And just like that, Whan and Podany were reunited.

They were hired out of college by Proctor & Gamble. They were roommates while at P&G (both wound up in brand management), and their future wives were roommates in the same apartment complex in Cincinnati. Podany soon took a job with the PGA Tour.

"I remember saying to him, 'You can work in golf?' We're talking shampoo and tartar,



and he's in golf,' Whan said. "And then a year later, I took the job running the golf balls and gloves division for Wilson Sporting Goods."

They didn't see much of each other for 20 years. Podany stayed at the tour. Whan went from Wilson to TaylorMade-adidas. He served a brief stint as chief marketing officer of Britesmile, Inc., and then became CEO of what eventually became Mission-Itech Hockey, which made equipment used by more than 50 percent of NHL players.

Their paths next crossed in a most unusual way.

Both were finalists to be the next commissioner. According to Podany, the search firm originally identified Whan, who pointed the firm in Podany's direction.

"It wasn't awkward," Podany said. "To his credit ... he recommended me. He told them, 'I don't want to go down the path unless you determine Jon is not the guy for you.'"

Podany said his interview and the feedback went well, but the board was nervous about another commissioner who didn't have chief executive experience.

"Given what happened with Carolyn, they didn't want to take the risk of some-

one who didn't have CEO-level leadership," Podany said. "I called Mike and said, 'They're going to be coming back at you because you have the experience they're looking for.'"

And it wasn't long before Whan found Podany as the perfect complement for a big project.

Whan and Podany were co-stars on stage at the Ritz-Carlton two months ago, sitting comfortably on high stools in a ballroom buzzing with the best news the LPGA has had in more than a decade. The week before Thanksgiving, they delivered a 2014 schedule that proved to be the best indicator yet that the LPGA was gaining momentum.

It featured 32 official tournaments, up from only 23 tournaments in 2011, with additions in key golf markets like Michigan and San Francisco.

Also added was an unofficial tournament called the International Crown, with eight countries competing in match play, an event that might feel more like true Olympic competition than when golf actually returns to the Olympics.

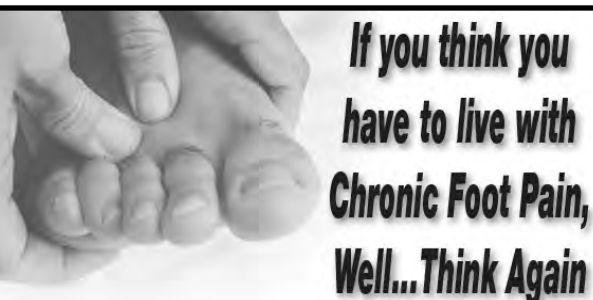
"We are excited where we are," Whan said. "But by no means are we finished."

Consumer spending likely to boost growth in 2014

WASHINGTON — Hopes are rising that consumers will drive stronger growth in 2014 after they stepped up spending at the end of last year in the United States and Europe.

The outlook for spending is brightening even though growth is weakening in some large emerging economies and slowing the sales of consumer product giants such as Unilever and Procter & Gamble.

Several trends are boosting consumer spending in developed countries: Inflation is low, enabling shoppers to stretch their dollars, euros and yen. The Federal Reserve, the Bank of England and other central banks are keeping interest rates super low. Those low rates have made it easier for borrowers to afford higher-cost items such as cars and appliances.

Global retail sales growth jumped to

a 5.4 percent annual pace in the three months through November, according to economists at JPMorgan Chase. And global auto sales reached an all-time high in December, the bank said.

"It was a year of big improvement in consumer spending after two years of very weak growth," said David Hensley, a global economist at JPMorgan Chase. "Businesses were pleasantly surprised by the increase in consumption."

Even in Europe, where growth remains slow after the region emerged from its longest-ever recession last year, consumers appear willing to spend more. Retail sales spiked 1.4 percent in November, the biggest increase in 12 years.

In the United States, Morgan Stanley economists forecast that consumer spending rose in the final three months of the year at its fastest pace in three years.

BP seeks rehearing in oil spill settlement dispute

NEW ORLEANS — BP on Tuesday asked an appeals court to review a ruling upholding a multibillion-dollar settlement to compensate victims of the company's 2010 oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

In a filing with the full 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, BP argued that a divided three-judge panel from the court erred earlier this month when it affirmed a U.S. district judge's approval of the company's settlement with a team of private plaintiffs' lawyers. The New Orleans-based appeals court has 14 active judges and eight senior judges who also hear cases.

BP argued that the panel's Jan. 10 majority decision will force the company to pay hundreds of millions of dollars to businesses that weren't harmed by the massive spill.

The company's lawyers argue that the 5th Circuit panel shouldn't have upheld U.S. District Judge Carl Barbier's December 2012 certification of a class of "vast numbers of claimants ... without regard to whether the class has been defined to include numerous members with no colorable claims against the defendants."

"If the panel's decision is permitted to stand, it will work a revolution in class-action law in this Circuit, permitting the certification of classes that cannot be certified anywhere else in the country," BP attorneys wrote.

Plaintiffs' lawyers have said BP simply undervalued the settlement and underestimated how many claimants would be eligible for payments. In a letter to the 5th Circuit dated Monday, plaintiffs' attorneys said BP's current position is that "some unknown and

subjective standard" should be used to define class membership.

BP has argued that Barbier and court-appointed claims administrator Patrick Juneau have misinterpreted settlement terms in ways that would force the company to pay for billions of dollars in inflated or bogus claims by businesses. During a hearing in November, a BP lawyer argued that Barbier's approval of the deal shouldn't stand unless the company ultimately prevails in its ongoing dispute over business payments.

In October, a different 5th Circuit panel threw out Barbier's rulings on the dispute over business payments and ordered him to change the calculation of some damages. Last month, Barbier rejected BP's argument that the settlement shouldn't compensate businesses if they can't directly trace their losses to the spill.

Mixed earnings hold back US stocks

NEW YORK — The Standard & Poor's 500 index logged a small gain Tuesday on a mixed day for the stock market.

Health-care giant Johnson & Johnson slipped after it warned that pressure to keep prices low would likely mean slightly lower profits than forecast. Delta Air Lines gained after reporting a better-than-expected profit in the fourth quarter as fares and traffic rose.

Company earnings were the main focus for investors Tuesday as there were no major economic releases. So far, the stock market has failed to get a big lift from earnings reports and investors appear to be assessing the results more critically.

"Earnings are coming in and, candidly, we're getting a mixture picture for the fourth quarter so far," said Jim Russell, an investment director at U.S. Bank.

The Standard & Poor's 500 rose 5.10 points, or 0.3 percent, to 1,843.80. The Dow Jones indus-

trial average fell 44.12 points, or 0.3 percent, to 16,414.44. The Nasdaq composite edged up 28.18 points, or 0.7 percent, to 4,225.76.

J&J, one of the 30 members of the Dow, slipped \$1.03, or 1.1 percent, to \$94.03, helping pull the index lower.

Tex-Mex meets classic comfort for Super Bowl grub

Most classic Super Bowl party grub generally can be classified one of two ways — spicy Tex-Mex or basic comfort. And since there's already a lot of crossover between those categories, we decided to embrace them and create a Super Bowl party dish that combines the best qualities of both.

We drew our inspiration from shepherd's pie and a Tex-Mex taco. The result is a casserole that starts with a layer of

chili, then adds a layer of cornbread. After it has baked, the casserole gets finished with all the standard Super Bowl ingredients — guacamole, sour cream, shredded cheese and olives. You could even add some refried beans or shredded lettuce and pico de gallo.

CHILI CORNBREAD PIE

■ Start to finish: 50 minutes (20 minutes active)
■ Servings: 10

FOR THE CHILI:

- 1 1/2 pounds lean ground beef
- 1 large yellow onion, diced

- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 16-ounce jar salsa
- 1 chipotle pepper, minced (from a can of chipotles in adobo)
- 2 tablespoons adobo sauce (from a can of chipotles in adobo)
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- Salt and ground black pepper

FOR THE CORNBREAD:

- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup corn meal
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 2 1/2 teaspoons bak-

ing powder

- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 1/4 cups milk
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, melted
- 3 scallions, sliced
- 1 cup frozen corn kernels, thawed (optional)
- 1/4 cup sliced pickled jalapenos, lightly chopped

Everybody seems enraptured by seven-layer dip. And not that it's bad, but it's been done. And done again. And again.

So for this year's Super Bowl party, why not freshen it up a bit? Take the same concept of shoveling piles of delicious toppings into your mouth, but instead of chips use a slab of roasted potato.

To create our seven-layer potato skins, we started with some of the traditional toppings for potato skins — bacon, scallions and cheese. From there, we added crumbled sausage (more pig!), a garlicky sour cream and caramelized onions.

Most of the time, the store goes out of its way to make the customer happy and explain the price-match policy if needed.

Savvy Savings Tip: Always have your store ads and coupons with you in case you find yourself at Walmart. Instead of going store to store for the best deal, price match your ads there and save yourself time, gas and headache.

Pie Council offers tips for making a more perfect pie crust

Crust is a big deal with the Pie Council, and every pie entered in the National Pie Championships has its crust painstakingly scrutinized. A good pastry crust is tender and flaky, baked to golden brown perfection. The last thing you want, whether you're baking for your family's dining pleasure or to impress a judge, is crust that's soggy on the bottom.

For a nice, flaky pastry shell, it's important to chill out. Begin with a cold mixing bowl, cold utensils and cold ingredients. In fact, the Pie Council says, it doesn't hurt to have cold hands too. Once the dough is made, let it chill in the refrigerator for at least an hour before rolling it out.

For a pie crust of more even thickness, let your hands rest in the center of your roller rather than on the ends. When the bottom crust has been rolled out, some cooks fold it gently in half, over the roller, and use the roller to lower it carefully into the pie dish. Others fold the crust into quarters, and unfold it to hang about an inch over the edge of the pie pan. Don't panic if your pastry tears during this part of the operation; it's a simple matter to mend the tear by smoothing it over with a couple of fingertips dipped in water.

Don't overwork or over-handle your pastry dough. The shortening or butter (or a combination of both) should be

coated with the flour rather than blended with it. Over-processing causes gluten to form, which results in a tough crust.

It helps to avoid a soggy bottom crust if you bake your pie in the lower third of the oven. And it is also important to keep an eye on the pie while it is baking; you may need to cover the edges with foil or a crust

protector to keep them from over-browning while the filling and the bottom crust are getting properly done.

One of the council's most important suggestions is to read the recipe in its entirety before you even think about beginning work on your pie. Do you have all the listed ingredients, and are they fresh? Do you have all the different utensils you need? And another precaution: Have you cleared a space in the refrigerator for chilling the utensils and ingredients to be used in making the crust?

HELPFUL HINTS

■ If you're thinking of making a pie to celebrate National Pie Day on January 23, which is tomorrow, the American Pie Council points out that the nation's three most popular varieties are apple (with more than 200 variations), pumpkin (first introduced to the holiday menu at the Pilgrims' second Thanksgiving in 1623) and pecan.

■ Thinking of entering this year's National Pie Championships in April? Categories announced for the Amateur Division include: Apple, Blueberry, Chocolate, Citrus, Cream, Cream Cheese and Comstock/Wilderness, which is a combination of two-plus flavors – Apple, Cherry, Blueberry and Strawberry. Also, Fruit/Berry, Innovation, Key Lime, Nut, Paramount Peach, Peanut Butter, Pumpkin, Special Dietary (such as Gluten Free and No Sugar Added) and, for those pies that don't seem to fit anywhere else, there's the Open category. Now, get busy refining your recipes and practicing your pie-making skills. (For information, go to www.piecouncil.org.)

■ You don't often see a pastry dough recipe that calls for baking powder, but some years ago a friend recommended adding a small pinch to the dry ingredients for pie crust, and I find that it helps to produce a crust that is light, flaky and crisp.

■ By the way, if you're making apple, pear or peach pies, half a teaspoon of cinnamon or nutmeg in the flour mixture adds an extra bit of flavor to your crust. And an old Betty Crocker cookbook in my collection suggests grating half a teaspoon of lemon, orange or lime zest into the flour mixture before cutting in the shortening.

Syrah wines a bargain in red

Psst! Looking for a bargain in red wine? Try a dark, red, potent but still user-friendly syrah.

I was on the judging panel tasting syrah wines from \$15 to \$30 at the most recent Sonoma Harvest Fair, and we found some wonderful examples. They were inky in color, full of the

flavors of black cherries, black raspberries and black plums, pepper, cloves, even licorice and smoke, with big but velvety tannins and long finishes.

But syrahs are like Lady Edith on "Downtown Abbey" — the middle child to Ladies Mary and Sybil, always playing, well, third fiddle.

Syrah comes in only

fifth in the number of acres of red grapes planted in California, after cabernet sauvignon, zinfandel, merlot and pinot noir.

Some growers say they love the stuff, but have trouble selling it because its reputation was hurt by the flood of cheap, too-soft-and-sweet shirazes made from the same grape in Australia (not that Australia doesn't also make plenty of wonderful shirazes).

Syrah is a wonderful red meat wine — hearty, with plenty of body but less astringency than cabernet sauvignon. It's great with wild game, lamb, burgers, sausages, stews, barbecue, pasta with meat sauces, even grilled veggies.

It's great for cooking. Here's my quick and tasty way to cook big beef ribs: Sear them, braise them for an hour in syrah, then slather them in barbecue sauce and caramelize them under the broiler until just short of burn-

ing. Serve them with more syrah, of course.

■ 2010 Willowbrook Cellars Syrah, "Altes Vineyard," Sonoma County: dark and hearty, with aromas and flavors of black plums and mocha; \$28.

■ 2010 Paradise View Syrah, Sonoma Coast: rich, concentrated and tart, with spicy black plum flavors and big, ripe tannins; \$24.

■ 2008 Wellington Vineyards Syrah, Sonoma Valley: very dark hue, hint of smoke, rich and dry, with blackcurrant and coffee flavors and soft tannins; \$25.

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon melted butter
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder or granulated garlic
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 pound grated sharp cheddar cheese
- 1 pound loose spicy sausage meat
- 2 eggs

DIRECTIONS:

- 1) Heat the oven to 350 F.
- 2) In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, salt, butter, garlic and cayenne. Set aside.
- 3) In a second large bowl, use your hands to mix to-

gether the cheese, sausage and eggs until well combined. Add the flour mixture and mix for several minutes to ensure all ingredients are evenly distributed.

4) Pinch off about 1/4 cup of the mixture and roll into 1 1/2-inch meatballs. Arrange the meatballs on a rimmed baking sheet. Bake for 25 minutes. Serve hot.

2) In a large skillet over medium-high heat, cook the beef until browned, about 8 minutes. Add the onion, garlic, salsa, chipotle, adobo, chili powder, cumin and paprika. Bring to a simmer and cook for 10 minutes.

Season with salt and pepper, then spoon the chili into the bottom of the prepared pan. Set aside.

3) To make the cornbread topping, in a large bowl stir together the flour, corn meal, sugar, baking powder and salt.

4) In a small bowl, whisk together the milk and the egg. Add the melted but-

ter, whisking as you add it. Gently stir the liquid mixture into the dry mixture. Fold in the scallions, corn (if using) and jalapenos. Spoon the cornbread mixture over the chili and bake for 25 to 30 minutes.

5) Spoon into bowls and garnish with guacamole, sour cream and shredded cheese.

- 2 scallions, sliced

DIRECTIONS:

1) Heat the oven to 400 F. Line a rimmed baking sheet with foil, then coat with cooking spray.

2) Poke the potatoes all over with a fork. Microwave on high until tender, 10 to 12 minutes depending on the wattage of your microwave. Allow to cool until easily handled.

3) Meanwhile, in a medium skillet over medium, heat 1 tablespoon of the oil. Add the onions and cook until softened and browned, 15 to 18 minutes.

4) When the potatoes are cool enough to handle, cut them in half. Scoop out and reserve the insides, leaving a 1/4-inch-thick wall of potato flesh on the skin. Arrange the halves skin sides down on the prepared baking sheet. Brush the potatoes with the remaining tablespoon of oil. Sprinkle lightly with salt and black pepper, then bake for 15 to 20 minutes, or until crisped and browned.

5) Meanwhile, in a medium bowl stir together the reserved potato flesh and the sausage. Season with salt and pepper, if needed. In a small bowl, stir together

the sour cream and garlic. Set aside.

6) Once the potato skins have baked, start layering them. Spoon a bit of the caramelized onions into the bottom of each shell. Top with the sausage-potato mixture. This should mostly fill the shell. Sprinkle crumbled bacon over the potatoes, followed by cheese. Bake for another 10 min-

utes. Top with a dollop of the garlic sour cream and sprinkle with the scallions. Serve immediately.
