900 elementary school kids receive free uniforms through national organization

Nearly 900 students from Central Avenue, Highlands and Kissimmee Elementary schools will have new school uniforms that their families might not have been able to afford thanks to the initiative of a national organization.

As part of the Assistance League's annual national conference, this year held in Orlando, the organization helped identify needy students at the three schools and partnered with National Stores, providing them with two full school uniforms including socks and underwear.

The giveaway, part of AL's national Operation School Bell initiative, happened Wednesday at the Fallas location at the Plaza Del Sol in Kissimmee, where 50 students from the three schools got to pick out their new clothes. The other 250 students at each school will receive vouchers and will be able to pick up their clothes at their convenience.

The Assistance League is a national charitable network of volunteers that works to inspire and support those in need through 120 local chapters. They worked with the schools and the school district and the Education Foundation - Osceola County to make Wednesday's giveaway happen.

"Kathy (Carr, Education Foundation's Executive Director) is the right person for this," said School District of Osceola

Kissimmee's parks will soon be in the national spotlight, as the city is one of six across the U.S. featured in the KaBOOM! Play Together Tour, powered by Disney Parks.

On the list with cities like Chicago and Atlanta,

Kissimmee's Mill Run Park will be the last stop for the tour on Sept. 13 and 14. Starting at Disneyland at Anaheim, Calif., KaBOOM! and Disney will tour the best parks in some of KaBOOM's Playful Cities. The tour is designed to promote family play with an obstacle course available to families for free.

The families will make a family flag and go through different activities in the obstacle course together, getting tips on how to make play part of their daily routine along the way.

According to its website, KaBOOM! is a national non-profit dedicated to saving play for America's

children. Its mission is to create play spaces through the participation and leadership of communities.

Nonprofit moving big cats to Osceola

Forty-three big cats will soon be making their way from Brevard County to a new home at a south Osceola facility.

Central Florida Animal Reserve, currently operating in Brevard County, is in the process of moving 32 tigers, four lions, four cougars and three leopards to a new facility on 500 Broussard Road, just off of U.S. Highway 441.

The facility, currently under construction, will take up a little over half of the 11 acres the animal reserve purchased in Osceola County. Once completed, it will have enough enclosures to house all 43 exotic cats, with features such as concrete in-ground pools for tigers, mist-spray features and ample shade for cats not suited for the Florida heat. It also has an on-site animal hospital and an indoor food-preparation area complete with large freezers and coolers.

"With the number of cats in this country being likely greater than the number that's in the wild, it's very important that we try to maintain them in a manner that is going to be both dignified as well as responsible," said Simba Wiltz, volunteer CEO/senior vice president of the Central Florida Animal Reserve.

Beginning as a nonprofit to care for neglected exotic cats in 1996, the

organization became Central Florida Animal Reserve in 2007 and took over a failed exotic cat facility in Brevard County that held 60 lions, tigers, cougars and leopards. With the zoning around its facility changing from agricultural to rural residential, Brevard County had given it until March 2015 to move to another location.

Wiltz said that while construction is underway, the reserve has 35 percent of the \$700,000 needed to construct the new facility. Wiltz and others in the organization are working to raise the remaining \$400,000 to \$500,000 needed to complete the construction. Along with Osceola County, the United States Department of Agriculture and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission are helping its move by conducting regulation inspections as the facility is constructed, but the construction needs to be complete before the cats can move in.

The facility also will serve as a place to provide information to similar organizations on the ways to properly care for exotic cats and become a source of information about exotic cats.

Theft charges linked to Sheriff's Office sting dismissed

Seven people arrested in an Osceola County Sheriff's Office sting operation will not face third-degree felony theft charges after a judge granted a motion from their attorney to dismiss the charges.

Ninth Circuit Judge Jon

B. Morgan ruled the Sheriff's Office operation on April 1 amounted to entrapment when deputies left \$350 in cash and other items planted in a purse hanging from a bicycle at a bus stop along West U.S. Highway 192, and then arrested 10 people who took the money.

Of the 10 arrested, one was a minor, a second had the case dismissed shortly after the operation and another took a plea deal in order to get out of jail to deal with a legal issue in another state, said Kissimmee attorney Don Waggoner. He took on the defendants' case for free after he heard about

the particulars of the case weeks after the arrests.

"The judge determined that the money was a bait and a trap by law enforcement. The evidence showed the money was in plain view. The police thought differently,"

Act like a kid again in new toy store

The man who until Aug. 26 was the mayor of the Florida Panhandle town of Perry has set up shop less than three blocks from Kissimmee City Hall.

But this is no political campaign or stunt.

Daryll Gunter now works between racks of stuffed animals at What's In The Bag, a new toy and gift store that recently opened at 111 Broadway in downtown Kissimmee.

Gunter, whose résumé includes being a Realtor, teacher and mayor, also was a retailer back home. He and his wife, Dawn, owned a shop that specialized in china and crystal, but that market bottomed out in 2009. The next year, as they liquidated their inventory online, they bought some toys from a mass marketer looking to do the same, and suddenly they saw the value in selling toys.

"And that just blew up," Daryll Gunter said. "Online has always been our driving force, but this was wild. Grandmas don't care about recessions. It doesn't hurt that I never stopped loving toys."

The family came to Osceola County when Dawn, who was the business manager for the Taylor County Health

Department, accepted the position at Osceola County's health department.

Daryll, 43, who spent 10 years as mayor and a Taylor County commissioner, saw the move to Kissimmee as a way to leave politics behind in his hometown, where five generations of his family have grown up.

"I'm through with politics, except for supporting a couple of my friends who are still in it," he said.

Since moving from the Panhandle, downtown Kissimmee has become Gunter's personal epicenter. The family is renting at City Centre for the time being, and 4-year-old son Chip is enrolled at First United Methodist School, all blocks from What's In The Bag.

"Downtown Kissimmee has spoiled us a little. I'm looking forward to being here full time," he said.

The store is in a great location business-wise, he said.

"There are no local toy stores in the area, and there is no toy presence downtown, so there is a market. A couple of our product line manufacturers require a storefront, and downtowns have such a different feel than a mall," Daryll said.

"Here you have a lot of foot traffic, and the Main Street and

other downtown people have been great. We've been hitting our early sales goals and the storefront hasn't even fully opened yet. I'm still unpacking five or seven pallets of stuff a week."

The store is open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the week and until 3 p.m. Saturdays — "or whenever else we're there, if we're there, we're open," Gunter said.

It features some major lines of toys as well as some lesser-known companies, particularly trains from Big Jigs and Brio, known more in other parts of the country. Gunter said more will be

coming in October, such as children's clothing and a teddy bear-stuffing station courtesy of Teddy Mountain, a national chain that has its corporate headquarters on John Young Parkway in Kissimmee.

"The vast portion of our stuff, you won't find at a Toys 'R Us," Gunter said.

Once fully stocked, the store also will include pursuits for adults, who at heart are just bigger kids, he said. Those lines will include Tyler Candle, Analeece Jewelry, Lenox China, Naked Bee lotions and a couple of greeting card suppliers.

Police forces nationwide need a reality check

One of the unsung blessings of Twitter is the way it continually reminds us that willful ignorance is alive and thriving in the American body politic.

In the past week, we were treated to widely retweeted photos purporting to show Capt. Ron Johnson of the Missouri Highway Patrol throwing a gang sign. The first controversial image showed up on an unvetted CNN social media webpage called iReport, and Internet trolls took it from there.

The only problem is that the hand sign in question was the greeting of Kappa Alpha Psi, a historically black fraternity of which Johnson is a member. He was posing with a frat brother.

Anybody could be forgiven for not knowing what the gesture meant. But the automatic imputation of criminal intent is a problem - actually, it's the problem at the heart of the unrest that has gripped Ferguson, Missouri for nearly two weeks.

The very reason that a black Missouri highway cop's image is on every TV in the land is that he's been sent to Ferguson to restore order. After

demonstrations and looting erupted there in response to the shooting death of 18-year-old African-American Michael Brown by a white police officer, the city's police department made matters considerably worse with its over-the-top militarized response. Authorities needed to hit the reset button fast, and Johnson was part of that effort.

After relieving Ferguson police, the governor put Johnson in charge. It's no coincidence a black man was put in command. Johnson's cadence and tone when speaking, his use of biblical references, convey to the black residents of Ferguson that he is one of them. His job is to restore order, but his standpoint for discharging that duty is understanding, empathy - the very qualities that apparently were heretofore lacking in the Ferguson Police Department.

We'll see how it works out. Meanwhile, law enforcement bodies nationwide ought to be thinking about how to clone him.

Three police officers out of Ferguson's force of 53 are black in a town where two-thirds of the residents are African-American. The much-repeated statistic is all too common. America's police forces do not look like the communities that

they serve. They never have, not in the riots of the 1960s and not now.

The Washington Post analyzed Census records and found that more than three-quarters of cities on which data is available have a police force that's disproportionately white.

For decades, the courts have been striking down affirmative action hiring measures, but the NAACP and the Justice Department have been just as effective at rooting out tests used to exclude minority applicants to police academies.

Many, perhaps most, racially skewed police departments acknowledge the problem. Indeed, the failure to attract diverse recruits goes far beyond discrimination against minority applicants. To be an African-American or Latino member of law enforcement opens one up to accusations of being "more blue than black" or "brown" - a traitor to the community, as it were. That attitude has to change.

Another handicap for minority applicants is educational attainment. The deplorable high school graduation rates of Latinos and African Americans hamper recruitment. So do criminal records. The Washington Post recently pointed out that while about

8 percent of Americans have felony convictions, for black men the national average is above 33 percent (thanks to the disproportionate impact of the war on drugs on minority communities). In some departments, simply having a family member who has been involved in the drug dealing can exclude a candidate.

Police and communities of color urgently need to have an honest dialogue. Community members need to acknowledge that policing comes with inherent dangers that the average person doesn't always recognize. Everyone knows now that Michael Brown wasn't armed, but did the officer who shot him know it at the time? We don't know that answer yet.

By the same token, police forces need to acknowledge their own behavior and attitudes that have cultivated community perceptions of hostility, whether they believe those views are accurate or not.

It has to be a two-way conversation, and a frank, genuine one at that. The alternative is playing out on the streets of Ferguson.

County Superintendent Melba Luciano, who came out to Fallas to support the clothing giveaway while students from Central Avenue Elementary peeked into their bags and compared the contents with each other.

Carr said AL reached out to her ahead of its conference when it sought out a group to help in the Seminole-Orange-Osceola County area.

"They don't have a chapter in Florida, so they wanted to do something in conjunction with their conference," she said. "They found that we were in great need, and Osceola really has the greatest need for this in the area."

Through Operation School Bell, AL said it provides more than \$19 million in new school

clothing to more than 300,000 disadvantaged children annually across the country. Wednesday's event in Kissimmee amounted to about \$30,000 in uniforms. The organization is funded partially by a chain of nationwide Assistance League thrift stores.

AL's director of chapter formation Cindy Burgess was out in front leading the local effort, and said it "went beautifully."

"The store was great to work with," she said. "We have no chapters in Florida, but going forward we're going to attempt to do that. Our thought was that if we're going to Orlando, let's leave a legacy."

National President Nancy Reberger said having one of their clothing drives in Central

Florida allowed her and other board members to get out on the front lines themselves.

"If we were to do this in a place where we have a chapter, they'd be out giving out clothing," she said. "For us, this is just great."

Trenisha Simmons, principal at Central Avenue Elementary, said she had been in contact with AL and Carr at the Education Foundation over the summer, and couldn't wait for the children to receive the clothes as a sort of back-to-school gift.

"This is going to be especially great for some of our parents," she said.

you know, that we were the chosen destination. We were able to do more with less. That's the one thing with getting grant money and partnering with agencies to build these public/private partnerships with these playgrounds. It has helped us do a lot more with less," said Steve Lackey, assistant director of Kissimmee Parks, Recreation and Public Facilities.

The department first partnered with KaBOOM! in 2009, after funding was cut for parks due to the sagging economy. Lackey and others on staff immediately started looking for other ways to fund future park projects, and quickly found KaBOOM. Since then, the department has been able to do several park renovations, either through grants through KaBOOM or funding from public/private partnerships in the community. It has been named a Playful City U.S.A. for four years in a

row by KaBOOM. Because of its Playful City recognition, KaBOOM toured Kissimmee as a possible stop for the tour, and it selected the city because of Mill Run Park. The park went through a major rebuild, partly through a \$25,000 grant from KaBOOM. It became the first boundless playground in the city. Both KaBOOM! and Disney representatives were impressed by the results, with some in the group claiming that it was the best example of a neighborhood they have seen throughout their whole tour, said Lackey. "When other communities around us were tearing places out because they can't afford to maintain them, we were building more and finding ways, not only to maintain them, but to continue to grow. And, it's because of those kinds of partnerships, finding these competitive grants, partnering with other agencies like KUA,

Florida Hospital and some of the funding partners, we're able to do stuff," said Lackey.

Incorporating the community with the projects created a sense of pride toward Kissimmee parks, as many were renovated or rebuilt through volunteers. Lackey said that parks that were just renovated have been consistently taken care of, with less littler and more calls from concerned residents about any problems with equipment.

Waggoner said. According to court documents, none of the defendants took the bicycles or any other items other than the money. Video evidence showed that the money was visible and hanging out of the purse and could have been seen without going into the purse itself.

"Nothing in the circumstances suggest to the court that these defendants were looking for an opportunity to steal and would have committed a theft absent law enforcement leaving a large amount of cash protruding from the unattended purse," Morgan wrote in his findings. "The court finds the Defendants to have been subjectively

entrapped as a matter of law."

Charges were dropped against Crystal Astbury, James Custode, Michael Anthony Davis, Matthew Douglas Perry, Andre Plasencia, Denise Kennealy and Sergio Diaz-Olivo.

Two of them, Diaz-Olivo and Kennealy, had no prior arrest record, and none of the seven had ever been arrested for theft.

The Sheriff's Office released a statement after the ruling, noting that while it doesn't agree with Judge Morgan's ruling, it will take his findings into consideration when planning for future operations.

"The Osceola County

Sheriff's Office will continue to work to make our community a safer place, not by targeting a particular group or groups other than those who violate the law," spokesperson Twis Lizasuain wrote in the statement.

Waggoner said he doesn't make a habit out of taking on pro bono cases, but he knew the defendants in this case couldn't afford to hire their own attorneys and he chose to represent them as a group.

"It was the right thing to do, and it wasn't that difficult getting the motions together," he said. "Otherwise they might not normally go through the process of fighting this and just take a plea deal."

Stan Boroski is OVC Hall of Fame inductee

Stan Boroski is pretty busy this time of year.

He is the Tampa Bay Rays bullpen coach.

But, the Rays didn't mind when Boroski returned to his native Ohio recently so that he could be inducted into the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference Hall of Fame.

Boroski was one of 17 former athletes inducted into the Hall of Fame's Class of 2014.

"It was great. My mom and dad and three of my

sisters were there, and a lot of my former coaches and teammates. A few of them, from Little League, I haven't seen probably in 40 years, before I even knew what the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference was," he said from the Rays offices in St. Petersburg.

Boroski, who makes his home in St. Cloud with his wife, Carol, and two children, starred in baseball, football and basketball at Buckeye South High School, which has since been merged with

two other high schools into Buckeye Local High in Rayland, Ohio.

"I am so proud of Stan and all of his accomplishments then, and throughout the years since then," Carol Boroski said.

Rayland is located in southeastern Ohio, about a 40-minute drive west of Pittsburgh and just minutes north of the West Virginia border.

The OVAC now encompasses 50 high schools in Ohio and West Virginia along with Ohio River Valley.

There were 44 schools in the conference with Boroski competed.

"It's a beautiful place with all the hills and the river valley, very peaceful," Boroski, 51, said. "But, it's tough to find a job. When I was playing there it was all steel mills and coal mines, and you know what happened to those."

Boroski led Buckeye South to the Ohio State Athletic Association football playoffs for the first time during his senior season in 1980, but he unfortunately missed the game after suffering an injury against rival Buckeye North. He finished the season with 1,200 yards rushing and 15 touchdowns at tailback, and he also booted four field goals.

"I loved football. It was my favorite sport," Boroski, who graduated from Buckeye South in 1981, said. "I played outside linebacker, too, so I took turns hitting and getting hit."

Boroski returned from his football injury five games into the basketball season and used his 6-2 frame to propel the Rebels to 16 straight wins while averaging 16 points per game at forward.

Baseball ultimately proved to be his most successful sport. He batted .400 during his junior and senior years and he threw a no-hitter during his senior season. Buckeye South won a pair of conference championships and reached the district playoffs twice with Boroski.

He batted .327 and posted a 6-2 record on the mound during his final year of American Legion baseball.

Boroski said that being a multi-sport athlete benefitted him, and he recommends that for young athletes today.

"Everyone is so specialized today. It starts so young. I'm not even sure that you can be a three-sport athlete anymore at a big school like Osceola. It would be very difficult," he said.

"We only had 300 at Buckeye South, we were tiny, so everyone played different sports."

Boroski's daughter, Sarah, was a two-time state weightlifting meet qualifier at St. Cloud High and his son, Clayton, played baseball for the St. Cloud Majors All-Stars this summer and he also plays football and basketball in St. Cloud.

"I really think it helps the young kids to play different sports," he said.

Boroski worked out at

West Liberty College in West Virginia with the permission of Coach Bob McConnaughey to prepare for his professional baseball career.

"He let me work out there and sharpen my game and my conditioning, and then he helped to arrange a tryout for me with Milwaukee," Boroski said.

The Brewers drafted Boroski in the 20th round of the 1981 draft and he played two years as a catcher in the Brewers system before he finished his pro playing career as a pitcher in the Kansas City organization.

He compiled an 11-12 record and 4.04 ERA over three seasons, from 1985-87, in the Gulf Coast Rookie League and the Florida State League. His career was curtailed by a pair of rotator cuff surgeries.

Boroski, who earned a biology degree from Ohio University, switched to scouting and coaching.

He was a pitching coach in the Houston Astros minor league system for 18 years before joining his good friend, Rays pitching coach Jim Hickey, five years ago.

Boroski said he would long remember his Hall of Fame induction ceremony.

"There are so many good memories. It was a lot of fun, and I really enjoyed it," he said.

"The Rays are very understanding about letting us take time off for personal things like that. They know that things come up from time to time, and they are very supportive."

A very personal documentary about 9/11

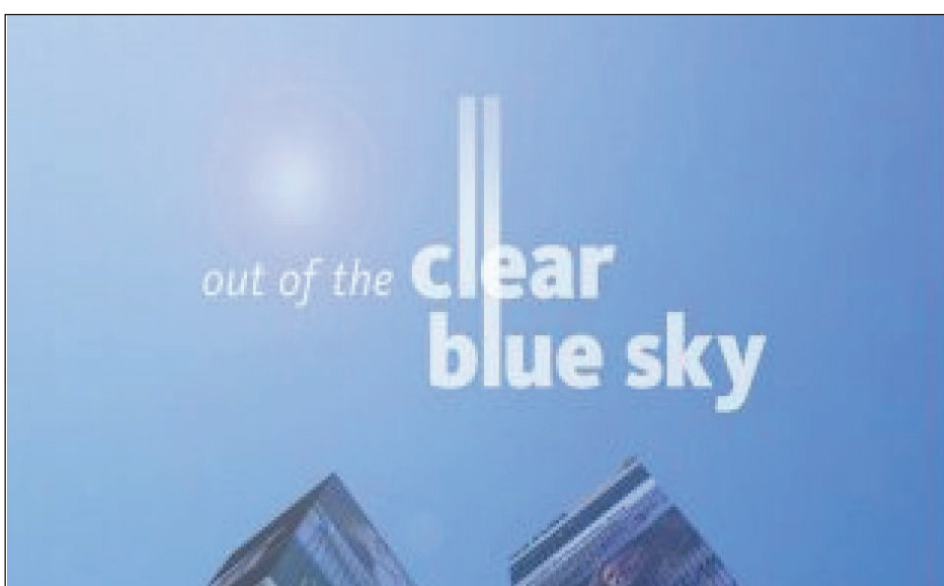
Thursday marks the 13th anniversary of 9/11 and there usually is no shortage of stories on TV recounting the events that have been etched in minds for more than a decade.

But if you are looking for a fresh approach to the day of devastation and the weeks, months and years that followed, you need not look any further than **Out of the Clear Blue Sky** (Virgil Films).

One of the biggest of the many tragic stories on that day, was the loss encountered by Wall Street firm Cantor Fitzgerald.

The investment firm, which occupied the top five floors of One World Trade Center and lost 658 of its employees.

This is their story, and more pointedly the story of one survivor, corporate CEO Howard Lutnick. Lutnick, by had one of the more ruthless reputations in his business, but the

events of that day, and the months that followed, changed him forever.

Nashville is more than just a little bit country

Music City USA more than lives up to its name with iconic attractions

If you haven't been to Nashville in more than a decade, you haven't been to Nashville.

The city got an NFL team in recent years, and even a TV series named after it.

But Nashville is so much more than Moon Pies and Goo Goo Clusters. It is foremost, all about its music heritage, and has taken great strides to preserve its more than 200-year-old Music City identity.

And nothing says Music City like the Grand Ole Opry and the Country Music Hall of Fame, two Nashville icons that have been transformed to make the city stake a claim at being the most important musical destination in the world.

Even if you are not a fan of country music, you can't help but be dazzled by the venue, and just try to keep your feet from tapping at an evening at the Opry.

The Opry, also known as "the show that made country music famous," has been a weekly staple in Nashville since 1925.

And even though it left historic Ryman Auditorium (where tours and shows still occur) back in the early 1970s, the Opry still feels like the home of music legends like Patsy Cline and Hank Williams, as well as living legends like Loretta Lynn, Dolly Parton and Garth Brooks.

The large stage seems less crowded than it did at the Ryman when Minnie Pearl and Ernest Tubb were regular fixtures of the weekly radio broadcast of WSM, which continues to broadcast the shows. But the format remains pretty much the same: It is a full evening of music, but not all of it is necessarily country. Yes, even a teenage Elvis Presley made an appearance at the Opry

back in 1954. If you have a particular country music favorite, and are planning a trip to Nashville, check out opry.com to see the latest music schedules.

The recent Saturday night Opry featured legends such as Connie Smith, Jean Shepard and Riders in the Sky, as well as more recent notables like Vince Gill and Exile. And the Opry is known for its surprise guest stars. Little Jimmy Dickens, though not on music bill also stopped by. At age 93, the country comedy singer ("May the Bird of Paradise fly up your Nose") is the oldest living member of the Grand Ole Opry.

The Grand Ole Opry is a fast-paced show. The Friday and Saturday shows are broken into four segments, each hosted by a different country star who sings a few songs and introduces the other acts in the segment as well.

Still present for that radio audience are the show's regular announcers Mike Terry and Eddie Stubbs, doing live on-air commercials for everything from Dollar General Stores to Cracker Barrel restaurants.

The announcers also continue that down-home tradition of announcing all the birthdays and anniversaries in the audience, if you are looking for your own 5 seconds of Grand Ole Opry fame.

The Grand Ole Opry has shows Friday and Saturday nights and Tuesday nights, March-December and Wednesday nights June-August. You can make your trip to the Opry even more historic if you attend a show in November-January at its winter home, the Ryman Auditorium. The Ryman, a U.S. Historic Landmark (originally the Union Gospel Tabernacle, built in 1892) was home to the Opry for more than 30 years. A circular piece of the Ryman stage is incorporated into the performing area of the "new" Opry, which seats more than 4,000, about 1,000 more seats than the Ryman Auditorium.

In addition to the live show, you can go backstage at the Opry with daytime tour tickets and post-show tours. Also available: Behind the Curtain VIP tours, where fans can go behind the scenes just before show time and learn the inner workings of the show and be on stage as the red curtain goes up.

If you can't make it to the Opry anytime soon, you can tune in as well with the Opry mobile application, or listen in on Sirius XM Satellite Radio and at Opry.com and wsmoline.com (the online site for radio station 650 AM WSM in Nashville).

The Grand Ole Opry has a gift store to take home a part of that Opry visit. You can visit the shop online as well at Opry.com.

After a night at the Opry, you will want to save the next day for a visit to the Country Music Hall of Fame to see where country music really began.

Like the Opry, the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum is not at its original location. That building, at historic Music Row in Nashville, opened in 1967 (it has since been torn down and BMI occupies that location).

The new Country Music Hall of Fame, which opened in 2001, and recently expanded, is a noteworthy architectural tribute to music itself.

You might not quite see it at first glance, but the exterior of the hall of fame is harmonious with the music industry — from its piano key windows and diamond-shaped radio mast to the round discs surrounding that tower symbolizing the different size records and CDs used in recording. The musical identify goes a step further, or make that a few thousand steps by air: From above, the building is in the shape of a bass clef.

Step inside and the architectural wonders continue before you actually get to the galleries and exhibits. The recent \$100 million expansion, doubled the size of the hall and museum to 350,000 feet.

Like most museums, the hall of a fame is a combination of permanent and limited engagement exhibitions, plus there is that impressive Hall of Fame Rotunda, featuring all of the members of the hall going back to its very first inductees, which includes Hank Williams.

You can probably spend hours just searching for your favorites and they are probably all here, including Patsy Cline, Roger Miller, Loretta Lynn, Buck Owens and many more, but the museum is only open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and there is a lot more to explore.

The newest exhibit at the hall is all about music icon, Kenny Rogers. Like all the major exhibits, it is a thorough look, from the earliest days of his career (including the trippy band First Edition) right on through his acting career.

The many artifacts on display include:

- Costume pieces worn and used by Rogers in the five-part Gambler TV movie series, including a fedora and gun belt, a Western-cut jacket, shirt and brocade vest, and a cane with a brass knob.

- A Tony Alamo of Nashville denim outfit, embellished with rhinestones and studs, worn by Rogers as the frontman for Kenny Rogers and The First Edition in the 1970s.

- Dolly Parton's rhinestone-embellished velvet jacket and dress, which she wore during a performance of "Islands in the Stream" with Rogers on her TV show, Dolly.

- Dottie West's Bob Mackie outfit with bugle beading and Dolcis pumps, worn in performance with Rogers.

- A 1970 program from a week of shows featuring both Kenny Rogers and the First Edition and Merle Haggard and the Strangers at the Starlight Theatre in Kansas City, Missouri.

- Sheet music for the Mickey Newbury-penned

"Just Dropped In (To See What Condition My Condition Was In)," which became the First Edition's first top 10 hit, and "Ruby (Don't Take Your Love to Town)," a crossover hit for Kenny Rogers and the First Edition written by Mel Tillis.

- A handmade tambourine with Kenny Rogers's logo burned into the wood, similar to the ones he throws into the crowd at his concerts

- Assorted cameras used by Rogers, including two Polaroid models; a Calument Scientific Inc. folding camera; and a Linhof Master Technika Classic camera, used by Rogers to capture the fifty-eight studio portraits of country artists in his third book of photos, Kenny Rogers: This Is My Country

- A paperback novel, part of a series of books inspired by Rogers's iconic portrayal of the "Gambler" in the popular TV movies

- Numerous awards, including the CMA Willie Nelson Lifetime Achievement Award; Grammy statuettes; the Academy of Country Music's Clifflie Stone Pioneer Award; and the Honorary Master of Photography award presented to Rogers by the Professional Photographers of America (PPA) at its annual conference; and more.

Other limited engagements include Miranda Lambert Backstage Access, the just-opened Alan Jackson exhibit and maybe the best of the bunch, The Bakersfield Sound, featuring Buck Owens, Merle Haggard and California Country.

For those who are recent admirers of the country scene, The Bakersfield Sound will certainly be enlightening. Bakersfield, Ca., seems like a remote location for country music, but in the 1960s, the area gave birth to an exciting sound, quite distinctive from the Southern sounds of Tennessee and Kentucky, though many of the musicians were transplants from Oklahoma and Texas.

In addition to the limited-engagement exhibitions, there are several permanent exhibitions at the museum including Sing Me Back Home: Folk Roots to the Present (which features some great memorabilia including outfits worn by Patsy Cline and Elvis Presley's gold Cadillac.

It will take at least two hours to go through the museum, and that will be just a pretty quick run-through. You can easily spend all day if you linger and take in all there is to see.

But if you are short on time, don't make it an all-day experience because then you will miss two really nice "add on" items that are also part of the museum.

The Historic RCA Studio B Tour, Nashville's only studio tour, just might prove to be more memorable than the Hall of Fame for country music fans, because you get to spend time in the same studio that Elvis and many other music legends recorded some of their biggest hits.

Located just a short distance from museum, Studio B, which is still used today, is known as the "Home of 1,000 Hits." The guided tour includes actual musical moments from Elvis, the Everly Brothers and other artists who called the studio home dating back to the 1950s.

More than 35,000 songs have been recorded at Studio B, including Elvis hits "It's Now or Never," "Are You Lonesome Tonight" and "Little Sister." The vibrant posters include not only advertisements for shows for everyone one from Elvis and Chuck Berry, but vaudeville, minstrel shows, opera singers and even Negro League baseball games. You even get to print your own Hatch Show Print poster as part of the tour.

The print show features a store where you can buy posters and other items and the Country Music Hall of Fame also has an extensive gift shop.

ugly and Lutnick was attacked by everyone from Bill O'Reilly to even the New York Times.

There are several interviews in **Out of the Clear Blue Sky**, by both company survivors (all of whom, fortunately were not at work that morning) and relatives of those who perished.

But mostly the documentary deals with Lutnick's own survival and how he personally dealt with the tragedy in the weeks and months that followed, including all those funerals, memorials and making sure the survivor's families were not forgotten.

An interesting side note, filmmaker Danielle Gardner also had a personal stake in this compelling story, which is revealed by film's end.

You may need a few

laughs after **Out of the Clear Blue Sky**, and **Ja'mie Private School Girl** (HBO) delivers a lot more than a few.

HBO has aired several of Australian comic Chris Lilley's series (**Summer Heights High**, **Angry Boys**) and Ja'mie (Lilley) is the continuing story of the queen bee from Summer Heights High, Ja'mie, the snobby, snotty self-promoting student, who will stop out nothing to win the Hillford Medal.

Ja'mie is so easy to hate, it is easy to forget how masterfully played she is by Lilley, who has made a living out of playing an assortment of characters so easily.
