# 32 states trail in job recovery including Florida

Five years into the recovery, 170,000 jobs are still missing

WASHINGTON Five years after the Great Recession officially ended, most states still haven't regained all the jobs they lost, even though the nation as a whole has.

In May, the overall economy finally recovered all 9 million jobs that vanished in the worst downturn since the 1930s. Another month of solid hiring is expected in the U.S. jobs report for June that will be released Thursday.

Yet 32 states still have fewer jobs than when the recession began in December 2007 — evidence of the unevenness and persistently slow pace of the recov-

Even though economists declared the recession over in June 2009, Illinois is still down 184,000 jobs pre-recession from levels. New Jersey is down 147,000. Both states were hurt by layoffs at factories. Florida is down 170,000 in the aftermath of its real

## Lawyer: Evidence lacking in Benghazi case

WASHINGTON — A lawver for a Libvan militant charged in the 2012 Benghazi attacks said Wednesday that she had seen no evidence tying her client to the violence, but a judge nonetheless directed Ahmed Abu Khattala to remain in custody as the Justice Department builds its case against him.

The lawyer, Michelle Peterson, conceded that Abu Khattala had no reasonable chance of being released at the moment, given the terrorism-related charge he faces and his lack of ties to the United States. But she also argued that prosecutors had failed to show, in their broad and initial outlines of the case, that he was in any way connected to the Sept. 11, 2012 attacks that killed **Ambassador Chris Stevens** and three other Ameri-

go to the sheriff's website at www.lcso. org and then to the right column under "What's New" or the top row under "How Do I?" Once on the page, the resident is navigated through a series of questions.

"This will benefit our citizens tremendously," Herrell said.

He said the new system will benefit deputies as well, allowing them to spend less time taking reports on minor crimes and focusing more on patrolling and other pro-active duties. However, Herrell was quick to point out that a victim of any crime still has the option to call for a deputy to their home and the page actually directs residents to call 911 if it considers the crime to be an emergency.

estate market collapse. The sluggish job market could weigh on voters in some key states when they go to the polls this fall. A Quinnipiac University poll out Wednesday found that voters named the economy by far the biggest problem facing the United States.

The states where hiring lags the most tend to be those that were hit most painfully by the recession: They lost so many jobs that they've struggled to replace them all.

Nevada, which suffered a spectacular real estate bust and four years of double-digit unemployment — has fared worst. It has 6 percent fewer jobs than it did in December 2007. Arizona, also slammed by the housing collapse, is 5 percent short.

By contrast, an energy boom has lifted several states to the top of job creation rankings.

"North Dakota is the No. 1 example," says Dan White, senior economist at Moody's Analytics. "It's like its own little gold rush."

North Dakota has added 100,000 jobs since December 2007 — a stunning 28 percent increase, by far the nation's highest. The state has benefited from technology that allows energy companies to extract oil from shale, sedimentary rock formed by the compression of clay and silt.



## **Ahead of the holiday, East Coast eyes tropical storm**

CHARLESTON, S.C. As one of the year's busiest travel weekends approaches, so does another visitor: Tropical Storm Arthur, expected to grow into a hurricane by the Fourth of July and hit most harshly at North Carolina's Outer Banks, a popular getaway spot of thin barrier islands along the shore.

The first named storm of the Atlantic hurricane season prompted a hurricane warning for a wide swath of the North Carolina coast and had officials, hotel owners and would-be vacationers as far north as New England carefully watching forecasts.

The Outer Banks will be especially vulnerable, forecasters said. The area's tourism agency expects about 250,000 people to travel there and stay in hotels and rental homes for the long holiday weekend.

"We want everybody to be safe and prepared, but we are not overly concerned at this point," said Lee Nettles, the executive director the Outer Banks Visitors Bureau. He noted that forecasters were predicting the storm in locals' memories.



# Putin under pressure as fighting rages in Ukraine

President MOSCOW — Vladimir Putin has been slammed for arming rebels and fanning flames of separatism in eastern Ukraine. But there is strong evidence recently that it's just the opposite: He now wants to bring about a truce.

To do so, however, Putin must face down nationalists at home pressuring him to send in troops to support the rebels occupying town halls and border posts and fighting government forces in eastern Ukraine after the new Ukrainian president ended a mainly one-sided cease-fire.

Putin's strategic aims have not changed: He wants to keep Ukraine at least partly in Russia's orbit and prevent it from joining NATO.

But he is also mindful of Russia's other global relationships, and he needs to move carefully to avoid more sanctions from the European Union and the United States.

His solution? Try to negotiate a truce in Ukraine while securing some long-term levers over Ukraine.

The Russian leader scored a measure of success last month when the new Ukrainian president, Petro Poroshenko, declared a cease-fire that some rebels accepted. While the truce was frequently broken and failed to persuade stage for consultations inpresident,

But as the battles intensified and the death toll climbed into the hundreds, the anger it has generated is making it increasingly difficult to de-escalate the crisis.

## Ancient gene helps Tibetans live in high altitudes

NEW YORK — Tibetans living on the "roof of the world" can thank an extinct human relative for providing a gene that helps them adapt to the high altitude, a study suggests.

Past research has concluded that a particular gene helps people live in the thin air of the Tibetan plateau. Now scientists report that the Tibetan version of that gene is found in DNA from Denisovans, a poorly understood human relative more closely related to Neanderthals than modern people.

Denisovans known only from fossils in a Siberian cave that are dated to at least about 50,000 years ago. Some of their DNA has also been found in other modern populations, indicating they interbred with ancient said.

But the version of the high-altitude gene shared by Denisovans and Tibetans is found in virtually no other population today, researchers report in an article released Wednesday by the journal *Nature*.

That suggests that Denisovans or close relatives of theirs introduced the gene variant into the modern human species, but that it remained rare until some people started moving into the Tibetan plateau, said study main author Rasmus Nielsen of the University of California, Berkeley.

## Messy protest shows rising fears about China

# **Employees shouldn't expect** coverage changes after ruling

NEW YORK — Don't expect a massive wave of companies to stop paying for employees' contraceptives after this week's Supreme Court decision allowing some businesses to refuse to cover birth control.

Some business owners say they won't pay for any forms of contraception. Others say they'll continue paying for most types, but not those that take effect after conception and that some people believe are akin to abortion.

to many of the country's busiworkers are likely to lose all companies of all sizes paid for before the Affordable Care Act required it, believing it's an important benefit that helps them attract and retain good workers. A survey by the Kaiser Family Foundation found 85 percent of large employers already paid for contraceptives before the health care law required it.

Even employers who want to opt out of some forms of birth-control coverage see covering others as important.

'We want to provide for good health care for our people. We just don't want to fund abortive procedures," said Mike Sharrow, owner of C12 Group in San Antonio. His company, which provides faith-based counseling for business owners, has always paid for what he calls

The Supreme Court ruled Monday that some businesses can, because of their religious beliefs, choose not to comply with the health care law's requirement that contraception coverage be provided to workers at no extra charge.

The 5-4 ruling has the Obama administration looking for another way to provide contraception for women who work for those companies.

The case decided by the Supreme Court on Monday involved two companies, Hobby Lobby and Conestoga Wood Specialties Corp. About 50 others also filed suit against the health care law's contraception requirement. Some received court injunctions allowing them not to pay for birth control; the Supreme Court's ruling is expected to allow them to continue that policy.

Triune Health Group Ltd. has already been in touch with its broker to see how soon it can change its coverage to stop paying for all contraceptives, said Mary Anne Yep, co-owner of the Oak Brook, Illinois company that provides medical management services.

"We were ready to go when we heard the decision," she said. Triune had filed lawsuits against the U.S. government and the state of Illinois because of requirements that they pay for contraception.

Weingartz Inc., which has five stores in Michigan selling lawn mowers and other outdoor equipment, stopped paying for all contraception, except when medically needed, since it won an injunction.

LONDON — British data protection authorities are investigating revelations that Facebook conducted a psychological experiment on its users.

The Information Commissioner's Office said Wednesday that it wants to learn more about the circumstances of the experiment carried out by two U.S. universities and the social network.

The commissioner's office is working with authorities in Ireland, where Facebook has headquarters for its European operations. French authorities are also reviewing the matter.

### US needs better justification for use of drones

hirteen months ago, during a speech at the National Defense University, President Barack Obama promised greater transparency and new guidelines for drone use as part of his counterterrorism strategy.

So much for promises.

An authoritative, bipartisan report released last week by the Stimson Center charged that the U.S. use of drones threatens to destabilize legal and moral norms worldwide. It also chastised the Obama administration's failure to conduct a cost-benefit analysis of drone use and questioned drones' effectiveness.

The Stimson Center report's recommendations demand attention.

They strongly urge that the Obama administration bring more transparency and oversight to its drone program. They call for the establishment of internationally recognized standards for use of lethal force outside traditional battlefields. And they recommend that the responsibility for carrying out lethal drone strikes be transferred from the CIA to the military.

The authors of this report are not pacifist human rights crusaders. They include retired Army Gen. John Abizaid, the former commander of U.S. Central Command; Philip Mudd, a former deputy director of the CIA's counterterrorism Center; and John B. Bellinger, a legal adviser to the National Security Council under President George W. Bush.

They found that drone attacks cause fewer civilian deaths than has been charged, and they saw no evidence that the use of drones was creating a video-game mentality toward war. But they did find reason to fear that "increasing use of lethal drones may create a slippery slope leading to continual or wider wars.'

The chief concern is that other nations -China, Russia, Iran — will see the U.S.'s use of drones at will and start carrying out their own lethal attacks. Unlike, say, nuclear weapons, drone technology is not especially sophisticated.

The authors of the study suggest a scenario in which, for example, Vladimir Putin decides to use drones to attack individuals in Ukraine whom Russia has declared "enemies of the state."

The logic essentially would be the same as the United States' justification for killing targets in Pakistan whom the Obama administration believes to be members of al-Qaida.

The use of any new instrument of war that changes the playing field requires the establishment of new norms for how and when to employ them. Use of drones to make strikes outside declared war zones falls into that category.

Obama, in that speech to the National Defense University, pledged to make U.S. drone use "consistent with long-standing U.S. commitments to democracy, accountability and the rule of law."

The president is not honoring that commitment. Congress should hold him to it, and consider canceling funding for the drone program until he does.

# Advice for the new VA secretary

EMO TO: Veterans Affairs Secretary-designate Robert A. McDonald RE: The VA's crisis is even worse

than you think!

Your good news is that the White House, Congress and Department of Veterans Affairs are no longer in denial about the reality that things have gone terribly wrong in the VA hospitals. Indeed, all America finally knows the systemic shame of VA hospitals' treatment delays, faked records and cover-ups.

And apparently, the monstrous job of fixing the VA is yours. Republicans are praising your experience as Procter & Gamble's CEO. Your Senate confirmation

seems assured.

But the publicly released summary of White House deputy chief of staff Rob Nabors' excellent tough-truth VA report to the president, which focused mainly on VA hospitals, leaves one major concern: Your new bosses probably still haven't grasped the full breadth, depth and pervasiveness of all that was allowed to go so wrong, for so long, at the VA.

VA pension and benefits claims bureaucracies are failing our military veterans and their families as shamefully as the backlogged VA hospitals are.

PENSIONS: Bill, a severely wounded World War II veteran, had a postwar career in the post office. When he died in January 2011, his widow, Diane, simultaneously sent the VA and U.S. Postal Service all the vital documents, requesting her share of both pensions as Bill's surviving spouse.

USPS immediately calculated Diane's pension share and her first check arrived when Bill's would have, in February. But half a year went by without a VA pension check. As her living expenses mounted, the VA asked for documents she'd already sent. I'd heard of Diane's plight, asked a VA official about it; Diane got a phone call from the VA the next day. Diane's first VA pension

check arrived in August.

I asked a top VA official why the VA couldn't simply do what the USPS did for the widow. The official launched into a long explanation about VA lawyers and the need to determine if Bill died due to old war injuries, which would mean a larger pension. So I naturally asked: Couldn't the VA instantly pay her the base pension? And then pay her more, retroactively, if it proved to be a service injury death?

The VA official's eyes widened, he slapped his palm down on the conference table, then scribbled a note to himself. Yes, he said, that's a better way to do it. He's a good person; but his managerial mind has been shaped by the VA's cultural mindset. Changing that mindset is the new VA secretary's most urgent challenge.

BENEFITS: When VA claim adjudicators issue denials — as they often do — an appeals process begins. The appeals court remands some 60 percent of the claim denials back to the adjudicators for reconsideration due to one mistake or another. And it all starts over again. The top level appeals court has ruled the denials of the VA adjudicators and next level board of appeals were right in a mere 24 percent of the cases that got to the court. No wonder the VA's benefits claim backlog was recently reported to be one million.

HOSPITALS: Here's a proposal — give veterans a Vet-Med card that works like a Medicare card, and pays for treatment where service is best and waiting times are brief. Not all hospitals need to provide top-level treatment for all maladies. In cities, some hospitals send major cardiac and cancer cases to another hospital specializing in those problems.

At the start of the Obama presidency, I sought to persuade the new VA secretary, Gen. Eric Shinseki, to focus on the full scope of VA failings. I'd just written a book chronicling sad cases of VA delays and denials of benefits and treatment. But back then Shinseki was in denial about what the book — titled, "Vets Under Siege: How America Deceives and Dishonors Those Who Fight Our Battles" — was warning.

Back then he didn't believe the subtitle. And especially, he probably didn't grasp the validity of my conclusion that an adversarial mindset had permeated the VA. Too many employees saw their jobs as assuring veterans didn't get benefits they didn't deserve. I urged that VA employees must see themselves first as veterans' advocates, tasked with what they'd earned. Nothing more, but surely nothing less.

Even in his last days, Shinseki told Congress there were only a "limited" number of "isolated" cases where VA hospitals falsified delay records. Only in his last hours did the four-star general admit he'd been deceived by a "systemic ... overarching environment and culture" within the VA.

There is one way our new bold VA secretary can change the VA mindset — by changing the VA's name. Let all VA employees know, first and foremost, they now work for the Department of Veterans Advocacy.















### NATIONAL WEATHER FOR JULY 3, 2014







'The frontstretch bumps are a concussion and Victory Lane is bleeding of the hand," he said. "I guess I don't have enough to lose upstairs to worry about the first one.





After winning the second club lead, declarer plays the A-K of trumps, learning that the opposing rumps are divided 4-1, which is not surprising in view of West's bidding. This development confirms that South has five losers, but does not necessarily mean that he can't make

Declarer continues by cashing the A-K of hearts and ruffing a heart. He then proceeds merrily along, trump-ing a club in dummy, ruffing another heart, leading a diamond to the ace and ruffing dummy's last heart.

The upshot of all this is that South has accumulated 10 tricks consisting of the A-K of spades, A-K of hearts, ace of diamonds and ace of clubs, plus three heart ruffs in his own hand and a club ruff in dummy.

So, despite starting with five losers, South finishes with 10 tricks. The explanation of this anomaly is that, after 11 tricks have been played, South's Q-9 of diamonds simultaneously succumb to West's K-J of diamonds and East's Q-J of trumps on the last two tricks. Four of his apparent losers are thus compressed into two actual losers, which allows South to get home safely with his

"Life Itself" takes us through Ebert's career, his drinking years, the "unspeakably romantic" life of newspapering and the Pulitzer Prize that life gave him. Then it pairs the longtime Chicago Sun-Times critic with cranky crosstown Chicago Tribune rival Gene Siskel, and "Life Itself" turns funny.

The two Windy City critics lorded over the Golden Age of American Movie Reviewing, when every magazine and newspaper had a critic or two and many of them turned up on TV as well. Starting their debate on Chicago public TV, spreading nationwide, then going into syndication and earning big bucks, they became a brand — "Siskel & Ebert" and every movie studio wanted its wares to wear their "thumb's up."

Did they dumb down their writing, pander to the TV audience and reduce reviewing to somesimplistic, thing Richard Corliss (Time complained? Sure. Were He faced the end, on- they as testy to each othline and in public, with er off camera as they seemed on the show?

> The surprises in the documentary are the frankness with which both Ebert and his wife, Chaz, speak of his (and her) alcoholism and lovely passages with the Chicago newspaper barflies who used to regale each other and be regaled by Ebert during the 70s.

And his early '60s college newspaper writing, about race and the civil rights movement, is a fore he'll sit still for more revelation.

The passion and skill with the language were there, from the beginning. He just turned his focus to the movies.
