Pre-natal care returns to Bartow

BARTOW - On Monday, Adam Putnam told a crowd of about 60 people why he decided to make his home in Bartow, though he spends most of his time

in the state capital in Tallahassee. "I am proud of our community for paving the values. This is a logical extension of faith in action," he said at the grand opening of Options for Women

at the Church Service Center. "That's why we're raising our family here. The profound effect on people's lives is incalculable, and Options for Women will change their lives for the better." Putnam was a guest

speaker at the opening of the clinic in Bartow that gives at-risk pregnant women a place for pre-natal care for free. Three days a week - Tuesday through Thursday - personnel will be on hand in a

full-service office to care for pregnant women who cannot afford care at a more convenient location than they've had in decades. The clinic will be able to serve residents in Bartow, Fort Meade,

Alturas and other nearby areas, where previously they would have to go to Lakeland for care. The clinic will be open from 9:30 a.m.-2 p.m., the hours the Church

Some justice, ongoing pain for Frostproof Fire Chief

BARTOW - The man who shot and killed the son of Frostproof Fire Chief Clifford Cofer pled to second degree murder Jan. 26 and was sentenced to 40 years in prison.

On Aug. 3, 2016, 33-year-old Caleb Justin McKinney received a call from his ex-girlfriend saying she was on the

way over to his house to drop off some medicine for their son. The ex reportedly told McKinney that her new boyfriend was in the car with her.

Court documents state that is when McKinney grabbed his Glock .40 caliber pistol, racked a

round into the chamber and stuffed it in his shorts. When she pulled up with her boyfriend in the front passenger seat and their five-year-old son directly behind the new boyfriend, McKinney approached the car and fired multiple rounds through the front windshield and into the front passenger seat.

Identity theft of four cars

WINTER HAVEN - Let this be a reminder to protect all of your sensitive information.

Police are on the lookout for a Haines City woman who reportedly helped her mother use fake information on credit applications in an attempt to steal three cars from Winter Haven Honda last week.

Norma Cedendo Castro, 48 of 717 Garnette Ave. in Haines City, was arrested Jan. 30 and charged with conspiracy to commit

fraud over \$50,000 and three counts of possession of identification of another person without consent. She was released on \$8,000 bail the following day and ordered to appear in court March 8.

According to her arrest affidavit, Castro, who does not speak or write English, had her daughter inquire about purchasing two vehicles valued at more than

\$100,000 for use as Uber taxis. Dealership staff copied both driver's licenses and then the daughter, 23-year-old Keisha Nichole Garcia-Castro, reportedly started to complete the credit application using the date of birth and social security number of a person whose name was similar to hers, but who lived in New York

FEMA releases safe build guidelines

Drive around Polk County, and you might see that some people are literally still rebuilding after Hurricane Irma came through in September.

For some, the wait has been insurance and FEMA.

According to the city of Winter Haven, folks are beginning to take care of those tattered roofs.

Of the hurricane related permits, according to Alicia Hughes, permitting specialist, "the majority are re-roof."

"We normally average about 60 re-roofs per month, and after the hurricane, we're averaging about 150 per month. Unfortunately, our system does not let us keep

hurricane related permits separate, and therefore no way to track them," she says.

And the city was grateful it spent a little extra money when they built the new firehouse to a Category 3 Hurricane rating.

Irma did not miff it, which is good. "The glass is impact resistant as it relates to a category 3 storm, as well as the roof structure. One thing we do have is the generator that will operate entire complex, including the Emergency Operations Center," said Fire Chief Chris Humphrey.

For others in the city not so fortunate, there are some things that might be helpful in the rebuilding process.

FEMA released guidelines this week to help

people in the rebuild or repair of their home.

According to a press release, while it may be challenging to rebuild, using "smart techniques" can help "minimize damage from flooding and wind and give you peace of mind about the safety of your home or business."

One example, FEMA says, is to use "flood smart" building techniques.

Water heaters, furnaces, and other items such as washers and dryers should be placed on pressure treated wood or masonry so that they sit at least 12 inches above the floor level.

Backflow preventers and check valves can be installed to plumbing to make sure waste water and sewage flow out of

your house.

Having floor drains and standpipes can also keep flood water or waste water from collecting in your home, says FEMA.

A sump pump with a battery or water-powered backup system can be installed.

And one thing some may not know is it is good to install all electrical panel boxes, circuit breakers, wall switches and outlets at least "one foot above the base flood elevation for your area."

Non-corrosive metal bindings can be installed to help keep indoor or outdoor fuel tanks from floating away in a flood.

Seal all ceiling or foundation cracks with waterproof sealant.

"Flood waters can flow through even the smallest

cracks and will quickly turn cracks into gaping holes," says FEMA.

Gutters need to have wire mesh guards to keep debris out. Otherwise that debris can create a clog that forms pockets of standing water on your roof.

Winds are another thing that come with hurricanes, as well as with Florida's strong thunderstorms.

Trailers and manufactured homes are at risk for extreme damage.

Here are a few tips FEMA gives for those:

- Install hurricane straps made from galvanized steel. They attach to trusses and wall plates.
- Install hurricane shutters.
- Retrofit gable end walls to eliminate wall failures in high winds.

• Strengthen the structural frames with load-path connectors.

• Install a safe room.

• Reinforce garage doors.

• Inspect and retrofit roofs to adequate standards to provide wind resistance.

• Secure all outside items that could become missiles in a strong wind event.

And that is where the permits come in. Anyone who builds or rebuilds needs to check and see if a permit is needed.

Call local code officials also to make sure you meet floodplain management requirements. For more information about rebuilding or repairing after a disaster, visit Mitigation Ideas: A Resource for Reducing Risk to Natural Hazards.

You can help improve Florida's Constitution

Few Polk Countians, we suspect, remember the role that Polk played in the drafting and ratification of Florida's present Constitution.

Chesterfield Smith, a Bartow lawyer who was managing partner in the law firm of Holland and Knight, was chairman of the Constitution Revision Commission that wrote the 1968 Constitution.

One of the nation's most prominent lawyers, Chesterfield (despite his prominence, he was most frequently referred to in his hometown by his first name) helped found the Holland and Knight law firm and served as president of both The Florida Bar and the American Bar Association.

In a 1980 letter to this newspaper (and doubtless to all other papers in the state), Chesterfield argued passionately for preservation of a key provision of the 1968 Constitution, the requirement for appointment of a Constitution Revision Commission every 20 years to consider what amendments, if any, should be submitted to the voters.

He called that provision "the most important thing in this modern Constitution." He said it gave Floridians "forevermore the power to amend and revise the Constitution in the future without the interference of the legislature, or without the interference or the veto of the Chief Executive."

His strident defense of that provision was prompted

by an attempt by the Legislature to convince voters to amend the Constitution to eliminate the appointment of an independent Constitution Revision Commission to propose improvements in Florida's blueprint for government.

The voters bought Chesterfield's arguments and rejected the amendment.

Fast forward to 2018, and it is time for the next Constitution Revision Commission to consider amendments to the 1968 Constitution.

And that, fellow citizen, is where you come in.

You have the opportunity to propose amendments to Florida's Constitution without mounting a multi-million dollar petition drive.

All you have to do is to make a recommendation to the Constitution Revision Commission.

The current Constitutional revision process began on March 20, 2017, and the CRC must submit its recommendations to the Secretary of State by May 10 of this year.

The voters will decide whether to approve or reject the recommended amendments in the November general election.

Circuit Judge John Stargel, a member of the CRC, outlined the process at January's Lunch 'n Learn program at the Polk County History Center.

He emphasized that public input is genuinely solicited.

Public hearings are scheduled in Melbourne (Feb. 19), Jacksonville (Feb. 20), Pensacola (Feb. 27), and St. Petersburg (March 13).

Input also can be made by mail or on the agency's web site.

One of the issues under consideration by the CRC is Florida's Government in the Sunshine Law, arguably the best open government statute in the nation.

Every time the Legislature meets, efforts are made to whittle away at it. One issue now before the CRC would allow two members of an elective body to meet in secret, which is strictly prohibited by the present law.

We view this proposed loophole as coming under the "little bit pregnant" concept: in this case, that a little bit of secrecy is okay. We could not disagree more. In government, there is no such thing as "a little bit of secrecy."

Once the doors are closed on the making of public policy, there is no way of ensuring that the secrecy does not lead to the chicanery often associated with government outside of the sunshine.

And that is our input into the process.



Less trust, fewer thefts, smarter locks

A bill introduced in the Legislature this session would make it a second degree misdemeanor (\$500 or 60 days in jail) to leave your car parked with the keys in the ignition.

Proponents say it would reduce auto thefts.

Opponents say it would punish you for having your car stolen.

Both viewpoints are valid.

I doubt that the proposal has much of a chance of passage.

But it did put my few remaining memory cells into gear, reminding me of The Way Things Used To Be.

I am 77 years old, which means that I was a little kid back in the 1940s.

In those days, you left your home unlocked. To do otherwise (at least in a small town like Bartow) would have been an insult to your neighbors.

What if a neighbor needed to borrow a cup of sugar for a recipe and found your door locked?

I can remember the day we discovered that a neighborhood kid (we were pretty sure who it was) had gone into our unlocked home and stolen what little cash

was there, including a coffee can in which I kept my spare change.

We were more disappointed in the violation of our family's trust than we were angry at our nominal loss. And from that day forward, we kept our doors locked.

Auto theft, though infrequent, was simple.

My parents had a 1951 Chevrolet. You could start it without a key by simply holding a half-dollar coin behind the ignition, bridging the gap between the two poles of the switch, then pushing the starter button. No key was necessary.

Advances in engineering and the disappearance of the half-dollar coin eliminated this simple way of starting a

car without a key.

As motorists became more cautious, they began locking their car doors.

Sometimes without remembering to remove the keys.

In the days when car door locks had "mushroom cap" lock posts, it was simple to bend a piece of wire (such as a coat hanger) and slip it past the rubber gasket between the door and the frame, snag the mushroom cap with the wire, and unlock the door.

It was not a matter of stealing a car; it was a way to help a friend (or a stranger) who had absent-mindedly slammed the car door with the keys inside.

I used to keep a coat hanger in my car for just such a purpose.

Fast forward a half-century or so.

Mary has a brand new candy apple red car with, among other features, a moon roof. It has a key, but you don't have to use it, because it also has a wireless electronic key fob.

When you get within arm's length of the car, the front door automatically unlocks. You don't have to take the key out of your pocket.

After you get into the driver's seat, fasten your seatbelt, and put your foot on the brake pedal, you start the car by pushing a button, somewhat like Dad's 1951 Chevrolet, while your key is still in your pocket. As far as I know, you can't substitute a half dollar — even if you could find one — for the key fob.

When you get out of the car, the door automatically locks itself as you walk away . . . unless you walk back too close or touch the car in some particularly sensitive spot. Then it unlocks itself.

I love Mary's new car, but just between you and me, I think it's haunted.

(S. L. Frisbie is retired. His most memorable moment helping a motorist get into a locked car occurred many years ago at the Tampa International Airport parking lot. A frantic woman told him she had locked her keys in the car and left the engine running. S. L. was without his trusty coat hanger, but walked around the car looking for another solution. "I think I can help," he told her. While the front door on the passenger side was locked, she had left the window down.)

Big 1956 Grand Opening for Northgate Shopping Center

February 27 will mark the 62th Anniversary of the opening of Winter Haven's venerable Northgate Shopping Center. The center, one of the first in Florida, featured the "winged" Publix architecture – their style of the era and mid-century modern arches at either end of the complex. The grand opening festivities lasted a month and culminated with quite a grand prize!

As reported in the News Chief: "A Lake Shipp Heights housewife, mother of two young boys, was the winner of a 1956 Ford automobile given away by Publix Markets as the climax to its month-long grand opening [of Northgate]." Gil Jones, manager of the Northgate Publix, presented the keys to Mrs. Rose Kelsey. She had not been present when the drawing was held but the entire Kelsey family including husband Eddie and sons Larry and Wayne came to watch Mrs. Kelsey drive away in the blue and white four-door sedan. The Ford was one of twenty-four prizes awarded. Other prizes included "Elsie the Borden Cow" dolls and skillets.

According to the bill of sale, the new Ford retailed for \$2200.

We are grateful to the Kelsey family and Beth Knighten for sharing this information and photograph.

Special Publix fact: The history of this great company includes the fact that founder George Jenkins took the name for his new venture from a chain of movie theatres. The photograph included with this column is taken from a 1931 Winter Haven Herald. The advertisement clearly identifies Lakeland's historic Polk Theatre as a "Publix Theatre." (The Winter Haven Herald was a weekly newspaper published by George and Josephine Burr.)

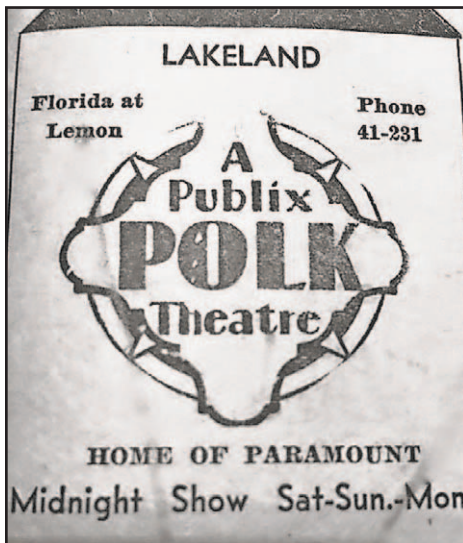

Inmate work saves tax dollars

Thomas Edison said, "There is no substitute for hard work." One of our most popular Sheriff's Office programs brings that quote to life. Our weekend and weekday jail inmates have done a great job over the years helping to keep our county clean. There is value in work. The men and women who served time in the program paying their debt to society should take pride in knowing they didn't just sit in jail for their punishment. The best possible result of this program is that the inmates learn their lesson and don't come back.

What is the Polk County Jail Inmate Work Program? It is an alternative sentencing program that allows judges to sentence inmates to work instead of sentencing them to jail. The inmates pick up trash along roadways, clean up parks, schools (on weekends or non-school days), and public facilities, and work for the county and cities on a variety of projects. The program allows inmates who have been found to have committed relatively minor crimes to pay their debt to society while controlling the numbers of inmates in jail that taxpayers have to pay for. Inmates can work during the week or on the weekend. A benefit to the program is that it allows those who have violated the law who have jobs to

keep them, thereby allowing them to continue to support their families and pay restitution.

Here are just a few examples of what has been accomplished last year through inmate work in 2017: Weekend and Weekday prisoners collected 106,047 bags of trash, removed 6,839 discarded tires, and cleaned 3,193 miles of roadway last year.

Inmates regularly mow, trim, and clean up county owned property and parks, including the county's jails and a number of county government facilities. This reduces ongoing maintenance costs. The inmates go to schools on weekends, when there are no children present to complete major landscaping projects, maintenance, and clean-ups. All of Polk County's municipalities regularly receive inmates to perform work in city parks and city government

complexes. And, of course, inmates spend tens of thousands of hours every year walking along Polk County roadways, picking up trash and discarded junk.

A total of 252,148 hours were worked in the weekday program and in the weekend program. That represents an approximate value to the taxpayers of

\$2,080,221! In addition, the inmates themselves pay to participate in the program, funding the cost of the program.

This is a great program that provides value for the taxpayer and accountability for those who break the law. We must all work together to keep Polk County a safer and more beautiful place to live.

probably Stuart Avenue.

Libation Station is a music stage with a few craft beer bars surrounding it, normally located between Stuart and Park near First Street. This year, the music starts Friday night with the Small Town Girls hitting the stage at 7 p.m., Almost There at 8:15 p.m. and the Josh Blevins Band, the headline act Friday, plays from around

10 p.m. to midnight.

scheduled to play until around 11 p.m.

For the kids, Saturday will feature a Kids Corral where the little ones can make their own Mardi Gras masks and Trina's Trains will be giving kids rides downtown. There will also be face painting, carnival games and lots of different food truck vendors.

King of Carnival this year is Lake Wales Mayor Eugene Fultz.

For those who have never experienced a Mardi Gras in New Orleans or Rio, Mardi

Gras is most popular in cities with a large population of Catholics. Catholics observe Lent, a period of around 40 days where believers prepare themselves for Easter by making personal sacrifices like giving up meat or alcohol to replicate the sacrifices that Jesus made in the days leading up to his Resurrection, according to the Bible.

In New Orleans, there are around 50 krewes or secret groups of people who organize each of the 50 or so parades in the weeks leading up to Fat

Tuesday.

In Lake Wales, the krewes put together a float in the one parade. Last year, there were around a dozen krewes who participated.

Mardi Gras literally means Fat Tuesday in English, the day before the Catholic observance of Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent.

In addition to the parade and music over the weekend, there will be a Fat Tuesday party at Al's Place on Scenic Highway Feb. 13 between 7 and 11 p.m.

In layman's terms, for many, Mardi Gras was a time to drink and eat as much as possible so that by the time Lent hit, you didn't want another drink until after Easter.

The celebration began in Lake Wales in 1984 when Vinton Davis, the former owner of a popular New Orleans style restaurant in downtown Lake Wales, passed away and family wanted to honor his life. Since Davis loved Mardi Gras, they organized the first parade and it kept growing over time.

Service Center is open.

This is the first time pre-natal care has returned to this area of Polk County since 2007 when the Bartow Regional Medical Center ended that care.

The services at Options for Women include pregnancy testing, ultrasound exams and STD testing. Additionally, Options provides free women's wellness exams for women older than 18 without insurance or Medicaid. The wellness program provides women the opportunity to have a free screening at Options for Women, and if eligible, will then provide them with a voucher for a free visit with a local OB/GYN.

"This is so awesome," Options for Women Executive Director Marilyn Paul said. "We are truly blessed. This came from me called out of nowhere to do this."

Paul said more than a year ago she contacted Rob Kincart, the president and owner of A-C-T Environmental, to see if there was anything the clinic can do to help people in Bartow.

"I left a message for Rob Kincart, and he introduced me to Brian Hinton, and he introduced me to Rusty Music, and then the ball started rolling."

With Kincart's history of helping when he can in Bartow, he told her Hinton, who is the treasurer of the Church Service Center, could

possibly help. With the mission of the Church Service Center, Hinton believed this would be a good service to the community.

"The next day I went to the Options for Women (office in Lakeland) and I said 'we're going to Bartow,'" Paul said.

Options for Women not only helps those in need, it also counsels women who may be in fear of having a baby she didn't plan for and possibly being a single mother. The advocate also can set up patients with insurance or Medicaid, Paul said.

Paul shared statistics on the service Options offers many women. In 2016, Options for Women served 325 patients, with 303 positive pregnancy tests, with 378 ultrasounds performed in its Lakeland office. The staff also performed 199 STD tests. She said there have been a handful of patients from the Bartow area who have gone to the Lakeland office, but with many who are

without reliable transportation, she feels there has to be a better way to reach them.

So with Music jumping in to help provide this service, he transformed two rooms in the CSC. Through donations, an examination table and ultrasound machine was added. Donations, Paul said, that would have cost the clinic \$35,000 if they had to buy them. A second room was converted into an office for consultation. Along with that, the Church Service Center has taken donations for mothers of newborns of diapers, food and blankets for months, which Rusty said, can only help the endeavor.

"This mission (by the Church Service Center) of saving people has been going on for more than 50 years," Putnam said. "It means we're taking the next step of Faith in Action. Our commitment to life continues and women have to know they have choices to make sure

they have everything they need."

Then there is the most important part: patients,

According to reports, McKinney then turned and pointed the gun at his ex, saying she ruined his life and deserved to die. The ex told deputies that McKinney then walked into his back yard holding the Glock to his head and telling the ex that she had to watch him kill himself.

The ex managed to grab her two young

children, including the one who was directly behind her new boyfriend in the car, and fled the scene.

McKinney then barricaded himself in his house, and eventually deputies were able to arrest him.

Court documents state McKinney admitted he was aware that his five-year-old son was in the car with the man he shot.

Clifford Cofer Jr. was 30 at the time he was murdered.

state.

The two ladies left the dealership with both cars. The following day, the sales person texted the mother asking how the cars were doing. The mother reportedly texted back that they worked great and that she was interested in buying a third car. Upon arriving back at the dealership, the mother said she also

wanted to buy a fourth car for her son.

To buy the third and fourth cars, the mother had her daughter fill out another credit application, this one with the date of birth and social security number of a woman in Texas with a name similar to that of the mother.

The ladies then brought the third vehicle home with them.

The following business day, the dealership was alerted to possible identification theft involving

the credit applications. Dealership staff knew the mother was scheduled to return that day to pay for tags on the fourth vehicle and so staff contacted WHPD.

Upon arrest, police found documents in the mother's possession with names, dates of birth and social security numbers for another two people. Police asked her where all of the stolen vehicles were located, and the mother reportedly said they were at her home.

Responding officers contacted HCPD for help finding the vehicles and the daughter. They found and towed the vehicles, but could not locate the daughter who is still at large.

Based on court documents, the daughter just got evicted at the end of November. She was arrested in 2017 on fraud charges out of Orange County. If you know where she is, contact Heartland Crime Stoppers at 1-800-26-TIPS (8477).



Giulia: A blast to drive

WINTER HAVEN - Owners of the Mahalak Auto Group were generous enough to give the newspaper around an hour to test drive the 2018 Motor Trend Car of the Year. The Alfa Romeo Giulia was a blast to drive.

If you are in the market to buy a luxury sedan for less than \$50,000, there is no need to drive all the way to Tampa or Orlando. Alfa Romeo Fiat of Winter Haven has several of these Italian cars in stock, so get ready to take your own test drive.

"We are proud to be Central Florida's headquarters for the most awarded sedan of the year," said Alfa Romeo Fiat of Winter Haven General Manager Scott Smith. "The all new Alfa Romeo Giulia reinvents the premium mid-size sedan segment with an unprecedented level of Italian craftsmanship, class-leading performance and state-of-the-art technology."

For somebody with a long history of driving beat up used cars, sitting in the driver's seat for the first time felt like melting into leather, surrounded by electronics. Punching the gas while leaving the car lot, heads snap back as sales consultant Bill Watts starts sharing stories about being given the opportunity to drive the Italian beauty on a race track along with all the other luxury sedans on the market.

Watts may have been biased in saying the Giulia was more fun to drive than

comparable versions of BMW, Mercedes, Lexus, Audi and Cadillac. But the car experts at Motor Trend tested the Giulia against them all and concluded the same, that the Alfa Romeo Giulia is flat out fun to drive.

After taking her through downtown Winter Haven and getting some pictures at the Lake Shipp boat ramp, Bill, myself and a local model hopped back in to make the trip back to the dealership. Turning north on U.S. 17 at Lake Shipp Drive, it was time to feel the power of the engine. After straightening out, with no traffic around and driving at around 20 m.p.h. at this point, the gas pedal hit the floor. Before getting halfway up the rail bridge the car was at 80 m.p.h., within seconds, plenty of time to lay off the gas and get back under the speed limit before the crest of the bridge.

The eight-speed automatic transmission shifted so fast it was barely noticeable. The novice racer had no white knuckles as the

car kept tires from squealing and everything under control.

The test drive was done with the base model with a sport package listing at \$45,340.

"Our top of the line Giulia is our Quadrifoglio Modle," said Alfa Romeo Fiat of Winter Haven General Manager Scott Smith.

Listing at around \$70,000, it's a Giulia on steroids. The base model features a 2.0 L turbo engine with 280 horse power, goes 0 to 60 in 5.5 seconds and tops out at 150 m.p.h., Smith said. The Quadrifoglio Modle features a Ferrari-derived 2.9 L twin turbo with 505 horsepower and can go from 0 to 60 in 3.6 seconds with a top speed of 191 m.p.h.

Motor Trend magazine featured both as car of the year, a first ever award for the Alfa Romeo brand. The magazine writers chose to use the word "eviscerated" when describing how the Quadrifoglio Modle compared against the beefed up versions of other luxury sedans.

Markley LW Charter Teacher of the Year

Tina Markley's road to Lake Wales High, where she has been named that charter school's 2017-18 Teacher of the Year, was hardly conventional.

With detours into the insurance and accounting fields, and being the daughter of a military family who regularly moved to new cities and schools, she finally found a true classroom home in 2009 when she started teaching English honors II and reading in Lake Wales.

Born in Ft. Campbell, Kentucky, she spent most of her youth in Texas,

where she graduated in 1984 with a Bachelor's degree in Business and English from East Texas Baptist College. After taking a job in the insurance business, she landed her first teaching job in February, 1985, in Venus, Texas, an assignment that was more than a little challenging.

"The class I took was 6th grade, they ran off their first teacher, and substitutes refused to cover that class. The principal told me that all he wanted was control of that group and didn't expect too much to

happen educationally. I was terrified, but my determination to teach would override that fear," Markley noted. "I will never forget that first day. When I saw the students come in the room, I couldn't believe those little sixth graders were causing such grief. I took on the persona of my Command Sergeant Major dad and said, 'I've heard about you. I can tell you this, YOU will be leaving before I will.' I instituted silent lunch, took away recess, and basically never smiled." That, she recalled

was a particularly tough moment, but she pressed on.

"I cried all the way home during my 30 minute commute. Fortunately, within a couple of weeks, they were able to have a normal lunch and recess," she recalled. "The next year, I received a group of sixth graders that were labeled as top students. They were terrified of me at first, but soon learned that I wasn't scary at all. We had a wonderful year and I moved up with them to be their English teacher for 7th and 8th

grades." "I started teaching a middle school that was predominately African American. I think the principal was a little hesitant but hired me anyway," Markley noted. "It was quite eye opening for me that some students had never had a white teacher before. Even though Rogers-Herr was considered a rough middle school at the time, I had no problems there."

After a few years of homeschooling her sons, she arrived in Lake Wales in 2007, and started at

the high school two years later.

"My principal, Donna Dunson, has helped me become a better educator. She challenges her staff to grow and learn from others' best practices," she noted.

LOVING THOSE LEGOS – Legos just aren't bricks to play around with in a kid's spare time. They're pretty serious business when it comes helping promote STEM education goals. "Students will compete in robot runs and judging sessions, all while

exhibiting 'gracious professionalism' and problem-solving core values."

WH Girls Basketball seeks the legacy



(There is only one goal at Winter Haven High School if you're a member of the girl's basketball team there. That, of course, is a state championship, which the Blue Devils have won in each of the last two years. Johnnie Lawson is the man who makes it all happen. Six senior players were honored Saturday at their last regular season home game, naturally a 70-31 win over Fort Pierce's Central High. Five of them have been part of the championship run, including Diamond Battles, Shaniya Mitchell, Tyla Singleton, Rushell Jacob and Melijah Sullivan. Should they be fortunate enough to get to defend their title, mark Saturday, March 3 at 4:30 p.m. on your calendars. That's the Class 8A girl's title game date and time at the RP Funding Center in Lakeland. The Blue Devils lost just once during the regular season, which came in their next to last game, something Lawson said could be turned into a positive, even though he hates to lose, even once. The playoff march starts this week.)

SCMG: What maybe is different about this year's team than the ones that won the last two state trophies?

JL: "I think the difference is that we don't just have the experience that we've

had. We have four that come back with experience and everybody else is kind of new to the system. But the expectations don't change. The work ethic doesn't change. We continue to have our eye on the ball. We always expect certain things out of them even though the new ones don't understand or know. And that's just 20 years of me being here."

SCMG: You always try to play a difficult and challenging schedule. How did this year's slate stack up?

JL: "This one may have been a little more difficult because we did play maybe 16, 17 games straight with top 25 teams in the nation and state. Usually we'll have a couple of breaks, but we didn't have a break this year. And we always play a lot of games away from home. And the most difficult thing for us is we always play our hardest games away from home. And again, it's all by design, to help us down the road. I mean, does it help us? I hope so, that's what it's designed to do."

SCMG: Is that as much a mental challenge as it is a physical one?

JL: It's definitely a challenge, and I love challenges. I accept the challenge, and I challenge my coaches (and players). They know they're going to get it, especially the ones that have been here. The good thing about it now is the ones that are here now it's like clockwork. They expect it. They (the team) just starts to love it like me. It's something that's hard to explain. It's just an adrenaline run just

knowing that you could lose any game, and to see if you can rise to the occasion. Sometimes you don't, and to me that's the challenge because you don't know. But you know in your mind that you've prepared every day, the off-season, on the weekend. I get excited, and I see it in their eyes, they get excited too."

SCMG: The fact that you lost your only game of the season last week at Montverde, can that actually be a positive thing?

JL: "I'll tell you what, there's no question we hate to lose at any time. But, you know, it did happen, so we just go back to the drawing board and continue to work hard and work it out. So, even if we'd have won, we'd still be working. So I don't think I'd see any difference in our work ethic, we're going to work hard if we win or lose. It matters, but it doesn't matter as far as how we work. I'm very aware if we're not prepared that we can be beaten on any given day, There's not a person in the world that can't be beaten. And when I talk about challenges, that's a challenge."

SCMG: What are one or two keys this post-season for your team to make sure you keep advancing?

JL: "Number one, we just want to take every game one at a time. We know we have to rebound, and play good defense and we have to move the ball on offense. The most important thing is we have to continue each game to try and get better, and know that it could end at any time. So

you want to savor each game like it's your last because it could be. There's nothing else next week, so you lose, it's over with. The great thing about losing to Montverde is that it wasn't in the playoffs. Now we still have the opportunity to continue to build and get better."

SCMG: If you were coaching against yourself, what strategy would you employ?

JL: "I would say probably be ready to battle all night, for 32 minutes. Be ready for anything and everything for 32 minutes, because we're going to be in good condition. Win or lose, we're going to fight all the way to the bitter end. And even after the buzzer sounds, we're still going to be fighting. I would scout myself and say be prepared to play a full 32 minutes and possibly overtime. We run a lot, we try to keep them in good shape. I feel if they're in good shape, then their minds will be in good shape. We still condition during the season, so I think that's been helping us."

SCMG: Might it help this post season that you have so many players that haven't experienced the playoffs like past teams have?

JL: "When you come here, the first day you walk in the gym, you understand what it's about. It's about the legacy of Winter Haven. If you don't know what it's about, we'll discipline you and run you until you find out. They understand what we're doing, it's 100 percent, even the ones that don't play that night. They're expected to go just as hard. That's a good thing."

Mancini confident about upcoming season

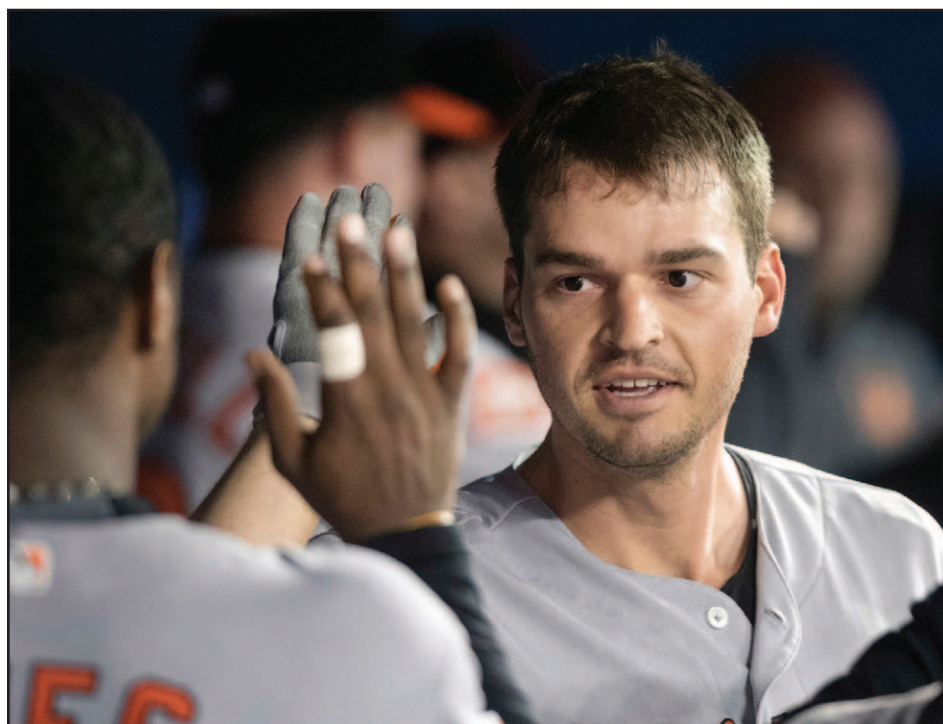
It might have been Baltimore Orioles announcer Joe Angel who first publicly, at least, pronounced Winter Haven's Trey Mancini worthy of a full time Major League Baseball job.

Last spring training, after another quality at bat, Angel declared that the Orioles simply had to find a spot in the lineup for Mancini to play.

"All he does is hit," Angel noted.

Mancini was never the hottest of the hot baseball prospects in the Orioles system, but he could always hit. He was an eighth round pick out of Notre Dame after three seasons in the Irish lineup, and heading into the 2017, both Baseball America and MLB.com had the one-time Blue Devil as Baltimore's fifth best prospect. All nice numbers, to be sure, but far from a sure thing when it came to being a big leaguer.

So off the radar he was that one of his favorite stories involves a scout who came to watch him at Notre Dame, and asked him how many innings he had thrown that season.

In his final of three years in South Bend, he hit .389 with 54 RBI in just 57 games as their first baseman.

Mancini hit .480 in his last season for Winter Haven (2010). In his sophomore year, he led all of Polk County with a gaudy .527 with 39 runs batted in en route to first-team all-state honors in Class 5A.

Mancini has made a career out

of taking nothing for granted, and spring training in Sarasota this year will be no different, despite the fact he was third in voting for American League rookie of the year following a season of 24 homers, 78 RBI and a .293 batting average.

"Every spring training I've gone in with the mindset that I'm fighting for a job," he told a group of Baltimore

media recently at the Orioles Fanfest. "I'm not going to change that no matter what the circumstance. I'm kind of like a creature of habit in that regard. I'm always going to go in trying to compete for a spot."

Those numbers came as he made the conversion to outfield, because the Orioles recognized they needed his bat in the lineup too.

"I was willing to do anything to make the team and really came to love it out there," he said. "For not playing out there, I thought I held my own."

He also said he learned plenty about being a big leaguer last year, his first full season in the majors.

"I think utilizing the people around you is the thing I really learned about the most," Mancini said. "You have so many valuable resources around you. People that have been playing up here a long time, and they really helped me through some minor slumps. If you reach out to people early on, it really helps out."

The Orioles can hit, of that there's no doubt. And there is the framework for a decent pitching staff, especially if they get lucky on a veteran free agent arm or two that is likely to come between now and opening day.

"It's not anything I think about too much day to day," Mancini said about what Baltimore's 25-man roster will look like. "I know that it will all sort itself out in the end, but I'm fully confident with the group we have."

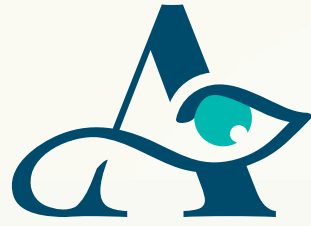

Six head to district Knights Free Throw

younger brother, Jordan McPartlan, a student at Elbert Elementary School in Winter Haven, won the Boys 9 division title on Sunday by making six of his 15 shots from the free throw line.

City closing recycling facilities

The City of Winter Haven is closing the recycling collection facilities at Rotary and W. G. Roe Parks. City collection facilities at both parks, including the containers, fencing and bollards will be removed by Feb. 5, 2017. In addition, the space will be repurposed to curtail future illegal dumping at these locations. Impacts of the removal will be minimal and the area will be restored to its previous condition at both locations.

According to Donna Sheehan, assistant to the city manager, "Since the installation of these recycling collection sites in the 1990's, the City has developed a robust recycling program that has made these facilities obsolete and no longer necessary." Though citizens who are not customers of the City's solid waste services use these receptacles to deposit recycle material, these areas have also become a regular illegal dumping ground for unrecyclable debris, junk and bulk items. This has created unsightly and hazardous conditions for park users and those attempting to utilize the receptacles. In addition, the improper disposal of non-recyclable materials contaminates the entire load, which impacts the intent of recycling.

City of Winter Haven solid waste customers can dispose of recycle material using the large carts. Commercial users can contact the solid waste office at 291-5757 to set up a Commercial Recycling account if needed. Customers outside the City limits who are not provided solid waste and

recycling services by the City of Winter Haven should to contact their municipality/county for guidance.

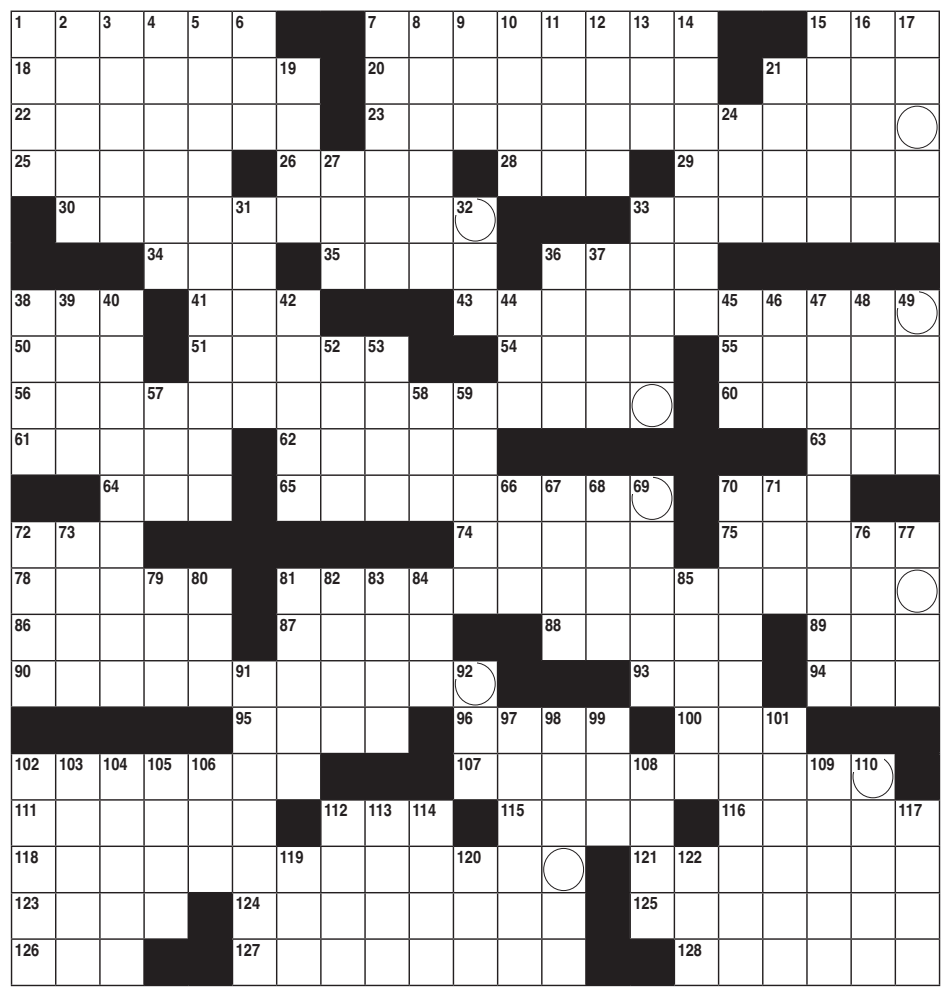

Public workshops on flood control

WINTER HAVEN - Staff with the Southwest Florida Water Management District is hosting two public workshops in the coming days so Winter Haven residents can review operational guidelines for flood control structures in the North Winter Haven Chain of Lakes.

Both workshops will be held at the Chain of Lakes Complex Pool Room. The first workshop is tomorrow (Feb. 8) between 4:30 and 6:40 p.m. The second workshop is being held Feb. 13 between 5:30 and 7:40 p.m. The same information will be presented at both workshops.

"You are invited to learn more about the lakes in your area, make suggestions and provide information or comments about the management of the lakes," according to a letter posted on the SWFWMD website. "There will be an open house the first hour of each workshop, followed by a presentation and an open discussion."

The most recent

operational guidelines for the North Winter Haven Chain of Lakes were published in January 2013. There are flood control gates on Lakes Henry, Smart, Fannie and Hamilton, and the guidelines determine when the gates are to be opened so that water can flow out of the north chain of lakes and into Peace Creek, headwaters for Peace River. When these gates are opened, water flows from the north chain of lakes, down Peace River and eventually winds up in the Atlantic Ocean once Lake Okeechobee gets too high.

Flooding can be a problem, especially during hurricane season. Every lake in the Winter Haven chain flooded after the 2004 storms, for example. But as flood control gates got raised along the north chain, helping residents on those lakes, that just meant those living downstream got it worse. Locals may remember the Cypresswood community along Dundee Road that got flooded when water from Lake Hamilton was released into the Peace Creek Basin. Downstream

further, water from the chain caused evacuations in communities between Bartow and Ft. Meade along Peace River.

So while flood control structures in the north chain can help some local residents, they may harm others. The upcoming workshop presents the public with an opportunity to discuss this. Flooding is not the only issue that comes into play. Water experts say so much water has been pumped out of the ground for human consumption over the past few decades that there

will not be enough water left in the upper Floridan Aquifer to meet needs by 2035. Some say the Winter Haven Chain of Lakes is a perfect set of natural reservoirs that could help recharge the Floridan Aquifer and that allowing water to collect in the lakes instead of releasing that water into Peace River could help in that regard.

Water experts have been debating what is more important, flood control or recharging the Floridan Aquifer, for years.

For example, in 2004 Florida legislators debated

concerns about lack of maintenance of Peace Creek. At the time, it was so clogged that it was limiting water from the Chain of Lakes into Peace River. SWFWMD staff published a response in reference to this debate.

"SWFWMD staff recognize the inherent conflict in goals that on the one hand seek to maintain or improve flood protection levels and, on the other hand, goals to retain or detain surface waters for recharge or slow release," their response read.

The debate continues to this day.

An anonymous source recently sent the newspaper a message stating that the upcoming workshops were necessary because SWFWMD staff was considering lowering the flood levels of the north chain again. The newspaper reached out to SWFWMD Senior Government Affairs Program Manager Cindy Rodriguez to see if this rumor was true and to see if she would release the contents of the workshop presentation in advance.

"Your information about the topic of the workshops

is incorrect - the purpose of the meetings is to solicit public input on our Structural Operations Guidelines - the guidelines the District uses to assist in managing lake levels," Rodriguez replied by email.

Rodriguez further wrote that the content of the presentation was not available.

The City of Winter Haven Director or Natural Resources M.J. Carnevale will be representing city residents at the workshop.

"As of right now I don't believe the district has proposed any changes (to lake levels in the Chain of Lakes)," Carnevale said. "The meeting's purpose is the district presenting information on how those structures have been operated and asking 'How are we doing?'"

The current guideline states Lake Hamilton should generally be between 121.25 ft. and 121.5 ft. above sea level. It is unknown how often the flood gates are raised to maintain that level. Government documents state the lake reached 123.7 ft. in 2004 and was 128 ft. in 1914.

Many self diagnose rather than see a doctor

A new report suggests that people in Florida are increasingly turning to the internet to assess and monitor their health, with a staggering 60 percent admitting they consult Google (or other search engines) rather than a medical professional. The research, conducted by The Tinker Law Firm, is based on a national survey of 3,000 adults. This is significantly higher than the national average of 44 percent.

Nationally, the survey also found that 30 percent of Americans use home remedies to deal with health issues, perhaps to avoid high medical costs, or because of busy lifestyles. Though only 30 percent said they use home remedies, interestingly, 41 percent of Americans said they believe in homeopathic solutions.

The survey revealed that it is women who are more likely to self-diagnose, with 36 percent of women using home remedies over a doctor, compared to 29 percent of men.

Clearly Americans are very trusting with technology, as 1 in 5 parents admit that they would consult the internet regarding their children's symptoms before going to see a doctor. This time, more men (32 percent) admitted to diagnosing their child's symptoms online than women (12 percent).

Though it may be a cheaper and quicker alternative, going online to assess our health may be fuelling the rise of 'cyberchondria' in America, with 15 percent of respondents stating that they cause themselves anxiety by Googling their symptoms.

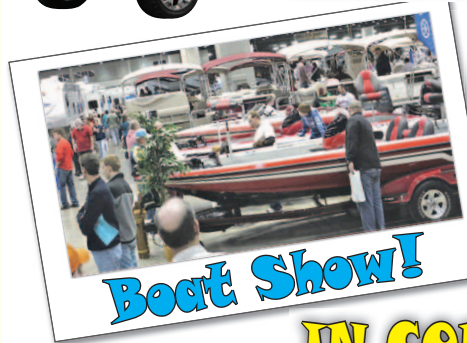

The information is gathered from police, sheriff's office, Florida Highway Patrol, jail and fire records. Not every arrest leads to a conviction and guilt or innocence is determined by the court system.

Two arrested for child abuse

BARTOW — On Jan. 29, Bartow Police detectives were informed of a possible child abuse that occurred at the Jean O'Dell Learning Center. At that time, detectives immediately responded to the school to investigate.

During the investigation, it was revealed that a para educator employed by the Polk County School Board used abusive physical contact on three separate students during class sessions, according to police reports, which indicate that these actions were observed in part by a school nurse and a classroom teacher. The school nurse ultimately reported these actions which led to the law enforcement response. The teacher did not report the actions as required by law and was subsequently arrested for failure to report child abuse (FSS 39.205), according to police.

Synopsis of the incident is as follows: The para educator, identified as Shelby Faulk, 32, from Winter Haven, is employed by the Polk County School Board and has worked at the Jean O'Dell Learning center for approximately four years.

The Jean O'Dell Learning Center is a school for special needs children. All of the victims involved are students at the Learning Center. During the month of December 2017, Faulk was working as a para educator and tasked with the care of juvenile students. One of the juvenile students wears a special jacket with D rings in order to secure him to a seat on the school bus for health reasons, according to reports. Police say that out of frustration in the classroom, Faulk used the student's medical use jacket and allegedly pinned the student to the ground by placing a chair leg through the D rings and then sitting on the chair. Although this did not injure the juvenile student, it rendered the student unable to move. She held this student down for an extended period of time, police say. During the same month, Faulk allegedly repeatedly pinched and pushed another juvenile student as a discipline measure because the student was "acting out." In January of this year, Faulk repeatedly pushed another juvenile student multiple times with both of her hands. This caused the student to fall to the floor. No injuries were reported on any of the students. It should be noted that none of the actions taken

by Faulk were approved by school administration, according to reports, and there are protocols in place if the need arises to restrain students, but police say these were not those protocols. Faulk was arrested on Jan. 30 for negligent child abuse without bodily harm and false imprisonment of a child, both of which are felonies.

The teacher assigned to the classroom, Julio Torres, 55, from Lakeland, was present in the classroom while all of the aforementioned actions occurred. According to police, he failed to report any of the actions by the para educator. He was arrested on Jan. 30, for failure to report child abuse.

Bartow Police Detectives are working closely with Polk County School Board Staff to determine if there are any other incidents involving the two defendants. At this time, there are no indications that any other abuse has occurred. The parents of the involved children are being notified by school administration.

Superintendent Jacqueline Byrd released a statement, saying the allegations against the two employees are "inexcusable" and "such behavior does not belong in our community's centers of learning."

"I am immediately moving forward with the process of terminating their employment based on the information provided by the Bartow Police Department. My recommendation will go before the School Board for approval. I expect educators and all district employees to treat our youth with dignity, respect and compassion. Anything less is unacceptable," she said.

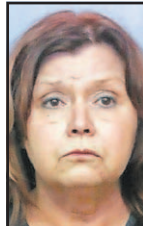
She added "The Jean O'Dell Learning Center serves some of our most vulnerable students who need special care and help to achieve their goals. I am greatly distressed to hear accusations that employees either caused harm to students or failed to report it. Student welfare must remain our highest priority, and I will take steps to ensure students are given appropriate care and that a safe learning environment is maintained."

Initial steps include that district administrators will be stationed on the campus of the Jean O'Dell Learning Center to review the operation of the school and

provide more oversight. In addition, Polk County Public Schools Human Resources department continues to conduct an internal investigation. Extra training will be provided to the Jean O'Dell Learning Center staff members on the proper methods of interacting with special needs students.

Hit and Run suspect arrested

According to reports, Polk County Sheriff's Office traffic deputies arrested a person suspected in the hit and run incident which killed a Bartow man near International Market World. PCSO reports that "Thanks to a Heartland Crime Stoppers anonymous tip," on Tuesday, Jan. 30, PCSO Traffic deputies identified and arrested 54-year-old Lisa Johnsey Rockefeller of Beacon Lane in Auburndale and charged her with one count leaving the scene of a crash causing death (F-1).

The fatal hit-and-run crash occurred in front of International Market World on Sunday night, Jan. 21, 2018, killing 45-year-old Eduardo Valle-Sanchez of Bartow.

According to the affidavit, on Jan. 21, 2018, Valle-Sanchez was found deceased on the roadway in front of the International Market World, 1052 US Hwy 92 West in Auburndale, and physical evidence along with his autopsy confirmed he died from injuries sustained in a motor vehicle crash.

PCSO published information about the crash, along with the Heartland Crime Stoppers number, seeking the public's help to identify the suspect responsible for killing Valle-Sanchez. On Jan. 29, PCSO traffic deputies received an anonymous Heartland Crime Stoppers tip identifying Lisa Rockefeller, who lives on Beacon Lane in Auburndale, as the possible suspect, and that the vehicle involved was parked on Greenway Circle.

On Jan. 30, deputies responded to Greenway Circle in Lakeland. While there was no car visibly parked in front of the home, deputies walked around the perimeter and saw a Toyota Camry

parked under a carport-like structure at the rear of the home. The car had windshield and hood damage consistent with a pedestrian being struck. While deputies were on-scene, they observed a woman, identified as Rockefeller, come out of the house, get into the car, and pulled out of the carport area. Deputies made contact with Rockefeller and her family members at that time.

Family members told deputies that Rockefeller made several statements this week about being involved in a crash, and told one family member that she struck a pedestrian in front of International Market World on Sunday. She parked her car behind the

family member's home on Greenway Circle, without their permission. Rockefeller was admitted to a hospital on Jan. 24, and released on Jan. 30, at which time she got a ride to the home on Greenway Circle, and told family members she was going to turn herself and her car in to the Sheriff's Office.

She was booked into the Polk County Jail had a first appearance hearing at 1 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 1.

"The Heartland Crime Stoppers anonymous tip we received about this fatal hit-and-run crash is the reason we were able to solve this crime so quickly. The Crime Stoppers tipline works. You can remain anonymous, get a cash reward, and help us solve crime. Regardless of whether or not Rockefeller was impaired when the crash occurred, was distracted, or driving recklessly when she hit the victim - which we'll likely never know - she is facing a harsher penalty for leaving the scene than if she had just stayed there to report it,"

An excerpt from PCSO reports says that based on statements Rockefeller made that she struck a pedestrian on Jan. 21 at or near the International Market World, damage observed to her vehicle consistent with a pedestrian crash, the fact that the crash was not reported to law enforcement, the fact Eduardo Valle-Sanchez was killed as a result of the crash, and the fact that an average and prudent person should have known they struck a pedestrian, Lisa Johnsey Rockefeller was arrested for leaving the scene of a crash involving death.

As of this investigation, Rockefeller never reported the crash, says the PCSO. Additionally, there was no other pedestrian crash at or near the International Market World on Jan. 21. The distance from International Market World to Rockefeller's residence was only 1.7 miles. The damage to Rockefeller's vehicle is estimated at approximately \$4000.

The Falcon takes flight

SpaceX's big new rocket blasts off, puts sports car in space

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — SpaceX's big new rocket blasted off Tuesday on its first test flight, carrying a red sports car aiming for an endless road trip past Mars.

The Falcon Heavy rose from the same launch pad used by NASA nearly 50 years ago to send men to the moon. With liftoff, the Heavy became the most powerful rocket in use today, doubling the liftoff punch of its closest competitor.

The three boosters and 27 engines roared to life at

Kennedy Space Center, as thousands watched from surrounding beaches, bridges and roads, jamming the highways in scenes unmatched since NASA's last space shuttle flight. At SpaceX Mission Control in Southern California, employees screamed, whistled and raised pumped fists into the air as the launch commentators called off each milestone.

Two of the boosters—both recycled from previous launches—returned minutes later for simultaneous, side-by-side touchdowns on land at Cape Canaveral. Sonic booms rumbled across the

region with the vertical landings. There was no immediate word on whether the third booster, brand new, made it onto an ocean platform 300 miles offshore.

SpaceX chief executive Elon Musk owns the rocketing Tesla Roadster, which is shooting for a solar orbit that will reach all the way to Mars. As head of the electric carmaker Tesla, he combined his passions to add a dramatic flair to the Heavy's long-awaited inaugural flight. Ballast for a rocket debut is usually concrete or steel slabs, or experiments.

Cameras mounted on

the car fed stunning video of the convertible floating high above the ocean with its driver, a space-suited dummy, named "Starman" after the Davie Bowie song. A sign on the dashboard read: "Don't panic!" Bowie's "Life on Mars?" played in the background at one point.

"View from SpaceX Launch Control," Musk wrote via Twitter. "Apparently, there is a car in orbit around Earth."

Minutes later, he provided a livestream of "Starman" tooling around the blue home planet, looking something

Down, then up: Stock market goes on another wild ride

Wall Street is making a good case for buying stock in Maalox and Tums.

In another stomach-churning day Tuesday, stocks plunged in the morning, then pulled off a late-afternoon rally, ending the day in positive territory and recouping some of the losses from the market's two-day plunge.

"The positive for the market is that we came back today in very convincing fashion, but I certainly would not say it's all done, the Wicked Witch is dead," said JJ Kinahan, chief investment strategist for TD Ameritrade. "Brace for volatility and strap yourself for the next couple of weeks."

The Standard & Poor's 500 index is now up just under 1 percent for the year. It had been up as much as 7.5 percent less than two weeks ago.

The bounce-back no doubt came as relief to many Americans made queasy by the drop in their retirement savings and investment accounts.

But for a while Tuesday, it was ugly and getting uglier.

After its 1,175-point nosedive Monday, the Dow Jones industrial average sank an additional 567 points right after trading began Tuesday. Several ups and downs

Trump advocates government shutdown as Congress faces another deadline

WASHINGTON — Congress is risking another federal government shutdown as House Republicans on Tuesday approved a temporary bill loaded with extra military spending that will almost certainly face a filibuster from Democrats — and some Republicans — in the

Senate.

Neither party appears to want a repeat of last month's three-day shutdown, but President Donald Trump seemed game for closing the government again if he could blame it on Democrats. Funds for federal operations expire Thursday.

"I'd love to see a shutdown if we can't get this stuff taken care of," Trump said during a White

House event on gang violence that quickly turned to immigration and border security issues. "If we have to shut it down because the Democrats don't want safety, let's shut it down."

Trump's brash comments drew instant rebuke from lawmakers, including one of the Republicans attending the roundtable event.

"We don't need a government shutdown on this," said Rep.

Barbara Comstock, R-Va., whose district in the Washington suburbs is home to many federal workers. Both parties want to resolve the issues, she added.

Trump interrupted her: "You can say what you want."

"I would shut it down over this issue," he said later in response to a question from a reporter.

The president's comments were out of sync with the action

on Capitol Hill. Unlike last month, when Democrats briefly blocked a federal spending bill to try to push Republicans on immigration, neither party has linked the two issues this time as lawmakers have been negotiating over possible immigration compromises.

Now lawmakers in both houses

On President Trump's desk: Dems' classified memo on Russia probe

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump met with a top Justice Department official Tuesday to review a classified Democratic memo on the Russia investigation, less than a week after he brushed aside objections from the same agency over releasing a Republican account.

The dueling memos — and Trump's silence so far on whether he will release the Democratic version — have set up a standoff between Trump and congressional Democrats and deepened

partisan fights on the House intelligence panel. The memos have become the recent focus of the committee's probe into Russian meddling in the 2016 election, taking attention away from investigations into whether Trump's campaign was involved.

The Democratic document is intended to counter the GOP memo, which criticized methods the FBI used to obtain a surveillance warrant on a onetime Trump campaign associate. The president has until the end of the week to decide whether to make it public.

On Tuesday, White House press secretary Sarah Huckabee

Sanders said Trump met with Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein to discuss differences between the two memos, and "we are undergoing the exact same process that we did with the previous memo, in which it will go through a full and thorough legal and national security review."

White House chief of staff John Kelly said later that he's instructed officials to complete an evaluation of the Democratic memo no later than Thursday. After that, Kelly said, "we'll brief the president on it and he will

US court considers potentially landmark LGBT housing case

CHICAGO — An appeals court heard arguments Tuesday in a potentially landmark case in which a 70-year-old lesbian accuses a suburban Chicago senior living center of doing nothing to stop fellow residents from hurling homophobic slurs at her, spitting on her and even striking her because of her sexual orientation.

Marsha Wetzel, who moved to the Glen Saint Andrew Living Community in Niles after her partner of 30 years died in 2013, was told by one resident that "homosexuals will burn in hell;" another intentionally rammed her scooter with a walker, toppling her and bruising her arm, filings by her attorneys allege.

A three-judge panel of the 7th U.S. Court of Appeals in Chicago heard oral arguments in the case Tuesday, one year after trial-level Judge Samuel Der-Yeghiayan tossed the lawsuit, saying Wetzel hadn't shown that administrators themselves displayed "any discriminatory animus, motive or intent."

If the court revives Wetzel's lawsuit, the case could help establish that Fair Housing Act protections cover LGBT tenants harassed by other tenants. The panel is expected to rule within the next several weeks.

A lawyer for the privately-owned facility, Lisa Hausten, has downplayed the incidents involving Wetzel, saying they stemmed from "on-going squabbles with

an older male resident and a couple of isolated incidents with two elderly females.

"(Her) quarrels with her fellow seniors, regardless of how cranky or offensive their words, are not sufficient to maintain an action under the Fair Housing Act," she wrote. Wetzel's lawyer, Karen Loewy, disputes that portrayal, saying her client lived in constant fear at the facility.

Judges' questions Tuesday focused on whether the federal housing law, as written, can be extended to hold administrators liable for tenants' abusive behavior. Judge David Hamilton sounded skeptical.

"I don't see any case cited where a landlord is held liable for tenant-on-tenant harassment," he told Loewy. He said he also worried that broadening the law could put administrators in the untenable position of trying to discern which tenant is the abuser and which the abused.

Loewy, from the New York-based LGBT rights group Lambda Legal, responded that it was not a matter of landlords being obliged to step in to stop run-of-the-mill disputes. She said it involved the kind of "severe or pervasive harassment" that fundamentally undermined Wetzel's rights.

Another panelist, Judge Diane Wood, sounded sympathetic to the arguments from Wetzel's legal team. Wood added that nobody was suggesting administrators at the living center "applauded" the abuse as it happened — only that they "shrugged their shoulders" when they learned about it.

Wood and Hamilton were appointed by then-President Bill Clinton. The third judge on the panel, Michael Kanne, spoke only briefly during the hearing. He was appointed by Ronald Reagan.

Colorado deputy killed as detectives make arrest

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. — Colorado's third law enforcement officer to be killed in five weeks was part of a group of detectives making an arrest in a car theft case, but authorities did not release other details Tuesday about what led to the shooting in the closest string of on-duty deaths in three decades. El Paso County Deputy Micah Flick was killed and four others — two sheriff's officers, a police officer and a bystander — were wounded Monday in a shooting near an apartment complex just east of downtown Colorado Springs. The suspect also was killed.

The last time this many Colorado officers were killed in the line of duty so close together was in

1987, when three were killed within a month. "A number of other officers" were at the scene but not injured, El Paso County Sheriff Bill Elder said, calling the shooting "senseless violence." He said the gunfire happened as they made an arrest and that the plainclothes officers were part of a group that works together regularly. Elder said they all wore protective vests as well as placards and badges identifying them as law enforcement.

Elder would not say if the suspect, whose identity has not been released, showed a weapon.

Colorado Springs Police Chief Pete Carey, whose department is leading the investigation, said Monday that the officers encountered the suspect and a struggle ensued, leading to gunfire.

A police spokesman didn't immediately reply to messages seeking information Tuesday.

Flick, 34, who grew up in Colorado Springs, was killed on his 11th anniversary with the sheriff's office. He leaves behind a wife and 7-year-old twins, a boy and a girl.

One of the wounded officers, Deputy Scott Stone

was shot in abdomen and was hospitalized in stable condition Tuesday. His injuries did not appear life-threatening, authorities said. Sheriff's Sgt. Jake Abendshan, who appears to have been hit by shrapnel, was treated and released Monday night.

The conditions of the police officer and the bystander have not been released.

The shooting comes just days after the funeral for Adams County Deputy Heath Gumm, who was shot Jan. 24 while chasing a suspect. On Dec. 31, Douglas County Deputy Zackari Parrish died after he was shot in suburban Denver by a man with a history of mental health issues.

Elder said he believes a lack of respect for law enforcement has developed in the past few years.

2nd man has gene editing; therapy has no safety flags

Doctors say they have treated a second patient in a historic gene editing study in California.

In an update Tuesday, they say no major side effects or safety issues have emerged from the first man's treatment nearly three months ago.

Gene editing is a more precise way to do gene therapy and aims to permanently change someone's DNA to try to cure a disease.

In November, a Phoenix man became the first person to have gene editing inside the body for a metabolic disease. Through an IV, he received a corrective gene and a genetic tool to put it in a precise spot.

Attorneys general sue Trump administration over water rule

NEW YORK (AP) — Eleven Democratic state attorneys general have sued President Donald Trump's administration over its decision to delay implementation of an Obama-era rule that would have expanded the number of wetlands and small waterways protected by the Clean Water Act.

New York Attorney General Eric Schneiderman says last week's decision by the Republican administration to postpone implementation of the 2015 Clean Water Rule for two years is an assault on public health.

Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Scott Pruitt has called the rule an overreach that could hurt farmers and ranchers. Mining and industry groups also opposed it.

The lawsuit was filed in New York by Schneiderman and his counterparts in California, Connecticut, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, Washington and the District of Columbia. It seeks to stop the government from delaying implementation of the rule.

Macy's to launch a clothing line geared toward Muslims

NEW YORK (AP) — Macy's is launching a women's clothing line aimed at Muslim shoppers.

The department store chain says it teamed up with a boutique called Verona Collection and plans to sell the collection of modest dresses, tops, cardigans and hijabs online. The clothing will launch on Macy's website on Feb. 15.

The brand was developed by Lisa Vogl, a graduate of Macy's minority- and women-owned business development program, which aims to offer more fashion diversity.

While Macy's is the first major U.S. department store to sell hijabs, it joins other brands offering products aimed at Muslims.

Prison chiefs head to DC to talk cellphones with FCC

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Corrections officials from around the country are heading to Washington on Wednesday to discuss what they call their biggest security threat: cellphones in the hands of inmates.

The Federal Communications Commission is hosting a meeting with law enforcement and prisons officials, as well as representatives from the wireless industry. South Carolina Corrections Director Bryan Stirling, who said he

had been asked to speak at the meeting on behalf of his fellow directors, said he expected no major answers to come Wednesday but viewed the gathering as progress on the issue.

"I'm hoping that this will be the start of a conversation," Stirling told The Associated Press on Tuesday as he traveled to Washington. "I don't think a solution will come tomorrow, but I think sitting across the table from folks is a positive step."

Prison officials say cellphones — smuggled into their institutions by the thousands, by visitors, errant employees, and

even delivered by drone — are dangerous because inmates use them to carry out crimes. Stirling and his counterparts from states including Arizona, California, Georgia and Tennessee are planning to attend the meeting for a discussion on ways to potentially use technology like signal jamming to fight the phones.

"To me, if you just shut the signal down, that seems to be the best solution," Stirling said.

Wireless industry groups are opposed to such technology, saying they worry signal-blocking technologies could thwart

legal calls.

The FCC, which regulates the nation's airwaves, has said it can't permit jamming in state prisons, citing a decades-old law that prohibits interruption of the airwaves at state-level institutions.

But the agency has been softening on the issue, thanks to persistent pleas from officials including Stirling, South Carolina Gov. Henry McMaster, as well as members of Congress including South Carolina Rep. Mark Sanford and Tennessee Rep. David Kustoff.

like a NASCAR racer out for a Sunday drive, with its right hand on the wheel and the left arm resting on the car's door.

On the eve of the flight, Musk told reporters the company had done all it could to maximize success and he was at peace with whatever happens: success, "one big boom" or some other calamity. Musk has plenty of experience with rocket accidents, from his original Falcon 1 test flights to his follow-up Falcon 9s, one of which exploded on a nearby pad during a 2016 ignition test.

The Falcon Heavy is a combination of three Falcon 9s, the rocket that the company uses to ship supplies to the

International Space Station and lift satellites. SpaceX is reusing first-stage boosters to save on launch costs. Most other rocket makers discard their spent boosters in the ocean.

Unlike most rockets out there, the Falcon Heavy receives no government funding. The hulking rocket is intended for massive satellites, like those used by the U.S. military and major-league communication companies. Even before the successful test flight, customers were signed up.

"It was awesome, like a science fiction movie coming to reality," said former NASA deputy administrator Dava Newman, Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Apollo professor of astronautics. "They nailed it. Good for them."

Given the high stakes

and high drama, Tuesday's launch attracted huge crowds not seen since NASA's final space shuttle flight seven years ago. While the shuttles had more liftoff muscle than the Heavy, the all-time leaders in both size and might were NASA's Saturn V rockets, which first flew astronauts to the moon in 1968.

Not counting Apollo moon buggies, the Roadster is the first automobile to speed right off the planet.

The car faces considerable speed bumps before settling into its intended orbit around the sun, an oval circle stretching from the orbit of Earth on one end to the orbit of Mars on the other. It has to endure a cosmic bombardment during several hours of cruising through the highly charged Van Allen radiation belts encircling Earth.

Finally, a thruster has to fire to put the car on the right orbital course.

If it weathers all this, the Roadster will reach the vicinity of Mars in six months, Musk said. The car could be traveling between Earth and Mars' neighborhoods for a billion years, according to the high-tech billionaire.

Musk acknowledged the Roadster could come "quite close" to Mars during its epic cruise, with only a remote chance of crashing into the red planet.

Also on board in a protected storage unit is Isaac Asimov's science fiction series, "Foundation." A plaque contains the names of the more than 6,000 SpaceX employees.

The Heavy already is rattling the launch market. Its sticker price is \$90 million, less than one-tenth the estimated cost of NASA's

Space Launch System megarocket in development for moon and Mars expeditions.

SpaceX has decided against flying passengers on the Heavy, Musk told reporters Monday, and instead will accelerate development of an even bigger rocket to accommodate deep-space crews. His ultimate goal is to establish a city on Mars.

"If people think we're in a race with the Chinese, this is our secret weapon: the entrepreneurship of people like Elon and others like Jeff Bezos," said Stanford University's G. Scott Hubbard, NASA's first Mars czar. Amazon's Bezos heads Blue Origin, which is developing a big, reusable orbital-class rocket and already is making suborbital flights in Texas.

Before launch, Bezos offered "best of luck" to Musk.

later, the Dow finished the day with a neatly symmetrical gain of 567 points, closing at 24,913.

The big sell-off over the past few days was triggered, at least in part, by fears of inflation and higher interest rates. But the rebound showed that even after going through the worst market tumble in more than six years, some investors are still in a buying mood.

That's been one of the characteristics of the remarkably resilient, nearly nine-year bull market: Time and again, buyers have stepped in within a day or two of a market drop and wiped out the decline.

"While the sharp decline in the S&P 500 on

Monday was unnerving, it is important to keep in mind that these kinds of moves have tended to be buying opportunities in the post Financial Crisis era," Lori Calvasina, head of equity strategy at RBC Capital Markets, wrote in a research note Tuesday.

Going back to 2010, the S&P 500 index has fallen 3 percent or more in a single day 15 times. And each time, the index, which is the benchmark most professionals and many index funds use, had been meaningfully higher six months later, Calvasina noted.

Even so, one couldn't blame investors for forgetting this trend, as the market didn't drop more than 3 percent on a single day all last year.

The question is, was Tuesday too soon to buy back in?

"There's no question

that the level of risk in buying the dip from this point forward is going to be higher than it was through any time last year and really even a year before that," said Randy Frederick, vice president of trading & derivatives at Charles Schwab. "That's why it's wise to just sit and watch here for another day or two and see where things settle out."

Other Wall Street insiders say the worst is over.

"I believe this is the bottom," said Phil Blancato, CEO of Ladenburg Thalmann Asset Management. "This is not 2008, when we were really seeing a massive broad-breadth market sell-off. Economically, we're in too good a shape."

The turbulence has yet to rattle Susan McCauley, of Marietta, Georgia, a 66-year-old investment portfolio administrator

who said she is not shifting away from stocks, despite the big tumble.

She recently decided to push back her retirement from 68 to 70 to give her more time to save up a

bigger nest egg.

"Now that looks even more like a good decision, because it will give me time to invest more and give the market time to recover," she said.

are hoping a broader, multiyear budget deal can be struck in time to prevent another stopgap measure after this one, which would expire March 23, in what would be the fifth short-term funding bill of this fiscal year.

The sticking point has been that Republicans want higher military spending and Democrats oppose that unless there is additional money for domestic accounts.

Republicans tried to win Democratic votes on the stopgap measure Tuesday by attaching a two-year extension of funding for community health clinics and other provisions, along with the full year of military funding. But Democrats mostly voted against it.

Even as House GOP

leaders were able to muscle their bill to passage, 245 to 182, thanks to backing from the conservative House Freedom Caucus, the outcome in the Senate is uncertain. The narrow 51-seat Senate Republican majority must rely on Democratic support to reach the 60-vote threshold for passage.

"Unfortunately, we are back at that point that we were just a few weeks ago," said House Majority Leader Kevin McCarthy, R-Calif. "Last time, we had to have a shutdown. Hopefully we will not be in that situation again."

But some Democrats said Republicans were simply wasting time on another temporary bill that had no chance of becoming law.

"How did we get here?" said Rep. Nita M. Lowey of New York, the top Democrat on the Appropriations Committee. "This is not a

serious bill."

Negotiators have been trying to craft a more lasting budget accord to fund the government through the remainder of the fiscal year, which ends Sept. 30. They want to boost all spending beyond the strict caps imposed under a 2011 budget deal.

If a broader budget agreement is struck, the Senate could swap it in for the House's stopgap measure, with a fresh round of voting before Thursday's midnight deadline to fund the government.

But mounting deficits are beginning to worry lawmakers after passage of the massive \$1.5 trillion tax cut package, especially if they pile on more than \$80 billion disaster aid for states hit during the especially devastating hurricane and wildfire season. The volatile stock market has only amplified lawmakers' concerns.

"At some point the

market's going to wake up to the fact that you're going to start running \$1 trillion deficits all over again," said Rep. Mark Sanford, R-S.C., the state's former governor, who worries that the stopgap measures are viewed as "a real sign that Washington doesn't work, that it is dysfunctional at some level."

While budget talks continue, the immigration debate involves efforts to craft a bill to protect young immigrant "Dreamers" from deportation after Trump formally ends the Obama-era Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program.

The government shut down for three days last month as Democrats pushed the immigration issue to the forefront of the agenda. They relented after winning a promise from Senate leaders that it would be the next debate. Groups of lawmakers

are meeting behind closed doors to develop legislation that would also include border security enhancements and other immigration law changes.

As senators struggle to craft a bipartisan immigration bill, some are mulling a one-year extension to DACA, which allows immigrants who came to the country illegally as minors to apply to live and work here as adults. Under Trump's order, the program was to have expired March 5, but a court case has allowed it to keep running for now.

The White House has shown no interest in extending the program, which it argues was created unlawfully by President Barack Obama. That leaves the matter with Congress, which could pass a law protecting Dreamers.

Some senators from both parties oppose a one-year extension.

have a decision to make" on whether to declassify it entirely, or perhaps declassify it with some redactions.

Kelly said the Democratic version is "not as clean a memo as the first one."

The House panel voted unanimously Monday to release the Democratic memo, sending it to the White House.

Separate Russia investigations are underway by the Senate intelligence committee and special counsel Robert Mueller, whose team is scheduled to interview former White House chief strategist Steve Bannon next week.

The Mueller interview was confirmed by two people familiar with it.

They spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to speak publicly about details of the interview.

Bannon is expected to face questions about key events during his time in the White House including Trump's firings of former national security adviser Michael Flynn and former FBI Director James Comey.

Also Tuesday, the House intelligence committee gave Bannon another week to negotiate the terms of a closed-door interview as the White House has put limits on what he can tell Congress. Bannon was under subpoena to appear Tuesday as part of the panel's Russia probe, but Republicans pushed the deadline to next week as talks about the terms of his interview continued.

California Rep. Adam Schiff, the top Democrat on the intelligence panel, said Bannon's lawyer has told the committee that the White House will only permit him to answer 14 "yes" or "no" questions. He said Bannon is barred by the White House from

talking about matters during the presidential transition, his time at the White House and communications with Trump since he left in August.

Schiff said the panel is in rare bipartisan agreement that the terms offered are unacceptable.

"Should Bannon maintain his refusal to return and testify fully to all questions, the committee should begin contempt proceedings to compel his testimony," Schiff said.

Despite unity on the Bannon interview, partisan tensions continued to run high on the committee as lawmakers issued their dueling memos.

Schiff and other Democrats have raised questions about whether the committee chairman, Republican Rep. Devin Nunes of California, coordinated with the White House in drafting the GOP memo. After the document's release last week, the president quickly seized on it to vent his grievances against the nation's premier law enforcement agencies and said it "totally vindicates" him in the Russia investigations.

Publix reverses, will cover HIV prevention drug for workers

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. — The Southeast's largest supermarket chain announced Tuesday that it is changing its employee prescription plan to cover a drug that helps prevent HIV infections, remedying an omission that doctors and gay rights groups said was highly unusual.

Publix announced its change in a Twitter reply to Florida state Rep. Carlos Guillermo Smith, an Orlando-area Democrat who had met with company officials Monday to discuss their refusal to cover Truvada for PrEP. The 6-year-old drug is more than 95 percent effective in preventing the contraction of human immunodeficiency virus, which can cause AIDS. It is usually prescribed to HIV-negative gay men and other people at higher risk of infection.

The issue came to light again recently when a website, The Body, noted that a former Publix employee had been denied coverage for PrEP. The Associated Press began reporting on the issue last week but Publix did not respond to numerous calls and detailed messages at that time.

Smith tweeted about his meeting with Publix officials late Monday night, saying they confirmed the decision not to cover the drug but would not say if it "was based solely on cost or some absurd moral objection they have to PrEP."

Early Tuesday, Publix

replied that it had reconsidered its position and would cover PrEP, saying the company is "committed to the health and well-being of our associates and families." It issued a statement reiterating its Twitter reply Tuesday afternoon.

Publix officials told Smith during the meeting that the company doesn't usually cover prescriptions to treat a condition an employee might get in the future, but he pointed out it does cover birth control. He said he walked through a situation where an HIV-negative employee is in a relationship with someone who is HIV-positive. Covering the employee's PrEP is both morally and financially sound, he said.

"I think they know and understand that this is the right thing to do for their employees," said Smith, Florida's only openly gay legislator.

HIV specialists and gay rights groups say the drug is almost universally covered by large employers who provide prescription drug coverage for their workers. Gilead Sciences, its manufacturer, estimated U.S. usage at 120,000 people last year.

Dr. David Holland, chief clinical officer for communicable diseases at the Fulton County Board of Health in Atlanta, said that since 2015 the county's HIV prevention program has prescribed Truvada for PrEP 255 times. He confirmed that the former Publix employee, a Georgia resident, had been denied coverage — the only such

case he'd seen. Holland said some patients take it for a short time when they are at highest risk; others, for years.

The former employee told the AP last week that he left Publix at the end of 2016 after being with the company for a year, primarily over the drug issue. He said his new employer pays for his PrEP prescription, which costs about \$1,500 a month for individual buyers. Insurance companies typically negotiate discounts with pharmacies. The man asked that his name and occupation be withheld to protect his privacy.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says the average lifetime cost of treating a person who becomes HIV positive at 35 is \$449,000. That does not include treating anyone else the person might infect.

Publix has 188,000 employees at 1,169 stores in Florida, Alabama, Georgia, the Carolinas, Tennessee and Virginia. The chain usually scores well on surveys of customer and employee satisfaction but has received low scores from the Human Rights Campaign, a gay rights group. It called Tuesday's decision "a positive step."

Smith said Publix scores low with the group because it does not include protections for gay or transgender people in its anti-discrimination policies and didn't recognize same-sex relationships until just before gay marriage became legal in Florida.

Best stock picks

Dear Mr. Berko: Please recommend about 10 stocks that are not well-known on Wall Street, are seldom touted by research departments and have, in your opinion, good appreciation potential over the next 18 to 24 months. I'm comfortable with low to moderate risk. — DB, Fort Walton Beach, Fla.

Dear DB: My friend Ossie Ollum, an old college classmate I've kept in touch with, thinks he's a stock maven. He gave me a bunch of issues last week and told me to watch them for a year. He believes that this portfolio could provide a 33 percent total return in 18 months. I chose nine issues. I'll profile the others next week.

Tailored Brands (TLRD-\$23.47) is a specialty apparel retailer that owns Men's Wearhouse, Jos. A. Bank, Joseph Abboud plus 40 retail dry cleaning, laundry and hairloomng facilities. TLRD also sells work uniforms to the airline postal, banking and health care industries under its Twin Hill, Alexandra and Yaffy brands. The 72-cent dividend yields 3.1 percent. Improving revenue growth and good earnings should enable a dividend increase to 80 cents and a stock price increase to the \$29-\$30 level this year.

Boise Cascade (BCC-\$42.15) is an integrated wood products manufacturer and building materials distributor. BCC also makes engineered wood products and plywood used in new homes and residential repairs. This was a \$4.4 billion-revenue company in 2017 and may be a \$4.7 billion one this year after a projected 19 percent increase in earnings, to \$2.22 a share. BCC shares

don't pay a dividend, but they could readily trade in the high \$40s to low \$50s this year.

Pilgrim's Pride (PPC-\$30) is the world's largest chicken processor, with \$9.1 billion in revenues from chicken feet, livers, gizzards, wings, beaks (used in powdered form as an aphrodisiac), necks, eyeballs and tongues. And the feathers, after being cleaned, are used in pillows and blankets. The eyes are used decoratively. There's no dividend, but an anticipated 21 percent improvement in 2018 earnings might spur PPC to trade in the low \$40s.

Covenant Transportation Group (CVTI-\$29) is a provider of expedited long-haul freight transportation, using two-person travel teams in transcontinental lanes. CVTI's \$700 million worth of activities also include refrigerated cross-border regional brokerage. Though it doesn't pay a dividend, improved metrics this year may give it a \$36-\$37 price tag.

Oshkosh (OSK-\$92) makes and markets commercial fire and emergency apparatus and military trucks under the Oshkosh, Pierce and McNeilus trademarks. OSK is a \$7 billion-revenue company with operations in Mexico, the United Kingdom, the Netherlands and Sweden. Future earnings look impressive, and the shares are

making new highs. Many are looking for earnings and sales growth to accelerate in the next two years, perhaps pushing the price to \$125. The 84-cent dividend yields 0.91 percent.

Posco (PKX-\$83) is a \$50 billion-revenue South Korean iron and steel company, the third-largest in the world. The \$2 dividend yields 2.6 percent, and analysts say it could be \$2.90 in three years if earnings reach \$12 a share on \$160 billion in revenues. PKX could trade at \$220 by 2021.

Beacon Roofing Supply (BECN-\$61) is a \$4.5 billion distributor of residential and commercial roofing products in the U.S. and Canada. Various acquisitions have tripled revenues and actually improved net profit margins by 21 percent. This is a small, quiet growth company with a \$28 target range in 18 months.

Greencore Group (GNCGY-\$12) is homeported in Dublin, which is the wealthiest capital in the world. GNCGY sells food products primarily from the U.K. Its food is a real gustatory experience. The 25-cent dividend paid from 83 cents in share earnings is expected to rise this year, and the stock could trade in the high teens.

Triton International (TRTN-\$38) acquires, leases, re-leases and sells intermodal containers. The \$1.80 dividend yields 5.9 percent, and revenues are rising. TRTN's equipment consists primarily of dry freight containers, refrigerated containers, tank containers and chassis, and the stock has a first-year target of \$47.

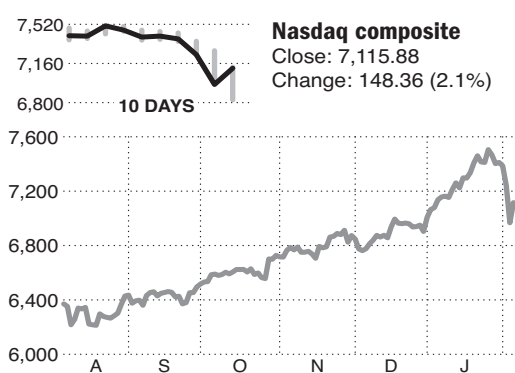
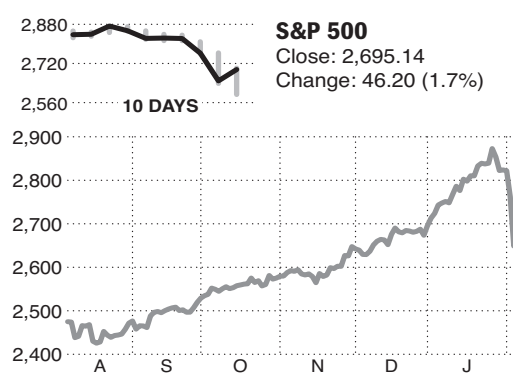

32 Russians appeal to CAS seeking Olympic spots

CAS added that as well as short-track speedskating great Ahn, the 32 include world cross-country skiing champion Sergei Ustyugov and world biathlon champion Anton Shipulin.

Also on the list are former NHL players Sergei Plotnikov, Anton Belov and Valeri Nichushkin, who had been considered possible candidates for the Russian team in Pyeongchang.

If figure skater Ksenia Stolbova is invited, she could compete as soon as Friday morning in the pairs short program component of the team event.

Some of the 32 Russians are already in Far East countries like Japan so they will be acclimatized

and ready to travel to Pyeongchang if invited.

John Coates, the Australian IOC member who also oversees CAS operations, said Tuesday that the 32 had also filed appeals in Swiss courts, but didn't give details.

The IOC hasn't said why any of the individual Russians weren't invited, but did say it used a newly available database detailing past doping when it decided who should be eligible.

The World Anti-Doping Agency's athlete committee on Tuesday expressed its "profound disappointment and dismay" that 28 Russian athletes last week had doping bans from the 2014 Olympics overturned at CAS. The athletes want a "comprehensive review" of how the investigation by lawyer Richard McLaren into Russia's doping

conspiracy was handled.

"We share the distress, uncertainty and frustration expressed by many athletes on the news of this ruling and believe this decision to be a massive setback for clean sport," the WADA athlete committee said. "We cannot lose sight of the extent nor the scale of the efforts that Russian authorities and athletes engaged in to cheat the anti-doping system. Thus, we call for stronger leadership from sport to protect clean athletes and their right to doping-free sport."

"It is vital that athletes, countries, teams and officials that cheat be held fully accountable and sanctioned accordingly."

The IOC is refusing to invite 13 of the 28 athletes that are still active to Pyeongchang.

UN experts: Islamic State militants still pose world threat

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — U.N. experts say the Islamic State extremist group still poses "a significant and evolving threat around the world" despite recent setbacks in Iraq, Syria and the southern Philippines that forced the militants to relinquish strongholds. The report to the Security Council circulated Tuesday said IS "has lost its focus on conquering and holding territory" but is continuing "to give prominence to external attacks."

The experts said the extremist group is now organized "as a global network" with "less operational control over its affiliates" and some members reportedly willing to work with al-Qaida networks "to support one another's attacks."

As a result, the fight against IS militants is entering a new phase with more focus on "less visible networks of individuals and cells acting with a degree of autonomy."

Snow forces Eiffel Tower closure as bad weather hits France

PARIS (AP) — The Eiffel Tower has been closed because of bad weather conditions

amid snowfall that has covered the French capital.

Visitors had to admire the snow-covered wrought iron lattice tower from the now-white fields covered near the Paris monument, clutching umbrellas as the snow continued all day Tuesday.

French meteorologists report that snowfall accumulation in Paris could reach about four inches by the end of the day.

Twenty-eight French departments, including eight in the Paris region, have been placed on orange alert over the dangerous weather conditions and ice on the roads. School buses in two regions near Paris won't operate Wednesday.

Deadly earthquake strikes Taiwan; shelters opened

TAIPEI, Taiwan — A magnitude-6.4 earthquake struck Tuesday near the coast of Taiwan, killing two people and injuring more than 200 others, officials said.

The ground floor of the Marshal Hotel in Hualien county caved in, causing the death of one employee. Another person died in a residential building, the national fire and rescue service reported.

Other buildings shifted on their foundations and rescuers used ladders, ropes and cranes to get

residents to safety.

Taiwanese media reported that a separate hotel known as the Beautiful Life Hotel was tilting. The agency also posted photos showing a road fractured in several parts.

Bridges and some highways were closed pending inspections after buckling due to the force of the quake.

With aftershocks continuing, shell-shocked residents were being directed to shelters, including a newly built baseball stadium, where beds and hot food were provided.

Speaking from a crisis

center in Taipei, Cabinet spokesman Hsu Kuo-yung said rail links appeared to be unaffected and the runway of Hualien airport was intact.

"We're putting a priority on Hualien people being able to return home to check on their loved ones," Hsu said.

The U.S. Geological Survey said the quake struck late Tuesday about 13 miles northeast of Hualien, on the island's east coast. It occurred at a depth of about 6 miles.

The earthquake followed one over the weekend off the coast of Hualien,

which lies along the famed "Pacific Rim of Fire" known for seismic activity from Alaska to Southeast Asia.

The quake came exactly two years after a magnitude-6.4 quake struck southern Taiwan, causing the collapse of an apartment complex and the deaths of 115 people.

Five people involved in the construction of the complex were later found guilty of negligence and given prison sentences.

A magnitude-7.6 quake in central Taiwan killed more than 2,300 people in 1999.

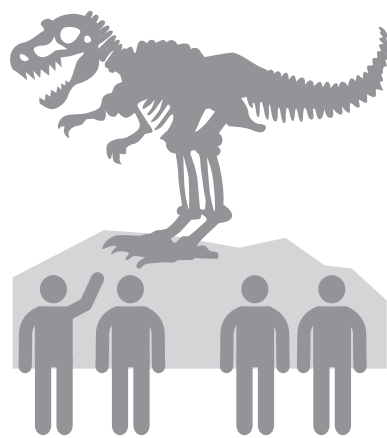

Song and composer both are free at last

In 1962, Martin Luther King Jr. came to Cincinnati to speak at a banquet for friend and fellow civil rights leader Fred Shuttlesworth.

Hotels were filled, so Shuttlesworth turned to his congregation's music minister for help. Louise Shropshire and her husband, Robert, opened their home to King.

"She could sing well, she could play well, she could cook well," recalled Patricia Massengill, one of Shuttlesworth's daughters.

And Louise Shropshire could write well, too — extremely well. What many people in her own church and city did not know then was that she enjoyed a national reputation as an accomplished composer of gospel music.

Her most famous hymn, *If My Jesus Wills*, is the likely source from which singer Pete Seeger derived the civil rights anthem *We Shall Overcome* when he heard it sung by striking African-American tobacco workers in the late 1940s.

The decades-long efforts to publicize Shropshire and her song received a big boost in recent weeks. A federal district court in New York on Jan. 26 oversaw a negotiated settlement that places *We*

Shall Overcome in the public domain. The song is now free from six-figure rights fees that kept it from being heard in feature films and incomplete writing credit that shrouded Shropshire's key contribution to the civil rights movement, her supporters say.

We Shall Overcome, the song that helped define the civil rights movement, the song that the Library of Congress labeled "the most powerful song of the 20th century," has itself been freed.

"She wrote *If My Jesus Wills* to comfort her own broken heart," said her grandson, Robert A. Goins Shropshire, 52, a record producer living and working in the Los Angeles area. "I think her hope would be for people to use it and never have to pay for it again."

Louise Shropshire published *If My Jesus Wills* in 1942 and had it copyrighted in 1954.

The lawsuit was filed by Butler Films, which produced the 2013 film *The Butler*, and a non-profit called the We Shall Overcome Foundation that had been created by Isaias Gamboa. Gamboa and Robert A. Goins Shropshire were bandmates in the 1990s.

Shropshire told Gamboa that his grandmother's last words to him before she died in 1993 were, "Someday, somebody's gonna do somethin' with all my music."

MISSOURI Union: A man is charged with first-degree murder in the death of his girlfriend's 2-year-old son. Police say Austin Stonebarger had been using methamphetamine

and admitted pushing the child, causing him to hit his head.

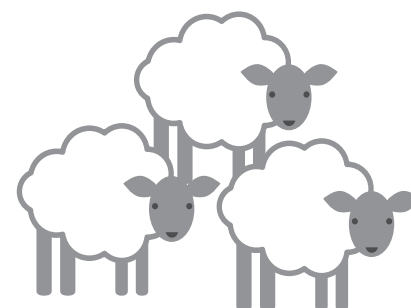

Hemp oil for arthritis treatment requires investigation

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have severe pain from osteoarthritis. I am able to get some relief with one tablet of 5/325 Norco a day. My doctor is trying to wean me off Norco, and some days I can manage with a half-tablet. To help control my pain, I have been using hemp oil with the Norco. I take up to three tablets a day. Hemp oil seems to be a new trend in combating severe arthritis pain. Would you please comment on this? — E.B.

ANSWER: Osteoarthritis is the most common form of arthritis. While there is no cure, the pain often can be managed with judicious exercise, pain relievers like Tylenol and anti-inflammatory medicines like naproxen (Aleve) and ibuprofen.

Opiates, like hydrocodone (Norco is a brand of a combination of acetaminophen and hydrocodone), are not usually used for people with osteoarthritis; they are less effective, have serious side effects, can lead to physiological tolerance and tend to lose effect over time. Some joints affected

with osteoarthritis are treated with joint replacement.

Hemp oil contains many components of Cannabis sativa (marijuana), depending on the plant and on how it is extracted. No hemp oil sold legally in the U.S. contains THC, the primary chemical in marijuana responsible for the euphoria or "high." However, other components of hemp oil have been shown to improve arthritis pain and inflammation. There is not yet enough high-quality data for me to recommend using hemp oil to treat arthritis. Further, it is difficult to

know whether one is buying hemp oil with high amounts of cannabidiol (one component proven to have some potential for benefit).

Despite the unknowns, hemp oil has some promise and should be further studied. Opiates like hydrocodone are not a good choice.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I would really like some information about trigeminal neuralgia. I have had this problem for about six weeks, and it is very painful at times. For about two weeks, I was on gabapentin, but it didn't help. My primary doctor didn't want me to take this, but can't seem to tell me much about this condition. — C.F.

ANSWER: Trigeminal neuralgia is a type of facial pain. It is more common in women and in older people. Most cases are caused by an artery deep in the brain compressing the trigeminal nerve. The major symptom is sharp, intermittent pain in the distribution of one of the three branches of the trigeminal nerve: forehead and scalp (called V1); cheek and upper

lip (V2); and ear and jaw (V3). Some people have constant pain, and the severity is variable, but it can be excruciating.

Most primary care physicians have never seen more than a handful of cases, if any, and may not be current on treatment, so I would strongly suggest finding an expert in the condition.

Medications can help: antiseizure medicines, like carbamazepine (Tegretol) or oxcarbazepine (Trileptal), can reduce the severity of the pain, but medical treatment usually is only partially effective. People who do not get adequate relief from pain medication (and it may take a long time to find the right medicine, or more likely combination of medicines, at the right doses) should consider evaluation for surgical treatment. The most effective surgical treatment is microvascular decompression, which is usually effective, but its benefit may not last forever.

Even without treatment, some people will gradually get better, only to relapse at a later time.

DEAR REQUIRES COMPANIONSHIP: I think it would be not only selfish but cruel to tell your husband you want to seek another relationship. How would you feel if you were in his position, unable to walk or talk, and he said that to you?

As to my giving you permission to date, that's something that should be between you and your conscience or higher power, not Dear Abby.

Should he duck a diamond now, the defense would lead another spade, forcing him to reduce his

trump length to the same as East's. He would not be able to get off the board safely after ruffing a diamond and he would lose control of the hand.

South led a low club at trick three to dummy's king as West ducked his ace. Three rounds of hearts came next, drawing trumps, and leaving this position:
