## DVD containing porn given to student

#### Disc was suspposed to contain photo retrospective of second-grade class

A 12-year-old boy and an 8year-old girl expecting to look at a photo disc of the girl's secondgrade Rock Crusher Elementary School class saw something

According to Citrus County

Sheriff's Office spokeswoman Gail Tierney, the boy loaded the DVD, but when the adults on screen started to take their clothes off, the boy turned it off and called for his mother. At about 8 p.m., the DVD was reported to the sheriff's office.

The DVD was one of 19 discs provided by a second-grade

teacher at RCE on Tuesday and distributed to her students, Tierney said. After school officials requested Wednesday that all the other discs be returned, a sheriff's detective determined that only one disc contained inappropriate material. Tierney said the other 18 were recordable CDs and contained still photos of children in the class throughout the school year.

Tierney said the DVD, which a sheriff's detective described as adult commercial pornography, was accidentally included in the discs for the students. Tierney said the teacher made the discs and gave them to a substitute teacher to distribute for her because she had been out. The teacher and her husband

band helped her make the discs for the children. "It would appear that the rogue DVD was his," Tierney said.

Tierney said the case is still open but no criminal charges are anticipated.

"I'm just glad that the 12-yearold stopped the DVD and that the kids didn't watch it," Tierney

School district officials said a personnel investigation would be conducted. Mike Mullen, executive director of support services for the district, said the teacher is not in the classroom now.

#### Divers suit up to scrub Fish Bowl

pring window cleaning was never like this. Most people have just a little buildup of dirt and grime.

Pamela Ammon and Chris Anastasiou had to deal with something a little tougher: thick algae.

Oh, and this: Ammon and Anastasiou were underwater, wearing scuba gear, while manatees playfully rolled on by.

It's the weekly cleaning of the Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park underwater observatory, known as the Fish Bowl.

Green and brown algae sticks like glue to the Fish Bowl's outer

windows, particularly the side that

faces sunlight much of the day. That thick algae prevents visitors from seeing manatees and a variety of fish up close, which is the Fish Bowl's main purpose.

Divers who work for the Department of Environmental Protection scrub the observatory's 12 windows using the same small sponges anyone can buy at the grocery store to scrub the sink.

Park Manager Art Yerian said sponges are soft so they don't scratch the glass.

Until last December, volunteers cleaned the outer glass. Then the DEP strengthened its commercial diving regulations, requiring more training before divers can be certified.

## PDRB refuses to hear development case

A Citrus County planning board refused to hear a pair of applications Thursday to rezone 805 acres of property between Crystal River and Pine Ridge for a large housing development.

The Planning and Development Review Board agreed with county staffers that the applications did not address traffic impacts to Pine Ridge Boulevard and Turkey Oak Drive.

Without that information, board members said they saw no reason to conduct a public hear-

And without the PDRB public hearing, county commissioners won't hear the case either, assistant county attorney Peter Aare said.

That didn't sit well with Joel Tew, a New Port Richey attorney who said his clients wanted to seek the comprehensive plan change before the November

The ballot includes Amendment 4 which, if approved, would require voter support of all changes to a local government's comprehensive plan.

Tew urged board members to

hear the case so it could move forward to the county commission with either an up or down recommendation.

"If you don't like what we're doing, tell us you don't like it,"

Board member said they felt pressured.

"Why do we have to hear this because they're afraid of an elec-

man William Garvin said. The applicants sought to change the zoning on adjacent parcels from agriculture and low-density residential to residential mixed use. Although the property owners did not include a specific master plan, the application estimated about 1,500 new homes.

## Protect your children on the water

National Safe Boating Week is a perfect time to remember the importance of life jackets. National Safe Boating week is May 22-28.

The Coast Guard's director of operations policy, Rear Admiral J.W. Underwood says, "It is the parent's responsibility to keep their children safe when on the water and insisting on wearing life jackets is one of the best ways to do that.'

This is about safety and this is about logic, and laws, and most importantly, just plain-old common sense. Adults may not notice a child falling overboard right away. Children who fall in may not surface immediately. It can be difficult to locate a child in the water,

Life jackets could prevent approximately two-thirds of all boating-related drownings of children ages 14 and younger. In fact, in most states, children under 13 must wear life jackets. In Florida, it is 7 years and younger. It is the law.

In the U.S., 11 children under age 13 lost their lives while boating in 2008. Seven of these children who died in 2008 (63 percent) died from drowning.

The Coast Guard strongly recommends adults always wear life jackets as well – not only to keep themselves safe, but to demonstrate safe behavior for their children.

The U.S. Coast Guard is asking all boat owners and operators to

especially when the vessel is help reduce fatalities, injuries, under way. help reduce fatalities, injuries, property damage, and health-care costs related to recreational boating accidents by taking personal responsibility for their own safety and the safety of their passengers. Essential steps include always wearing a life jacket and requiring passengers to do the same; never boating under the influence; completing a boating safety course; and getting a free vessel safety check annually from local U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary or United States Power Squadrons vessel examiners. The U.S. Coast Guard reminds all boaters, "You're in

> For those who have not already committed, consider the following pledge and stick to it:

Command, Boat Responsibly!'

1) Wearing my life jacket and ensuring that everyone on board wears their life jacket;

2) Remaining sober and alert remembering that the use of alcohol contributes to accidents on the

3) Staying in control of my craft and respecting the right of others enjoying the waterways;

4) Knowing and obeying navigation rules, operating at a safe speed and maintaining a proper lookout.

Next time you go boating with a child, remember, they are the future. Asking them to wear a life iacket increases their safety and possibly will save their lives. Boating is a fun sport, but like all sports, when safety is ignored, danger is around the corner.

## Lab's move begins to lift mystery around NY island

GARDEN CITY, N.Y. -Hannibal Lecter the fictional villain in "Silence of the Lambs," said it sounded "charming." Author Nelson DeMille made it the centerpiece of his 1997 thriller about deadly viruses and hidden treasure.

Since the infancy of the Cold War, Plum Island has been the site of an animal disease laboratory; access is limited to scientists, support personnel and, on rare occasions, invited guests. Because of its remote location a mile and a half off the eastern tip of Long Island's north fork, it frequently has been the target of rife speculation about what really goes on there.

The general public could someday get access to the 840-acre pork chop-shaped oasis now that the federal government is moving its animal disease research functions to a new lab in Manhattan, Kan. With a "For Sale" sign about to go up at Plum Island, the General Services Administration is seeking community input on what should be done with the property. A hearing was held Wednesday in Connecticut and another is scheduled

for Thursday on Long Island. Besides the laboratory, the island is home to a defunct U.S. Army base and a charming little lighthouse that looks out onto Long Island Sound. And, as Agent Clarice Starling told Lecter: beach. Terns nest there."

DeMille, whose 1997 book "Plum Island," about a fictional detective investigating the murders of two biologists at the lab, said in an interview with The Associated Press that he'd like the government to retain ownership.


"The most obvious thing to do would be to make it into a federal park and nature preserve," he said. "You could turn the lab into a visitors center.

DeMille is hardly nostalgic about the lab's move, calling Plum Island "a terrorist target waiting to happen."

His concerns were shared by federal officials. The U.S. Government Accountability Office told Congress in a 2007 security report that Plum Island's vulnerability was apparent after the Sept. 11 terror attacks. The GAO said new laws and rules were enacted, tightening access to the facility to help protect animal health and reduce the possibility of bioterrorism. Plum Island was transferred from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Department of Homeland Security and plans were begun to replace it with a "higher-level biosecurity facility.

The GAO said Plum Island scientists research such pathogens as foot-and-mouth disease, which is highly contagious to livestock and could cause "catastrophic economic losses" and imperil

that the sale of Plum Island could fetch \$50 million to \$80 million — not counting cleanup costs. Bishop said that would hardly cover the costs of building a new \$650 million lab in Kansas.

'Before we cross a point of no return, I want everyone to open their eyes and look at what we're doing here,' Bishop said. "Rather than pour hundreds of millions of taxpayer dollars down a sinkhole in Kansas and open the Pandora's Box of decommissioning Plum Island, we should ... make use of existing facilities that continue to serve this nation well."

Last year, Congress appropriated \$32 million for a new 520,000-square-foot National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility in Kansas, most of it for planning and design, though it did order a safety study. The new lab will allow research on diseases that can be passed from animals to humans, something currently not done at Plum Island.

The safety study was prompted by some who questioned the wisdom of opening an animal disease lab in the so-called Beef Belt because hoof and mouth and other contagious diseases are researched by Agriculture Department scientists.

But for now, the move to Kansas appears on track, which leaves the future of Plum Island an open question.

"There could have been mishaps or illegal dumping or the unreported disposal of materials around the island," she said. "It's going to be fascinating to look and see what's there.'

The facility began as Fort Terry, established in 1897 as an artillery post during the Spanish-American War. It was used on and off until the end of World War II and was operated by the U.S. Army Chemical Corps from 1951 to 1954, when it was officially deactivated.

John van Courtland Moon, an author and history professor emeritus at Fitchburg State College in Massachusetts, said his research has found that animal testing for germ warfare was conducted at Plum Island in the 1950s. "The problem is the stuff

that went on is not available in the public record," he said. "Exactly what took place? I would imagine sheep, I would imagine goats and rats and rabbits" had been tested. A spokeswoman for the

U.S. Department of Homeland Security said the agency could not speak to the U.S. Army's time on the island. Ret. Col. David Huxsoll, a

veterinarian who served as the lab's director from 2000 to 2003, said anthrax was among the diseases there. "It was done in containment," he said, adding there were concerns anthrax could be used as a weapon to target the livestock industry.

"I think it's a great thing," Yerian said. "If it makes things safer, how can anyone argue with that?"

Yerian said the park utilized about 28 people involved in a local dive club to clean the windows. Since the DEP changed the requirements, the number of volunteers has dropped to eight. He said two are nearly ready for certification and another six are in the process.

Kristin Lock, a spokeswoman for the DEP's state parks, said the state pays for training.

Yerian said the dives are more organized and efficient. In the past, cleanings required just two divers and both were scrubbing windows.

Today, four people are involved: Two on the windows, a third diver in the water monitoring the two scrub-

bers and a supervisor inside the observatory who logs the activity.

Jim Lee, who supervised the Wednesday morning dive, also placed his hand up against the inside glass to let divers know outside what spots they missed. Children from a Citrus County Head

Start program got a kick out of seeing not only manatees but humans hovering at the windows.

Along with cleaning windows, divers also look beneath the Fish Bowl for items dropped into the water from the catwalk. Divers on Wednesday

found a pair of sunglasses. The scrubbing looks like hard work

and it is. "It gets a little tiring after a while,"

Ammon said. Yerian said cleanings now take place about once a week. Once volunteers are certified to dive, he hopes to

pick the pace to twice a week. "It doesn't take any time at all for

that algae to come back," he said. The DEP divers are out of the Tampa and Orlando field offices. Most of their jobs involve mapping sea grasses or conducting research.

"This," Anastasiou said, "is the only window job we have.'

#### Officials warn of rise in distemper cases

Citrus County Animal Control has noticed an apparent increase in wildlife distemper cases in the county, a phenomenon occurring in some other counties in the region also. Animal control officers have been responding to raccoons and foxes wandering listlessly in the daylight and showing unusual neurological

In Citrus, there appears to be more retrieval of infected animals from the east side of the county, with a heavy concentration in the Hernando Highlands area.

Citrus County Animal Services veterinarian Dr. Julie Rosenberger said she was able to speak with a colleague at the University of Florida's Maddie's Shelter Medicine Program and that they, too, were experiencing increased cases

A recent increase in canine distemper infection in wildlife has UF veterinarians worried about a recurrence of an outbreak that killed more than 600 dogs in Alachua County three years ago.

Rosenberger said the threat is serious because distemper is highly contagious and she recommends all owners make sure that their dogs have been vaccinated for distemper.

The existing ramp was rebuilt for the county by Tedder Systems. It is the third public boat ramp to be rebuilt recently by Tedder that was paid for with Florida Boating Improvement Funds.

An undercover child pornography investigation led to the arrest of a father and son Wednesday morning in Homosassa.

According to arrest reports, a detective with the Citrus County Sheriff's Office began an investigation in April to locate individuals who were possibly distributing child pornography on the Internet. During the investigation, the detective identified an Internet protocol (IP) address possibly from Homosassa that was distributing child pornog-

The detective reportedly downloaded a couple of files from the IP address, which depicted images of child pornography. Authorities sub-

the Internet service account holder's information, which came Randy back for Gene Concar Jr., 18, of 6426 W. Appian St., in Homosassa.

Deputies executed a search warrant at the house and first spoke with Concar's father, Randy Gene Concar Sr., 60. He report-

edly told law enforcement that he reportedly told law enforcement he lived in a camper in the back of the house and that the Internet was in his son's name. According to the report, the father said that he had a computer in his camper, but denied downloading child pornography.

Authorities then spoke with Concar Jr., who reportedly admitted to downloading the child pornography. According to the report, Concar Jr. said he had a problem and knew it was against the law to download poenaed Bright House Networks the files. He told deputies where he

At issue was whether the applicants, George Southworth and Midwest Systems Inc., provided a study to show the potential traffic impacts to Turkey Oak Drive and Pine Ridge Boulevard.

County planners said they were in the process of doing that but the information was not provided.

Don Lacey, with Coastal Engineering of Brooksville, said he met with county officials and was told a trafficimpact study was needed for the intersection of U.S. 19 and State Road 44. He said planners then asked for a similar report for Turkey Oak and Pine Ridge Boulevard.

Tew said the application would limit access to Pine Ridge Boulevard to 32 homes. The development would be configured so that the remaining traffic would enter and exit onto Turkey Oak.

Regardless, the board voted unanimously to not conduct the public hearing.

Aare said comprehensive plan amendments require two public hearings — one with the PDRB first and a second with the county commission.


While the situation was unusual, Aare said he didn't think county commissioners could hear the applications.

"We haven't had the first public hearing yet," he said. Tew, a land-use attorney, said after the vote that did-

n't seem fair.

"I don't understand how an advisory planning board can block an application," he said. "I don't know the answer to that."



## **Astronaut gives Isaac Newton** a cosmic view of Earth

CAPE CANAVERAL Sir Isaac Newton is getting the royal treatment in space, thanks to the Britishborn astronaut who carried up a picture of the 17th century scientist and a chip from his famous apple tree.

Atlantis astronaut Piers Sellers said Thursday that he placed Newton's picture in the glassed-in dome of the International Space Station — the best seat in the gravity-less house. views of Earth are stupendous from there.

"Sir Isaac absolutely loved it, I've got to tell you,' Sellers said in an interview with The Associated Press. "We had him in the window, and he got to watch his little wood chip float by and ponder the laws of gravitation and everything, so I think it was a treat for him.'

The Royal Society of London provided Sellers with the 4-inch sliver of wood, which he took with him into orbit aboard the shuttle. It's inscribed with Newton's initials and, according to the society, came from the actual tree in England from which an apple fell nearly 350 years ago and inspired Newton to discover the law of gravity.

Sellers said Wednesday's ceremony was a dry run. He plans to videotape the Newton items later this week for the Royal Society, which is the national academy of science of the United Kingdom. It's celebrating its 350th anniversary.

## National intelligence director resigning effective May 28

WASHINGTON - National Intelligence Director Dennis Blair said Thursday he is resigning, ending a tumultuous 16-month tenure marked by intelligence failures and turf wars among the country's spy agencies.

Blair, a retired Navy admiral, is the third director of national intelligence, a position created in response public outrage over the failure to prevent the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.


In a message to his work force, Blair said his last day would be May 28.

## Group unveils synthetic

Method swaps cell's 'software'

WASHINGTON — Scientists announced a bold step Thursday in the enduring quest to create artificial life. They've produced a living cell powered by manmade

While such work can invoke images of Frankenstein-like scientific tinkering, it also is exciting hopes that it could eventually lead to new fuels, better ways to clean polluted water, faster vacproduction and more.

Is it really an artificial life form?

The inventors call it the world's first synthetic cell, although this initial step is more a re-creation of existing life — changing one simple type of bacterium into another — than a built-from-scratch kind.

But Maryland genomemapping pioneer J. Craig Venter said his team's project paves the way for ultimate, harder goal: designing organisms that work differently from the way nature intended for a wide range of uses. Already he's working with ExxonMobil in hopes of turning algae into fuel.

"This is the first selfreplicating species we've had on the planet whose parent is a computer," Venter told reporters.

And the report, being published Friday in the journal Science, is triggering excitement in this growing field of synthetic biology.

Scientists for years have moved single genes and even large chunks of DNA from one species to another. At his J. Craig Venter Institute in Rockville, Md., and San Diego, Venter's team aimed to go further. A few years ago, the researchers transplanted an entire natural genome - the genetic code - of one bacterium into another and watched it take over, turning a goat germ into a cattle germ.

Next, the researchers built from scratch another, bacterium's smaller genome, using off-theshelf laboratory-made DNA fragments.

Friday's report combines those two achievements to test a big question: Could synthetic DNA really take over and drive a living cell? Somehow, it did. "This is transforming

life totally from one species into another by changing the software,' said Venter, using a computer analogy to explain the DNA's role.

The researchers picked two species of a simple germ named Mycoplasma. First, they chemically synthe sized the genome of M. mycoides, that goat germ, which with 1.1 million "letters" of DNA was twice as large as the germ genome they'd previously built.

Then they transplanted it into a living cell from a different Mycoplasma species, albeit a fairly close cousin.



## FEMA offers insurance rate cuts

### Decision softens blow of remapping plans

EAST ST. LOUIS, Ill. — Property owners across the country fearing they may be forced to buy expensive flood insurance under a push to draw up new floodplain maps will catch a break by being offered the coverage at sharply lower rates for two years, a key lawmaker said.

Sen. Dick Durbin of Illinois said the Federal Emergency Management Agency's decision to offer the cheaper rates on properties affected by changes to flood hazard maps dramatically softens the financial blow for southwestern Illinois and other affected regions — at least for now.

FEMA has agreed to offer up to two sonable, and everyone in the area

years' eligibility for the National Flood Insurance Program's Preferred Risk Policy — the program's lowest-cost option — to small businesses and homeowners on any land the new maps show are in newly designated special flood hazard areas. The new rates are available after the redrawn maps take effect, in many cases this fall or early next year.

The savings could be big: An affected homeowner's yearly premium under the preferred risk program might be \$300 — four to five times less than what it might cost otherwise, Les Sterman, an administrator of a flood-protection district involving three St. Louis-area Illinois counties, said Thursday.

The lower premiums "are quite rea-

## **CDC:** Best look before you leap

## Public pools can be germy

ATLANTA — You might want to look before you leap into a public swimming pool this summer.

A new government republic swimming pools were shut down two years ago because of dirty water or other problems, like missing safety equipment.

Kiddie pools were most likely to be the germiest, from fecal matter and improper chlorination.

The report is based on more than 120,000 inspecpools in 2008, including those in parks and hotels. It's the largest study of the topic ever done by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, which released the report Thurs-

Each year, there are water at public pools. about 15 or 20 outbreaks Health officials also say from stomach bugs blamed on pools, the CDC said. Studies suggest a quarter of them are caused by bacteria, viruses or parasites that should have been killed by proper pool treatment and chlorination.

Fecal particles are a common factor, especially in kiddie pools and fountains where children frolic. ity problems or other is-But urine is also a problem: It contains nitrogen rings or other safety equipthat eats up chlorine in ment.

pool water, depleting the supply. Sweat and suntan lotion have the same effect.

And about one in five adults admit they have peed in the pool, according to a survey of 1,000 Ameriport shows one in eight cans done last year for a chemical industry advisory group, the Water Quality and Health Council.

Reports of pool-related illness have been on the upswing for much of the last decade, but it's not clear whether conditions are worse or whether there's more awareness and testing, said Michele tions of public swimming Hlavsa, chief of the CDC's swimming pool program.

'We definitely need to focus on improving pool operations," she added.

Before you go swimming, the CDC suggests buying test kits from hardware stores and checking the people who've had diarrhea shouldn't swim; and everyone should avoid swallowing pool water.

The inspections were done in 13 states, and pool regulations and reporting varied.

The CDC report did not give a breakdown of pool closures from water qualsues, such as missing life

NEW YORK - Stocks took their deepest plunge in more than a year Thursday as fears grew that Europe's debt crisis could spread around the world and undermine the U.S. economic recovery. The possibility has been brewing for weeks, but analysts said some investors are just waking up to it.

The Dow Jones industrial average fell 376 points, its biggest point drop since February 2009. All the major indexes were down well over 3 percent and are now showing losses for 2010. Interest rates fell sharply in the Treasury market as investors once again sought the safety of U.S. government debt.

The number of people applying for unemployment benefits last week rose unexpectedly and the Greek government's response to its debt crisis sparked new protests in Athens, but analysts said neither event appeared to set off Thursday's selling.

Until this scandal broke, Blumenthal was 20 points ahead, and the big issue was financial reform and regulation. Now it's about a war and the false claims of a part of a generation that refused to fight it.

## Muslim concerns trigger Pakistani Web bans

#### YouTube, Facebook, others blocked

The offending Facebook page encourages users to post images of the prophet on May 20 to protest threats made by a radical Muslim group against the creators of the

"Such malicious and insulting attacks hurt the sentiments of Muslims around the world and cannot be accepted under the garb of freedom of expression," Foreign Ministry spokesman Abdul Basit said.

Later the same year, a suspected al-Qaida suicide bomber attacked the Danish Embassy in Islamabad, killing six people.

## Thailand mops up, but fears threat of long-term strife

BANGKOK — As soldiers mopped up pockets of resistance and the government declared it was back in control, fears grew Thursday that the tentative quiet restored to Thailand's capital after a bloody crackdown on protests may just be a respite from violence and political polarization that could continue for years.

Leaders of the anti-government Red Shirt movement vowed a return as they were taken into custody.

"I think this is a new beginning for the Red Shirts," said Kevin Hewison, a Thailand expert at the University of North Carolina. "It will be a darker and grimmer time of struggle and less-focused activities. By no stretch of

the imagination is the movement finished."

The Thai government declared Thursday it had mostly quelled 10 weeks of violent protests in the capital as buildings smoldered troops rooted out die-hard holdouts and resisome dents cau-

tiously life a day after a military operation cleared the main commercial district of thouing 15 dead and nearly 100 injured.

Troops roamed the city on foot and in Humvees and exchanged gunfire with scattered Red Shirt holdouts, who fought near the city's Victory Monument and torched a bank, bringing to 40 the number of buildings set aflame after the military push sent the protesters retreating from their demonstration site.

The protesters, demanding elections, had fortified thembehind tire-andselves bamboo-spike barricades.

## Mexico's Calderon criticizes Ariz. law

WASHINGTON - Mexican President Felipe Calderon took his opposition to a new Arizona immigration law to Congress Thursday, saying it "ignores a reality that cannot be erased by decree.'

Calderon's comments on the Arizona law and his request that Congress do something about the availability of high-powered weapons along the border drew criticism from several lawmakers saying he was interfering in U.S. internal matters.

The Mexican leader also told lawmakers reluctant to take up the immigration issue this year that comprehensive immigration reform is crucial to securing the two countries' common border.

WASHINGTON — Who's discriminated against in America? More people say Hispanics than blacks or women — and it's far from just Hispanics who feel that

An Associated Press-Univision Poll found that 61 percent of people overall said Hispanics face significant discrimination, compared with 52 percent who said blacks do and 50 percent who said women.

The survey also underscored how perceptions of prejudice can vary by ethnicity. While 81 percent of Latinos said Hispanics confront a lot or some discrimination, a smaller but still substantial 59 percent of non-Hispanics said so.

## Oily goop makes landfall

## Syrupy oil washes into La. marshes for first time

GRAND ISLE, La. — The spectacle many had feared for a month finally began unfolding as gooey, rust-colored oil washed into the marshes at the mouth of the Mississippi for the first time, stoking public anger and frustration with both BP and the government.

The sense of gloom deepened as BP conceded what some scientists have been saying for weeks: that the oil leak at the bottom of the Gulf of Mexico is bigger than the company previously estimated.

Up to now, only tar balls and a sheen of oil had come ashore. But on Wednesday, chocolate brown and vivid orange globs, sheets and ribbons of foulmammals and a rich variety of marine life.

■ HOW MUCH? BP conceded Thursday that more oil than it estimated is gushing into the Gulf of Mexico as heavy crude washed into Louisiana's wetlands for the first time. Mark Proegler, a spokesman for oil giant BP PLC, said a mile-long tube inserted into a leaking pipe over the weekend is capturing 210,000 gallons a day — previously estimated as the total gushing into the sea but some is still escaping. He would not say how much. Several professors who have watched video of the leak have said they believe the amount spewing out is much higher than official estimates.

LIVE VIDEO. Rep. Edward J. Markey, D-

Mass., said in a news release that BP complied with his request that a live feed of the oil spill be made publicly available on the Web, available at

**DISPERSANT.** The Environmental Protection Agency directed oil giant BP to use a less toxic form of chemical dispersant to break up the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico. Two Obama administration officials confirmed the order Thursday. Some lawmakers and environmental groups have criticized use of the dispersants, which are being shot thousands of feet beneath the sea to break apart the oil and keep it from

reaching the surface.

■ TOP KILL. BP PLC was marshaling equipment and conducting tests Thursday for a new effort to choke off the oil's flow. Crews hoped that by Sunday they can start the "top kill," which involves pumping heavy mud into the crippled equipment on top of the well, then permanently sealing it with cement. The procedure has been used before to halt gushing oil above ground, but it has never been used 5,000 feet below the surface. Scientists and engineers have spent much of the last week preparing for the complex operation and taking measurements to make sure that the mission doesn't backfire.

## N. Korea: Retaliation will mean war

SEOUL, South Korea - North Korea, accused of waging the deadliest attack on the South Korean military since the Korean War, flatly denied sinking a warship Thursday and warned that retaliation would mean

Evidence presented Thursday to prove North Korea fired a torpedo that sank a South Korean ship was fabricated by Seoul, North Korean naval spokesman Col. Pak In Ho told broadcaster APTN in an exclusive interview in Pyongyang.

He warned that any move to sanction or strike North Korea would be met

"If (South Korea) tries to deal any retaliation or punishment, or if they try sanctions or a strike on us .... we will answer to this with all-out war," he told APTN.

An international team of civilian and military investigators declared earlier in Seoul that a North Korean submarine fired a homing torpedo at the Cheonan on March 26, ripping the 1,200-ton ship in two.

Fifty-eight sailors were rescued, but 46 died — South Korea's worst military disaster since a truce ended the three-

## Paris art thief nabs \$123M in paintings

PARIS — A broken alarm system made it as easy as 1-2-3: A masked intruder clipped a padlock, smashed a window and stole a Picasso, a Matisse and three other masterpieces from a Paris museum Thursday—a \$123 million haul that is one of the world's biggest art heists.

Offloading the artwork may prove a tougher task, however, with Interpol and collectors worldwide now on high alert.

In what seemed like an art thief's fantasy, the alarm system had been broken since March in parts of the Paris Museum of Modern Art, according to the city's mayor.

So with no alarm to worry about, a lone masked intruder entered the museum about 3:50 a.m., said Christophe Girard, deputy culture secretary

at Paris City Hall. The stolen works included





## Citrus grappler achieves high expectations with his third-place medal at state on wrestling mat

It's not often a freshman comes in, experiences great success and people

are not surprised at all. But first-year Citrus wrestler Taylor Jackson managed to put together years in Hurricanes history and it was actually antici-

pated. "We expected him to be an elite performer," Citrus wrestling coach Mike Porcelli said. "We knew this kid was a blue-chip kid right off iors. the bat.'

Results couldn't have been much higher than the expectations. Jackson went 57-3 overall in 2009-10 and took a third-place medal in the 160-pound weight class at the Class 2A state wrestling meet.

Jackson set a school record at Citrus in victories against the trio of losses. His win total surpassed Bryant Fisher's 50 victories set in 2008.

For his accomplishments on the mat, Jackson is an easy choice as a nominee for the Chronicle's Male

Athlete of the Year award.

"He's one of the best athletes in the state," Porcelli said. "That's not me making some grand statement it's the truth."

While the quantity of triumphs is impressive, even the losses lend to the quality of Jackson's campaign.

Of his three setbacks. one of the most impressive Jackson fell to some elite wrestlers: two came to Oviedo's Erin O'Dell, who is the runner-up in Class 2A at 160 and the other to Brandon's Kyle Koziel, the runner-up in Class 3A at 171. Both wrestlers were sen-

If Jackson continues to progress and stavs in the 160 class, he could open up as the top-ranked grappler in the Florida in 2010. Because Jackson is still growing, though, a move to 171 at this point seems more

From Dallas Braden's perfect game to Hanley Ramirez's loafing, it's been an eventful first quarter of the baseball season.

In the chilly months of April and May, it often takes the hitters a little longer to get warmed up than the pitchers. That trend appears to be continuing this year, with the first quarter of the season being highlighted by the guys on the mound.

There have already been two no-hitters and a handful of one-hitters in the first 40 games of the regular season. As of Thursday morning, eight pitchers, including three in the heavyhitting American League, had earned-run averages under 2.00. Fifteen pitchers have ERA's better than 2.50 and a whopping 30 starters are under 3.00.

Here's a look at some of the stars, slumps and surprises through the first quarter of the year.

#### **STARS:**

- Ubaldo Jimenez, RHP, Colorado Rockies: He is making pitching cool for the first time at Coors Field. Threw the first no-hitter in franchise history at Atlanta on April 17 and topped the majors with seven victories and a 1.12 ERA. ■ Andre Ethier, RF, Los Ange-
- les Dodgers: Leading the majors with .392 batting average and 38 RBIs. His 11 HRs are second-best in NL. Also has two walkoff hits this season, including a grand slam to beat Milwaukee on May 6. Went on DL with broken finger on Tuesday. ■ Braden, RHP, Oakland Ath-
- letics: Season numbers of 4-4 with a 3.45 ERA are pedestrian, but one of those

wins was anything but. Threw 19th perfect game in MLB history on May 9 against the best team in baseball — the Tampa Bay Ravs.

Justin Morneau, 1B, Minnesota Twins: Hitting behind Joe Mauer, Minnesota's \$184 million man, Morneau is making his \$80 million contract look like a bargain. Leads AL with a .365 batting average and is third with 11 HRs.

- Trevor Hoffman, RHP, Milwaukee Brewers: One of best closers ever, the 42year-old Hoffman has blown five of 10 save chances this year, prompting manager Ken Macha to bench him for two games. He is 1-3 with a 13.15 ERA with 7 HRs allowed.
- Aramis Ramirez, 3B, Chicago Cubs. Hitting .167 with 4 HRs and 20 RBIs for the struggling Cubs, who hope his walk-off homer in the 11th inning to beat Colorado on Monday night was a sign of things to come. ■ Ken Griffey, Jr., DH, Seattle
- Mariners: Another aging star who appears on his way out. Seattle icon is hitting .183 with 0 HRs and 6 RBIs in 30 games. Team closed ranks after report that Griffey was sleeping in the clubhouse during a game. ■ Josh Beckett, RHP, Boston
- Red Sox: Was 1-1 with a 7.29 ERA with 29 earned runs allowed in his previous 27 innings before being put on DL with back problems. Signed a four-year, \$68 million extension in April.

## No excuses for absences

#### Four Cup champions miss Hall of Fame induction ceremony

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — NASCAR Hall of Fame opened its doors with a star-studded ceremony showcasing many of its stars.

Retired champions Dale Jarrett, Darrell Waltrip and Rusty Wallace sat on stage alongside current drivers Greg Biffle, Kurt Busch and Bobby Labonte. Heavyweight team owners Rick Hendrick and Richard Childress flanked NASCAR chairman Brian France, while Joe Gibbs watched from the audience.

The ceremony ended NASCAR pioneers Richard Petty and Junior Johnson drove replicas of their old cars onto the plaza. The only two living members of the incoming inaugural five-member class, Johnson and Petty received a stand-

It was a fitting close to a celebratory day for the sport. But for a few moments, as security cleared the plaza for Petty and Johnson's arrival, there was a quiet murmur that perhaps NASCAR's current stars were about to arrive.

Missing from last week's events were Jeff Gordon, Jimmie Johnson, Tony Stewart and Dale Earnhardt Jr. the "big dogs" of today's NASCAR.

Gordon, Johnson, Stewart and Matt Kenseth were the only four active Cup champions missing from the ceremony. Earnhardt, NASCAR's most popular driver and a two-time champion in NASCAR's second-tier series, wasn't there despite the upcoming induction of his father.

Their absence did not go unnoticed. Petty, a seven-time champion and

NASCAR's all-time winningest driver, thought their absence was wrong.

"A lot of these drivers that are doing pretty well today don't realize what some of the guys went through to get it to this point," Petty said last weekend. "A lot of us old timers look back and hope that the guys that are doing it now appreciate what the guys did who laid the groundwork."

All four champions had various reasons for missing the ceremony. Gordon cited a prior commitment and Johnson said he was on one final vacation with his wife before the couple welcomes their first child this summer. The slumping Stewart was testing with his team in Virginia, while a spokesman for Earnhardt said there had been confusion as to which events the driver was to attend.

It all speaks to a large scheduling problem. NASCAR runs a 38-race schedule over 11 months that takes drivers and teams from home a minimum of three days a week. Throw in sponsor appearances, business obligations, team meetings and personal responsibilities, well, it barely leaves time for a haircut some weeks.

It doesn't make skipping certain events right, though. After all, just about everyone, no matter the profession, is busy. Family, work and life's day-to-day nuances have stretched folks, and it doesn't matter if they drive race cars for a living.

In this instance, current NASCAR drivers could choose to attend three Hall of Fame events honoring the men who over the last six decades paved the track where they now earn their fortunes. Gordon and Johnson said they'll intend Sunday's induction ceremony. So will Earnhardt, who also plans to sit with his family during a Thursday night gala to honor the inductees.

Stewart, according to event organizers, is not planning to attend either event. Why? Organizers said they were told the two-time champion is busy, and has places to be and things

#### Show's producers feel 'empty' now that its 6-year run is over

- NEW YORK on't expect a laser show. Don't bet on the island to lift off into space.

While intel is scarce about the much-awaited, under-wraps finale to "Lost," those hints come straight from the guys who not only know the truth but also created it: executive producers Damon Lindelof and Carlton Cuse.

But other than such tongue-incheek tips, Lindelof and Cuse remain supremely tightlipped about the "Lost" conclusion, airing Sunday on ABC at 9 p.m. Exactly how they'll polish off this epic mystical thriller after six trippy seasons well, that literally remains to be

and the 2 1/2-hour finale, even sight unseen, has already been decreed a major television milestone.

"We're satisfied with the finale," said Cuse in an interview alongside Lindelof on Wednesday.

He called the ending "kind of spiritual," and said it "feels like a fair way to honor the fans, the characters and everyone's commitment

He also said he expected a wide range of viewer reactions: "That's bound to happen."

But Lindelof predicted "Lost' will spur its own distinctive brand of morning-after debate — one much different from viewers' raging response to the blackout that concluded "The Sopranos" three years ago.

That series ending centered on one thing, said Lindelof: Would Tony Soprano live or die? So whatever a viewer thought should happen to Tony (when last glimpsed, he was alive and well and enjoying onion rings) played a major role in whether the outcome pleased that viewer.

"But for the 'Lost' finale, people don't really know going into it WHAT would satisfy them," Lindelof declared. "If you say to some-body, 'What thing would need to happen in the story for you to feel satisfied?', they'd say something like, 'Well, I want all my questions to be answered.' But they can't tell you what they want to happen to the characters.'

"They don't even know what the questions are they would want to have answered," added Cuse.

#### **'LOST' FINALE**

9-11:30 p.m. Sunday on ABC.

Where to begin? Since its premiere in fall 2004, "Lost" has gloried in its multiplying mysteries, in the paradox of a series that's set on an island but is anything but insu-

While the show was being filmed in Hawaii (with an evolving cast including Matthew Fox, Evangeline Lilly, Terry O'Quinn and dozens more), Lindelof and Cuse toiled with fellow writers in Los Angeles crafting the tale.

'Only now are we getting a sense of how autobiographical the show has been for the writers," said Lindelof. "In the third season, we locked characters in cages because Fans of "Lost" can hardly wait, we felt like we were locked up and

> cided to put this guy down in the hatch, pushing a button every 108 minutes. He doesn't know why, exactly, but he believes that if he doesn't, maybe the world will end. That's exactly how we felt when we were writing that season: Just keep pushing the button."

> At the start of production each year, Cuse and Lindelof would pitch ABC executives on what the coming season might have in store.

"They really embraced what was most novel and different about the storytelling, and that was an incredible blessing," Cuse said.

"They actually became fans,"

said Lindelof, "so that when we came in to pitch them Season 6, they were like, 'We don't want to know the ending of the show. Don't spoil it for us.' Even when we wrote the script for the finale, we withheld a key scene from them. They didn't want to know.

"Before we shot it, they read it," Cuse said. "But not until the very last minute."

LOS ANGELES — An Emmy rules exemption will give the talent behind Sunday's extended-length "Lost" finale the chance to compete for awards.

The TV academy's board of governors voted Wednesday night to make the upcoming "Lost" finale eligible for acting, directing and other individual honors despite the episode's 105minute length. Its airtime with commercials is 2 1/2 hours, from 9 to 11:30 p.m. Sunday, exceeding the running time allowed under Emmy rules.

The one-time exemption avoids having to cut 17 minutes and echoes those granted previously for "The Wire" and other veteran series with many plot lines to wrap up.



In this account, the hero

started out as Robin Longstride (Russell Crowe), seasoned archer of Britain's King Richard the Lionheart (Danny Huston). Despite years of loyal service in the Crusades, the king leaves Robin and his men to die for speaking against their brutality in the Middle East. Luckily for

them, King Richard dies in the midst of battle and they flee the scene.

During their escape, Robin and his friends fall upon a

bent on taking the fallen king's crown. Loyal to the end, they fend off the attackers and return the crown to its rightful owner, King Richard's self-centered little brother, Prince John (Oscar Isaac).

Always compelled to do what is right, Robin strives to return the sword of one of the fallen knights to his father. He and his men journey to Nottingham, where they are instantly accepted as family. After falling in love with the village and its people, Robin and the soon-tobe-called Merry Men will do anything to protect Nottingham from unjust taxation and foreign aggressors.

Not one actor leaves more to be desired. Crowe stuck to his noble warrior formula. Gravelly-voiced, tough yet sentimental, this winning persona never grows old. Cate Blanchett is regal and fiercely independent, expertly charging forth as the Marion Loxley. The actors who make up the Merry Men and Friar Tuck are perfect, their goodhearted jingles and rowdy antics make for great comic re-

Neither watered down nor mind-numbingly convoluted, the political plot has just the right dose of complexity. A lot like "Gladiator," "Robin Hood" tells the story of a loyal soldier

who tries to bring justice back to a tyrannical government. But the interesting twist is the new King John is not entirely evil, but inept and impressionable. The king's potential to swing either way with the addition of an English traitor adds some suspense to the equation, even

if momentary. 'Robin Hood" is nothing new, but skillfully follows the good old blockbuster recipe, B.



know him; and, most troubling purely from a survival standpoint, ogres are being hunted in the woods.

That's right, it's the old alternate-universe bit.

So Shrek must befriend Donkev and woo Fiona to make everything right again: basically, repeat all the steps he went through in part one, which only reinforces the lack of originality now that we've reached part four.

An attempt at injecting some novelty with the Rumpelstiltskin character also falls flat: He's tiny but hugely obnoxious. It's one thing to have an over-thetop villain if he's a compelling, well-developed figure. This guy is just off-putting. The only thing that changes

about him are the wigs he wears for various occasions.

Thankfully, Antonio Banderas returns to voice the swashbuckling Puss in Boots — only in Shrek's weird new world, the kitty has gotten so lazy and overfed as Fiona's pampered pet, he can't even buckle his own belt. Still, Puss remains the most consistent source of comedy in the "Shrek" series. Here's hoping that when the character gets his own movie spin-off, he'll be able to stand on his own two paws without the needless aid of a third dimen-

Fox also starred last year as the title character in "Jennifer's Body," playing a possessed cheerleader who preys on high school boys. The movie, written by Oscar-winning writer Diablo Cody, made a disappointing \$16.2 million domestically.




There are deals in which the declarer needs a defensive error. Then it helps if he has some subterfuge up his sleeve.

If you were South in today's deal, what would you do in three no-trump after West leads the spade king?

As always when in no-trump, start by counting your top tricks, your instant winners. If you don't do that, you will misplay many contracts.

Here, you have eight top tricks: one spade, three hearts, one diamond and three clubs. Assuming diamonds are 3-2, which they usually will be, you can establish a ninth trick in that suit. However, the opponents might cash at least three spades and two diamonds.

If diamonds will not work,




though, you will have to get a fourth club trick.

You might as well find out the spade break. So, duck the first two tricks and take the third spade after East discards a heart.

Now it would be too optimistic to assume East has K-Qdoubleton or K-Q-J-tripleton of diamonds. Instead, hope West has the club jack and try to sneak a fourth club trick past him.

Lead your club nine — not the 10, because West will surely cover that card if he has the jack. But he might fail to cover the nine. And if he does fail, you will have your ninth trick in the bag.

When you are taking a finesse and do not want an opponent to cover a card, lead the lowest one you have that will win the trick. If, though, you do want a cover, lead the highest.
