2. Medium trees: In order to plant any one of this group you must provide evidence that your lot is wide enough for the width of the plant!

Golden Shower Cassia. Senna fistula 35 ft high and 25 ft wide. Hanging yellow flower clusters 12 to 18 inches. No known pests. Briefly bare in winter. Summer bloomer.

Hong Kong Orchid Bauhinia blakeana. 30-45 ft tall and 25 wide. Some smaller varieties are available. One of the most beautiful winter bloomers.

Japanese Fern Tree. Filcium decipiens. 30 ft tall by 20 ft wide. A very attractive non flowering tree with a very interesting texture. Very unusual.

Tabebulas Tabebulas. 20-30 ft tall and 12 to 15 ft wide. Beautiful yellow or pink/purple blooms in late winter/early spring. Blooms when bare of leaves. A pink form is available also but is taller. Warning: Limited wind resistence. No pests. Dwarf varieties are available.

Tri-colored Mahoe. Hibiscus tiliaceus. A superior plant with pink, white and green foliage all year. Blooms of pink or yellow are occasional. This plant can reach 40 ft but can be kept smaller to 20 ft. Homeowner is responsible for pruning! See referenced website above for details. Other Mahoes are not recommended.

Yellow elder. Tecoma stans. Can grow up to 30 ft but best maintained at 15 ft and 8 ft wide. Therefore must be pruned by the home owner. Bell shaped fragrant yellow flowers in fall and then thoughout the year with new growth. No known pest or diseases

Small trees. Some are large bushes or vines which are trained as a tree (called a standard).

Bottlebrush tree. Callistemon viminalis. Upright and weeping forms are available. 15 ft tall by 6 to 8 ft wide. Bloom are red and elongated. Blooming heaviest in summer but can throw blooms thoughout the year. Fine texured very attractive foliage.

Bougainvillea Tree Form. Bougainvillea glabra Many colors. Best maintained at 7 ft. High maintenence but bright winter color.

Casslas. Desert Cassla. Senna polyphylla. 7-10 ft high by 5-6 ft wide. Everblooming yellow flowers with few non blooming rest periods. Weeping form. Drought tolerant. Slower growth. Beloved by butterflies. No major pests. A superior plant. Cassla surenttensis. No longer recommended because of disease problems

Creps Jasmine. Tabernaemontana divaricate. 8 ft tall. Fragrant white double flowers. Spring though summer.

Crepe Myrtle. Lagerstroemia indica. Heights vary by variety. 2 ft up to 20 ft. Pink, purple, red and yellow blooms. Summer bloomer. Bare in winter. No major pest problems. Easy to grow.

Dewdrop. Duranta repens. Tree form of the shurb. Best kept at 6 -8 ft. Clusters of small lavender flowers followed by golden berries. Flowers on and off all year.

Owarf Poinciana. Caesalpinia pulcherrima. 10 ft tall and 10 wide. Orange and red combinations as well as single colors of yellow and all red. Blooms on and off all year. A good alternative to the standard Poincianna. A variety 'Compton' blooms in pink. No known pests. Can be bare in winter.

Dwarf Ylang-Ylang. Cananga fruticosa. Compact tree staying in the 6-10 ft range. Very fragrant yellow flowers. A superior selection of Ylang-Ylang.

Geigers. Cordia sebestenna. 20 ft high and 15 feet wide. Orange trumpet blooms especially summer and fall. Warning: Can be subject to geiger bettles which defoliates the tree but does not kill it. White variety available.

Frangipani. Plumeria. Large shrub or tree. Fragrant flowers in summer. Can reach 25 ft. Bare in winter.

Hibiscus Tree Form. Many varieties some weeping such as "Anderson".

Jatropha Tree Form. Jatropha integerima. Shiny leaves an ever blooming red flowers makes this a favorite of south Florida. Butterfly friendly.

Magnolla 'Little Gem'. Magnolia Grandiflora 'Little Gem'. Fragrant white flowers throught the year. Undersides of leaves are bronze. Growing to 15 to 20 ft. Little pruning needed.

Powderpuff Tree. Calliandra haematocephala. 15 ft tall and 10 ft wide. Pink or red blooms off and on thoughout the year.

Starburst. Clerodendrum quadriloculare. Can grow to 25 ft or more. Best kept lower. Speciacular white/pink protruding flowers in late winter. Caution: suckers can run a few feet from the plant and may need to be removed. Best in a large pot.

Tibochina Tree Form. See Tibochina below.

Tree Wisteria. Bolusanthus Speciosus. Blue to mauve drooping, fragrant pea-like flowers hang down from the branches. Slow growing to 20 ft. Protect from frost until established.

Tropical Hydrangea. Dombeya Tree Form. See Tropical Hydrangea below.

Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow Tree Form. Brunfelsia grandiflora. Purple, lavender and white flowers all at the same time in winter. Maintain 6 ft tall and 5 ft wide. Pests include snalls and scale. A very attractive plant.

3. Shrubs.

Arboricola. Schefflera arboricola 'Trinette'. Variegated foliage makes this a popular hedging plant. Slower growing than the green variety of arboricola. The green variety makes an excellent hedge plant in the 4-6 ft range.

Almond Bush. Aloysia Vitgata. 3-10 ft. Very fragrant white flowers.

American Beautyberry. Callicarpa Americana. Clusters of purple berries hug the stems. Florida native. Easy. 6 ft.

Angel Trumpets. Brugmansias. Spectacular fragrant pendulous flowers in a variety of colors.

Blue Butterfly. Clerodendrum Ugandense. Bright blue butterfly-like flowers appear year around on a large shrub. Keep at 4-6 ft.

Bougainvillea varieties. Numerous varieties including dwarf (Pixle) in pinks, white, purple, salmon, orange and pink.

Brazillian Cloak. Megakepasma erythrochlamys. 7 ft tall by 7 ft wide but can be maintained at 3-4 ft tall. Spectacular hugh red spikes bloom for months in fall and winter. Lime foliage.

Butterfly Bush. 2-9 ft high and 3-9 ft wide with size dependent on variety. Speciacular proturding flowers attract butterflies. A weeping form. Numereous varieties. Very tragrant.

Cardboard Palm. Zammia furfuracea. An ancient plant with very thick leaves. Planted primarily as an accent. 6 ft.

Cape Honeysuckle. Tecomaria capensis. A very large vine-like plant which needs constant pruning to be maintained as a shrub. Shades of orange with continous blooms make this a favorite of hummingbirds. No major problems.

Carissa. Carissa macrocarpa. Varieties include 'Natal Plum', 'Boxwood Beauty, 'Emerald Beauty' grow slowly, can be kept small, and have some of most beautiful deep green foliage.

Cassias. Bahama Cassia. Cassia bahamensis. A florida native shrub can reach 15 ft but can be kept much smaller. Yellow flowers in fall. Privet cassia. Cassia ligustrina. 10 ft tall and 6 ft wide but usually kept much smaller with a hard pruning after flowering. Yellow fall flowers.

Caricature Plant. Graptophylium Pictum. Foliage plant with glossy foliage with pink and brown tones. Best in a pot. Temperature sensitive to frost.

Clusias. Clusia rosea and guitifera. Easy to grow shrubs that can be pruned to a shrub or small tree.

Cocopium. Chryosalanus icaco. Easy native used as a hedge or as a specimen. It produces plum colored fruit. Shiny leaves.

Copper plants. Acalypha. Numerous varieties. Outstanding varieties include "Inferno" (4-5 tt) and "Fire Dragon". (8tt). All can be trimmed lower. The chenille plant is included in this group.

Crown of Thorns. Euporbia milli. Slow growing but year round blooming in a variety of colors. Dought resistent and evergreen. New Thai cultivars are a vast inprovement over older varieties. 2ft.

Devil's Backbone, Zigzag or Jacob's Ladder. Euphorbia tithymaloides. Foliage plant with zig zag stems and pink flowers.

Dwarf Bottlebrush. Callistemon "Little John". A superior selection of bottlebrush staying 2-3 ft with on going red flowers.

Dwarf Powderpuff. Calliandra emarginata. 4ft plants bloom in red puffs all year. Other varieties grow into much larger shrubs with red or pink blooms. Large varieties can be trained to be a small tree.

Dwarf Yellow/White Mussaenda. Mussaenda flava . 4 ft tall by 6ft wide. White bracts and tiny yellow flowers that bloom year around. Especially effective against a green background. No known pests. Does well in a pot.

False Aralia. Scheffiera elegantissima. False aralia features lacy foliage and a tropical look. Keep 5 to 8 ft.

Fire Bush. Hamelia patens. Native. Small tubular flowers of red/orange color which blooms heaviest in summer. Beloved by butterflies.

Firecracker. Russelia equisetiformia. Small shrubs with fine foliage and tubular red to coral flowers atractive to butterflies and humminbirds. Best in full sun.

Firespikes. Odontonema calilstachyum. (Pink and Purple). Odontonema strictum. (Red). 6 ft tall and 4 ft wide. Can be maintained 4 ft high. Attractive spikes of pink or purple bloom all winter long. The red variety tends to bloom from late spring to fall. No major problems. Very easy to grow. Beloved by butterflies and hummingbirds.

Gardenia varieties. Many varieties of very fragrant flowers too numerous to list.

Gold Mound Duranta or Dewdrop. Duranta repens. Yellow to golden foliage and blue flowers characterize this plants. Very showy accent plant or hedge.

ixoras. Many varieties with the petite ones preferred for planting in our community. Very good pot plant. Likes moist soil. Orange, pale yellow and pinkish bloomers.

Jam Lilac. Cornutia grandiflora. 8 ft tall and 12 ft wide but can be maintained smaller. Unrelated to northern iliacs. Large upright protuding lavender flowers come in flushes through out the year but heaviest in summer through fail. Flowers not fragrant.

Jasmines. Cape Jasmine. Tabernaemontana divaricate. Fagrant double write flowers in spring and summer. 8 ft. Downy Jasmine. Jasminum multiflorum. Downy is a fluffy shrub with bright white blooms on and off all year. Can be kept to 3 ft high. Cestrum varieties including day and night blooming. Cestrum Diurnum and Noctumum. Very fragrant pale yellow to white flowers.

Jatropha varieties. Jatropha integerrima. Dwarf, shrub and tree form varieties are available in red, coral, pink and with variegated follage. Butterfly friendly nectar plants.

Kings Mantie. Thunbergia erecta. 3 ft tall and 3 wide. Blue blooms with a yellow eye which flowers for many months.

Indian Hawthorn. Low growing plants with shiny teaves with either white or pink flowers. Good groundcover.

Lipstick tree, Annato. Bixa oreliana. Pink flowers followed by dramatic red seed pods.

Lorepetalum. Burgundy foliage (which turns green as the plant grows) and pink strap-like flowers cover the arching tollage in spring. Dwarf to larger varities available.

Mexican Petunia. Ruellia. An aggressive but very pretty plant with blue, pink or white flowers. 1-4 ft depending on variety. Best in a pot.

Musical Note. Clerodenrum Incisum. Large showy white blooms resembling musical notes and producing flowers year around.

Mussaenda. Mussaenda phillippica. Maintain at 6-8 ft. Large salmon, pink, white or red blooms all summer. Can be bare in cold winter. No known pests. Also available in light pink, white and red.

Nandina. Nandina Domestica. Sometimes called "Heavenly Bamboo". Not a bamboo but a fine textured shrub resembling bamboo. Red leaves in winter. 2-6 ft depending on varieties.

Oleander. Very large shrubs with continous blooms of red, pink or variations of white. Subject to leaf eating caterpillers in summer. Dwarf varieties available. Natural products such as BT will stop an infestation.

Orange Bird of Paradise. Strelitizia reginae. A very popular tropical accent plant with graygreen leaves and flowers said to resemble a bird in flight. Best in a pot as this plant can root deeply and spread fast.

Pagota Flower. Clerodendrum Paniculatum. Very showy targe shrub with orange flowers off and on year around.

Panama Rose. Rondeletia leucophylla. 4-5 feet high by 3 ft wide. Can be maintained lower. Heavy pink blooms all winter long. Resembles a penta. No known pests or diseases. A superior plant.

Philippine violet. Berleria cristata. Dwarf shrub with purple trumpet shaped flowers predominately in the fall. 3 ft. Other Berlerias in pink and yellow.

Pittisporum. Pittisosporum tobira 'Variegata'. Slower growth and variegation make this shrub a good choice for those who want low maintenance. Best in group plantings. Keep between 3 to 5 ft.

Plumbago. Plumbago auriculata. Blue and white flowers somewhat resembling phiox that bloom all year. No longer planted in our community but does well in pots.

Podacarpus. Podocarpus macrophyllus. A very low maintenance plant of line, soft, texture somewhat resembling a yew in the north. Sun or shade. Growth is mostly vertical. A dwarf cultivar is available. Often used as a hedge plant.

Privet. Ligustrums. A group of shrubs used for accent, hedges and small trees. The gold tip variety (Ligustrum japonicum 'Howardii') features bright yellow new growth. A variegated variety (Ligustrum sinense 'Variegatum) sports white/green small leaves and tends to weep. All privets bloom in spring with white flowers if not sheared before bloom.

Sanchezia or Fire Fingers. Very oranamental striped yellow/green toliage and orange flowers.

Snow Bush. Breynia Disticha. Variegated foliage with white, green and red/pink coloration. 4-6 ft.

Snowliake. Euphorbia Leucocephala. Fragrant showy white bracts blooming around the holidays. Beloved by butterfiles, 4tt.

Stromanthe. Stromathe amabilis. A very attractive foliage plant resembling a ginger with green/pink/creme variegation. Best in shade or morning sun. 2ft.

Song of India Dracaena. Dracaena Reflexa. 6 ft high by 4 ft wide but usually maintained much smaller. An easy to grow variegated plant. Sets off dark green plants. Non flowering. No known pests or diseases.

Texas Sage. Leucophyllium frutescens. Texas sage is an outstanding landscape choice with its silvery foliage, purple flowers and drought tolerant nature.

Thriallis. Galphimia gracillis. Popular landscape shrub for hedging or specimen use. Yellow flowers from late spring through fall.

Ti plants. Cordyline fructicosa. 2 -6 ft tall and 2-3 ft wide. Foliage plants happiest in morning sun except "Black Magic" which can tolerate more sun. Maintain at desired height. Snaits, aphids and mealy bugs are common pests but easily controlled.

Tibouchina Shrub. Tibochina multiflora Both compact and large shrub sizes available. Large shrub can grown to 10 ft and compact stay around 3 ft. Beautiful purple flowers in winter. Dwarf variety (Tibochina lepidota 'Jules Dwarf') reportly not as long lived.

Tropical Hydrangea. Dombeya varieties. Large clusters of pink flowers or hydrangea- like balls are displayed most of the winter depending on warm days. 10-15 ft but can be kept smaller. "Seminole" is a superior variety.

Variegated Taploca. Manihot esculenta varigata. A stunning foliage plant of rapid growth. Good pot plant. Can grow to 10 ft in ground.

Yellow Elder. Tecoma stans. Beautiful shrub with golden yellow trumpet-like flowers which are everblooming. The variety "Lydia" is a superior plant that stays dwarf and is sterile. It is more lemon yellow. A hybrid variety 'Orange Bells' (Tecoma X smilhli) is available.

Yesterday-Today-Tomorrow. Brunfelsia Grandiflora. Showy flowers change color from purple through lavender to white. 6 it.

White Candles. Whitefeldia elogata. Shiny green follage with white blooms year round. Best in the shade. A superior plant

4. Perennials:

African Iris. Dietes. White or yellow flowers off and on thoughout the year.

African Lily. Agapapanthus. Summer blooming in shades of blue and white. Stap-like foliage.

Agaves. Succulent plants grown for their form. Most flower infrequently.

Alpinias, Costus and Zingibers. Group of deciduous and non deciduous plants. See plant reference web sites (above) for more information. Popular variety: Shell ginger. Yellow/ green long leaves with white flowers. Prefers part sun to shaded spaces. 3-5 ft.

Aphelandras. Yellow to pinks shrubs. 4-6 ft. bloom off and on. Very showy.

Blue Daze. Evolvulus glomeratus. 8 to 10 inches with bright blue flowers.

Bromeliads. Many choices for sun or shade frequently with dramatic blooms and foliage. Can be used as a ground cover.

Bulbine. Bulbine frutescens. Very drought tolerant. Full to partial sun. Orange or yellow flowers blooming year round. 2 ft.

Bush Dalsy. Euryop pectinatus. Likes full to part sun and a regular "hairout". Keep about 2 tt tall. Yellow flowers.

Buttercup. Some varieties grow bushy and best kept at 2 ft. Others like the white variety stay low and can be used as a ground cover. Full to part sun.

Calathea. Many varieties of spectacular shade loving foliage plants

Cat's Whiskers. Orthosiphon aristatus. Wispy blooms in lavender or white that attact butterfiles. Part to full sun. Keep at 2 ft.

Crossandra. Crossandra undillolla. Bright orange to yellow/orange flowers year around.

Candy Corn Plant. Cuphea melvilla. Great hummingbird and butterfly attractor. Shear to maintain. Yellow and red flowers throughout the year.

Crossandra. Crossandra undilfolia. Bright orange to yellow/orange flowers year around.

Desert Rose. Adenium obesum. Slow growing succulents with flowers similar to plumeria. Many choices including hybrids.

Gaura. Gaura IIndheimeri. Sometimes call "whirting butterlies" as the blooms in pink or white top the foliage. 2 ft.

Ground Orchids. Spathoglottis plicata. Pink to purple summer blooming flowers primarily in the warm season. Shade loving.

Heliconias. Many dwarf and larger growing choices. Some flower in the warm season and some in winter.

Justicas. Also called Plume flower. Also Jacobina. Spectacular pink, yellow or orange plumes cover the top of the plant. Bloom times vary by variety. Hummingbird and butterily attractors.

Lantana. Lantana. Comes in a rainbow of colors and likes full to part sun. Butterfly magnent. Keep bushy varieties cut back.

Lions Ears. Leonotis leonurrus. Everblooming orange flowers attractive to butterflies.

Mexican heather. Cuphea hyssoplicilia. Lavender blooms year around. 1ft.

Milkweed. Asclepias curassavia. Tropical milkweed. Butterfly attractor. Blooms heaviest in late spring through summer in yellow/red colors. Some blooms all year.

Mona Lavender. Plectranthus. Evergreen perennial with dark green follage and lavender flowers off and on.

Persian Shield. Strobilanthes dyerianus. Beautiful purple foliage plant.

Pentas. Penta lanceolata. 2-3 ft plants attracting butterfiles and hummingbirds. Pink, lavender, white and red blooms. Keep trimmed as plants tend to lose lower leaves.

Porterweed. Stachytarpheta unticifolia (blue). Stachytarpheta speciosa (pink). 3 ft tall and 2 ft wide. A native blooming in blue or pink all year. Needs trimming to look manicured. Butterfly magnet.

Reed Ground Orchid. Epidendrum. Orange and pink. Varied heights in this group.

Salvias. Several varieties are perennials. Too numerous to list.

Sedums. Succulent plants frequently used as groundcovers with many blooms colors according to the variety. Very easy care.

Shrimp plant. Pachystachys lutea. Unique golden flower bracts and white biossoms for sun or part sun.

Vinca. Catharanthus roseus. Sometimes call "Periwinkle". Its drought tolerant and likes full to part sun. Various colors.

5. Vines. Most tropical vines are of an aggressive growth nature and best grown in a large pot with a treflis. Most will need frequent pruning.

Allamanda. Allamanda hendersonii. Yellow trumpet blooms. Also red, pink and sunset colors are available.

Bengal Clock Vine. Thunbergia battiscombel. Slow growing, non aggressive, vine with deep blue/purple trumpet shaped blooms. Very compact. Not to be confused with Blue Sky vine a vey agressive grower for large pots only.

Bleeding Heart Vine. Clerodendrum thomsonli. Spectacular vine with white and red flowers. Best confined in a pot. Red/pink is also available.

Bougainvillea. Aggressive growers with the exception of dwarf varieties. Will need frequent pruning.

Confederate Jasmine. Trachelospermum jasminoides. White blossom is spring and sporadically throughout the year. Moderate grower.

Carolina Jasmine. Gelsemium jessamine. Yellow fragrant blooms in winter through spring. Easier to control than other tropical vines like bougainvillea.

Garlic Vine. Mansoa alliacea. Spectacular semi-woody vine. Deep lavender blooms with a white throat lade to a light lavender. Three colors seen at once. Attaches itself to support. Only crushed leaves smell like garlic but is not a true garlic.

Jasmine. Fragrant white to yellow varieties including 'French perfume' (Jasminum officinale grandiflorum).

Mandevilla. Mandevilla spp and Dipladenia. Variety of colors in the red/pink/white spectrum. Warm season blooming. Dipladenias are more compact and bushy relatives.

6. Ground Covers. Many shrubs can be pruned to use as ground covers such as Carrisa, Dwarf allamanda, Firecracker plant, Indian hawthorn, Philodendron 'Xanadu' among many others. Other plants are naturally low growing.

Asiatic Jasmine. Trachelospermum asiaticum. Tough green or variegated foliage plant that requires on going maintenance. A good choice for the undersides of trees where grass won't grow. Slow growth at first then more moderate.

Baby Sun Rose. Aptenia cordifolia. One of the best groundcovers for hot sun. Green or variegated green succulant leaves and rose to yellow flowers. Maintains at approximately 6 inches.

Dwarf Chenille. Acalpha pendula. Flowering in rose tones in any light conditions. Very showy. Stays low.

Dwarf Clusia. Clusia Rosea 'Nana". Small leathery leaves ona compact rounded plant. Pink flowers. Low maintenance. A superior plant.

Owarf Mexican Petunia. AKA Dwarf Ruellia. Ruellia brittoniana. White, pink and violet flowers year round on one foot plants. Not as aggressive as the larger variety.

Flax Lily. Dianella tasmanica. Foliage resembles a variegated iris and is an alterative to astec grass. Grows in sun or part sun. A good choice for fronting dark green plants. Blue flowers are insignificant.

Foxtail Fern. Asperagus densifiorus 'Meyers". A hardy plant. Amazingly tough despite its delicate looks. Grows about 2 ft tall in sun or shade. Very little horozontal growth.

Green Island Ficus., Unlike other ficus this is a very low maintenance plant that creeps along the ground. Very slow growing keeps pruning to a minimum. Shiny green leaves and small fruit appealing to birds.

7. Palms. Note: Areca Palms are strictly forbiden to plant in the ground in VW. Pot only.

Christmas Palm. Velichia merrilli. An easy care, self cleaning palm somewhat resembling a royal palm with smooth bark. Growing slowly to 15 ft.

Bamboo Palm. Chamaedorea. A palm with the look of bamboo. Reaching no more than 7 ft. They make a good house plant or can be planted outside under the shade of a tree.

Cat Palm. Chamaedorea cataractarum. Cat palm has similar foliage to an areca palm but stays 6-8 ft. It is slower in growth and will tolerate all light conditions. These palms need regular waterings. This palm does not grow from a cental trunk but rather a clumping group of stems. Good privacy plant.

Pygmy Date Palm. Phoenix roebelenii. Very popular accent plant. Grows slowly to 12 ft. Has thoms and needs trimming. Usually seen with multiple trunks.

Lady Palm. Rhapis excelsa. A graceful palm that grows on mutiple thin trunks. Dark green strap-like foliage characterize this slow grower. Prefers shade to morning sun. Good Lenai plant in a pot.

Silver Saw Palmetto. Serence repends. Relative to the common native. Silver foliage. Warning: leaf stems are sharp and saw like. Good accent plant growing slowly to 3 to 6 ft.

Prohibited Invasive Exotic Plants of Unincorporated Lee County

The following highly invasive exotic plants may not be planted and must be removed from common landscapes in unincorporated areas of Lee County. Their removal is by order of the land development code section 10-420. It does not apply to single family residential lots. Methods to remove and control invasive exotic plants must be included on the development order plans. A statement must also be included on the development order that the development area will be maintained free from invasive plants in perpetuity.
