## 'THE PATH OF ALL DANGERS'

Lake County honors officers who died in the line of duty

n a profession where 150 of their comrades die every yea in the United States, law enforcement officers throughout Lake County took part in a na tional memorial service Tuesday night to honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice. What looked like at least 300 officers in dress uniforms - on horses and motorcycles, in helicopters and gleaming squad cars, with many on foot - took part in the event in front of the Lake County Historic Courthouse in Tavares. They gathered with friends and families of deceased officers.
According to a ceremony program, 10 officers have died in the line of duty throughout Lake County since 1919
Keynote speaker for the event was State Attorney Brad King, who oversees the 5th Judicial Cir cuit, including Marion County, where a Florida Highway Patrol trooper was killed last week in a roadside crash. King told the crowd that law enforcement officers frequently put themselves

## High school seniors see no gains on exam

Only about one-quarter are performing proficiently or better in math and just 4 in 10 in reading. And hey re not improving, the report says, reinforcing concers of to large numbers of today's students are unprepared for either col ege or the workplace. scom in both subjects exam in both subjects from 2009, when the National Assessment of Educational Prog ress was last given to 12th-graders. The new results, released Wednesday, come from a representative sample of 92,000 public and private school students.

# Charges possible in jail explosion

PENSACOLA - Criminal neg igence charges are possible in a Florida jail explosion case if inves tigators find authorities failed to evacuate the building after smell ng gas, a state attorney overseeing he investigation said
The April 30 explosion at the Es cambia County Jail killed two in mates, paralyzed a detention offi cer and injured about 200 others. There were 600 inmates in the jail when the explosion ripped through he bottom floor, a day after heavy rains left two feet of water in the

Stangs basement. State Attorney Bill Eddins said ate Tuesday that criminal negli "The charges were a possibility. That is an issue that cl
Eddins said an assistant state atorney and an investigator from his office have been assigned to work with the Florida fire marshal and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives as they comb through debris and try to find cause of the blast.
Eddins said the investigation will likely take months and that criminal charges would only be filed if it is found that any jail authority was
rossly negligent by not acting to en ure the safety of people in the jail. Inmates have said that they smelled gas hours before the ex plosion. Escambia County denied request for recordings of phone alls made from the jail by inmates prior to the explosion, saying they are part of the ongoing investiga on. The county also denied re quests to view surveillance vid recorded by the jail before and during the explosion.
The jail was running on generato power at the time of the explosion and one inmate and attorneys have old AP that toilets were broken and prisoners were using plastic bags.

n September, the Centers for Disease Control sounded the alarm: Unless we sopped misusing and overusing antibiot ics, they could become useless against dis-ase-causing bacteria that are becoming re sistant to them - evolving into so-called superbugs."
We could find ourselves living in a "post-an tibiotic" era, the CDC warned, one in which common infections and minor injuries could nce again prove fatal because antibiotics a no longer effective
Now the World Health Organization is say ing that era is already here. Superbugs able to esist the most powerful antibiotics - drugs nown as carbapenems - have been found all over the globe. And the problem is only getting worse.
One of the most common superbugs is MRSA, a staph infection that kills an estimated 19,000 Americans each year, most Many countries - including Canada, Great Many countries - including Canada, Great have patients with the dangerous sexualhave patients with the dangerous sexualristant to all available antibiotics. And more sistant to all available antibiotics. And more han half he patient in many counches can olonger be ing and kidneys.
A Doctors Without Borders physician reports, "We see horrendous rates of antibiotic resis ance wherever we look in our field operations," It continues to be important for doctors to esponsibly prescribe antibiotics; for patient use them as intended; and to stop routine ow-dosage use of the drugs in the livestock and poultry industries. Lawmakers must give he Food and Drug Administration greater authority over use of antibiotics among farm nimals. But the existing prevalence of superbugs uggests those steps alone aren't enough anyprevent infections in the first place since it's become harder to treat them after the fact And the world will need to invest in research develop new medicines that will be more ffective against bacteria resistant to what's effective again
That investment isn't lucrative to drug com panies more interested in developing longterm maintenance medicines rather than nes that are taken for short periods of time A federal Manhattan Project-style initiative might be called for in this case

"Tiger won five times last year, but you go to the majors, Scotty seems to be in contention with a chance o win more often than Tiger. If Tiger is your benchmark, he (Scott) has been a better player Right now, whoever gets to No. 1 probably is. If Henrik wins a major and gets to No. 1, there cant be an argument."

Speaking to ConCommittee, Yellen said that as a result, she expects low borrowing rates will continue to be needed for a "considerable time."
Yellen's comments echo earlier signals tention of acting soon tention of acting soon for short-term interest rates even though the job market has strengthened and poised to rebound this year. The Fed has kept short-term rates at a record low near zero since December 2008. At the same time, Yellen cautioned that geopolitical tensions, a renewal of financial stress in emerging markets and a faltering housing recovery pose
