

Officers find sophisticated grow house underground

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – The watchful eye of a Florida Highway Patrol officer in South Florida is credited with tipping Clay County authorities about an elaborate \$864,000 pot-growing operation in the

Middleburg-Clay Hill area.

In a June 17 news conference, Clay County Sheriff Rick Beseler said the June 12 and 13 arrests mark the most unique marijuana-growing operation uncovered in the county in the last five years. A South Florida traffic stop – not a call from nearby neighbors – led authorities to obtain search warrants for the home at 2100 Candlewood Ct. in Middleburg.

In total, Beseler said four homes – all of which had previously been in foreclosure and were miles apart – were bought for the sole purpose of growing marijuana. Beseler said the FHP officer contacted the federal Drug Enforcement Agency, which in turn, contacted the CCSI. Other houses involved in the operation were located at

Green Cove gets loan for police headquarters

Seven derelict structures to be demolished

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A go-ahead order for construction of the city's \$5 million new police headquarters will be issued no later than July 17 as the result of city council action June 18.

The delay will give the contractor, Batson-Cook Co. of Jacksonville, time to draw revised plans for the police station and to get a Clay County building permit for the project. The plan's revisions will slice \$1.7 million from the cost, previously calculated at \$6.7 million.

Meanwhile, Batson-Cook will be given permission to demolish seven derelict structures on the three-acre site at Idlewild and Melrose avenues.

In related business at the 4-and-a-half-hour meeting June 18, comprising mostly anxious talk about the police project, the council also approved borrowing \$2.4 million from SunTrust Bank to partially pay for the structure. The

Camp merges nature and science

MIDDLEBURG – As Debra Cater squirted dish soap, vegetable oil and food coloring into a set of nearby buckets, impassioned cries rang out from a group of fourth, fifth and sixth graders.

About 30 children from around the state participated in the Clay County School District's Science Discovery Camp from June 10 through 14. In a role-playing exercise, Carter and other helpers represented a new family who moved into a house and tainted the neighborhood's water source. The group sat in the shade of the large pine trees on the campus of the North Fork Leadership Center where they sorted out the alleged crime.

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Steamed about Lawn Fungus?

We've seen plenty of heat and rain this summer - perfect conditions for fungal problems to develop in lawns. Steamy weather keeps everything wet for extended periods.

The ground becomes saturated with rain, then humid air slows or prevents leaf blades from drying. The combination of warm temperatures and lots of moisture brings on a host of disease issues in Florida lawns. For folks with St. Augustine lawns, one fungal problem you may be noticing is Grey Leaf Spot disease. Pythium Root Rot and Take-all Root Rot are other issues that can emerge in muggy heat and rain that affect most types of turf grass. Knowing the symptoms and management treatment options for each of these problems can help keep you from getting steamed about lawn fungus.


too short can result in damage that may look like a disease. Some insects such as chinch bugs can be eliminated as the problem by checking the lawn. Scouting or flushing - flooding a contained area sunk into the ground, such as a can with both ends removed - can alert you to the presence of lawn-damaging insects. Nutritional disorders can also discolor turf but do your homework before fertilizing in reaction to a problem spot. Be certain by doing a soil test, since fertilizers can make some fungal issues worse.

Grey Leaf Spot shows up in St. Augustine and centipede grass as oblong brown spots with dark brown edges. As the problem gets worse, the spots grow together and can turn the entire blade brown. A severe outbreak will show up as thin turf areas that lack vigor. Excessive nitrogen makes this problem worse, so fertilize at the right time and use a slow-release product. Also avoid using the herbicide Atrazine when temperatures are above 85-degrees Fahrenheit in the daytime, as this combination can stress turf grass and make it more susceptible.

Pythium Root Rot is rarely fatal and shows up as a general decline and thinning of turf. Instead of having distinct patches, areas can be small or large, and appear yellow, light green or brown in color. Roots will be thin as well, and may be slightly discolored. Correct mowing height and

frequency (i.e., remove no more than 1/3 of the blade length at a time) are important to checking this problem. Mowing at a slightly higher height until the problem is under control can help. Soil compaction and poor drainage make this problem worse, so avoid driving or heavy mowers on affected turf, and consider core aeration to reduce compaction. Since it affects the roots, a foliar fertilizer can be helpful if the lawn is seriously impacted.

Take-all Root Rot also affects roots, and is aggravated in turf that is stressed for any reason. This condition is marked by decayed, blacked roots that may have a slimy appearance and bad odor. Leave blades will pull out easily from the sheath of affected roots. The fungus won't infect leaf blades, but it will cause them to yellow and die as nutrient uptake is halted. This results in small to large patches of yellow or light green turf that thins out. In serious

outbreaks, patches of turf can die. Once damage to leaves is noticeable, treatment can be very difficult so your best bet is to use best care practices to prevent stress before the problem becomes apparent: observe proper mowing frequency, mow height, proper use of fertilizers, and avoid overwatering. Avoid liming lawns infected with Take-All, and with St. Augustine use the least amount of herbicide possible. As with Pythium Root Rot, when the disease is bad a foliar fertilizer can help since roots aren't able to feed the leaf blades.

When tackling fungal problems, know that the fungus is probably present in the environment even if you can't see it. Only when conditions of temperature and moisture are favorable will symptoms be noticeable. While you can't control rain, humidity, or temperature you can control

loan the money, which will cost the city \$422,000 per year.

The remaining price for the police station will be covered by land purchase and architecture fees already paid by the city and by funds previously set aside for the project. The police station has been 10 years in the planning.

The city council also wrestled with correcting a three-year-old mistake made in an effort to keep rainwater from pooling on Oakridge Avenue south of Idlewild Avenue.

Resident Charlene Roberts complained that a culvert installed on the west side of the street has diverted water onto her property. Council members voted to spend \$248,000 to remove the culvert and to install storm drains along the street.

The council also listened to arguments for and against a proposed asphalt plant endorsed the Clay County Economic Development Authority.

The county Planning and Zoning Commission has approved re-zoning for the plant, proposed for Gustafson Cattle Co. property south of the city, adjacent to CSX Corp. railroad tracks. It is scheduled for review by the Board of County Commissioners on June 25.

Economic Development Council Director Bill Garrison appeared at the city council meeting to urge its members to throw their weight behind the project.

Garrison cited added jobs and the possibility of natural gas pipelines that would follow the asphalt plant's development.

The plant would lie outside the city, so the council has no say in the matter. While four council members voiced approval, Mayor Mitch Timberlake said, "The smell of asphalt is not something that will attract people to Green Cove Springs."

In the end, the city council took no action on the matter.

The next council meeting will be at 7 p.m. July 16 in city hall.

Re-thinking 'Good' & 'Bad'

Since Daddy passed away in July 2008, I tend to view Father's Day a little differently than I used to. I tend to think back now and wonder if I did the right things, said the things and served as a role model to my son in the best way possible.

And now that our son is a college sophomore, I look at the world he faces and sometimes worry that he may get caught up in the throes of things I'd always told him to stay away from.

I have to remain convinced that he knows the difference between right and wrong at this point in his life. But, it could happen at any moment. I've been told I am a good father, but one never knows.

With all that said, being a father colors much of what I do in life, including the way I carry out my work here at Clay Today. For example, I look at the police reports at some of the young men who get arrested and I have to often wonder, "Where was this young man's Dad? Why did this happen? His whole life, possibly, is now a mess."

Along with viewing the police reports, I get a lot of phone calls here at the paper. One concerned reader asked me recently why we print the names of juveniles in the police briefs. She said that I had possibly ruined one young man's life for running an article about his charges.

While she wanted answers, I offered her a different way to look at the situation. What if this one incident in time was the one event that could turn that young man's

life around? I told her what a speaker said once at a seminar I attended. David Bauerly told the group of men sitting in a circle to reconsider the concept of good and bad.

I thought his statement to be preposterous at first, but as he continued I began to understand what he meant. He told a story of how he was arrested one night at a Midwestern U.S. airport for drug possession in the 1980s. He said he had the opportunity to look at that night as the worst day of his life, but he chose not to. He took responsibility for his actions.

He looked at his arrest completely the opposite. Bauerly said he took his arrest as an opportunity to change his life and turn it around.

"If I'd not been arrested, I know I would have been dead in 60 days, the way I was living," he said.

After he paid the price for his charges, David re-channeled all of his energy and resources into becoming a better man. He started his own business where he makes high-end custom home furnishings. But he also goes around the country sharing his story of how, by simply re-thinking the way we look at 'good and bad,' he turned a perceivably terrible thing into good.

Clay Today prints juveniles' names and the crimes for which they are charged because that is what state law allows. Florida open records laws are just that – very open. Unlike some states, Florida lawmakers feel it is in the best interest of the communities in which we live to be informed about what is going on in terms of crime.

And while the father in me will always have empathy about the young person whose story ends up being told via the police briefs, the journalist I am understands that the public has the right to know despite the concepts of good or bad. Either way, every event we face is an opportunity for change.

10 Years Ago, 2003

- Twenty-year-old Reginald Millard walked into the Clay County Jail and turned himself in to authorities for a murder in which he was wanted that took place in Roberson County, North Carolina. He was charged with killing convenience store clerk Robert Lenzy Ingram Jr..

- Clay Co. Sheriff's Officers joined forces with the Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco Agency to conduct a countywide crack down on the sale of tobacco to minors. Fifteen people were arrested.

- Clay Co. Schools advertised a public notice concerning proposed boundary changes for both Orange Park and Wilkinson Junior High Schools.

Reader says 'Hold onto your wallet'

This is a Public Service Announcement. For all residents of Clay County, hang onto your wallet. Those in our community who thought they voted for Conservative Republicans to serve on the Board of Commissioners, think again. You got one out of five.

The other four commissioners seem bent on wasting county taxpayer dollars on something no conservative would ever approve. I am referring to the ongoing shenanigans involving the possibility of building a ball park to be run by a company called Big League Dreams.

As any conservative will state, government has no business funding private enterprise. The deal (oh have they got a deal for you) is BLD gets \$450,000 up front for a contract to run a replica ball park for all kinds of baseball and softball. The county

- 7) multi-family units (350)

- 10) financial business 5,000 sq ft

All of this to be set up and running between 2014 and 2018. Sound realistic to you? And this is just for openers. There is more needed from 2019 through 2035, when most of the people involved in this will be dead.

To add insult to injury, there is a group of landowners who control roughly 840 acres of barren land. This is land deemed almost useless unless someone with deep pockets can develop it. 30 Years Ago, 1983

- Members of the Clay County Commission expressed concerns about members of the County Planning Commission. BCC members James Jett said only four of the seven members of the Planning Commission had attended panels' two previous meetings.

- The Clay Co. Sheriff's Office investigated a vandalism spree at Lakeside Middle School. Officials said vandals spray painted 666 on walls and chalkboards and caused an estimated \$1,000 damage.

- The BCC lifted a ban on scavenging for re-usable goods at the county's landfills after a month-long moratorium. New rules opened the county dumps weekdays after

3 p.m. when county equipment was not in use.

40 Years Ago, 1973

- Orange Park commissioners voted to give \$12,500 to help build a new library for the city. The library had already \$110,000 before making the request.

- Eagle Family Discount held its grand opening as the 150th store in the chain, which was started 27 years prior to the Orange Park store's opening. The discount store was located at the corner of U.S. Highway 17 and Milwaukee Avenue.

other factors through good habits. Setting sprinklers to come on early in the morning and be done just before sunrise will help keep leaf blades dry on sunny days. Mow to the correct height for your lawn and if fungal problems are present, mow these areas last to avoid spreading the problem. Wash the mower after use, and keep mower blades sharp for a healthy cut – ragged and torn edges after cutting can be more susceptible to problems.

For most fungal problems, professional help is advised. Treatment with fungicides is tricky – the product, timing and application need to be just right for effective control, or the time and money spent are wasted. If you choose to treat problems yourself, then for any use of pesticides be safe and protect your health by following instructions for ap-

plication rates, methods, timing, and any other instructions. Read and follow all label directions with your product to protect yourself, your family and the environment. Also, check out the "Homeowner's Guide to Fungicides for Lawn and Landscape Disease Management" at <http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/pp154> and "Turf grass Disease Management" at <http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/lh040> for more info on lawn fungal problems and treatments. The bottom line: adopt good cultural practices, know what to look for, and know when to ask for help to keep lawn fungal problems from getting you steamed.

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Battle with weight results in crown

ORANGE PARK – Yo-yoing is how she describes her weight over the course of her 63 years because it has always been an up and down battle.

Cathy McCleese of Orange Park has known the solution to the battle since she was a teenager after attending her first Take Off Pounds Sensibly meeting.

Since she rejoined Florida Chapter 180 for the fourth time in October 2007, McCleese has lost an average of one to two pounds a week for a total of just shy of 146 pounds. She was recently crowned as the 2012 TOPS Florida Queen at the organization's annual state conference in Punta Gorda, Fla., on April 13.

She earned the crown by losing more weight than any other TOPS member in Florida by reaching her personal goal.

"I reached my goal on Oct. 8, 2012 and after all the files were reviewed, they called me in February," she said. "The coordinator called and told me I had lost more weight than anybody else in Florida in 2012."

All she could say was "are you sure."

"Are you sure you got the right person, are you sure you want to talk to me, are you sure, are you sure, and they keep say-

ing yes, yes, yes, yes, yes," she said. "I just couldn't believe it."

McCleese attended the conference with two of her chapter members, area leader and coordinator.

"I could tell my chapter, but they asked that we didn't tell anyone other chapters," she said. "I also told my son...he knew I had yo-yoed in the past and he was happy that I got my weight down."

Rosemary Huge, a member of TOPS for more than 30 years, was cheering McCleese on from the sidelines.

"I was surprised, but I knew she would probably qualify because she had reached her goal by being so dedicated," Huge said.

But besides dedication, it was the chapter members' support, motivational meetings, incentives for losing weight and having to face the scale every Monday night that helped McCleese shed her weight.

"Cathy stayed with the regimen; she was so faithful," said Marilyn Hollowood of Orange Park, a two-decade TOPS.

At the recognition ceremony they had several motivational speeches and stories of weight loss success, McCleese said.

"But they don't announce who won king and queen until the end helping to build the suspense," she said.

When the queen delivered her speech she talked about her weight struggle and

what it took to be able to stand in front of the audience that April day.

McCleese has been concerned about her weight since eighth grade.

In 1970, she joined TOPS with a girlfriend because it was cheaper than anything out there.

"We want to lose 10 to 15 pounds, something silly like that," she said. "It was old ladies there and we were the only two teenagers, so we couldn't relate to them; it was short lived."

However, 10 years later she joined again and lost her weight and then quit a

second time assuming she could keep the weight off by herself.

She did well until she had a horse-riding accident.

"I punctured and collapsed a lung, broke six ribs, broke my collar bone, severely sprained my leg and had many cuts and bad bruises," her speech read.

McCleese was 33 at the time of the accident and, not being able to work, she stayed at home and tried to heal the pain by indulging in whatever she wanted to eat.

"I was bed bound, so I ate as I pleased

and became a 'Coke-a-holic' and 'choc-o-holic' very quickly," she told the audience.

Once she was ready to go back to work, her 12-year-old daughter passed away in an accident, which resulted in her and her husband getting a divorce and more eating in hopes to relieve the pain.

"I have not recovered from that loss, but I have learned to live with it," she said.

A few years later she met her second husband, Larry, who weighed close to 500 pounds because of a leg problem, McCleese said.

They tried what seemed like every diet book in print but they all failed. They just kept eating more and more country-fried-fattening foods.

They finally joined TOPS together and did well until he got really sick and they both quit. McCleese stayed home to care for him 24/7. It got really bad and he passed away January 2007, she said.

McCleese's health suffered too.

"I had three mild heart attacks and after the third one, the doctor told me I was, Pre-diabetic," she said. "It was the worst diagnosis."

She was about 350 pounds at the time and when she left the doctor she went home and lost 50 pounds and then went back to TOPS a fourth time when she hit a wall and couldn't lose any more weight.

"I always came back to TOPS," she said. "It costs \$5 a month and \$28 a year for national fees; it's the cheapest thing out there because eating healthy is not cheap," she said.

At the conference, she was one of 158 people out of all the groups program wide to receive a Century Award from TOPS for losing 100 pounds and becoming a KOPS, Keep Off Pounds Sensibly.

Being a KOPS, McCleese can only gain three pounds and lose seven.

"The hardest part is maintenance because you think, well I should be able to do what I want now that I've reached my goal," she said. "You can't because you have to continue to watch your daily intake, exercise and stay within your 10-pound limit, so your weight doesn't get out of control again."

Clay County working with the Neighborhood Housing and Development Corporation (NHDC) a nonprofit housing organization is accepting applications from low, moderate and middle income households interested in participating as tenants in the Clay County Neighborhood Stabilization Program - 3 (NSP-3) rental program. The housing units available for lease through the program are being acquired and renovated as part of the federally funded Neighborhood Stabilization Program - 3. "Getting dressed up is the best," Norman said and, pointing to her shoes, added, "They're high heels."


Stephanie Korey, a librarian at the branch at 2054 Plainfield Ave., came up with the idea in time for Fathers' Day on

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teens ages 12-18, singing covers of popular songs or showing off their instruments. Genres such as Top 40 pop, Indie Rock, and Alternative rock mainly rule the stage. According to the shop's co-owner, Valerie Kelley, the open mic night will host

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Meet Michael Barcenas

French horn musician, Douglas Anderson student

ORANGE PARK – Days before leaving for Boston University Tanglewood Institute's summer workshop to study French horn, Michael Barcenas learned that he was accepted to also study with the Young Artist Wind Ensemble.

After studying the French horn for five years, Orange Park resident Michael Barcenas, 17, landed one of 16 spots in a prestigious French horn workshop for young musicians from around the world. Barcenas left Orange Park June 16 and will return from Boston University Tanglewood Institute, or BUTI, July 29 after six weeks of intense musical workshops.

"We'll be practicing big horn excerpts from orchestral pieces," Barcenas said during a June 13 interview. "Our group will be broken down into small groups and switched out to learn to play three orchestral songs. I'll also be critiqued on solos."

A rising senior at Jacksonville's Douglas Anderson School of the Arts, during the school year Barcenas studies French horn at least three hours every day in addition to taking music, Advanced Placement and Honors classes.

"The horn gives me a challenge," Barcenas said, the youngest of five. "It has one of the widest ranges of brass instruments. It has a mellow side and has a smooth sound depending on the player."

During two separate workshops, Barcenas will study with other French horn, woodwind, brass and percussion musicians.



"He will be studying instrumental works in a broad range of styles, which will include pieces for a full wind ensemble, chamber music and solos performances," said Barcenas' mother Marisela Barcenas. "He will participate in master classes and have private lessons with BUTI faculty."

High school age musicians aspiring to be professional musicians flock to the university's highly competitive Tanglewood Institute, recognized in the world of music academia as the top summer training program. Students of BUTI will study with professional musicians and members of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. For the first two-week workshop, Barcenas will study French horn with Eric Ruske, a Boston University professor and director of the BUTI horn seminar.

"I'll be getting lessons from Eric Ruske, who is a known soloist," Barcenas said. "I've heard he's a tough horn player and makes you push hard and work through."

Barcenas' latest achievement will be added to his lengthy resume. Barcenas has practiced and performed with the Jacksonville Symphony Youth Orchestra, Douglas Anderson School of the Arts' Horn Choir and Wind Symphony, and various school jazz ensembles, orchestras and honor bands. Locally, he studies with Kevin Reid, principal horn with the Jacksonville Symphony.

"Michael is a very musical player and plays very powerfully," Reid said, who has with the Jacksonville Symphony since 1998. "He's a bright guy and a hard worker. That's what it takes."

They loved the coffee shop so much they drove back from Dallas, Texas to play a second time. They will be coming back once more playing a third show June 20 at Spring Park Coffee.

Reid said that attending BUTI workshops is an important stepping stone for Barcenas because collaborating with other skilled students will challenge him to be better.

"He goes to Douglas Anderson where the level is really high," Reid said. "[In Boston], it's going to be great horn players from everywhere which will motivate him even more. Being with very fine players always increases your want when you're around."

Barcenas became enamored with brass instruments in middle school and chose the French horn because of its ability to mimic and blend with other instruments. He also "was drawn to the way it looks," because the instrument has 20 feet of tubing wrapped into a coil with a flared bell, which emits sound waves. Musicians control the pitch by adjusting lip tension on the mouthpiece. The player's left hand operates valves which reroutes the air to shorter or longer coils, allowing the player to reach various notes.

"French horn music is really diverse because you can play music from concert, to orchestra, to chamber music," Barcenas said. "It goes well with everything from woodwinds to violins and cellos. It's the only instrument that can go into those other instruments."

"I'm moving away from you guys," Indiana Harper said to Carter with a furrowed brow.

In the "Won't You Be My Neighbor?" lab, the fictional Iggy family performed typical household tasks, such as mowing the lawn, washing cars and salting the sidewalk in the winter. When Mrs. Iggy cut the lawn, Carter placed grass clippings in each group's bucket, about five in all. When Mr. Iggy washed the cars, each bucket got a squirt of liquid soap. When their trash can fell over when they were at work, bits of paper towels were placed in the teams' buckets. Argyle Elementary student Mathew Pesek questioned if they family's last name was "Iggy" or "Icky."

"I'm calling the cops on you," Emily Stewart, 10, said.

Students were challenged to clean the water using a small square of screen, a funnel, a coffee filter and a two-liter bottle.

"The screen separates the larger stuff like sticks and the coffee filter catches the smaller stuff that fits through the screen," said Hannah Bothast, 11.

All of the kids seemed emotionally invested in their water source. Each time Carter introduced a new challenge, the kids grumbled.

"You're literally killing us," nine-year-old Zion Dugan said.

Carter, a sixth grade science teacher at

Paterson Elementary, said that the bucket represented human impact on the ground water, springs, rivers and oceans and that they should be upset about polluted water.

"We all do this," Carter said. "Even though people know all this stuff washes into the gutters and into the ground water they still allow it to happen."

Science Discovery camp is a collaborative effort of administrators and teachers. Each day, groups participated in three different labs incorporating science and engineering into regular camp activities like hiking and arts and crafts. No two labs were duplicated.

"I liked building the roller coaster,"

Dylan Haffner, 10, said. "We connected pipes together with duct tape. We rolled a marble down into the track and talked a lot about friction."

Tina Baker headed up the younger group of boys and girls ranging from rising first graders to rising third graders. Their labs were designed to challenge younger children, but the groups worked together to design and build a solar oven using a shoe box, glue and aluminum foil. The ovens dried overnight and were used to bake S'mores using only the sun.

"When I woke up this morning, I never expected we'd make a solar oven," Madison Pesek said.

Baker said the idea for the science discovery camp was born from two grants awarded to the school district by the Department of Defense Education Activity. In 2011 and 2012, the district received \$2.9 million to fund the Learning In Florida's Environments, or LIFE, program where military-connected students performed

the work of scientists in an outdoor setting. This is the second year of the science camp held at North Fork and Baker wants the camp to reach more children.

"Last year, we got two Title I grants and bused kids down from Grove Park Elementary and Charles E. Bennett Elementary," Baker said. "Their [FCAT] science scores went up that year. They are definitely being exposed to skills in science and engineering."

Although the Title I grants were not available this year, the science experiments are scheduled for two more sessions in July. Traditional camp activities like canoeing, archery and swimming are woven into the day's three labs exploring friction, fossilization, and solar energy.

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Summer Desserts

Ah, summer is here. Time for picnics, family reunions, trips to the beach and many other occasions that call for a special dessert. But wait, your favorite dessert will melt in the heat or worse yet spoil and make everyone a little queasy. Never fear, the Foodie is ready to share two of her favorite safe summer dessert recipes.

Brown Sugar Brownies have been a family favorite for years. My grandmother was allergic to chocolate so my mother began making these yummy brownies when I was a child. I cannot remember a family gathering without them. They are a perfect house warming gift, church potluck offering or picnic addition. They will not melt so I took them as a treat for many a tennis match. Trust me when I tell you everyone loves these brownies and my recipe has been passed along many times.

When you make Brown Sugar Brownies, you must use real butter. They will not taste as good made with margarine. One other note, the recipe calls for a scant cup of flour. This is a very old fashioned term. It means do not fill the measuring cup completely full of flour. The flour will be just below the top of the measuring cup. The recipe easily doubles to fit in a 9x13 pan. The brownies freeze beautifully. Simply cool the brownies cut them and put them in an air tight container. I have kept them frozen for up to one month and yes out of desperation I have eaten a frozen brownie. Delicious.

Sour Cream Pound Cake is another old family favorite. My mother always made pound cakes to take on beach vacations. We would stop and get fresh peaches on our way. She would slice the peaches and sprinkle them a little sugar. She let them sit until the peaches released some of their juices. Then she would serve a slice of pound cake with a scoop of the fresh peach

Brown Sugar Brownies

These delicious and easy bar cookies can be mixed in the same glass bowl in which you melt the butter. The recipe makes an 8x8 inch pan, but you can easily double the recipe and make it in a 9x13 pan.

- 1/4 cup melted butter (no substitutes)
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 scant cup flour (For those non-cooks, this 3/4 cup chopped pecans is not quite a full cup but not 3/4 cup)
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/3 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Add ingredients to melted butter, one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Put batter into a 8x8 inch, greased pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes. Do not overbake. Let cool before cutting.

mixture. After the addition of a dollop of whipped cream, we had summer bliss.

The recipe calls for butter, real butter. Do not substitute. It will affect the texture of the pound cake. Use real sour cream, not a reduced fat version. I also recommend using real vanilla extract, not imitation. It costs a little bit more, but the flavor difference is worth it. If you are planning to take the pound cake to a picnic, it is perfectly acceptable to slice the pound cake

and arrange the slices on a pretty platter. Pound Cake freezes very well. Let it cool completely, and then remove the cake from the pan. Wrap it tightly in foil and freeze for up to one month. I recommend freezing it whole and slice it after thawing to preserve the freshness.

Sour Cream Pound Cake

- 2 Sticks butter (no substitutes), softened
- 2 2/3 cups sugar
- 6 eggs
- 1/4 tsp baking soda
- 1 8-ounce carton sour cream
- 3 cups plain flour
- 1 tsp vanilla

Cream butter and sugar well. Add one egg at a time mixing well between each addition. Stir baking soda into sour cream. Add flour and sour cream to butter mixture.

Add vanilla. Mix well. Pour into greased and floured tube or bundt pan. Bake at 300 degrees for 1 hour (do not open oven). Increase oven temperature to 325 degrees. Continue baking for another 20-25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in cake comes out clean.

Cool completely, then remove from pan.

2903 Guava Ct., 4834 Fireweed St. and 5335 Valor Ct., all with Middleburg addresses.

The two-month investigation led to the arrests of five Cuban nationals for the cultivation of marijuana. However, Beseler said the case remains under investigation and would not say whether more houses or suspects could be involved in the operation that thus far has netted five arrests and 216 high-grade marijuana plants. Officers also seized \$1,800 in cash, three grocery bags of so-called marijuana “shake,” more than six pounds of processed pot and a Ford pickup truck.

“We believe they picked Clay County due to its rural setting,” Beseler said. “It was really a remarkable operation.”

Officers found two semi tractor-trailer containers buried as deep as 20-feet in what Beseler called “literally a bunker buried underground” in which they grew the marijuana. He said the elaborate bunkers were equipped with air conditioning, ventilation, fans and power they re-routed directly from a Clay Electric power line.

“They scaled a Clay Electric power line while it was still live and stole the power to run the grow lights,” Beseler said.

Raluxi Raul Erbiti, 37, of Hialeah, Fla., Yandriel Urbay Gonzalez, 23, of Middleburg, Jonny Valdespino Gordillo, 32, of Middleburg and Jaime Mora, 39, were

arrested June 12. As the investigation continued, members of the Clay County Drug Task Force were led to the June 13 arrest of Antonio Santos, 26, who also gave a Middleburg address. Beseler said the men are in the U.S. legally, but for other reasons. All five are in the Clay County Jail where they are being held without bond.

Santos, Beseler said, had expertise in the electrical arena.

“They were very-well hidden. This took a lot of construction,” Beseler said. “We believe [the marijuana] was being pack-

aged and sent to South Florida.”

He said the men used back hoes and track hoes to dig the holes for the containers all the while remaining inconspicuous to neighbors. He said investigators determined that the marijuana-growing equipment was brought in from other parts of the state to set up shop.

Because the marijuana they were growing was so potent, officers had to use self-contained breathing apparatuses to enter the bunkers. The CSSO is currently working with Clay County’s Code Enforcement

Department to ensure each site is cleaned up safely. Beseler said he wants to make sure there is proper site remediation so no one can get hurt.

“It could also pose a safety hazard due to the high voltage of the line underground,” Beseler said. “It’s really remarkable that they didn’t get electrocuted.”

Beseler said he has seen instances of indoor pot-growing operations before, but “never a bunker.”

“Most growers are doing indoor grows,” Beseler said. “It’s just more profitable.”

Is Church Attendance REALLY Necessary?

We see this truth displayed every time we go into the restroom of a public restaurant and see the sign “Employees must wash their hands before returning to work”. The same ‘wash your body’ principle so important for good physical hygiene is also true for good moral hygiene. People don’t say “I’m going to quit taking showers since I’m too busy, or don’t understand why I should do it”. We all rub shoulders with moral impurity on a daily basis. We get around somebody with a vulgar mouth, or somebody with a really bad attitude. We hear a crude joke, or watch a TV program that leaves us feeling dirty.

Washing our hands, or taking a shower can cleanse us from physical filth, but it doesn’t touch the moral filth. That is where Church attendance becomes critically important. Ephesians 5:25-27 says, “Christ cleanses (His church) with the washing of the water by the word...that it (His church) should be holy and without blemish”. The teaching of the Word of God doesn’t just intellectually enlighten us to greater truths about God and His creation. It also provides a moral cleansing that nothing else on earth can provide. 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

Middleburg man charged with fencing thousands of dollars in building material

MIDDLEBURG – Clay County authorities have arrested a Middleburg man for allegedly stealing thousands of dollars worth of building materials on more than 40 different times from area construction sites.

Shawn Alan Davis, 26, is charged with 40 counts of grand theft from a posted construction site, one count of burglary, possession of drug paraphernalia and driving with a suspended or revoked license following his June 12 arrest.

Clay County Sheriff's Office Public Information Officer Mary Justino said the evidence collected so far in the investigation shows the crimes took place between May 1 and May 31 at both residential and commercial construction sites in Clay County. Most of the incidents occurred at night, but some took part during the day as well, she said.

Justino said when Davis would be confronted by authorized construction crews at different work sites, he would give them a story telling them he was transporting such goods as plywood, roofing shingles and lumber to other sites on which the company was building.

Officers found that Davis was then selling the construction materials on the Internet on such websites as Craigslist.org.

According to the police report, when officers apprehended Davis, he agreed to ride with them around Clay County and show them the work sites from which he stole the goods.

He was taken to the Clay County Jail,

where he bond was set at \$290,109. At press time, he remained behind bars.

Orange Park man faces three counts of lewd and lascivious battery

ORANGE PARK – An investigation that began May 16 has resulted in the arrest of an Orange Park man for three counts of lewd and lascivious molestation on a victim between the ages of 12 and 16 and one count of simple battery.

Christopher David Sumpter, 20, was arrested June 12 for allegedly fondling at least girls at an Orange Park gaming center.

According to the police report, Sumpter was witnessed grabbing the buttocks and breasts of girls there were as young as 12 at a teen club called Underground Alley at 920 Blanding Blvd. The club owner, Wendy Hendricks, told police that she had warned Sumpter as recently as May 4 about his improper behavior.

"[Hendricks] provided several examples which included C. Sumpter massaging females, having them sit on his lap, touching their faces, touching their arms and even touching them on the buttocks," stated the report.


Sumpter was arrested after investigators obtained a warrant from Judge Don H. Lester. He was taken to the Clay County Jail where he later was released on \$7,503 bond.

Third arrest in Keystone Heights meth lab case

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – The Clay County

Sheriff's Office has made a third arrest in connection with a Keystone Heights meth lab involving two men who were making the illegal drug in neighboring houses on Lori Loop Road.

James Reden Wooten, 52, was arrested June 13 and charged with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine. This marks Wooten's second meth-related arrest in the last seven months. In December 2012, Wooten was arrested in Orange Park for possession of 1.5 grams of meth while en route from Jacksonville to Keystone Heights.

Wooten's arrest, according to the police report, is connected to the June 4 arrest of Thomas Byron Kelley, 42, who was "routinely purchasing Pseudoephedrine for [Wooten] to manufacture methamphetamine and in exchange Thomas Kelley would receive a small amount of the methamphetamine produced," stated the police report.

A check of the National Precursor Log Exchange database, which tracks pseudoephedrine purchases, Wooten had purchased the cold medicine 47 times and had rejected 18 other times by area pharmacies.

Also charged in the case is Christopher Steven Harrelson, 24, of Keystone Heights. CCSO officials say more arrests are possible as the investigation continues.

Meanwhile, Wooten was taken to the Clay County jail where his bond is set at \$180,006. Harrelson remains in jail where his bond is set at \$75,003 and Kelley's bond is set at \$100,006. All three men remain in jail at press time.

Middleburg man faces three sex-related charges

MIDDLEBURG – Clay County authorities have arrested a Middleburg man for three counts of sexual misconduct.

Scotty Mathew Green, 39, was arrested June 13 by the Clay County Sheriff's Office following an investigation by the agency's Special Victims Unit.

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

Couple arrested for child neglect, pot charges

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A Green Cove Springs couple made it really easy for a Clay County Sheriff's Officer to develop a case against them on June 13.

Deputy K.L. Maertz said a gold Chevrolet Impala passed his police car at the intersection of North and Olive Streets on June 13 in Green Cove Springs. When the car passed, the officer said he could smell marijuana coming from the vehicle.





"As the vehicle passed I smelled a very strong odor of cannabis and observed the male passenger smoking what appeared to be a joint," stated the police report. "I followed the vehicle to the intersection of North Street and Roberts Street with the increasing odor of cannabis emitting from the vehicle. I observed the windows crack to the vehicle and observed smoke come out of the cracked windows."

The driver of the car, Stephanie Kareena Frazier, 39, was charged with one count each of possession of a controlled substance without a valid prescription, possession of drug paraphernalia and child abuse without great harm.

Officers seized a metal pill container from Frazier that contained 1.6 grams of crack cocaine. CCSO officials had to call the Department of Children and Families into the case as Frazier's juvenile child was in the backseat. DCF officials gave Frazier's mother custody of the child. Also arrested in the traffic stop was a passen-

ger of the car – Devin Scott Adams, 31, also of Green Cove Springs.

Adams was charged with child abuse without great harm and possession of less than 20 grams of marijuana. He was taken to the Clay County Jail where his bond was set at \$25,005. Frazier's bond is set at \$25,006.

Keystone Heights man faces charge of abusing disabled brother

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS – The Clay County Sheriff's Office has charged a Keystone Heights man with abusing an elderly or disabled adult following a June 12 incident.

Robert Christopher Griggs, 45, is charged with allegedly injuring his legally blind brother, Alfred Griggs, during an argument. Alfred Griggs told police that he had ordered his brother Robert Griggs to leave his home. When Robert Griggs refused, an argument took place and Robert Griggs allegedly broke a door down to return into the house.

"The defendant said when the victim lunged at him, he pushed the victim out of the way and the victim hit the floor causing his eye to bruise and swell up," stated the police report.

Robert Griggs was taken to the Clay County Jail where his bond is set at \$5,003.

Jury acquits Keystone Heights man on 2012 drug trafficking charge

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – After deliberating for an hour and eight minutes, a Clay County jury recently acquitted a Keystone Heights man of drug trafficking charges.

Jeffery Alan Cook, 46, was found not guilty of trafficking Hydrocodone and Acetaminophen stemming from a January 19, 2012 investigation in which police alleged that Cook sold 100 pills during an under-

cover investigation. He was arrested and charged with the alleged transaction on July 16, 2012.

The Clay County Sheriff's Office used an informant to purchase drugs from Cook, according to court records. Cook's attorney, Russell Poole, said Cook's case was a classic example of entrapment.

"To do an entrapment defense, you have to basically admit that you did the crime," Poole said. "The defense had to show that a police informant used methods of persuasion to entice [my client] to commit the crime, a crime he was not otherwise pre-disposed to do."

Had he been convicted, Cook would have faced a 25-year minimum mandatory sentence, Poole said.

Poole said the CCSO officers were well-intentioned in what they were trying to achieve in the undercover investigation but also points out that there can sometimes appear to be a rush to prosecute in some of the cases he has seen involving pain killers. In the last four years, there has been a coordinated effort statewide to crack down on the painkiller market. Part of that crackdown was the development of a statewide database, stepped up law enforcement and monitoring of painkiller prescribing.

"The police did not monitor their informant," Poole said. "The informant set it up so they could make money off the transaction, but my client made no money."

On the closing day of the trial, Poole filed three separate motions requesting Cook be acquitted of the charges. On each occasion, Fourth Judicial Circuit Judge John H. Skinner denied the motions of acquittal. When the jury returned a not guilty

verdict around 4:50 p.m. on June 11, Skinner released the jurors and thanked them for their service in the two-day trial.

Drowning accident victim autopsy planned

KINGSLEY LAKE – An investigation is underway to determine the exact cause of death of a Jacksonville man involved in a diving accident that occurred on June 13 on Kingsley Lake.

According to the Clay County Sheriff's Office, Scott Allen Hamner, 51, of Jacksonville passed away over the weekend of June 15 from injuries he sustained.


His body was transferred June 17 from Shands Hospital in Gainesville to the Medical Examiner's Office in Alachua County for an autopsy. He was originally taken to Shands Starke, but was moved to Shands Gainesville on June 14.

A preliminary investigation showed Hamner dived from a dock into the water and never surfaced. Family members pulled him from the water and contacted Clay County Fire and Rescue. The location of the incident was 6111 Kingsley Lake Drive.

Kaczmar set to be re-sentenced; judge steps down

In a motion filed June 13 by Assistant State Attorney James Colaw, Skinner agreed to remove himself from the

death penalty re-sentencing of Leo Louis Kaczmar III, 29, of Jacksonville. Court records show Skinner signed the motion June 14.

During his August 2010 trial, a medical examiner testified that Kaczmar stabbed 49-year-old Mary Ruiz 93 times, and then burnt the mobile home in which she lived in an attempt to create an alibi to cover up the December 2008 crime.

Colaw asked Skinner to take himself off the case because Skinner had previously stated that he had decided to give Kaczmar life in prison instead of the death penalty.

October 4, 2012, the Supreme Court handed down a ruling that effectively threw out Kaczmar's death sentence on the grounds that the sentence would be a violation of his 8th Amendment rights. The court ruled that Kaczmar's crime did not meet the standard for being cold, calculating and premeditated, key aspects of death penalty sentencing.

"Murders that are cold, calculated, and premeditated enough to merit the CCP aggravator must be cold, calculated, and premeditated, not simply premeditated," stated the high court ruling, which was not entered into the records in the Clay County Clerk of Court Office until January 2013. "Yet, that is what the State seems to argue here, or rather it argues only that the murder of Ms. Ruiz had the heightened premeditation this Court requires. It says nothing about the additional requirements that it also be cold and calculated."


When Kaczmar was convicted of first degree murder, arson and attempted sexual battery, the jury recommended the death penalty by a vote of 11-1. In November 2010, Judge William Wilkes sentenced Kaczmar to the state's death row.

Chief Judge Donald Moran will appoint a new judge to the case.

Woman pleads guilty to attempted murder charge

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A Green Cove Springs woman charged with trying to kill her mother with a claw hammer last October has pleaded guilty to attempted murder charges.

Kelly Diane Rose, 49, entered into the plea agreement with the State Attorney's Office this week. She effectively pled guilty to killing her mother, Diane Knapper, 70, who was left alone and injured on her kitchen floor for at least two-and-a-half days before she was found by another daughter who had been trying to reach her via phone. Knapper suffered skull fractures during the attack but later recovered to tell police that Rose beat her with a hammer.

After rifling through her mother's home,


Rose stole various credit cards from her mother's purse and used them in Jacksonville where she was living in a motel on Philips Highway. Police said Rose also stole her mother's check book.

As part of the plea arrangement, Rose will spend 30 years in prison. She will be officially sentenced the week of July 15.

Remodelers face illegal dumping charges

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Two Middleburg men faces charges of illegal dumping following an investigation by the Clay County Sheriff's Office.

William Gunnar English, 21, and Ryan Peter Seitz, 24, are accused of dumping refuse that was taken from the site of a foreclosed home they were remodeling and dumping the



waste inside the shell of another foreclosed home.

"The defendant and co-defendant opted to save money in disposal costs and the two dumped the waste illegally at another vacant foreclosed home they were familiar with," stated the CCSO police report. "The defendant received economic gain by dumping the waste illegally versus paying to have it properly disposed of."

CCSO officers initiated their investigation June 4 involving the home at 3385 County Road 315. They were able to track down the name of the company that hired the men by going through old letters at the dump site. Officers said both men work for a company called It's Your View and dumped 840 pounds of building materials and debris in a foreclosed Shelley Drive

home owned by Bank of America.

County officials said they have seen increase in this type of illegal dumping as the local housing market begins to improve and home sales increase. This marks the second time since March 11 that CCSO officers have made such an arrest.

In March, Joseph Allen Moore II, 20, of Clermont, Fla., and John Dallas Brant, 17, of Green Cove Springs were charged with dumping more than 500 pounds of house trash taken from a home in 6200 block of Shetland Road in Jacksonville. The Clay County Sheriff's Office said a witness told an officer March 11 that about 27 bags of trash were dumped in a ditch and an abandoned driveway in the 1700 block of Shedd Road on property belonging to Shadowlawn Nursery.

Seitz faces one charge of violating Florida's litter law, while English was charged with littering more than 500 pounds of commercial hazardous waste. Both were taken to the Clay County Jail for booking.


the big field.”

Brauer wins Pies 5km open race

JACKSONVILLE - Fleming Island runner Tommy Brauer won the open Run to the Pies 5K race with winning 17 minute, 10 second time while master's runner John Metzgar battled his 50 year old legs against a slew of elite youngsters in 1st Place Sports' annual speed fest in downtown Jacksonville on his way to a seventh Jacksonville Grand Prix running title.

"In winning his seventh Jacksonville Grand Prix title (2004, 06, 07, 08 and 2011), John Metzgar becomes the Tiger Woods of running in Jacksonville," said 1st Place Sports of Jacksonville owner Doug Alred, the director of the Pies races and the Grand Prix series. "That's good running for a long time."

The Run for the Pies 5km race event, the 17th and final event of the 1st Place Sports sponsored Jacksonville Grand Prix circuit, consists of two separate 3.1 mile races; one an elite race with prize money offered, and the second, an open race competition where a 5km time under 21 minutes for men and 24 minutes for women earns a coveted baked pie special award. Grand Prix prize money goes to the top five overall winners based on a percentage of age-graded performance percentages over the course of the year. Age Group awards are also calculated with winners receiving plaques. Ironically, the final cash purse spot in the 2013 Grand Prix was the tightest in years, said Alred, with Fleming Island's Lisa Adams, 38, losing by six-tenths of a percentage to Michael Johnson, 51, of Jacksonville, who ran 19:26. Adams ran 19:53.

"I didn't have to beat him to win, just stay within 14 seconds," said Adams, before the race.

Metzgar, a running stalwart in north Florida, ran a fleet 16:57 to finish 25th overall of 34 runners in the elite race behind leader Jeremy Criscione, 25, a former Interlachen High and University of Florida star, who won with a 14:42 winning time.

Elite runners ran a series of one mile loops after starting at the Jacksonville Landing with the open race starting in front of the Landing as well, but encompassing one larger loop around the city.

In the women's elite race, Orange Park's Britta Fortson, 40, also ran strong among younger racers to finish 16th of 20 in 19:21. Young Bridget Morse, 12, a former Clay County-based Sunny Runners Club athlete that was part of the 2011 Middle School State Championship team, finished 15th in 19:21 in the elite race as well.



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Velobrew Cycling Team looking for long-lost titles

"We have worked well together for quite a while," said Miller. "Both of us have won titles before, but, like Kent said, it has been too long."

"I've always liked this area for a business like this," said Hall, who opened his Open Road Bicycles doors just three weeks ago (9680 Argyle Forest Blvd, Suite 18) and already has had a lot of conversations with locals thanking him for the store. "Every day, I get a comment about how glad someone is for having a quality bike shop in the area."

Located near the Gator Dockside restaurant, a doctor's office and a drycleaning business, Hall does not see a slowdown in day-to-day foot traffic.

"People stop in after doing their busi-







now a Ridgeview High running backs coach after excelling as a running back at Florida A & M in Tallahassee and coaching at Clay and Oakleaf high schools.

Floyd sees his return to the youth fields as a cycle that started when he was just seven years old at the OPAA fields.

"I always had good coaches around me that taught me more than football," said Floyd, who won a Grey Cup championship ring with the Hamilton Tigercats and played three times in the Canadian version of the Super Bowl. "I played on the same teams that Doug Flutie and Dwayne 'The Rock' Johnson played in Canada. Johnson went on to become the World Wide Wres-

ting Federation star after they cut him."

In 1995, when the Jacksonville Jaguars opened up shop, it was Floyd who was Clay County's first Jaguar, but then head coach Tom Coughlin released him from the Jags

practice squad.

"I did my first year (1994) with the Redskins under Norv Turner and a summer (1995) with the Jags under Coughlin," said Floyd. "When I got the call to play in Canada, I jumped on the opportunity."

Floyd remarked that the CFL scouts would watch the NFL roster cuts each summer and match talents with needs. Floyd played four years at Texas El-Paso and earned numerous Western Athletic Conference defensive awards.

"Again, I got good coaching there and it was at my pace," said Floyd.

Floyd's cycle back to Clay County came in the middle of Ridgeview High's best-ever season last year with Floyd joining the team after a mid-season loss to Columbia Lake City.

"I volunteered with Ridgeview in the middle of their season and stayed with them to the end in St. Augustine," said Floyd. "When Orange Park got their new coach, Craig Nosse, another opportunity came to me. I hope to make an impact."

Gilbert finishes season with Knoxville NightHawks

17-catch debut in Indoor Football League

ORANGE PARK - Former Ridgeview High football and basketball standout Charles Gilbert, Jr., has been journeying around numerous professional football leagues; NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars and St. Louis Rams; Arena Football's Jacksonville Sharks, and finally the Knoxville NightHawks in the Professional Indoor Football League. The NightHawks finished with a two win, 10 loss season record and ended their season with a 55-37 loss to the Alabama Hammers on Saturday.

Gilbert, listed at 6-foot, 180 lbs. as a wide receiver, who played in just four regular season games, opened his NightHawks' debut with a 17 catch performance in a May 4 loss to the Louisiana.

Gilbert finishes his four game season as the number four receiver with 32 catches compared to 52 by 11-game starter Kelvin Bolden. Gilbert caught for 300 yards and three touchdowns with a 45 yard bomb his longest of the season.

On field goal returns, Gilbert had just one return for a 31 yard gain and four kick-off returns for a 13 yard average.

Some of the bright spots include kicker Armando Cuko, defensive lineman Deandre Brown, and wide receivers Rico Joseph, Charles Gilbert, DeAndre Brown, and Kelvin Bolden."

JACKSONVILLE - One of the key figures for the 2013-14 Jacksonville Jaguars' defense will be defensive tackle-turned defensive end Tyson Alualu and, from his perspective, that's alright with him.

"We have definitely bought into the new scheme under coach Bradley," said Alualu, who recorded 45 tackles from his tackle position but just 3.5 sacks. "We have a lot of veterans on the D-line and we are trying to mesh together to make the best squad we can and turn things around."

One wrinkle on the offensive side of the ball during Thursday's final mini camp was seeing quarterback Blaine Gabbert lining up on an outside receiver position with the Jaguars in a somewhat Wildcat formation. Gabbert rolled back toward the backfield


Sgromolo detailed his rendition of Dunning's college and minor league career and remarked that Dunning as a Major Leaguer pitcher only came about very recently.



24, 1941 and moved to Jacksonville where he worked as a meat packer. The couple moved to Tampa where Whitman got a job working in a shipyard.

Whitman and his wife lived in Clay County since 1955 on 40 acres of land Jerry's father purchased for them after they were married. They called their land Woodpecker Paradise.

"You will always be remembered in Clay County, especially as we pass by your home at Woodpecker Paradise," Carli Woodward said through a post on Clay Today's Facebook page.



Slim Whitman

World War II started and he joined the U.S. Navy, which is where he picked up the guitar and was self taught. While working in the Jacksonville meat packing plant he lost almost all of his second finger on his left hand. Because of the injury, he developed an interesting way of playing. Whitman was right-handed, but learned to play guitar with his left hand.

After the war, he returned to the Tampa shipyard and joined a minor-league baseball team called the Plant City Berries all while pursuing a musical career. He was discovered by Eddy Arnold's manager Colonel Tom Parker who heard Whitman singing on the radio. It wasn't long before Whitman signed a contract with RCA Records in 1948.

His career did not take off right away, even though his songs filled national airways. It was his cover song of Bob Nolan's "Love Song of the Waterfall" that was his big break. The song came in at number ten on the top 10 on country music charts. It

was the next single called "Indian Love Call" that propelled him into stardom. The song was well received by the pop audience in addition to the country crowd and made it to the number two spot on the charts. Whitman was successful because of his melodic songs with romantic themes.

Whitman recorded 10 songs for RCA Records. His vocal range covers three octaves and he was considered a master yodeler, his voice sounding like a steel guitar. He used a falsetto break in the middle of phrases and words to create a distinctive sound. The Grand Ole Opry welcomed Whitman on July 23, 1955 and he went on to tour the United Kingdom where his popularity exploded.

Perhaps the greatest memory for Clay residents was his accessibility. He was often seen with his buddy Claude Bass at the Middleburg McDonalds. Bass was unable to be reached for comment at the Clay County Historical Archives.

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
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

