No indication of link with manatee release plans

Officials head off death speculation

HOMOSASSA - Sandy Valente conducted the manatee program Wednesday afternoon at the Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park as she has done countless times.

She tossed heads of lettuce into the cool spring waters to attract three manatees roaming nearby. Grownups listened, took photos, and children squirmed on the bleacher seats as Valente spent 20 minutes discussing the mammals she loves.

It was the same program she's always given, except for one slight change: Valente said there are six female manatees in the park, not seven.

She did not mention that Amanda, a manatee who had lived at the park for 25 years, died Tuesday while undergoing a biopsy procedure.

Valente said beforehand that she didn't plan to bring it up. If someone asked, she would try to tell exactly what happened.

"I'm so sick about it," she said when the program concluded. "I'm really heartbroken. She was the most playful, the one with the most affinity for people. I'm hoping something good will come of this.

Like many park volunteers who work closely with manatees, Valente wonders whether Amanda's death was connected to her being targeted for a manatee-release program overseen by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

The federal agency wants to release all

School bomb plot in Tampa

Expelled teen in custody

TAMPA — Tampa police have arrested an expelled student after thwarting what they deemed a potentially "catastrophic" plot to set off a bomb at his former high school and cause mass casualties on the first day of classes next week, authorities said Wednesday.

Police Chief Jane Castor aid Jared Cano 17 had threatened to plant a bomb at Freedom High School in north Tampa and detonate the device when students return Tuesday.

The suspect was arrested Tuesday night after someone alerted police to the alleged plot.

Castor told a news conference that the alleged bombing plot was planned minute by minute and the intent was to cause more casualties than the 1999 Columbine High School massacre, which resulted in 13 deaths before the two shooters killed themselves.

Castor said police and the school system "were probably able to thwart a potentially catastrophic event, the likes of which the city of Tampa has not seen, and hopefully never will."

At Cano's apartment, police discovered materials to make pipe bombs, shrapnel, plastic tubing and timing and fusing devices, along with a fuel source, Castor said. Police also said they found a journal containing schematic drawings of rooms inside the school and statements about the teenager's intent to kill.

The Tampa high school shares a cafeteria with its neighboring middle school, increasing the potential threat to hundreds of additional students, officials noted.

The plot targeted specific school administrators and any students who were nearby, police said. Authorities did not name the administrators nor would they disclose who tipped them off about the alleged plot.

Cano's mother consented to a police search Tuesday evening, Castor said. In addition to the bomb-making materials, police reported they also found a marijuana-growing operation.

captive manatees that do not require medical care. That means all but one of the Homosassa Springs park manatees could be released to the wild sometime in the future.

Amanda, who was brought to Homosassa in 1986 from the Miami Seaquarium, had been in a seclusion pool with another manatee, Electra. Federal officials planned to release both in early 2010 but delayed the release after public opposition.

Park manager Art Yerian said Amanda was undergoing a biopsy procedure to learn the cause of unusual mammary swelling. The procedure lasted about 20 minutes, but medical personnel were unable to revive Amanda from sedation.

The carcass was taken to the Path Lab in St. Petersburg for a necropsy. The biopsy is also being tested by two separate labs, Yerian said, adding it should be a few days before results are known.

Yerian said he doubted Amanda's death had anything to do with the release program, even though she was being isolated and on a

special diet to reduce her weight for potential release to the wild. "I think it might be some-

thing to do with old age," he said.

According to the park's Web site, Amanda was born in the wild on July 19, 1966, which would have made her the oldest manatee in the park.

Chuck Underwood, spokesman for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Jacksonville, agreed there is nothing to suggest Amanda's death was connected to the release program.

"Unfortunately, this does occur with captive manatees," he said.

Amanda was the first manatee to die at the Homosassa Springs park since it accepted Rosie the manatee in 1968.

"I understand the emotions attached for animals in captivity," Underwood said. "Health checks go on all the time. The possibility of an animal dying during a routine health check is a reality. It's unfortunate. I couldn't draw a conclusion that if Amanda hadn't been on the list for release this wouldn't have happened."

do if we feel there is an unreasonableness and it's going to affect the other taxpayers.

Greene said in cases where a property owner wanted a much lower appraisal, usually with a commercial property, he would hire a professional with the Appraisal Institute to help settle the issue.

Operating within its revenue stream, the office has had a budget cut of 3.4 percent as revenues fell 2.6 percent, Greene said.

'Since historical budget highs (the 2007-08 budget year), the property appraiser's office has reduced the budget by 23 percent," Greene said.

Staffing, the largest budget expenditure, has been reduced from a high of 71 in the 2006-07 budget year to 53 in the current year. Citrus County is among the top five of the 67 counties in the state for property appraiser reductions.

The non-school taxable value for Citrus Countv reached its peak in 2007 at \$12.4 billion. It has dropped by \$3.1 billion to its current \$9.3 billion. Greene pointed out that the rate of decline has been slowing by fewer percentage points each year. The median sales price for existing improved residential homes on non-premium parcels (nonwaterfront lots) reached a peak at \$145,000 in 2007 and declined to \$98,000 in 2010. Vacant property showed a more dramatic decline, from a peak of \$32,000 in 2006 to \$8,550 in 2010. The one-year, single-family residence market change across the county was a decrease of 6 percent. Within the seven taxing districts, only Beverly Hills, with a 12 percent drop, exceeded the countywide decline. Inverness and Sugarmill Woods both declined by 2 percent, showing the best performance in the county. Looking at three-year averages in value changes, Beverly Hills was the hardest hit, declining over 2008-11 by 42 percent. Countywide, the decline was 27 percent for the three-year period. Only Sugarmill Woods, at a value decline of 20 percent, did better than the county figure. Value adjustment board petitions reached a peak of 2,086 in 2007, and currently number 127. Non-residents pay most of the taxes. "As we studied the ZIP codes, it appears that 52 percent of the non-school taxable value is being billed to people who live outside Citrus County," Cook said. "If you are getting a dollar's worth of service in Citrus County, it's being subsidized by outside payers.' Another interesting statistic for homeowners Greene presented was that property values are returning to a level that was tracked from the 1990s.



Last stranded whales won't be released

Around

The last of nearly two dozen pilot whales that became stranded off the Florida Keys will not be released back into the wild because it has developed scoliosis.

Erin Fougeres, an administrator with the National Marine Fisheries Service, told The Key West Citizen the whale developed the condition while being treated at the Marine Mammal Conservancy in Key Largo. She said it's common during rehabilitation

The whale, a female adult, also still has some lingering effects of pneumonia.

Fougeres said officials are concerned the whale would not be able to dive or forage for food. Instead, the mammal will likely go to a facility such as SeaWorld.

A calf has already been sent there. The adult is the last of the whales at the rehabilitation facility.

Miami police arrest three in gaming probe

Miami police have seized nine coin-operated devices they claim are illegal video gaming machines, part of an ongoing roundup authorities say will protect the city's poor and elderly.

The Miami Herald reported police raided three shops early Tuesday. Three people were arrested on charges including operating a gambling house.

Police have seized hundreds of the machines since starting their investigation in October 2010. They say the machines are an illegal game of chance. Industry insiders object, saying they can't be considered gambling because there is a pattern to the numbers that pop up.

The machine seizures have strained the relationship between Miami Mayor Tomas Regalado and Police Chief Miguel Exposito. Exposito claims Regalado tried to stop the October raid. Regalado says the claim is false.

PENSACOLA-Nicknamed "Superman" because of his chiseled 6foot-3 frame, Marine Lt. Patrick Wayland saved his most heroic act for last. He donated a kidney to a comrade he never met.

Wayland, a flight student at Pensacola Naval Air Station, died earlier this month after his heart stopped beating during water survival training. He was already an organ donor, but while on life support, his family decided they wanted to help a fellow Marine.

A doctor who treated the 24-yearold Wayland searched the Internet for "Marine needing transplant" and found a website for Sgt. Jacob "Jake" Chadwick, who was stationed on the other side of the country at Camp Pendleton, Calif.

Wayland were about the same age, and after several tests, doctors said they were a match.

'He has given me a second chance at life," Chadwick, 23, said Tuesday.

Wayland decided he wanted to become a pilot and attend the Naval Academy after the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks. He was a top high school student, athlete and involved in his community of Midland, Texas, according to his father. But he didn't get an academy appointment on his first try and went to Texas Tech. He was accepted to the academy the next year.

He had recently taken his first solo flight as a Marine flight student. He sent a text message to his father, David Wayland, as he was waiting on the runway.

When Wayland was taken to the hospital Aug. 1, friends and family spent four days at his bedside before he was declared brain dead.

"Patty was physically very strong and seeing him in a hospital bed was very difficult," said Wayland's roommate, Marine Lt. John Silvestro.

Dr. Jeffery Moore, a flight surgeon at the Pensacola base who initially treated Wayland, kept vigil with family and friends. He wanted to do something for the family.

"I was very happy that I found somebody, but there was still a lot of screening that had to be done. The fact that he turned out to be such a perfect match was pretty amazing," Moore said.

Chadwick is married and he is expecting his second child in November. His wife, Victoria, created a website for her husband when he

after returning from a yearlong deployment to Iraq in 2009. Chadwick had been on a five-year waiting list for a transplant when he received the kidney Aug. 7.

He didn't know the full story behind his transplant until days later when Silvestro, Wayland's roommate, called him. They have kept in touch ever since.

"From the time you go into boot camp to the time you leave boot camp, it is about being there for your fellow Marines. This is the ultimate example of that," Silvestro said. The Waylands don't know who re-

ceived the other five organs that were donated. But they hope to eventually meet Chadwick.

"I know it will take time for them," Chadwick said. "I cannot begin to express what I feel for what they have done. This is all so overwhelming."

Littnan said car seat expiration dates is just one small item on a long list of things people don't know about car seat safety. From poorly adjusted straps to incorrect installations, she has seen it all.

Florida will spend \$2 million on three new training programs for seaport, air cargo and other international trade iobs.

Workforce Florida, a public-private job-creation partnership, announced the Quick Response Training grants Wednesday in Jacksonville.

Congressman wants changes to Cuban Adjustment Act

MIAMI — Embattled South Florida freshman U.S. Rep. David Rivera on Wednesday called for an overhaul of the decadesold law that grants most Cubans U.S. residency a year after they arrive, proposing to revoke the residency of any Cuban who then goes back to visit family on the island.

Rivera said those Cubans who travel home to see their families should not qualify for The Cuban Adjust Act that was created to provide political asylum.

"In 1966, the U.S. government gave one of the most benevolent immigration designations in its history to Cubans," he said. "We have an obligation to protect the future status of Cubans seeking political asylum."

He said many Cubans arrive in the U.S. and travel home not just to visit family but also for tourism or even medical procedures, though he did not provide any statistics or specific cases.

The congressman spoke to a standing ovation of about 40 mostly Cuban exiles who support a hard line against the island and oppose any overtures between the two countries.

Critics question why Rivera would be the first member of Congress in a decade to call for a measure that only hurts members of his community. Many Cubans, particularly recent immigrants, return to see family on the island.

Plan announced for beltway toll road

JACKSONVILLE - A 15-mile, \$291 million toll road will be built to serve as a western bypass around Jacksonville.

Lt. Gov. Jennifer Carroll and Florida Transportation Secretary Ananth Prasad announced the project Wednesday in Jacksonville.

Carroll said the First Coast Outer Beltway will improve economic development in Clay, Duval and St. Johns counties.

The highway also is expected to reduce traffic congestion and serve as a hurricane evacuation route.

It will run south from Interstate 10 in Duval to Blanding Boulevard in Clay.

Florida Turnpike Enterprise is financing the project through bond sales.

The bonds will be repaid from toll revenues tentatively set at 15 cents per mile, making the toll \$2.25 for the full 15 miles

Construction is expected to begin in the fall of 2012 with completion in 2016.

ACT scores up; still among lowest

TALLAHASSEE - Florida's high school graduates improved slightly on this year's ACT college entrance test, but they still rank near the bottom nationally.

Results released Wednesday posite score from 19.5 in the past

That put Florida in a tie for 48th place with Kentucky among the 50 states and District of Columbia. Only Tennessee and Mississippi had lower scores.

The national composite score was 21.1.

In Florida 117,575 graduates took the test. That's 66 percent, which ranks 22nd nationally. Nationally 49 percent of graduates took the ACT.

Higher participation rates tend to reduce state scores.

Only 17 percent of Florida students met or surpassed all four ACT benchmarks - English, reading, math and science.

Nationally the figure was 25 percent.

Anthony attorneys appeal probation

ORLANDO - Casey Anthony's attorneys have filed an appeal in an effort to stop her from having to return to Florida to start serving a probation sentence.

The appeal was filed Wednesday in Florida's Fifth District Court of Appeal in Daytona Beach.

Judge Stan Strickland sentenced Anthony in January 2010 to one year of probation after she pleaded guilty to stealing checks from a friend. He said Anthony should serve the probation upon her release, but those instructions never made it to a written order. Corrections officials interpreted the sentence to mean Anthony could serve the probation while she was in jail awaiting her murder trial.

Last month, Anthony was acquitted in the death of her 2-year-old daughter, Caylee.

Town lays off 7 police employees

Boynton Beach is laying off seven police employees, and the department's chief says budget cuts have forced the elimination of some customer-oriented police services.

The South Florida Sun-Sentinel reports the employees include two community services officers and two records technicians, among others

Police Chief Matt Immler says no one who calls 911 will see a difference but there will be "less discretionary patrol time."







A big bounce, ounce by ounce, as gold takes off

NEW YORK — For what is normally a sleepy month, there are so many customers at the Gold Standard, a New York company that buys jewelry, that it feels like Christmas in August. Uncle Ben's Pawn Shop in Cleveland has never seen a rush like this. Welcome to the new

American gold rush. The price of gold is on a remarkable run, setting a record seemingly every other day. Stomach-churning volatility in the stock market this month has only made investors covet gold more.

Some want it as a safe investment for turbulent times. What worries some investors is that many others are buying simply because the price is rising and they want to make money fast.

'Is gold the next bubble?" asks Bill DiRocco, a golf company manager in Overland Park, Kan., who shifted 10 percent of his portfolio earlier this year into an investment fund that tracks the price of gold. He stopped buying because the price kept rising.

In October 2007, it sold for about \$740 an ounce. A little over a year later, it rose above \$1,000 for the first time. This past March, it began rocketing up. On Wednesday, it traded at \$1,795 an ounce, just shy of last week's record of \$1,801. Meanwhile, stocks, de-

spite rising sharply in the last two and a half years, are only slightly higher in price than they were a decade ago. Since hitting a record high in October 2007, the Standard & Poor's 500 index is down 23 percent.

Then the U.S. began running a trade deficit, and dollars piled up abroad. Central banks could redeem dollars for gold. But it was a poorly kept secret that the U.S. didn't have enough gold to cash out every dollar in circulation.

To head off a rush, Nixon "closed the gold window," essentially saying that confidence in the U.S. government, not gold, gives the dollar its value. Gold and fall freely, and gold earned its place as protection against the falling dollar when confidence lags.

As inflation worsened later in the 1970s and dollars were worth less, the price of gold took off. Gold hit its high in 1980 — \$850 an ounce, or more than \$2,300 in today's dollars.

This time is different because gold is rallying against all currencies, not just the dollar, says Jim Grant, editor of Grant's Interest Rate Observer.

'Gold is the reciprocal of the world's faith in the world's central banks," Grant says, and right now, 'the world is in a pickle.'

Gold prices will probably keep rising until the U.S. predicts inflation, low for the moment, will soar, further eroding the value of gold as a good investment.





Stocks increase slightly after earnings reports

NEW YORK — Stocks rose modestly Wednesday after companies reported higher earnings but gave mixed forecasts about how the fragile economy and rising costs will affect their growth.

Target Corp., Staples Inc. and Dell Inc. reported earnings for last quarter that were above analysts' forecasts. Companies in the Standard & Poor's 500 are on track to report higher profits for a ninth straight quarter. But economic growth is weak around the world, and some economists worry that a second recession may be coming. That could hurt companies' earnings in the future — and kept investors from buying with more enthusiasm Wednesday.

Dell's forecast added to investors' concerns: It cut its prediction for revenue growth this year. Target and Staples gave profit forecasts that were above Wall Street's expectations.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 4.28 points to 11,410.21. The S&P 500 rose 1.12, or 0.1 percent, to 1,193.88. The Nasdaq composite fell 11.97, or 0.5 percent, to 2,511.48. that make up the S&P 500 rose. The biggest drops came from technology stocks, which fell 0.8 percent after Dell cut its forecast.

"There are a whole bunch of contradictory signals in the system now, and it's hard to tell which way to go," said Charlie Smith, chief investment officer of Fort Pitt Capital Group, which has just over \$1 billion in assets under management.

Investors are still worried about Europe. Some countries have borrowed so much that they may not be able to repay their bonds, and economic growth there has slowed. Concerns about a possible default by a European country have dominated the market in recent weeks, along with worries about the slow U.S. economy.

Another concern Wednesday: Companies are contending with rising costs. Higher food prices helped push inflation at the wholesale level to 0.2 percent in July according to a government report Wednesday.

Foxes guarding the henhouse

nyone who's been following the Miami Herald's investigation of the wretched conditions in some of Florida's assisted living facilities might wonder how the state could have cruelly turned its back on so many sick and helpless people.

The answer is as simple as it is sickening: Money.

Florida doesn't spend enough of it enforcing the laws and regulations governing ALFs, while the industry spends a fortune buying off key state lawmakers with campaign donations.

One of them is Sen. Rene Garcia, a Republican from Hialeah who chairs the Health Regulation Committee. Remember this character's name, in case he ever dreams of running for statewide office.

Garcia's district includes more than 100 assisted living facilities, including some of the worst and most heavily fined in Miami-Dade. Thanks to Garcia and others, it's not easy for one of these joints to get in trouble, no matter what horrors are taking place inside.

Statewide, more than 70 ALF residents are known to have perished from gangrene, starvation, narcotic overdoses and burns. At least 200 others have died under suspicious circumstances, but the records have been sealed.

In one case, caregivers at an ALF in Manatee County managed to overlook an 85-year-old man while nearly half of his face was consumed by a cancerous tumor. In another facility, three people died, including a senior who fell down 24 separate times.

Despite all this, legislators beholden to ALF lobbyists assiduously labored to gut the laws meant to keep these homes safe. Too many rules and regulations, they complained.

Heck, it's only human suffering we're talking about.

Even as the authorities found residents neglected, abused and even dying, lawmakers like Garcia — who are rarely made to sleep in their own urine — were working aggressively on behalf of the ALFs. Their mission was to shrink state oversight, minimize the number of inspections and said.

make it harder to shut down rogue facilities.

This year in Tallahassee, 23 bills were introduced to weaken state supervision over ALFs. Most of them were written by the Florida Assisted Living Association, the industry lobby group. No one is more slavishly obedient to their

wishes than Garcia, who collected \$8,100 in campaign contributions from ALF corporate interests.

One of the bright ideas in Garcia's proposal would have removed the state's power to automatically shut down the most dangerous ALFs - the ones found to repeatedly put residents at risk of death — after two more Class I violations.

Garcia also pushed to block the state from slapping additional fines on ALFs when inspectors catch workers breaking the law. Without that enforcement measure facing them, operators wouldn't have much incentive to clean up their acts.

When questioned by reporters, Garcia said he didn't actually favor reducing legal protections for residents in assisted living facilities. He said the legislation he sponsored was mostly initiated by FALA, the ALF lobby group — a pathetic excuse that tells you all you need to know about how things work at the Capitol.

Furthermore, Garcia said he wasn't aware of language in his own proposal that would have stripped regulators of the authority to revoke the licenses of ALFs with multiple critical violations.

"I just don't recall that," he said.

People are dying under the most miserable conditions, and this guy conveniently can't remember pimping a law that would have made things even worse.

He's not the only one who's foggy these days. Sen. Don Gaetz, a Destin Republican, said he couldn't recall language in one of his own co-sponsored bills that stopped the state from bringing medical teams to ALFs to decide whether sick residents should be removed from the homes for their own safety

"I just don't remember," Gaetz

The legislation passed in 2009. Now the ALF operators, not doctors, decide when an ailing resident should be moved. No big deal, unless it happens to be your grandmother or grandfather who's in trouble.

To further deter nosy inspectors, lawmakers have kept on a shoestring budget the agency charged with overseeing ALFs. Over the last decade, investigations of serious incidents involving residents have declined radically even as the toll of deaths and abuse cases has risen.

Only seven homes were closed during a two-year-period in which the state could have shut down 70, based on repeated violations that endangered residents, fatally in some cases.

The Herald's series temporarily stalled many of this year's worst bills, including Garcia's, but they'll be back the next session. Meanwhile, Gov. Rick Scott has put together a task force heavily weighted toward the ALF industry (big surprise), which began meeting last week.

In the fall, a group of state senators will convene to draw up new legislation that supposedly would increase inspections of ALFs and hike penalties for repeat offenders. The best choice to chair the panel would have been Ronda Storms, a Republican from Valrico who heads the Senate's Children, Families and Elder Affairs Committee.

Storms has been a strong advocate for strengthening supervision and cracking down on assisted living facilities that neglect frail and sick residents. As leader of the reform committee she would have brought some credibility and compassion to a debate that's been dominated by colleagues who sold out to the industry.

But Senate President Mike Haridopolos made sure that the ALF owners will have little to worry about this autumn. Instead of appointing Storms to run the committee, he appointed none other than Rene Garcia.

If it weren't so tragic, you'd almost have to laugh.





WASHINGTON - The Associated Press has obtained an audio recording in which a lawyer for a major U.S. drugmaker offers payment to an opposition expert in a lawsuit involving the company's Mexico branch.

On the recording, a Mexican lawyer for a subsidiary of Baxter International offers to pay an opposing expert in a business lawsuit to leave the country on a key court date.

Baxter said the lawyer had no authority to make the offer. The Illinois-based company said it has cut ties with the lawyer.

Obama to unveil economic strategy

WASHINGTON Under fire in a nation desperate for jobs, President Barack Obama will soon announce a broad package of tax cuts, construction work and help for the millions of Americans who have been unemployed for months, a White House official said Wednesday. Republicans immediately cast doubt about any such plan, setting up a fresh economic showdown as the presidential campaign intensifies.

Obama will unveil his economic strategy in a speech right after Labor Day, hoping to frame the autumn jobs debate by pressuring Republicans in Congress to act or face voters' wrath. The country is in a deep state of disgust about Washington politics, piling urgency on both parties to help the economy quickly — or some-how position the other side to take the blame.

To pay for his jobs ideas, Obama will challenge the new "super committee" in Congress to go well be-yond its goal of finding \$1.5 trillion in deficit reduction, with part of the savings used to cover some of his economy-jolting help without sinking the nation deeper in debt. But there, too, Obama already faces trouble from Republican members who have ruled out tax hikes.

It's all leading to a sharp campaign for public opinion, the outcome shaping the presidential and congressional elections in 2012

Obama, as the most visible target for voter ire, is seeking re-election with unemployment north of 9 percent. No incumbent in recent times has won a second term with the jobless rate anywhere near that high. The final details of Obama's new economic plan have not been decided, and it is expected to be broader than the proposals known so far. It is likely to include tax cuts to help the middle class, a build-up-America construction program that goes beyond any infrastructure proposal Obama has had already, and targeted help for the particularly worrisome group of people who have remained unemployed for many months in a row. A White House official confirmed those details to The Associated Press, on condition of anonymity because the president has not disclosed them publicly. In Illinois on Wednesday, Obama broadly outlined his plans to help the fragile economy and have the costs covered as part of a broad plan to reduce the deficit. He pledged to present a specific way to do both to the super committee of lawmakers assigned to come up with such a deficit-slicing plan before Thanksgiving. Previewing his line of argument, Obama has spent much of a three-day bus tour through the Midwest lobbying people to pressure their members of Congress to deal with him. "If you're delivering that message, it's a lot stronger than me delivering that message because you're the folks ultimately that put those members of Congress into office. All right?" Obama said at a town hall in northwest Illinois. He faced a supportive but restless audience eager for its government to deliver on jobs, aid for the needy and protection of Social Security.

Trinidad leader contracts dengue

PORT-OF-SPAIN, Trinidad Doctors in Trinidad say the Caribbean island's prime minister is among the nearly 1,700 people who have been diagnosed with dengue.

Trinidad's health minister says Prime Minister Kamla Persad-Bissessar has a mild form of the mosquito-borne virus and is expected to recover. Dr. Fuad Khan says the leader likely contracted the disease during a recent walking tour in the capital of Port-of-Spain.

The prime minister's office released a statement late Tuesday saying Persad-Bissessar is working from home.

Khan said Trinidad is fighting a dengue outbreak and warned people to take precautions.

An 8-year-old Trinidadian girl died earlier this month from the more severe hemorrhagic dengue after being released from a hospital.

Charter, cargo airlines target pilot safety rule

WASHINGTON — Amid fierce opposition from charter and cargo airlines, as well as alarms raised by Pentagon officials, the Obama administration has delayed new safety rules aimed at preventing airline pilots from becoming so exhausted that they make dangerous mistakes.

The Federal Aviation Administration was supposed to have final rules in place by Aug. 1 under a law passed by Congress last year in response to a 2009 regional airline crash in western New York that killed 50 people.

The FAA proposed new rules last year designed to address long-standing concerns that pilot fatigue contributes to errors that cause accidents. They would reshape decades-old regulations governing how many hours a pilot can be on duty or at the controls of a plane. Administration officials declined to comment on the reasons for the delay. A new schedule for issuing final rules indicates the target date is now in November. Charter airlines are de-

manding to be exempted from the new rules. Charter, also called nonscheduled, airlines not only fly tourists and sports teams, they provide the planes and pilots for thousands of military flights every year. Civilian airlines transport more than 90 percent of U.S. troops and 40 percent of military cargo around the globe under contracts with the Pentagon.

proposed rules The would allow some pilots to fly more hours – 10 instead of the current maximum of eight — if they begin their day in the morning so that most of their flying takes place during the daytime.

The rule could force airlines to add one or two relief pilots to the normal two-pilot flight crew on overseas flights and to provide onboard rest facilities and sleeping accommodations at destinations more frequently.

And it sets standards for suitable resting places for a pilot during a flight while another pilot flies the plane. Airlines that provide a bunk for the pilot to lie flat for a nap would be allowed to fly longer without changing crews.

In Nevada's recession apex, cash woes abound

country's Once the fastest-growing city, the middle-class haven of 220,000 outside Las Vegas is now teetering on the brink of insolvency. The state is threatening to take over the city and desperate officials are even considering selling the brand new city hall.

The billboards came down after a court blocked mass police or fire layoffs, but the problems remain in the state's fourth-largest city. Property values have plummeted. After spending more than it earned for four consecutive years, the city will not be able to make payroll come October.

"Every single local government has problems. ... much more severe," said

Martin Leavitt, who oversees a state board investigating the city's financial predicament.

North Las Vegas mirrors Nevada's downfall in many As construction wavs. cranes erected new casinos across Las Vegas starting two decades ago, would-be homeowners flocked to the suburb for its affordable prices.

The population nearly quadrupled, from fewer than 60,000 in 1990 to 223,394 last year. North Las Vegas earned the fastestgrowing city title in 2007. Nevada was the fastestgrowing state during the decade.

This year, the state leads the nation in bankruptcies, foreclosures and unemployment.

In 2005, more than 8,000 homes were built in the city. New construction dropped to 2,800 houses in 2008. Thousands of businesses within the city closed their doors as residents lost their homes, according to city records. SEC ADs mum on expansion

ORLANDO — Tennessee's interim athletics director says that she is referring all questions about possible expansion of Southeastern Conference to the league's commissioner.

At the SEC's annual meeting of athletic directors, Tennessee's Joan Cronan said Thursday "I think all you're going to get from any of us is 'no comment.' She says the ADs are deferring all questions about expansion to the commissioner.

Several other SEC athletic directors declined any comment. Meetings conclude on Thursday.

Reports continue to swirl this week about Texas A&M possibly becoming the SEC's 13th member. Florida president and SEC president and chancellors committee chairman Bernie Machen said recently that though they are satisfied with their current alignment, future conditions may make it advantageous to expand.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - Three North Carolina football players and a fourth who has transferred were involved in a campus wreck in May but not cited for speeding by an officer who had worked on-field game security.

Herman Davidson was cited for driving without a license after swerving to miss an oncoming car and flipping a vehicle owned by senior linebacker Ebele Okakpu's father. UNC police Sgt. S.R. Smith revised his report to state Davidson was driving at 45 mph instead of the posted limit of 25 due to the "severity of the collision."

UNC police spokesman Randy Young said Smith resigned in July but wouldn't discuss details. Smith couldn't be reached for comment.

Junior linebacker Dion Guy suffered minor scrapes. Okakpu and senior offensive lineman Carl Gaskins were also in the vehicle.

Coker: No contact from NCAA about Miami probe

SAN ANTONIO — Former Miami coach Larry Coker said Wednesday that NCAA investigators haven't contacted him amid allegations that players on his Hurricanes teams were treated to sex parties, cars and lavish gifts from a booster who is now in prison.

Coker, who was at Miami

from 2001 to 2006, is now at Texas-San Antonio in his first coaching job since the Hurricanes fired him.




Former Larry Coker booster Nevin was Miami's Shapiro told football coach. Yahoo Sports

he provided extra benefits to 72 football players and other athletes at Miami from 2002 to 2010.

The NCAA said Wednesday it has spent five months investigating Shapiro, who is serving 20 years in prison for running a \$930 million Ponzi scheme.

In a statement released by UTSA. Coker said he hasn't been contacted by the NCAA or Miami, and was not aware of details of the investigation. "Compliance issues have always been of utmost importance to me throughout my career," Coker said. "Since I have not been contacted by either the NCAA or Miami, it would be inappropriate for me to discuss any alleged rules violations at another university." The statement continues with a lengthy rundown of steps UTSA takes to ensure compliance within its new football program, and ends with Coker saying he will make no other public statements about the Miami investigation. Coker was fired at Miami after a final 7-6 season that was marred by an infamous sideline-clearing brawl and off-field troubles. After trying to find another job for two years, UTSA hired Coker in 2009 to lead its fledging football program. The Roadrunners play their first game in school history next month.

NCAA confirms investigation at Miami

CORAL GABLES — The NCAA said Wednesday it has been investigating the relationship between a convicted Ponzi scheme artist and the University of Miami for five months, and the allegations — if true — show the need for "serious and fundamental change" in college sports.

Former booster Nevin Shapiro, now serving 20 years in federal prison, claims he treated players with sex parties, nightclub outings, cars and other gifts. Shapiro told Yahoo! Sports he provided improper benefits to 72 football players and other athletes at Miami from 2002 to 2010.

"If the assertions are true, the alleged conduct at the University of Miami is an illustration of the need for serious and fundamental change in many critical aspects of college sports," NCAA president Mark Emmert said in a statement.

The Hurricanes' entire football lined rule book and new parameteam took the practice field ters for athletic scholarships. The Wednesday, even though Shapiro's claims involve several current players. Coach Al Golden said it was too soon to take disciplinary action.

The Hurricanes open their season Sept. 5 against Maryland.

"Everybody is practicing," said Golden, who is in his first season as Miami's coach. "If it is determined somebody broke rules, then certainly they'll be first dealt with. ... As we get ready for Maryland, hopefully we'll swiftly learn if errors were made. If there are guys that are going to have to sit out games, we'll adjust our practice accordingly.'

Players weren't permitted to speak with the media.

Last week, Emmert led a group of university presidents in drafting an outline for change in college sports, including higher academic standards, a stream-

group included Miami president Donna Shalala.

'The serious threats to the integrity of college sports are one of the key reasons why I called together more than 50 presidents and chancellors last week to drive substantive changes to Division I intercollegiate athletics," Emmert said in his statement Wednesdav.

The allegations against Miami - a program that once reveled in an outlaw image and dealt with a massive Pell Grant scandal in the 1990s — have sparked the latest in a string of NCAA investigations involving some of college football's most high-profile and successful programs.

In the past 18 months, football teams at Southern California, Ohio State, Auburn, Oregon, Michigan, North Carolina, Georgia



So you want to catch some redfish?

ne of the most sought after species of fish along the Gulf coast of our great state is the redfish (Sciaenops ocellatus). We talk about it often.

Many old-timers in these parts will remember back to the mid 1980's it was illegal to harvest a red. I sure do.

The sudden popularity of blackened redfish in restaurants along the Gulf coast nearly sealed the fish's fate. Commercial over-harvesting of the species had a drastic affect on numbers and red drum were nearly wiped out for good. That decline lead to a moratorium for several years to allow the population to replenish.

And as nature has the ability to do so well, the species rebounded nicely and vast schools of reds can be found throughout the Gulf Coast from Florida to Texas and up the Atlantic coastline.

Puppy drum, also known as channel bass up the Mid-Atlantic coastline, are caught as far north as New Jersey although the species isn't as prevalent that far north as their southern cousins.

Triva question: What is the state fish of North Carolina? If you guessed the redfish,

you're right. Fittingly, the all-tackle world record redfish was



NCAA investigators were on the Miami campus this week in the wake of the allegations by Shapiro, and have interviewed Shalala and athletic director Shawn Eichorst He was sentenced to prison in June for masterminding a \$930 million Ponzi scheme, plus ordered to pay more than \$82 million in restitution to investors.

Shalala said she was 'upset, disheartened. and saddened by the recent allegations."

'We will vigorously pursue the truth, wherever that path may lead, and I have insisted upon complete, honest, and transparent cooperation with the NCAA from our staff and students, Shalala said in a statement. 'Our counsel is working jointly with the NCAA enforcement division in a thorough and meticulous investigation."

Most cases are resolved in six to seven months, but more complex investigations take longer, an NCAA official said.

Golden said he's eager to obtain answers quickly, in part so his players don't repeat past mistakes.

"If they were exposed to Mr. Shapiro, clearly we have to make sure we prevent that going forward," Golden said. "You do that by getting to the facts. How did this guy, if he did, get around our players like that? As a head coach, I want to know. I know our assistant coaches want to know. We want to make sure it never happens again. It shouldn't happen."

Yahoo! Sports published its story Tuesday afternoon, saying it spent 100 hours interviewing Shapiro over the span of 11 months and audited thousands of pages of financial and business records to examine his claims, some involving events nearly a decade ago. The NCAA's four-year statute of limitations doesn't apply when there is a patcontinues into the past four years.

"I did it because I could," Shapiro said of his spending. "And because nobody stepped in to stop me."

A person familiar with the situation said much of Shapiro's access to Hurricane programs in recent years was approved by former athletic director Kirby Hocutt, who has since left the school for Texas Tech. The person spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because of the ongoing joint investigation between the university and the NCAA.

Hocutt, the person said, allowed Shapiro on the sideline before football games at times during the 2008 season, plus invited him to select gatherings reserved for the athletic department's biggest donors.

"That's what Kirby did,' the person said. "His No. 1 job was to raise money and thing, I ain't got nothing."

Shapiro had been on the Miami sideline before games an unknown number of times before Hocutt's arrival as athletic director in 2008. Hocutt has declined comment on the investigation.

Shapiro dubbed himself "Little Luke" in reference to Luther Campbell — aka Luke Skyywalker, the rapper who was a constant presence on the Hurricanes' sideline during their 1980s glory days.

Campbell took exception to any comparisons.

"Nevin Shapiro wishes he could wear my shorts for one day," Campbell wrote in a blog post. "That punk could never be me. First of all, I have never been a UM tern of willful violations that booster. I have never given a dime to the school. I have and always will support the players and the program out of civic pride, but I never violated any NCAA rules when I was the team's biggest fan in the 1980s.

Former Nebraska defensive end Benard Thomas told the AP he was on Shapiro's yacht with two former Hurricanes players, Kellen Winslow Jr. and D.J. Williams, in 2005 when they had finished college.

"We all had money ourselves," Thomas said. "We didn't need anything from him.'

Thomas described Shapiro as "cool."

But Jackson spent a total of seven weeks at the top with his "Bad" songs; Perry has been at the top perch now for a cumulative 18 weeks.

Perry's first major hit was the song "I Kissed a Girl" in 2008.

David Carradine's widow settles suit

Court records show David Carradine's widow has reached a settlement in a wrongful death lawsuit filed against a French company handling the actor's final film.

Abercrombie asks 'Jersey Shore' cast to shop elsewhere

NEW YORK — The Situation doesn't usually require a lot of motivation to lose the shirt. But Abercrombie & Fitch wants him to go one further — the company has offered to pay "Jersey Shore" cast members to stop wearing clothes carrying their brand.

The preppy teen retailer said Tuesday it would pay a "substantial payment" to Mike "The Situation" Sorrentino or any cast member who stops wearing its clothing on the popular MTV reality show because the series is "contrary to the aspirational nature of the brand."

"We are deeply concerned that Mr. Sorrentino's association with our brand could cause significant damage to our image," the retailer said in a press release.

It may seem strange that a brand that employs half-naked models to stand outside its flagship stores and courted controversy with racy catalogs has come out with such an aggressive campaign against the hard partying cast of "Jersey Shore." But the audacious approach is getting the teen retailer tons of publicity during the crucial back-to-school season, the second biggest shopping period of the year. The CEO says it's having fun with the ploy, and marketing experts say the company may wind up laughing all the way to the bank.

"It gets their name further out into the marketplace with one of the hottest brands on TV right now at the peak of the back-to-school season, said Wall Street Strategies analyst Brian Sozzi. "It's free marketing. Because the approach is so ridiculous, everybody's talking about it.'

PARIS — Coco Chanel: A fashion icon whose name has become shorthand for timeless French chic, a shrewd businesswoman who overcame a childhood of poverty to build a luxury supernova and ... a Nazi spy?

A new book by a Parisbased American historian suggests Chanel not only had a wartime affair with a German aristocrat and spy, but that she herself was also an agent of Germany's Abwehr military intelligence organization and a rabid anti-Semite.

Doubts about Chanel's loyalties during World War II have long festered, but "Sleeping with the Enemy: Coco Chanel's Secret War" goes well beyond those previous allegations, citing as evidence documents culled from archives around the world.

The book, published in the U.S. on Tuesday by Knopf, has ruffled feathers in France, where the luxury industry is a pillar of the economy and Chanel is widely regarded as the crowning jewel.


New Out Back Bakery offers cookies, cakes and breads

Wine's sweeter side

ow many sweet wines have you sipped this year? If the answer is not many or none, you are not alone.

Americans — who like most people of the world love their sweets, including chocolate and ice cream of every description and flavor — have not turned to naturally sweet wines. I am talking here not about everyday pop wines or even about semisweet Rieslings - Bev and I keep two or three for drinking with spicy foods, Mexican or Oriental - but rather the late-harvest version Rieslings and grapes such as Moscato, dessert sherry, ruby port, ice wine, and most distinctive of all, the nectarsweet Sauternes of France.

By the way, "sauterne," without the initial capital and ultimate "s," is simply generic for sweet wine in America and bears no relation to the real McCoy. The French do not pronounce the "s."

According to one research group in 2009, the sales volume of dessert wines sold in the USA amounted to about onetenth of regular table wine, about 27 million cases out of a total of more than 280 million.

As Bordeaux once set a world standard for red wines blended of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, other varieties, the white wine of Sauternes made mostly from the Semillion (sem-e-yon) grape is the true benchmark of dessert wine. The designated region of Sauternes is in the province of Bordeaux to the south. No one knows why the area lends itself to the production of these superlative unfortified (by the addition of brandy) naturally sweet wines. Somehow the moist atmosphere encourages the growth of a grape fungus called botrytis. Otherwise known as the "Noble Rot." it is this special development which leads to wines redolent with the taste of ripe apricot, peach and pineapple overlaid by a creamy quality unmatched anywhere else in the world. Other true dessert wines are Eiswein (German) or ice wine (Canada and America). This elixir is created from grapes allowed to literally freeze on the vine. They are then picked, usually in the dark, one at a time and pressed until the water is gone, leaving a concentrated syrup laced with pure fruit and acid background, so delicious as to bring tears to the eyes. Two tongue-twisters are Germany's "Beerenauslese" and the even more terrible "Trockenbeerenauslese," without a doubt Germany's greatest wine. They are rarely found, because the required weather to produce the mold botrytis, as with Sauternes, is rare. So these ultra-luscious wines with low alcohol content are hard to come by and very expensive. One other region of Europe famous for botrytisaffected harvest is



Doctors were just in here to see her, but are not sure if she will be able to go home today. She had some pain through the night, but is now taking some pain medicine and sleeping really well.



Make or buy refrigerated biscuits and bake. Butter well.

- **Chocolate Sauce:**
- 3 cups white sugar
- 2/3 cup of Hershey's cocoa
- 1 stick butter (not margarine)
- 1 large can evaporated milk
- 1/3 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons vanilla
- 1 teaspoon flour mixed with just enough water to thin

Mix dry ingredients. Add canned milk and mix well. Use candy thermometer and bring all ingredients except butter and vanilla to a boil. Stir well.

Turn down heat and cook until mixture reaches a soft ball stage. Add butter and vanilla and set aside. Spoon over hot buttered biscuits.

Capers add delicious pungency to tapenade wrap

When you need to jam a lot of flavor into a simple dish, reach for an umami bomb.

That is, foods that are jammed with the fifth taste savory (to go along with bitter, sweet, salty and sour). In a small package, these foods deliver seriously big and satisfying flavor. Things like Parmesan cheese, anchovies and steak. As far as leaving me satisfied, savory beats out sweet every time.

It's one of the reasons I'm such a fan of tapenade, a simple puree of olives, anchovies, garlic, capers, olive oil and thyme. It's salty, savory and pungently delicious. It can be spread on baked fish, used as a dip or spread for crusty bread, or do duty as a sandwich condiment.

And don't let the anchovies spook you. You'll never know they are there, but the flavor isn't the same without them.

ROASTED **CHICKEN WRAPS** WITH TAPENADE

Start to finish: 20 minutes

Servings: 4

1 1/2 cups pitted Kala-

2 teaspoons chopped fresh thyme

- Pinch red pepper flakes
- Salt and ground black pepper
- 4 large flour tortillas
- Bibb or Boston lettuce leaves
- Meat from a 1 1/2pound rotisserie chicken
- 12-ounce jar roasted red peppers, drained, patted dry and chopped
- 1/2 cup grated Parme-san cheese

In a food processor, combine the olives, anchovies, garlic, capers, olive oil, lemon zest and juice, thyme and red pepper flakes. Pulse until very finely chopped. Season with salt and pepper, then pulse again.

Spoon 1 to 2 tablespoons of the tapenade over each tortilla. Top with several leaves of lettuce, then a quarter each of the chicken, red peppers and Parmesan cheese. Wrap the sides of the tortilla up around the fillings. The wraps can be eaten as is or heated in a 350 F oven

Tomato myths still sow seeds of confusion

Any way you slice it, the tomato is one confusing comestible.

There's the whole identity crisis thing — is it a fruit or a vegetable? And don't get us started on the tuh-MAY-to, tuh-MAH-to thing. It's enough to drive anyone ba-NAY-nas.

Here are what tomato lovers and experts have to say about some common misconceptions about this vine product.



This is the kind of thing that can spark quite the argument, with both sides passionately supporting their claims. Oddly enough, both are right, at least according to the USDA's Economic Research Service. Yes, botanically speaking the tomato is a fruit, but horticulturally and legally, it is considered a vegetable.

This debate has been adjudicated by none other than the U.S. Supreme Court. It happened in the late 19th century in connection with a challenge to tariffs on imported produce. The high court ruled in Nix vs. Hedden that despite the botanical definition, tomatoes are a vegetable, in part because at the tables of the time they were served as "the principal part of the Lowe of the Kendall-Jackrepast" and not as dessert.







Since declarer had to play the trump suit for only one loser, an opponent had to have jack-doubleton. So South won with his heart ace, cashed the club ace, and led the club queen.

How many points do you need to come in over one no-trump?

It is less a matter of points, more a matter of winners. The normal assumption is that game is impossible. You get into the auction, find a fit, and get back out again.






