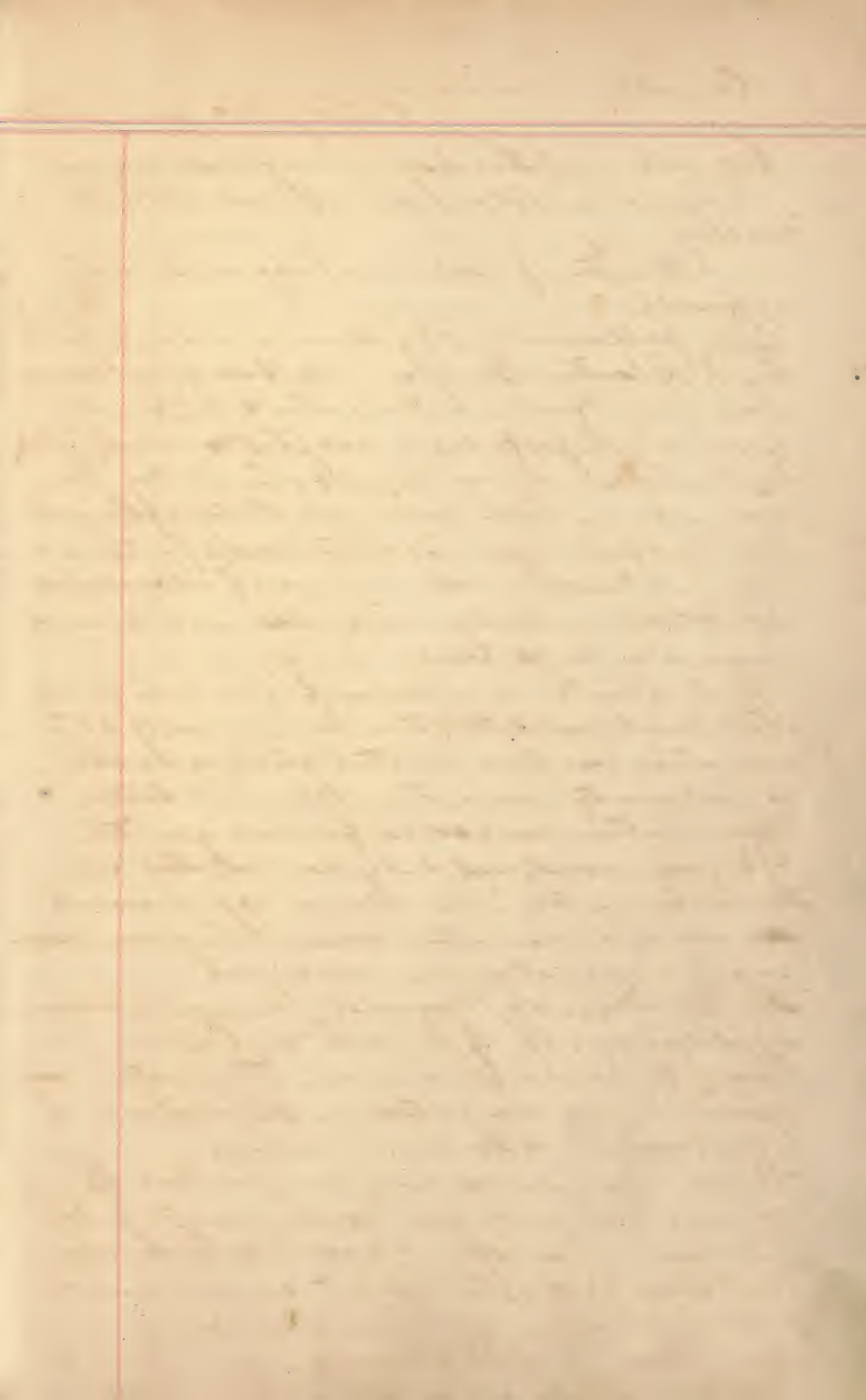

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Perry, Florida:

Section 1. No person shall engage in, manage or conduct the business, profession or occupation mentioned in this Ordinance unless a license therefor shall have been procured from the Tax Collector, such license shall be given to such person on receipt of the amount hereinafter provided together with the Clerk's fee

of twenty five cents for each license, and shall be signed by such Clerk and countersigned by the Mayor and shall have attached thereto the seal of the Town of Perry, Florida.

Sec. 2. All license shall be issued to expire on Sep- (30th) thirtieth after the issuance thereof, and no fractional license shall be issued. All license may be transferred with the approval of the Mayor to the purchaser of the business for which said license is desired to be transferred was taken out, but for no other business.

Sec. 3. The following individual license taxes shall be paid to the town by any person or persons, firm or corporation engaging in transacting or conducting each or either of the occupations named to wit:

Sec. 4. - Any person, firm or corporation engaging in any business, profession or occupation, not enumerated in this ordinance, in the town of Perry, Florida who are required by the laws of the State of Florida to pay a license tax to said State shall be required to pay to the town of Perry a license tax in the amount of fifty per cent. of the amount paid to the State as a license tax on <sup>such</sup> business, profession or occupation.

Sec. 5. - Any person, firm or corporation violating this Ordinance and failing to pay the



license tax herein provided for and engaging in the business, profession or occupation without paying such license tax required and provided for by this Ordinance to engage in such business, trade, profession or occupation, shall be fined an amount not less than double the license tax required for such business and not exceeding three hundred dollars, except dealers in wines, spirits and malt liquors, who shall be fined not exceeding three hundred dollars and not less than one hundred dollars, or such persons violating the provisions of such Ordinance may be imprisoned for a period not exceeding three months, at the discretion of the Mayor.

Sec 6. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec 7. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, or passage legally over the approval of the Mayor.

That permission be and the same is hereby granted to the Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company, its successors and assigns, to erect, operate and maintain lines of telephone and telegraph including <sup>the</sup> necessary poles, for wire and electrical conductors, repair, stay and over the public roads, streets and highways of the Town of Terry, Florida as its business may from time to time require, provided this Ordinance shall be construed to give the right to maintain a local exchange as a party line within the limits of the Town of Terry, Florida provided <sup>that</sup> all poles shall be neat and symmetrical.

Section 2. That the work of erecting poles by virtue of this ordinance shall be done under the supervision of the Committee on streets and highway of said City Council and the said Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company shall replace and properly re-lay any sidewalk or street that may be displaced by reason of the erection such poles, and upon failure of the Company to do so after twenty days' notice in writing shall have been given by the Mayor of the Town of Terry, Florida, to said Company, the City may repair such portions of the sidewalk or street that may have been disturbed by said Company, and collect the costs so incurred, from said Company.

Section 3. In consideration of the rights and privileges herein granted said Company shall upon demand, provide one cross arm on each pole on which the Town of Terry Florida, may desire to attach either fire alarm telegraph or fire alarm telephone wires, for the free use of the police or fire alarm telegraph or police telephone wires.

## Ordinance # 59

An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance regulating Small Pox and other Contagious disease and prohibiting infected persons from appearing at certain places and imposing a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be It Ordained by the Town Council of The Town of Perry Florida

Section 1. That all persons in the Town of Perry Florida who shall be considered and adjudged by any practicing physician of said Town to be infected with Small Pox or other Contagious disease are hereby prohibited from frequenting or appearing on the public streets and high ways, or in any store or public building or other business house, Depot, Churches, school buildings, barber shops, public toilets, public halls, trains, public hacks and all places where other persons may be accustomed to assemble or frequent, until such person or persons shall be considered and adjudged by such physicians to be no longer infected.

Section 2. That when any person shall be found to be infected with Small Pox or other Contagious disease, he shall immediately upon notice of the Town Marshall, repair to his home or such other place as may be designated by Mayor and Town Marshall and shall remain in such house or place of confinement until he shall have authority from the Town Marshall to leave said premises.

Section 3. That when any inmate of any house of said Town shall be found to be infected with Small Pox or other Contagious disease, the Town Marshall shall upon notice of any Physician of said Town, place a warning flag at such house or place of confinement of such infected person and such warning flag shall not be removed or taken down by any person until so ordered by the Town Marshall.

Section 4. That any person violating the provisions of Section one, two or three of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a breach of the law and the Marshall

or any police officer shall arrest such person with or without warrant and bring him or her before the Mayor to be dealt with according to the laws and ordinances of said Town of Perry Florida.

Section 5. That any person or persons violating the provisions of Section one, two or three shall upon conviction pay a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars or be punished by imprisonment in the Town prison for a term not to exceed sixty days. Provided further that any person who shall be convicted of a second offence under this ordinance shall be punished by fine of not less than Twenty five Dollars nor more than One Hundred and Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment in the Town prison for a period of not less than thirty days nor more than ninety or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Ordinance # 63

The Ordinance Entitled an Ordinance Concerning Ordinance # 13, Entitled and Ordinance defining vagrancy in the Town of Perry Florida, and providing a penalty therefor.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Perry Florida Section 1. (1st) hereinafter shall be the respective names of defendant and who have unreasonable employment shall be subjected to the annual taxable that is sufficient for use as an exhibit over the support of family depending on them are hereby declared to be vagrants. It is declared that a small amount of money shall not be deemed a viable means of support but when it is put in evidence that the person whom such money has money as a viable means of support the amount of money must be of such an amount that it would seem able provide for her or her & waste from the interest there on: and reasonable employment shall be held to mean a employment that any decent person can engage in and that will secure to them such wages as will reasonably support themselves and those depending on them. And furthermore, it shall be made the special duty of the Marshal to arrest all persons who, in his opinion, come under this law, without a warrant and bring him or her before the Mayor and make the charge of vagrancy, and the Mayor as it shall be deemed best to hear and determine the cause, and adjudge the party so charged guilty or not guilty as he may think just in the matter according to the testimony.

Section 2. That any person who shall be adjudged guilty of vagrancy under Section one of this Act shall be punished by fine not exceeding Two hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding sixty days, or by fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Mayor as hereinafter defined as follows, If a person is ordered to be imprisoned the person imprisoned shall be sent to labor on the streets of the Town of Perry Florida

Section 3. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with the Ordinance aforesaid shall be void the same are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor

An Ordinance Amending Section One and Two of Ordinance #55 of the Ordinances of the Town of Perry, Fla. the same being entitled "an ordinance regulating the sidewalks and the laying and the putting down, repairing and improving the same; and giving notice to owners to repair."

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Perry, Fla.

Sec. 1. That Sections one and two of Ordinance #55 approved Sept 9, 1910, and being entitled "an Ordinance regulating the sidewalks and the laying and putting down, repairing and improving of the same; and giving notice to owners to repair" be and the same are hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section One. That from and after the passage of this Ordinance persons owning property in the Town of Perry, Fla. shall be required when laying, placing or improving the said side walks fronting their property to repair, lay or place such side walks with good solid cement, or tiling, and no other substance or material shall be used, except such as is necessary to properly lay, repair and build a cement or tiling side walk, unless by special written permission of the Town Council of the Town of Perry, Fla.

Section 2. From and after the passage of this Ordinance, when the owners of any property in the Town of Perry, Fla. shall fail, refuse or neglect to keep the side walks in front of or bounding or surrounding the said

property in good and proper repair and condition, it shall be lawful for the Marshal, by and under the direction of the Chairman of the Street Committee, to give such owner written notice to repair, relay or rebuild such side walks, stating in such notice the repairs, work or improvement to be done, and if the said owner fails, refuses or neglects for the period of thirty days after the giving and receiving of said notice to improve, relay or repair such side walks as is specified and mentioned in said notice, the chairman of the street committee may have such improvements or repairs made and the same shall be charged to and chargeable against the property of the owner adjacent to such side walks and fronting on the same.

Section 3. That section three and four of said Ordinance # 55 shall still remain in full force and effect and are not modified, changed or altered by this ordinance.

Section 4. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 5. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately on its passage and approval by the Mayor.

## Ordinance # 68

A proposed Ordinance To be entitled an Ordinance relating to meeting trains coming into or leaving the town of Perry, Fla, and to prescribe a penalty for the violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained by the town Council of the Town of Perry, Fla,

Sec. 1. That from and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person or persons in the town of Perry either on foot or in any vehicle or machine to run along the side of or up to the train coming into or leaving any railroad or depot station in the town of Perry, Fla, or to live onto or swing off of any such train in the town of Perry, Fla.

Sec. 2. From and after the passage of this Ordinance it shall be lawful for the railroad and depot agents of the railroads having depots in the town of Perry, Fla, to designate at and around such depots and at and near where trains coming in to such depots and going out stop and leave from a line or point or points where hackmen, livery stablemen, draymen, porters and other persons meeting the trains for the purpose of soliciting business shall go and that it shall be unlawful for any hackman, drayman or livery stableman or hotel keeper, or any agent, servant or employee of such hackman, drayman, stableman or hotel keeper to go nearer to the stopping or starting place than the line or point or points indicated and designated by such depot agents for the purpose of soliciting trade, business or patronage and any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished by fine not exceeding \$100 or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days or both at the discretion of the Mayor.

Sec 3. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance or any part thereof be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval by the Mayor or upon its legal passage without the approval of the Mayor or over his veto.

horn of the said Automobile or other machine or to run or operate any Automobile over or along the streets or roads or by-ways of the town of Benz, Fla, without having headlights burning on such Automobile, or to back any Automobile or to let same stand on or along the streets of the town of Benz, Fla, after sundown without having red light burning on the rear of such Automobile.

Sec 2. Any person violating the first or any of the provisions of Sec. one of this Ordinance shall be punished by fine not exceeding \$100<sup>00</sup> or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days or both such fines and imprisonment at the discretion of the Mayor.

Sec. 3. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance or any part thereof shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. This Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. or upon its legal passage without the Mayor's approval or over his veto.
