## State of the City: Lake Wales 'in great shape'

LAKE WALES – During his 2019 State of the City address Feb. 27 at Vanguard School, Lake Wales Mayor Eugene Fultz made a handful of newsworthy announcements.

Fultz said that, as a member of the Ridge League of Cities, he has been helping to lobby Citrus Connection and the Polk County Commission to fund an express bus that would loop between Frostproof and Posner Park near Davenport, up and down U.S. 27. Citrus Connection staff say the express bus for U.S. 27 is still in negotiation.

The mayor also verified that a massive upgrade to the intersection of S.R. 60 and U.S. 27 has been fully funded, and that construction may start soon.

The mayor highlighted several other topics during his speech, also.

A runway at Lake Wales Airport was recently completed and work on a taxiway is currently underway. Fultz said he is hoping the changes will bring more air traffic to the city.

Downtown Lake Wales will soon be getting a facelift thanks to Lake Wales Main Street Executive Director Karen Thompson, who recently helped the city strike a deal to hire an urban planner to bring more foot traffic to the downtown district. That, along with a series of new trails, may help the city look much different in the coming years.

Once complete, the new trails will link the downtown area to Lake Wales Park and the Lincoln Avenue business district, in the

## School board weighs McLaughlin makeover proposal

LAKE WALES – A majority of Polk County School Board members appeared to express support for a proposal to transform McLaughlin Middle Fine Arts Academy, a Lake Wales middle school for students in grades six through eight, into a middle/senior high school during a work session meeting Feb. 26.

If the board members vote to approve Polk County Public Schools Superintendent Jacqueline Byrd's proposal, then Lake Wales would have its' first zoned public high school open since the early 2000s.

The Lake Wales Charter Schools Board of Trustees was formed in 2004. Soon after, it took over administration of all but three public schools in Lake Wales — McLaughlin Middle, Roosevelt Academy and Spook Hill Elementary.

## Polk Regional Water Cooperative votes to seize land

POLK COUNTY – On Feb. 27, members of the Polk Regional Water Cooperative board voted unanimously to authorize the cooperative’s attorney and staff to start the process of seizing private property in Lakeland using eminent domain.

The PRWC board is comprised of area mayors and commissioners who are tasked with making sure there is enough water available to keep pace with projected population growth over the coming decade.

The board has a \$23 million contract with a group of engineers called Team One to test the feasibility of two desalination plants in Polk County, as well as two other projects — one to harvest storm water and another to recharge the aquifer near Bartow and the Peace River basin.

Right now, these engineers are working on the feasibility of using salt water far under the ground to meet future demand.

The desalination plants are currently planned to be built near Frostproof and near Interstate 4 in Lakeland. Testing the wells for the proposed desalination plant near Frostproof is nearly complete. In April or May, engineers want to start testing the Lower Floridan Aquifer wells in Lakeland to determine quantity and quality of the water.

In order to test the Lakeland wells, Team One engineers say they need to pump around three million

gallons of water out of the ground daily. They say that, after this is done, they have nowhere to put the water. Over the course of 14 days, they want to pump around 42 million gallons of salt water diluted with water from a more shallow well into Lake Parker. The distance from the test site to Lake Parker is around two miles, Team One engineers said.

PRWC staff said there are 14 landowners who would need to allow Team One engineers access to their land for up to a year to complete the testing.

Using a resolution, on Feb. 27 the PRWC board authorized PRWC staff to file eminent domain petitions

for any landowner who does not sign a contract. PRWC staff said five landowners seem open to allowing temporary use of their land, one landowner was hesitant and the rest have not been reached so far.

A judge would have to sign off on any seizure of land.

If built as planned, the two desalination plants could cost nearly \$1 billion with costs and loan interest. Some Winter Haven city staff and some Frostproof elected officials have opposed this plan, citing high cost and a preference to solve the water crisis in a less costly manner, such as using water conservation, harvesting stormwater and recycling more water.

northwest portion of town. Basketball, pickleball, a splash pad, an amphitheater and a pro shop will be built around Crystal Lake, which is in between the downtown area and Lake Wailes Park.

Thompson also helped the city initiate a \$50,000 grant as an incentive to bring a new restaurant downtown. The mayor said a winner will be announced soon. The mayor also took pride in the opening of the ALDI supermarket and Wawa convenience store and gas station near the Eagle Ridge Mall, as well as construction of the new Love's Truck Stop and Dyer Kia on U.S. 27.

The 2018 opening of the Lake Wales Medical Center Wound Treatment Center was also highlighted in the mayor's speech. The city will be purchasing the YMCA soon, meaning the city will soon own a pool for residents to enjoy.

Every third Friday of the month, music will be played at the Tina Peak gazebo near the library. The food truck rally events and movies on Lake Wailes will continue to provide other recreational opportunities.

Students attending Warner University who volunteer for Warner Cares Day have done a particularly good job cleaning up parts of the city over the past few years, and the mayor said Lake Wales looks cleaner than it has in years.

Hurricane Irma repairs are now complete. The Lake Wales Fire Department responded to 2,939 calls averaging a 4.6 minute response time. The Lake Wales Police Department just purchased two new Harley-Davidson motorcycles to help with traffic calls and more than 14,000 area residents visited the library.

The Lake Wales Museum reopened the caboose after a few years of reconstruction and hosted seven exhibits and five speakers in 2018. New stormwater assessment fees will be used to clean Lake Wailes and pave some city streets.

The mayor said last year the city commission was worried that an amendment proposal to the Florida Constitution on Homestead Exemption would be

passed. Had it passed it, would have meant less income for the commission to work with annually. As such the commission did not "roll back" to 2017 property tax rates last year.

Since that amendment did not pass, the commission instructed city staff to put the extra money in reserves. Those reserves are the healthiest in 10 years, the mayor said. This September the mayor said the commission would likely "roll back" property taxes again.

The city election is April 2. The mayor and Curtis Gibson's seat are up for grabs. Voters will also decide whether to change commission terms from two to three years.

For now, though, it was an encouraging situation that the mayor conveyed to his constituents.

"I'm proud to report that the city of Lake Wales is in great shape, as we continue to grow in a healthy and responsible manner," Fultz said.

Ever since, students who did not apply to or were not accepted by Lake Wales High School were bused out of the city, with many ended up enrolling at Winter Haven High. Polk County Schools Chief Academic Officer Michael Akes said 470 high school students currently living in Lake Wales are bused out of Lake Wales, at an annual cost of \$1.1 million.

Zoned schools are different than charter schools in that they do not require a student to apply. Anybody who can prove residency and custody of a high school-aged child can enroll that child, regardless of his or her academic history. If McLaughlin were recategorized as a zoned middle/high school, those 470 or so students could then attend high school close to home — even if they were not accepted into Lake Wales High.

The discussion has been prompted by the ongoing saga surrounding McLaughlin, which has received a failing grade in each of the past three years. If the

school fails again, an outside entity will have to assume operation of the school.

In 2018, the Lake Wales Charter Board of Trustees submitted a proposal to fill that role and transform McLaughlin into a charter school, with a promise to accept any Lake Wales resident who applied. The Polk County School board chose not to partner up with the charter school board then, and now they seem intent to stick to that decision.

"It's become pretty clear to me that their staff and our staff don't like each other very much," said Polk County School Board member Billy Townsend.

Townsend later said he needed time to digest the proposal and that he is hoping for a collaborative solution versus a stance competitive with the charter school system. School board member Lori Cunningham seemed to agree.

"I thought the direction we were trying to look at

was more (of a) collaborative type of thing, and not to divide the community any more than it already is," Cunningham said. "In my opinion, we have definitely drawn a line in the sand."

School board member Sara Beth Reynolds said she was in favor of the proposal. Members Kay Fields and Lisa Miller wanted more time to decide. Member Sarah Fortney expressed support. Chairman Lynn Wilson opposed the proposal.

"There will be a shoving match that our students will pay for," Wilson said.

Lake Wales Charter Superintendent Dr. Jesse Jackson did not reply to a request for comment for this story.

If the school fails again this year, a majority of the Polk County School Board seemed to express support for hiring an independent contractor to take over its operations temporarily, until the school gets a passing grade.

## Cycling event returns to downtown Winter Haven

WINTER HAVEN — On Sunday morning, customers sitting on the patio at Egg Haven will be treated to more than their favorite breakfast dish.

The Chain of Lakes Cycling Classic is returning this weekend and the second day of the two-day race will see cyclists tearing through the streets of downtown Winter Haven. A modified route will move the course south this year, with a course that goes as far north as Avenue A SW and on its south end loops around Grove Roots Brewing on Avenue D SW.

Organizing officials from Top View Sports and Polk County Tourism and Sports Marketing believe the exciting new course will only enhance what is already an exciting, urban style of bicycle racing.

"I think what people don't realize is how fast these people who are racing will pass you and just how close

they'll get to each other," explained Jessica Roberts, the content manager for Polk County Tourism and Sports Marketing and an avid cycling enthusiast. "It's a great lesson in physics just to witness the cornering."

The event, which is in its 11th year, spans two days and two courses. On Saturday, March 9, participants will take part in the road race and time trial portions of the competition in the Lake Buffum area, near Alturas.

Then, on Sunday, March 10, is what many view as the main event — at least as far as spectators are concerned. The criterium portion of the competition features a tight, urban-based route through the streets of Winter Haven. Winners will be based on performance in all three portions of the competition.

The Chain of Lakes Cycling Classic kicks off the season for the Bill Bone Pro-Am race series, a Florida-based bike race series. According to Tim Molyneaux, the president of TopView Sports, it is an event that attracts competitive cyclists from around the

southeast United States.

"Because we've been doing it for quite some time, there are people annually who schedule trips around the race," Molyneaux said.

The Bill Bone series is cumulative and runs through October. As for the Chain of Lakes Cycling Classic, organizers anticipate around 300 cyclists competing per day. Registration for the event is still open and will be through Thursday, March 7. More information on registration, as well as the race format and the course maps, is available at [topviewports.com/events/event/chain-of-lakes-cycling-classic/](http://topviewports.com/events/event/chain-of-lakes-cycling-classic/).

According to Roberts, the event is worth checking out for cyclists and non-cyclists, alike.

"To me, it's just beautiful to watch — you've got really talented people who are putting it out there," Roberts said. "We would like the general public to just come out and watch because it — whether you ride or not — it's interesting."

# Heartland Parkway proposal resurrected heading into 2019 legislative session

POLK COUNTY – Florida’s 2019 legislative session began yesterday and, between March 5 and May 3, state legislators will be turning bills into law in Tallahassee.

Some Polk County politicians and leaders are lobbying, in part, to bring an old proposal back to life.

The Heartland Parkway was first discussed in the 1990s — a toll road that would start along the Polk Parkway and travel south, all the way to the outskirts of Fort Myers. At the time, then Gov. Jeb Bush appeared to favor the idea, but when Gov. Charlie Christ was elected, journalists reported that he called the Heartland Parkway a “road to nowhere.”

Fast forward 30 years and politicians and other leaders are discussing the idea again.

Back in January, current Florida Senate President Bill Galvano started pushing for a plan to spend \$75 million on three Florida toll roads, one being the Heartland Parkway.

On Feb. 5, the Polk County Commission sent a letter to Galvano in support of the project. On Feb. 25, Winter Haven City Manager Mike Herr recommended that the Winter Haven City Commissioners begin lobbying state legislators representing Polk County to build the Heartland Parkway, as well. City staff and commissioners met with Rep. Melony Bell and Sen. Kelli Stargel Feb. 26, before meeting with Rep. Sam Killebrew the following day.

March 12 is “Polk County Day” at the Legislature, when many county leaders will be traveling to Tallahassee to lobby state legislators on a variety of policy. Herr said Winter Haven staff are trying to schedule a time to

meet with Florida Department of Transportation officials to lobby for the Heartland Parkway.

Rick Dantzler represented Winter Haven in the Florida House and Senate during the 1980s and 1990s. After retiring, he briefly represented landowners that supported the Heartland Parkway project in the early 2000s. Dantzler is currently the University of Florida Citrus Research and Development Foundation Chief Operating Officer, overseeing citrus greening research in Lake Alfred. Reached last week, Dantzler addressed the criticism from some who label the project as “a road to nowhere.”

“Many people made that claim years ago, and with the improvements to S.R. 17 and the significant conversion investments that have been made along the likely route, I’m sure the sentiment is even stronger,” Dantzler said.

In the past, S.R. 17 was predominately a two-lane road south of Polk County. It is now four lanes from Winter Haven down to where it intersects Interstate 75, north of Fort Myers.

Polk County Commission Chairman George Lindsey said the proposed Heartland Parkway would not head toward Fort Myers, but instead would travel due south, connecting Polk County to Alligator Alley in Collier County.

“Any discussion about transportation improvements in Polk County is encouraging,” Chairman Lindsey said in an email statement. “And any major project will have ample stakeholder involvement. Doing nothing is not an option.”

Winter Haven City Manager Mike Herr said the Heartland Parkway would have a far-reaching impact on Winter Haven.

“(Sen. Galvano) deserves our support,” Herr said.

Winter Haven Mayor Brad Dantzler is Rick Dantzler’s brother.

“We have a full agenda set for Tallahassee with many far reaching issues on the docket for discussion,” Mayor Dantzler emailed. “Mr. Galvano has stated he favors infrastructure to include roads, sewers, water, bridges and high speed internet. I concur with his goals and hope to see Winter Haven participate in some meaningful way.”

## Polk County a possible destination for high-speed rail station

BARTOW — When Tom Deardorff, the executive director for the Polk Transportation Planning Organization, addressed the community at a public forum last month, he said that officials are looking at any number of ways of improving congestion and transportation in Polk County — including high-speed rail.

“That may be one of the solutions to the travel demand that is forecasted,” Deardorff said, specifically referencing the Brightline high-speed rail system now operating in the Miami area.

Currently, Brightline is operating in South Florida, with stations open in Miami, Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach — but that is just the beginning for the privately-owned enterprise.

Phase Two of the Brightline project will connect the Miami stations with Orlando, at a transportation hub being constructed as part of Orlando International Airport. That project is expected to begin construction within the next month or so.

Phase Three will connect Orlando with Tampa, and therein lies the opportunity for Polk County.

“Our first mission is just to get to Tampa — but then we would look to have stops between the Orlando Airport and Tampa,” explained Bob O’Malley, a representative for Brightline, to the Polk TPO Board

Feb. 14. “With the growth of Polk County, at some point, the market is going to demand and warrant a stop somewhere here. It’ll be a market-based decision, but we will work very closely with local government for feedback and advice on where it should go.”

While official decisions on the matter are years off, Lakeland was preliminarily discussed at the meeting as a possible destination for a station in Polk County, as was the area near Florida Polytechnic University.

O’Malley said that Brightline officials have had preliminary discussions with Citrus Connection officials in Polk, and that connectivity will be a factor in deciding a potential Polk location.

“That type of connectivity will factor into our site selection — we’re not going to make our decision in a vacuum,” he said.

TPO board members inquired about the possibility of multiple stops in Polk, but for now at least, the idea seems to be a non-starter. As O’Malley explained, the selling point for the service is its speed, and the more stops Brightline adds, the more it compromises its ability to deliver upon that.

“Every time you add a stop, you impact the service,” he said.

And while families in Polk can daydream about one day being able to catch a train to South Beach, it perhaps is the reverse of that which could have the

biggest economic impact on the area — with destinations such as Legoland Florida and Bok Tower looming as legs of a Central Florida vacation for families from South Florida.

“There is a lot of excitement in South Florida to be able to come up to (Central Florida) for the weekend,” O’Malley said.

## Polk State College, City of Winter Haven to partner

WINTER HAVEN – Polk State College President Dr. Angela Falconetti announced something newsworthy at the Winter Haven City Commission meeting Feb. 10

Starting sometime in the near future, Polk State staff will be paid to provide professional development education to city employees.

Winter Haven City Manager Mike Herr said negotiations began in August 2018 and that the arrangement will save the city money on travel and hotel expenses associated with traveling to education conventions.

“(Falconetti’s) team will be an extension of our staff,” Herr said. “We look forward to a very effective partnership.”

Falconetti also requested that city commissioners and staff lobby on behalf of Polk State College during “Polk County Day” of the 2019 legislative session, scheduled for March 12 in Tallahassee. Polk State staff are lobbying for \$16 million to renovate old classrooms in the theater building, \$2.5 million for more advisors and \$2 million for improved campus security, among other concepts.

Falconetti said that last year there was less money available for these types of projects because much time and money was allocated to school security. She said

she is hoping money will be available for these kinds of expenditures this fiscal year.

## Summerlin Academy names Cynthia Downing as first female commandant

BARTOW – Within the first month that she has been in charge of Polk County's military academy, Cynthia Downing says she is quickly grasping her new job.

In early February, Downing was named the third commandant of the Summerlin Academy and the first woman to run the school. She follows Mike Butler, who opened the school, and Steven Cochran, who is now the senior director of Workforce Education.

Being in this sort of position is not new for Downing. Previously, she was the first female commandant at the Quartermaster School in Virginia, and she was the first female deputy commandant of the NCO Academy in Texas.

Downing has been working for the Polk County

School District since 2006, back when she was a JROTC instructor at George Jenkins High for four years. Later, at Lake Gibson High, she was the 2015 Teacher of the Year. Before her career in education, Downing spent 5 years in the United States Army.

"This is a dream job," she said

Summerlin is one of three schools within Bartow High School. Bartow High is also the home of the International Baccalaureate, thereby giving the school three principals.

At Summerlin, there are a little more than 500 students from all over the county in grades 9-12. The school was established in 2005, branching off from Bartow High as a military school within the school. Students, known as cadets, wear uniforms and participate in academic and JROTC programs, with an emphasis on leadership, honor and community service.

"Summerlin Academy is a special school. It's a privilege and an honor to have this opportunity," Downing said. "I'm very comfortable mentoring, teaching and preparing kids. When you see a child totally turn around because of your leadership — that's a special thing."

In much of her first few weeks on the job, Downing has been concerning herself with learning who the teachers and students are.

Having Downing on staff was great news to IB Principal Dr. Brenda Hardman, who worked with Downing previously at George Jenkins.

"I got to know her and she is insightful, intelligent and a born leader," Hardman said.

Hardman elaborated on the setup at Bartow High, saying the three schools are independent, but the institution acts as one. There are weekly meetings of the principals — Downing, Hardman and Emilean Clemmons.

Tami Dawson, the regional assistant superintendent for Polk County high schools, said Downing was an obvious choice for this position.

"She has commandant experience, and that will lend itself very well to the mission and vision of Summerlin Academy," Tami Dawson said. "She excels at building relationships with students. She sees every part of her job as a learning experience, and her goal is to make the best decisions possible according to students' needs."

## State Rep. Melony Bell hosts open house, ribbon-cutting for Fort Meade office

FORT MEADE – Incoming freshman state congresswoman Melony Bell's open house Feb. 28 for her district office in Fort Meade was also a launch party for her first legislative session, which started March 4 in Tallahassee.

Two staffers will be available each day to constituents at the local office, located at 11 W. Broadway St.

For Bell, serving as a state representative is the latest step for her in public service.

"When I was in high school in the 1970s, I worked here in a political office. Then later I worked at Power Business Service here," Bell said at the grand opening.

Bell, a graduate of Fort Meade Middle-High School, served 16 years as a Fort Meade City Commissioner, four years as mayor, eight years as a Polk County Commissioner and — last November — she beat fellow Republican Jeff Mann in the Florida House of Representatives race, getting nearly 75 percent of the vote.

She now serves District 56, which covers DeSoto and

Hardee counties and southeast Polk County.

At the event, to Bell's surprise, she was presented with an award from Heartland Crime Stoppers. With her being in the House of Representatives she resigned from the Board of Directors.

Bell previously was awarded for her dedication to building arts in Polk County.

In 2018, the Polk Arts Alliance awarded and recognized Bell for promoting arts helping it to provide \$45 million a year in local economic impact. Vena Cannon, the president of the Fort Meade Chamber of Commerce, told the crowd that Bell had turned Moonlight & Music from a small gathering to a major event in Fort Meade.

"She cheered us on and helped us with the funding," Cannon said.

At the start of her first session, Bell has already introduced six bills and is on four committees: the Civil Justice Subcommittee, the Government Operations and Technology Appropriations Subcommittee, the Health Quality Subcommittee and the PreK-12 Quality Subcommittee.

Having Bell working in the state capitol could be ad-

vantageous for Polk County, said Pat Fortney, elected last November to the Polk County School Board.

"She is known for being big on children," Fortney, a 33-year educator in Polk County. "She went to Fort Meade schools. I got to know her on the campaign trail and she's a problem-solver."

Anita Stasiak, a former president of the Bartow Chamber of Commerce, recognized Bell for her honesty and integrity. Cannon said she was isn't afraid of asking hard questions. Bartow Vice Mayor Billy Simpson said Bell has the highest ethical standards.

Bell indicated to her supporters she is jumping into new territory, but she believes it shouldn't cause anyone concern.

"I'm going to be dealing with a \$91 billion budget, and I started with a \$13 million one," she said. "It should be interesting to see what goes on."

She also reminded those in attendance Thursday morning she will not forget where she comes from and who she represents.

"Where else can you come to an open house and hear a rooster?" she asked.

## Lake Wales seeks tenant for 1919 Building

LAKE WALES – City officials would like to attract a new tenant to Lake Wales' historic 1919 Building — especially since the current ones are not exactly welcome guests.

The former school on Third Street has a termite problem, although it's not so severe that it needs immediate attention, according to City Manager Ken Fields. He indicated the city has gotten treatment estimates in excess of \$20,000 to treat the problem.

"Literally to tent it and treat it is going to cost that kind of money. We monitor that building on a regular basis," Fields said. "The building is structurally okay. It's not in danger of falling down or anything like that. ... It's not something we're going to rush into. At the appropriate time we'll move it forward."

He also noted the long vacant building most recently has been considered as a location for Bok Academy North, part of the Lake Wales Charter Schools System. Fields said the city might double back on taking a look at the two-story structure.

"We might want to revisit the issue of the charter schools perhaps taking over that property," he added. "That's a possibility a still. We want to do an RFP (request for proposals) on that building of some kind to see who's interested in it."

# Lakes Wales couple arrested for possession of child pornography

The Polk County Sheriff's Office announced Feb. 28 that it had arrested a Lake Wales couple on charges of possession of child pornography and possession of methamphetamine

Detectives for PCSO arrested Jesse Butler, 29, and Katie Butler, 30, on Wednesday, Feb. 27, after discovering they possessed child pornography.

That investigation began thanks to a tip PCSO detectives received from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. The NCMEC tip was that a video containing child pornography was uploaded and sent by Jesse Butler via Facebook Messenger, and sent to Katie Butler Dec. 23.

As detectives executed a search warrant of the couple's home at 511 High Street, Lake Wales, on Thursday, they found 40 images and videos depicting child pornography on Katie Butler's cell phone. According to the PCSO statement, "the images and videos consisted of male and female children between the approximate ages of 2 and 12 years."

"At this time, the identities of the children in the images is unknown," Polk Sheriff Grady Judd said. "Our detectives will continue their work to determine if there are any more images, and if any of the victims are local."

During the search of the home, detectives also found drug paraphernalia and baggies containing methamphetamine residue throughout the residence.

Katie Butler has been charged with 40 counts of Possess/Control/View Child Pornography, Possession of Controlled Substance and Possession of Paraphernalia. Jesse Butler has been charged with Possess/Control/View Child Pornography, Transmission of Child Pornography via Electronic Device, Possession of Controlled Substance and Possession of Paraphernalia.

According to authorities, the couple did have access to small children, but there is currently no indication that any of those children were involved with the child pornography.

The Butlers were transported to the Polk County Jail and the PCSO investigation is ongoing.

## 'Here Abouts' in Winter Haven in 1976

In the spring of 1976, Oscar and Jane Marable had just published the second issue of a small, tourism-focused magazine they named "Here Abouts."

It compiled visitor information about current events throughout the county. Scanning its 22 pages presents a clear picture of just how much things have changed in the past 43 years.

The fact that 1976 was all things Bicentennial found The Museum Old Dolls and Toys (on U.S. 17, where Spring Lake Rehab is today) featuring a display of "Fifty years of First Lady Fashions" with dolls dressed in authentic inaugural gowns of America's FLOTUS. Half-price admission was \$1 for adults and 50 cents for children.

Other local businesses of the day included the Sundial Shop, Sara Buri Imports, Crazy Horse Gifts and Antiques, Shattuck's Men's Wear in Bell's Alley, the Park Restaurant and Juhler's Cottage Shop. One venerable survivor is The Little Studio.

If rock and roll was your passion, you could see the

Doobie Brothers at the Lakeland Civic Center for \$6 in advance and \$6.50 at the door! Tickets to Holiday on Ice were \$4-6 and you could see William F. Buckley for a mere \$3.50.

The Winter Haven Community Theatre was in its sixth season under the direction of Norman Small. "The Glass Menagerie" was on tap for May "in the air conditioned Civic Center Auditorium on Lake Silver" (now the Senior Center). Tickets were \$3 for adults and \$2 for students.

Winter Haven's population stood at 19,500 (it is now 40,000). The city hosted Boston Red Sox Spring Training at the Chain of Lakes Stadium.

Cypress Gardens was in full bloom, having recently opened Gardens of the World featuring themed areas including an All-American Rose Garden, an Italian Water Garden, Mediterranean Quarry Waterfall and a fifty foot Dutch Windmill.

And yes, there were thrilling ski shows at 10 a.m., noon, 2 p.m. and 4 p.m.

And while the Gardens evolved into LEGOLAND Florida, the waterfall remains a popular photo

spot creating new memories for new generations.

Winter visitors had a number of Polk touring options including Bok Singing Tower, Circus World, Dolls of Dundee, Florida Citrus Showcase, Masterpiece Gardens, The Museum of Old Dolls and Toys, Slocum Water Gardens, Spook Hill, USA of Yesterday and the Black Hills Passion Play.

Of these only Bok Tower and Spook Hill remain today.

In some ways 1976 seems recent — but when was the last time you paid \$6 for a rock concert!?

This column is based on information contained in the "Here Abouts" magazine from the spring of 1976. And for you "word-smiths," auto-correct does not like the word "abouts."

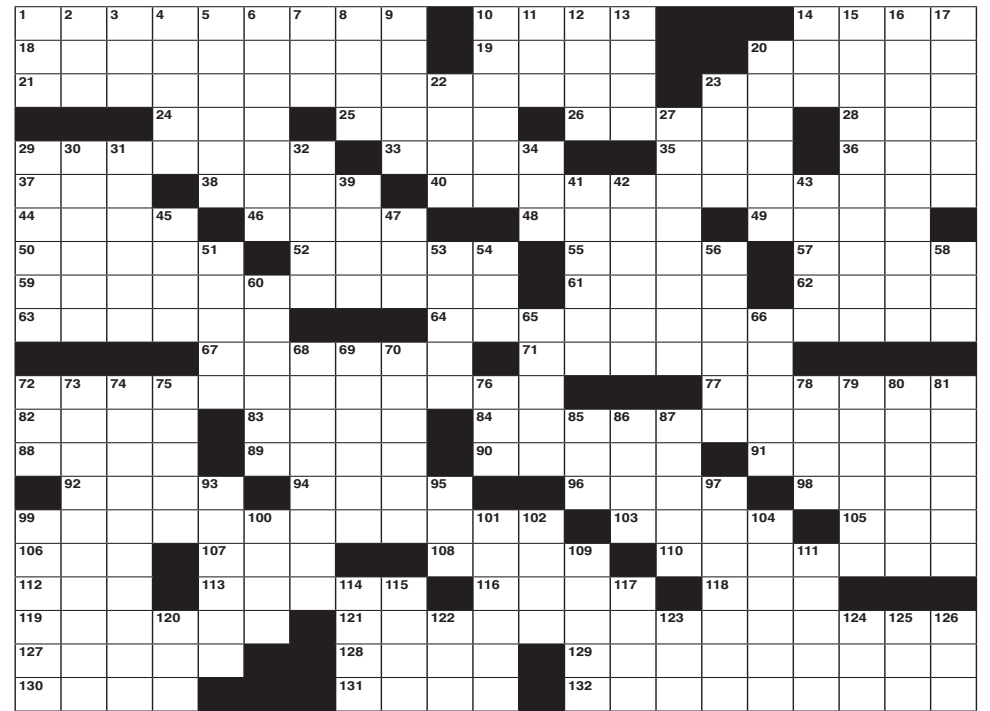

# Auburndale soccer coach reflects on Bloodhounds' path to another title

AUBURNDALE – To understand just how dedicated Auburndale boys soccer coach Guy Jennings is to the sport, know that his front yard isn't a yard at all.

It's a soccer field.

Which pretty well defines his players' dedication to the sport, too — a passion for the pitch that brought the Bloodhounds a third soccer state title in 13 years a couple of weekends back.

In fact, Auburndale ran the table when it came to any team from the Sunshine State, completing its journey with a 5-3 overtime win over Fort Lauderdale to earn the 4A crown. The team's only losses in the just finished 2018-19 season came on a trip to California.

Much like the regular season, the Bloodhounds spread the wealth offensively, with five different players scoring goals, including the game winner from Ducarmel Jennestin, one of the few juniors on the senior-laden team —

a team that pretty much has played together since the ninth grade, when the group advanced to the state semifinals.

"We've been trying to get back there for a long time," Jennings said.

He was Auburndale's club soccer coach in 2005 and 2007, which launched the school's soccer success.

"I knew what it tasted like, but they were 6-year-olds when that happened," Jennings added. "We knew about the possibilities of this team since they were freshmen."

Noah Stephens, Noah Sims, Ben Pigg and Echo-ni Puis also scored. For the season, the five players combined for 93 goals, but none of them had more than 30.

Dawson Hinkle made it all stand up on the defense with his sparkling goals against average of .084.

The Bloodhounds had been close before, including two final fours before this year, but hadn't gotten back to the top of the mountain.

"You can have a great

team, but you still don't always get over the hump. One bad game can send you home," he said

But this edition of the Bloodhounds was a little different, and a little wiser, too.

"This team was so good, We just had too many pieces that that wasn't going to happen. We had too much firepower, too much defense, too much goalkeeping. We just had all the pieces this year," Jennings added.

And Jennings knows that another state title will be motivation for the city's younger players, a few of which were running around in his front yard, er, soccer field, a few days after states.

"It's kind of like when the United States gymnastics team has a great Olympics," he added. "What happens? The enrollment for gymnastic classes double and triple. It's the same for soccer. We've created a culture here in Auburndale, a little rural, blue collar community. We have to work harder, and we've been able to pull that off."

## Thinking Out Loud Two airplanes and a bank robbery

One of the most remarkable crimes in Polk County's history, my Dad always maintained, was the robbery of a Fort Meade bank in 1957 by two men — both drunk — who utilized two airplanes (one of them stolen) and a kidnapped law enforcement officer's patrol car for transportation.

Spoiler alert: they got caught.

Mary and I have assigned ourselves the job of going through 30-plus Bankers Boxes full of memos, letters, stories and other impedimenta salvaged during the closing and ultimate sale of the building in which The Polk County Democrat was published for more than 50 years.

A magazine article about Polk's most bizarre bank robbery prompted me to ask Dorinda Morrison-Garrard, senior library assistant at the Polk County History Center, for help in researching local coverage of the crime.

She found a lengthy story in The Polk County Democrat, undoubtedly written by my father (his writing style is easy for me to spot, even though he rarely put his byline on a story) and a shorter one published in The Fort Meade Leader, both on Oct. 25, 1957 — the day after the robbery.

The two robbers were from Tampa, and what they lacked in sophistication they more than made up for in imagination. The apparent leader of the pair of robbers was an Air Force pilot in World War II whose post-war employment was as a corporate pilot.

On Oct. 24, 1957, he borrowed a friend's Cessna in Tampa for "a short business trip," which he failed to explain was for the purpose of robbing the First State Bank of Fort Meade the next day.

Early the next morning, he and his associate, an unemployed airplane salesman, flew to Venice (for reasons unknown), then set course for Winter Haven's Gilbert Field, where the No. 2 pilot "casually strolled over" to an Aeronca aircraft, cranked it up, and took off.

From there, they flew both planes to an abandoned air strip near Plant City, left behind the borrowed Cessna, and flew toward Fort Meade in the stolen Aeronca.

After landing near that city, they walked into town, by this time having consumed a quantity of spirits, and purchased soft drinks and two pairs of dark glasses.

Soon after leaving the store, they were arrested for drunkenness by a constable. Once in his car, the two men pulled pistols on the constable and ordered him to drive them to the bank, where they pulled stockings over their heads as masks.

Several witnesses believed the two men were dressed in pre-Halloween get-ups and initially ignored them.

This error became apparent when the miscreants entered the bank, ordered employees to fill a sack with money — "nothing less than tens" — knocked one banker unconscious and, as they left, fired a shot into a window frame.

As the robbers fled in the constable's car, an anonymous caller reported the robbery to law enforcement, and lawmen from several agencies joined in pursuing the gunmen.

The fugitives fled to the Aeronca they had flown to Fort Meade, and took off in it for Plant City, where they left the stolen plane and got aboard the borrowed Cessna for a flight to Tampa. By this time, pilots from several airports had joined in an aerial search.

At Tampa, the Cessna pilot dropped off his accomplice, who left in a car, had an accident a short time later, and was arrested for drunken driving. The Cessna pilot took off and circled the area for awhile, finally returning to the Tampa airport, where he was arrested by waiting lawmen.

With help from one of the two robbers, lawmen recovered the stolen money the next afternoon.

*(S. L. Frisbie is retired. A senior in high school when this robbery occurred, he missed out on helping cover the story. But at least two witnesses to the crime became friends of his in ensuing years and remain so today. He didn't discover this until reading the account of the robbery in The Fort Meade Leader just a few days ago.)*

Public schools need the maximum amount of dollars to provide services for: Advanced Placement classes, average classes, exceptional students with learning disabilities, English-language learners and homeless students.

We have to educate, mentor and legislate wisely and comprehensively in order to course-correct students away from the correctional facility pipeline and into opportunities to further their education or attain employment in the workforce in the state of Florida.

State lawmakers, please be mindful of any legislation that affects change in K-12 public schools. Please do not write bills and pass legislation that will hinder our students — because all students need to be successful in education and in life.

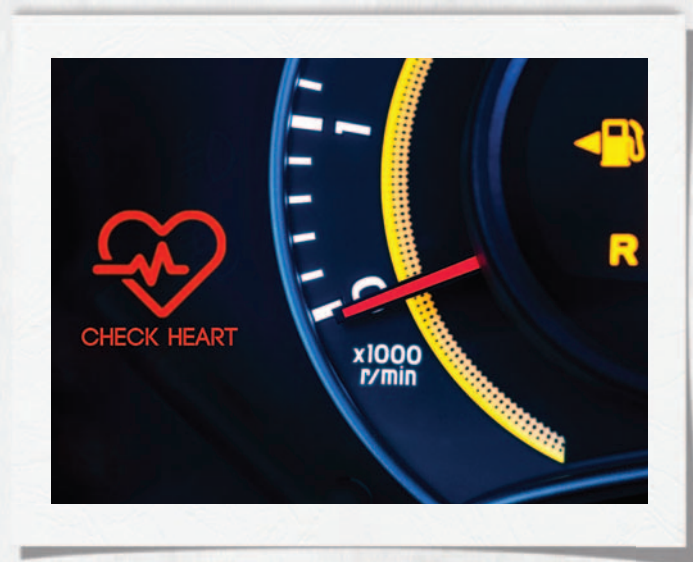

## Florida lawmakers convene for annual 60-day session

Issues range from repealing ban on smokeable medical marijuana to enhanced environmental protections to broadened vouchers for students to attend private at taxpayer expense

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Florida's political leaders called for cooperation and outlined goals for education, health care, transportation and other priorities as the state Legislature convened Tuesday in Tallahassee with new presiding officers, a new governor and only one requirement: pass a balanced state budget to fund the government. Republican Senate President Bill Galvano stressed in a brief

speech that lawmakers should work together and value quality of legislation over quantity.

"Let's make every single day of this session meaningful, purposeful, and have it lead to accomplishment," the Bradenton Republican told senators in a speech free of specific policy proposals but including references to Ernest Hemingway and Abraham Lincoln.

"When an idea is not right, when a bill is not ready, let us have the courage to step back, regroup and rethink. Let us have

the discipline to let go and walk away," Galvano added.

In the House, GOP Speaker Jose Oliva listed several major goals: changes to the funding of higher education, more school choice in K-12 education, continued aid for Hurricane Michael recovery and several steps to improve competition and bring down costs in Florida's health care system.

"(This is) a new session and a new opportunity for us to be who we said we would be," said Oliva, who is from Miami Lakes.

Lawmakers have already been meeting in committees for weeks on issues ranging from repealing the ban on smokeable medical marijuana to enhanced environmental protections to broadened vouchers for students to attend private at taxpayer expense. Other high-profile issues for the annual 60-day session include Galvano's plan to boost rural roads and infrastructure, improving environmental protections to curb events such as coastal algae blooms and reducing regulations on business.

Only a handful of the several thousand bills filed will actually pass. The must-pass budget begins with a \$91.3 billion blueprint proposed by DeSantis. Oliva and Galvano pledged to work with the governor on crafting a balanced budget as required by the Florida Constitution, but Oliva stressed that spending must not get out of hand.

"Together we will craft a budget that aligns our priorities, that rewards innovation and rejects excesses," Oliva said.

## Tornado forecasting improves, but deaths still keep coming

### Meteorologists can get everything technically right in forecasting, yet it all can go horribly wrong

WASHINGTON — Sometimes in forecasting tornadoes, you can get everything technically right, and yet it all goes horribly wrong.

Three days before the killer Alabama tornado struck, government severe-storm meteorologists cautioned that conditions could be ripe for twisters in the Southeast on Sunday. Then, an hour before the tragedy, they warned that a strong tornado could occur in two particular Alabama counties within 30 to 60 minutes.

And that's what happened. Yet 23 people died. To a meteorologist, the

forecast was the equivalent of a hole-in-one in golf or a slam dunk, but with so many people killed, "was it a success or a failure or both?" asked Colorado State University meteorology professor Russ Schumacher.

Forecasters "painted a pretty clear picture that something bad was going to happen," Schumacher said, and "there's certainly success in that. On the other hand, we don't like to see entire communities to be turned upside-down like this. So there's more to be done."

Predicting with any precision where a tornado is going to go is still beyond the limits of meteorology, which is why warnings went out for a large two-county area when a

tornado might be only half a mile wide. And getting people to listen and take precautions is another matter altogether.

Forecasting tornadoes combines the hard physics of meteorology, the softer human factors of social science and more than a dash of chaos.

At the National Oceanic and Atmospheric

Administration's Storm Prediction Center in Norman, Oklahoma, forecasters look for certain ingredients that can make a tornado. These include warm moist air coming from the south and stormy weather chugging from the west that can bring instability. That's when you

### Ethan Lindenberger told Congress 'my school viewed me as a health threat'

WASHINGTON — An Ohio teen defied his mother's anti-vaccine beliefs and started getting his shots when he turned 18 — and told Congress on Tuesday that it's crucial to counter fraudulent claims on social media that scare parents.

Ethan Lindenberger of Norwalk, Ohio, said his mother's "love, affection and care is apparent," but that she was steeped in online conspiracies that make him and his siblings vulnerable to vaccine-preventable diseases like the ongoing measles outbreaks.

"I grew up under my mother's beliefs that vaccines are dangerous," Lindenberger told a Senate health committee. He'd show her scientific studies but said she instead turned to illegitimate sources that "instill fear into the public."

Last December, despite his mother's disapproval and realizing that "my school viewed me as a health threat," Lindenberger began catching up on his missed immunizations. He told lawmakers it's important "to inform people about how

# Board votes to retain Stoneman Douglas superintendent

## Only six of about 80 community members spoke in favor of firing Runcie during testimony

**FORT LAUDERDALE** — The superintendent of the Florida school district where a gunman killed 17 last year weathered an attempt Tuesday to fire him by a board member who lost a daughter in the shooting.

The Broward school board voted 6-3 to retain Superintendent Robert Runcie, rejecting a motion introduced by member Lori Alhadeff, who was elected to the board last year. Alhadeff's 14-year-old daughter Alyssa and 16 others died in the Feb. 14, 2018, shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High

School in Parkland. Runcie supporters and opponents packed the board's meeting room and an overflow area, and security was tight: A police officer escorted Runcie into the building and spectators were checked for weapons.

The district is the nation's sixth-largest with 327 schools and 270,000 students.

After the vote, Runcie asked Alhadeff and the other victims' parents to work with him moving forward and to use the tragedy as an opportunity to bring the community together.

"I can't lift the pain of the victims' families but I

know pain," Runcie said. He said his mother was shot and wounded while he stood next to her when he was 8 and that he dealt with the loss of several children when he was an educator in Chicago.

"I have witnessed a lot of loss. Grief and anger can really test and wreck your spirit, but you can't let it wreck your life."

About 80 parents and community members addressed the board prior to the vote, with only six speaking in favor of firing Runcie during more than four hours of testimony. The rest said he should be retained because he has improved schools districtwide and reached out

to minority communities. His supporters say he has led an academic rebirth in the district and note that the state gave Broward a "B" in its latest district grades. The state's report took into account a graduation rate of 84 percent, a 10 percentage-point increase over five years.

Brian C. Johnson, vice mayor of the suburb of West Park, said that while he sympathized with the Stoneman Douglas parents, the effort to remove Runcie was a "sham" and "a shameful attempt to make our superintendent a sacrificial offering to their god of irrational revenge." He punctuated his remarks with an obscenity.

Board member Patricia Good said she supported Runcie because he has helped the community heal in the shooting's aftermath.

"This has been a very difficult year, a very

painful year," Good said. "I have seen firsthand how this superintendent has dealt with some very emotional and complex issues with this tragedy. No one has walked in his shoes."

### Police: Man stabs bar patrons after 1 upsets wife with music

**WINTER HAVEN (AP)** — Police in Florida say a man stabbed two bar patrons after one of them upset his wife with loud music that was being played.

Winter Haven police tell news outlets 46-year-old Jason Sinkler stabbed 40-year-old Jeremy Keefe and 41-year-old Kristopher Hobbs on Sunday. The friends remain hospitalized with critical injuries Monday.

A police statement says the altercation began when Keef drove into the bar's parking lot with loud music playing, upsetting 41-year-old Carmelita Sinkler. They say she began to yell at him.

Police say Jason Sinkler came out of the bar, joined the argument and stabbed Keefe several times. Hobbs ran toward

the attack and was also stabbed.

Jason Sinkler was charged with two counts of aggravated battery with a deadly weapon. It's unclear if he has a lawyer who could comment.

### SeaWorld removes foam bowls, plates from parks

**ORLANDO (AP)** — SeaWorld Parks & Entertainment is removing products made of polystyrene foam from its 12 parks.

Officials at the Florida-based theme park company said Tuesday the removal of bowls, plates and trays made of the material will prevent an estimated 14 million pieces of polystyrene foam products from entering the environment each year.

Although the material is good for keeping food warm and is comparatively inexpensive,

SeaWorld officials say it's resistant to decomposition and difficult to recycle.

SeaWorld vice president Andrew Ngo says in a statement that reducing the company's environmental footprint is an important part of the company's mission. SeaWorld has previously removed plastic straws and plastic coffee stirrers from its parks.

In recent years, Baltimore, San Francisco and Portland, Oregon have banned businesses from using foam food containers.

### Officers fatally shoot sexual battery suspect

**JACKSONVILLE (AP)** — A Florida police officer fatally shot a man who had a sexual battery warrant during a traffic stop confrontation.

The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office tweeted

the shooting happened early Tuesday. Officials say an officer saw a truck backed up in the bushes outside the supermarket and approached the vehicle.

Officials say the officer saw the man in the back seat of the truck. A check on his license plate found he was wanted in a sexual battery case. The man then refused to comply with officers.

Eventually an officer broke a window in the truck and used a stun gun on the man. Officials say the officers saw the man turn toward officers with a gun.

Officials said in a news conference that six officers fired their guns at the man.

### Florida man accused of trying to drown child in pool

**ORLANDO (AP)** — Sheriff's officials say a man is accused of trying

to drown a toddler in a swimming pool at an apartment complex in Orlando.

Officials tell news outlets that 29-year-old Wilkens Ordena faces charges of attempted first-degree murder and fleeing and eluding law enforcement following the Monday night incident.

An arrest report says family members jumped into the pool to save the child. Ordena left the pool before deputies arrived. He then crashed a car into a deputy's vehicle and the gate complex before authorities arrested him.

The Orlando Sentinel reports the toddler is not related to Ordena, but their relationship hasn't been disclosed. The child was taken to a hospital for treatment and is in stable condition.

An attorney wasn't listed for Ordena in jail records.

### Woman gets 1 year, 1 month for FEMA fraud

**ORLANDO (AP)** — A Florida woman has been sentenced to one year and three months in prison for lying on an application seeking disaster relief benefits following Hurricane Irma.

Court records show that 46-year-old Sandreana Davis was sentenced Monday in Orlando federal court. She was convicted in December of filing a materially false statement in an application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Prosecutors say Davis broke into an Orlando apartment and pretended to live there in September 2017, shortly after Irma hit the Florida Keys and traveled up the state's Gulf coast. She used the apartment for a FEMA inspection while trying to obtain the relief benefits.

# Prominent French jihadis killed in IS-held area in Syria

**OUTSIDE BAGHOUZ, Syria** — A prominent French militant who joined the Islamic State group, Jean-Michel Clain, was killed in a mortar strike over the weekend as he struggled with wounds suffered in an earlier airstrike that killed his jihadi brother, his wife said Tuesday after emerging from the group's last pocket of land in Syria.

The wife, who identified herself as Dorothee Maquere, said another French woman who had joined IS, Hayat

Boumeddiene, was killed in another strike last week that allegedly hit a safe house known as the "French House," where many French nationals were staying. Boumeddiene had been wanted by French police as a suspected accomplice in a 2015 attack in the Paris region.

Maquere was one of hundreds of people who over the past two days streamed out of Baghouz, the last village held by the Islamic State group, under stepped-up assault the past four days by U.S.-backed forces. The latest wave of evacuations

brings the final defeat of IS by the Kurdish-led Syrian Democratic Forces one step closer — a milestone in the devastating four-year campaign to defeat the group's so-called "caliphate" that once covered a vast territory straddling both Syria and Iraq.

Maquere, who is also French, told the Associated Press that the situation inside Baghouz was a "horror film," saying there is a "massacre" inside, with constant shooting. People had to lay flat to avoid the crossfire, she said, adding that there were "no more

homes, we live underground in tunnels and tents." She said her 7-year-old daughter was killed and her other daughter wounded by an explosion two weeks ago. Two other sons were killed earlier in a mortar attack and Syrian government fire.

Speaking at a desert reception area where SDF fighters were screening the evacuees, the 38-year-old said she does not want to go back to France, which is part of the U.S.-led coalition fighting IS. "I want France to leave me alone. They killed my husband, my children. ... I want nothing from them.

They did already enough harm. I want them to leave me with my children," she said, cradling her two-week old son, one of her five surviving children.

Her account, if verified, closes a chapter on a number of French militants who were connected to attacks in past years in and around Paris and who then made their way to IS's "caliphate" and finally, as it crumbled, to this tiny village on the Euphrates River near the Iraqi border.

Her husband, Jean-Michel Clain, who Maquere said wrote

religious anthems for IS, was seriously wounded in a Feb. 20 airstrike in Baghouz that killed his brother, Fabien, one of Europe's most wanted IS members. The U.S.-led coalition announced Fabien's death several days after the strike. The two brothers joined IS together and Fabien went on to become the group's voice in France. Fabien's voice was on an IS recording claiming responsibility for the worst terrorist violence in France's modern history — a series of bombings and shootings in Paris in November 2015 that killed 130 people.

## Back in Venezuela, Guaido asks state workers for support

**CARACAS, Venezuela** — Opposition leader Juan Guaido on Tuesday appealed for support from Venezuela's state workers in his push to oust President Nicolas Maduro, whose government has yet to comment on the defiant homecoming of his adversary.

Guaido said police officials were among those at a meeting that he held with leaders of public employee unions, which rely heavily on subsidies from Maduro's government to get by in a country suffering from hyperinflation and shortages of food and other necessities.

"We're not going to collaborate any longer with the dictatorship," Guaido

said after a meeting at the offices of an engineers' association in Caracas. He urged state workers to prepare for a strike, though no date was given and he said an immediate priority will be to promote a law guaranteeing rights for public workers.

The 35-year-old leader of the National Assembly said he would call a meeting of the legislature on Wednesday to craft the law.

Guaido and his backers say Maduro's re-election last year was invalid, making the legislative leader interim president. At least one pro-Maduro Supreme Court judge has accused Guaido of illegally usurping power, putting him at risk of arrest.

Guaido had shrouded the route and timing of

his return Monday in secrecy amid concerns he might be detained. Yet he breezed through airport immigration checks and brazenly called for Maduro's downfall at a rally where the presence of security forces was minimal.

The United States and other countries had warned Maduro not to move against his adversary, and he possibly realized arresting his foe could generate more street protests.

And while Guaido's presence is likely to add at least short-term momentum to his campaign for political change, Maduro has proven resilient and still controls the organs of state, including the critical loyalty of top military officers.

## Over 1,500 turtles found inside luggage in Philippines

**MANILA, Philippines (AP)** — Philippine authorities said Monday that they found more than 1,500 live turtles stuffed inside luggage at Manila's airport.

The various types of turtles were found Sunday inside four pieces of left-behind luggage of a Filipino passenger arriving at Ninoy Aquino International Airport on a Philippine Airlines flight from Hong Kong, Customs officials said in a statement.

The 1,529 turtles were turned over to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources' Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit, the statement said.

Convictions for the illegal trading of wildlife are punishable by a

prison sentence of up to two years and a fine of up to 200,000 pesos (\$3,861).

In 2018, Philippine authorities turned over to the DENR a total of 560 wildlife

and endangered species, including 250 geckos and 254 corals smuggled through air parcels, baggage and shipments, according to the statement.

# Trump aims to stem vet suicide with outreach, local grants

## Order creates task force to develop roadmap for prevention

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump signed an executive order Tuesday aimed at stemming a persistently high number of veteran suicides, urging expanded outreach by awarding grants to community programs.

The order creates a Cabinet-level task force that will seek to develop a national roadmap for suicide prevention, bringing in state and local organizations to raise awareness among the high-risk group. It directs the task force led by Veterans Affairs Secretary Robert Wilkie to finalize a plan in 12 months.

"Veterans suicide is a tragedy of staggering proportions," Trump said

at a signing ceremony surrounded by military families and veterans' organizations. "Today we can help end this crisis."

He said the problem of veteran suicide can only be solved if the entire country works together to build communities that support and protect veterans from the first moment they return to civilian life.

"They courageously fulfill their duties to our nation, now we must fulfill our duties to them," Trump said.

Currently, about 20 veterans die by suicide each day, about 1.5 times higher than those who haven't served in the military. The government says about 14 of those 20 were not under VA care, pointing to a need for improved outreach.

According to the White House, the new task force will look to create a grant system similar to the Housing and Urban Development-VA Supportive Housing program, which provides funding to state and local programs. The effort, which is being dubbed the PREVENTS Initiative, will also aim to better coordinate research on suicide prevention across agencies, including Veterans Affairs, Defense and Homeland Security. PREVENTS stands for "President's Roadmap to Empower Veterans and End a National Tragedy of Suicide."

The White House did not indicate the expected costs of the proposed grants, which would require congressional approval.

Trump has sought to boost suicide prevention, part of his campaign pledge to improve health care for veterans. Still, the order follows a report by the Government Accountability Office last

December that found the VA had left millions of dollars unspent that were available for suicide prevention efforts. The report said VA had spent just \$57,000 out of \$6.2 million available

for paid media, such as social-media postings. The VA has blamed the missteps on leadership turmoil at the VA that has since stabilized now that Wilkie is VA secretary.

# Holiday season defines winners and losers in retail

NEW YORK — The 2018 holiday season turned out to be a mixed bag for retailers, with some of them defying a gloomy government report in December that raised concerns that shoppers were hunkering down everywhere.

Retailers like Walmart, Target and Best Buy that have been responding faster to a more competitive landscape with expanded delivery services and spruced up stores are enjoying strong sales. Off-price chains like T.J. Maxx parent that offer treasure hunt experiences have remained a sweet spot.

But mall-based clothing chains and department stores — particularly those that target the middle-income shoppers — continue to muddle along. Macy's had weak holiday sales, ending a year-long recovery after a three-year slump. J.C. Penney and Gap are both closing more stores after lackluster holiday sales.

2019 is expected to be challenging as economic growth is expected to slow. The once-strong housing market is cooling. And smaller tax refunds could put a damper on the current quarter results, hurting sales of big ticket items like TVs.

If shoppers pull back, analysts say that the healthy retailers will face some pressure to get them to spend. But for the already struggling chains that have been in a slump despite a strong economy, their prospects will become even worse.

Here's a closer look at the winners and losers:

### Off-price stores to remain strong

Off-priced chains gained market share and expanded rapidly during the depths of the Great Recession and stayed strong during the economic recovery. Retail consultant Craig Johnson doesn't see their fortunes fading anytime soon.

TJX Cos., which operates T.J. Maxx, Marshalls and HomeGoods, posted a 6 percent increase in sales at stores opened at least a year for the fiscal fourth quarter as more shoppers walked through their doors.

The off-price concept has been a bright spot at Macy's and Nordstrom. Macy's is rapidly expanding its off-price concept called Backstage and CEO Jeff Gennette said its 120 stores with Backstage concepts are enjoying a more than 5 percent sales lift. Meanwhile, Nordstrom said that sales

at its off-price division grew 4 percent but slipped 1.6 percent at full-priced stores during the latest quarter.

### Muddling in the middle

Mall-based clothing chains like Gap as well as mid-priced department stores like J.C. Penney haven't benefited from a strong economy because they haven't differentiated themselves from a sea of sameness, Perkins said.

Many are continuing to try to shrink their way to profitability. J.C. Penney said it was closing 18 stores, while Gap said it would shutter 230 Gap brand stores over the next two years. That would leave the Gap chain with roughly 427 stores, a little more than half of what it was a year ago. Gap Inc. is also splitting itself, announcing last week that it will create two independent publicly traded companies: low-priced

juggernaut Old Navy and a yet to be named company, which will consist of Gap, Banana Republic as well as less well-known names like Athleta and Intermix.

Meanwhile, a number of retailers have filed for bankruptcy in the first two months of this year, including Charlotte Russe, Gymboree and Payless ShoeSource. Late last month, Payless filed for Chapter 11 for the second time, and is liquidating all 2,500 of its U.S. stores. Gymboree is closing all of its roughly 900 stores, including its Crazy 8 stores.

### Fortunes for home improvement business

Lowe's and Home Depot saw sales slow down in the fourth quarter amid an overall housing slowdown. The Commerce Department recently reported the number of homes being built in December plunged to the lowest level in more than two years, potentially signaling that developers expect fewer home sales this year. The National Association of Realtors said sales of existing homes dropped 1.2 percent in January to their worst pace in more than three years.

But Perkins believes that in a slowing housing market, home improvement chains can still weather the slowdown.

"People may not be buying homes, but they'll stay and renovate," Perkins said. "They have some insulation."

### California won't charge officers who killed Stephon Clark

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — California's attorney general said Tuesday that he won't charge two Sacramento police officers who fatally shot an unarmed black man last year, a killing that set off intense protests.

Attorney General Xavier Becerra's conclusion to a nearly yearlong investigation follows a Sacramento district attorney finding last weekend that the officers broke no laws when they shot 22-year-old Stephon Clark.

Officers Terrance Mercadal and Jared Robinet said they mistakenly thought Clark was approaching them with a gun after he ran from them into his grandparents' backyard as police investigated vandalism. Investigators found only a cellphone. Becerra acknowledged

that the killing was devastating for Clark's family but that his review found Clark had been committing crimes and officers believed he was armed and their lives were in danger when they opened fire.

Becerra, who called for changes in law enforcement practices to prevent other shootings, said there was plenty of evidence to support his conclusion. Still, he said it was not an easy decision.

"There's a young man who's no longer alive," Becerra said. "Two sons who won't have a father. Whose mother I just met is still grieving. Of course it was a tough call. These are all tough calls. It's never easy."

### AMA, Planned Parenthood challenge Trump family-planning rule

The American Medical Association and Planned

Parenthood filed a federal court lawsuit Tuesday challenging a new Trump administration rule changing criteria for family-planning grant money in ways sought by anti-abortion activists.

The new rule, announced last week by the Department of Health and Human Services, would prohibit family planning clinics funded by the federal Title X program from making abortion referrals — a provision that critics denounce as a "gag rule."

Clinics that receive Title X grants also would be barred from sharing office space with abortion providers — a requirement that would in many cases boost costs for providers like Planned Parenthood that offer abortions and other services, including family planning.

The result of the rule, if implemented, "will be a national public health crisis in short order," the lawsuit said.

### Professional wrestler King Kong Bundy dies at age 61

GLASSBORO, N.J. (AP) — King Kong Bundy, the 6-foot-4 professional wrestler best known for facing Hulk Hogan in WrestleMania 2, has died. He was 61.

Bundy died Monday, said promoter and longtime friend David Herro. He posted on Facebook: "Today we lost a Legend and a man I consider family." The cause of death and other details were not disclosed.

Bundy, whose real name was Christopher Pally, was born in Atlantic City, New Jersey. The 458-pound wrestler made his World Wrestling Federation debut in 1981.

He faced Hogan in 1986 in a steel cage match at WrestleMania 2, which Hogan won. WWE said he was one of the "greatest ... big men to lace up a set of boots."

# FBI adds anti-bribery squad focusing on South America

WASHINGTON — Aiming to crack down on money laundering and bribes to overseas governments, the FBI is stepping up its efforts to root out foreign corruption with a new squad of agents based in Miami.

The squad will focus its efforts not only on Miami but also in South America, a continent that has been home to some of the Justice Department's most significant international corruption prosecutions of the last several years. The Miami squad joins three others based in the FBI's largest field offices — Washington, New York and Los Angeles.

"We're protecting the rule of law," Leslie Backschie, the chief of the FBI's international corruption unit, said in an interview Monday. "If there's no rule of law, you'll have certain societies where they feel like their governments are so corrupt, they'll go to other elements that are considered fundamental, that they see as clean or something against the corrupt regime, and that becomes a threat to national security."

The unit aims to identify violations of the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, a U.S. law that makes it illegal to bribe foreign officials. The FBI has also been doing outreach to companies in a variety of industries, from oil to pharmaceuticals, to teach them about red flags that could indicate corruption and encourage the companies to "self-report" potentially improper conduct to the bureau.

"One thing when I talk to companies, I'm like, 'When you pay a bribe, do you know where your bribe goes? Is your bribe going to fund terrorism?'" Backschie said.

And so far, the cases the unit has brought have resulted in billions of dollars in settlements.

Last September, for instance, the Brazilian-owned energy company, Petrobras, agreed to pay more than \$853 million to resolve investigations into allegations that executives paid hundreds of millions of dollars in bribes to Brazilian politicians and political parties. And in December 2016, the Brazil-based construction conglomerate Odebrecht and another petrochemical company agreed to pay more than \$3.5 billion to settle charges they bribed politicians around the world through a web of shell companies and off-the-books transactions.

# Industrial, tech companies pull US stocks slightly lower

A mostly listless day on Wall Street ended Tuesday with stocks closing slightly lower as losses in industrial, technology and financial stocks outweighed gains elsewhere in the market.

Stocks wavered between small gains and losses through much of the day, with communications companies and retailers bucking the overall market decline. Mixed data on new U.S. home sales pulled homebuilders lower.

The stagnant trading came as investors looked ahead to a busy stretch of economic data releases later this week and the Federal Reserve's next interest rate policy meeting in two weeks. Meanwhile, traders continued to wait for new details on the trade talks between the U.S. and China.

The S&P 500 index dropped 3.16 points, or 0.1 percent, to 2,789.65. The Dow Jones Industrial Average fell 13.02 points, or 0.1 percent, to 25,806.63. The Nasdaq composite slipped 1.21 points, or 0.02 percent, to 7,576.36.

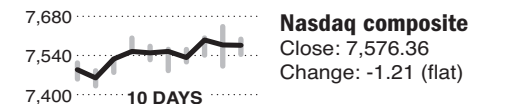

Today's deal is from a major championship in India not long ago. North judged well to take the sacrifice despite holding two aces. Six hearts would have made easily. A "wild and woolly" auction like this one often ends with a penalty double.

The double of a slam, however, often has lead implications, asking for an unusual lead. This is usually the lead of dummy's first-bid suit.

West, who knew that his partner had, at most, one diamond, thought the double suggested a diamond void. The defense could have taken the first three tricks, but declarer had a chance when West lead the seven of diamonds.

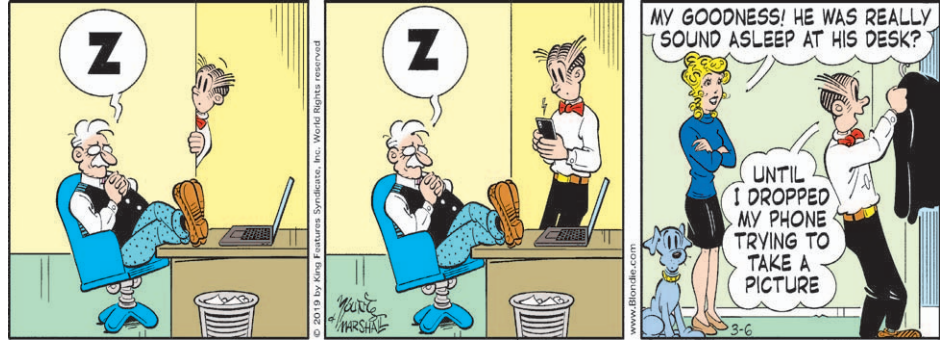
What would you play on the opening lead? Declarer reasoned that the loss of an additional trick would only cost 200 points, so it was well worth risking that for a chance to score 1210 points for making his slam. He courageously played dummy's 10 of diamonds at trick one! When this held the trick, and East followed, South ruffed a diamond with his king of spades. He crossed back to dummy with a spade to the 10 and ruffed another diamond high. The ace of spades drew the last trump and South discarded all three of his club losers on the good diamonds. This earned a big swing for his team.

# FDA chief Gottlieb steps down after nearly 2 years

### He targeted tactics used to maintain sky-high prices on drugs, calling them 'shenanigans'

WASHINGTON — Food and Drug Administration Commissioner Scott Gottlieb is stepping down after nearly two years leading the agency's response to a host of public health challenges, including the opioid epidemic, rising drug prices and underage vaping.

Health and Human Services Secretary Alex Azar announced in a statement Tuesday that Gottlieb would leave in a month. In a note to FDA staffers announcing his departure, Gottlieb cited “the challenge of being apart from my family” in Connecticut.

President Donald Trump tapped Gottlieb in 2017 to “cut red tape” at the FDA. But Gottlieb bucked expectations by pushing the agency to expand its authorities in several key ways, including an unprecedented effort to make cigarettes less addictive by requiring lower nicotine levels.

The 46-year-old physician and former conservative pundit advanced his agenda while managing to maintain the support of the president, Republicans and key Democrats in Congress.

Still, he departs with his most sweeping plans unfinished, including the initiative to make cigarettes less addictive.

In recent months, he came under fire for not acting more quickly to address an explosion in teenage use of electronic cigarettes, especially those with candy and fruit flavors. Under Gottlieb, the FDA has emphasized vaping as a potential tool to wean adult

smokers off traditional cigarettes. And in a widely criticized move, Gottlieb delayed key regulations on vaping devices until 2022, in part, to avoid over-regulating the industry.

Anti-smoking groups are now suing the agency to begin reviewing e-cigarettes immediately as the most recent federal data suggest that 1 in 5 high school students are using e-cigarettes. While the FDA has taken steps to keep e-cigarettes away from teenagers, including tightening restrictions on convenience store sales, it's unclear whether they will be enough to reverse the trend.

The pushback against FDA's approach to vaping threatens to overshadow what is by far Gottlieb's most far-reaching plan. Gottlieb announced in May 2017 the FDA would seek to require tobacco companies to drastically cut nicotine in cigarettes, in a bid to help adult smokers quit. The agency has had the authority to regulate nicotine levels since 2009, though no previous FDA commissioner tried to use it. The agency is still in the early stages of writing regulations that would standardize nicotine in cigarettes.

Elsewhere, Gottlieb targeted

drug industry tactics used to maintain sky-high prices on older drugs, calling them “shenanigans” and “deceptions.” For decades, FDA commissioners steered clear of the issue, noting that the FDA has no direct role in regulating U.S. medicine prices, which are set by drugmakers. But Gottlieb said the agency could help spur competition and reshuffled its review procedures to speed up approvals of lower-cost generic drugs.

Drug overdose deaths hit their highest level on record in 2017 — the most recent year for which federal data is available. Fatal overdoses are largely driven by illegal opioids including fentanyl and heroin, though the epidemic was triggered by legal prescription painkillers like OxyContin.

As FDA Commissioner, Gottlieb boosted the agency's inspectors at U.S. mail facilities to try and intercept illegal opioid shipments from China and other nations. It's not yet clear whether that effort has reduced drug abuse or overdose rates.

Trump tweeted that Gottlieb “has done an absolutely terrific job,” adding “he and his talents will be greatly missed.”

to find good information” and to remind them how dangerous these diseases really are.

This year is shaping up to be a bad one for measles as already, the U.S. has counted more than 200 cases in 11 states — including about 70 in an outbreak in the Pacific Northwest.

Measles is one of the most contagious viruses, able to be spread through coughs and sneezes for four days before someone develops the characteristic rash. It's dangerous: 1 in 20 patients get pneumonia, and 1 in 1,000 get brain swelling that can lead to seizures, deafness or intellectual disability. While deaths are rare in the U.S., measles killed 110,000 people globally in 2017 — and unvaccinated Americans traveling abroad, or foreign visitors here, can easily bring in the virus.

The vaccine is highly effective and very safe, John Wiesman, Washington state's health secretary, told the Senate Health, Education, Labor & Pensions Committee.

More than 90 percent of the population nationally is properly vaccinated but there are pockets of the country, including in his hard-hit state, where fewer children get immunized on time or at all. They in turn are a hazard

to people who can't get vaccinated — babies who are too young or people with weak immune systems.

Vaccination against a list of diseases is required to attend school, but 17 states, including Ohio, allow some type of non-medical exemption for “personal, moral or other beliefs,” according to the National Conference of State Legislatures.

The hearing came a day after the American Academy of Pediatrics urged the CEOs of Facebook, Google and Pinterest to better counter vaccine misinformation spread through their sites.

Lindenberger created national headlines after he posted on Reddit several months ago that, “my parents think vaccines are some kind of government scheme” and “god knows how I'm still alive.” He asked how to go about getting vaccinated on his own.

Lindenberger's mother, Jill Wheeler, told The Associated Press on Tuesday that she was proud of how her son carried himself even though “I didn't agree with anything he said.” Wheeler said she feared her children having a bad reaction if they were vaccinated, and questioned why a teen was given a national platform to discuss the topic. “They've made him the poster child for the pharmaceutical industry,” she said.

# Ex-NYC Mayor Bloomberg won't run for president in 2020

WASHINGTON — Michael Bloomberg, the billionaire former New York City mayor, announced Tuesday that he will not join the crowded field of Democrats running for president in 2020.

Instead, Bloomberg said he planned to focus his energy and considerable resources on outside efforts aimed at defeating President Donald Trump, as well as on combating climate change and addressing gun violence.

Bloomberg spent months weighing a White House run, traveling to early voting states and building a team of experienced political advisers. But aides said internal polling suggested Bloomberg's path to the Democratic nomination was narrow, particularly if Vice President Joe Biden — who shares some of Bloomberg's moderate positions — decides to run.

In an editorial for Bloomberg News — the media company Bloomberg owns — he said he was “clear-eyed about the difficulty of winning the Democratic nomination in such a crowded field.”

**77-year-old former New York City mayor Michael Bloomberg, one of the richest men of the world, announced his decision not to join the crowded Democratic field.**

He encouraged Democrats on Tuesday to unify behind a nominee who could beat Trump, a not-so-subtle dig against candidates pushing the party to embrace liberal priorities such as “Medicare-for-all.”

It's unclear how much money Bloomberg is willing to plunge into the effort. He invested more than \$100 million to help Democrats in the 2018 midterm election and his team has discussed going much further in 2020.

can get supercells, which is where tornadoes come from.

But maybe only 10 to 20 percent of supercells spawn tornadoes, said prediction center forecast operations chief Bill Bunting. There are other factors at work, including erratic wind behavior known as wind shear, the amount of cold air present, even the size of the rain droplets, meteorologists said. And then there are the unknown factors at play.

Given all that, the best meteorologists can do is say seven to eight days out — four to five is more usual — when conditions will be ripe for tornadoes, Bunting said. And even that doesn't mean they will happen. And certainly not over all of the large area that meteorologists give in their several-day-out alerts.

From 1994 to 2017, the weather service's “false alarm” rate for tornado alerts was 74 percent, while last year it dropped to 69 percent, according to weather service spokeswoman Maureen O'Leary.

The problem is that a tornado is a rare, small, fleeting event, harder to predict than giant phenomena like hurricanes or big winter storms. A one-mile variation in a tornado's path can mean the difference between plowing up a field and wreaking havoc in a populated area, Bunting said.

Bunting's office might warn people to watch out across a five- or six-county area or even a two- or three-state region, but “only a very, very small area of that risk area will actually experience dangerous conditions,” he said.

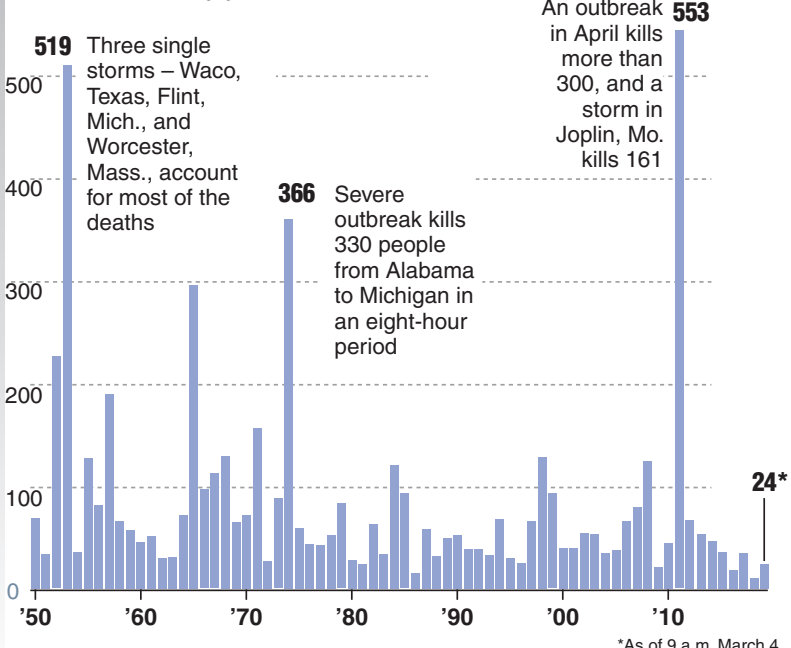

And people who don't get hit may not bother to listen the next time, said University of Oklahoma meteorology professor Howard Bluestein.

That's the social problem, which may be even bigger than the meteorology one, Bluestein said. And that's where Kim Klockow-McClain comes in. She is a researcher for NOAA's National Severe Storms Laboratory, also in Oklahoma, who specializes in trying to find out why some people listen and

react to warnings and others don't. “Social sciences, I think, are really going to the heart of the issue,” Klockow-McClain said. “You've got to receive the message. You've got to understand it and know what to be able to do about it.”

For example, people in mobile homes, which are especially vulnerable to tornadoes, are less likely to receive or seek out storm alerts, she said. Even though they are told to get out, studies show

mobile home dwellers still “shelter in place,” Klockow-McClain said. “They think it's the best thing they can do or the only they can do.”

It isn't. The weather service started to change from just focusing on better forecasts to better communication of warnings in 2011 because the agency noticed that the forecasts had improved but that the outcomes were still similar to what they were in the 1950s, '60s and '70s, she said.

### Couple 'close to death' until their cat rescued them

ORLANDO, Fla. — A Deltona, Fla., couple had spent several hours exposed to carbon monoxide poisoning and nearly died had it not been for their cat, according to a report by WESH.

Paul and Leona Jones parked their car in the garage after an early dinner Wednesday, WESH reported.

However, the couple failed to push the off button of their vehicle and left the engine running. The fumes began permeating throughout the house.

Paul fell asleep in the bedroom and woke up at 1 a.m. to the cries of the couple's pet cat, Bella, under the bed, WESH reported. He picked Bella up off the bed and then collapsed.

Leona, who was sleeping on the couch, came into the room but couldn't lift herself onto the bed, WESH said.

She called 911, and rescue crews gave the Joneses and their cat oxygen and transported them for further examination.

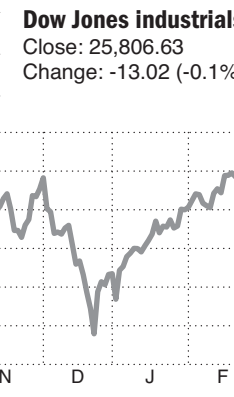
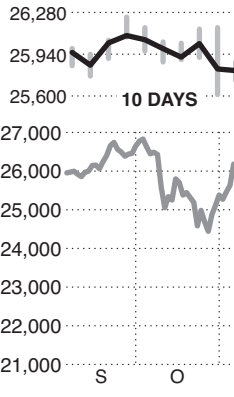
