overnment officials take a certain amount of pride in planning and completing public works projects.

That's why Inverness officials are inviting the public to the unveiling of their newly completed project a \$17 million wastewater treatment facility.

The public can attend a ribbon-cutting ceremony and open house from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday at the facility off U.S. 41, just south of the fairgrounds. The public is invited to tour the facility

during Saturday's festivities. City Manager Frank Di-Giovanni recently told City Council members the proj-



ect is one to be proud of.

"I think you're going to be very pleasantly surprised by the appearance and the qualities that have been built into that system," he said. "You're going to really be proud of what's been designed and built."

The new plant replaces the city's old wastewater treatment system and is more environmentally friendly.

## Paranoia mounting over spill

## Reports of oil washing ashore are unfounded

GRAND ISLE, La. — People along the Gulf Coast have spent weeks living with uncertainty, wondering where and when a huge slick of oil might come ashore, ruining their beaches and their livelihoods.

The anxiety is so acute that some are seeing and smelling oil where there is none. And even though the dead turtles and jellyfish washing ashore along the Gulf of Mexico are clean, and scientists have yet to determine what killed them, many are just sure the flow of crude unleashed by the explosion at BP's Deepwater Horizon is the culprit.

Calm seas Tuesday helped cleanup crews working to fight the oil gushing from the well a mile below the surface, allowing them to put out more containment equipment and repair some booms damaged in rough weather over the weekend. They also hoped to again try to burn

some of the oil on the water's surface Tuesday afternoon.

A Coast Guard official said forecasts showed the oil wasn't expected to come ashore until at least Thursday.

"It's a gift of a little bit of time. I'm not resting," U.S. Coast Guard Rear Adm. Mary Landry said.

Near Port Fourchon, southwest of New Orleans, workers for contractor Wild Well Control were busy welding and painting a massive containment device. BP spokesman John Curry said would be deployed on the seabed by Thursday.

That wasn't much comfort to the hotel owners, fishing boat captains and others who rely on the ocean to make a living.

"The waiting is the hardest part. The not knowing," said Dodie Vegas, 44, who runs the Bridge Side Cabins complex in Grand Isle, a resort and recreational fishing community that's iust about as far south in Louisiana as you can go. So far, two fishing rodeos have been canceled, and 10 guests have canceled their rooms.

The Deepwater Horizon exploded April 20, killing 11 workers and sending hundreds of

## Politicos say sheriff should resign post

## Nugent says he's staying put

BROOKSVILLE — The calls for Sheriff Richard Nugent to resign his position and devote himself full-time to running for the 5th District Congressional seat got stronger Tuesday.

Democrat Jim Piccillo is sending Nugent a letter today asking him to make up his mind — stay on as sheriff or devote his full energy to the race.

The people of Hernando County shouldn't suffer because of his political ambitions," Piccillo said.

Nugent, calling from Washington, D.C., where he has been since Monday, said he has no plans of resigning. He dismissed critics who say he won't be a fulltime sheriff and would shortchange taxpayers.

Much of his campaigning will be done on weekends and evenings and the day-to-day activities associated with the race will be handled by his campaign

"Our goal is to grow leaders within the sheriff's office, and we have some great ones currently on staff who keep me apprised, Nugent said.

## WH pushes to lift liability limit for Gulf spill

## Obama emphasises taxpayers won't foot bill for clean-up

WASHINGTON — The White House is pushing to lift the limit on how much BP pays for the Gulf Coast oil spill.

Press Secretary Robert Gibbs said Tuesday the administration wants to work with Congress to change a law that caps at \$75 million BP's liability for economic damages like lost wages or dwindling tourist dollars.

BP PLC is responsible for all cleanup costs under the Oil Pollution Act, but Gibbs said that other costs could easily top \$75 million.

Democratic Sen. Robert Menendez of New Jersey is co-sponsoring a measure that would raise the liability limit to \$10 billion. Menendez also wants it to be made retroactive so it can apply to the huge spill that began after an oil rig exploded in the Gulf on April 20.

Gibbs said the administration supported Menendez's attempts to raise the limit retroactively. He also noted that if BP is found to have acted negligently or violated the law, the cap would not be in effect. The Oil Pollution Act was passed in 1990 in response to the Exxon Valdez spill.

Menendez said he was confident that the liability measure could be applied retroactively. He cited the 30-year-old Superfund law that has forced companies to pay for previously polluted hazardous waste

"This is about making Big Oil responsible for its excesses," Menen-

"I don't trust Big Oil," added Sen. Frank Lautenberg, D-N.J., another one of the bill's co-sponsors.

BP CEO Tony Hayward declined to comment on the bill.

Asked whether the company expected to spend money beyond the \$75 million limit, Hayward said the cap was largely irrelevant.

"It's got nothing to do with caps. All legitimate claims ... will be honored," he said.

BP says on its website that it is committed to paying "all necessary and appropriate cleanup costs" as well as "legitimate and objectively verifiable claims for other loss and damage caused by the spill."

Hayward said the company was also providing \$25 million block grants to Louisiana, Mississippi, Al-

The federal government also maintains an Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund supported by industry fees. It can make a total of \$1 billion in payouts per incident to individuals, businesses and governments.

Roughly 2.6 million or more gallons has spilled into the Gulf since the April 20 blast that sunk an oil rig and killed 11 workers.

President Barack Obama has said repeatedly that taxpayers will not be on the hook for the massive oil spill, which threatens the Gulf Coast. But prior to Tuesday, the administration hadn't staked out a position on how the liability limit might be dealt

## **Committee to hold** hearing on oil spill

WASHINGTON — Senate Commerce Committee Chairman Jay Rockefeller says he will hold a hearing on the Gulf oil spill in the coming weeks.

The West Virginia Democrat joins other congressional panels that are looking into the spill. Next week, the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee and the House Energy and Commerce Committee are both planning hearings. Rockefeller hasn't yet set a date for his hearing.

He calls the spill "an unmitigated disaster." Earlier Tuesday, he said he would have a hard time voting for offshore drilling again.

## **BP** announces grants for states

MOBILE, Ala. — An executive with BP PLC is saying that the company has announced \$25 million grants for four Gulf coast states affected by the oil

**BP Chief Operating Office** Doug Suttles said Tuesday that he hopes the grants will help Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Florida cut through red tape to get money to communities and people impacted by the spill.

Suttles also said there have been more than 10,000 volunteers and about 3,500 have been trained to help with the cleanup. He says they are offering to pay the volunteers but some have refused the money.

Officials have received more than 1,000 applications for boats to join in the cleanup, and already have about 500 boats in the program. Over 1,000 people have also showed up to remove debris from beaches that could be impacted.

## **Ex-Levy official gets jail**

## Yearty sentenced to 33 months behind bars

A judge ordered third-generation County Commissioner Sammy Yearty to serve 33 months in federal prison, followed by three years' probation, and pay \$10,300 in fines for soliciting and accepting a part of a \$10,000 bribe from an undercover FBI agent posing as a developer

and then lying to the FBI about it.

Yearty, who has held office since being appointed in 1978 by then-Gov. Reubin Askew, was sentenced on Monday afternoon in Gainesville by federal District Chief Judge Stephan P. Mickle, after a string of supporters testified to his many kindnesses and the good job he has done in office.

Yearty's father and grandfather were also county commissioners. Mickle, who earlier sentenced Commissioner Tony Parker to six months house arrest and five years' probation on bribery charges, told Yearty "your actions were different." Parker had only encountered the undercover FBI agent once be-

Gainesville hotel suite, where the lying to the FBI in an interview. agent gave Parker \$4,000 and Yearty \$6,000 to pay for a weekend trip to New York City in December 2007.

"Behind closed doors, you took a large amount of money," Mickle said. And he told the commissioner he worked to keep it secret. The iudge condemned "the self-dealing of officials that is damaging to the public's faith.'

Mickle said, "The sentence reflects the seriousness of the offense."

This is the second of three cases in the FBI's investigation into corruption in Levy County. The third person charged in the Levy County case, Pamela Blair, goes on trial on June 1 fore attending a dinner in a in Mickle's court. She is accused of

Yearty, Parker and Blair were indicted on Oct. 20, 2008, but the document was sealed to prevent the news from influencing the Nov. 4, 2008, general election. After Yearty and Parker won re-election, the indictment was unsealed on Nov. 5, and Gov. Charlie Crist suspended them from office. Crist's office has maintained that it is up to the state Senate, under Florida law, to decide the question of removing the convicted commissioners from office. The Senate is not expected to take action until all appeals have been exhausted.

PENSACOLA — Florida Gov. Charlie Crist said Tuesday it is "within the realm of possibility" that the state will sue BP PLC over any damage the Gulf oil spill causes.

Crist made the comment after meeting with workers at the Escambia County emergency operations center. He said a decision would come soon. BP announced Tuesday that it was giving the state an initial \$25 million to cover costs its incurred preparing for the oil's arrival

Crist said that while it remains unclear when the spill might reach Florida or what its effect would be, the state needs to be prepared. The state Department of **Environmental Protection** says no landfall is expected in Florida through Thursday. The department is taking air and water samples and about 20 miles of boom has been laid off the Panhandle coast to protect environmentally sensitive areas.

Crist has declared a state of emergency in 19 counties from Escambia in the Panhandle to Sarasota in southwest Florida.

"The last thing we want to be criticized for is not doing enough," Crist said. "I always prefer to be criticized for doing too much.'

Crist then flew over the slick and said it seemed much bigger than it had when he flew over it Thursday. He then went into a meeting with emergency officials in Mobile, Ala.

Crist said that though the Panhandle would likely see the first effects from the spill, the entire state should be prepared. He pointed out that in a worst-case scenario, currents could carry the oil down the state's Gulf coast, through the Keys and then up the Atlantic coast.

"I don't want to be an alarmist, but I want to be a realist. And I just think we all need to be prepared to do whatever we can to protect our state. It's precious," Crist said.

The spill began April 20 when a drilling rig exploded off the coast of Louisiana, killing 11 workers. It has been spewing up to 200,000 gallons of oil per day into the Gulf with little to no relief expected for at least another week. The spill now covers

thousands of square miles.

The state's fishing industry has already been damaged - the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration on Sunday shut down commercial and recreational fishing from Louisiana to parts of the Florida Panhandle, saying the closure would last for at least 10 days. The ban could be expanded as the spill spreads.

U.S. District Judge Richard Smoak ruled Friday that the law violates free speech rights.

Smoak ruled in favor of a Tallahassee man. Robert Bravshaw, who challenged the law with help from the American Civil Liberties Union.

Brayshaw had been charged with violating the law for posting on a website the address and cell phone number along with criticism of a Tallahassee police officer.

The charge was dismissed because the state violated Florida's speedy trial law.

## Three charged with packing cats in boxes







## **David** Forman, 65

JEWISH HUMAN RIGHTS LEADER

JERUSALEM — Rabbi David Forman, founder of Rabbis for Human Rights, a prominent group defending Palestinians, has died, a colleague said Tuesday.

Forman was 65. He died Monday in a hospital in Dallas, Texas, where he was undergoing treatment, said Rabbi Arik Ascherman, current leader of the human rights group.

Forman founded Rabbis for Human Rights in 1988 and led it until 1992. He served as its chairman again from 2002-03.

A Reform Jewish rabbi, he was director of the Israel office of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, the Reform umbrella group. He moved to Israel in 1972.

'Rabbi Forman was a mentor and a moral compass for several generations of rabbis and Jews around the world" through his work in human rights, Ascherman told The Associated Press.

Rabbis for Human Rights leads regular protests against the demolition of Palestinian homes and uprooting of olive trees in the West Bank.

TOKYO — The world's oldest person, a Japanese woman on the southern island of Okinawa, has died a week before her 115th birthday, a spokeswoman said Wednesday.

Kama Chinen, who witnessed three centuries, died Sunday, according to Kaoru Shijima, a spokeswoman at her care facility.

## 1800s: he was the first black to graduate from Oberlin College, the first black lawyer in New York state and the first black professor at Howard University. But in his home state of Pennsylvania, where Vashon grew up and studied law, he was twice rejected from practicing law because he was black. On Tuesday, more than 160 years after Vashon applied to be admitted to the Allegheny County bar, the

state Supreme Court ordered that he be posthumously admitted practice law in Pennsylvania. Vashon's relatives and a Pittsburgh attorney who heard about Vashon's story had asked the court earlier this year to do just that.

"I think it's very important not just as a family matter, it goes far beyond family," said Nolan N. Atkinson Jr., Vashon's great grandson and a lawyer in Philadelphia. Vashon was born in

Carlisle in 1824, and his family later moved to Pittsburgh, where he grew up. At 16, he was admitted to Oberlin College and graduated with a bachelor of arts degree in 1844. He came back to Pitts-

burgh and studied law under a judge, which was customary at the time. But when Vashon sought admission to practice law in Allegheny County in 1847, he was rejected because of his "negro descent."

After, he moved to New York where he became the state's first black lawyer and opened a practice in Syracuse.

The changes would force car companies to meet new safety standards and face stiff penalties for failing to report defects.

## Stocks tumble as new doubts about Greek finances emerge

NEW YORK — Stocks plunged around the world Tuesday as fears spread that Europe's attempt to contain Greece's debt crisis would fail. The euro fell to its lowest point against the dollar in a year.

The Dow Jones industrial average lost 225 points, its biggest drop in three months. The slide erased a 143-point gain from Monday. The Dow and broader indexes each fell more than 2 percent. Meanwhile, Treasury prices rose on increased demand for safe investments.

Stocks have seesawed in the past week as European countries' efforts to agree on a bailout package for Greece proceeded in fits and starts. An agreement finally came together over the weekend, but its ballooning size of \$144 billion has investors worried that Europe would have an even tougher time assembling an aid package if a larger country such as Spain or Portugal were to get in trouble. Traders are concerned that problems in Greece and other countries could spill over to the rest of Europe and in turn, the U.S. The market's plunge was-

n't a surprise to some analysts who have warned for weeks that stocks were due for a retreat. After MonMarket watch

Tuesday's slump marked the fifth time in six days that the Dow rose or fell by triple digits. The market's moves are reminiscent of the fearsome swings in the fall of 2008 and early 2009 when investors were panicked over how bad the recession would get.

The Dow fell 225.06, or 2 percent, to 10,926.77, its lowest close since April 7. The Dow was down as much as 283 points at its low of the dav.

The S&P 500 index fell 28.66, or 2.4 percent, to 1,173.60. As with the Dow, it was the worst drop for the S&P since Feb. 4. The Nasdaq composite

index fell 74.49, or 3 percent, to 2,424.25. The Nasdaq's more intense drop reflected the fact that it includes smaller companies seen as riskier investments than the big names in the Dow or S&P 500. Investors rushed to safer

holdings like Treasurys, pushing interest rates sharply lower. The euro again fell



## **NTSB finds lessons** in Hudson crash

WASHINGTON — A federal safety panel on Tuesday issued more than two dozen safety recommendations related to the airliner that ditched into the Hudson River after colliding with geese last year. Those include making aircraft engines more bird-resistant and equipping all passenger-carrying planes with life vests and rafts.

The National Transportation Safety Board said it was just due to chance that US Airways Flight 1549 had such equipment on board on Jan. 15, 2009, when the Airbus A320 collided with a flock of Canada geese. Captain Chesley "Sully" Sullenberger made a split-second decision to glide the airliner with 155 people aboard into the river rather than risk crashing in a densely populated area by trying to reach an airport.

The board also recommended making life vests easier for passengers to retrieve and put on correctly. Only 33 passengers reported having put on a life vest and only four completed fastening their vest; most struggled with the waist strap or chose not to secure it.

## **Intimidation feared** in mine probe

WASHINGTON — Federal officials concerned about witness intimidation said Tuesday they are setting up a second team to investigate the blast that killed 29 workers at a West Virginia coal mine.

The Mine Safety and Health Administration formed the special team of investigators to work anonymously with miners, victims' families and others who fear retaliation for speaking freely.

"The work of this special team will be part of MSHA's investigative process and it will give family members and others the opportunity to share information they might otherwise not feel comfortable passing along," the agency's director, Joe Main, said.

## **Comedian wins** 'mother-in-law' suit

LOS ANGELES — A standup comedian who was sued for making mother-inlaw jokes has had the last laugh after a federal judge threw the case out of court.

Sunda Croonquist, whose shtick for years has been to describe her life as a halfblack, half-Swedish woman who marries into a Jewish family, was sued two years ago after her mother-in-law, sister-in-law and brother-inlaw said her jokes were holding them up to public ridicule.

In a 21-page ruling issued Friday, U.S. District Judge Mary L. Cooper of New Jersey concluded that the examples they cited — including one in which Croonquist says her sister-in-law's voice sounds like a cat in heat fell under the category of protected speech.

Many of the jokes, Cooper said, were clearly statements of opinion and not fact and therefore protected by the

First Amendment.

## Pakistan native admits to Times Square bomb

NEW YORK — Seized from a plane about to fly to the Middle East, a Pakistan-born man admitted training to make bombs at a terrorism rigged an SUV with a homemade device to explode in Times Square, authorities said Tuesday.

Faisal Shahzad, a naturalized U.S. citizen who recently spent five months in Pakistan, was arrested on terrorism and weapons of mass destruction charges for trying to blow up the crude gasoline-and-propane bomb amid tourists and theatergoers Saturday evening.

He was in custody after being hauled off a Dubai-bound plane at

being placed on the federal "no-fly" list. Because Customs and Border Protection agents were on the lookout for Shahzad, they recognized his name on a passenger manifest and camp in his native land before he ordered the flight stopped so they could arrest him.

Authorities shed little light on what might have motivated Shahzad who since moving from Pakistan to Connecticut had acquired a master's degree in business administration and a house in the suburbs that subsequently was lost to foreclosure. He reportedly came from a background of privilege and wealth the son of a retired air vice marshal.

A real estate broker who worked with Shahzad in 2004 said the bomb-Kennedy Airport that he had been ing suspect had expressed a dislike ing on his own.

## Residents tell of mixed messages on whether to flee

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The Cumberland River finally began receding Tuesday, exposing mud-caked homes and submerged cars as officials searched door to door for more victims of a record-busting flash flood and weekend storm already blamed for nearly 30 deaths.

No new fatalities were reported Tuesday and it was unclear whether anyone remained missing.

The weekend deluge swept many motorists to their deaths even after forecasters and Nashville's mayor warned people not to drive. But staying put carried frightening consequences for others as the swollen Cumberland and its tributaries started pouring into thousands of homes.

"I kept watching TV; that was my source,

and (Mayor) Karl Dean was saying stay put, don't drive," Nashville resident Cheri Newlin said. Police eventually told Newlin to evacuate on Monday, but by then, the water was so close that she had to flee by boat, leaving her three cats behind. She is now at a shelter and hasn't been able to get back to her house to check on her pets and

assess damage. By Tuesday, the flash floods were blamed in the deaths of 17 people in Tennessee alone, including nine in Nashville. At least nine people died in vehicles in Tennessee. Others were found in their homes or yards, including an elderly couple discovered in Nashville home. A 21-year-old Nashville resident died when he tried to wade through the waters in front of his home

## Greek bailout leaves markets unconvinced

ATHENS, Greece — Angry Greek unionists took to the streets Tuesday to protest harsh austerity measures imposed under an international bailout to save Greece from looming bankruptcy, while financial markets were far from assured that the euro110 billion (\$144 billion) in promised loans could douse Europe's smoldering sovereign debt crisis.

About 4,000 striking teachers and students marched in Athens to protest the cuts, carrying black flags, while some scuffled with police. Earlier, about 100 Communist Party supporters broke

Acropolis, the city's chief ancient monument, and hung banners in Greek and English reading "Peoples of Europe Rise Up," to the bemusement of tourists allowed in despite the disruption.

## Woods trying to hit stride

## Golfer attempts to regain form that befits world's best

PONTE VEDRA BEACH — The 18th hole on the TPC Sawgrass is not nearly as daunting without wind, which was the case on a muggy Tuesday morning when Tiger Woods set up over the tee shot with a 3-wood in hand.

The ball never had a chance to

It started down the left side with a severe hook and splashed down some 20 yards to the left of the water's edge. With a mild curse under his breath, Woods asked his caddie for another ball.

It was his fifth ball in the water during nine holes of practice at The Players Championship.

He lost two in the water on the front nine the day before.

There have been flashes of brilliance, as always, but far more shots that hardly resemble golf from the world's best player.

"It's just a matter of ... getting my mind where it needs to be," Woods said. "And certainly, I've made a lot of adjustments in my life, and I've gone through a lot — a lot. Just trying to make sure I get everything organized so I can play.'

Woods is capable of making some form of history at just about any golf tournament, and The Players Championship is no exception. Only now, the question is whether Woods will miss the cut in consecutive tournaments for the first time

He didn't just miss the cut last week at Quail Hollow, he missed it by a mile. With a 79 in the second round — his second-highest score in his career — Woods posted his highest 36-hole total (153) in 14 years on the PGA Tour.

Two days of practice this week did little to change the notion that his game — not to mention his head is not in a good spot.

After three days of rampant specswing coach, Woods said that nothing has changed with Hank Haney, who was not at Sawgrass. Haney rarely goes to tournaments outside the majors.

The other was on Feb. 19 to make a public apology to family and friends for his serial infidelity. He never looked more uncomfortable that day in the Sunset Room of the clubhouse for a 13½-minute statement that was televised worldwide.

Emotionally, he compared the depths of his emotions to four years ago, when his father died after a long battle with cancer. Woods took nine weeks off, then returned to the U.S. Open and missed the cut for the first time in a major.

Among the differences: After missing the cut, Woods didn't finish worse than second in a stroke-play tournament for the next seven months. It's hard to envision such a performance now, not with seven balls in the water over his last 18 holes, even if it is just practice.

And if he's not feeling the pressure from within, there suddenly is an outside force — Masters champion Phil Mickelson.

For the first time since the 1997 Masters that Woods won by a record 12 shots, he is no longer the outright favorite by British bookmaker William Hills. Woods and Mickelson

DETROIT — Longtime Detroit Tigers broadcaster Ernie Harwell, beloved by generations of fans who grew up listening to his rich voice, Southern cadence and quirky phrases on the radio, has died after a months-long battle with cancer. He was 92.

Harwell died about 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday in his apartment at Fox Run Village and Retirement Center in the Detroit suburb of Novi, said his attorney and longtime friend, S. Gary Spicer.

His wife of 68 years, Lulu, and his two sons and two daughters were at his side, Spicer said.

## FIU player on 38-game streak in batter's box

MIAMI — Garrett Wittels started this year as an afterthought on the FIU baseball roster, set to be a late-inning replacement and little else.

Surprise!

He's headed for the NCAA record books.

Wittels has gone to bat in 38 games this season — and gotten a hit in every one. It's the best current stretch in the country, and according to the NCAA, marks the 10th-longest streak recorded at the Division I level. Most surprisingly, it's been put together by someone who was terrible as a

freshman at the plate a year ago. "I always knew that once I had a chance and really got into the lineup, I would-

n't get out," Wittels said.

He wasn't kidding A .246 hitter last year including a two-month stretch where he batted just .188 — Wittels is hitting .404 this season, with 39 RBIs in 38 games. And he's doing it without a set position either, having spent time this year at shortstop, second base, third base and even

pitching in three games. As far as the streak goes, well, Wittels prefers to have his bat do most of the talking. There are superstitions in baseball, foremost among them never doing anything to jinx a streak, so Wittels understandably doesn't want to

hype himself too much. Once you think you've made it, you'll go 0 for 20,' Wittels said before practice Tuesday. "You'll hit the ball hard right at people, not be able to buy a hit and you won't do anything. That's



## **Conservation conversation**

## Crystal River Middle School students take trip to teach science lessons to kindergarten students

ater conservation recently brought 38 Crystal River Middle School eighth-graders into four kindergarten classes for a lively morning of fun and education.

Deanna Hadley, a CRMS science teacher, said she, along with two other science teachers from her school, Cyndy Jones and Sherina Finley, participated in a group water conservation project.

For the project, a group of eighth-graders worked in teams to write and illustrate "Water Drop" stories to read to the kindergarteners and also took a field trip to the Rainbow River, where they pulled hydrilla, an invasive plant, from K.P. Hole near Dunnellon.

On April 27, the eighthgraders traveled to the nearby primary school to share their stories and engage the young learners in other water education activities including workbook exercises, coloring posters and creating door hangers with water-friendly messages, "so we have an action-packed hour and a half," Hadley said. The project was funded by a Southwest Florida Water Management District minigrant that she wrote.

The morning before the eighth-graders gave their presentations, they practiced reading them aloud and learned how to hold them up and review the illustrations.

Hadley said the teaching experience would help them understand "what it's like to be on the other side of the clipboard."

As for what the kindergarteners would learn, Hadley said she hoped they picked up on small ways to help save the environment, such as turning off the water while they brush their teeth.

Alyssa Bonomo, a kindergarten teacher at CRPS, said it is good for the older students to interact with the younger ones.

"Sometimes the best way to learn is to teach," Bonomo said. Hunter Roe, Brian Davis and Trevor Roberts took turns

reading from their story. Roe started, but first he took questions from Cheyenne Belcourt.

'What's your name? Can we tell all of our names? After introductions, Roe

began the story: "One hot summer day, there was a water drop named Willie. He was having a wonderful time in his pond."

After his teammates read more about Willie the water drop, Amanda Crawford, a science teacher on special assignment for Citrus County Schools, asked the kindergarteners after Willie went

into the ground what they

thought would happen next. Belcourt said he was going to "pop out in the clouds."

What made you think he was going to pop out?" Crawford asked.

'When are we going to do coloring?" Belcourt replied. Merrin Chamblin, a CRPS kindergarten teacher, said when kids teach kids, they have a tendency to learn better because they relate better. She said her students were very excited about the eighth-

Miranda Blackstock, an eighth-grader in Hadley's class, said she wasn't nervous about working with the younger students because she has younger siblings at home.

graders' visit.

"It's really fun hanging out with the kindergarteners," she

While his students probably didn't understand all about the hydrologic cycle, Miller Henderson from Jones' class said, "I think they're picking up on the easier stuff."

Hadley's class said teaching the kindergarteners was a lot

"The little kids, they're so cute. They really like to color," she said.

And she believes they learned something, too: "They got the rain; that it rains a lot.'

Cole Schneider in Ruth Smith's kindergarten class was happy to share what he had learned about water: "It comes down and it goes back up.'

Eric Lin had more questions for Danielle Nabone as she explained how water seeps into the ground.

'Think of it as a sponge when it soaks; the water sinking into the sponge is just like

percolation," she said. "Do you have any parents?" Lin asked.

'Yes, I do," she replied. "You should bring your parents here," he said.

'OK, guys, do you want to color?" she asked. "Yes, I do," he replied.

## Program explores human impact on springs

When Academy of Environmental Science students first heard they would be studying water quality and plankton diversity in Three Sisters Springs, there was apprehension mixed with confusion.

When they heard they would have the chance to teach middle school students about the research they were conducting, confusion and anxiety turned to enthusiasm and motivation. For nearly two years the Marine Science students at the Academy of Environmental Science have been conducting the research, analysis, and outreach associated with this program.

The Springs Program at the Academy has a dual purpose. In the research component of the program, students aim to understand how human impact can influence the coastal marine environment. For too long we have relied on assessing human impact through water quality. This program aims to understand how action such as over fertilization and septic tanks can influence not just the water

quality, but the animals and plants that live there. The second purpose of the program is to increase public awareness about how we influence a cherished and valued resource, our springs. Students do through hosting middle school groups for field-based and classroombased workshops in which they can showcase the program and the research they conduct. In its lifetime, the program has been a raging success. This is due in part to the funding provided by agencies such as Southwest Florida Water Management District and, more recently, the Toshiba America Foundation.

On March 4, students from the Academy were in the field conducting the research necessary to understand the relationships between water quality and plankton diversity. Students worked very hard to conduct the research in preparation for the April workshops.







## Got a date for the prom? Yes, enough to fill a bus

NEW YORK — In many high schools, the pressure is off when it comes to finding that special someone to take

to the prom. Instead, teens are going to the prom in groups so big that they sometimes arrive in buses rather than limou-

The trend is seen largely as a positive one, because it allows more kids to participate without the stress of finding a date or being part of a couple.

"They have definitely slid away from feeling that 'Oh my goodness, if I don't have a date, I can't go,' or 'If I'm not in love, I can't have a good time," said Louise Morgan, head of the Upper School at Mary Institute St. Louis Country Day School in Missouri (MICDS). Morgan estimated that 75 percent of the kids attend the prom in groups rather than as couples.

"The going-in-groups trend has allowed it to be more fun, more relaxed," she added. "Everything doesn't have to be romantically perfect like Cinderella."

'The way it used to be, when I've seen it in movies, is that the guy takes care of the girl and is expected to pay for the girl's ticket," said Adrienne Alair, a high school student who is going with a group of friends to her May 15 prom at the Northwest School of the Arts in Charlotte, N.C.

"I'm into the whole feminism thing," Adrienne added. "We buy our own ticket, go with a group of friends, and if you don't get a date, you can have fun anyway and not worry about it being a popularity contest.'

Her mom, Moira Alair, said "it's so much better than when I was a kid, when the kids went mainly as couples. This way if you're not already in a dating relationship, there's no stigma. No one needs to be left out.

"Some people had dates, some people went with a group," she said. "And it doesn't really matter who you dance with. It's a free-for-all."

Blair added that even though the couples tradition is on the decline, dressing up for prom remains a sacred rite.

'You're queen for a day,' she said. "For girls, prom is an all-day event where you get your hair done, nails done, and constant pampering."

Missi Koebler, who owns Secrets of Hairdesign Salon and Day Spa in Butler, Pa., agreed, saying that she serves "a ton of prom-goers throughout prom season, and I've definitely noticed that most of our prom clients are following the trend of going in large groups. In fact, it's very rare that we hear of any of our girls heading off to prom with just their date. Most often, we hear a lot about large dinner parties and group activities before and after the prom."

Daniel Unger, now a freshman at California State University Northridge, attended his high school prom last year in Long Beach, Calif., with two other guys. He said part of why the couples tradition is going away is that "girls who don't find dates tend to hang in groups, which makes it very hard to ask them privately. The only alternative I saw for guy who did not have a date was to approach these groups and face public rejection.

"Several students have told me that dating is just too much work. They comment that it requires more emotional and time involvement, it is a financial hardship for some men and they often prefer the ease of doing things with friends and hooking up when they so desire.'


Dating trends aside, going to the prom with a big group poses one major logistical challenge: transportation.

She added that "organizing dinner plans and transportation for a group of 21 is worse than herding cats.



Albert Einstein said, "The grand aim of all science is to cover the greatest number of empirical facts by logical deduction from the smallest number of hypotheses or axioms."

The aim in a bridge grand is to use logical deduction to win all of the tricks with the smallest number of risks. How should South play in seven spades after West leads the heart king?

Many of us would open that North hand with one diamond. Having passed, though, he described his hand well on the second round with a passed-hand jumpshift. Three diamonds was fitshowing, promising at least four-card spade support, five-plus respectable diamonds and a maximum pass.





to seven spades because real bridge players do not need Blackwood. But he decided to check that partner had the diamond ace. (If North had shown one ace, South was going to assume it was in diamonds.)

South could have impulsively discarded his club loser on dummy's ace. However, before leaping, declarer deduced the danger — a 4-0 diamond break.


He had two other choices at trick one. He could discard a diamond on the heart ace. Then he could establish a long diamond for a club discard. Or, the line that I prefer, he could play low from the dummy and ruff in hand, draw trumps, and start on diamonds. When South sees the 4-0 split, he will understand the necessity for a diamond discard on the heart ace.

Note that pitching the club nine at trick one costs the contract.
