## School bomb

 plot in TampaExpelled teen in custody

TAMPA - Tampa police have arrested an expelled student after thwarting what they deemed a poten-
tially "catastrophic" plot to tially "catastrophic" plot to
set off a bomb at his former high school and cause mass casualties on the first day of classes next week, authorities said Wednesday. Police Chief Jane Castor said Jared Cano, 17, had
threatened to plant a bomb at Freedom High School in north Tampa and detonate the device when students return Tuesday. The suspect was arrested
Tuesday night after some one alerted police to the alleged plot. Castor told a news confer ence that the alleged bomb-
ing plot was planned ing plot was planned
minute by minute and the intent was to cause more casualties than the 1999 Columbine High School massacre, which resulted in
13 deaths before the two shooters killed themselves. Castor said police and the school system "were probably able to thwart a poten-
tially catastrophic event tially catastrophic event,
the likes of which the city of Tampa has not seen, and hopefully never will." At Cano's apartment, police discovered materials to
make pipe bombs, shrapnel make pipe bombs, shrapnel,
plastic tubing and timing and fusing devices, along with a fuel source, Castor said. Police also said they found a journal containing
schematic drawings schematic drawings of
rooms inside the school and statements about the teenager's intent to kill. The Tampa high school shares a cafeteria with its neighboring middle school,
increasing the potential threas to hundreds of additional students, officials noted.
The The plot targeted specific school administrators and any students police said. Authorities did not name the administrators nor would they disclose who tipped them off about the alleged plot.
Cano's mother consented to a police search Tuesday evening, Castor said. In addition to the bomb-making materials, police reported they also found a mari-

Littnan said car seat expiration dates is just one small item on a long list of things people
don't know about car seat safety. From poorly adjusted straps to incorrect installations, she has seen it all.
"Four out of five child safety seats are either in the car wrong
or not used correctly" she sid However, the long-time instructor said the best way parents can guarantee they're using their seats right is to read the owner's manual. Each seat
comes with a booklet of instructions on how to set up the seat properly. Plus, most seats have stickers on the outside of the seat itself to guide parents through the process.
"It's all in reading the direcfactures try hard to make it easy for people to understand."
In addition to reading instructions, parents should also make sure to have the right seat for the

It is likely to include tax cuts to help the middle class, a build-up-America construction program that goes beyond any infrastructure proposal Obama
has had already, and tarhas had already, and tar-
geted help for the particularly worrisome group of people who have remained unemployed for many months in a row.

confirmed those details to The Associated Press, on condition of anonymity because the president has not
disclosed them publicly disclosed them publicly. In Illinois on Wednes-
day, Obama broadly outlined his plans to help the fragile economy and have the costs covered as part of a broad plan to reduce the deficit. He pledged to present a specific way to
do both to the super committee of lawmakers assigned to come up with such a deficit-slicing plan before Thanksgiving.
Previewing his line Previewing his line of
argument, Obama has spent much of a three-day bus tour through the Midwest lobbying people to pressure their members of
Congress to deal with him. "If you're delivering that message, it's a lot stronger than me delivering that message because you're the folks ultimately that put those members of Congress into office. All
right?" Obama said at a town hall in northwest Illinois. He faced a supportive but restless audience eager for its government to deliver on protection of Social Security.

How many sweet f the answer is not many or none, you are not alone Americans - who like most people of the world love their sweets, including chocolate and ice
cream of every descrip tion and flavor-have not turned to naturally sweet wines. I am talking here not about everyday pop wines or even about semi and I keep two or three for drinking with spicy foods, Mexican or Oriental - but rather the late-harvest
