## New coalition seeks National Wildlife Refuge status for Lake Apopka

Numerous environmental groups have banded together to work to obtain National Wildlife Refuge designation for the North Shore Restoration Area at Lake Apopka.

"We are making slow, but steady progress on the Lake Apopka Coalition which is being organized to begin the process of obtaining NWF designation for the North Shore Restoration Area," said Jim Thomas, president of the Friends of Lake Apopka (FOLA). "This was started by FOLA but will not be a FOLA project. The focus of the group will be limited to the Wildlife Refuge goal – no controversial projects like airports, dredging and other issues.



Lake Apopka is the third-largest lake in Florida, and several groups want it to carry a new designation.

Thomas said the group is working on a document that

details the structure of the coalition (with lots of members), and the procedures they plan to follow as they begin to ap-

## Longest sample ballot will be delivered soon

The longest ballot in Orange County history should arrive in mailboxes very soon.

The supervisor of elections office was scheduled to mail the ballots late Thursday, October 18, so voters should receive their ballots over the next day or two.

The ballot is the longest ever in Orange County and includes political races, as well as five Orange County charter amendment questions, and 11 state constitutional amendment questions, and is three ballot cards long with voting opportunities on the front and back of all three ballot cards.

Also included in the sample ballot envelope will be a map and driving directions to the polling location for each voter. "We are strongly encouraging people to pre-mark their sample ballots and take them to the polls with them. That way, they'll get through the process faster," said Bill Cowles, Orange County supervisor of elections.

The sample ballot also includes a barcode that will assist in expediting the check-in process at the polling place.

Cowles also said that voters should pay attention to their polling location for this election because precincts have been re-drawn and re-numbered due to the redistricting process from earlier this year. On Election Day, citizens must cast their votes in their assigned polling location based on their residen-

## Eight new homes in Errol Estate receive unanimous approval from City Council

In a meeting that lasted less than 40 minutes, the Apopka City Council's major action was approving an eight-lot development of higher-end

homes in Errol Estate Country Club.

Unlike several years ago, this time there was no controversy over the eight single-family home lots that will be built on the edge of the current parking area for Errol's clubhouse.

Back in 2007, a condominium

project was proposed for that area, but it faced heated opposition from some who live in Errol Estate. While some Errol members supported that project as a means to bring in new members, it failed to receive city approval.

The newest proposal, though,

flew through with little fanfare, with the final development plan being approved 4-0, with Commissioner Bill Arrowsmith abstaining because he is a member of Errol.

The homes will be a minimum of 3,000 sq. ft. each and will be built on

lots that are at least 120 feet wide. The houses will result in the removal of 255 of the current 389 parking spaces at the country club, leaving 134 spaces. However, that is still more than

proach the federal agencies and the justification for promoting this project.

"We are leaning toward a very simple structure with an executive committee but no officers," he said.

"Every member will have a representative to attend meetings with the executive committee putting it all together."

Thomas, who is a scientist, said the group is carefully considering its actions.

"The justification for designation will be for development of ecotourism and recreation projects and we are working on getting research that will illustrate these goals," Thomas said.

FOLA hopes to have all local governments around the lake, all the major environmental groups, other interested groups like local chambers of commerce, civic groups, and individual members as members of the coalition, Thomas said.

"We already have a number of organizations that are helping with the basic organization - FOLA, the Oakland Nature Preserve, several Audubon chapters, several chapters of Native Plant Society, Audubon of Florida, Green Mountain Scenic Byway, Florida Fish and Wildlife Foundation, Sierra Club and others," he said.

Avid bird-watcher Harry Robinson, co-president of the West Volusia Audubon, and several of his members drive an hour to the FOLA meet-

ings. Robinson currently works at least three eight-hour days a week on approximately 20,000 acres of the North Shore Restoration Area to identify different bird species.

"The North Shore Restoration Area would be the best ornithological place in Florida for a wildlife refuge," Robinson said. "The bird list here is larger than the list for Merritt Island and the habitat is useful for a whole range of recreational activities."

Individual groups like FOLA will still deal with controversial proposals and projects, Thomas said.

"We presented our ideas as a work in progress to the SJRWMD Governing Board last week," Thomas said. "Their reactions were positive, but we will wait for our detailed organizational document before we push for an answer. This is taking much longer than anticipated, but we want it to be concise before we approach any of the local governments for membership. We stress that details will be forthcoming."

Thomas said he presented the refuge concept to the SJRWMD Governing Board and Charles Lee of Audubon of Florida and Greg Gensheimer of Green Mountain Scenic Byway made comments.

The next coalition meeting will be Thursday, October 25, at 7 p.m. at the Oakland Nature Preserve, 747 Machete Trail, Oakland.

# Sample: Early voting will be October 27 through November 3 at Apopka Community Center/VFW

Prior to Election Day, voters have the option of casting their vote by mail with an absentee ballot or by visiting an early-voting center. The place for early voting in Apopka will be the Apopka Community Center/VFW, 519 S. Central Avenue. Early voting will take place from Saturday, October 27, through Saturday, November 3, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. each day. At the polling places on Election Day, voters may exchange their absentee ballots for an Election Day one.

Cowles said voters who have absentee ballots, but don't

wish to pay the 65 cents postage to mail them in may turn them in at an early-voting site.

The supervisor of elections said he wasn't ready to try to pinpoint a voter turnout, but said he was expecting somewhere between 65 percent and 72 percent. He said 77.17 percent of Orange County voters turned out for the 2008 presidential ballot. In 2008, 31 percent cast their ballots in early voting, while 25 percent voted absentee, and 44 percent voted on Election Day.

This year, more than 140,000 voters have requested absentee ballots, but

only 32,385 were back as of Wednesday, October 17. He wasn't sure why the number of ballots returned was so low at this point. "Are they still undecided? Will we have a rush after next Monday's third and final debate? The best I can do right now is between 65 and 72 percent turnout," Cowles said.

# Hazardous waste collection set for October 20

Orange County Utilities will hold its Household Hazardous Waste and Electronic Waste Community Collection Event Saturday, October 20 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Orange County Services Building located at 1111 North Rock Springs Road, Apopka. Participants will have the opportunity to properly dispose of hazardous and electronic waste free of charge.

The event is open to residents of unincorporated Orange County and the cities of Apopka, Ocoee, Orlando, Windermere, and Winter Garden only. Proof of residen-

cy is required.

"The Household Hazardous Waste collection program was created in 1990 to increase the protection of the health and environment of Orange County and its citizens," said Jim Becker, manager of Orange County Utilities' Solid Waste Division. "Each year, we sponsor these community collection events to give citizens the opportunity to dispose of hazardous items at a location that is convenient for them."

The following items will be accepted: paint, waste oil, flammable liquids, clean-

ing fluids, pesticides, pool chemicals, vehicle batteries, drain cleaners, brake fluid, antifreeze, propane tanks (20 lb. maximum), stereos, televisions, computers, telephones, and DVD players.

Participants are prohibited from bringing biologically active materials, radioactive materials, explosives, tires, or ammunition.

# Landfill in Zellwood area draws interest from residents

The crowd of approximately 64 people at the Northwest Orange County Improvement Association (NOCIA) were divided in their opinions at a public meeting to discuss a request from Mid-Florida C&D (construction and demolition) Landfill at 3602 Golden Gem Road to be modified to a Class III landfill on Thursday.

According to a document from the Orange County Planning Division, the landfill, which currently only accepts construction and demolition materials, would, as a Class III solid waste landfill, be permitted to accept yard trash, construction and demolition, processed tires, asbestos, carpet, cardboard, paper, glass, plastic, furniture other than appli-

ances and materials that are not expected to produce leachate, which experts say poses a threat to public health or the environment.

Jim Golden, of HSA Golden Engineering, said currently the landfill recycles 30 percent of all that it receives and a Class III landfill would recycle approximately 75 percent under state law. He cited geological studies that say the upgrade would not damage the water quality. He also said that additional DEP regulations would require the company to monitor the site closely and would catch the first indications if there were any trouble.

One of the attendees said he thought it would be good to have the upgrade to give Waste Management, currently the only Class III landfill in Northwest Orange County, competition.

"I have asked them to upgrade to a

Class III landfill because Waste Management charges about eight times what they do," he said.

Charles Lee, director of advocacy for Audubon Florida, who was present at the meeting voiced his concern about the impact of a Class III landfill in the proposed area, which is in one of the highest value spring recharge areas previously identified in the Wekiva study effort.

"There will be a hearing before the Orange County Board of Zoning Adjustment and Audubon will be there," Lee said. "We do not think a landfill change would be good for the area and will be asking the Orange County Commission to deny the request."

The plan is available for review in the Planning Division at 201 S. Rosalind Avenue, 2nd Floor, Orlando, 32802.

Apopka and was its first president. He has been a member for 39 years.

Later, from 4-6 p.m., Kit Land Nelson Park will be transformed into a Winter Wonderland for Mayor Land's Tree Lighting Ceremony.

per, varnish, waste oil, pesticides, drain cleaner, solvents, pool cleaners, chemistry sets, auto and furniture polish, photography chemicals, household and auto batteries, flammable liquids, brake fluid, antifreeze, and fluorescent light bulbs. If the label contains the words pesticide, caustic, acid, poison, flammable, warning or danger, take the item tomorrow to the Orange County collection event. If there is no label or the label is illegible write “unknown” on the container and bring it to the event.

Today, let’s talk about edu-

cation in protecting our environment.

Orange County’s Environmental Protection Division is conducting an art contest. The annual competition is the “Pollution Prevention Awareness Calendar Art Contest” and is for high school students. ## Explanation of Amendments 6 and 8

This week, I will provide explanation on the last two Amendments that will be on the ballot on November 6. Amendment No. 6 Prohibition on Public Funding of Abortions and Amendment No. 8 Religious Freedom. Also, remember there is no Amendment No. 7 on the ballot because it was removed by the court. The language was changed and it was reintroduced as Amendment No. 8.

Amendment No. 6 adds to Article I, Section 28 of the State Constitution. It states that public money may not be used to cover abortions or health-benefits that cover abortions. It clearly states that this Amendment does not affect federal requirements stated in the United States Constitution. In addition, it also clarifies that the provisions of Article I, Section 23 of the State Constitution are not to be interpreted in a way that undermines the United States Constitution’s provision as relating to abortions.

Amendment No. 8, if ap-

proved, would make changes to the State Constitution’s Article I, Section 3. The Article currently prohibits the use of state funds to help any church, sect, or religious denomination or in assistance of any sectarian institution.

The Amendment provides that no person or entity be denied governmental support, funding, or benefits and that public money be available to those organizations that were previously excluded.

This Amendment would protect certain very important public services that are currently provided, such as drug treatment, foster care, and prisoner

rehabilitation. The Amendment does, however, state that provisions of the First Amendment to the United States Constitution be upheld.

So, again, a recap on the 2012 Amendments.

\* Amendment No. 1 would prohibit the establishment of rules that demand a person or employer to obtain or provide health care coverage.

\* Amendment No. 2 would extend the homestead property tax exemption to include veterans who were not residents of Florida when they entered the military.

\* Amendment No. 3 would create a new formula on which the state revenue limitation is based; population changes+ inflation.

\* Amendment No. 4 would reduce the limitation on annual assessment of non-homestead properties to 5 percent.

\* Amendment No. 5 would change the procedure in which

DECEMBER 10, 1999 – In the realm of Protestant theology, there are what are known as mainstreamers and fundamentalists. With the latter, the evangelistic statement which follows, contains the ABCs of doctrine, purpose and practice, and the person who said it would, without question, be considered a full-fledged member of what the

media has labeled the “Religious Right.”

“I knew I had been giving my life to the wrong goals. I knew then that I wanted to give my life to Jesus Christ and His service. The choice is simple. It is between the eternal and the passing, between the strong and the weak, between the living challenge and a boring conformity – between Jesus Christ and the world.”

Normally, one would attribute a statement of this sweeping magnitude to someone like the Rev. Billy Graham or the Rev. Pat Robertson. But, how about New York Knicks rookie Bill Bradley in 1968? The statement and details of Bradley’s activities, as a member of the

Fellowship of Christian Athletes, are covered by Paul Sperry in the December issue of *The American Spectator Magazine*. Sperry is the Washington bureau chief of *Investor’s Business Daily*.

Bradley’s life as a witness for Jesus is reported to have begun at Princeton University, endured through his Rhodes scholarship sojourn at Oxford and ended sometime in mid-career with the Knicks. His statement of faith above originally appeared in an evangelizing tract of the American Tract Society. According to the society, his tract sold more than 300,000 copies before going out of print in 1971 and was very effective with athletes and young people.

Since his election as a U.S. Senator (Dem., N.J.) in 1978, Bradley has used his three terms to champion the murder of unborn babies, gain special rights for homosexuals, push the feminist agenda of family demolition and promote every other liberal, radical cause that a backslider would embrace. He has gone from Religious Right to Licentious Left with the speed of an NBA fastbreak.

His Senate partner in crime for a good portion of those years is former Divinity student Al Gore, now Bradley’s opponent for the presidency, as both vie for the Dems’ nomination. In Gore, we see the same tumble from grace to being the defender of partial birth murder and be-

coming the chief apologist for the “First Adulterer” Bill Clinton.

In a *60 Minutes*’ interview of Gore on December 5, Leslie Stahl asked the vice president (how appropriate) if he was “born again.”

“Yes, I am,” responded the former pro-lifer, whose most recent lie to a group of New Hampshire high schoolers is a claim to have been the one to have discovered the contaminated Love Canal in upstate New York some 20 years ago. the legislature can repeal a court rule, it would give the Senate the power to confirm the appointment of a justice of Supreme Court, and it would also allow the Speaker of the House to have access to all files that are necessary in the impeachment of a judge process. \* Amendment No. 6 would prohibit the use of public funds for

any institutions that perform abortions or any health care benefits coverage that cover abortions.

\* Amendment No. 7 There is no Amendment 7 on the ballot!

\* Amendment No. 8 would allow the use of state funds for any church, sect, or religious denomination that provide services that benefit Floridians.

\* Amendment No. 9 would extend the homestead property tax

exemption to include spouses of veterans and first responders who die in the line of duty.

\* Amendment No. 10 would provide an ad valorem tax exemption on tangible personal property if its value is greater than \$25,000 but less than \$50,000.

\* Amendment No. 11 would extend the homestead property tax exemption to include low-income seniors who qualify.

\* Amendment No. 12 would assign the chair of the council of state university student body president to be the student member on the Board of Governors for the university system.

Remember: amendments need to pass with 60 percent of the vote to become a law.

Once more, this is a brief depiction of the Amendments and does not reflect all of the requirements as pertaining to each

section of the Articles of the state Constitution.

# Health Dept. warns of increased risk of encephalitis

There has been increased mosquito-borne disease activity in areas of Orange County, health officials have said.

One sentinel chicken flock, which helps monitor mosquito-borne disease, has had an increase in positive tests for St. Louis encephalitis virus infection.

This means the risk of transmission to humans has been increased.

The Orange County Health Department reminds residents and visitors to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes that may cause encephalitis disease.

Orange County Mosquito Control and the health department continue surveillance and prevention efforts and encourage everyone to take basic precautions to help limit exposure by following the department of health recommendations.

To protect yourself from mosquitoes, you should remember "Drain and Cover":

- \* Drain standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying.
- \* Drain water from garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flow-

er pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected.

\* Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.

\* Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week.

\* Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.

\* Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

\* Cover skin with clothing or repellent.

\* Clothing: Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.

\* Repellent: Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing.

\* Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET(N,N-diethyl-m-toluamide), picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.

\* Use mosquito netting to pro-

tect children younger than 2 months old.

\* Cover doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house.

\* Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

### Tips on repellent Use

\* Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before you apply a repellent. Some repellents are not suitable for children.

\* Products with concentrations of up to 30 percent DEET are generally recommended. Other US Environmental Protection Agency-approved repellents contain Picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or IR3535. These products are generally available at local pharmacies. Look for active ingredients to be listed on the product label.

\* Apply insect repellent to exposed skin, or onto clothing, but not under clothing.

\* In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is age-appropriate. According to the CDC, mosquito repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be

used on children under the age of three years. DEET is not recommended on children younger than two months old.

\* Avoid applying repellents to the hands of children. Adults should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing.

\* If additional protection is necessary, apply a permethrin repellent directly to your clothing. Again, always follow the manufacturer's directions.

The Florida Department of Health continues to conduct statewide surveillance for mosquito borne illnesses, including West Nile virus infections, Eastern equine encephalitis, St. Louis encephalitis, malaria, and dengue.

Residents of Florida are encouraged to report dead birds via the web site for Surveillance of Wild-bird Die-offs located at <http://www.myfwc.com/bird/>.

Orange County residents who want to receive two free trees to plant in their landscapes should register upon arrival and provide proof of Orange County residency (such as driver's license, photo I.D., or utility bill). Orange County/University of Florida IFAS Master Gardener volunteers will be on hand to answer landscape questions.

## Rookie rangers train at Wekiwa Springs State Park

Approximately 53 cadet rangers, from state parks throughout Florida, have been participating in the 73rd "Ranger Academy" this week at the Wekiwa Springs State Park youth camp facility.

The cadets learn everything from the business of state parks to park rules and policies on how to wear their uniform correctly.

"The class, which is usually held twice a year, was split almost equally between men and women," said Amy Conyers, assistant park manager. "Classes are usually 50-60 people. Since 1977, Wekiwa has hosted more than 3,000 Florida State Park Rangers."

The classes range from classroom learning to natural resources, exotic plants and

prescribed fires to field exercises for maintenance and safety.

"Wekiwa Springs Maintenance Mechanic Phil Spychaboer presented a segment on maintenance sensitivity to the Ranger Academy cadets," Conyers said. "He reviewed safety procedures with common tools and explained common repairs in state parks such as broken water lines, campground

electrical boxes without power and stuck commercial toilet flush valves."

Park Manager Warren Poplin talked to the cadets about maintenance sensitivity, and the students formed small groups to think creatively on how to address visitor accessibility requests.

"The Wekiwa River is an incredibly beautiful habitat for thousands of our feathered friends," said Bill Weinaug, president of Wekiwa Island. "The Audubon Center serves as a steward for birds and conservation, with an emphasis on rehabilitation and public education. The Island's goals are focused on sustainability, learning, and the arts."

Weinaug said the similarity in the mission of Wekiwa Island and Audubon makes the new exhibit a natural fit.

Charles Lee, director of advocacy for Florida Audubon, said Audubon is thankful for the partnership with the Weinaugs and their interest in promoting an ecological view of the Wekiwa River. He said the Audubon Center for Birds of Prey is the largest

in the eastern U.S.

"We have approximately 600-700 birds of prey come through the center every year," Lee said. "Forty percent of the birds we receive can be released back into the wild. Some don't survive their injuries and others, that are injured and unable to be released back into the wild, are used in educational exhibits. Every bird we receive has a good life ahead."

Lee said the center has released approximately 350 eagles back into the wild.

"There are more eagles in

this part of the state than there was in all of the U.S. in the 1960s," he said. "Back then, we only had about 500 eagles in the whole country. Today, we have the highest concentration of eagles in the country."

Wekiwa Island is one of the most accessible locations to access the Wekiwa River, Lee said.

"You can have a reasonably quick kayak trip from Wekiwa Island," he said. "Typically, a trip on the river would take four-to-five hours. Here, you have the opportunity to do it in less time and see incredible beauty. It is

The lobby features a brightly tiled coffee bar with lounging chairs and the roof and walls were replaced.

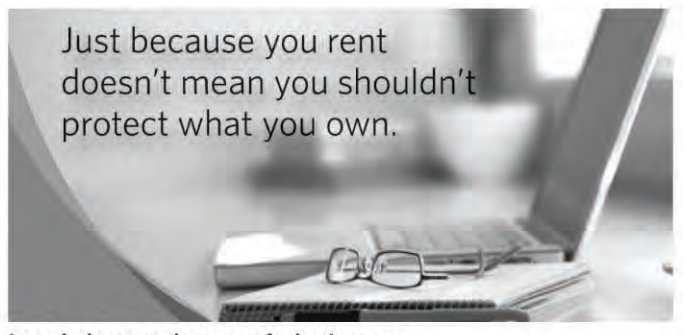
A fully equipped commercial kitchen will be used for social functions.

portance of their park system role as well as how it fits into the broad-based goals of the Florida Park Service," Conyers said. "Their knowledge will create consistency within the park system allowing each park to complement and enhance the stay of our visitors, thus increasing admiration for Florida's natural and cultural resources."

Conyers said approximately 24 million people visit Florida State parks and contribute \$1.16 billion to the local economies.

Florida has 171 managed state parks and 10 state trails, 27 restaurants, 12 horse stables, 84 swimming areas, nine marinas and 100 miles of beaches.

"The maintenance of our more than two million square feet of buildings requires the continuous attention of well-trained park rangers, other staff and volunteers," Conyers said. "The natural resources that cannot speak for themselves are in good hands with our park rangers who actively apply resource management practices in 65 natural communities spanning nearly 800,000 acres which are

home to more than 250 state and federally-listed threatened and endangered species.

"Park rangers also care for more than 2,500 historic sites and eight national landmarks, which include historic buildings, archeological sites and more," Conyers said.

"Seasoned park staff from nearby parks participate in Ranger Academy as instructors and, in addition to teaching, they provide their own stories and experiences to the newer staff," Conyers said. "When the long days of instruction end, the rangers return to the cabins

to relax and share stories around the campfire. Many of us have fond memories of friendships built around the fire."

When the rangers return to their parks and their normal duties, they not only have successfully completed Ranger Academy, but also have a support system of friends in similar positions around the state that they can call on for advice, Conyers said.

over 100 million people. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control has estimated that more than five million Americans have heart failure, with about 670,000 new cases diagnosed each year and hospitalizations on the rise. A National Institute of Health-funded study has found that elderly heart patients have a better quality of life and fewer hospital readmissions when they receive specialized nursing care through their hospital stay and at home following hospital discharge.

## Blue Darters have happy Homecoming with 57-20 victory over North Miami Beach

When the North Miami Beach Chargers visited Roger Williams Field, their 3-2 record was an argument that they were a better team than the 0-5 squad that visited Apopka last year and left with a 50-point loss.

Well, maybe they are, but the 44-point Apopka lead at halftime and the 57-20 victory Friday, October 12, may also prove the Blue Darters (4-2) are a better team this year.

Apopka scored early and often, dominating the first two quarters, then coasting through the second half with its running clock.

"We jumped on them pretty quick. We're usually pretty good when we do that," Apopka head coach Rick Darlington said. "We forced them into being one dimensional."

Even though he didn't score the first touchdown for the Blue Darters (that privilege went to Chandler Cox), Apopka's Jevric Blocker scored five of Apopka's eight touchdowns, three rushing, one on a pass reception, and one on a punt return.

He also had two scores called back due to penalties, one on a kickoff return and another on a pass reception.

It was the 66-yard punt return that ignited the crowd and the Apopka sideline, erasing any chance that North Miami Beach might pull off the victory. It gave the Blue Darters a 22-0 lead late in the first quarter, which Apopka stretched to 29-0 on the first play of the second period.

Apopka never punted in the game, scoring on all seven possessions in the first half, gashing the North Miami Beach defense during the first two quarters.

Defensively, the Blue Darters shut out the Chargers until late in the second period. North Miami Beach's sophomore quarterback Cedrick Wiggins got the attention of Apopka defensive coordinator Jeff Rolson. "We thought he was really good," Rolson said about Wiggins. "We spent a lot of time defending their run game. They (Apopka's defense) did a good job."

However, the two second-half touchdowns concerned Rolson. "Our kids thought the game was over and they (North Miami Beach) weren't ready to quit yet."

After Cox's two-yard run for a score ended Apopka's first drive of 50 yards and

put the Blue Darters ahead for good, Daquon Isom scored the 2-point conversion to give Apopka an 8-0 lead with 8:55 left in the first period. The touchdown was set up quickly on Apopka's first offensive play of the game when quarterback Zack Darlington, playing for the first time in more than a month, hit James Crider for a 47-yard completion to the North Miami Beach 3-yard line.

An interception by Shyeem Covington set up Apopka's next touchdown. He returned it to the North Miami Beach 28-yard line and the Apopka offense again scored quickly when Blocker tallied from one yard out. Brett Wilson kicked this extra point with 6:39 left in the first period to give the Blue Darters a 15-0 lead. Wilson also added the remaining six extra points for Apopka.

The Blue Darters allowed just one first down for the Chargers on the Miami team's next possession and that's when Blocker scooped up the bouncing punt and raced untouched down the Apopka sideline for the 66-yard score with 1:53 remaining in the first period.

## AHS volleyball gears toward postseason

Almost every championship team at some point during the season has to prove they are legitimate and not pretenders. The odds are almost non-existent for any non-football team to go undefeated in high school sports. With more than 20 games, the number of contests alone make the odds to win every one as close to impossible as possible.

Gradually and systematically over the course of the past five years, the Apopka Blue Darters girls volleyball team has moved toward becoming a state power and, starting with its undefeated record, was having its best season ever in every measurable aspect as the toughest stretch of its schedule cropped up. At 14-0 and playing eight consecutive state-ranked teams, it was naive to expect the winning streak to continue. But seven matches were lost. Apopka is now finding out first-hand about attempting to re-establish its game and change the sudden adversity which comes from losing, especially when it is against teams it is supposed to be on par with.

The first three were individual matches against Winter Park, Bishop Moore, and Dr. Phillips. Then, the team participated in the Lake Mary/Bishop Moore Varsity Tournament. Held at Orlando Sports Center last weekend, Apopka

began the tournament with a victory over Jensen Beach. However, standout Denise Belcher rolled her ankle as the team was warming up and the Blue Darters never recovered, losing the final four matches to Boca Raton, Martin County and Clearwater Central Catholic.

For the first time this season, Apopka failed to make the two or three plays which determine a close as possible match, and the result was also the first loss of the season by a 25-23, 26-24, 25-17 score to Winter Park (17-4) on the road. Then, the number one team in the nation, Bishop Moore paid a visit to Joe R. Sterling Gymnasium. Bishop Moore defeated Apopka in three sets, as well, all of which were close, too.

Then, Dr. Phillips survived a power-laden back-and-forth, almost punch-for-counterpunch affair with Apopka. The Blue Darters actually outscored Dr. Phillips by a 93-91 margin for the first four sets. But Apopka was overwhelmed during the fifth set, falling behind early and losing by a 15-5 score. The final tally was 25-23, 22-25, 25-20, 19-25, 15-5.

All the matches during the tournament took only two sets. Tournament matches are two out of three, instead of the usual three-out-of-five format.

"We just didn't play at the high level we

The most pressure-filled and significant games are in the district, because the first and second place teams in each earn berths in the regional rounds of the FHSAA postseason.

## 2012 CHASE CONTENDERS

Chase Chart Following the Bank of America 500 at Charlotte Motor Speedway

- 1. Brad Keselowski 2,214 (finished 11th)**  
Fuel-mileage racing, which had been one of his strong suits throughout his career, worked against him at Charlotte as he had to stop for gas while his closest Chase competitors stretched theirs to the finish. "It's like playing blackjack," he said of mileage racing. "Sometimes you're going to get a good deal, but you're not going to win 'em all."
- 2. Jimmie Johnson -7 (finished third)**  
With four finishes of fourth or better in the five Chase races to date, he's making a strong bid for a sixth Cup title. "We're still not the best car out there at it, but we're making it work week-in and week-out," he said.
- 3. Denny Hamlin -15 (finished second)**  
The five-time winner this year played it conservatively in the closing laps at Charlotte, stretching a tank of fuel to the finish, and now he's headed to four of his best race tracks. "It's finally good to have a fuel mileage race somewhat go our way," he said. "You've got to be prepared for these because they seem happy more often than not."
- 4. Clint Bowyer -28 (finished first)**  
He made gas-mileage racing work for him again and remains in the hunt for the championship in his first year at Michael Waltrip Racing. And it was a milestone victory. "It is my first mile-and-a-half race track win, and it's Charlotte, my worst race track," he said.
- 5. Kasey Kahne -35 (finished eighth)**  
Many figured he'd be battling for the win at Charlotte, where he has three points-paying Cup victories, but he wasn't. Still, he's not completely out of the running for the title.
- 6. Greg Biffle -43 (finished fourth)**  
After setting a track record in qualifying on the pole, he led the race early, but wasn't fast enough to win at the end. "It was too loose all night," he said. "I just didn't want to take big enough swings at it. And then fuel mileage; we are just not in that game to go as far as those cars were going."
- 7. Martin Truex Jr. -49 (finished 10th)**  
He salvaged a top-10 finish after struggling mid-race. "We started out really strong, but lost some track position, and it was so hard to get it back when we were in traffic."
- 8. Tony Stewart -50 (finished 13th)**  
He battled back from as low as 36th after an early race incident damaged the nose of his car. "I was following the 2 car [Brad Keselowski] there, and he had to check up, big time, for whatever was going on in front of him," Stewart said.
- 9. Jeff Gordon -50 (finished 18th)**  
His chances for a fifth Cup title dwindled after he lost a lap due to a penalty for speeding on pit road.
- 10. Kevin Harvick -56 (finished 16th)**  
Handling problems throughout the 500 led to his worst Chase finish so far, and he doesn't have any top-10s to offset it.
- 11. Matt Kenseth -67 (finished 14th)**  
The Talladega winner spun early at Charlotte and never really recovered. "It took us so long to get that lap back, and we never had any cautions to really get caught up," he said.
- 12. Dale Earnhardt Jr. -86 (did not compete)**  
His decision to seek medical help for concussions led to his not being able to compete, and his chances for even a top-10 Chase finish at this point are slim to none.

# To fight another day

## Earnhardt talks about concussion, 'playing hurt'

Concussions in the sports world have pretty much been a football story, until last week when NASCAR's biggest star, Dale Earnhardt Jr., had to get out of his car.

Earnhardt's problems began with a violent wreck during a tire test at Kansas Speedway in August. But he kept it quiet until a seemingly minor impact on the last lap at Talladega Superspeedway triggered more symptoms and led to his seeking medical help for concussions suffered in both incidents.

Missing Saturday's Bank of America 500 at Charlotte Motor Speedway pretty much ended any hope Earnhardt had of winning the Sprint Cup championship, but the driver and those around him all said the most important thing at this point is the driver's health.

And most around him were praising him for having the courage to come forward and admit he was suffering. Earnhardt, throughout his career, has been known for telling the truth no matter the consequences.

"I think that's one thing everybody admires about Dale is how honest and up front he is," Earnhardt's car owner Rick Hendrick said in a press conference at Charlotte. "He cares a lot about the team, his

fans, and the sport in general. "But when he knew that there was something not right, he went to see Dr. [Jerry] Petty, and I admire him. I think a lot of guys would try to play hurt, but when the doctor tells you if you get hit again like right away, it could be catastrophic."

Petty, who has worked for years with NASCAR and its drivers, said the very nature of concussions requires honest answers on the driver's part to get a correct diagnosis.

"Ninety percent of a concussion probably depends on individual information," Petty said. "People around you might notice that you're different. By and large, the history that the patient gives is the thing that tells you that they've had a concussion."

"A concussion can be seeing stars. A concussion can be just being addled for a minute. Any time the brain is not doing what it's supposed to be doing after an acceleration or deceleration, that's a concussion."

But despite the possible consequences of concussions after concussions, drivers tend to try to keep their symptoms from keeping them out of their race cars, especially when there are big trophies to be had.

Earnhardt's teammate Jeff Gordon said he

probably wouldn't take the steps Earnhardt took if there was a championship on the line.

"Honestly, I hate to say this, but no, I wouldn't," he said. "That's why I say we all play a part in this. If I have a thought at the championship, there's two races to go, my head is hurting, and I just came through a wreck, and I am feeling signs of it, but I'm still leading the points, or second in the points, I'm not going to say anything."

"That's the competitor in me, and probably many other guys. And, that's to a fault. That's not the way it should be. It is something that most of us, I think, would do. I think that is what gets a lot of us in trouble."

But Earnhardt's comments reveal that there's a lot at stake, career-wise and otherwise, when a driver has literally rattled his brain in a crash. And sometimes the best decision is the one that seems so hard to make at the time.

"I want to live a healthy life, so I'm going to make sure that I'm doing the right thing, and that's all I felt like I was doing here," Earnhardt said. "I think if I give myself time to get healed up, I can race for as long as I want to race, and that's my objective."

### Smith drives Earnhardt's No. 88

Dale Earnhardt's concussion opened the door for Regan Smith, displaced from the No. 78 Furniture Row Chevrolet, to get in Earnhardt's No. 88 Chevrolet, and Smith made the most of it while the car was running.

He qualified a disappointing 26th, but was second fastest in the Happy Hour practice session. Then in the race he was steadily marching toward the front when a blown engine sent him to the garage at Lap 61.

"I think the important part is that we had a really fast race car," he said. "We had a good first adjustment there, went just a little too far with it and got a little too free. Needed one more stop and I think we would have had it dialed in."

"I'm looking forward to next week. We get three days to test when we get there to Kansas and we will see if we can get the AMP Energy/National Guard Chevrolet up front there."

"I feel confident we will have the same speed we had here."

Smith had planned to drive James Finch's No. 51 Chevrolet at Charlotte, but his move to the No. 88 opened the door for A.J. Allmendinger to make his return to NASCAR after being suspended back in July for failing a drug test. He responded with a 24th-place run despite a late-race penalty on pit road. He's expected to drive the car again this week at Kansas.

Kurt Busch, who had been driving the No. 51, made his first start in the No. 78 Chevrolet that had been driven by Smith. He finished 21st.

"As a competitive racer you always want to go out there and be a contender, but on the other hand when you're starting something new you

need to focus on the big picture, and that big picture is to get primed and ready for the start of the 2013 season," Busch said. "Finishing 21st might not appear that we made progress, but the fact of the matter is that we did in our first three days together at the track."

"But we're also realistic, knowing that there will be more kinks along the way to work out in the final five races of the season."

### Tests set for repaved speedway

Sprint Cup drivers and teams will arrive at Kansas Speedway a day early this week. NASCAR is allowing an extra day of testing because the track has been repaved and slightly reconfigured since the last time the circuit raced there.

Kasey Kahne said he's looking forward to the extra laps to fine tune his No. 5 Chevrolet.

"We don't get a lot of testing these days. So it's nice to go to a race track that you race on, and have the tire that you are using," he said, adding that some of the knowledge gained could apply to other tracks the circuit races on this season.

"You can learn some things for Texas and Homestead, and maybe even a little bit of stuff for Phoenix. So, I think it's a nice test for all the teams to just be a little bit better prepared throughout the rest of the season."

His Hendrick Motorsports teammate Jimmie Johnson agreed that the test will be helpful for this week and for the future.

"I would imagine the Chase guys will really just be focused on this year's stuff and what we need to do there," he said. "It's nice to have data files, as we all know, for our simulations programs and 7-Post machines and all the stuff that we use back at the shop. So, that's good. I really feel more than anything, it's just a safe move and it makes total sense to do it for our sport."

He said that if there is a problem with the tires or the track, it'll come out in time to make a fix before Sunday's race.

"We all get acclimated with the new surface and re-design," he said. "I guess there are some small little changes and things; and validate the tire and validate the track and get everything right so that when we show up Friday, we can put on the show that we need to."

# Cooler weather means fishin' will pick up

Hello Folks,

I was out walking with my wife this mornin' and the cool breeze was great. I don't know about you, but I have been lookin' forward to some cooler weather. When we have cooler weather, the fishin' picks up and bein' on the water durin' this time of the year is great, too. That ol' sun can take it out of ya durin' the summer.

As far as the fishin' goes, folks are tellin' me that the bluegills and the shellcrackers have slowed down in most of the lakes in our area. You can always catch a few in the residential canals under the docks and treetops. You will need some red worms or crickets to catch 'em.

Now that the weather is coolin' down, folks are startin' to fish for specks in their favorite specks lake. Captain Joe was fishin' on Lake Mon-

roe this week and doin' pretty good. Joe was tellin' me that you need to be in at least 10 ft. of water to catch some specks. Joe reports that they caught more than 30 specks on jigs tipped with a minner. The best colors on the jigs were pink, orange, and yellow.

Lake Woodruff off the St. Johns River has been good for specks, too. Most of the specks are bein' caught on minners around the dollar pads. If you want to fish close to home, try

fishin' the Harris Chain. Folks are fishin' for specks in deeper water. A good lake to try has been Lake Carlton. You need to drift across the middle of the lake with jigs tipped with a minner.

You can also catch some specks in Big Lake Harris, and Lake Dora doin' the same thing. Just let the wind move ya across the lake, and keep your jig as close to the bottom as possible. If you catch some specks in a particular area, drift over it again and then drift to the next spot. As the weather cools down, the specks fishin' will get better.

If you can't get on the water, try fishin' off the seawall in Lake Monroe and up at Crow's Bluff area of the river. You can catch a mixed bag of panfish, catfish and some mullet. The bass fishin' has been pretty good early in the mornin' but you have to get on the water

early. Once the sun gets up, the bass are goin' to move to cooler water. They will be lookin' for some shaded areas like pads, and heavy grass. Once the bass move to the shoreline for shade, you will have to flip those areas to catch 'em. You can catch 'em on plastic worms. Good colors to use have been Junebug, and Junebug with a blue tail.

You can also catch some bass in the mouth of the feeder creeks, on Rat-L-Traps, and top-water baits. You can catch some nice bass early in the mornin' or early evenin' on swim-baits. You can use a Gambler Big Easy in those areas. If all else fails, take along a few shiners to fish in those areas, too.

Well, enjoy this cooler weather and I'll see ya next week.

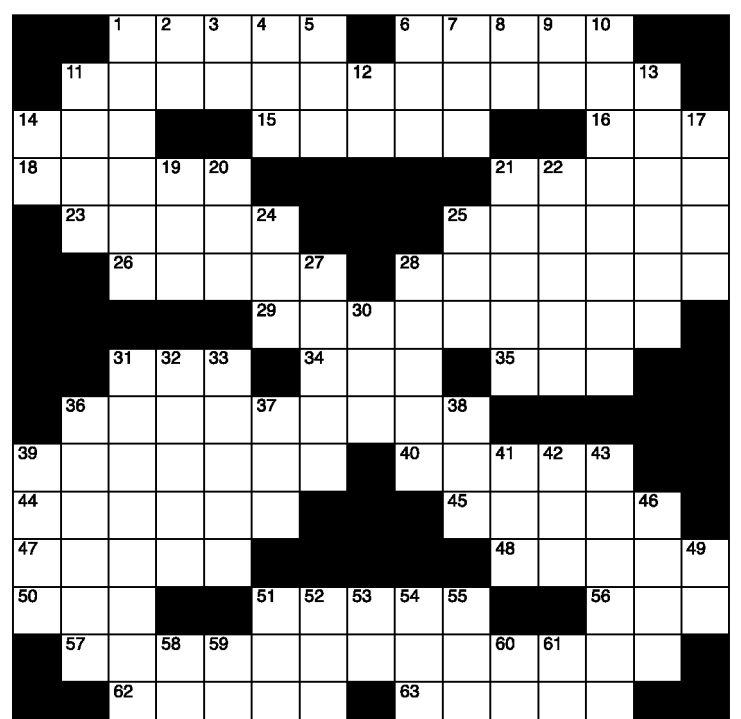

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# Craig Savage commits to Florida Southern, top baseball school



Apopka senior Craig Savage has committed to play baseball at Florida Southern College in Lakeland, one of the top NCAA Division II baseball schools in the country. Now, however, Savage said he is looking forward to a successful senior season for the Blue Darters.

Apopka Blue Darters pitcher Craig Savage will enter his senior season knowing what lies ahead after he receives his Apopka High diploma next June, as he committed last week to attend and play baseball at Florida Southern College in Lakeland.

The Moccasins are one of the top NCAA Division II programs in the nation, having won nine national championships, the most of any Division II school.

"I thought it was the best fit for me," Savage said. "They have a rich program with nine national championships. They also have a young coaching staff. The coaching and program were the main things, along with the education." Savage also cited the competition in the classroom among the Florida Southern baseball players, as the team has a composite 3.5 grade point average.

Next spring while the Blue Darters are facing their opponents during Savage's senior season, the Mocs will be play-

ing their first season under head coach Lance Niekro.

If that last name sounds familiar, it's because he's the son of former major leaguer Joe Niekro and the nephew of Phil Niekro. Both his late father and his uncle were longtime knuckleball pitchers in the major leagues, combining to win 539 games in the major leagues.

Lakeland being only about an hour or so away from Apopka also played into Savage's decision. "I like that it's close to home," he said.

For second-year Apopka head coach Eric Lassiter, having Savage commit to a school with such a rich baseball heritage is a source of pride. "It means a lot," Lassiter said. "As a coach, you are just more proud of him. All the hard work he's been doing the past four years has paid off. This is something that he really deserves."

"They feel that Craig can come in and help them right away," Lassiter said.

Many four-year college coaches look for pitchers from junior college, which Florida

Southern also does, but Savage was the only high school pitcher the Mocs recruited, Lassiter said. "That made me think they really did want me," Savage said. "I will definitely have some kind of role to fill."

But, before he heads to Lakeland, Savage and his five fellow seniors have their final Apopka High baseball season to play.

"Craig is one of our top pitchers," Lassiter said. "I always say we have three or four No. 1 pitchers. If Craig's on, he's by far our No. 1."

Playing in a tough district against teams like Olympia and West Orange, as well as other teams from a tough non-district schedule excites Savage, not only for his senior season at Apopka High, but for his freshman year at Florida Southern. "I think it will get me ready to play against the best," Savage said. "Our district is usually the top district in Central Florida."

"I just hope to put our team in the possible way to win the district. My personal goal is just to win district, but eight (pitching) wins would be nice, too."

## Apopka swimmers look to use Metro meet for future improvement

We moved to Camp Wewa (for practice) with the goal being that our numbers increase. The boys teams saw Dr. Phillips best Olympia, but it was decisive, unlike the girls. The championship was taken with an effort of 559 points. Olympia scored 415 points. Once again, West Orange finished third and was unchallenged as it tallied 299 points. Wekiva was fourth, accumul-

ing 210 points. The only place which was contested was fifth, as Edgewater held off Apopka by a 198.5-195.5 count. Ocoee rounded out the standings.

"We (the coaches) were surprised the girls team finished ahead of Edgewater and Ocoee, but the boys team failed to finish where we should have even though we improved our times in several events," Russell said. "One of our divers was injured and unable to compete. It wasn't the only reason, but we would have had another athlete to score points for us and that is all that is needed when the difference is three."

"The breaststroke was our best event as far as scoring

points and that was something of surprise, too. We also scored well in the 500-meter freestyle." Three Apopka entries earned positions in the top 14 in the boys 100-meter breaststroke. Another three Apopka entries took positions in the top 12 in the boys 500 meter freestyle.

The biggest improvement was turned in by Katie Bryant in the 100-meter backstroke. She decreased her best time by a phenomenal six seconds, scoring a ninth place finish with a time of 1:14.69.

"We went through the regular season with a combined 7-1 record which met our goal of what we need to do during

the regular season for it to be another springboard for 2013," Russell said. "Of course, four meets is a modest sampling to analyze how this year prepares us for next 2013. It is not the only stat or accomplishment in itself, but there is something to be said about when it is one as a part of the whole picture. Now we will get ready for water polo, which is the next step for the springboard."

The boys compiled an undefeated 4-0 record. The girls won three of their four meets.

The final meet of the season is the District 3A-2 championship meet, being held at Lake Brantley on Saturday, October 27.

## AHS golfers placed fourth at conference meet, fifth in district

That means they have expectations to play better, which is so important to moving forward and light years ahead of where we were five years ago."

As expected, the championship was battled between Dr. Phillips and Olympia. The two waged a back-and-forth struggle with Dr. Phillips emerging the victor by the narrow margin of two strokes. The final score was 288-290.

Also, as expected, West Orange contended and stayed in range of taking the championship, but in the end was not quite good enough as it fell by 11 strokes.

South Lake comfortably earned fourth with a round of 338 strokes. The 358 strokes it took Apopka to shoot 18 holes was next in the standings. Apopka held off East Ridge by three strokes to take fifth. The rest of the standings were Edgewater, Ocoee, and Freedom. Cypress Creek, Oak Ridge and Wekiva did not record team scores. The scores are compiled in the Metro Conference and district meets with four golfers playing 18 holes.

Lucas Parrett of Dr. Phillips

claimed the individual championship with a round of 68. Alex Merriman (Olympia), William Wrigley (West Orange), Ben Huizinga (Dr. Phillips), Matt Chamberlain (Olympia) and Kyle Tate (West Orange) followed in the standings with scores between 69 and 71.

The individual qualifiers for the Region 2A-3 championship were Derrek Drozdyk of South Lake with a round of 74 (ninth), Mike Cecelia of East Ridge as he took 78 shots to transverse the 18 holes, and Mahindra Lutchman of Ocoee who shot 79.

"It was a season of moving forward, but there is also something to be gained from it if we are going to continue to move forward and we need to assess what happened at the district championship," Cary said. "Basically, we didn't have a good score because of our putting. We have worked so hard to improve it this season and we have. However, the greens were still wet when we began because of the morning dew, but as the day went on, they dried out. We didn't compensate for the change in conditions."

"If we are going to take the next step, we need to be more aware of the need to compensate. The teams we are trying to get into the same league with understand that. If we had really good putters, it wouldn't have mattered that the conditions changed. But we don't. We can't afford to keep doing what we would in normal condi-

tions. The teams we are trying to get to the same level with have golfers who aren't that far ahead of us, but they compensate and minimize the strokes. That is the difference. They can grind when they have to."

The Blue Darters' average for the season was 166 for nine holes. Doubling that score for 18 holes, the team should have shot 332, which is 26 below what it did.

And each individual was well above his average. Each individual Apopka golfer compiled averages below 45 this season. But those games did not show up at the district meet. Blake Donahue shot a round of 86 as did Ben Hall. An 89 was put in by Austin Gillis. Josh Hutchinson and Austin Brana compiled scores of 97 and 100, respectively.

"However, we have a team of character and that will be important for next year," Cary said. "We ended the season well below what we thought our potential was. They were not happy with the results of the district championship and we will take it into the summer program. We will be continuing what we have been doing the last few years and the results will be huge motivation to use the off-season to work on what we need to. We will also start practice two weeks before the first day of classes next year."

"The character of this team is strong enough to want to do it. So it can get better and it has the bad taste

about the district championship. It doesn't want it to happen again. What we accomplished this year was because of that same character."

This year, the Blue Darters set school records for lowest average score per nine holes, lowest individual average, the most rounds under 40 strokes, and the lowest score for a single meet.

Donahue's average was 39.5. He lowered it from 46 last season. He also had the most rounds under 40 strokes for nine holes. The team shot eight rounds under 40, and also shot rounds of 155 strokes twice.

"The score of 155 pretty much puts a team on the map as far as it being relevant among the traditional powers," Cary said. "We got attention this year from doing it not once, but twice. Doug Matthews was also significant in us having the season we have had. He helped the golfers who weren't in the starting lineup. He took them to the meets, He encouraged them. We are grateful for what he has brought to the team. We have a core of eight golfers and he was the reason the non starters are good enough to be a part of the core."

"We look forward to him being a part of the team next year and continuing to work with golfers, especially the ones who will be the future of the program."

Matthews was the team's assistant coach this year.

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# Enjoy some good cake-baking times with these tasty recipes

*Kitchen Kapers* reader Mary Agnes Wright recently sent a letter about an early-days community cookbook titled **Stewpot Favorites of Zellwood**.



**Kitchen Kapers**

That cookbook, she pointed out, was published a very long time before Zellwood United Methodist Church's 1990 **Cooking With Friends** and its 1995 follow-up, **Cooking With Friends II**, both frequently featured here.

The **Stewpot Favorites of Zellwood** vintage cookbook "tells the history of the women's circles, its organization and names of officers, etc.," she wrote.

The cookbook's publication date was June 13, 1922!

"You should get a copy," she wrote.

Indeed we certainly should do that, if possible, and we would greatly appreciate it if any reader who happens to have that now ninety years old cookbook or knows where it might still be found will help us make a copy of it. We would like to include its recipes in *Kitchen Kapers* and learn from it what local folks were cooking, serving and eating here back in the very early twentieth century. The year 1922 certainly seems like a grand time to have been alive and creating a community cookbook, just one year before now-near-centenarian *The Apopka Chief* began publishing.

While we try to locate a copy (or copy-of-a-copy) of that ninety years old cookbook so we can feature its recipes in future *Kitchen Kapers*, readers helping us with the search can celebrate just our learning about the existence of this early local cookbook by baking a celebration cake from the recipes below.

All these recipes are from the Friendship Circle of Zellwood United Methodist Church's 1990 and 1995 **Cooking With Friends** cookbooks. Enjoy some good cake-baking times while we search for and hope to find somewhere soon a surviving copy of this very vintage and very special Zellwood cookbook, so we can pass on to readers recipes from it in future *Kitchen Kapers*.

## HAZEL BRANTON'S TENNESSEE PECAN CAKE

**2 cups butter (or margarine)**  
**2 cups unbroken pecans**  
**6 eggs**

**4 cups flour, not sifted**  
**1-1/2 teaspoons baking powder**  
**2 cups sugar**  
**2 ounces lemon extract**  
**1/2 to 1 pound white raisins**

Cream the butter and sugar together. Add well-beaten eggs. Add lemon extract, flour and baking powder sifted together, and mix in the nuts. Blend well. Pour into greased pan. Bake in tube pan for two hours and five minutes at 275 degrees.

## KATHY ESTER'S HOT FUDGE SUNDAE CAKE

**1 cup flour**  
**3/4 cup sugar**  
**2 teaspoons cocoa**  
**2 teaspoons baking powder**  
**1/4 teaspoon salt**  
**1/2 cup milk**  
**2 tablespoons vegetable oil**  
**1 teaspoon vanilla**  
**1 cup chopped nuts**  
**1 cup brown sugar**  
**1/4 cup cocoa**  
**1-3/4 cup hottest tap water**  
**Ice cream**

Mix flour, sugar, 2 teaspoons cocoa, baking powder and salt. Add milk, oil and vanilla. Stir until smooth. Add nuts. Spread onto ungreased 9 x 9 x 2-inch pan. Sprinkle with the brown sugar and 1/4 cup cocoa. Pour the hot water over batter. Bake for forty minutes in 350-degree oven. While warm, spoon into dessert dishes and top with ice cream. Spoon the sauce from pan into each serving.

## HORTENSE PARKER'S CARROT FRUITCAKE

**1 1/2 cups chopped nuts**  
**1 cup chopped mixed candied fruit**  
**1 cup chopped dates**  
**1 cup raisins**  
**3 cups all-purpose flour, divided**  
**2 cups sugar**  
**1 1/2 cups vegetable oil**  
**4 eggs**  
**2 teaspoons baking powder**  
**2 teaspoons baking soda**  
**2 teaspoons ground cinnamon**  
**1 teaspoon salt**  
**3 cups finely shredded carrots**  
**Confectioners sugar icing (optional)**

Combine nuts, fruit, dates and raisins with 1/2 cup flour; set aside. In a large mixing bowl, combine sugar and oil; mix well. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Combine baking powder,

baking soda, cinnamon, salt and remaining flour; gradually add to sugar mixture, beating until smooth. (Batter will be stiff.) Fold in carrots and fruit mixture. Spoon into a greased and floured 10-inch tube pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour and 20 minutes or until cake tests done. Cool for 15 minutes before removing from pan to cool on a wire rack. If desired, drizzle with confectioners sugar icing when cooled. Makes 12 to 16 servings.

## KAY BRANTON'S CARROT SHEET CAKE

**4 eggs**  
**2 cups sugar**  
**2 jars baby carrots (add last)**  
**1 1/2 cups oil**  
**2 cups flour**  
**2 teaspoons soda**  
**3 teaspoons cinnamon**  
**Frosting:**  
**1 (8 ounce) cream cheese**  
**1 box confectioners sugar**  
**1/2 cup oil**  
**1 teaspoon vanilla**

**Small amount of milk to thin as needed**  
Cake: Cream eggs, oil and sugar well. Add dry ingredients. Add remainder of ingredients; blend well. Add baby food last. Pour into greased and floured sheet cake pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

Frosting: Combine frosting ingredients, adding a small amount of milk, if needed, to thin. Spread on cooled sheet cake.

## HILDEGARD GRINNELL'S GERMAN APPLE CAKE

**3 cups all-purpose flour**  
**3 teaspoons baking powder**  
**1 teaspoon salt**  
**4 eggs**  
**2 cups sugar**  
**1 cup vegetable oil**  
**1/2 cup orange juice**  
**2-1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract**  
**4 cups thinly sliced apples, peeled**  
**2 teaspoons ground cinnamon**  
**3 tablespoons sugar**  
**Confectioner's sugar (optional)**

Combine the first three ingredients; set aside. In separate large mixing bowl, beat eggs and sugar together. Combine the oil and orange juice; add this mixture, alternately with dry ingredients, to the egg and sugar mixture. Mix until batter is smooth and then add the vanilla and beat well.

Pour half of the batter into a greased and floured tube pan. Arrange half the ap-

ples over the batter. Combine cinnamon and sugar; sprinkle half over the apples. Top with remaining batter, apples and cinnamon-sugar. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour and ten minutes or until cake tests done. Allow cake to cool for one hour before removing from pan. Cool cake, apple side up, on a wire rack. Sprinkle top with confectioner's sugar.

## BETH HOLDER'S WHITE CHOCOLATE CHEESE CAKE

**1-1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs**  
**1/4 cup ground pecans**  
**1/4 cup butter, melted**  
**1 pound white chocolate**  
**2 (8 ounces each) packages cream cheese**  
**1/2 cup sour cream**  
**3 eggs**  
**1 teaspoon vanilla**

Combine and blend first three ingredients. Press into bottom and sides of 9-inch spring-form pan. Bake at 375 degrees for eight minutes. Cool.

Place white chocolate in top of double boiler. Bring water to boil. Reduce heat to low. Cook until chocolate melts, stirring. Let cool.

In large bowl, combine cream cheese and sour cream. Add eggs, one at a time. Add vanilla and white chocolate, stirring until blended. Pour into prepared pan. Bake at 300 degrees for 50 minutes. Turn oven off and partially open oven door and leave cake in oven for thirty minutes. Cool on wire rack and then chill. Garnish as desired.

## CLAIRE ELLINGTON'S PINEAPPLE SHEET CAKE

**2 cups sugar**  
**2 cups flour**  
**1 cup crushed pineapple and juice**  
**2 beaten eggs**  
**1 cup nuts, chopped**  
**2 teaspoons soda**  
**Pinch of salt**

Mix all ingredients together well. Pour into a greased 8 x 16-inch sheet pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Frost with cream cheese frosting.

### Cream Cheese Frosting:

**1 stick oleo (soft)**  
**1 (8 ounce) cream cheese (soft)**  
**1 box powdered sugar**  
**1 teaspoon vanilla**

Cream oleo and cream cheese together. Add powdered sugar and vanilla. Mix well and spread on cake while warm.

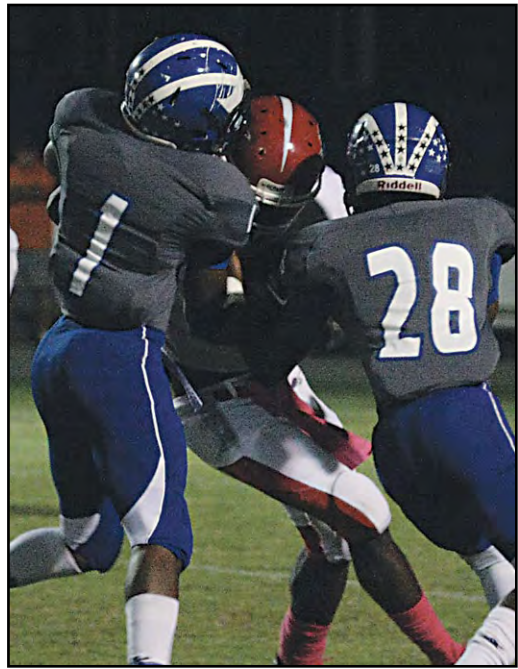

A three-and-out forced by the Apopka defense and a short punt gave the Darters the ball on the NMB 35-yard line. Then, on the first play of the second period, Darlington hit Blocker with a swing pass at the 15 and he outran the Chargers to the end zone, upping Apopka's lead to 29-0 just seven seconds into the second quarter.

Another short punt by the Chargers set the Darters up at the 45 of North Miami Beach and Apopka quickly moved inside the 10-yard line. However, soon found itself facing a fourth-and-goal from the 3. Not to worry, as Blocker barreled in from there with 7:10 remaining in the second period.

That gave Apopka a 36-0 lead and a fumble caused by Rakeem Smith and recovered by Ben Bascom set up the Darters' next score. The Apopka offense quickly moved the 65 yards with Blocker once again scoring, this time on a nine-yard run with 1:51 left before halftime.

But, that was just the first of three touchdowns in the fi-

nal two minutes of the second quarter.

North Miami Beach found its groove quickly, driving 65 yards in just three plays, scoring when Wiggins hit Leroy Parker for a 29-yard score. The 2-point conversion failed and the Darters led 43-6 with 1:29 left in the period.

Apopka apparently scored on the first play following the kickoff, but another screen pass to Blocker gained a net of 20 when his touchdown reception was nullified by a penalty. Apopka did score, however, when Darlington found a huge hole up the middle, running it in from 16 yards out with 30 seconds remaining in the first half. Wilson's extra point was Apopka's 50th of the night.

The Darters' starters remained in for the first possession of the third period with the running clock in effect and Apopka drove 67 yards for the score. Darlington punched it in on an eight-yard run to give the Darters a 57-6 lead.

North Miami Beach punched it in twice more, but it mattered little to the final outcome.

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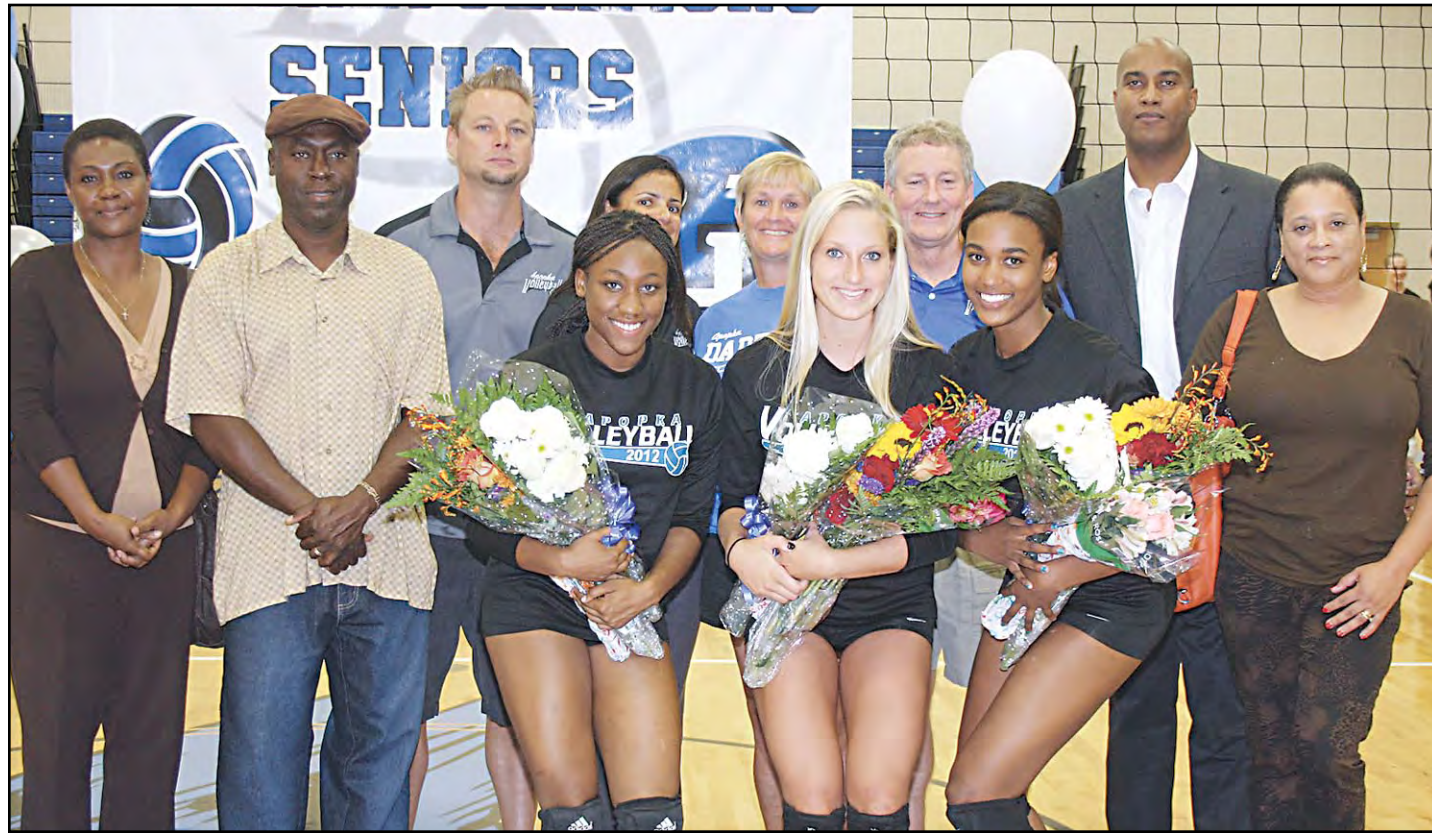

need to win in a tournament like the Lake Mary/Bishop Moore tournament," Apopka coach Jamie Lillethorup said. "We played above average, but we needed to play at a championship level during the tournament. We played at that high level in spurts, but it just wasn't there consistently. Our serve-receive game broke down. We weren't able to pass and when a team can't pass, it gets out of system. We just made too many errors. Some of it was our youth. We had several points where the entire lineup was freshmen and sophomores. Some of it was Denise being out.

"But we lost a lot of points because of errors we shouldn't have made, errors we haven't made all season. We weren't focused on prevent-

ing the things which lead to breakdowns and getting out of system. Obviously, we need to change that before the playoffs start. We can't do anything about Denise getting hurt. We shouldn't be making the mistakes we did with Denise in or out of the lineup."

Fortunately for Apopka, the injury was much less serious than it originally appeared to be. If it had been a situation in which the team needed Belcher to play, she would have. However, with the team playing in a measuring-stick tournament, the coaching staff decided it was more important to shut her down so her relatively minor injury, which needed just a couple of days of rest to heal, wouldn't become a major one.

She returned to the lineup on Monday, October 15, as the team cel-

ebrated Senior Night and rebounded with an impressive and decisive 25-22, 25-17, 25-21 victory over Lyman. Belcher tallied 10 digs in the victory. Deja Griffith also accounted for another 10 digs. The setter, Kacie Miller, chipped in with 6 kills.

That Senior Night victory was followed by a second consecutive victory, 13-25, 25-22, 25-21, 18-25, 15-12 victory Tuesday, October 16, over Lake Brantley. Belcher totaled 22 kills.

The regular season ended with a second matchup against Bishop Moore Thursday, October 18, past press time.

The District 8A-3 tournament takes place next week. As the tournament's number one seed, Apopka will play the winner of the Ocoee vs. Wekiva game Wednesday, October 24,

at West Orange High. With a win, as one of the two finalists, Apopka will earn a berth in the regional round of the FHSAA's postseason tournament for the second consecutive year.

Despite the 1-7 stretch, the Blue Darters still appear to be a much stronger team than last year and Apopka has far less holes in its game which playoff teams take advantage of in the postseason.

Most importantly, a win puts Apopka in the position to win its first district championship. The finals are scheduled for Thursday, October 25, at West Orange.

"Nonetheless, it was a good experience," Lillethorup said. "The team continued to play hard and that is important for our freshmen and sophomores to understand. That is the first step. We set the schedule up for us to

go into the playoffs after playing the most difficult part of our schedule and against a level of play equal to what we will see in the playoffs. Championship teams have a hardened skin. That hardened skin is developed by playing other championship contenders to prepare them for the postseason and for adverse conditions.

"We are going through that adversity. But we are a team still with expectations of a long playoff run. We are still the number one seed for the district championship tournament and were second in the Metro Conference. We defeated the same kind of opponent as the ones we lost to win the district and finish second in the conference. We obviously have to work on some areas of our game, but we are still in a good place to meet those expectations."

failed to do, we still have an opportunity to do something in the district. Of course, it won't be easy, but we did show against Boone we can defeat top teams. We still have three district games in front of us, but if we play like we did against the (George Jenkins) Eagles, it won't matter is what we are emphasizing this week."

The Mustangs came into the game against Ocoee after a 35-14 loss to the Eagles on Homecoming. The loss was particularly disappointing because it appeared the Mustangs had put themselves in the position of salvaging its season with a victory over the Boone Braves in which its power rushing attack gelled into a relentless assault which pounded the opponent over and over again.

It was short-lived as against George Jenkins the laundry list of mistakes, errors and gaffes for the fifth time out of six games this season reared its ugly head. Once again, it rendered the game plan moot and subsequently, the possibility of its play having effectiveness against the opponent never existed during the loss.

"Despite the rough start, we can still have an opportunity to contend for the playoffs and that is what is important as we play Ocoee and then Olympia," Parker said. "Historically, we have been a strong-second-half-of-the-season program. So we do feel some confidence based on the precedence. It starts with Ocoee and it must

continue against Olympia. But, just because previous teams have been second-half teams doesn't mean it will happen. We, as in this team, have to make the changes which have been the difference."

If Wekiva defeated Ocoee, its record is 1-1 in the district, which keeps it mathematically alive for the playoffs and accomplishes the first half of what it needs to at this point of the season, but to use an old cliché, the proof in the pudding will be next week when Olympia is the opponent.

The Mustangs have never beaten the Titans. Nor have the Titans ever failed to win at least seven games during the Mustangs' existence.

This season that will change as Olympia is 3-4 as of press time, six days before the game.

However, make no mistake about the record. It is not a reflection of a team on the descent. Under coach Bob Head, the Titans are still the power they have been in the past and are still capable of a long postseason run. Its record is the product of it playing the most difficult schedule or at least it is the only team in Central Florida to face a schedule in which everyone of its first seven opponents were ranked in the top 10. And even with a losing record, the Titans are still highly regarded to the point they are ranked (as of press time).

While the record is a reflection of a gauntlet of a schedule, what really matters is two of the three wins are against Class 8A District 4 opponents.

With a 2-0 record in district play, Olympia is still the beast of the district. It has defeated Apopka and West Orange by a combined 79-48 score. Its other victory was an impressive 38-23 non-district one against Edgewater to open the regular season. Its victories have been an average of 15.33 points, just over two touchdowns.

In those wins, the Titans have put up monster offensive statistics. In its opener, quarterback Deondre Francis threw for 350 yards as he completed 17-of-20 passes. It was his first varsity start.

Against the Blue Darters, the Titans rambled over the defense as it gained over 400 rushing yards. The Olympia offense also gained over 400 total yards against the Warriors.

Its losses have been to the state's top-ranked Dr. Phillips (7-0), Freedom (5-1, fifth in Central Florida rankings), Timber Creek (6-0, second in area rankings), and Lake Brantley (6-1, sixth in area rankings).

Those losses have been by an average of 17.25 points and three of the four have been by at least two touchdowns. In those games, the defense has been gashed to the tune of giving up at least 350 total yards, including Timber Creek's Jacques Patrick gaining 277 rushing yards.

The Titans should also be smarting when they play the Mustangs next week, because they come off a loss to the Patriots for the second consecutive year. That has become a big rivalry because both teams are perennially

ranked teams expected to earn postseason berths. It is a clash for bragging rights among the best of the best.

Francis did not play in that game. In his stead, freshman Kailan Strickland made the start. He was intercepted three times during the first half and Lake Brantley took a 21-7 halftime lead. Lake Brantley did the most damage to Olympia's defense, pummeling it for 458 yards.

Head coach for eight years now, Head has transformed the Titans into a power and perennial postseason team with a full-throttle, full-speed-ahead offense which uses speed and athleticism to pass the ball voraciously. It uses the spread offense to make the relentless attacking of the passing assault possible.

However, the I-formation and multiple pro-formations using two tight ends are used as a change of pace to the defense.

In order to make the philosophy successful, a trigger-man is needed. And Olympia has relied on its quarterback for such to varying degrees. The result is Olympia has produced a line of Division I quarterbacks, starting with Trevor Siemian. He has quarterbacked Northwestern to a 6-1 record this season.

Although the quarterback responsibilities as the triggerman have varied since Siemian's days at the helm, it has continued to some degree as Francis is the latest. However, his status as of press time, six days before the game takes place, is undecided.

But, nonetheless, the Titans are more than capable of making up the loss because of running back John Armstrong.

When the final gun sounded to end last season's game against Wekiva, Olympia had decisively won by a score of 42-14 as a host of Wekiva mistakes were taken advantage of with lightning-quick speed and with overwhelming disastrous outcomes.

Wide receiver Mike Macon, running back Dexter Williams and Alex Gomez (Jr., 5-11, 170) are the other skill-position talent. Shawn Curtis (Sr., 6-5, 270) is the Titans' leader of the offensive line.

"They have the talent and speed and Armstrong is their go-to-guy when all else fails," Parker said. "They have the skill positions covered. But they also have the physical offensive line which allows the skill positions to use their skills and to where it is most dangerous in open field. We play a style which emphasizes ball control and it is simply a football fundamental to keep the opponents offense off the field. However, like Dr. Phillips, it is even more so against Olympia. The best offense is a good defense is particularly true and we need to focus on it against Olympia. They can score so quickly and they did last year.

"The only way for a team to give itself a chance to defeat Olympia is to keep its offense off the field. The longer it is off the field the less likely it can make the big play, which has to be limited."

ing for the district championship. Our two best swimmers were challenged very little during the regular season. So to be competing against other swimmers of the same caliber gave them that challenge. Most of the season, they were well ahead of the field. At the Metro Conference, they were swimming side by side with the other swimmers.

"But for the team in general, it is important because they were competing against other swimmers and teams who are of the same caliber as far as the skill level. At the district, the swimmers and teams who are the closest with their skill level are grouped together. It gives them some experience competing against that kind of competition and swimmers for the district. However, finishing fourth is a major step for us."

Only a sophomore, Lauren Smith earned third place in the diving competition, scoring 156.2 points for the Mustangs. She missed qualifying for the Region 3A-1 championship meet last season by less than three points. She was followed in the standings by

Destani Heyer. The 10 points earned by the Mustangs for the diving competition are the most ever in its history. This was Tabitha Cooker's first year as the Mustangs' diving coach.

Sarah Brown took third in the 100-meter butterfly and sixth in the 100-meter freestyle.

Another sophomore, Madison Dewey, gave Wekiva a 1-2 punch in the 100-meter butterfly with a fifth place finish and added an eighth in the breaststroke.

After setting the goal of 6:30 in the 500-meter freestyle during her freshman year, Blair Ballin achieved it with a time of 6:28.13 and earned seventh place in that event. She is now a senior.

"The Metro Conference championship meet was also important for our future, because 19 athletes are graduating this year, which means the younger swimmers will be the core of future teams," Sharpe said. "It will be a big loss. But with the younger athletes competing and even earning points positions, they will be in a position to take over the roles the seniors are in this year.

"We won't be an automatic vic-

tory (for other teams). We will still be competitive and teams will have to bring their better game to defeat us. Doing what we did at this year's Metro Conference is where and how it starts."

The boys team put on its best performance of the season, as well. After almost all of its team graduated last year and with almost all of its top athletes being varsity rookies in 2012, Wekiva wasn't supposed to mount much of a challenge to get out of the cellar. But it went far above that, notching fourth place at the conference meet. With this year's effort, Wekiva has now earned fourth place in back-to-back seasons for the first time in its history.

"Considering how many new swimmers were on the roster at the beginning of the season, to place fourth at the Metro Conference championship was a surprise at the time," Mustangs boys coach Kara Charboneau said. "But they have developed quickly and have swum at a high level for rookies. That is coupled with the returners stepping up and putting in their best times of the season at the biggest meet. We set several personal bests

this season and a couple of school records."

"We are very pleased and satisfied with what happened at the conference championships. It was one of those results which really feels special because it wasn't expected when the season started."

The boys teams saw Dr. Phillips best Olympia and it was decisive, unlike the girls. The championship was taken with an effort of 559 points. Olympia scored 415 points. Once again, West Orange finished third and was unchallenged as it tallied 299 points. Wekiva was fourth, accumulating 210 points. The only place which was contested was fifth. Edgewater held off Apopka by a 198.5-195.5 count. Ocoee rounded out the standings.

"We lost to Edgewater and Apopka in dual meets by only a few points, less than five both times," Charboneau said. "So finishing fourth again wasn't the only reason we were satisfied. Defeating Edgewater and Apopka this time was also very satisfying and special to us."

The Mustangs' boys divers were also strong, earning three of the top

five positions. Dalton Ballin, Alex Vickers and Jacob Ferguson earned second, third, and fifth, respectively. The 18 points accumulated by the Wekiva divers were also a school record.

Robert Leavitt set the school record in the 500 freestyle with a time of 5:48.04 and took fifth in the process. Other points were scored by Noah Brown finishing sixth in the 100-meter backstroke and Dalton Ballin crossing the finish line in eighth in the 100-meter backstroke.

"The situation for what we got out of the conference championships is the same for the boys as it is for the girls," Charboneau said. "It was an opportunity for us to get some experience competing against the same level of competition. We will be competing against the Seminole schools which are just as strong if not stronger than the teams in the Metro Conference. Back-to-back fourth places are also self-esteem boosters."

The District 3A-2 championship meet will take place Saturday, October 27, at Lake Brantley High School.

# Apopka Raptors spin their magic against Kissimmee Kowboys

Osceola High School probably doesn't look like an old, wild west town, but Saturday, October 13, the football field was the stage for a youth football shootout between the Apopka Raptors and the Kissimmee Kowboys.

With the regular season quickly approaching its end and the playoffs right around the corner, each game becomes more critical in the race to the playoffs. The Raptors Flag squad entered their day of games against the Kowboys with a record of 6-0, and a number one spot in the conference. The Raptors took the lead first with an early touchdown to go up 6-0, but before the half, the Kowboys came back to score a touchdown of their own to tie the game up at 6-6. In the second half, the Raptors extended their lead with touchdown runs by Antwone Robinson, and Antrevion Robinson, to put Apopka in the lead once and for all to give them the victory 19-6. The win secured a playoff spot and top seed for the Apopka flag squad.

The undefeated Mitey Mite Raptors (6-0) also held the top spot in the conference and were up next in the duel with the Kowboys. As they have done all season, the Raptors stuck first. Elijah Green broke free for a 70-yard touchdown run to give Apopka the early lead. The Kowboys had no answer for Apopka's offensive performance and were unable to generate anything on their side of the ball when they did have possession. Green would eventually go on to score two more times, one for 40 yards, and a

third touchdown run for nine yards. Jaiden Gordon received a perfect pass from Green and took the ball 45 yards for another Apopka touchdown. The Raptors defeated the Kowboys 26-0, and also secured themselves a spot in the playoffs.

The Pee Wee Raptors, also undefeated at 6-0 entering into the weekend's games, took the field next. Both the Raptors and the Kowboys boasted perfect records, but that would have to end for one of the two teams. Most of the first half was a hard-fought battle that seemed to stay between the 45-yard lines of the field, as neither team could gain any significant advantage, going three-and-out for most of their possessions. However, with just seconds remaining before the half, Elijah Augstin broke free on a run up the middle for 35 yards to give Apopka the lead. Cory Odell followed up the run with a successful kick for two points to send the Raptors into halftime with an 8-0 lead. The second half remained a battle with both teams trying to put points on the board. The Kowboys eventually found themselves stuck deep in Raptor territory with the goal line looming behind them. A Raptor blitz caught the Kowboys off guard and they were caught in the end zone for a safety. Time ran out on Kissimmee and Apopka would go on to win 10-0, remaining undefeated at 7-0 and a spot in the playoffs.

The Jr. Varsity squad has had its struggles this season and came into Kissimmee needing a win to stay in the race for playoff consideration.

Apopka went into halftime leading 28-6. The Kowboys managed two more scores in the second half but these were met with a reception for a touchdown by Terrence Moore, and a quarterback sneak by Cameron Stewart to give the Raptors the win 40-16. The JV squad managed to keep their playoff hopes alive as they enter the final week of the regular season.

The Varsity Raptors took

After several tense moments of the officials conferring on the call, the final indication was given that the ball had missed the upright and was no good, the Raptors found themselves down 8-6. The Raptor defense stopped the Kowboys on the next possession, and Apopka got the ball back with less than two minutes remaining in the game. Kelvin Lewis, for Apopka, broke free on a 45-yard run that went deep into Kowboy

territory before he was eventually forced out of bounds. With less than a minute left on the clock Celella found his way into the end zone for a second time on a quarterback sneak to give the Raptors the lead 12-8. The extra point kick attempt was blocked by the Kowboys and Apopka kicked the ball off to Kissimmee with 35 seconds remaining on the clock. An interception by Apopka on a final pass attempt by the Kowboys finally let the Apopka fans breathe a sigh of relief and allowed the Raptors to pull off the 12-8 victory.

# Median price of homes in Central Florida jumps 11 percent

The median price of Orlando homes sold in September jumped 11.11 percent to \$125,000, spurred by a significant increase in the number of traditional transactions and the higher prices generated by that sales type.

Orlando's median price has now posted positive year-to-year gains for 14 consecutive months.

In addition, the median price increased 3.91 percent over the August 2012 median price of \$120,300.

All sales types experienced year-to-year increases in median price in September. The median price of normal sales increased 6.67 percent, while the median price of foreclosures increased 4.32 percent and short sales increased 1.01 percent.

## Completed Sales

Members of the Orlando Regional Realtor Association participated in 2,258 home sales that closed in September 2012, a slight increase of 0.67 percent compared to September 2011 and a 16.43 percent decrease compared to August 2012.

"There is no doubt that our dip in sales is caused by a lack

of inventory and not by a lack of buyers," said ORRA Chairman Stephen Baker, Re/Max Central Realty. "The demand is there."

Compared to September 2011, the number of short sales decreased 21.07 percent and foreclosures decreased 6.63 percent. The number of completed traditional sales, however, jumped a whopping 25.84 percent compared to last year.

Homes of all types spent an average of 84 days on the market before coming under contract in September 2012, and the average home sold for 95.80 percent of its listing price. In September 2011 those numbers were 102 days and 93.88 percent, respectively.

The average interest rate paid by Orlando homebuyers in September, 3.58 percent, set yet another record as lowest average interest rate since ORRA began tracking the statistic in 1989. A year ago, homebuyers paid an average interest rate of 4.19 percent.

## Pending Sales

Pending sales – those under contract and awaiting closing – are currently at 9,268. The number of pending sales in September 2012 is 1.08 percent

lower than it was in September 2011 (9,369) and 1.00 percent lower than it was in August 2012 (9,362).

Short sales, which take much longer to process from contract to close, made up 69.49 percent of pending sales in September 2012. Normal properties accounted for 19.80 percent of pendings, while bank-owned properties accounted for 10.71 percent.

## Inventory

The number of existing homes (all types combined) available for purchase in Orlando is continuing a steady decline that began back in July 2010 at 16,563 and now rests at 8,073.

In September 2012, inventory was 18.71 percent less than it was in September 2011.

The inventory of single-family homes is down by 22.86 percent when compared to September of 2011, while condo inventory has increased by 9.82 percent.

The month-of-supply increased in September when compared to last month: Current inventory combined with the current pace of sales equates to a 3.58-month supply of homes in Orlando (there was

a 3.01-month supply in August 2012).

## Affordability

This month's increase in median price has led to a decrease in Orlando's affordability index: The September index of 251.05 percent is three points higher than August 2012's index of 254.09 percent. (An affordability index of 99 percent means that buyers earning the state-reported median income are 1 percent short of the income necessary to purchase a median-priced home. Conversely, an affordability index that is over 100 means that median-income earners make more than is necessary to qualify for a median-priced home.)

Buyers who earn the reported median income of \$54,644 can qualify to purchase one of 4,719 homes in Orange and Seminole counties currently listed in the local multiple listing service for \$313,810 or less.

First-time homebuyer affordability in September decreased to 178.52 percent from last month's 180.69 percent. First-time buyers who earn the reported median income of \$37,158 can qualify to purchase one of the 3,393 homes

in Orange and Seminole counties currently listed in the local multiple listing service for \$189,681 or less.

## Condos and Town Homes/ Duplexes/Villas

The sales of condos in the Orlando area increased by 4.78 percent in September when compared to September of 2011 (351 to 335).

The most (109) condos in a single price category that changed hands in September were yet again in the \$1 - \$50,000 price range and accounted for 31.05 percent of all condo sales.

Orlando homebuyers purchased 196 duplexes, town homes, and villas in September 2012, which is an 18.67 percent decrease compared to September 2011. Most (27) fell within the \$120,000 - \$140,000 price range.

## MSA Numbers

Sales of existing homes within the entire Orlando MSA (Lake, Orange, Osceola, and Seminole counties) in September were down by 3.58 percent when compared to September of 2011. Throughout the MSA, 2,670 homes were sold in September 2012 compared with

2,769 in September 2011. To date, sales are down 2.14 percent for all counties combined.

Each individual county's monthly sales comparisons are as follows: Lake: 3.72 percent above September 2011 (362 homes sold in September 2012 compared to 349 in September 2011); Orange: 4.37 percent below September 2011 (1,378 homes sold in September 2012 compared to 1,441 in September 2011); Osceola: 16.01 percent below September 2011 (404 homes sold in September 2012 compared to 481 in September 2011); and Seminole: 5.62 percent above September 2011 (526 sold in September 2012 compared to 498 in September 2011).

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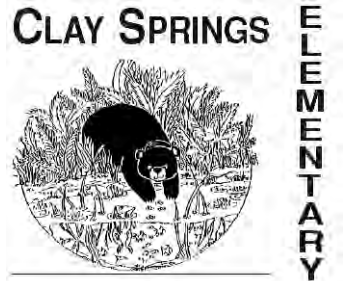

## October is a very busy month for local students

#### Pre-K

Insects and Spiders: Not-So-Creepy Crawlers is our theme this month. This theme will look at both insects and spiders in an effort to help the children understand how they are alike and how they are different. We are reading lots of bug books including many from author Eric Carle and are making our own bugs to hang up in our classroom. We have started our letter of the week and have many creative hands-on, music and movement and finger play activities to help learn letters and beginning letter sounds. Reading is something we do every day in Pre-K and to encourage reading at home, the children, with the help of their parents record all titles on Busy B.E.A.R. (Be Excited About Reading) log. Halloween is approaching and we have some hallowing fun activities planned!

#### Kindergarten

Kindergarten students at Clay Springs Elementary have been very busy this past month. We have been learning all about our five senses and doing science experiments to investigate the senses. We have studied about various community helpers, including firefighters. During the beginning of the month, we took a walking field trip to visit our local fire station #27. We learned about the different types of vehicles and equipment they need to do their job. At the end of the trip we pretended to be firefighters and used the hose to put out a "fire." Does your family have a fire plan? Do you know your meeting place? How many smoke detectors do you have in your home? These are some of the important questions your child can discuss with you.

#### First grade

This fall has brought a whirlwind of learning for our 1st graders. In reading, The Daily Five (Read to Self, Read to Someone, Listen to Reading, Word Work, and Work on Writing) is in full swing with all components introduced and practiced daily. The students have been building their reading stamina and are able to sit and read for 20 minutes independently! We have been reading a lot of non-fiction books about spiders and bats and are currently working on the difference between facts and opinions. In writing, we have focused on the author's purpose, discussed how to pick a writing topic, and have been working on punctuation. Our writers are becoming very creative!

In math, we have been working on using drawings and manipulatives to solve math word problems. We continue to work on addition and subtraction facts as well. In addition to this, students are learning how to measure with non-standard units such as candy corn and tell time to the hour and half hour.

In science, we are studying objects in the sky and gravity. Our social studies activities have included learning about goods and services. The firefighters will be coming to do

a fire safety presentation this month. We also learned about Christopher Columbus and his exploring adventures.

#### Second grade

We've been very busy examining and testing soils in science! Did you know that soil is made up of organic and inorganic matter? In social studies we've just finished our study of the United States government, USA landmarks, USA symbols, and the rights and responsibilities of being a citizen in the USA. Did you know that Uncle Sam originated in the War of 1812? U.S. was printed on food barrels sent to the Army. The name appeared in a book in 1816. Read more about him to see when he became a national symbol.

We saw a great play at the Repertory Theatre called "The Paper Bag Princess." It was really funny. We're looking forward to going to the ballet, and having the Birds of Prey come to our school in the next few weeks.

#### Third grade

Third graders at Clay Springs are enhancing their reading skills during "Brain Power." They are learning important skills to empower them to be better readers. In social studies, they are discovering where they are located in the world and exploring the United States and its regions. In reading, Houghton Mifflin is taking our third grade readers on a voyage through "Realism and Fantasy."

The children had an adventure exploring the Downtown Regional History Center. All students had a blast actually making tasty butter. While learning about World War II, they had a grand time dressing up in clothes of the 40s. The children witnessed the grandeur of the original 1927 courtroom. They were judge, jury, and witnesses in the case of the Three Little Bears. You should have seen their faces when they were at the bottom of a sinkhole looking up at houses falling in on them.

Students will be participating in a school wide mock Presidential Election on Nov. 1. This will allow them to experience what an election is about and the importance of a single vote.

#### Fourth grade

We concluded our study of Florida's early land and people by making salt dough maps of Florida. A special thanks to Papa John's Pizza located at 1716 S. Orange Blossom Trail for donating the pizza boxes for the project.

In math, we are continuing to learn and use properties of multiplication. We are finishing Theme 1: Journeys in reading. Science finds us finishing up

our unit on matter. We are now learning about magnets.

Students will begin learning the writing process as we introduce narrative and expository essays.

#### Fifth grade

October is proving to be a very busy month for the fifth graders at Clay Springs Elementary.

We have been enjoying our unit on Matter in Science. Students have been able to explore volume, temperature, density, mass, physical changes, and chemical changes with hands-on experiments. Ask your children the definitions for all those words. We have also been making tree maps and flow maps to go along with the concepts we are studying.

Recently we were able to meet with Mrs. Eagles in preparation for visiting Wekiwa State Park on October 30th. She showed us pictures and items to look for in the Xeric area, Mesic Area, and Hydric Area. We followed up the discussion with a trip on our own sand hill identifying many plants and animals we will see in the park. We have had some visitors to our Sand Hill lately. Ask your child what they have discovered.

In math, students are working on long division. Knowing their multiplication tables is very helpful. We have been dividing two, three, and four-digit numbers by one digit. We will be moving on soon to dividing by two-digit divisors. Students are able to access the math web site where lesson tutorials, videos, and games are available.

We would all like to thank Wekiwa High School for allowing us to attend their Homecoming parade. Our students enjoyed the parade and look forward to being Wekiwa "Mustangs" in the future.

#### PE4KIDS

The Physical Education Department at Clay Springs Elementary promoted the International Walk Your Child to School Day on Wednesday, October 3. The children learned how to be a safe pedestrian in their Physical Education classes. The third, fourth and fifth graders helped promote this event by making posters that were displayed around campus and creating skits and chants and presenting them on morning announcements. Florida Safe Routes to School delivered lots of giveaways, and we had a volunteer from Bike/Walk Central Florida on campus the day of the event. The walk was a huge success with over 500 participants.

The next big event will be our Country Western Day to be held on Friday, November 16. The students will learn several line dances in PE class, and family and friends are invited to

participate in this event.

#### Construction Information:

##### Vick Road Project

Project: State Road 451 (formerly SR 429 from US 441 to SR 414) is being extended by the Orlando-Orange County Expressway Authority across Old Dixie Highway to connect with Vick Road. The new extension will improve access to nearby communities and schools as well as connectivity to the Orlando area and the attractions. Estimated date of project start is January 2013.

Once complete, the south end of Vick Road will be four lanes from Old Dixie Highway to Ashworth Overlook Drive realigned and widened. Nearly 3,000 feet of Old Dixie Highway will be widened and resurfaced; two new retention ponds will be in the southwest area of Vick Road and Old Dixie Highway; an upgraded traffic signal will be installed at Vick Road and Old Dixie Highway; and six-foot-wide sidewalks and bike lanes will be along the extension. The SR 451 extension will not be tolled.

This work is part of the SR 429/SR 414 realignment initiative. As a part of that initiative, the portion of SR 429 from SR 414 to US 441 was redesignated SR 451. SR 429 has been extended north and west and will ultimately tie into the Wekiwa Parkway, which will complete the beltway around metro Orlando.

Once complete, it will be easier to travel between SR 429 and SR 414, it will accommodate future growth in west Orange County and provide improved access to I-4, the attractions and other major business centers. There will be night and weekend work on this project. Motorists should be alert for possible lane closures on all of the roadways within the project area during daytime and nighttime operations. Lane closures will not take place during school drop-off and pick-up times while school is in session. During construction, nearby residents and other property owners may experience some noise, vibration and dust. The Expressway Authority will take steps to minimize the impact of construction to the surrounding community to the extent possible. The work is expected to take approximately six months and to be completed in the summer of 2013. The estimated project cost of construction is \$2.5 million.

## Second grade

Second grade is learning some fabulous things this month!! In reading, we are finishing up working on main idea and identifying beginning, middle, and end of a story. Now we are starting story structure and sequencing of events. We are also learning how to write in

complete sentences and add details to our paragraphs.

In math, we have been focusing on addition and subtraction with two digit numbers and will start working with money at the end of this month. Help your child at home by having them count your loose change!

In Science, we are finishing our unit on the Earth. We studied about the different types of soil, land formations, and life cycles of plants. In Social Studies, we have learned why it is important to have rules and procedures in a society. Soon, we will begin discussing and learning about the election and voting process.

A very special event happened for second grade this month. We were ecstatic to be able to attend the Hansel and Gretel ballet at the Bob Carr, on Tuesday, October 16. This was a great learning opportunity for our students!

## Third grade

Third Graders are becoming great scientists. We are learning about the three states of matter. We know that everything is made of matter and how matter can be physically or chemically changed. In Social Studies, we know the difference between primary and secondary sources and how to read maps. In math, we are adding and subtracting with regrouping and learning how to make graphs so that we can graph our Halloween goodies. Reading is a breeze when we practice every day to identify the title, characters, setting, problem and solution. We are soaring to the top in third grade!

## Fourth grade

Fourth grade students at Dream Lake Elementary are working steadfastly in all subject areas! We've learned how to plan and write narrative essays using strong descriptive language in order to paint a picture for the reader. Our next practice writing test is Thursday, November 1.

Parents can assist teachers by ensuring that their child is reading a book on their level for at least 20 minutes daily. Some reading skills we've practiced in class include sequencing, cause/effect, and using context clues to determine the meaning of unknown words. We're becoming quite the mathematicians as we reinforce our multiplication skills and as we learn how to multiply two- and three-digit numbers by one number. All students must know their facts for memory.

Report card conferences will be held during the week of Monday, October 29, and parents are strongly encouraged to check their child's grades on Progress Book on a weekly basis. We are looking forward to our St. Augustine field trip in April, so if parents are interested in chaperoning, please be sure to contact your child's teacher for an application. Students will learn to estimate, measure, count, and weigh. Classes will also compare and contrast various fall vegetables. We are looking forward to a fun day of learning!

As this first nine weeks comes to an end, our first graders are well into weekly homework assignments, spelling words and sight word practice. Developing good study habits now will help to ensure academic success in the future.

## Second grade

Cooler weather and autumn have arrived just in time to complement our reading of nature and outdoor activities. Our science experiments are also providing an opportunity for our second grade students to explore various forms of nature; (i.e., rocks, soil, natural resources, weather, water cycle). These opportunities allow students to physically understand the author's purpose in a variety of realistic fiction, non-fiction and poetry selections that we are reading.

In social studies, we are also learning about our Earth, map skills, different communities and our government.

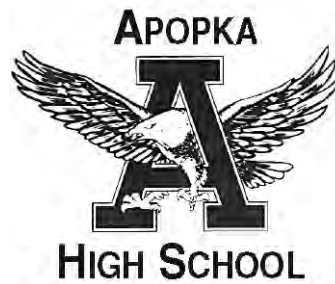
