CHAPTER I

LEGAL FRAMEWORK

CHAPTER 1

LEGAL FRAMEWORK

1. POLICY AND LAWS CONCERNING CITES IN INDIA

International trade in all wild fauna and flora in general, and the species covered under CITES in particular, is regulated jointly through the provisions of the Wildlife (Protection) Act 1972, the Foreign Trade (Development Regulation) Act 1992, the Foreign Trade Policy of Government of India and Customs Act, 1962. The Director of Wildlife Preservation, Government of India is the Management Authority for CITES in India.

1.1 Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972

Hunting of wild animals has been prohibited under Sec. 9 of the Wildlife (P) Act, 1972. No person is allowed to hunt any wild animal specified in Schedule I, II, III and IV except as provided under sections 11 and 12 of the Act. The Act also prohibits under section 17A, the collection or the trade in specified plants (whether alive or dead or part or derivative) i.e. those listed in Schedule VI of the Act, from any forest land and any area specified by notification by the Central Government. The Schedule VI of the Act lists all the six plants of Indian origin included in CITES appendices. Trade in Scheduled animals / animal article i.e. animals/animal articles covered under Schedule I and Part II of Schedule II which also include some invertebrate such as insects, corals, molluscs and sea cucumber are prohibited under the said Act. Similarly, the Act disallows trade in all kinds of imported ivory, including that of African elephant. Export or import of wild animals and their parts and products is, however, allowed for the purpose of scientific research and exchange of animals between Zoos and is subject to licensing by the Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), Government of India. The Act has been amended in 2006 leading to the establishment of the National Tiger Conservation Authority and the Wild Life Crime Control Bureau (WCCB) with a statutory backing.

1.2 Foreign trade (Development and Regulation) Act 1992

This Act replaces the earlier Imports and Exports (Control) Act, 1947. The Foreign Trade Policy incorporating the export and import policy is formulated and announced by the Central Govt. under section 5 of this Act. As per section 8 (1) no export or import shall be made except in accordance with the provisions of this Act, the rules and orders made there under. As per section 3(1) the Central Govt. makes provisions for the development and regulation of foreign trade by facilitating imports and exports. As per section 3(2) the Central Govt. may also by order published in the official gazette, make provision for prohibiting, restricting or otherwise regulating in all cases or in specified classes of cases and subject to such exceptions, if any, as may be made by or under the order the import or export of goods. As per section 3(3) all goods to which any order under subsection (2) applies shall be deemed to be goods the import or export of which has been prohibited under section 11 of the Customs Act, 1962 and all the provisions of that Act shall have effect accordingly.

1.3 Foreign Trade Policy (2009-2014)

Foreign Trade Policy announced periodically by the Ministry of Commerce contains, inter alia, information regarding the wildlife and wildlife products which are either prohibited or permitted for the purpose of import or export. It also contains the conditions (which include compliance with CITES) governing import and export of permissible species of wildlife and wildlife products. The policy is decided in consultation with the Management Authority for CITES in India as far as matter relating to wild fauna and flora are concerned and is enforced through the Customs Act, 1962. The Foreign Trade Policy is brought out under the provisions of the Foreign Trade (Development & Regulation) Act 1992 and it regulates the import and export of all goods including wildlife. 1.3.1 Import policy

Import of animals and their parts and products for zoological parks and circuses or for research purpose may be permitted subject to the provisions of CITES and on recommendations of the Chief Wildlife Warden of the States and Union Territories under license from DGFT. Import of plants is also subject to the provisions of CITES. The current policy does not permit commercial import of African ivory in view of the ban imposed by CITES. Import of other derivatives of wildlife is restricted and can be made only with prior permission of DGFT, subject to the conditions prescribed. Import of wild animals as pets in the personal baggage of a passenger is also subject to the provisions of CITES in accordance with the Ministry of Commerce's Public Notice No. 27ITC (PN) 180. dated 15.7.80.

1.3.2 Export Policy

The Export Policy permits re-export of commodities except to the extent such exports are regulated by any other provisions of this Policy or any other law for the time being in force. Items prohibited for export are not permitted to be carried in the personal baggage also. Extracts of the Policy and ITC (HS) classification have been reproduced in Chapter II & III respectively of this report. It is worth mentioning that all forms of wildlife including their parts and products are prohibited for export except in cases where it is specifically allowed under different parts of ITC (HS) classification of Export & Import items. Peacock tail feathers which were earlier allowed for Export under a limited ceiling are now prohibited for export. Export of exotic birds except 6 species listed under Table 'B' of Schedule 2 is also prohibited at present. Further the Ministry of Commerce vide public notice no. 47 (PN) 92-97 dt. 30-3-94 had prohibited the exports of a number of plants, plant portions and their derivatives if obtained, from wild. This list has been amended from time to time, A list of 29 prohibited plant taxa is given in Chapter III.

1.3.3 Special Conditions for Import & Export

All imports and exports of wild animals and plants are permitted only through the Customs points at Mumbai, Kolkata, Delhi, Chennai, Cochin, Amritsar and Tuticorin. Two essential conditions governing the import and export of Wildlife and the derivatives are,

1. Compliance with the provisions of CITES.
2. Inspection of the consignments by the Regional Deputy Directors of Wildlife Preservation at the Customs points. In case of items covered under CITES, an endorsement is made on the relevant CITES export permit.

1.4. Customs Act, 1962

Section 3(3) of the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulation) Act 1992 provides that all items (including wild Fauna & Flora) covered in the Import & Export policy will be deemed to be covered under Section 11 of the Customs Act, 1962. As a consequence, all cases of violation of the Import-Export Policy in general and CITES in particular, constitute an offence under the Customs Act and are dealt with by the Customs officials.

2. QUARANTINE REGULATIONS

The Livestock importation Act 1898 empowers the Central Government to regulate, restrict or prohibit the import into India or any specified place therein, of any livestock which may be liable to be affected by infectious or contagious disorders. The Central Government has notified poultry, parrots, pigeons, canaries and finches as livestock for the purpose of the said Act. The Foreign Trade (Development and Regulations) Act 1992 also empowers the Central Government to regulate import and export of birds and animals with a view to control the spread of communicable diseases. The Ministry of Agriculture has appointed Animal Quarantine officers at Delhi, Mumbai Chennai and Kolkata to verify the health of animals and birds before export and after import and to issue Quarantine Clearance Certificates. The Animal Quarantine Officer may, if needed, cause for the detention of any animal or bird to be imported at a quarantine station for observation and prevent the entry of such birds and animals as are diseased. The import of plants is also regulated under the provisions of the Destructive Insects and Pests Act, 1914 and the notifications issued there under i.e. the Plant Quarantine (Regulation of Import into India) Order 2003. All imported plant consignments should be accompanied by :

1. The import permit issued by the Issuing Authority is listed in schedule X of the Plant Quarantine (Regulation of Import into India) Order-2003 for the Jurisdiction specified.
2. The official Phyto-Sanitary Certificate from the country of origin with an additional declaration, wherever specified. All imported materials are inspected and, if necessary, fumigated or otherwise disinfected at the port of entry by the Plant Quarantine Officer.

As per section 3(14) of the aforesaid order, all consignment of seeds and plants for propagation and regulated articles such as live insects, microbial cultures, bio-control agents and soil shall only be imported into India through regional plant quarantine stations of Amritsar, Chennai, Kolkata, Mumbai or New Delhi or through any other points of entry as may be notified from time to time for this purpose, provided that no import of germplasm/transgenic plant material and genetically modified organisms shall be permitted through New Delhi Airport.

As per section 6(1) No consignment of germplasm/transgenics/Genetically Modified Organisms(GMOs) shall be imported into India for research/experimental purpose without valid permit issued by the Director, National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources, New Delhi-110012.

3. MANAGEMENT AUTHORITIES-CITES:

India is a signatory to CITES since 1976. The Additional Director General (Wildlife) cum Director, Wildlife Preservation, MoEF, Govt. of India is the Management Authority, CITES in India. There are 4 functional Assistant Management Authorities (AMA-CITES) working on behalf of MA-CITES at Delhi, Kolkata, Chennai and Mumbai.

3.1 Scientific Authorities

Following are the Scientific Authorities to deal with the CITES related matter in the country.

1. Director, Zoological Survey of India, Kolkata (West Bengal)
2. Director, Botanical Survey of India, Kolkata (West Bengal)
3. Director, Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute, Cochin (Kerala)
4. Director, Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun (Uttarakhand)
5. Director, Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding (IFGTB), Coimbatore.

3.2 ENFORCEMENT

- 3.2.1 Considering the seriousness of organised Wildlife Crime having the inter-state and International ramification and illegal trade of Wildlife parts and products, the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau was created in 2007 under the provisions of the Wildlife Protection Act 1972. The Wildlife Crime Control Bureau, Head Quarter is situated at New Delhi and erstwhile Regional Wildlife Preservation offices have been designated as regional Wildlife Crime Control Bureau offices. These offices are located at New Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai and Chennai. In addition there is a Wildlife Crime Control Bureau Office in Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. The Bureau is a multidisciplinary organisation with the following mandate given under 38 Z of the Wildlife Protection Act. Wildlife Crime Control Bureau is designated nodal agency for CITES related enforcement.

38Z: Powers and functions of the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau- (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau shall take measures with respect to –

- (i) Collect and collate intelligence related to organized wildlife crime activities and to disseminate the same to State and other enforcement agencies for immediate action so as to apprehend the criminals and to establish a centralized wildlife crime databank;
- (ii) Co-ordination of actions by various officers, State Governments and other authorities in connection with the enforcement of the provisions of this Act, either or through regional and border units set up by the Bureau;
- (iii) Implementation of obligations under the various International Conventions and protocols that are in force at present or which may be ratified or acceded to by India in future;
- (iv) Assistance to concerned authorities in foreign countries and concerned International organizations to facilitate co-ordination and universal action for wildlife crime control;
- (v) Develop infrastructure and capacity building for scientific and professional investigation into wildlife crimes and assists State Government to ensure success in prosecutions related to wildlife crimes;
- (vi) Advise the Government of India on issues relating to wildlife crimes having national and international ramifications, and suggest changes required in relevant policies and laws from time to time;

(2) The Wildlife Crime Control Bureau shall exercise –

- (i) Such powers as may be delegated to it under sub-section (1) of section 5, sub-section (1) & (8) of section 50 and section 55 of this Act ; and
- (ii) Such other powers as may be prescribed.

- 3.2.2 The enforcement of CITES provisions is presently being carried out by the Customs officials and Regional Deputy Directors, Wildlife Crime Control Bureau through the Customs Act, 1962 at the point of Import/Export and by the State Wildlife Departments headed by Chief Wildlife Wardens under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 elsewhere. The Chief Wildlife Wardens also issue licences to the dealers and manufacturers of wildlife items and legal procurement certificate to the exporters of wild fauna and flora to establish the legality of the consignment in question. The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI), the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), the Police, the State Forest Departments and various other Central/State agencies also provide assistance in controlling illegal trade in wildlife.

CHAPTER - 2
GENERAL PROVISIONS REGARDING IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

2.1 Exports and Imports free unless regulated

Exports and Imports shall be free, except where regulated by FTP or any other law in force. The item wise export and import policy shall be, as specified in ITC (HS) notified by Director General of Foreign Trade, as amended from time to time.

2.2 Compliance with Laws

Every exporter or importer shall comply with the provisions of the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulation) Act, 1992, the Rules and Orders made there under, the FTP and the terms and conditions of any Authorisation granted to him. All imported goods shall also be subject to domestic Laws, Rules, Orders, Regulations, technical specifications, environmental and safety norms as applicable to domestically produced goods. No import or export of rough diamonds shall be permitted unless accompanied by Kimberley Process (KP) Certificate as specified by the Gem & Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC).

2.3 Interpretation of Policy

If any question or doubt arises in respect of interpretation of any provision contained in FTP, or classification of any item in ITC (HS) or HBP-v1 or HBP-v2 or Schedule of DEPB Rates (including content, scope or issue of an authorization there under), said question or doubt shall be referred to DGFT whose decision thereon shall be final and binding.

2.4 Procedure

DGFT may, specify procedure to be followed for an exporter or importer or by any licensing or any other competent authority for purpose of implementing provisions of FT (D&R) Act, the Rules and the Orders made there under and FTP. Such procedures shall be published by means of Public Notice, and may, in like manner, be amended from time to time.

2.6 Principles of Restriction

DGFT may, through a notification, adopt and enforce any measure necessary for :

- i. Protection of public morals.
- ii. Protection of human, animal or plant life or health.
- iii. Protection of patents, trademarks and copyrights and the prevention of deceptive practices.
- iv. Prevention of use of prison labour.
- v. Protection of national treasures of artistic, historic or archaeological value.
- vi. Conservation of exhaustible natural resources.
- vii. Protection of trade of fissionable material or material from which they are derived; and
- viii. Prevention of traffic in arms, ammunition and implements of war.

2.7 Restricted Goods

Any goods the export or import of which is restricted under ITC (HS) may be exported or imported only in accordance with an Authorisation or in terms of a public notice issued in this regard.

2.8 Terms and Conditions of Licence/Certificate/Permission/Authorisation

Every Authorisation shall be valid for prescribed period of validity and shall contain such terms and conditions as may be specified by RA which may include :

- a. The quantity, description and value of the goods ;
- b. Actual User condition ;
- c. Export obligation ;
- d. The value addition to be achieved ; and
- e. The minimum export/import price.

2.14 Transit Facility

Transit of goods through India from or to countries adjacent to India shall be regulated in accordance with the bilateral treaties between India and those countries and will be subject to such restrictions as may be specified by DGFT in accordance with International Conventions.

2.18 Import of samples

Import of samples shall be governed by the provisions given in Handbook (Vol. 1).

2.19 Import of Gifts

Import of gifts shall be permitted where such goods are otherwise freely importable under this Policy. In other cases, a Customs Clearance Permit (CCP) shall be required from DGFT.

2.20 Passenger Baggage

Bonafied household goods and personal effects may be imported as part of passenger baggage as per the limits, terms and conditions thereof in the baggage rules notified by the Ministry of Finance.

Samples of such items that are otherwise freely importable under this Policy may also be imported as part of Passenger baggage without an Authorisation. Exporters coming from abroad are also allowed to Import drawings, patterns, labels, price tags, buttons, belts, trimming, and embellishments required for export, as part of their passenger baggage without an Authorisation.

2.23 Import of goods used in projects abroad

After completion of the projects abroad, project contractors may Import, without an Authorisation used goods including capital goods provided they have been used for at least one year.

2.24 Sale on high seas

Sale of goods on high seas for import into India may be made subject to FTP or any other law in force.

2.26 Clearance of goods from Customs

Goods already imported/shipped/arrived, in advance, but not cleared from customs may also be cleared against an authorisation issued subsequently.

2.29 Free Exports

All goods may be exported without any restriction except to the extent that such exports are regulated by ITC (HS) or any other provision of FTP or any other law for the time being in force. The Director General of Foreign Trade may, however, specify through a Public Notice such terms and conditions according to which any goods, not included in the ITC (HS), may be exported without an Authorisation.

2.30 Export of Samples

Export of samples and Free of charge goods shall be governed by the provisions given in Handbook (Vol. 1).

2.31 Export of Passenger Baggage

Bonafide personal baggage may be exported either along with the passenger or, if unaccompanied, within one year before or after the passenger's departure from India. However, items mentioned as restricted in ITC (HS) shall require an Authorisation. Government of India officials proceeding abroad on official postings shall, however, be permitted to carry alongwith their personal baggage, food items (free, restricted or prohibited) strictly for their personal consumption.

Samples of such items that are otherwise freely exportable under FTP may also be exported as part of passenger baggage without an Authorisation.

2.32 Exports of Gifts

Goods including edible items, of value not exceeding Rs. 5,00,000/- in licensing year, may be exported as a gift. However, items mentioned as restricted for exports in ITC (HS) shall not be exported as a gift, without an Authorisation.

2.35 Export of Imported Goods

Goods imported, in accordance with FTP, may be exported in the same or substantially the same form without an Authorisation provided that the item to be imported or exported is not restricted for import or export in ITC (HS). Exports of such goods imported against payment in freely convertible currency would be permitted against payment in freely convertible currency.

2.36 Goods, including those mentioned as restricted item for import (except prohibited items) may be imported under Customs Bond for export in freely convertible currency without an Authorisation, provided that the item is freely exportable without any conditionality / requirement of licence / permission as may be required under ITC (HS) Schedule II.

2.36A Hides, Skins and semi finished leather may be imported in the Public Bonded warehouse for the purpose of DTA sale and the unsold items thereof can be re-exported from such bonded warehouses at 50% of the applicable export duty. However, this facility shall not be allowed for import under private bonded warehouse.

CHAPTER - 4

4.1.3 Advance Authorisation

An Advance Authorisation is issued to allow duty free import of inputs, which are physically incorporated in export product (making normal allowance for wastage). In addition, fuel, oil, energy, catalyst which are consumed/ utilised to obtain export product, may also be allowed. DGFT,, by names of Public Notice, may exclude any product(s) from purview of advance Authorisation

4.1.13

Prohibited items of imports mentioned in ITC (HS) shall not be imported under Advance Authorisation/ DFIA. However

Similarly prohibited items of export mentioned in ITC (HC) shall not be exported under Advance Authorisation / DFIA scheme.Export of restricted items shall be subject to all conditionalities or requirements of export Authorisation or permission, as may be required, under Schedule II of ITC (HC).

CHAPTER - 9

DEFINITIONS

- 9.1 For the purpose of FTP, unless the context otherwise requires, the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings attached to them.
- 9.2 "Accessory" or "Attachement" means a part, sub-assembly or assembly that contributes to the efficiency or effectiveness of a piece of equipment without changing its basic functions.
- 9.3 "Act" means the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulation) Act, 1992 (No. 22 of 1992).

- 9.4 “Actual User” means and actual user who may be either industrial or non-industrial.
- 9.5 “Actual User {Industrial}” means a person who utilizes the imported goods for manufacturing in his own industrial unit or manufacturing for his own use in another unit including a jobbing unit.
- 9.6 “Actual User {Non-Industrial}” means a person who utilizes the imported goods for his own use in
- i. any commercial establishment carrying on any business, trade or profession; or
 - ii. any laboratory, Scientific or Research and Development (R&D) institution, university or other education institution or hospital; or
 - iii. any service industry.
- 9.9.1 “Authorisation” means a permission as included in Section 2 (g) of FT (D&R) Act to import or export as per provisions of FTP.
- 9.11 “BTP” means Biotechnology Park as notified by DGFT on recommendation of Department of Biotechnology.
- 9.21 “Domestic Tariff Area (DTA)” means area within India which is outside SEZ and EOU/EHTP/STP/BTP.
- 9.26 “Exporter” means a person who exports or intends to export and holds an Importer-Exporter Code number unless otherwise specifically exempted.
- 9.27 “Export Obligation” means the obligation to export the product or products covered by the authorisation or permission in terms of quantity, value or both, as may be prescribed or specified by the licensing or competent authority.
- 9.27.1 “FTP” means the Foreign Trade Policy which specifies policy for exports & imports under Section 5 of the Act.
- 9.29 “HBT v I” & “Handbook” (Vol. 1)” means the Handbook of Procedures (Vol. 1) and “Handbook (Vol. 2)” means Handbook of Procedures (Vol. 2) published under the provision of the paragraph 2.4 of the Policy.
- 9.30 “Importer” means a person who imports or intends to import and holds an Importer-Exporter Code number unless otherwise specifically exempted.
- 9.32 “ITC (HS)” means ITC (HS) Classification of Export and Import Items Book.
- 9.34 “Licensing Authority” means the authority competent to grant an authorisation under the Act/Order.
- 9.35 “Licensing Year” means the period beginning on the 1st April of a year and ending on the 31st March of the following year.
- 9.37 “Manufacture” means to make, produce, fabricate, assemble, process or bring into existence, by hand or by machine, a new product having a distinctive name, character or use and shall include processes such as refrigeration, re-packing, polishing, labeling Reconditioning repair, remaking, refurbishing, testing calibration, re-engineering. Manufacture, for the purpose of FTP, shall also include agriculture, aquaculture, animal husbandry, floriculture, horticulture, pisciculture, poultry, sericulture, viticulture and mining.
- 9.38 “Manufacturer Exporter” means a person who export goods manufactured by him or intends to export such goods.
- 9.40 “Merchant Exporter” means a person engaged in trading activity and exporting or intending to export goods.
- 9.42 “Notification” means a notification published in the Official Gazette.
- 9.43 “Order” means an order made by the Central Government under the Act.
- 9.45 “Person” includes an individual, firm, society, company, corporation or any other legal person including the DGFT officials.
- 9.46 “Policy” means the Foreign Trade Policy 2009-14 as amended from time to time.

- 9.47 “Prescribed” means prescribed under the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulation) Act, 1992 (No. 22 of 1992) or the Rules or Orders made there under or under this Policy.
- 9.48 “Public Notice” means a notice published under the provisions of paragraph 2.4 of the FTP.
- 9.51 “Rules” means Rules made by the Central Government under Section 19 of the Act.
- 9.58 “Specified” means specified by or under the provisions of this Policy through Notification / Public Notice.
- 9.65 “Wild Animal” means any wild animal as defined in Section 2 (36) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

Policy Conditions of this Chapter:

- (1) An application for grant of a licence for import of Animals, Birds and Reptiles (including their parts and products) may be made in the Aayat Niryat form given in ANF 2B of the Handbook of Procedures Vol. 1, to the Director General of Foreign Trade along with the recommendation of the Chief Wild Life Warden of the State concerned.
- (2) (a) An application for grant of a licence for import of Stallions and Broodmares may be made in the Aayat Niryat form given in ANF 2B of the Handbook of Procedures Vol. 1, to the Director General of Foreign Trade along with the recommendation of Director, Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services of the State Government concerned or the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India.

- (b) The import of stallions and broodmares against licences shall be subject to the following conditions:
- (i) Import of such animals shall be subject to the health regulations in force;
 - (ii) Applications shall be considered only from stud farms which have been in existence for at least three years and registered with the Animal Husbandry Commissioner, Department of Agriculture and Cooperation, Government of India. However, this period of three years may be relaxed on merits;
 - (iii) A certificate of fitness issued either by the veterinary officer or by a qualified veterinary doctor registered with the Government of the country of origin shall be furnished at the time of customs clearance.
- (3) An application for grant of a licence for import of horses for polo may be made in the form given in ANF 2B of the Handbook of Procedures Vol. 1, to the Director General of Foreign Trade.
- (4) An application for grant of a licence for Livestock (excluding equine), Pureline stocks, birds' eggs, frozen semen/ embryo, and Commercial chicks may be made in the form given in ANF 2B of the Handbook of Procedures Vol. 1, to the Director General of Foreign Trade along with the recommendation of the Department of Agriculture and Cooperation, Government of India.
- (5) Import of Live animals other than wild animals as defined under Wild Life Protection Act, 1972 is permitted against a licence to Zoos and Zoological parks, circus companies, private individuals, on the recommendation of the Chief Wild Life Warden of a State Government subject to the provisions of the Convention on Inter-national Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES). For recognized scientific/research institutions, in addition to the above requirement, recommendation of Committee for the purpose of Control and Supervision of Experiments on Animals (CPCSEA) under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 shall also be required for issuance of Import licence.
- (6) Import of Wild Animals (including their parts and products) as defined in the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 is prohibited and in respect of those species listed in CITES, is subject to the provisions of CITES.

CHAPTER 4

DAIRY PRODUCE; BIRD'S EGGS; NATURAL HONEY; EDIBLE PRODUCTS OF ANIMAL ORIGIN, NOT ELSEWHERE SPECIFIED OR INCLUDED

NOTES:

1. The expression "milk" means full cream milk or partially or completely skimmed milk.
2. For the purposes of heading 0405:
 - (a) The term "butter" means natural butter, whey butter or recombined butter (fresh, salted or rancid, including canned butter) derived exclusively from milk, with a milk fat content of 80% or more but not more than 95% by weight and a maximum milk solids-not-fat content of 2% by weight and a maximum water content of 16% by weight. Butter does not contain added emulsifiers, but may contain sodium chloride, food colours, neutralising salts and cultures of harmless lactic-acid-producing bacteria.
 - (b) The expression "dairy spreads" means a spreadable emulsion of the water-in-oil type, containing milkfat as the only fat in the product, with a milkfat content of 39% or more but less than 80% by weight.
3. Products obtained by the concentration of whey and with the addition of milk or milkfat are to be classified as cheese in heading 0406 provided that they have the three following characteristics:
 - (a) A milkfat content, by weight of the dry matter, of 5% or more;
 - (b) A dry matter content, by weight, of at least 70% but not exceeding 85%; and
 - (c) They are moulded or capable of being moulded.
4. This Chapter does not cover:
 - (a) Products obtained from whey, containing by weight more than 95% lactose, expressed as anhydrous lactose calculated on the dry matter (heading 1702); or
 - (b) Albumins (including concentrates of two or more whey proteins, containing by weight more than 80% whey proteins, calculated on the dry matter) (heading 3502) or globulins (heading 3504).

SUB-HEADING NOTES:

1. For the purposes of sub-heading 0404 10, the expression "modified whey" means products consisting of whey constituents, that is, whey from which all or part of the lactose, proteins or minerals have been removed, whey to which

natural whey constituents have been added, and products obtained by mixing natural whey constituents.

2. For the purposes of sub-heading 0405 10, the term "butter" does not include dehydrated butter or ghee (sub-heading 0405 90).

SUPPLEMENTARY NOTE:

In this Chapter "Wild Animals" means wild animals as defined in Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 (53 of 1972).

CHAPTER 5

PRODUCTS OF ANIMAL ORIGIN, NOT ELSEWHERE SPECIFIED OR INCLUDED

NOTES:

1. This Chapter does not cover:
 - (a) Edible products (other than guts, bladders and stomachs of animals, whole and pieces thereof, and animal blood, liquid or dried);
 - (b) Hides or Skins (including furskins) other than goods of heading 0505 and parings and similar waste of raw hides or skins of heading 0511 (Chapter 41 or 43);
 - (c) Animal textile materials, other than horsehair and horsehair waste (Section XI); or
 - (d) Prepared knots or tufts for broom or brush making (heading 9603).

2. For the purposes of heading 0501, the sorting of hair by length (provided the root ends and tip ends respectively are not arranged together) shall be deemed not to constitute working.

3. Throughout this Schedule, elephant, hippopotamus, walrus, narwhal and wild boar tusks rhinoceros horns and the teeth of all animals are regarded as “ivory”.

4. Throughout this schedule, the expression “horsehair” means hair of the manes or tails of equine or bovine animals.

SUPPLEMENTARY NOTE:

In this Chapter, the expressions “wild animal” and “wild life” have the meanings respectively assigned to them in clauses (36) and (37) of section 2 of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 (53 of 1972); and the expression “wild bird” means any bird specified in Schedules to that Act.

Subject to the second part of heading 0601, this Chapter covers only live trees and goods (including seedling vegetables) of a kind commonly supplied by nursery gardeners or florists for planting or for ornamental use; nevertheless it does not include potatoes, onions, shallots, garlic or other products of Chapter 7.
2. Any reference in heading 0603 or 0604 to goods of any kind shall be construed as including a reference to bouquets, floral baskets, wreaths and similar articles made wholly or partly of goods of that kind, account not being taken of accessories of other materials. However, these headings do not include collages or similar decorative plaques of heading 9701.

Policy Conditions of this Chapter:

- (1) Import of seeds of vegetables, flowers, fruits and plants, tubers and bulbs of flowers, cutting, sapling, budwood etc., of flowers and fruits for sowing or planting is permitted without a licence in accordance with a permit for import granted under the Plant Quarantine (Regulation of Imports into India) Order, 2003. However, import of Poppy seeds if permitted for import under the Plants, Fruits and Seeds (Regulation of Import into India) Order, 1989 for sowing or planting shall be subject to the condition that importer shall produce a certificate from the competent authority of the country of origin that opium poppy has been grown licitly/legally in that country as per requirements of the International Narcotics Control Bureau.
- (2) Import of living plants, seeds for sowing or plant material shall be made by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Agricultural Universities, Botanical and Horticulture Departments of other Universities and State Governments, without a licence. Such import shall be subject to such conditions as may be specified by the Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India, from time to time.

CHAPTER 12

OIL SEEDS AND OLEAGINOUS FRUITS; MISCELLANEOUS GRAINS, SEEDS AND FRUIT; INDUSTRIAL OR MEDICINAL PLANTS; STRAW AND FODDER.

NOTES:

1. Heading 1207 applies, *inter alia*, to palm nuts and kernels, cotton seeds, castor oil seeds, sesamum seeds, mustard seeds, safflower seeds, poppy seeds and shea nuts (karite nuts). It does not apply to products of heading 0801 or 0802 or to olives (Chapter 07 or Chapter 20).
2. Heading 1208 applies not only to non-defatted flours and meals but also to flours and meals which have been partially defatted or defatted and wholly or partially refatted with their original oils. It does not, however, apply to residues of headings 2304 to 2306.
3. For the purposes of heading 1209, beet seeds, grass and other herbage seeds, seeds of ornamental flowers, vegetable seeds, seeds of forest trees, seeds of fruit trees, seeds of vetches (other than those of the species *Vicia faba*) or of lupines are to be regarded as “seeds of a kind used for sowing”.

Heading 1209 does not, however, apply to the following even if for sowing:

- (a) Leguminous vegetables or sweet corn (Chapter 07);
- (b) Spices or other products of Chapter 09;
- (c) Cereals (Chapter 10); or
- (d) Products of headings 1201 to 1207 or 1211.

4. Heading 1211 applies, *inter alia*, to the following plants or parts thereof: basil, borage, ginseng, hyssop, liquorice, all species of mint, rosemary, rue, sage and wormwood.

Heading 1211 does not, however, apply to:

- (a) Medicaments of Chapter 30;
- (b) Perfumery, cosmetic or toilet preparations of Chapter 33; or
- (c) Insecticides, fungicides, herbicides, disinfectants or similar products of heading 3808.

5. For the purposes of heading 1212, the term “seaweeds and other algae” does not include:
 - (a) Dead single-cell micro-organisms of heading 2102;
 - (b) Cultures of micro-organisms of heading 3002; or
 - (c) Fertilizers of heading 3101 or 3105.

SUB-HEADING NOTE:

For the purposes of sub-heading 1205 10, the expression “low erucic acid rape or colza seeds” means rape or colza seeds yielding a fixed oil which has an erucic acid content of less than 2% by weight and yielding a solid component which contains less than 30 micromoles of glucosinolates per gram.

CHAPTER 43

FURSKINS AND ARTIFICIAL FUR, MANUFACTURES THEREOF

NOTES:

1. Throughout this schedule reference to “furskins”, other than to raw furskins of heading 4301 apply to hides or skins of all animals which have been tanned or dressed with the hair or wool on.
2. This Chapter does not cover:
 - (a) Birdskins or parts of birdskins, with their feathers or down (heading 0505 or 6701);
 - (b) Raw hides or skins, with the hair or wool on, of Chapter 41 [see Note 1(c) to that Chapter];
 - (c) Gloves, mittens and mitts, consisting of leather and furskin or of leather and artificial fur (heading 4203);
 - (d) Articles of Chapter 64;
 - (e) Headgear or parts thereof of Chapter 65; or
 - (f) Articles of Chapter 95 (for example, toys, games, sports requisites).
3. Heading 4303 includes furskins and parts thereof, assembled with the addition of other materials, and furskins and parts thereof, sewn together in the form of garments or parts or accessories of garments or in the form of other articles.
4. Articles of apparel and clothing accessories (except those excluded by Note 2) lined with furskin or artificial fur or to which furskin or artificial fur is attached on the outside except as mere trimming are to be classified in heading 4303 or 4304, as the case may be.
5. Throughout this Schedule, the expression “artificial fur” means any imitation of furskin consisting of wool, hair or other fibres gummed or sewn on to leather, woven fabric or other materials, but does not include imitation furskins obtained by weaving or knitting (generally, heading 5801 or 6001).

CHAPTER 44

WOOD AND ARTICLES OF WOOD; WOOD CHARCOAL

NOTES:

1. This Chapter does not cover:
 - (a) Wood, in chips, in shavings, crushed, ground or powdered, of a kind used primarily in perfumery, in pharmacy, or for insecticidal, fungicidal or similar purposes (heading 1211);
 - (b) Bamboos or other materials of a woody nature of a kind used primarily for plaiting, in the rough, whether or not split, sawn lengthwise or cut to length (heading 1401);
 - (c) Wood, in chips, in shavings, ground or powdered, of a kind used primarily in dyeing or in tanning (heading 1404);
 - (d) Activated charcoal (heading 3802);
 - (e) Articles of heading 4202;
 - (f) Goods of Chapter 46;
 - (g) Footwear or parts thereof Chapter 64;
 - (h) Goods of Chapter 66 (for example, umbrellas and walking-sticks and parts thereof);
 - (ij) Goods of heading 6808;
 - (k) Imitation jewellery of heading 7117;
 - (l) Goods of Section XVI or Section XVII (For example, machine parts, cases, covers, cabinets for machines and apparatus and wheel wrights' wares);
 - (m) Goods of Section XVII (for example, clock cases and musical instruments and parts thereof);
 - (n) Parts of firearms (heading 9305);
 - (o) Articles of Chapter 94 (for example, furniture, lamps and lighting fittings, prefabricated buildings);
 - (p) Articles of Chapter 95 (for example, toys, games, sports requisites);
 - (q) Articles of Chapter 96 (for example, smoking pipes and parts thereof, buttons, pencils) excluding bodies and handles, of wood, for articles of heading 9603; or
 - (r) Articles of Chapter 97 (for example, works of art).

2. In this Chapter, the expression “densified wood” means wood which has been subjected to chemical or physical treatment (being, in the case of layers bonded together, treatment in excess of that needed to ensure a good bond), and which has thereby acquired increased density or hardness together with improved mechanical strength or resistance to chemical or electrical agencies.
3. Headings 4414 to 4421 apply to articles of the respective descriptions of particle board or similar board, fibreboard, laminated wood or densified wood as they apply to such articles of wood.
4. Products of heading 4410, 4411 or 4412 may be worked to form the shapes provided for in respect of the goods of heading 4409, curved, corrugated, perforated, cut or formed to shapes other than square or rectangular or submitted to any other operation provided it does not give them the character of articles of other headings
5. Heading 4417 does not apply to tools in which the blade, working edge, working surface or other working part is formed by any of the materials specified in Note 1 to Chapter 82.
6. Subject to Note 1 above and except where the context otherwise requires, any reference to “wood“ in a heading of this Chapter applies also to bamboos and other materials of a woody nature.

SUB-HEADING NOTES

1. For the purposes of subheading 4401 31, the expression “wood pellets” means by-products such as cutter shavings, sawdust or chips, of the mechanical wood processing industry, furniture-making industry or other wood transformation activities, which have been agglomerated either directly by compression or by the addition of a binder in a proportion not exceeding 3 % by weight. Such pellets are cylindrical, with a diameter not exceeding 25 mm and a length not exceeding 100 mm.
2. For the purposes of item 4403 41 00, sub-heading 4403 49, items 4407 21 00 to 4407 28 00, sub-headings 4407 29, 4408 31, 4408 39 and 4412 31 the expression “tropical Wood” means one of the following types of wood:

For the purposes of heading 4412, the expression "similar laminated wood" includes blockboard, laminboard and battenboard, in which the core is thick and composed of blocks, laths or battens of wood glued or otherwise joined together and surface with the outer plies and also panels in which the wooden core is replaced by other materials such as a layer of layers of particle board, fibre board, wood waste glued or otherwise joined together, asbestos or cork.

Policy Conditions of this Chapter:

1. The Exim entry under ITC (HS) Code No. 4416 00 10 in this Chapter shall also include used casks and barrels. Imports of all items falling in this entry shall be free.
2. Import of Sandal wood (Exim Code No. 4403 99 22) will be ‘Restricted’ and subject to a ceiling in each licensing year (*Present ceiling is 4795 MT, subject to modification, if any, to be notified from time to time*). Imports will be permitted only against an Import Authorisation issued in consultation with the Ministry of Environment and Forest (see Procedure is (I) below). The ceiling of Sandal wood for each financial year will be monitored by the Ministry of Environment and Forest to ensure that it is not exceeded. The license will be valid for a period of one year from the date of issue. No further revalidation of such authorisation shall be allowed.
 - (I) The following procedure will be followed for obtaining an Import Authorisation for Sandal wood:
 - (a) Applicant will submit the application in the Aayaat Niryaat Form 2B to the DGFT (Headquarters office), Udyog Bhawan, New Delhi – 110 011.
 - (b) The applicant will be required to declare the quantity of sandal wood and their specifications to be imported species-wise, quantity-wise and the country from which it is to be imported.
 - (c) The purpose of import must be specified. If the importer is having sandal wood based unit, it must be legally established and registered with the concerned State / UT Forest Department.
 - (d) In case the importer is a trader not having his own sandal wood based unit, the past performance and antecedents must be given for necessary verification.
 - (e) Utilisation Certificate specifying the details and necessary ‘Transit Permit’ regarding the earlier import must be specified

by the applicant, for seeking permission for import of sandal wood second time.

- (II) All import consignments of sandal wood must be accompanied with the following documents:
- (i) The 'Certificate of Origin' from the country of export; (ii) The necessary phytosanitary certificate; and
 - (iii) A certificate from the Government authorities of country of export stating that export of sandalwood is legally permitted from the concerned country.

Before clearance of the import consignment, the customs authorities are required to verify the above documents.

- (III) Applications for issuance of Import Authorisation would be considered by the Exim Facilitation Committee on merits and shall be subject to such conditions which the Committee may specify.

SCHEDULE- 2

EXPORT POLICY

General Notes to Export Policy – Goods under Restrictions

2. Free Exportability

All goods other than the entries in the export licensing schedule along with its appendices are freely exportable. The free exportability is however subject to any other law for the time being in force. Goods not listed in the Schedule are deemed to be freely exportable without conditions under the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulations) Act, 1992 and the rules, notifications and other public notices and circulars issued there under from time to time. The export licensing policy in the schedule and its appendices does not preclude control by way of a Public Notice Notification under the Foreign Trade (Development and Regulations) Act, 1992.

Goods listed as “Free” in the Export Licensing Schedule may also be exported without an export licence as such but they are subject to conditions laid out against the respective entry. The fulfillment of these conditions can be checked by authorized officers in the course of export.

2. Code does not limit the item description

The export policy of a specific item will be determined mainly by the description and nature of restriction in the schedule. The code number is illustrative of classification but does not limit the description by virtue of the standard description of the item against the code in the import part of the ITC(HS) classification.

3. Classes of Export Trade Control

A. Prohibited Goods

The prohibited items are not permitted to be exported. An export licence will not be given in the normal course for goods in the prohibited category. No export of rough diamond shall be permitted unless accompanied by Kimberly Process (KP) Certificate as specified by Gem & Jewellery EPC (GJEPC).

B. Restricted Goods

The restricted items can be permitted for export under licence. The procedures / conditionalities wherever specified against the restricted items may be required to be complied with, in addition to the general requirement of licence in all cases of restricted items.

C. State Trading Enterprises

Export through STE(s) is permitted without an Export Licence through designated STEs only as mentioned against an item and is subject to conditions in para 2.11 of Foreign Trade Policy 2009-14.

D. Restrictions on Countries of Export

- (i) Export of Arms and related material to Iraq shall be prohibited.
- (ii) Direct or indirect export of all items, materials, equipments, goods and technology which could contribute to Iran's enrichment related, reprocessing or heavy water related activities, or to development of nuclear weapon delivery systems including those listed in INFCIRC/254/Rev.9/Part 1 and INFCIRC/254/Rev.7/Part 2 (IAEA Documents) and items listed in S/2010/263 (UN Security Council Document) or any items related to nuclear and missile development programmes is prohibited. All the UN Security Council Resolutions/Documents and IAEA Documents referred to above are available on the UN Security Council website (www.un.org/Docs/sc) and IAEA website (www.iaea.org).
- (iii) Direct or indirect export of following items, whether or not originating in Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK), to DPRK is prohibited:
All items, materials equipment, goods and technology including as set out in lists in documents S/2006/814, S/2006/815 (including S/2009/205), S/2009/364 and S/2006/853 (United Nations Security Council Documents) INFCIRC/254/Rev.9/Part 1a and INFCIRC/254/Rev.7/Part 2a (IAEA documents) which could contribute to DPRK's nuclear-related, ballistic missile-related or other weapons of mass destruction-related programmes.

- (iv) Export of rough diamonds to Cote d'Ivoire is prohibited in compliance to Paragraph 6 of UN Security Council Resolution(UNSCR) 1643 (2005).
- (v) Export of rough diamond [ITC (HS) Code 710210, 710221 or 710231) to Venezuela shall be Prohibited in view of voluntary separation of Venezuela from the Kimberley Process Certification Scheme (KPCS). No Kimberley Process Certificate shall be accepted / endorsed / issued for export of rough diamond to Venezuela.
- (vi) In addition to above, export to other countries will be subject to conditions as specified in Para 2.1 of the Foreign Trade Policy 2009-14 and Para 2.2 of the Handbook of Procedures 2009-2014 (Vol. I) and other conditions which may be listed in the title ITC (HS) Classification of Export and Import items.

Chapter 2

Meat and Edible Meat Offal

Note 1

Beef includes meat and edible offal of cows, oxens and calf

Note 2

Offal includes heart, liver, tongue, kidneys and other organs.

Note 3

The export of chilled and frozen meat shall be allowed subject to the provision specified to the gazette notification on raw meat (chilled and frozen) under Export (Quality Control and Inspection) Act, 1963. Offals of buffalo too are subject to the same conditions of quality control and inspection. Laboratories duly recognized by APEDA, as well as in-house laboratories attached under the abattoirs cum meat processing plant registered with APEDA and Agency approved labs, may also be used to conduct the necessary tests for confirmation of quality under the supervision of the designated veterinary authority of the State. On the basis of these test and inspections carried out by Veterinarians, duly registered under the Indian Veterinary Council Act, 1984, employed by the exporting unit and supervised by the designated veterinary authority of the state, the veterinary Health Certificate may be issued by the designated authorities of the state.

Note 4

Export of canned meat products shall be subject to preshipment inspection either by the State Directorate of Animal Husbandry or Export Inspection Agency or Directorate of Marketing and Inspection Government of India or Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) in accordance with either the standards prevalent in the exporting country or standards prescribed under the Meat Food Products Order, 1973 under Export (Quality Control and Inspection) Act, 1963 or orders made thereunder

Note 5

Exports of gonads and other reproductive organs of buffaloes and the germplasm of cattle and buffaloes in heading 0511 require an export licence.

Note 6

Export of meat and meat products will be allowed subject to the exporter furnishing a declaration, attached with copies of valid APEDA Plant Registration Certificate(s) to the customs at the time of export that the above items have been obtained / sourced from an APEDA registered integrated abattoir or from APEDA registered meat processing plant which sources raw materials exclusively from APEDA registered integrated abattoir/abattoir. **(The stipulation that raw material for export of meat & meat products must be sourced exclusively from APEDA registered abattoir/integrated abattoir will come into effect on 15.06.2012.**

Note 7

On the cartons for export of meat, the following details shall compulsorily be mentioned:-

- (i) Name of the Product.
- (ii) Country of Origin
- (iii) APEDA Plant Registration No.
- (iv) Name of the exporter.

Note 8

The designated veterinary authority of the State where meat processing unit is located, may issue the certificate on the basis of the inspections carried out by Veterinarians duly registered under the Indian Veterinary Council Act 1984 employed by the exporting unit and supervised by the designated veterinary authority of the State. The Inspection Fee prescribed under the Export of Raw Meat (Chilled/Frozen) (Quality control and Inspection) Rules, 1992 shall continue to be paid by the exporting unit to the Agency as currently applicable.

Amendment to Appendix III

1. In accordance with the provisions of Article XVI, paragraph 1, of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, the United States of America has requested the Secretariat to include in Appendix III the species indicated below:

FAUNA

CLASS: AMPHIBIA

ORDER: CAUDATA

FAMILY: Cryptobranchidae

Species: *Cryptobranchus alleganiensis*

The United States has stated that this includes both subspecies: *Cryptobranchus alleganiensis alleganiensis* and *Cryptobranchus alleganiensis bishopi*.

2. In accordance with the provisions of Article XVI, paragraph 2, of the Convention, inclusion of this species in Appendix III shall take effect 90 days after the date of this Notification, i.e. on 3 April 2012.
3. The revised edition of the CITES Appendices will be placed on the CITES website before it enters into effect.

Non-commercial loan, donation or exchange between
registered scientists or scientific institutions

1. Article VII, paragraph 6, of the Convention specifies that:

The provisions of Articles III, IV and V shall not apply to the non-commercial loan, donation or exchange between scientists or scientific institutions registered by a Management Authority of their State, of herbarium specimens, other preserved, dried or embedded museum specimens, and live plant material which carry a label issued or approved by a Management Authority.

2. At its 11th meeting (CoP11, Gigiri, 2000), the Conference of the Parties adopted Resolution Conf. 11.15 on *Non-commercial loan, donation or exchange of museum and herbarium specimens*, containing guidance on the implementation of the above-mentioned special provisions. This was revised at CoP12 (Santiago, 2002) and the current Resolution on this subject, Resolution Conf. 11.15 (Rev. CoP12), can be found at the following URL: <http://www.cites.org/eng/res/11/11-15R12.php>.

3. In this Resolution, the Conference of the Parties, amongst other provisions:

URGES Parties to contact scientists and scientific institutions in the territory under their jurisdiction to facilitate greater understanding of the scientific exchange provisions of Article VII, paragraph 6, on the non-commercial loan, donation or exchange of scientific specimens.

4. In accordance with the same Resolution, the Secretariat maintains a *Register of scientific institutions entitled to the exemption provided by Article VII, paragraph 6, of the Convention*, which can be accessed through the CITES website at the following URL: http://www.cites.org/common/reg/e_si.html.

5. At CoP12, the Conference of the Parties adopted Decision 12.79, as follows:

Directed to the Secretariat

The Secretariat shall develop a brochure that will illustrate the importance of registering scientific institutions under Article VII, paragraph 6, of the Convention and demonstrate how the registration procedures can be applied in a simplified manner.

This Decision remains valid and the Secretariat is seeking funding to implement it.

6. In accordance with Decision 15.32, adopted at the 15th meeting of the Conference of the Parties (Doha, 2010), the Secretariat encourages Parties that have not already done so, to:
 - a) implement at the national level a system for registering scientific institutions within the territory under their jurisdiction, that might benefit from the special provisions for facilitating trade under Article VII, paragraph 6, of the Convention;
 - b) inform such institutions about the implications and potential benefits of being registered; and

c) provide to the Secretariat, at the earliest opportunity, the details of the registered scientific institutions that are entitled to benefit from the special provisions of Article VII, paragraph 6, of the Convention

Monitoring of illegal trade in ivory

1. The Secretariat reminds Parties of the considerable time, money and effort that have been devoted to the Elephant Trade Information System (ETIS) and encourages them to submit reports on all seizures of ivory and other elephant products.
2. An electronic version of the ETIS *Ivory and elephant product seizure data collection form* and *Explanatory notes* to report seizures of ivory and other elephant products are attached.
3. Reports may be submitted for inclusion in ETIS in printed or electronic form to the CITES Secretariat, or directly to TRAFFIC. To ensure that data from such reports can be included in the analysis of ETIS data for the 62nd meeting of the CITES Standing Committee (23-27 July 2012) and the 16th meeting of the Conference of the Parties (3-15 March 2013), Parties should ensure that their submissions reach TRAFFIC by 18 April 2012.

5. Parties are invited to use the *Ivory and elephant product seizure data collection form* (see Annex 1) to submit their information. Alternatively, TRAFFIC will accept electronic or printed spreadsheets of elephant product seizure information as long as they contain the minimum set of data. With reference to the data collection form, the minimum information required to enable entry of a seizure case into ETIS is:
 - Question 1: source of data;
 - Question 2: date of seizure AND the agency or authority responsible for the seizure;
 - Question 4: location of the seizure; and
 - Question 9: number and/or volume of ivory seized by type (i.e. raw, semi-worked or worked ivory); or
 - Question 10: number and/or volume of non-ivory elephant product seized.
6. Cases that are reported without the above information cannot be entered into ETIS, and TRAFFIC will have to seek further details from the appropriate authorities.

7. Parties are also encouraged to include other important information, if known, particularly (Question 5) country of origin, (Question 6) country of export/re-export and (Question 7) country of destination/import for the elephant products seized, as this information serves to strengthen any subsequent analysis of the ETIS data.
8. Parties are reminded that ETIS includes records of elephant product seizures that have occurred since 1989. Thus, Parties are encouraged to review and provide information on seizures that have occurred in the past but that have not been reported to ETIS yet.
9. Parties are advised that they should also communicate the absence of ivory or other elephant product seizures within the course of a year. Indeed, a report that no seizures have been made is far more useful than not communicating any information at all.
10. In reporting ivory seizures, Parties are asked to pay particular attention to the need to identify the type of ivory involved. ETIS recognizes three types of ivory:
 - 'raw ivory',
 - 'semi-worked ivory'
 - and
 - 'worked ivory'.

Definitions of these ivory types are found in the *Explanatory notes* (see Annex 2). Failure to indicate the precise type of ivory seized is the most common problem preventing data entry of ivory seizure cases, and clarifying this issue with Management Authorities usually takes considerable time.

11. This Notification replaces Notification to the Parties No. 2010/041 of 13 December 2010.

Explanatory notes for the *Ivory and elephant product seizure data collection form*

Background

Annex 1 to Resolution Conf. 10.10 (Rev. CoP15) directs all Parties to "provide information on seizures and confiscations of ivory or other elephant specimens on the prescribed form to the Secretariat within 90 days of their occurrence". This document serves to explain more fully the requirements for each of the prescribed items on the data collection form.

The objective of the *Ivory and elephant product data collection form* is to collect data and information on seizures and confiscations of ivory and other elephant specimens in a systematic manner. The data will be held as a component of the Elephant Trade Information System (ETIS) in order to monitor and record levels of illegal trade in ivory and other elephant products on a global basis.

The form should be filled out clearly either in capital letters, typing on the form or by adopting your own electronic version. The tick boxes should be filled out with a tick i.e. .

Please note that persons filling out the data collection forms are free to omit confidential information. To safeguard confidentiality and data integrity, all completed forms should be sent to the CITES Secretariat where they will be screened before being passed to TRAFFIC for inclusion in the database.

Also please note that to qualify for data entry, questions 1, 2 and 4 must be filled in, on each form, as this is the minimal essential information required for each seizure. Questions 9 and/or 10 are also very important and either the weight or quantity should be filled in, but preferably both. If you are unable to obtain some of the required information, incomplete forms can be submitted, and more information can be sent later, if necessary.

To the extent possible, please try to obtain the following information:

With regard to the two introductory questions, indicate whether this is the first time the seizure is being reported or if it is a follow-up report to an earlier submission by ticking "Yes or No". When submitting further information on cases that have already reported to ETIS, please make it clear as to which seizure the follow-up report relates to.

1. Source of data

Give the source of the information. Preferably, the source should be the original source of information (e.g. the government agency responsible for the seizure). However, the source could be a newspaper report, government press release, or other published item. If so, indicate as appropriate. Provide the date the information was obtained or acquired in the following format: day/month/year. If the exact date is not known, at the very least, indicate the year and the source of data. Any seizure information received without the year and source will be of little use to the system for analytical purposes.

2. Date of seizure

Give the date the seizure actually occurred and indicate the agency responsible for the seizure. If the exact date is not known, at the very least, indicate the year of seizure. Any seizure information received without the year of seizure will be of little use to the system for analytical purposes.

3. Type of activity

Identify the nature of the transaction. Specify if the trade offence involved illegal export, import, transit, possession, sale, offer for sale/purchase, or illegal killing. If "other", please indicate more specifically. This is a multiple-choice question and more than one answer is permitted.

4. Location of discovery

Identify the place, city and country in which the seizure took place. Examples of “place” are an international airport, a ship in a port, a hotel, border post, game reserve, etc. It may not always be possible to describe the place or city, but at the very least indicate the country. Any seizure information received without the country of discovery will be of little use to the system for analytical purposes.

5. Country of origin

Preferably identify the country of origin of the elephant products seized, but if that proves to be difficult indicate the region (e.g. West Africa or Africa) in which the ivory or elephant product is believed to have originated. If completely unknown, write “unknown.”

6. Country of export/re-export

If the seized items involved an international transaction then this section should be filled in. Identify the country of export or re-export. In cases involving illegal possession or sale within a particular country, particularly an elephant range state, there may not be a country of export. If not known, write “unknown.”

7. Country of destination/import

If the seized items involved an international transaction then this section should be filled in. Identify the country to which the ivory or elephant product was destined. If not known, write “unknown.”

8. Elephant species

If known, identify the elephant species from which the ivory or elephant product derived (i.e. African elephant or Asian elephant). If not known, check “unknown.”

9. Ivory type and quantity

Identify the ivory type and quantity, by indicating the total number of items seized and their total weight. Use the following definition of terms as a guide:

Raw ivory – refers to whole tusks which remain in a raw state or whole tusks which may derive from sport hunting or other activities, including those that are mounted or polished. In addition to whole tusks, raw ivory includes tusks that have been broken or cut into pieces, but otherwise have not been shaped or processed. Indicate number of tusks/pieces by crossing out the one that does not apply.

Semi-worked ivory – refers to ivory that has been shaped or processed to some extent but which will undergo further processing at a later stage. Examples would include ivory blocks that have been fashioned into name seal blanks, but are not yet fashioned products.

Worked ivory – refers to carved or manufactured ivory items that are finished products. Examples would include jewelry and accessories (e.g. bangles, rings, necklaces, hair clips, etc.), piano keys, chopsticks, game pieces (e.g. chess sets, mah jong pieces, billiard balls, etc.), carvings, composite sculptures, and other finished products.

If known, please indicate the percentage of the seized ivory that represents “fresh” or “old” ivory. If unknown, indicate “unknown”.

Please use the following definition of terms as a guide:

Fresh ivory – refers to ivory that is deemed to have been recently poached. Such ivory typically has blood or particles of flesh attached to it, does not show evidence of discolouration or cracks from aging, and sometimes exhibits sharp (as opposed to worn or blunt) edges on the lip cavity end of the tusk when it was removed from the animal using an axe, machete or other sharp chopping tool.

Old ivory – refers to ivory that is deemed to have been held in storage for a considerable amount of time, typically exhibiting a weathered appearance with discolouration, cracks and brittleness as noticeable features.

Comment

Give a brief description of the item seized (e.g. whole tusk, ring, chopsticks, ivory blocks, etc.) or any details concerning distinctive markings on the surface of the products, such as punch dyed or written numbers or codes. If the space allocated on the form is insufficient, use the back of the form or additional sheets of paper which should be attached.

10. Non-ivory elephant products

Identify non-ivory elephant products seized and indicate the volume. Please note:

Elephant/hide skin – note the number of skins/hides in their raw state and the total weight of all pieces seized.

Manufactured hide product – indicate the type or types of product and the total weight of the products seized.

Feet – indicate the number of feet seized.

Hair – indicate the total weight of hair or hair products seized.

Other – please describe any other type of product seized and the total volume of the product or products.

11. Other contraband seized elephant products

Provide details of any other items seized along with the elephant products (e.g. drugs, diamonds, parrots, weapons, etc.) If possible, indicate the total volume of the other contraband seized.

12. Estimated value of seized elephant products in country of seizure

Indicate an estimated value in local currency of the seized elephant products in the country of seizure. Be sure to state the currency in full (e.g. US dollars, Hong Kong dollars, Zimbabwe dollars, etc.) Note the source or basis for the valuation (e.g. an airway bill, or verbal declaration, etc.).

13. Mode of transport

Identify the mode of transport (e.g. airline, ship, truck, post, etc.) used to move the seized elephant products. If by air, sea or by land, try to provide further details on the airline carrier, the ship, or the vehicle and/or the name of the courier company (e.g. DHL, Chronopost, Fedex, etc.) If by post, try to identify the post office from which the parcel originated.

14. Method of concealment/fraud

Describe the manner in which the elephant products were concealed to avoid detection. Illustrative examples include semi-worked ivory blocks shipped by post disguised with brown paint, ivory tusks identified as “beeswax” or “wood curios” on the documents, worked ivory curios hidden in carry-on baggage, or caches of raw ivory tusks which were buried.

15. Documentation

Indicate whether any kind of documentation accompanied the seized items. Examples of such documentation could be CITES import and export permits, internal transaction permits, transport licenses, possession certificates, etc.

Please use the following definition of terms as a guide:

Falsified – a genuine permit that has been illegally altered to represent the items that have been seized.

Fake permit – a forged or counterfeit document

Valid permit but wrong shipment – a genuine permit meant for a different consignment.

16. Method of detection

This refers to the way by which the seizure came about by the authority responsible. Five main methods of detection are noted here with an option to add any other method. A box can be ticked more than once.

Please use the following definition of terms as a guide:

Routine inspection – this is the method which relates to the normal activity of checking for contraband; in such cases this is when inspection is performed in a neutral way without any prior information.

Targeting – when a seizure has occurred as a result of profiling activities of individuals, trade routes, typical locations of illicit activity etc. targeting must relate to prior intelligence analysis for wildlife only and not other contraband.

Investigation – the method of investigating particular illegal activity relating to wildlife, where information has led to proactive research into an illicit activity.

X-ray – where a x-ray machine has been used to detect the contraband.

Intelligence – the use of prior information to assist in the detection.

17. Profile of offenders/suspects

Provide information concerning any individual named, apprehended, arrested, or tried in conjunction with the seizure. Space is allocated for one individual, if more than one person is involved, please write on the back of the form or attach an additional sheet of paper with the profiles. Even if some of this information may be deemed confidential, at the very least, please indicate the nationality of the offenders/suspects for analytical purposes. Other information will be held by the CITES Secretariat and will not become part of the ETIS analysis process apart from the nationality of the offenders/suspects.

18. Status of offenders/suspects

Provide the status of the offenders/suspects with respect to the seizure by ticking the appropriate box or identifying another item not listed. This is a multiple-choice question and more than one answer is permitted.

Please note:

Courier – refers to a person who actively smuggles contraband or accompanies contraband from one point to another in its route from source to destination. This does not refer to commercial freight courier companies.

Repeat offender – refers to a person who been caught/arrested with a similar crime on at least one other occasion and maybe even repeatedly.

19. Status of case in court

Provide information on the status of the case in the courts in particular the following:

- a) The date the case was first brought to court.
- b) The date the cases ended, if still pending, indicate by writing "pending" on the line that states **Status of the case in court.**
- c) The name and location (city/town) of the court.

The verdict/penalty, describe the verdict and any penalties given in the case by ticking the appropriate box.

20. Additional information

Provide any other information that you feel is relevant and important to the case. If the space allocated on the form is insufficient, use the back of the form or additional sheets.

21. Was an Ecomessage form filed with Interpol?

Indicate whether the seizure was reported to Interpol using the Ecomessage form. The Ecomessage form was circulated to the Parties through CITES Notification to the Parties No. 966 of 7 March 1997. Interpol's Ecomessage is a system for collection and dissemination of intelligence data on environmental crime, including the illegal trade in wildlife. CONCERNING:

National laws for implementation of the Convention

1. Article VIII, paragraph 1, of the Convention requires each Party to take appropriate measures to enforce the provisions of the Convention and to prohibit trade in violation thereof.
2. Resolution Conf. 8.4 (Rev. CoP15) on *National laws for implementation of the Convention* was initially adopted in 1992. It establishes the basis for a CITES National Legislation Project aimed at providing legislative assistance to Parties and preparing analyses of their legislation in relation to four requirements (see document CoP12 Doc. 28 at <http://www.cites.org/eng/cop/12/doc/E12-28.pdf> for a detailed explanation of the requirements). Legislative analyses conducted under the National Legislation Project determine which of the following categories the legislation of each Party and dependent territory should be placed in:
 - Category 1: legislation that is believed generally to meet the requirements for implementation of CITES;
 - Category 2: legislation that is believed generally not to meet all of the requirements for the implementation of CITES; or
 - Category 3: legislation that is believed generally not to meet the requirements for the implementation of CITES.
3. In Resolution Conf. 8.4 (Rev. CoP15), the Conference of the Parties instructs the Standing Committee:

to determine which Parties have not adopted appropriate measures for effective implementation of the Convention and to consider appropriate compliance measures, which may include recommendations to suspend trade, in accordance with Resolution Conf. 14.3 [on CITES compliance procedures];
4. In Decision 15.38, the Conference of the Parties requests the Parties to “submit to the Secretariat, in one of the working languages of the Convention, appropriate measures which have been adopted for effective implementation of the Convention.” In addition, under Decision 15.39, “any Party which has not adopted appropriate measures for effective implementation of the Convention should submit to the Secretariat a justification for not having done so”.
5. Under Decision 15.41, the Secretariat is directed to report at the 62nd meeting of the Standing Committee (SC62, Geneva, 23-27 July 2012) on “Parties’ progress in adopting adequate measures and, if necessary, recommend the adoption of appropriate compliance measures, including suspension of trade.” The Secretariat should also “identify any countries that require attention as a priority under the National Legislation Project.”
6. Under Decision 15.40, the Standing Committee is directed to review at SC62 “the progress of Parties in adopting appropriate measures for the effective implementation of the Convention.”

7. At its 61st meeting (SC61, Geneva, August 2011), the Standing Committee:

agreed that the adoption of national laws for implementation of the Convention was a serious issue and urged Parties and dependent territories whose legislation was in Category 2 or 3 to make use of the means listed in paragraph 6 of document SC61 Doc. 23 to increase legislative momentum. It decided to consider appropriate compliance measures for Parties which it had identified as requiring attention as a priority, if those Parties had not submitted legislation for parliamentary, Cabinet or ministerial approval by SC62. Finally, the Committee asked the Secretariat to issue a Notification requesting Parties and dependent territories whose legislation was in Category 2 or 3 to submit information on their legislative progress 90 days in advance of SC62.

8. Parties currently identified as requiring attention as a priority under the National Legislation Project are:

Algeria, Belize, the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, the Comoros, Djibouti, Guinea-Bissau, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Liberia, Mauritania, Mozambique, Pakistan, Paraguay, the Plurinational State of Bolivia, Rwanda, Somalia, South Africa and the United Republic of Tanzania.

9. Parties and dependent territories should consult the legislative status chart contained in the Annex to verify whether their legislation is placed in Category 1, 2 or 3 under the National Legislation Project. Parties and dependent territories whose legislation is in Category 2 or 3 are requested to submit information on their legislative progress to the Secretariat as soon as possible. Information submitted by 21 May 2012 will be included in the updated legislative status chart that the Secretariat will submit at SC62.
10. Parties and dependent territories whose legislation is in Category 2 or 3 are urged to advise the Secretariat if they require specific assistance in making further legislative progress.

CONCERNING:

Status of *Scleropages inscriptus* ('Batik arowana') under CITES

1. The attention of the Secretariat has been drawn to the publication of a scientific paper relating to a newly described taxon of Asian bonytongue fish (or 'arowana') from the Tenasserim river basin (also known as the Tanintharyi River), on the coast of Myanmar.
2. The Secretariat consulted the nomenclature specialist of the Animals Committee, who notes that:
 - a) In the supporting statement of the proposal to transfer *Scleropages formosus* from Appendix II to Appendix I, which was adopted at the seventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties (Lausanne, 1989), the described distribution of *S. formosus* was: Indonesia, Burma (now Myanmar), Thailand, Malaysia, Laos (now the Lao People's Democratic Republic), Kampuchea (now Cambodia) and Viet Nam; and
 - b) All other *Scleropages* species not covered by CITES (i.e. *S. jardinii* and *S. leichhardtii*) occur in Australia and New Guinea, well away from the range of the newly described taxon.
3. Taking these facts into consideration, the Secretariat and the nomenclature specialist of the Animals Committee recommend that, until it is clarified to the contrary by the Conference of the Parties, it should be understood that the specimens that have now been described as *S. inscriptus* were intended to be included in the original listing of *S. formosus*. Consequently, specimens traded internationally should be recorded under the name *Scleropages formosus* and in accordance with the provisions relating to species in Appendix I. The Secretariat will be adding a footnote in the Appendices to clarify this.
4. The Secretariat has suggested to the Animals Committee that it make a recommendation to the Conference of the Parties at its 16th meeting to clarify the listing of *S. inscriptus*.

1. In accordance with the provisions of Article XVI, paragraph 1, of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, the Governments of the following States have requested the Secretariat to include in Appendix III the species indicated below:

Belgium, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland

2. In accordance with the provisions of Article XVI, paragraph 2, of the Convention, inclusion of these species in Appendix III shall take effect 90 days after the date of this Notification, i.e. on 25 September 2012.
3. When revising the CITES Appendices to include the species listed above, the Secretariat will take the opportunity to make the following further amendments.
 - a) For reasons explained in Notification to the Parties No. 2012/043 of 25 June 2012, a footnote will be added to the listing of the species *Scleropages formosus* in Appendix I, to indicate that this includes the newly described taxon *Scleropages inscriptus*;
 - b) At the request of the Government of Madagascar, the species *Diospyros crassiflorides* was included in CITES Appendix III on 22 December 2011. The listing in the Appendices is presented as follows, the name in parentheses being provided as a synonym for information purposes:

* Excluding the dependent territory of Greenland.

Diospyros crassiflorides (*Diospyros crassiflora*).

However, the use of this name has created some confusion. Following consultation with the nomenclature specialist of the Plants Committee, it has been clarified that the correct name for the species that Madagascar wished to include in Appendix III is the following:

Diospyros mcphersonii G.E. Schatz & Lowry (*Diospyros crassiflora* H. Perrier)

The Government of Madagascar has confirmed that it agrees to this amendment; and

- c) A correction will be made to the translations in French and Spanish of the annotation to *Crocodylus niloticus*, to clarify that the text "(subject to an annual export quota of no more than 1,600 wild specimens including hunting trophies, in addition to ranched specimens)" applies to the population of the United Republic of Tanzania only. This correction does not affect the English.
4. The revised edition of the CITES Appendices will be placed on the CITES website before it enters into effect.

CONCERNING:

Interpretation of the annotation to *Hoodia* spp. in Appendix II

1. The species of the genus *Hoodia* are included in CITES Appendix II with annotation #9, which is as follows:
 - #9 *All parts and derivatives except those bearing a label: "Produced from Hoodia spp. material obtained through controlled harvesting and production in collaboration with the CITES Management Authorities of Botswana/Namibia/South Africa under agreement no. BW/NA/ZA xxxxxx".*
2. In Notification to the Parties No. 2006/047, of 18 August 2006, the Secretariat published the following information:
 2. *The Plants Committee, at its 15th meeting (Geneva, May 2005) discussed the difficulties that importing Parties were experiencing in interpreting and applying annotation #9 for Hoodia spp.*
 3. *At its 16th meeting (Lima, July 2006), the Committee was informed that no agreement yet existed between Botswana, Namibia and South Africa of the type mentioned in annotation #9 to the Appendices and that therefore there was no exemption from the provisions of the Convention for trade in specimens of Hoodia spp.*
 4. *Therefore, at the request of the Plants Committee, the Secretariat hereby notifies the Parties that currently all trade in specimens of Hoodia spp. requires the issuance of CITES permits or certificates.*
3. Recently, as a result of questions arising from countries of import of *Hoodia* specimens, the Secretariat has been in communication with Botswana, Namibia and South Africa to seek information on the 'agreement' referred to annotation #9 and clarification of their control of trade in specimens of *Hoodia* species.
4. These countries drew attention to the statement in paragraph 4.3.1 of the original proposal to include *Hoodia* spp. in Appendix II, document CoP13 Prop. 37, submitted by Botswana, Namibia and South Africa at the 13th meeting of the Conference of the Parties (CoP13, Bangkok, 2004), as follows:

The proponents intend to promote local processing, and the major form of exports is likely to be in the form of extracts, partially processed or finished pharmaceutical products. Such products present complications for enforcement, and have traditionally been exempted for medicinal plant species included in Appendix II. It is therefore proposed to only exempt such products bearing a label indicating that the specific manufacturer/distributor/agent responsible for marketing such product has established an agreement with the relevant Management Authority, as specified in the proposal (Section A). All other specimens and raw material would remain subject to the requirements of trade under Article IV.
5. It is clear from this statement that the 'agreement' to be referred to on each label was intended to be an agreement between the Management Authority of the country concerned and the "specific manufacturer/distributor/agent responsible for marketing". Although this was the background for the acceptance of the proposal to include the species of the genus *Hoodia* in Appendix II, unfortunately, the

text of the annotation that was presented and adopted does not clearly reflect this statement, which has been understood as referring to an agreement between the governments of the three countries.

6. Consequently, following consultation with the Management Authorities of Botswana, Namibia and South Africa, and in view of the clear intention expressed to the Conference of the Parties at CoP13, the Secretariat recommends that annotation #9 of the CITES Appendices be interpreted as referring to individual agreements between each one of these Management Authorities and the manufacturers, distributors or marketing agents within their country.
7. This means that parts and derivatives of *Hoodia* species are excluded from CITES controls if they bear a label indicating:

Produced from Hoodia spp. material obtained through controlled harvesting and production in collaboration with the CITES Management Authority of [Botswana under agreement no. BW/xxxxxx] [Namibia under agreement no. NA/xxxxxx] [South Africa under agreement no. ZA/xxxxxx].

8. At the time of issuance of the present Notification, Botswana, Namibia and South Africa have not concluded any agreement at the national level with the manufacturers, distributors or agents responsible for the marketing of *Hoodia* specimens.
9. The CITES Management Authorities of Botswana, Namibia and South Africa have indicated that they intend to submit a proposal for consideration at the 16th meeting of the Conference of the Parties to clarify the annotation applying to the species of the genus *Hoodia*, along the lines indicated in paragraphs 6 and 7 above.

Trade in stony corals

List of coral taxa where identification to genus level is acceptable

1. At its 18th meeting (San José, April 2002), the Animals Committee adopted a list of coral genera that could be identified to the species level and of those that could be identified to the genus level only. These lists were accepted by the Conference of the Parties at its 12th meeting (Santiago, 2002) and disseminated by the Secretariat through Notification to the Parties No. 2003/020 of 4 April 2003.
2. At its 15th meeting (CoP15, Doha, 2010), the Conference of the Parties instructed the Secretariat to re-issue Notification to the Parties No. 2003/020 without the list of stony coral taxa identifiable to species level. The Secretariat therefore issued Notification to the Parties No. 2010/014 of 17 June 2010, providing the list of stony coral genera for which identification to genus level only is acceptable. In addition, at CoP15, the Conference instructed the Animals Committee to update this list.
3. At its 26th meeting (Geneva, March 2012), the Animals Committee adopted a revised list of stony coral genera for which identification to genus level only is acceptable for the purpose of implementing Resolutions Conf. 11.17 (Rev. CoP14) on *National reports* and Conf. 12.3 (Rev. CoP15) on *Permits and certificates*. The revised list is presented in the Annex to this Notification. Nevertheless, these taxa should be identified to species level where feasible.
4. This Notification replaces Notification to the Parties No. 2010/014.

Standard nomenclature

Standard references to be considered at CoP16

1. In Resolution Conf. 12.11 (Rev. CoP15) (*Standard nomenclature*), the Conference of the Parties recommends, in paragraph h), that:

the Secretariat be provided with the citations (and ordering information) of checklists that will be nominated for standard references at least six months before the meeting of the Conference of the Parties at which such checklists will be considered. The Secretariat shall include such information in a Notification to the Parties so that Parties can obtain copies to review if they wish before the meeting.
