"Our shelves are bare," said Deborah Rossfeld, executive director, in a news release.


Needed food items include nonperishable canned meats, macaroni, cereal, macaroni and cheese, Tuna Helper, canned vegetables and canned fruit.

Obama, Romney hit hard in initial meet

DENVER — In a showdown at close quarters, President Barack Obama and Republican Mitt Romney sparred aggressively in their first campaign debate Wednesday night over taxes, deficits and strong steps needed to create jobs in a sputtering national economy. "The status quo is not going to cut it," declared the challenger.

Obama in turn accused his rival of seeking to "double down" on economic policies that actually led to the devastating national downturn four years ago — and of evasiveness on details for Romney proposals on tax changes, health care, Wall Street regulation and more.

Both men made frequent references to the weak economy and high national unemployment, by far the dominant issue in the race for the White House. Public opinion polls show Obama with a slight advantage

'Cost recovery' goes before high court Group argues against advance charge for nuke plant construction

The Florida Supreme Court is scheduled to hear oral arguments today challenging the constitutionality of charging electricity customers in advance for the cost of future nuclear plants.

It centers on Progress Energy Florida's proposed Levy County nuclear reactors and two future nuclear reactors planned by Florida Power and Light.

The Southern Alliance has labeled the advanced cost recovery a "nuclear tax" and a "blank check for utilities." It has argued Progress Energy has not established the required "intent to build" to support cost recovery for the planned County Levy reactors. "Year after year the com-

mission has unfortunately voted to enrich the big power companies at the expense of Florida's busirisky nuclear power projects that may never even be

built," said Dr. Stephen A. Smith, executive director of Southern Alliance for Clean Energy, in a press release. 'We look forward to arguing this issue before the Florida State Supreme Court.'

Local transportation group looking at partners

Transportation planners are actively considering potential partners for the county to transition into a municipal planning organization, and so far Hernando County MPO is looking likely.

"I think Hernando looks at us and thinks we could invigorate them a little bit,' said Bob Clifford, Tampa Bay Area Regional Transportation Authority (TBARTA) director, who provides management services to the Citrus County Transportation Planning Organization.

Clifford spoke Wednesday to two TPO advisory groups the Transportation Technical Advisory Committee and the Citizens Advisory Committee about progress he's made in negotiating for MPO partners, an effort TPO board members instructed Clifford to pursue.

Clifford will present his report to the TPO board when it meets at 5:15 p.m. fied in the 2010 census at

■ Hernando MPO is ready to engage in the discussion, Clifford said. It feels like a natural fit because most of Citrus residents' out-ofcounty trips pass through Hernando County. Both counties share major route connections in U.S. 19 and County Road 491 and, if the Suncoast Parkway 2 is built through Citrus, that highway as well. The two counties are close in population size. However, board structure and equity could be an issue: The Citrus board has seven seats, while the Hernando board has only six. Clifford said he anticipated Hernando would not want to be the minority partner as it already is established and

is larger by 30,000 people. ■ With Ocala-Marion, the MPO has 12 seats and a population of 331,298. Citrus and Marion counties share a new urbanized area identi-

Although the Ocala-Mar-Three MPOs are being ion MPO is open to discussion, a merger might not be practical. It is in a different FDOT district, and apportionment could be difficult as its representation is not proportional.

■ Lake-Sumter sees the benefit in regional discussions, but already encompasses two counties and has 18 seats, one of which is rotated among seven communities. By state law, MPOs must have between five and 19 voting members. Like Ocala-Marion, Lake-Sumter is in a different FDOT district than Citrus County. It also is concerned about regional identification.

"It's all about concurrence and affirmation of what happens instead of who actually decides and approves," Clifford said. "We're going to find our way through the fog as we go through it and the fog will clear up.

CMHS Sugarmill Woods walk-in clinic to close

CRYSTAL RIVER — The Citrus Memorial Health System walk-in clinic at Sugarmill Woods will close Dec. 31 in a budget-cutting move.

Hospital CEO Ryan Beaty said other services at the Sugarmill Woods center, including diagnostic imaging and physical therapy, will remain open.

CMHS will save about \$500,000 by closing the walk-in clinic. which opened in 2009 but failed to see the patient load officials expected. Beaty said other physicians and another walk-in clinic have opened nearby, giving patents more options.

Plus, the Sugarmill center includes primary care physicians and specialists. 'It's not like we're leav-

ing the community in a lurch," Beaty said.

Diane Toto, president of the We Care Food Pantry, had helped organized free county bus service to the indigent patients.

Toto said she was surprised the Sugarmill clinic didn't draw as many patients as CMHS expected.

"There's such need over here," she said. "People aren't really that aware of the indigent program and they're afraid to go there because they don't have any money."

Toto said she understands the decision, though. "It's a dollar and cents issue," she said. "You can't have something opened

that's not making money." Beaty said CMHS will continue to expand services in the southwest portion of the county.

"We stand ready to work with all community care providers and human service providers to meet any needs that are there," he said.

Other budget highlights: ■ CMHS anticipates 100

additional hospital patients, based in some part on \$338,000 in new marketing costs. Beaty said the effect Oct. 1.

"We want to let the community know that we are the only complete and comprehensive heart program in the county," he said. "We are in the top 14 percent of hospitals in all the country."

Wife to testify in abuse case Woman changes plea to no contest

INVERNESS woman accused of not getting timely treatment for a boy who was allegedly badly scalded by her husband changed her plea.

Alexza Marisol Potts, 27. pleaded no contest to child abuse charges Wednesday. She originally pleaded not guilty.

With her no contest plea, prosecutors agreed to five years of probation for Potts. She also is expected to testify against ĥer husband, Aaron Potts, who is charged with aggravated child abuse for allegedly spraying the child in the groin area with hot water, causing first-, second- and third-



Hearing on land off C.R. 486 postponed Business group seeks continuance

A request that was to be heard today by the county planning panel has been postponed until next month to work out details concerning a 61.75-acre parcel at 3499 W. Norvell Bryant Highway (County Road 486) to allow commercial development.

"We have asked for a continuance, since this report was just provided to us last Thursday to take the time to meet with staff and try and work through the issues before moving forward," Joe Capuccilli, on behalf of Genesis Group for C.R. 486 LLC, wrote in an email Wednesday to the Chronicle.

County staff had recommended denial of the group's request to change a residential area on C.R. 486 to commercial. The request would go before the Citrus County Planning and Development Commission to amend the county's comprehensive plan. In its initial report, county staff stated: "The application is inconsistent with the goals, objectives and policies of the comprehensive plan.' The Chronicle reported Wednesday the report indicated the parcel was environmentally sensitive. However, the county's report followed a policy of allowing no new commercial development in the Coastal, Lakes and Rivers Regions. As the county's report stated: "The site does not appear to have any environmental issues and is located within the central ridge region of the county," the Chronicle stands corrected and regrets the error. Capuccilli has pointed out the site will be well served for sanitary sewer, potable water and solid waste disposal. He said the county staff's report reveals two main issues: One, it would do away with the transition area of the professional services/office (PSO) designation, or office space zone; the second being the residential density. Capuccilli wrote: "What wasn't stressed is we do not adjoin residential to the west, since it is where the YMCA is planned.' The parcel is between the YMCA site and an existing commercial site, has a depth suitable for a shopping center or town center and leaves more than 700 feet to the southern boundary of Black Diamond, Capuccilli explained. All land touching Black Diamond would remain in its current land use for medium density residential, which the applicant believes is more than sufficient for a buffer. Capuccilli said current residential density for existing land uses already could allow for density for up to eight units per acre in the medium density residential area and 10 units per acre in the PSO area.

Aaron Potts' trial is set for Dec. 3. Alexza Potts' sentencing is set for Dec. 18.

Prosecutor Brian Trehy said his office agreed to the deal because Alexza Potts has been cooperative and, he alleged, she has suffered domestic violence.

Alexza Potts' attorney Andras Czioka wants the court to withhold adjudication in the case.

The Pottses were arrested in March 2012 and charged with child abuse. Alexza Potts was accused of trying to cover up Aaron Potts' actions.

According to a Citrus County Sheriff's Office report, a witness said she got a call from Aaron Potts on a Saturday, saying he was stressed out and could not handle watching children. He wanted her to help. The witness, however, reportedly convinced him that he would do fine.

The witness said the next day Alexza Potts sent her a text message asking her to check on the children. When the witness arrived, Aaron Potts told her a rash on the boy's groin area had become worse. When she saw the so-called rash, she immediately said she was going to take the child to the hospital.

The child reportedly told investigators Aaron Potts made him stand in the bathtub while he sprayed scalding-hot shower water on his groin area for a minute, causing the burns. Aaron Potts reportedly then used peroxide and alcohol to treat the injuries, further aggravating the pain. When investigators talked to the couple, they provided stories alleging the injury was a bug bite that turned ugly.

At first, Alexza Potts denied noticing anything unusual with the child when she got home from work.

Heading south Endangered whooping cranes depart on flight to Florida

Six young whooping cranes began their ultralight-led migration Friday from the White River Marsh State Wildlife Area in Green Lake County, Wis.

This is the 12th group of birds to take part in a project led by the Whooping Crane Eastern Partnership (WCEP), an international coalition of public and private groups reintroducing the imperiled species in eastern North America, part of its historic range.

WCEP partner Operation Migration will use two ultralight aircraft to lead the juvenile cranes through Wisconsin, Illinois, Kentucky, Tennessee, Alabama and Georgia to reach the birds' wintering habitat at St. Marks National Wildlife Refuge (NWR), in Wakulla County along Florida's Gulf Coast a short distance south of Tallahassee. As of Wednesday, the cranes were in Columbia County, Wis.

"Despite the fact that we have done this before, each year we learn something new about these wonderful birds," said Joe Duff, CEO of Operation Migration and

progress. Our target is to arrive in Florida before Christmas.'

In addition to the six birds being led south by ultralights, biologists from WCEP partner International Crane Foundation are rearing six whooping crane chicks at Horicon NWR in Dodge County, Wis. The birds will be released later this fall in the company of older cranes from whom the young birds will learn the migration route south. This is the eighth year WCEP has used this direct autumn release method.

Whooping cranes that take part in the ultralight and DAR reintroductions are hatched at the U.S. Geological Survey's Patuxent Wildlife Research Center in Laurel, Md., and at the International Crane Foundation in Baraboo, Wis.

Chicks are raised under a strict isolation protocol, and to ensure the birds remain wild, handlers adhere to a no-talking rule and wear costumes designed to mask the human form.

The 12 ultralight-led and DAR chicks are joining two wild-hatched thecranes.org.

Whooping cranes were on the verge of extinction in the 1940s. Today, only 600 birds are in existence, with 445 of them in the wild.

WCEP asks anyone who encounters a whooping crane in the wild to give them the respect and distance they need. Do not approach birds on foot within 200 yards; remain in your vehicle; do not approach in a vehicle any closer than 100 yards. Also, remain concealed and do not speak loudly enough that the birds can hear you. Finally, do not trespass on private property in an attempt to view or photograph whooping cranes.







Initiative launched for military kids

WASHINGTON - Madeline Stevens knows what it's like to be a military brat.

'The first week of school, it's really hard," said Stevens, a 17-year-old from Jacksonville, Fla., who has moved eight times with her naval aviator father and attended 10 different schools. 'You sit by yourself at lunch; you try and make friends in classes. When you're younger it's easier because, you know, you just share crayons, and you're new best friends."

But in high school Stevens said she's had to integrate herself into sports and clubs to make friends, many of whom have known each other most of their lives. The shuffle has also been a strain academically.

Moving can be tough for any child, but it can be even harder for children of military families, who, like Stevens, may relocate more frequently. And the emotional impact of having a deployed parent can also include worry and anxiety, said Mary Ann Rafoth, dean of Robert Morris University's School of Education and Social Sciences.

"Most of us go through each day not realizing that we're a nation at war. But those kids do," she said. "They often feel like they're carrying that burden alone."

However, educators often don't have the tools to help military children cope.

A new initiative being launched Wednesday by first lady Michelle Obama and the vice president's wife, Jill Biden, is designed to better prepare educators instructing educators instructing military-connected chil-dren. "Operation: Educate the Educator" already has a commitment from more than 100 colleges offering teaching degrees.

The Obama administration has partnered with the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education and the Military Child Education Coalition to help military children as they face social, emotional and learning challenges in the classroom while having an active-duty parent. The colleges that have signed on have agreed to incorporate information about military children in the training curriculums for student teachers, push faculty and student teachers to do research on military children and require student teachers to work with military children as part of their final clinical experience or internship. Nearly 2 million students have parents who are either on active duty, members of the National Guard or Reserves or military veterans, according to the Military Child Education Coalition. Students

H-P sinks on Whitman's outlook

NEW YORK — A pair of encouraging economic reports helped nudge the market stock higher Wednesday. Measures of business activity in the service sector and job growth last month came in better than economists had expected.

The market's gains were held in check by a slump in energy stocks and Hewlett-Packard's 13 percent plunge. In a meeting with analysts and investors, Meg Whitman, H-P's CEO, predicted weak earnings and sales for the foreseeable future.

The Dow Jones rose 12.25 points to close at 13,494.61. The Standard & Poor's 500 index gained 5.24 points to 1,450.99.

"The price action today seems boring, but the economic data is pretty strong," said Ryan Detrick, senior technical strategist at Schaeffer's Investment

The Institute for Supply Management said its index of service companies, which includes everything from financial firms to clothing stores, rose in September to the highest level since March. The index reached 55.1. Economists had estimated it would drop to 53.4. But concerns over an eco-

nomic slowdown in Europe, China and the U.S. helped push the price of crude oil down \$3.75 to \$88.14 a barrel. Energy stocks fell sharply as a result. After H-P, Chevron had the worst loss in the Dow, giving up \$1.82 to \$116.14.

"The U.S. is looking better than a lot of places in the world," Detrick said. "The big question is: Are they going to pull us down with them?"

In other trading, the Nasdaq composite index rose 15.19 points to 3,135.23. The yield on the benchmark 10year U.S. Treasury note ended the trading day at 1.61 percent, the same as late Tuesday.

Hewlett-Packard plunged after CEO Meg Whitman said a successful turnaround of the computer maker is a long way off. Profits will likely fall by more than 10 percent next year, she said. HP's stock lost \$2.22 to \$14.91.

Payment processor ADP said Wednesday that U.S. companies put 162,000 more workers on their payrolls last month. That's still below August's total of 189,000, and not enough to put a dent in the 8.1 percent employment rate.

T-Mobile, MetroPCS unite to battle rivals

NEW YORK — T-Mobile and MetroPCS have agreed to combine their struggling cellphone businesses in an effort to compete better with their three larger rivals.

The combined company will use the T-Mobile brand and have about 42.5 million subscribers. Although T-Mobile will stay No. 4 among U.S. wireless companies, it will have access to more space on the airwaves, a critical factor as cellphone carriers try to expand their capacity for wireless broadband.

That could ultimately mean more choices and better services for customers, though Forrester Research analyst Charles Golvin doesn't believe the deal will make a "revolutionary difference" for U.S. cellphone customers. That said, MetroPCS customers will probably have to buy new phones at some point over the next three years as they move over to T-Mobile's network.

But why say so in a mailing to Polk and Osceola voters? Because doing so makes the advertisement a "three-pack."

Nominally endorsing three Democrats constitutes "partybuilding," rather than an "on-be-half-of" expenditure for Game. Thus the law pretends the mailing is meant to educate voters about the Democratic Party, which does not require the three mentioned officeholders to be running in the counties where the flyer is received.

Both parties use three-pack ads. Usually, they extoll the virtues of one candidate for 59 seconds, or on both sides of printed materials, and then jam two other candidates' names into the tagline.

This mailing is unique in that it doesn't mention any candidate in the race it seeks to influence. Instead, its fine print cites three Democrats seeking re-election in far-off districts.

Every election year produces its quirks and oddities, even dirty tricks. But the anti-Horner threepack is a weird one, even by Florida standards.

in key battleground states and nationally, and Romney was particularly aggressive, like a man looking to shake up the campaign with a little less than five weeks to run.

With a prime-time television audience likely counted in the tens of millions, moderator Jim Lehrer was pressed at time to enforce time limits on the two rivals. The president occasionally shook his head as Romney talked over Lehrer.

And Romney virtually lectured Obama at one point after the president accused him of seeking to cut education funds.

"Mr. President, you're entitled to your own airplane and your own house, but not your own facts."

Romney said he had plans to fix the economy, repeal Obama's health care plan, remake Medicare, pass a substitute for the legislation designed to prevent another financial crash and reduce deficits — but he provided no specifics despite Obama's prodding.

Said Obama: "At some point the American people have to ask themselves: Is the reason Governor Romney is keeping all these plans secret, is it because they're going to be too good? Because middle class families benefit too much? No."

At times the debate turned into rapid-fire charges and retorts that drew on dense facts and figures that were difficult to follow. The men argued over oil industry subsidies, federal spending as a percentage of the GDP,

Firm in outbreak halts operations

FRAMINGHAM, Mass. -A Massachusetts specialty pharmacy suspected as the source of a steroid that has been linked to an outbreak of a deadly form of meningitis said it has voluntarily suspended operations.

In a statement Wednesday, the New England Compounding Center said it was working closely with the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and other regulators to identify the source of infection.

Health officials said the outbreak has sickened 26 people in five states who received steroid injections. Four people have died.

Eighteen of the cases are in Tennessee, where a Nashville clinic received the largest shipment of the steroid from the Framingham-based company.

Iran tightens grip on currency

Monetary unit loses more than a third of value in a week

TEHRAN, Iran — Iranian authorities used aggressive measures Wednesday in an attempt to halt the nosedive of the country's currency, making arrests, vowing to stamp out sidewalk money changers and warning merchants against fueling the mounting public anger over the economy.

There were unconfirmed reports of sporadic violence. Associated Press photos showed riot police blocking a street with the charred hulks of a garbage can and a motorcycle that had been set on fire. Smoke was rising from the area in central Tehran near the main bazaar.

The sweeping responses to the freefall of the rial which has lost more than a third of its value in a week --

underscored the worries for Iranian leaders after months of dismissing the West's economic squeeze seeking to rein in Tehran's nuclear program. A declining currency causes shifts in an economy such as making imported goods more expensive.

Although the currency crisis is blamed on a combination of factors — including internal government policies — the rush to dump rials appears to reflect an underlying perception that international sanctions have deepened problems such as runaway inflation and soaring prices for imports and the only safe hedge is to grab dollars or euros.

If the economic turmoil intensifies, it could boost pressure on the ruling system before elections next June to pick President Mahmoud

Turkey fires at Syria after deadly shelling; 34 dead



BEIRUT — Turkish artillery fired on Syrian targets Wednesday after shelling from Syria struck a border village in Turkey, killing five civilians, sharply escalating tensions between the two neighbors and prompting NATO to convene an emergency meeting.

"Our armed forces at the border region responded to this atrocious attack with artillery fire on points in Syria that were detected with radar, in line with the rules of engagement," the Turkish government said in a statement from the prime minister's office.

The artillery fire capped a day that began with three bombs tearing through a government-held district in Syria's commercial and cultural capital of Aleppo, killing more than 30 people and reducing dozen others according to Turkish buildings to rubble.

Along the volatile border, a shell



fired from inside Syria landed on a home in the Turkish village of Akcakale, killing five civilians, including some children, and wounding a media.

The shelling appeared to come

from forces loyal to Syrian President Bashar Assad's regime, which is fighting rebels backed by Turkey.

"Turkey, acting within the rules of engagement and international laws, will never leave unreciprocated such provocations by the Syrian regime against our national security," according to the terse statement from the office of Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton said the U.S. was "outraged that the Syrians have been shooting across the border," adding she would speak with Turkish Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoglu on the matter.

'It's a very, very dangerous situation," Clinton said. "And all responsible nations need to band together to persuade the Assad regime to have a cease-fire, quit assaulting their own people and begin the process of a political transition."

Boys detained for Quran defiling

CAIRO — Two Coptic Christian boys were put in juvenile detention after locals in Cairo accused them of urinating on pages of the Islamic holy book, an Islamic cleric and prosecutors said Wednesday, in the latest in a series of legal cases in Egypt against alleged contempt of religion.

Accusations of insulting Islam have increased in Egypt - particularly against Christians — since last month's fury over an anti-Islam film produced in the United States. The flurry to prosecute such cases in recent weeks has raised concerns over freedom of speech and over the power of ultraconservative Islamists in the country.

Commission seeks justice in coup

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras - A truth commission formed by human rights organizations called on Honduran President Porfirio Lobo's government on Wednesday to annul a 2010 amnesty law and fire Honduran officials responsible for the coup that overthrew his predecessor, Manuel Zelaya.

The report issued by the non-governmental commission also called on Lobo's administration to pay unspecified reparations to Zelaya supporters who were victims of the 2009 coup.

Tigers' Cabrera wins first Triple Crown in 45 years; enters elite club of 15

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Miguel Cabrera became the 15th player to win baseball's Triple Crown on Wednesday night, the reluctant superstar thrust into the spotlight after joining an elite list that includes Mickey Mantle, Ted Williams and Lou Gehrig.

Cabrera's milestone wasn't official until the Yankees pinch hit for Curtis Granderson in their game against the Boston Red Sox. Granderson had homered twice to reach 43 for the year, tied with the Rangers' Josh Hamilton and one shy of Cabrera.

Cabrera went 0 for 2 against the Royals before leaving in the fourth inning to a standing ovation. He finished the regular season with a .330 average, four points better the Angels' Mike Trout, his biggest competition for MVP. Cabrera was the runaway leader with 139 RBIs.

Boston's Carl Yastrzemski was the last player to achieve the Triple Crown in 1967.

"I am glad that he accomplished this while leading his

team to the American League Central title," Yastrzemski said in a statement. "I was fortunate enough to win this award in 1967 as part of the Red Sox's 'Impossible Dream Team.""

Commissioner Bud Selig also offered his congratulations, calling the Triple Crown "a remarkable achievement that places him amongst an elite few in all of baseball history."

The crowd at Kauffman Stadium gave him a standing ovation before he flied out in the first inning. He struck out in the fourth inning but remained in the game, allowing Leyland to remove him with two outs to another standing ovation from thousands of appreciate fans.

Cabrera high-fived his teammates as he entered the Detroit dugout, then walked back to the top step and waved his helmet. When the milestone became official, it was displayed on the center field scoreboard to another standing ovation.

"I would say without question he's enjoyed it. How could you not enjoy what he's done if

FLORHAM PARK, N.J. - Tim Tebow came to Broadway in March as a backup, already a bona fide star.

NFL fans nationwide caught sight of him on TV last season, leading the Denver Broncos to one improbable comeback after another and then into the playoffs. His force-of-nature style was the talk of the league, with fans "Tebowing" at games and parties, in their offices and living rooms. When actor Robert Downey dropped to a knee and bowed his head in prayerful pose at the Oscars, everyone was in on the joke.

Then Gotham and the Jets beckoned — along with the tantalizing prospect to build his brand further and someday take over from Mark Sanchez as quarterback of one of the league's highest-profile teams. 



- NEW YORK ack in the day, if Barbra Streisand made one vocal error or found one problem while recording a song, she'd toss the whole thing.

"If I didn't like that one word, I wouldn't release the record," the 70-year-old said in a recent interview. "Because in those days ... we did take one, take two, take three. We made albums in three days. Twelve songs. We didn't have this digital way."

Now, because of her perfectionism, she has a case full of unreleased material, and she's decided to share it with the world.

"Release Me," a collection of Streisand songs she recorded in the 1960s, '70s and '80s, is out Tuesday. It also includes the new song "If It's Meant to Be," written by her longtime friends and collaborators, Alan and Marilyn Bergman, recorded last year.

Besides the new album, Streisand is readying another duets album and a launching a U.S. tour on Thursday in Philadelphia. She talked with The Associated Press about it all, including politics.

AP: How's does it feel to finally release this music?

Streisand: It feels liberating. It's really interesting because I don't listen to my records after I make them. I am so sick of them because you have to listen to them over and over, in a car, with good speakers, bad speakers. I get so sick of it that I never hear anything. But I had this black case in my house for so long called "Unreleased songs." Listening to some of them again I thought, "God, I was hard on myself."

AP: How many songs are in that black case?

Streisand: I have another album or two. ... I really wasn't aware of how many things I had in there, between films and videotapes and TV shows. I actually never (have) been to my vaults, can you imagine? I just see them in pictures.

AP: What would Barbra now say to Barbra back then?

FTC to fine Warner unit \$1M

NEW YORK — The Federal Trade Commission is proposing to fine a unit of Warner Music Group Corp. \$1 million for violating a child privacy law in the operation of fan websites for artists including **Justin Bieber**, **Selena Gomez**, **Demi Lovato** and **Rihanna**.

Commissioner **Edith Ramirez** revealed the proposed settlement in a speech in New York on Wednesday at the annual meeting of the Children's Advertising Review Unit, a selfregulatory group for the advertising industry. A judge would need to confirm the settlement.

Ramirez said website operator Artist Arena collected personal details like names, email addresses, street addresses and cellphone numbers of more than 100,000 children aged 12 or younger on sites such as Bieber Fever.com.

or September, the three of us chose to reflect the coming of fall with our selection of breads.

As J.K. and I perused selections on the computer, banana-pumpkin bread jumped out at me. You would be surprised how many recipes we pass up before making our choices. Many "yucks" or "I-don't-think-sos." With this one I could smell the spicy, flavorful bread baking as I read the ingredients.

While the recipe was chosen, there were two difficulties to overcome. First was breaking it to my faithful pooch and kitchen buddy, Foxtrot, that once again our recipes had no meat or cheese. I tried to console him by telling him the aroma would make his mouth water and he could have an extra Milk-Bone; he went outside. The next chore was to find pumpkin puree before Thanksgiving. It seems that's the only time the groceries carry it. After the third store was a no-go, it was time to go to the Internet to find out what could be done. Turns out it is fine to use pure pumpkin as a substitute. No pumpkin pie filling, but pure pumpkin ... OK, piece of cake! It's Monday, baking night. The ingredients are gathered and it's time to make the bread for Tuesday's office sampling. The oven is preheated, a 9-by-5-inch pan is greased and waiting for batter. Since my bananas weren't quite as ripe as they should have been, the mashing took a little more work than usual, but got done. Next time the bananas will be bought a few days earlier, since you never know if or when the stores will have ripe bananas. The mashed bananas, eggs, oil, pumpkin, honey and sugar were placed in a large bowl and stirred together. There must be a trick to getting all the honey out of a measuring cup – I haven't found it yet. Another bowl was taken out of the cupboard to combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, pumpkin pie spice and cinnamon. Remember to mix these ingredients slowly or you'll create a dust storm. Gradually add the dry ingredients into the banana mixture until just combined. Don't over-mix, or the bread might be tough.



varieties. Syrah is the only grape of the north, while the south is always a blend of as many as 13 diverse grapes, with Grenache, and one you probably never heard of, Mouvedre (moo-ved-druh) leaning the parade.

Two more "AOCs" (designated growing areas) need a mention. The rural Loire Valley running east and west in south central France is big and varied, supporting almost every type of wine. The signature characteristics of Loire products are their zesty acidity, a strong backbone and a crisp bevy of flavors. The Loire is especially known for Vouvray, made from Chenin Blanc grapes, and for Sancerre; think fume blanc (sauvignon blanc). Ignore the reds.

Two more French regions of note are Alsace — way to the east, home to wonderful crisp dry Rieslings — and the humongous Languedoc way down south skirting the Mediterranean. It is the largest wine-producing re-

for more production than the entire United States. Grenache and Syrah are the major reds. Ignore the whites, unless you are lucky enough to travel there and drink white wine from the barrel along with some scrumptious fish stew.

Now let's move on to another nation responsible for some of the world's most recognizable labels.

Italy's two commanding wine regions are Piedmont to the northwest and Tuscany in the north central. The former is home to the three famous "B's" of wine: Barolo, Barbaresco and Barbera. Barbera is both a place and the grape, while Nebbiolo grapes are the stars of Barolo and Barbaresco, legendary and costly labels not for the faint of heart. The latter, Tuscany, is home to olive trees, the city of Florence and Chianti. Chianti is another one of those confusing wines named after a place where the single cultivar is the musical-sounding grape Sangiovese. When Sangiovese is combined with cabernet and merlot, a number of

gion of France, responsible new designations have been coined, but we'll reserve another column to review these.

And so, gentle reader, that's all you need to know to unlock two Old World countries for viticultural exploration. Drink the wines of France and Italy and experience the ancient delicacy the Old World.

Recently, I sampled several new-to-me labels, with good price-to-quality ratios (PQR). They are the robust and fruit forward Sledgehammer cabernet sauvignon (about \$13), Handcraft pinot noir (\$12), a smooth mouthful of light earthy flavors, and finally Black Stallion cabernet sauvignon (\$25), a bit pricey, but its multi-layered black stone fruits make it worth the money for those special occasions. All are California wines.



Measure out 1/3 cup boiling water and pour into the bowl with the chocolate mixture, mixing quickly to make a smooth chocolate sauce. Add pumpkin, sugar and vanilla and mix well.

Dump about half of the flour mixture into the chocolate mixture and gently stir just to incorporate, then measure out 1 tablespoon of boiling water and stir again. Now add the rest of the flour mixture and another tablespoon of boiling water and stir just until smooth. Take care not to over-mix. Fold in the chocolate chips.

Spoon the batter into the prepared loaf pan. It will be good and thick. You can smooth the top out with a bowl scraper.
