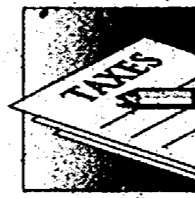

Voters face tax question Aug. 6



Westland residents should consider whether they are adequately protected by their police and fire departments. In August, they will decide whether to pay higher taxes for public safety.

Following a heated debate, a split Westland City Council decided Monday night to ask voters to approve higher taxes to improve police and fire departments.

In a 6-1 decision, with Councilman Charles Pickering casting the opposing vote, the council chose to place a city charter amendment on the Aug. 6 primary election ballot.

The long-discussed proposal would allow city officials to raise the charter-imposed general operating mill-

age from the current 8-mill limit to 9.5 mills.

According to Finance Director Michael Gorman, an average residential taxpayer with an \$80,000 home would pay about \$60 more a year.

The money would be used to implement Mayor Robert Thomas' Project 2000 plan. He wants to initiate a community policing program and have all firefighters trained as paramedics.

"It can't be done without the millage increase," Thomas said Monday.

Pickering disagreed and said city leaders haven't exhausted other possible ways of paying for the program.

Missing from the ballot proposal is language - much discussed by city officials - that would allow the council to levy the new tax for six years. It wasn't clear why.

A telephone call to City Attorney Angelo Plakas hadn't been returned Tuesday afternoon, and Assistant City Attorney Keith Madden wasn't willing to discuss the matter on the record.

Councilman Richard LeBlanc said Tuesday he wasn't aware that the six-year time frame had been omitted from the ballot proposal.

"That will have to be addressed," he said.

Councilman Charles "Trav" Griffin also couldn't elaborate on the lack of time frame.

"I can't answer that, either," he said.

Mayor Robert Thomas wasn't available for comment.

LeBlanc said later that he had talked with some of his council colleagues and that a special meeting had been scheduled for Monday morning to address the issue.

Weeks ago, city officials had said the six-year millage would raise money for an \$11.5 million public safety plan.

Specifically, city officials want to hire 10 new police department employees, including seven new police officers, one lieutenant, one

Warmbier mourned: Veteran trustee remembered as 'honest' and 'true friend'

Veteran Wayne-Westland school board member Fred Warmbier, who died Sunday evening, is being remembered as an honest and caring public servant who stood firm on issues important to him.

"Fred was the kind of person that you meet once in a lifetime," longtime friend and former school board colleague David Moranty said. "He was just a true friend and a gentleman. He will be missed by many people."

Warmbier, 76, died Sunday at Angela Hospice after battling cancer. He served on the Wayne-Westland school board for 18 years.

"Fred cared deeply about the Wayne-Westland school district, and he wasn't afraid to do the hard

things to try to get the results that he wanted," former colleague Laurel Raisanen said. "Fred wasn't afraid to speak out for what he thought was right. That was what impressed me."

"He was always ready to go the extra mile, and it was always for students, not for himself," Raisanen said. "I'm going to miss him."

Warmbier served on the school board from 1969-85 and then successfully campaigned in 1991 for a two-year term.

He didn't shy away from controversy and was among a narrow board majority that ousted former Superintendent Dennis O'Neill and hired successor Larry Thomas. Thomas also was eventually replaced by current Superintendent Duane Moore following a turnover of board members.

Warmbier consistently lashed out at the Wayne-Westland Education Association, accusing the teachers'

Residents angered by 'years of neglect'

Two angry residents Monday accused city officials of neglecting Westland's southeast neighborhoods - an attack that city leaders called unjust.

Julius Street resident Nellie Williams called for revitalization efforts in southeast neighborhoods that she said have suffered "40 years of neglect."

Williams, speaking during a Westland City Council hearing on the

mayor's proposed \$36.2 million budget, said new housing construction is needed to stabilize neighborhoods and to combat blight in the Carver subdivision.

She said she was upset to learn during an April 18 meeting of the Community Development Citizens Advisory Board that proposed neighborhood improvements could be ditched.

She described statements made to residents attending the April 18 meeting as "insensitive" and "unconscionable."

Williams charged that city leaders shouldn't miss "a rare opportunity" to help low-income families improve their quality of living.

Another Julius Street resident, council watcher Dorothy Smith, also charged that city leaders have focused on improvements in the northwest end and along Ford Road, at the expense of her neighborhood.

"We pay our share of taxes, but we don't get our share," she said.

Williams and Smith are concerned that the city hasn't done enough to address problems in an area roughly bounded by Inkster Road to the east, Van Born to the south, Henry Ruff to the west and Annapolis to the north.

Smith said during the public hearing that Ford Road, a major east-west route through Westland, receives too much attention.

"It will be better than Birmingham after awhile," she said.

City officials responded that statements about the southeast end being ignored aren't accurate. Moreover, fears about housing proposals being

That is the number of Painter-Ruthenberg Inc., the city's waste hauler who is handling the recycling program. Inquiries in writing may be made to the company at: 2660 Beech Daly Road, Inkster, 48141.

The curbside pick-up program is scheduled to begin May 15. Subscription fees are \$18 for six months or \$34 for a year.

Residents who join the after May 15 will have their fees pro-rated. Apartment residents and the city's industrial and commercial sectors aren't included in the program at this point.

Household drop-off Saturday

Residents will have another chance Saturday to bring in household waste items to the Central Wayne County Sanitation Authority's facility on Inkster Road near Annapolis, Dearborn Heights.

The materials to be accepted between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. are oil-based paints and varnishes, wood preservatives, cleaning solvents, pesticides and weed killers, household batteries, oven cleaners, mothballs, transmission fluid and antifreeze, pressurized cans, metallic mercury from thermometers and lead.

Proof of residency will be required. The sanitation

authority, which owns and operates an incinerator facility, has Garden City, Westland, Inkster, Wayne and Dearborn Heights as its member communities.

An authority spokeswoman said residents should place the materials to be disposed of in closed containers and then in boxes and avoid mixing materials. After the collection, the material will be recycled or taken to specially designed disposal sites. The materials will not be burned at the authority's incinerator or taken to a landfill.

sergeant and one secretary.

Each officer would be assigned exclusively to one of seven community policing districts, with the goal of getting to know residents and business owners. Nine new police cars and bicycles would also be bought.

The city also would hire eight new fire department employees, including six new firefighters, one captain and one secretary. All four fire stations would be renovated, and all firefighters would become trained as full-fledged paramedics.

Assistant Fire Chief Mark Neal said the new Advanced Life Support system would allow paramedics to administer intravenous drugs and provide other

on-the-scene medical attention that now gets postponed until patients reach a hospital.

"We would actually be able to save people in the street," Neal said.

Councilman Glenn Anderson said, "I know that there will be lives saved."

Police Sgt. Jon Handzlik told council members that the city needs more police officers. In 1980, Westland had 102 officers who responded to 17,000 calls, he said.

Sixteen years later, the police department still has 102 officers but has 50,000 calls a year, or about three times as many as in 1980, Handzlik said.

"We've lost the ability to just meet with the citizens and find out what's going on," he said.

City officials cautioned that current public safety services aren't targeted to be slashed if the 1.5-mill proposal fails. The

new programs would simply enhance what the city already has.

Councilwoman Justine Barnes, who recently fell and crushed her kneecap, said the pain she experienced could have been eased if firefighters responding to her emergency had been trained as paramedics.

"What happens to the heart patient?" she asked Monday. "What happens to the diabetic who might be in coma?"

Barnes noted that 80 percent of the fire department's calls are medical related.

Anderson labeled the ballot proposal the most important issue to confront him in his five years on the council.

Pickering said the city hasn't tried to find other ways to pay for the program.

He drew support from former Councilman Thomas Brown, who addressed the council and suggested using surplus budget dollars and special revenues from the Tax Increment Finance Authority.

Pickering said he supports the program, but not by paying for it with what he called the biggest

millage increase in the city's history.

Pickering also said the ballot proposal should be decided in the November general election, not during the primary when a lower turnout is typical.

"That's wrong," he said, noting that special interest and absentee voters will, in essence, decide the issue.

Anderson said he resented Pickering's implication that the council had "a sinister motive" in placing the issue on the August ballot.

"A voter can vote in either one of those elections," Anderson said.

Council president Sandra Cicirelli said she would want an Advanced Life Support system in place "if someone was responding to me and I was having a heart attack."


Pickering noted that some firefighters already have been trained as paramedics and that the city could implement some level of Advanced Life Support even without a tax increase.

City officials have said they will not place the proposal on the ballot again if it fails in August.

Nature group urges quick grant approval by board

The Friends of the Sassasfras Trail may face a new hurdle to keep the 64-acre nature preserve for educational and environmental purposes.

The group, formed three years ago to preserve the area north and west of Palmer and Wildwood, appealed to the Wayne-Westland Board of Education Monday to vote before the June 10 board election to accept a \$520,000 grant from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

According to school board President Francis "Bud" Winter, the DNR has said the property is valued at an estimated \$1.5 million. The district is expected to receive a new property appraisal in about two weeks.

He said if the appraisal comes in at that estimate — about three times higher than the DNR grant — the board may have to consider its original decision to avoid selling the property.

That potential spurred the formation of Friends of Sassasfras Trail, and the group's urging the board to not sell the property and retain it for educational and environmental purposes. The board agreed. Later, it pursued a DNR grant to pay for development rights.

On Monday, the friends' group showed two videos and made an appeal for the board to continue its support for the trail's preservation.

Friends' president Kevin Headrick told the board that "it has been a long process since we first came before the board with our vision and our request that Sassasfras Trails be saved in perpetuity."

"We believe we have done everything the board asked of us and we truly appreciate the patience and support of each board member both past and present. We are also grateful to

the school district's administration and all of our state representatives.

"Through their efforts the DNR approved a grant for the full amount requested by the administration. We believe we have shown the importance and the benefits of achieving our vision."

"We have the support and the momentum needed to accomplish this vision. So, let's continue to collectively move forward to make sure that this vision became a reality."

Another group member, Vickie Lewis, told the board that the efforts to retain the nature preserve not only reflects the school board's mission statement, but also focused on bringing together the community, local businesses, organizations and government "in the improvement of the district's ability to provide a well-rounded and complete education

Robbery suspects to stand trial

Two robbery suspects have been ordered to stand trial for a string of holdups in Westland.

Dewayne Haag, 25, of Westland, and Dennis Miller, 40, of Inkster were bound over for trial in Wayne County Circuit Court after they waived a preliminary hearing last Thursday in Westland 18th District Court.

Both suspects are charged with three counts of armed robbery, one count of assault with intent to rob, and being habitual offenders.

Haag, accused of implying that he had a gun during the robberies, also faces trial on a felony firearms charge.

Haag and Miller remain jailed in lieu of cash bonds amounting to \$400,000 for each defendant, 18th District Court administrator David Wiacek said.

The men are defendants in three robberies and one attempted holdup that occurred in less than five hours April 23 in Westland.

The first incident, a robbery attempt, occurred at 2:35 a.m. when one suspect went to the Speedway gas station at Wayne Road and Cherry Hill and demanded money, Westland police Sgt. Scott Fetner, has said.

The man implied that he had a gun hidden in his clothing, although none was shown and no shots were fired, Fetner said.

A second suspect waited in a getaway car, he said.

The suspects didn't get any money during the Speedway attempt, but they allegedly seized undisclosed amounts of cash during subsequent robberies that included:

- A holdup that occurred shortly after the Speedway incident at the Total gas station at Cherry Hill and Venoy.

- A 4:52 a.m. robbery that happened at the 7-Eleven at Palmer Road and Merriman.

- An 8:15 a.m. holdup that occurred at the 7-Eleven at Cherry Hill and John Hix.

Haag and Miller had been arraigned on the Palmer-Merriman 7-Eleven holdup on April 25, but they were charged in the remaining incidents when they appeared in Westland 18th District Court on Thursday.

They waived their right to a preliminary hearing on all charges and were ordered to stand trial in Wayne County Circuit Court. Not-guilty pleas have been entered on the record for them.

They could face maximum sentences of life in prison if convicted as charged.

ditched may be premature, Jay Gilbert, the city's community development director, said Tuesday.

Several southeast end proposals could hinge on how much money Westland receives in Community Development Block Grant dollars. The city had expected to get \$1.3 million, but officials became worried about recent rumors of possible 25-percent cuts, Gilbert said.

Now, city officials have been told that the cuts aren't expected to exceed 5 percent.

"The cutbacks are not as severe as we thought," Gilbert said.

Still, several proposals remain in question, Gilbert confirmed Tuesday, although he said alternate funding methods may be available even if federal cutbacks are made.

The programs may be able to draw money from the state and the county, Gilbert said.

City officials simply don't have all the answers yet. But Gilbert, when questioned one by one about specific proposals, confirmed Tuesday that the following programs could be delayed:

- Efforts to fund home rental rehabilitation in the Carver subdivision and in the Norwayne neighborhood, the latter being bounded by Palmer, Merriman, Glenwood and Wildwood.

- Plans to help launch new home construction in the Carver area.

- Proposals to provide money to help low-income families buy homes.

- Hopes for continuing the development of Stottlemeyer Park, located north of Daney Street in the Annapolis Park subdivision.

Other proposals apparently are safe, Gilbert said, including plans to replace a major Van Born Road water main in the southeast end.

On Monday, Gilbert reminded southeast end residents that never before has their neighborhood been targeted for so many improvements in one year.

Moreover, he said he is "fairly confident that the federal government will come through" with money for the proposals.

Mayor Robert Thomas said he was surprised that residents would be critical at a time when the city is attempting so many improvements.

"I really am kind of flabbergasted at this kind of response," he said during Monday's hearing.

union of fighting for pay raises that he said the district simply couldn't afford. He blamed the union for causing school taxes to increase to a level that he said was unaffordable for a typical homeowner.

Warmbier also repeatedly called for efforts to improve student scores on achievement tests.

"He didn't talk around the issues. He was honest, and he had integrity," Moranty said. "We had a lot of the same viewpoints, and sometimes we weren't well-liked."

"Fred was a very caring person who wanted to do the right thing for people," he said. "I could trust Fred. He was honest and upright with people. His concern was for other people. And even though he was fairly well-off, he

had empathy for people whether it was financially or educationally."

Professionally, Warmbier retired in 1984 from Detroit Edison, where he was a director of property taxes.

As a public servant, he also served 15 years on the Wayne Planning Commission and 16 years on the city's Zoning Board of Appeals.

Warmbier formerly served as president of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church.

He is survived by his wife, Mildred; a son, Donald; three daughters, Janet Gainer, Marlene Brandenburg and Sandra Laraway; a sister, Loretta Thomas; a grandson, Justin Laraway; and a granddaughter, Amy Brandenburg.

Services were scheduled for Wednesday at St. John's church, with the Rev. Keith Schreiner officiating. Interment was in Glen Eden Memorial Park in Livonia.

Services for Helen Berthelot, Democratic Party activist, author, labor organizer and adviser to three generations of Michigan politicians, will be 3 p.m. Friday in Vermuelen Funeral Home, 980 Newburgh Road in Westland.

Berthelot, known as "Buffy" to her friends for the way she was buffer between the organizations she ran, died Monday in St. Mary Hospital. She was 91.

Berthelot started her career as a telephone operator and became an organizer for the Communications Workers of America. In 1948 she met G. Mennen Williams and managed his successful campaign for governor.

Her daughter, Margarette Beagle of Roscommon, said her mother "was the first woman to run a statewide political campaign for either party." Beagle also said her mother was the first woman labor lobbyist in Washington, D.C.

Berthelot chronicled the Williams era in Michigan in her book "Win Some, Lose Some," published last year.

Philip Power, chairman of the company which owns the Observer, met Berthelot in the early 1960s. "She was legend: formidable and quick, with snapping eyes and an efficient manner barely concealing her warmth and maternal feelings toward her young volunteer corps.

"Buffy Berthelot had a good sense of proportion and utility," wrote Power in a column last year.

Berthelot is survived by a son, Douglas R. of Westland; a daughter, Margarette Beagle of Roscommon; four grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren.

Series of votes can't resolve jail crowding issue

Three strikes, but it's not necessarily out.
 A resolution to authorize the Wayne County sheriff to find jail beds in other Michigan counties faced three votes Thursday, but failed because many commissioners felt it wasn't ready yet.
 A vote by the Wayne County Commission to pass it for the day failed. A vote to send it back to committee failed, and a vote to approve it failed.
 The resolution would allow the sheriff to enter into contracts with other coun-

ties to house Wayne County inmates under certain conditions, including limiting the number of beds to 150, the cost per bed couldn't exceed \$35 a day and contracts would only be with counties within the state of Michigan.
 But, the fact that Wayne County's Corporation Counsel had not signed off on the resolution and that there could be liability concerns for the county had some commissioners urging a delay in approval until the May 16 meeting.
 Other commissioners said the county

has waited enough and wanted to act.
 Commissioners called for opinions from three attorneys.
 Eric Smith, deputy chief/legal adviser for the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, said the sheriff's department was willing to move forward with the resolution while corporation counsel worked out any liability issues.
 William Noakes, of the county's Corporation Counsel office, said he had not reviewed the resolution and wasn't sure the resolution is in compliance with the

county's charter.
 Ben Washburn, general counsel for the county commission, said that although he had recommended in favor of approval at the committee level, he has found that some questions still need to be addressed.
 "I'm not willing to vote on it without the proper sign-offs," Vice Chair Kay Beard, D-Westland, said.
 A vote to pass it for the day was then voted down.
 Next, a motion was made to send the

resolution back to committee, which failed 6-6, with three absent.
 A motion was then made to approve the resolution, and it was also defeated 6-6 with one abstention, when a commissioner who had been absent during a previous vote came back into the room.
 Local commissioners Bruce Patterson, R-Canton Township, and Michelle Plawewski, D-Dearborn Heights, voted to approve. Vice Chair Kay Beard, D-Westland, voted against and Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, abstained.

James Brickley to speak in area

Michigan Supreme Court Justice James Brickley will discuss the Michigan court system and court reform at noon Wednesday, May 15, at the Canton Economic Club.

The economic club meets at Summit on the Park, Canton's new recreation/banquet complex, on Summit Parkway (Palmer Road), south of Cherry Hill Road. Cost is \$15 per person and includes lunch. Call Joan Noricks for reservations at 981-3002.

The Canton Economic Club is sponsored by Rudolph/Libbe Co. and the Observer Newspapers.

Brickley, 67, has served on the court since December 1982 when he was named by then-Gov. William G. Milliken to fill a vacancy. He served two terms as lieutenant governor before that and was a former gubernatorial candidate. He has also served as president of Eastern Michigan University, a member of the Detroit City Council and as a special agent for the FBI.

A native of Detroit, Brickley received his law degree from the University of Detroit. He also holds a master's in public admin-

istrative law from New York University.

Brickley lives in Traverse City. Brickley has been an advocate of court reform.

A plan, currently in the state House, could result in two years in the elimination of Detroit Recorder's Court.

In its simplest form, court reform means a single trial court instead of the current system of circuit, probate, district and Detroit Recorder's Court, with all having the same pay and same jurisdiction. Because probate courts are established by the constitution it would take a constitutional amendment to consolidate circuit and probate courts.

Detroit Recorder's Court, which handles criminal cases in both Detroit and out-Wayne County, could be abolished by Jan. 1, 1998, unless the city agrees to be responsible for funding it. Recorder's judges would be "grandfathered" as Wayne County circuit judges. Detroit is the only city in Michigan where countywide circuit judges don't try major criminal cases.

The latter step is a similar to a separate bill sponsored by Rep. Deborah Whyman, R-Canton. The Whyman bill would abolish Recorder's Court and grandfather its judges as circuit judges, but without the option of staying in business if Detroit pays for it.

Brickley opposes Whyman's bill.

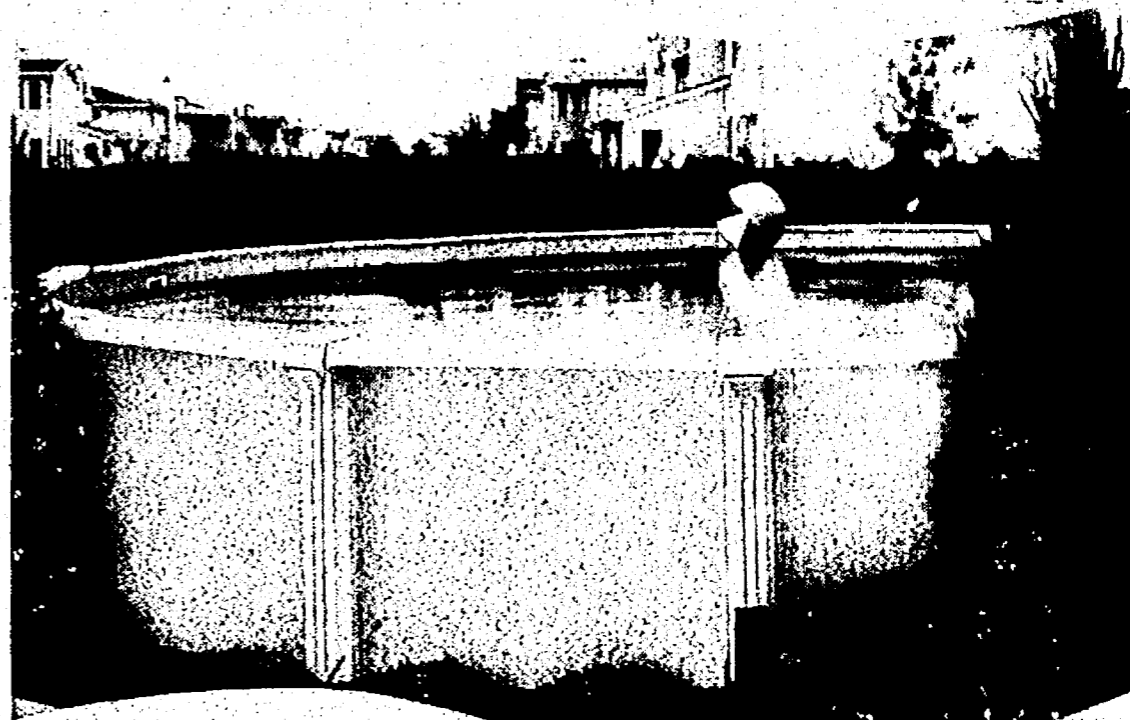

As I am sure you have read, Ford Motor Company recently announced a program to voluntarily recall 8.7 million vehicles to replace ignition switches. You should know that at the time we announced the recall, the actual number of complaints which may be related to the ignition switch in question was less than two hundredths of one percent of that total. Q: *What happened?*

Q: *What vehicles are affected by this voluntary recall?*

A: The following model year vehicles are affected:

- 1988-1992 Ford Mustang, Thunderbird, Tempo, and Mercury Cougar and Topaz.
- 1993 Ford Mustang, Thunderbird, Tempo, and Mercury Cougar and Topaz models built prior to October 1992.
- 1988-1989 Ford Crown Victoria, Mercury Grand Marquis and Lincoln Town Car.
- 1988-1991 Ford Aerostar, Ford Bronco full-size sport utility and Ford F-Series light truck.

Q: *What should I do?*

A: If you own one of these vehicles, you will receive a letter from us instructing you to take your vehicle to the Ford or Lincoln/Mercury dealer of your choice and have the switch replaced free of charge. However, you do not have to wait for our letter. You may contact your dealer and arrange to have the switch replaced immediately if you choose, free of charge.

Q: *How long will it take?*

A: The repair procedure should take about one hour. But please contact your dealer in advance to schedule a time that is convenient for you.

Judge, officials discuss Rouge authority idea

What do they want us to do and how much is it going to cost us?

Those were among the questions raised during a hearing in U.S. District Court Judge John Feikens' courtroom in Detroit Tuesday on Rouge River pollution and formation of a regional watershed authority.

The informational hearing was part of a process resulting from a lawsuit filed in the late '70s by the Environmental Protection Agency and the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, Feikens said.

"The address of those lawsuits cannot be made in a purely legal proceeding," Feikens said. "That's why we're engaged in the development of a watershed, so that standards can be set," he said.

Local and county officials heard a presentation on pollution levels in the Rouge River and responded with questions about what municipalities, which are already dealing with the cost of containing their combined sewer overflows, would be required to do to keep pollutants out of the river and how much it would cost.

Feikens urged officials to be patient, as the requirements will be worked out as the board is set up.

"As a federal judge is it my

task to appropriately enforce federal law," Feikens said. The mechanisms in place to address the problem have not been adequate, he said.

"Of course I could hold hearings and fine communities not in compliance with the law. It seems to me that does not meet the goals of what we have to find together," he said.

"You are in a position, in my view, to help frame the standards," Feikens said.

"Your community should be involved in regulatory standards. To bring about that kind of development is vital," he said.

The Rouge Program Office is conducting monitoring and sampling of river water quality at 53 sites in the Rouge. Lou Regemorter, an environmental engineer and manager of the Rouge River sampling program, gave a slide presentation focused on bacteria and dissolved oxygen levels in the river as indicators of the quality of water and their effects on human and aquatic health. The sampling and data evaluation are ongoing and that raised concerns about when goals would be set.

"It's not appropriate for Wayne County and the Rouge Program Office to set goals. I think that's up to the local communities," James Murray, director of the Wayne County Department of Environment, said.

"The goals and objectives are

really between the local communities and the regulatory agencies," he said.

Attorney Charles Moon, one of the court monitors in the case, outlined what the drain board would do. He said limits would be set on sewage, waste matter, and pollutants of any kind that drain into the river, a drain code would be established so that discharges can be dealt with and flood control would be addressed.

"An intercounty drainage (board) creates a body that sets those standards," Moon said. "It has to operate on the basis of fairness and equity."

Inkster Mayor Edward Bivens complained that the retention basin projects in his community have cost \$26 million. "What if the watershed decides other measures need to be taken? What are we going to do?" he asked.

"The concern you speak of must at some point be addressed. I'm not unaware that you have that problem. That's why we have communities coming together voluntarily," Feikens said.

The next informational hearing will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday, June 11, in Feikens' courtroom (858) at the Theodore Levin U.S. Courthouse on West Lafayette in Detroit. Department of Environmental Quality officials are expected to make a presentation.

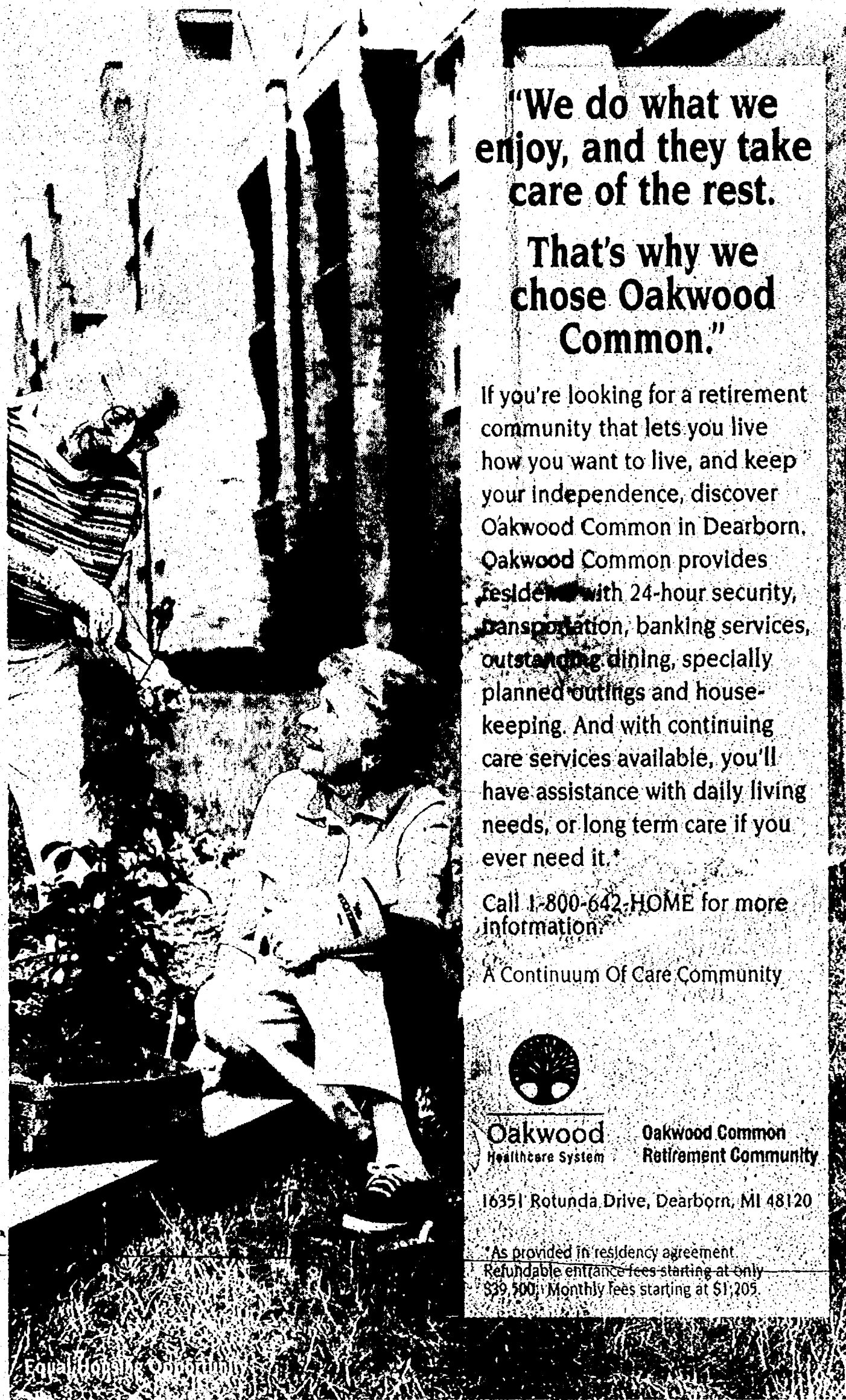

A.D.D. & Comprehension Related To Vision Problems

Eight-year-old Amanda was struggling in school. "My daughter tried very hard in school and found little success. When second grade began, something..." shares her mother, "...didn't click."

Her story is typical.

New hope has been found, however.

Vision is responsible for 80% of learning. And the vision system for many children, especially those with A.D.D., is deficient in giving these children the ability to learn.

Testing has shown that in many A.D.D. cases, the child's focus is not clear and is often double, causing learning to suffer.

Local optometrist, Dr. John P. Jacobi, has been working extensively with children with learning difficulties, and with tremendous success.

"We can make significant changes for these children," states Dr. Jacobi. "Many times extensive motor and perceptual testing is given, but not a single test is given for eyesight and vision. In most cases, vision has a great deal to do with the child's problems."

"These are little boys who are acting out in frustration, 3rd graders who have run into a brick wall academically, even college students who can't study without getting terrible headaches."

What is the end result? We asked the parents of Dr. Jacobi's patients.

"Her memory has greatly improved! Homework time has been cut in half. She gets most of her work done in school now," one parent describes. "I think the vision therapy program was wonderful."

"Increased concentration, at home and school, increased self-esteem," David's mother shares. His school teacher reports improved overall behavior, improved concentration, less distractibility. "His school work is improved - correct, neat, and assignments are completed on time."

"She is anxious to go back to school. She knows there is now hope to improve instead of being so defeated all the time," adds the mother of 18-year-old Sara. "My biggest regret is that we were not aware of this program while she was still in school."

Working with other specialists in the field of Attention Deficit and learning disabilities, Dr. Jacobi is helping to get the word out to have children's vision tested. A free vision screening for vision-related learning problems is offered in his Livonia office at (313) 525-8170.

The following is a list of symptoms parents should be alert to:

- Avoids reading and near work, cannot sit still or finish a task. This is often caused by double vision and eyestrain to focus, aim, or visually concentrate.
- Loses his place while reading, skips words, moves whole head back and forth, uses his fingers to follow, sometimes "impulsive." Poor control of eye movements will bring these results.
- Tilting the head while working up close, covering an eye, developing headaches after reading and paperwork are all signs of problems with eye teaming. "Children typically do not report poor vision, they assume everybody sees the way they do," notes Dr. Jacobi.
- Poor handwriting can also be the result of poor eye-hand coordination.
- Poor spelling, the child may even pass the test but cannot recall the words one week later. Reversing letters (sometimes identified as "dyslexia"). This is often the result of poor visual memory.

It may be the explanation for the struggles many children go through.

It's worth a simple phone call to find out.



Sought quality Warmbier played major role

Fred Warmbier made an impact on the Wayne-Westland school district during his 18 years of service on the board of education.

While many didn't agree with his conservative philosophy, no one questioned his views that students and the quality of education should be the highest priorities.

Memories of Mr. Warmbier, who died Sunday evening after a lengthy illness, surfaced this week. The long-time board member, who was one month short of his 77th birthday when he died, may be mostly remembered for his criticisms of the Wayne-Westland Education Association, the union which represents teachers in collective bargaining matters.

But the Observer recalls that Mr. Warmbier wasn't opposed to teachers' unions for any conservative philosophical bent, but only to make sure that overtaxed homeowners got the most bang for their buck. Basically, he demanded better performance on academic tests.

While many teachers were upset about Warmbier's stance on pay raises, they should realize that he only wanted to improve the quality of education and the board and administration can't accomplish that goal if money intended for equipment and additional staffers is redirected to pay raises for existing

employees.

While it's not as appealing as voting on budgets, millage rates or union contracts, it's also important that board members - like Mr. Warmbier - are sensitive to the many little things that residents bring to the board.

For example, at his last meeting in June, 1993, a parent thanked Mr. Warmbier for understanding the complaint that parents shouldn't have to pay a fine for a damaged textbook.

He will probably be most remembered for the battle he and fellow board member David Moranty waged in the mid-1980s, pointing out that the administration overstated the district's adult education enrollment.

During the years Mr. Warmbier served on the board, the district had the highest or second highest millage rate in the state.

He was acutely aware of the financial burden carried by local homeowners as well as the problem of declining Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) academic tests.

In reviewing the district's up and downs Fred Warmbier will certainly be a major part of the community's history.

Election season under way

As of 4 p.m. Tuesday, May 14, the 1996 election process officially gets underway. That's the day that candidates for partisan and non-partisan elected offices are required to file their nominating petitions for the Aug. 6 primary election.

By then, voters will know for sure who is running for local, county and state offices in their western Wayne communities.

Those who have filed nominating petitions by the deadline have had no easy task. Each candidate had to obtain signatures for their petitions. That onerous task generally weeds out those would-be candidates who are not serious about throwing their hats into the political ring.

From now until the Aug. 6 primary election, you will likely be deluged with campaign literature from candidates. Take time to read the pamphlets and flyers. Be sure to seek out information about the candidates seeking election in your particular community.

When candidate forums are announced, take the time to attend so you can meet those residents who want your vote and a chance to represent your interests in the political arena.

For all its faults and frailties, the election process still works for our representative form of government.

And it works even better when the electorate goes to the ballot box with an informed vote.

- Tickets are on sale for all the summer concert series at Pine Knob.

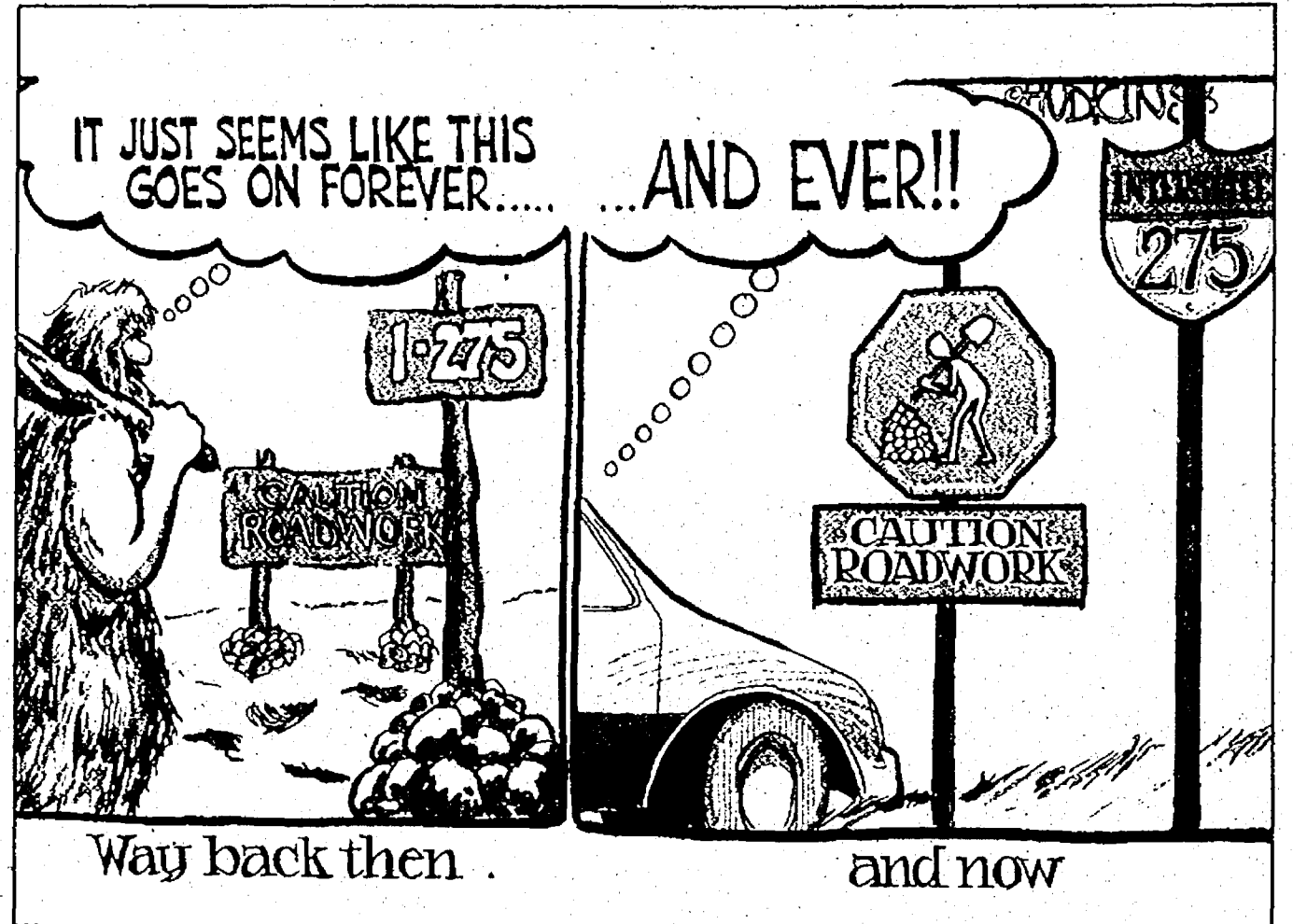
- The season for runs and walks to benefit charity is well under way, including the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation's Great Strides Walks the weekend of May 18.

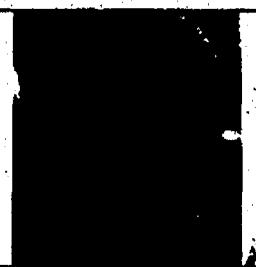

Today's children need to learn resilience

Resiliency refers to the ability to "bounce back" from adversity and stress. As parents we strive to protect our children from misfortune but we also know that it is not always possible to do so.

Changes in family circumstances, loss of jobs, illness, problems with substance abuse, and sometimes just the trials of everyday living can cause tremendous stress in families with traumatic repercussions for children. Children need the skills to handle such stress productively - to be resilient.

A phrase often occurring in the literature sums up the resilient child as one who "works well, plays well, loves well, and expects well." What more could we want for our children?

Although we have all seen examples of children raised in the best situations go astray and children who have endured terrible home situations come out on top, parenting the

resilient child is not just a matter of chance. There are a number of protective factors that can be fostered within the family. The following tips for raising resilient children are based on the research of Dr. Peter Benson of the Search Institute of Minneapolis who has conducted a national study of sixth- through twelfth-graders.

Family support is a critical factor in the raising of healthy children. Children need to have frequent conversations with parent(s) and view them as sources of advice and support. In addition, it is helpful for children to have access to another non-parent adult in whom they can confide. This may be a grandparent, aunt, uncle, neighbor, teacher, or other responsible adult in the child's life.

Children need to have boundaries. Parents should set rules and have consequences for when those rules are broken. Discipline should be consistently administered and "fit the crime." Research suggests that students spend no more than three

nights per week out with friends. Parents need to monitor who those friends are.

Providing opportunities for involvement in structured activities is another key to raising resilient children. Parents should encourage participation in school activities including sports, clubs, and organizations. Community organizations and activities such as scouting or sports leagues offer other possibilities for structured time use. Music lessons and practice are also recommended activities. Involvement in church or synagogues provides yet another avenue for structuring the way your child spends his or her day.

Parents need to foster a commitment to education as their children grow. This can be accomplished by taking an interest in their school work, monitoring homework, and attending school functions.

While children need to be encouraged to do their very best, parents need to be realistic in their expectations. An all-A report card is not within the reach of every child. Age-appropriate conversations with children about their futures and the expectation that they will pursue an educational program beyond high school, whether it be a trade or technical program or college, are also important.

Positive values are one of the hallmarks of resilient children. These children value the worth of themselves and others and are therefore less likely to engage in harmful behaviors such as substance abuse, sexual activity, and gang involvement. Parents can help their children acquire positive values by discussing their own values and beliefs, setting expectations, and most importantly, providing a good role model. The old adage of "do as I say, not as I do," doesn't work here.

Resilient children are identifiable by their social competence. Social competence evolves when children

feel good about themselves, can stand up for what they believe in, and are able to make good choices. Children need to develop good decision-making skills. Giving them opportunities to make choices appropriate for their age level and helping them to weigh the consequences of those choices is a way for parents to help in developing this skill.

Parenting is a difficult job but can be one of life's most rewarding pleasures. While there are no guarantees, parents who take the time to be involved in their child's world, provide structure and consistency, and reinforce healthy choices are most likely to meet with success.

Public school enemies keep pushing their agenda

By now, anyone who reads should be wise to the voucher plot.

The plot is to avoid a direct attack on the section of the Michigan Constitution which prohibits aid to private and church-related schools. Instead the plotters will nibble, nibble, nibble at the edges, then say: "Well, we might as well have vouchers because we aid private schools in so many other ways."

We saw the voucher plot at work last month as the state Senate mauled the driver's ed bill. First, the Senate removed the "mandate" (ugh! dirty word!) that public school kids be taught to drive.

Next it amended the bill to offer a \$100 voucher that a student could take to a private driving school and buy lessons. The money-hungry wolf got another paw inside the door.

It remains to be seen if the House

will be suckered into buying that amendment.

In March, the plot was moved along when lawmakers passed a bill sponsored by Rep. Jessie Dalman, R-Holland, with the clever title of "a bill to establish post secondary enrollment options for certain students."

"Options" - what a slick disguise for transferring taxpayers' money to private schools.

The bill expands a program allowing high school students to enroll for a course in private and church-related colleges and take their state aid to the K-12 school with them. "This is one more effort to put a nail in the coffin of public schools," objected Sen. Jim Berryman, D-Adrian. We can ignore Berryman - can't we? - because he's running for governor.

In past months, some of us have pointed to the misnamed "charter

schools" that are being so loosely licensed, particularly by Central Michigan University.

The law calls them "public school academies." Most are not, of course. Two-thirds or more were previously existing private schools, many with ethnic and religious agendas.

If you want to know how "public" these charter schools are, check your June 10 ballot when you vote for local

school trustees. Look high and low for "public school academy" board candidates. Hint: Don't hold your breath until you find them on the ballot.

Off in the wings is Dr. Paul DeWeese, a physician who is at least honest about his intentions. DeWeese wants to amend the state constitution to strike out the language that voters, by a 300,000 majority, added in 1970:

"No public monies or property shall be appropriated or paid by any public credit utilized, by the legislature or any other political subdivision or agency of the state directly or indirectly to aid or maintain any private, denomination or other nonpublic, pre-elementary, elementary, or secondary school."

DeWeese is an embarrassment to the plotters because he is so forthright. Their tactic is to drain off the school aid fund, a dollar here and 50

cents there, all couched in the free-market language of parents' options.

Gov. John Engler is known to be partial to parochial schools. That's his and Michelle's right. Michigan does not go so far as some jurisdictions in the world by outlawing parochial schools. In fact, our constitution protects freedom of religious worship and gives tax-free status to religious schools. Those are pretty generous "options."

What we will see is a series of these tiny raids on the budget, all in the name of giving parent options. The goal is to soften up television watchers and talk-radio listeners over a few years into believing that parochial is here, and all we need to do is bring our constitution up to date. Readers won't be fooled.

Term limits won't provide answer to all our problems

Over the weekend, I happened to share a platform at the University of Michigan commencement with 13th District U.S. Rep. Lynn Rivers.

"How are things going?" I asked. "Terrible," she replied. "It's an election year, and by now all we do is driven entirely by politics. Everything - literally every thing - is spinning and pandering."

She's right, of course. That's the price we pay for living in a democracy.

OK. But here's a question: Given the vast popularity of term limits in the polls, how come the U.S. Senate recently voted down a bill to enact term limitations on members of Congress?

Certainly, much of the momentum for term limits was the 1994 election. Voters figured out they had their own tried and true system of term limits: Vote out the incumbent rascals.

Moreover, most voters are pretty conservative about making big changes in the fundamentals of our political system. Better to see how the idea has worked out in the 20 states that have adopted term limits since 1990, before amending the U.S. Constitution.

Michigan voters adopted in 1992 a referendum that limited state representatives to three two-year terms. Newly-elected state senators and the governor, as of 1994, may serve only two, four-year terms.

The idea was to get back to replace career officeholders with citizen politicians and to cut the corruption, pork-barreling and arrogance that so characterize legislatures.

What's the evidence so far? Already Michigan's term limits have produced a lot of legislative turnover. The highly respected Republican speaker of the House, Paul Hillemonds, has decided not to run for re-election, while GOP Sen. Doug Carl, citing term limits, has announced plans to run for Macomb County treasurer.

A lot of state reps already are figuring out how to run for the state Senate in 1998, when they hit the term limit barrier. There's going to be a lot of churn over the next few years, plus lots of jostling for leadership positions as senior legislators tromp off into the sunset.

If nothing else, getting rid of long-term legislators means the loss of lots of experience. "We'll lose a lot of institutional memory," said Hillemonds. This will change the balance of power in Lansing, according to Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek. "We've made the governor a pro-consul (a Roman district ruler). We're giving inordinate power to the professional staff and bureaucracy."

Not to mention the dreaded lobbyists. While term limits will eliminate the long-standing, bipartisan "old boys network" that has run the Legislature for years, it may also introduce much more sharply partisan people and confrontation dynamics into the political process. A quick look at the celebrated - and radical - Republican freshman class in the U.S. House tends to confirm this fear.

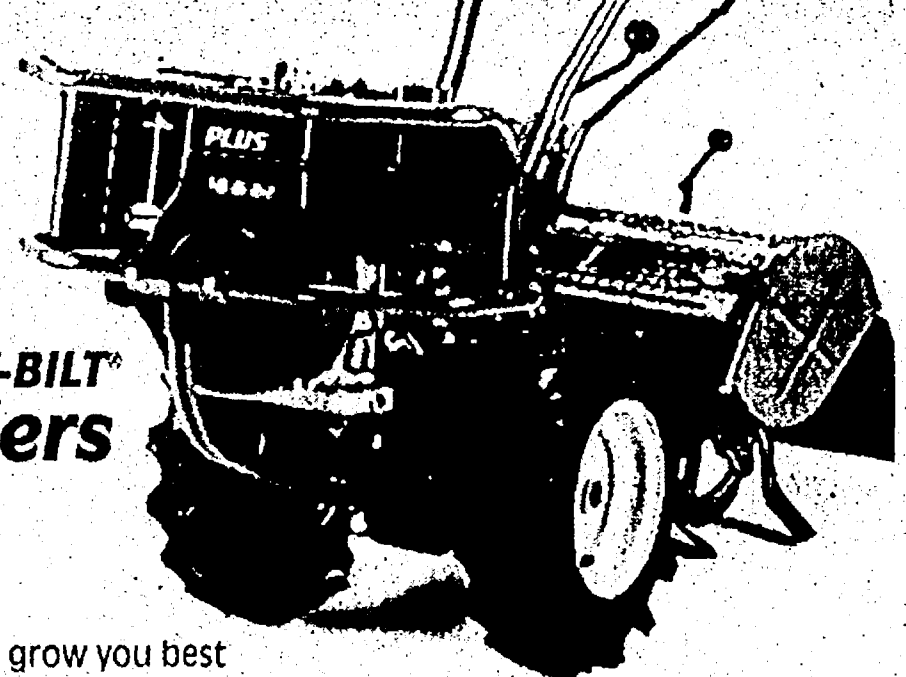
Specific legislative issues also will be affected by term limits. For example, Wayne State University President David Adamany testified that because of the loss of institutional memory in the Legislature, university "funding arrangements are likely to become highly unpredictable and even chaotic." Adamany urged the Legislature to adopt a funding formula for universities before chaos descends.

Originally, I supported term limits. And although the evidence is still not fully in, I am beginning to think that moves to limit terms are largely an exercise in scapegoating, and little more than a bad idea whose time has come.

In and of itself, limiting the time folks can serve will not ensure that good people run for office.

Survey: Fix, don't expand, roads

Folks in Detroit, the suburbs and the outlying regions of Livingston County all agree: Freeways are bad, local roads are bad, safety measures are needed, but new road capacity is a low priority.

A new survey shows southeastern Michigan residents think outstate roads are better than metro area roads, and Michiganians give lower marks to their state than other Americans do to their own states.

"If only limited funds were available for road improvements in the region, the top preference is for traffic safety improvements, followed closely by maintenance of the road pavement. The expansion of the capacity of existing roads is a distant third on the preference scale," said a summary of a survey by Market Opinion Research made for Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

MOR in January sampled 2,400 households — 300 each in Detroit, suburban Wayne County, Oakland, Livingston, Washtenaw, Macomb and St. Clair counties.

No one expressed surprise at anything when SEMCOG traffic expert Carmine

Palombo unveiled results to SEMCOG's executive committee.

"In the past, we tried to hold public meetings, and got five or six people to show up," Palombo said. His own conclusion: "People don't think we have a very good road system, and they're willing to ante up more for it."

Results were remarkably uniform in all units with two exceptions:

- Only drivers in Livingston, Monroe and St. Clair counties used gravel roads much. They rated gravel roads poor but preferred improving existing paved roads over paving gravel roads.

- Detroiters expressed the strongest desire for improved public transportation. Six percent of Detroiters used buses; 2 percent used them in Washtenaw County; bus use was negligible elsewhere.

Some highlights:
ROAD SYSTEM — 43 percent rated the freeways and roads as poor to very poor. More than half of Oakland residents gave them bad marks. Livingston residents were most likely to consider freeway congestion as serious to very serious.

Whereas 22 percent in southeastern Michi-

gan gave good to excellent marks to their freeways or roads, other Americans gave their roads 42 percent good-excellent ratings.

DRIVING — "Tailgating," or driving too closely, outranked drunk driving and speeding as a serious to very serious traffic problem. In out- Wayne County, it was cited by 63 percent; Oakland 58 percent; Livingston 58 percent; and Detroit 60 percent.

Drunk driving scored in the 30s and 40s as a serious to very serious problem, speeding in the 40s to lower 50s.

Running red lights got high marks in Detroit and suburban Wayne County as a serious problem, lower marks in the rest of the region. Elderly drivers with diminished capacity scored 21 to 34 percent as a serious traffic safety problem.

PUBLIC TRANSIT — 52 percent of the region called public transportation "somewhat adequate" while 18 percent rated it "not at all adequate" and 18 percent "very adequate."

Detroiters gave their system 24 percent bad marks; suburban Wayne, 16 percent; Oakland 21 percent; Livingston, Monroe and Macomb, all tied at 13 percent bad.

As Pam Stenzel sees it, teen-agers can make good decisions, if they know the facts.

That's why the Minnesota resident founded and now serves as director of Straight Talk, an organization established to educate teens about the issues of sexuality and the importance of chastity.

Stenzel will be in town next week to present her "Sex Has a Price Tag" talk to students at 12 area schools and at youth rally, courtesy of the AAA Crisis Pregnancy Center.

This is the second year the Livonia-based agency has brought in a national speaker to talk to students at area schools. Last year, six schools agreed to offering the program, and with an extra push, the center was able to double the number this year.

"There's nothing negative about teaching abstinence," said Diane Costlow, the center's director. "The message used to be to wait and a few did, but the message now is we expect you to do it and you should do it safely."

Stenzel has spoken to more than 250,000 teen-agers across the country on the subjects of teen pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases and AIDS. When she talks to young people, she talks about the consequences of sex outside of marriage in three basic categories - physical,

emotional and those incurred by the innocent parties.

"I firmly believe young people are capable of making, healthy decisions, if they are given the facts," said Stenzel. "The problem with most 'sex education' is that teens are given half truths and are not made aware of all the consequences of their decisions."

Stenzel will be in town Monday through Wednesday, May 13-15, and

will take her message to Clarenceville, Wayne Memorial, Westland John Glenn, Livonia Franklin, Detroit Redford, Redford Union and Ladywood high schools as well as several parochial schools, including Plymouth Christian, St. Damian and St. Priscilla.

She will close out her visit with a rally for youth groups of the 56 churches that support the center. Junior and senior high school stu-

dents and their parents are invited to attend the rally at 7 p.m. May 15 in St. Priscilla's Hall, 19120 Purlingbrook, west of Middlebelt Road and north of Seven Mile Road, Livonia.

"We promote good sexual attitudes," said Costlow. "We tell them that you have to exercise discipline.

"If you cannot stay with one partner when you are not married, what



can possibly get without bursting into flame. It yelled, it screamed "RED." And it was shiny. Overly, unrealistically shiny. My husband had seen to that. He'd taken one of our bath towels and rubbed the road dust off just before we went on our ride. I take that back. He'd taken TWO of our bath towels to DAB the road dust off. Rubbing might've put microscopic scratches in the SCREAMING RED paint.

I eyed the car before I dared approach it. It seemed to say, "Don't even think about sitting in my seat, it's real leather. Real expensive leather. And look at you. You're wearing a sweatshirt

with cake frosting smeared in the sleeve and tennis shoes with uneven laces. And you didn't brush your hair."

I had. But the car was just that kind of car. Snippy. High falutin'. The "nyah, nyah, nyah, boot, boot, I'm way, better than you" kind of car. The kind that wouldn't even notice or be impressed if you had brushed your hair or gone to the most expensive hair cutting place in the whole world or had a facelift. It wouldn't even blink if you'd happened to cure a hideous disease that very day. It was just that kind of car. Stuck on itself. And it screamed in its red, red voice, "Everyone. Look at me.

LOOK AT ME. Ain't I coo-oooh?"

I wouldn't dare tell this heap of conceit, "No. You are not. So there."

I climbed into this contraption. I felt like I was inside a well. And then he began chanting. And the chant kept coming back to the same refrain, "RPMmmmmmmmm. RPMmmmmmmmm."

makes you think you can when you're married?

"I think if we give kids the message that they should wait, kids will get that message, but that's not the message they get. Our expectations for our children are lower now, and kids will do what their parents expect

them to do."

Since it is a Christian ministry and pro-life, it receives no government funding and relies on the generosity of individuals and church groups that support its mission to meet the physical, emotional and spiritual needs and offer an alternative to abor-

tion.

"In February, we had \$40 in checking and needed the rent of \$1,370; the next day a check came in from a person we had never heard of," said Costlow. "He had heard us speak at church the year before and promised himself he would send us 10 percent of his next Chrysler profit-sharing check.

"It seems that when we need something, it's taken care of."

The center was able to land a grant of \$1,000 from the Redford Suburban League to cover part of the \$3,700 cost of brining Stenzel into speak. The center has two grants pending, but could use donations to defray

expenses, Costlow said.

Word-of-mouth and the Yellow Pages are the primary ways women find out about the center; some come as referrals from Planned Parenthood and government social services agencies.

Costlow believes the decline in abortions has accounted for the increase in clients at the center. Since 1990, the number of women helped has jumped from 250 to more than 17,000 a year between 1993 and 1995.

"Our client load has leveled off because abortions are down and abstinence is really being taught at various places," Costlow said. "I think the reason we have grown is because we are meeting

practical needs."

Meeting needs

Women initially come to the center for a pregnancy test. Some people don't need the services of the center, since they are happy to discover they are pregnant. For those in crisis, the center offers counseling and referrals.

The Center relies on Joe Iskra's "Faith, Hope and Love" program which goes to churches to find families that will "adopt" women in crisis. It also has several church-based day care centers that provide low-cost care and a shepherd homes - families who take in pregnant young women with no family support into their homes.

The center also provides for material needs. It has one room stocked with maternity clothes and another filled with baby clothes, diapers, formula and cribs, which are in short supply. Much of the latter items are collected at baby showers - local churches hold to benefit the center.

"We offer clients two options to abortion: parenting and adoption," Costlow said. "We don't say 'have your baby and have a good life.' We help with their needs. We have a network of 56 churches and people who have business connections.

"We had one client who need-

ed white nurse's uniforms. St. Mary Hospital donated six and the money to buy shoes."

But Costlow the "talents and interests" of the volunteers for making it possible. They go out of their way to help the clients.

One such volunteer is retired mathematics teacher Bud McCalla, who also is a certified mechanic. He donates his time by fixing old cars and giving them to clients in need of transportation. He's given 6-8 cars to clients in the last six months, and if the cars break down, he goes to the client's home to fix it, Costlow said.

Another retiree, Ken Kop, has stepped in to provide leadership as board president and a counselor. His wife Joanne also is a master counselor at the center.

"We have volunteers who spend up to 30 hours a week here... and they're volunteers," Costlow said. "When I started here in 1990 we had nine volunteers and we were only open 17 hours a week. Now we're open 47 hours a week because we have these people."

Early milk-drinking habits can prevent osteoporosis

"Mother knows best" when it comes to advising daughters about the value of milk to help build strong bones to last a lifetime. And according to a new study published in the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition, daughters are following mom's example at the dinner table.

Researchers from Oregon State University in Corvallis found that some daughters are patterning their milk consumption after their mothers, a practice that may help reduce their future risk of osteoporosis. It's a welcome news this Mother's Day, the official start of National Osteoporosis Prevention Week, May 12-18.

Today, more than eight million Americans suffer from osteoporosis and 17 million more are at high risk due to low bone mass. Eighty percent of these individuals are women. Due to the increase in life expectancy, the worldwide incidence of osteoporosis is predicted to increase threefold over the next 60 years.

Researchers agree that osteoporosis is preventable and treatable. One of the best strategies to prevent disease is maintaining adequate calcium intake and starting early in life to build peak bone mass.

Unfortunately, government food consumption surveys reveal that more than 50 percent of women fail to meet their needs for calcium. Simply put, they aren't drinking their milk or consuming enough other dairy products - the predominant sources of calcium available from food.

"The adolescent years represent an important time period for building bone mass," according to author Cornelia Ulrich, who conducted the mother-daughter pairs research at Oregon State University. "If we really want to do something to reduce the incidence of osteoporosis, we must start by working on our teens and our children to foster skeletal health."

Positive influences

Ulrich and her colleagues found that a mother's milk-drinking practices can positively influence those of her daughter's which can leave her on better

ground to withstand the loss of bone mass that comes with aging.

"If mom has a lifelong high milk consumption, her daughter seems to drink lots of milk as well," Ulrich said.

Coined by medical professionals as the "silent thief" due to its slow onset and lack of warning signs, osteoporosis costs the nation in hospital and nursing home bills more than \$10 billion annually. The disease is characterized by decreased bone mass and increased risk of fractures. A broken bone is often the first sign that there has been a serious bone loss. But, according to Ulrich, "many of the 1.5 million annual bone fractures attributed to osteoporosis might be reduced by committing to calcium-rich foods like milk and dairy products at an early age."

According to a recent study of more than 5,500 women from six countries in southern Europe, published in the Journal of Bone Mineral Research, early milk drinking had a significant impact on hip fracture risk. The authors estimate that an adequate calcium intake from milk between 18 and 50 years of age decreased the risk of hip fractures by 35 percent in this study.

Another recent study, published in Medicine and Science in Sports and Exercise, linked higher reported milk intake during the second decade of life with greater leg bone density. The researchers found that calcium

Today, more than eight million Americans suffer from osteoporosis and 17 million more are at high risk due to low bone mass.

intake from milk products was more strongly correlated with bone measurements than was total calcium intake. They assert that a potential reason for this finding may be that calcium from milk products is better utilized by the body than calcium from a combination of other foods and supplements.

11-24 years of age need even more calcium, at least 1,200 mg or four servings of dairy products daily.

However, some health organizations, including the National Osteoporosis Foundation and an

expert panel convened by the National Institutes of Health in 1994, say the RDA for calcium is too low. They assert that the RDA focuses on the maintenance

of calcium balance, but additional calcium — 1,000 mg each day for adults — is required to maximize peak bone mass and minimize bone loss. NIH also recommends that adolescents and young adults should aim for 1,200 to 1,500 mg per day.

While many foods contain calcium, they are not created equally. Dairy products are the richest source of well-absorbed calcium, according to Connie Weaver, professor of foods and nutrition at Purdue University. For example, a person would need to consume nearly eight cups of spinach to absorb the amount of calcium absorbed from one cup of milk, she said. Spinach may offer calcium, but it also contains substances that can reduce absorption. Calcium food in other leafy greens may be better absorbed, but large quantities would need to be eaten to contribute sufficient amounts of calcium.

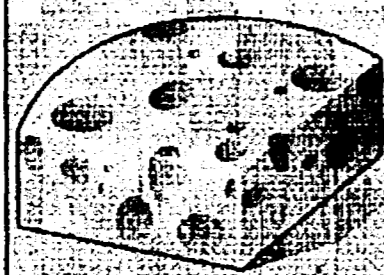
Weaver offers these immediate strategies to help women reduce the risk of osteoporosis:

- Include three or more servings of dairy foods in your meal plan each day. Without dairy in your diet, it's difficult to meet

Calcium gap

calcium requirements.

• Don't forget about vitamin D. Milk is fortified with vitamin D, which helps your body absorb calcium.

• Step up weight-bearing physical activity. Aim for 30-40 minutes of exercise at least three times a week.

• Avoid smoking and excessive alcohol intake.

• Consider estrogen replacement therapy, if you are going through menopause.

Comedians yuck it up 'Just for Laughs'

Nathan Vestal sees his Sanctum Entertainment Complex in downtown Pontiac as a one-stop location for fun.

High-energy dance music throbs against the stained-glass windows on the main floor of the former First Congregational Church, now known as the Sanctum nightclub. In a back room, fashionable twentysomethings get down in the groove room, which features music from the 1970s and 1980s.

Downstairs, in the former gymnasium, comedians yuck it up with patrons at the boldly decorated Just For Laughs comedy club.

The one-two punch of Vestal's building is the advantage that Just for Laughs has over other local comedy clubs, the Rochester resident said.

"One of the original concepts was to cross-pollinate it (the two clubs). So many (comedy) clubs have a terrible habit of putting you out on the streets after a show. We get to send them upstairs to the Sanctum for free and dance and sight see," said the former manager of Pike Street restaurant who also owns Diamonds and Spurs country bar/concert hall in Pontiac.

When Vestal opened Just For Laughs six months ago it was his mission to get the club recognized as a first-class theater. He got himself listed in comedy club guides, once hired a professional company to book shows, and

called every single comedian he could think of in a two-week period.

As a result, the club has hosted comedians like A.J. Jamal of "In Living Colour" and "Comic Justice," Mike Saccone of VH-1's "Stand Up Spotlight" and A&E's "Evening at the Improv," and Billy Garan of "Caroline's Comedy House" and "Comedy Central."

"I've had great performers. What I've tried to do is get a good blend of different talent."

Within the first few months of opening, Vestal wasn't completely satisfied so he tweaked a few things to bring Just For Laughs closer to perfection.

Most noticeable, he replaced the original in-house comedy troupe, Mr. Paulie's Fruit and Vegetable Company, with the Oakland County-based Totally Unrehearsed Theatre.

"We've done things different since the first show, with the introduction of Totally Unrehearsed Theatre. It adds a totally different dimension to the club. The act is totally different every week," Vestal said.

The 3 1/2-year-old group — which Karen Bell-Brege and Darrin Brege of Novi, Kirk Rosey of Troy, Kirk Hanley of Farmington, Dan Snyder of Garden City, and John Fountain of Ann Arbor — hosts the open mic night on Wednesdays. It allows five comedians, including two to three rookies, the chance to come in and practice material before an audience.

"Ultimately I'd like my open

mic night to be the strongest night of the week. It's a real healthy climate for (amateurs). It's not so easy to get on stage," Vestal said.

The improv troupe's repertoire includes a take-off on "Jeopardy" where the audience shouts out answers and the group members have to come up with the questions.

"Party Quirks" is another of the group's popular games. Audience members yell quirks to the host of an imaginary party. Each member of the group has to act out that particular quirk. It's up to the host to guess which one each member is doing.

"That's why people keep coming back. Our show is 90 percent sketch comedy and 10 percent improv," Bell-Brege said.

Totally Unrehearsed Theatre, which got its start and still performs on Tuesdays at Mark Ridley's Comedy Castle in Royal Oak, is enjoying its time at Just for Laughs.

"We love Nathan's club but it's hard because Pontiac is not established (as an entertainment center yet). It's a big secret. It has great art galleries and coffee shops," said Karen Bell-Brege, who founded the troupe with Gilda Hauser.

Vestal explained that Pontiac's reputation may be keeping people from exploring the city.

"People don't realize how safe Pontiac is. There's very little vandalism. People barely get confronted anymore. The City of Pontiac has done backflips to make sure everybody feels safe."

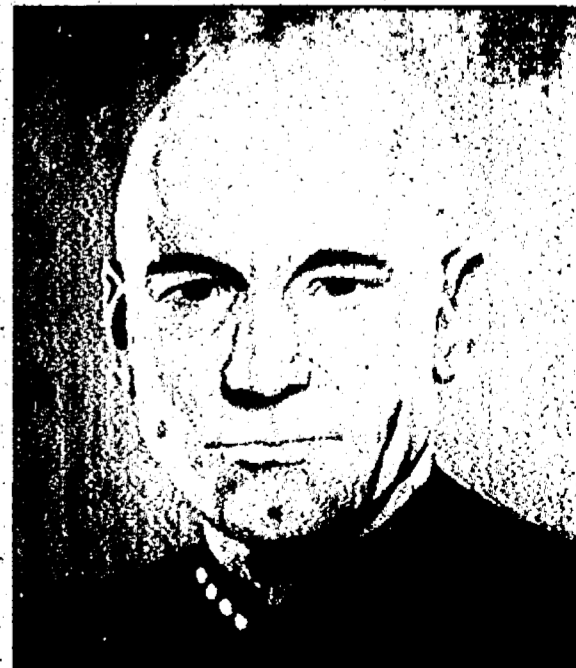
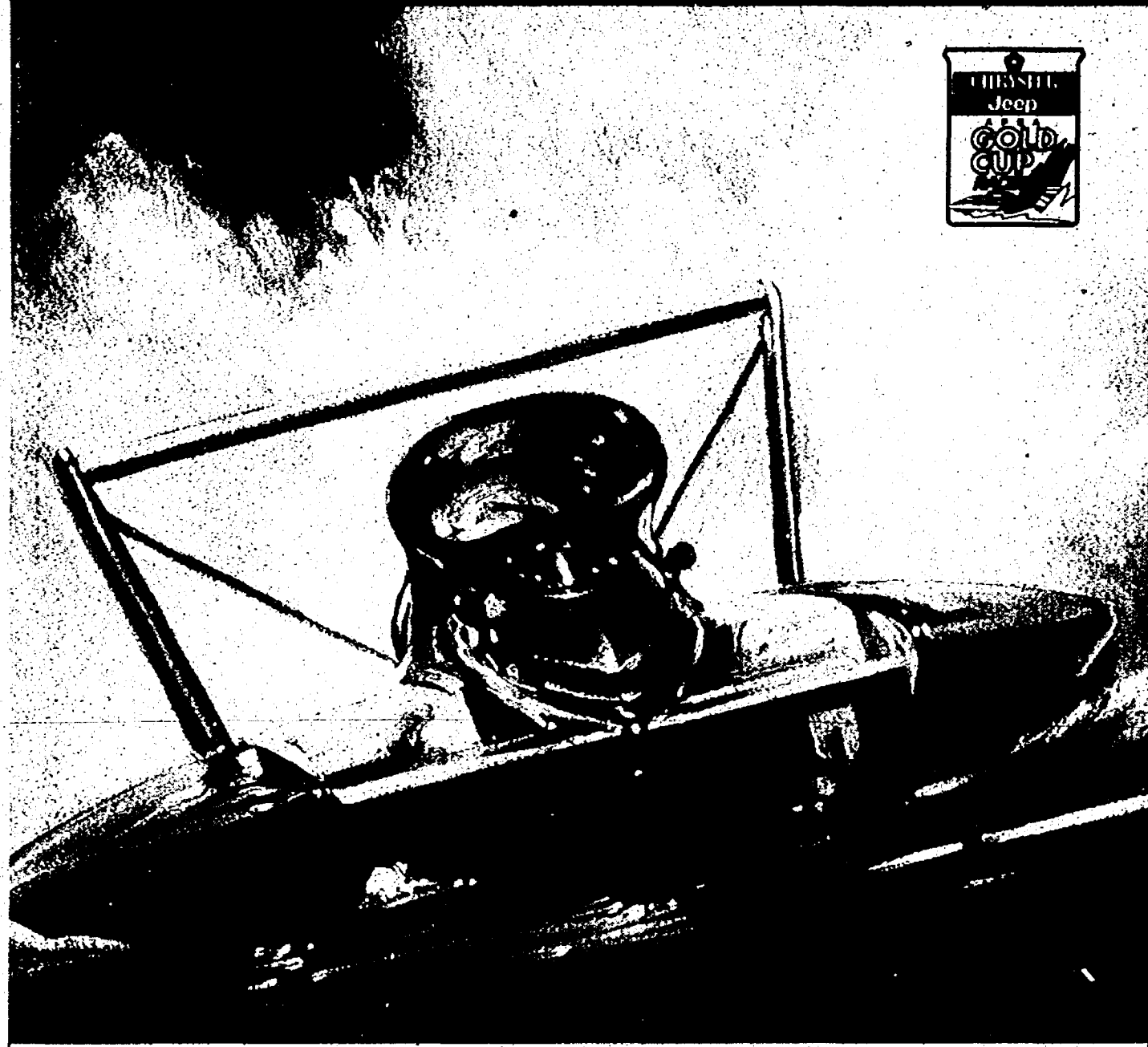

Although Michael Tripodi will receive a bachelor of fine arts in graphic design from CCS, an internship working in the graphic art department at the Detroit Institute of Arts has led him down different paths than Smith.

"Every single day handling Picasso, Max Ernst and Dali, it's inspiration," said Tripodi of Livonia. "I've learned by looking at

the care and preservation of these works how they're preserved."

Tripodi's career could take several different directions after graduating from CCS.

A guitarist with Glissen, a space rock band, Tripodi loves music as much as art. "In music you have to compose a song. With art, it's a piece of work," Tripodi said.

Founded in 1906, as the Society of Arts and Crafts, CCS offers bachelor degree programs in 17 visual art majors and non-degree programs in music, dance, art and design. Other Observer area graduating seniors in the exhibit include: Greg Darby, Christopher Trevas and Craig Breil of Canton; Godofredo Gannad, Plymouth; and Shannon Paxson, Westland.

Unrehearsed Theatreok, the seven-player house improv troupe.

Improv means finding moments of humor and connection — with the ensemble and with the audience — as players take characters into uncharted territory. There are standard improv games and routines, often fueled by suggestions from the audience, but every scene can be different.

It's hard work. The off-the-cuff sketches are not played strictly for laughs, but laughs are generated when actors use their wits to leap over pitfalls and dodge gaffes as their scenes progress.

Unlike stand-up, usually a solo venture, comedy improv is a group effort. Bell-Brege and Hauser stress cooperation, supporting others and being affirmative rather than denying.

The criticism "denial," used by

both teachers and other students, is often heard when those rules are broken in class.

"You don't have to have conflict. If you're constantly arguing it stops things," said Bell-Brege, of Novi.

Upstaging fellow actors is not allowed.

"If somebody was good up there then the troupe was bad," said Kirk Hanley of Farmington Hills, a Totally Unrehearsed player who stopped in at the end of a beginning-level class.

Students in the intermediate class said they find improv's play-acting and fun, supportive environment a good antidote to everyday pressures.

"It brings out the kid in you sometimes," said Sal Rubino of St. Clair Shores.

The class talked about how to handle lewd suggestions from the audience. Play off it, they

were told, instead of to it. "It's real easy to get a laugh" with smut, Bell-Brege said. "And once you start that, that's all they want."

Toward the end of the intermediate class, Dan Snyder, another Totally Unrehearsed trouper, dropped in. He was asked what happens if he is completely stumped on stage.

"It's not about going up there with something in mind, said Snyder, of Garden City. "If you go up there with something in mind it usually doesn't work."

What works, he said, is being true to your scene's character.

"Once you're into your character, things will come to you," he said.

The conclusion of Phase One of renovations in March marks a new beginning for the 27-year-old arts organization struggling for several years to find a building capable of housing educational and performing arts programs. Already, the arts council

is planning arts events for the future. A monthly music series begins Saturday, June 15 with two concerts by the jazz duo of Heidi Hepler and Michele Ramo.

"We're trying to utilize the new building. In addition to the music, eventually we're going to be doing a comedy night," Kuzak said.

Lovers of Neil Simon never seem to get enough of his brilliant plays, yet "Barefoot in the Park," may be one of his largest crowd-pleasers. The Plymouth Theatre Guild is performing the cult-classic, and they have created a wonderful rendition which is sure to please audiences.

While director, Alvin LaCroix, boasts a "traditional interpretation with all the original dialog and set layout," there is a distinctly 90s update to this classic. The actors appear and sound modern, yet the sets and dialog

are left in their original format, adding LaCroix's own unique style to Neil Simon's art.

"Barefoot in the Park" chronicles the five days after the honeymoon of newlyweds Paul and Corie Bratter. As they move into their fifth floor apartment (not counting the front stoop) we quickly learn that Corie and Paul do not appear to be the most compatible of couples. Corie, played by Julie Newcombe, is a vivacious, young woman in search of all that is new and exciting. Paul, on the other hand, is an easily-irritated lawyer who is consumed with his new career and his hopes for a stable home-life.

Corie quickly shows Paul that life with her will be anything, but dull. She befriends the eccentric and somewhat odd neighbor, Victor Velasco, and schemes to set him up with her

lonely mother, Ethel Banks. What happens next is proof of the age-old saying, "opposites attract." While Victor and Ethel begin to notice each other's charms, Paul and Corie begin to see their personality conflicts and doubt their future together.

Harrison High School junior, Julie Newcombe, does a splendid job in her first lead role as Corie. Stuffed-shirt lawyer, Paul Bratter, is played by the talented Peter Hathaway. Nancy Schuster is hysterical as Ethel Banks.

Victor, her love interest with the convincing accent and indisputable charm, is played by Jerry Salas.

Bob Weibel, who writes theater reviews for the Observer & Eccentric, affirms his talents as a seasoned actor, in his role as the telephone man. Ragged band earns respect

The Asian band Cornershop filled its requirements as a member of the Brit Brat Pack early in its career. Upon release of its first singles, the group bragged about its lack of musical ability. Then, as reported in the British music press, the group burned a photo of Morrissey, former lead singer

of The Smiths, in front of EMI Records offices in England. The band's musical ability has improved since then and the release of Cornershop's Luaka Bop debut "Woman's Gotta Have It," which was on most critics' "Best of" lists last year, proves that. "We're very happy about it (positive reviews)," said Tjinder Singh, the group's founder and vocalist/guitarist/dholki player. "We just try to get on with things. (It's nice to be) revered after such a long time. It's been

a long struggle." 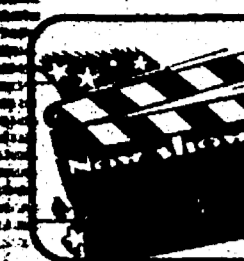

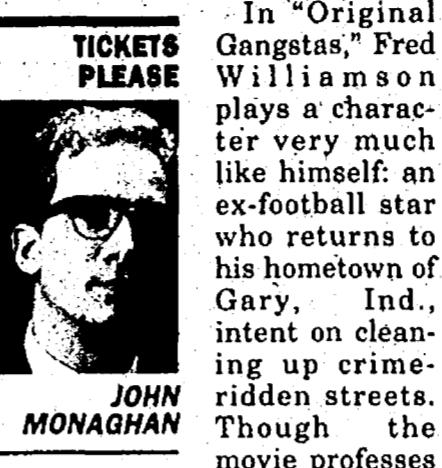

'Original Gangstas' returns
Williamson to mean streets

In "Original Gangstas," Fred Williamson plays a character very much like himself: an ex-football star who returns to his hometown of Gary, Ind., intent on cleaning up crime-ridden streets. Though the movie professes that "one man can make a difference," it also proves another adage: "You can't go home again."

Williamson, interviewed by phone from Chicago, says the project developed from a desire to pump some money into Gary, where he spent his formative years. "I was a typical thug, a typical tough guy," he recalls. "Yet the gangs back then were more about protection, not about

wreaking havoc in the community." The movie pits him against the new breed of gang members who destroy the family grocery store and nearly kill his father. It plays a lot like "Rumble in the

Bronx," but without the raucous sense of humor or the inspired fight scenes. "Original Gangstas" will undoubtedly strike the youthful audience it's aimed at as rather silly, especially after the comparative realism of "Boyz in the Hood" and "Menace 2 Society." At its best, the movie captures the low-budget quality of the '70s black action movies. At its worst, it's derivative, badly acted, and, worst of all, dull.

Williamson was known as "The Hammer" when he played football for Northwestern University, before going pro with the Oakland Raiders and Kansas City Chiefs. Like Jim Brown and O.J. Simpson, his notoriety on the football field paved the way for movie roles. "In the old days, we represented an image," he said. "We had a strong image, one that was marketable, that was sold. We have good actors today, Denzel and Angela Bassett, but they don't have that same persona that we had to have in the '70s."

When asked how he approached his early roles differently from Brown, he says, "I'm sneaky tough. With Brown it's obvious that he's tough because he's heavy. My movies had this flair, this lightness. I was the sneaky guy with a cigar."

Titled "blaxploitation" by fans and critics, the black action movies have an odd place in movie history. Many film historians dismiss them for perpetuating images of inner-city drugs, sex, and violence, though titles like Williamson's "Black Caesar" (1973) and "Three the Hard Way" (1974) are considered cult classics.

Williamson takes the entire "blaxploitation" label to task: "My checks cleared. People who worked in my movies, their checks cleared. The audiences weren't herded negatively into the theater... So I could never imagine what the hell they were talking about that was being exploited."

Williamson, one of the few black action stars to work steadily as a director, has helmed some 30 movies under the auspices of his own Po' Boy Productions. For "Original Gangstas" he called upon Larry Cohen, veteran director of "Black Caesar" and its 1973 sequel, "Hell up in Harlem," to call the shots. The original "blaxploitation" movies premiered at the Fox, Grand Circus, and United Artists in an era generally considered a low point for the downtown movie palaces. Ironically, a series of these films has recently played at big-city art theaters, with California-based distributor Kit Parker Films eyeing the Fox as a possible venue to run them this summer.

"Original Gangstas" will unfortunately do little to further an interest in the genre. The video store is still the best place to catch Williamson and company, backed by ubiquitous wacka-wacka guitar, walking the mean streets as Slaughter, Shaft, Black Caesar, and Foxy Brown.

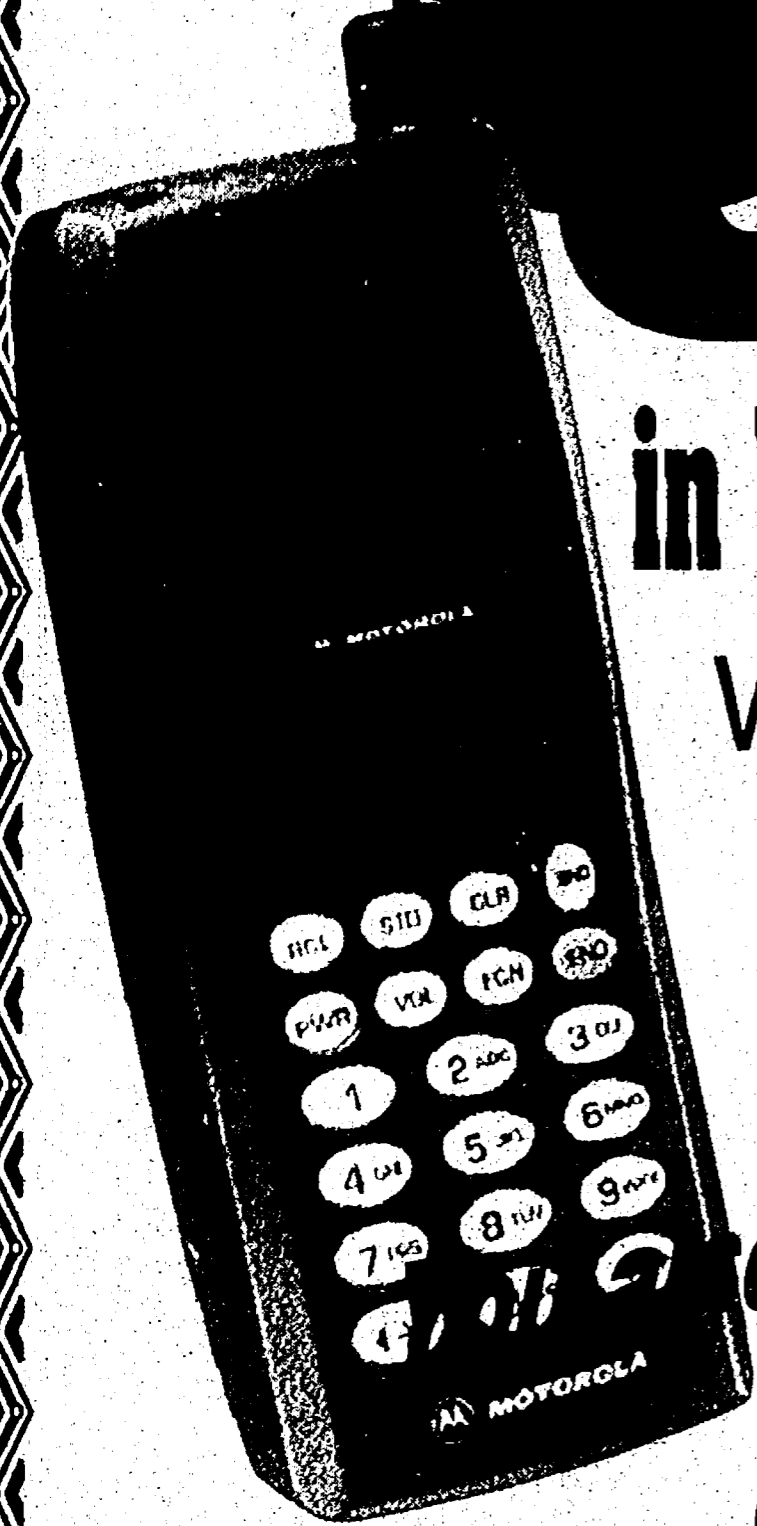

"She's got to be the most our most improved player on our team. Even late in the game, when people start crossing the ball in front, I don't feel the nerves like I have before."

"We have a lot of confidence in her."

Kimble also concurred with O'Shea.

"That save she made on Brianna was outstanding," Kimble said. "She's by far the most improved player in the Western Lakes (Activities Association)."

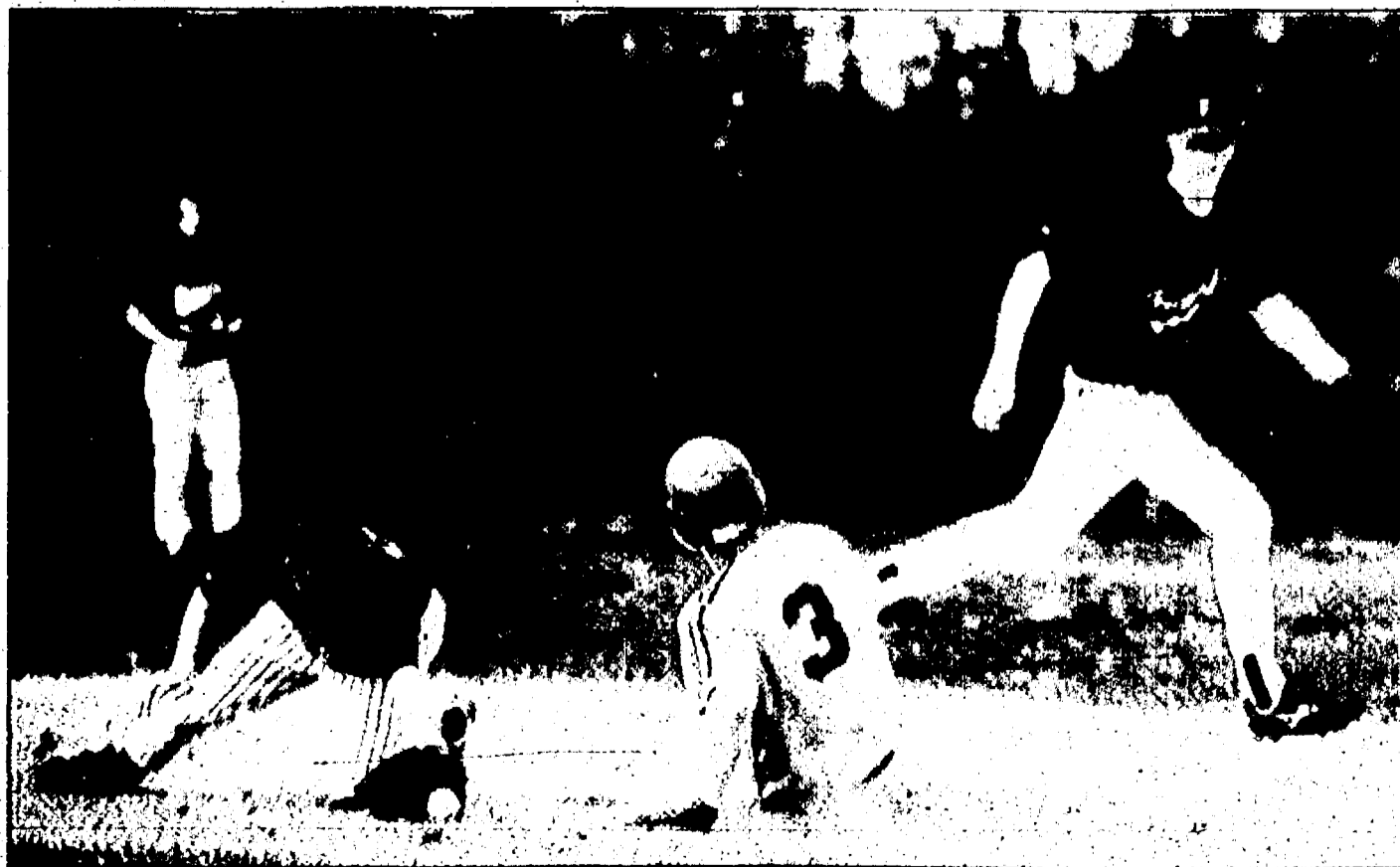

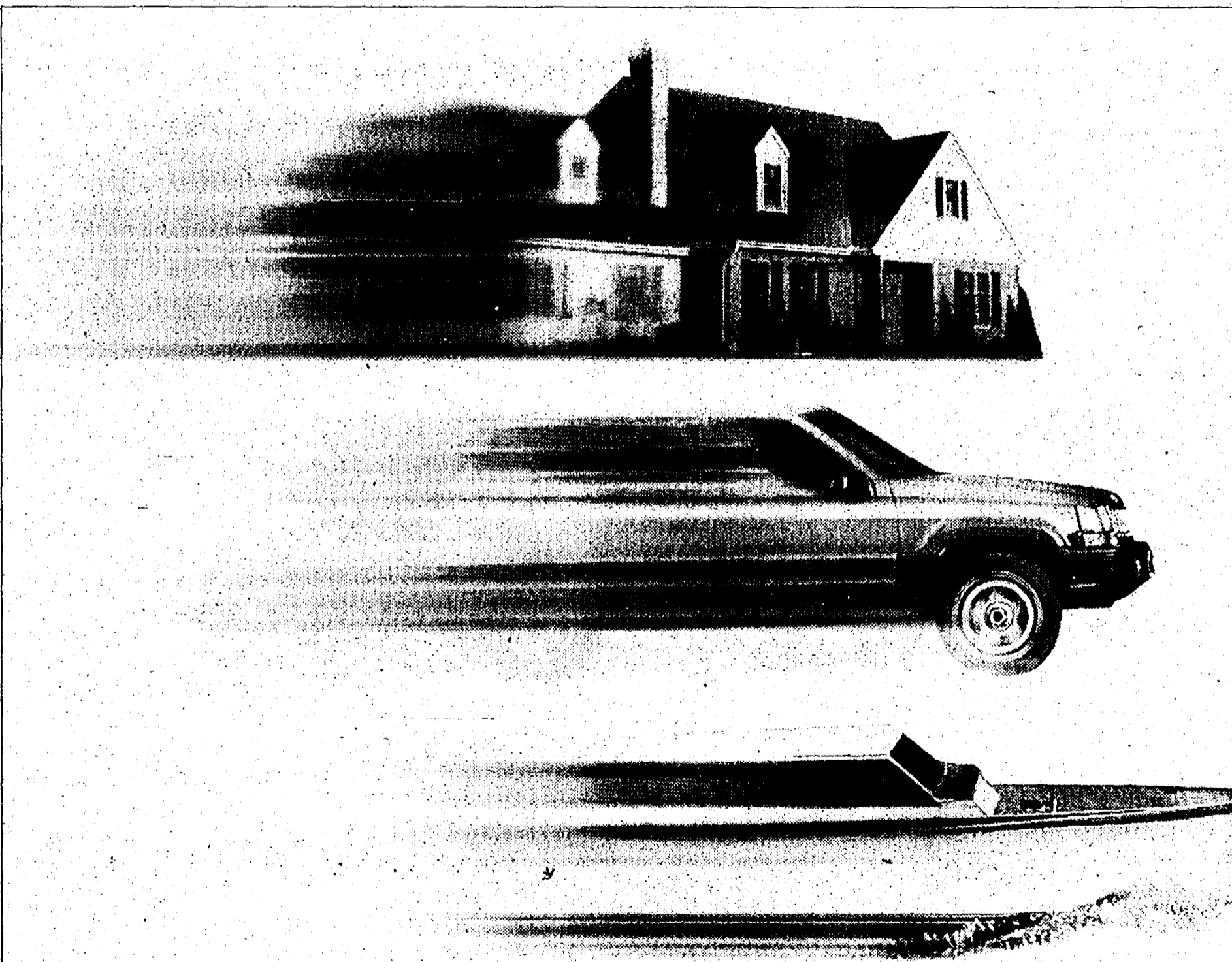

Center offers high-tech office space

Private offices, a reception area and receptionist, conference room, kitchen, and high-tech equipment — these are part of the package in local shared office suites complexes.

One company in the business — International Business Centers — has opened offices on Seven Mile near I-275 in Livonia and on Canton Center Road north of Ford Road in Canton Township.

People find renting the space attractive because it has a prestigious address and high-tech office services, according to Gary Cobb, president of International Business Centers.

It's not just small business entrepreneurs but also major corporations that rent space in the complexes.

Large corporations also have relatively small numbers of people in the field, Cobb said.

In the past mostly law firms shared space, but now the concept of executive suites or shared office space has taken off, Cobb said.

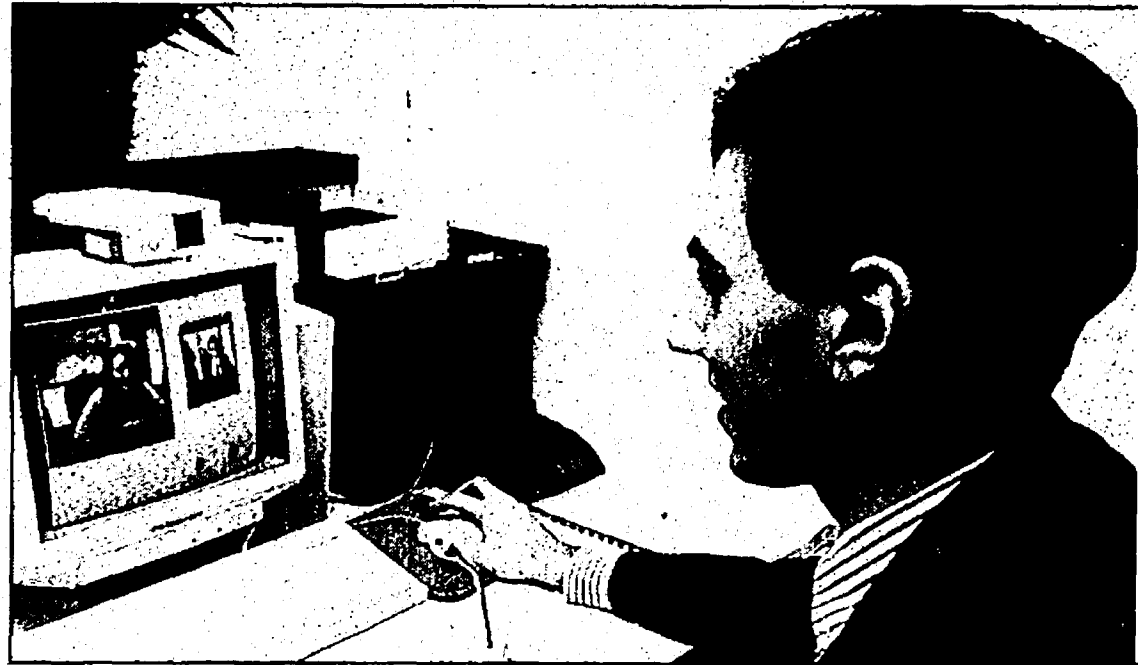
The industry is just evolving and International Business Centers has evolved into an information service company, he said.

The centers are located in what the company considers key office corridors and high-tech amenities are offered.

The cost compared to renting an office separately can be attractive for small businesses or large corporations that locate a lone representative out in the field.

Typically office spaces are at least 1,000 square feet and cost \$1,500-2,500 a month in rent. But in shared office space, smaller offices can be rented for about \$500-600 a month, some as low as \$350 a month, Cobb said.

Square footage rates may be higher in the shared office space, but the renter has access to a conference room, kitchen, fax, photocopier and a receptionist to

answer the phones.

"If anyone has to hire even one person to staff an office, sharing is substantially less," Cobb said.

The phones are answered from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and there is an after-hours service.

Tenants range from large firms to small firms and from entrepreneurs to physicians.

"There really is not a professional type of business that we have not seen over the last 10 years," he said.

Also the space can be leased for short terms as compared to conventional office space, which often is rented in three- to five-year increments.

"We lease by the day, but typically it's six months to a year," Cobb said.

"Most companies today want the flexibility." Because of an uncertain economy, companies don't know if in the future they are going to need two employees or 22 employees, he said.

The Livonia office opened in the fall and is expanding to about 6,000 square feet, and Cobb projects a need for 10,000-15,000 in Livonia. The Canton Township office is between 4,000

and 5,000 square feet, he said.

"There's a market in each city," Cobb said.

There's perceived to be an office market in Detroit and Southfield, but there's a market in other areas as well, he said.

People don't want to drive far to work, especially if they are on the road as part of their jobs, he said.

Mark Hurley, transportation, signs, and signal national sales manager for Dialight Corp., rents an office at the International Business Centers offices in Livonia.

He praised the office as convenient for him with good access to the airport.

Nancy Moorman, sales executive of The Ultimate Software Group/Midwest Ltd., also rents

spaces at IBC in Livonia.

Her office had formerly been in Southgate, but the Livonia location is better for the company image, she said.

"Livonia and this actual corridor has a higher-tech image than Downriver," she said.

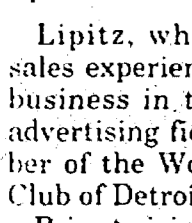

It pays to check out college financial aid

Students and parents need financial resources to help pay college bills which makes them targets for scholarship scams.

"Every year tens of thousands of families fall prey to fraudulent scholarship opportunities," said Mark Kantrowitz, maintainer of the Financial Aid Information Page on the World Wide Web and author of a book about financial aid. "If you must pay money to get money, it might be a scam."

The Financial Aid Information Page is at <http://www.cs.cmu.edu/finaid/finaid.html> and can be viewed using Web browsers like Netscape, Mosaic, or Lynx.

"If you are suspicious of a scholarship offer, call or visit your school's financial aid office," advises Kantrowitz. "The financial aid staff can tell you whether an offer is legitimate. If you're still in high school, talk to your guidance counselor."

The Financial Aid Information Page also suggests contacting the Better Business Bureau (BBB), the State Bureau of Consumer Protection, the State Attorney General's Office, and

the State Chamber of Commerce. Or call the National Fraud Information Center at 1-800-876-7060 to report the offer because they pass their information on to law enforcement agencies.

The Financial Aid Information Page, also known as the FinAid Page, probably is the most comprehensive resource for student financial aid information on the World-Wide Web.

Scholarship scams operate by imitating legitimate foundations, scholarship sponsors, lenders, and scholarship search services. They may even have official-sounding names, using such words as "National", "Federal", "Federation", "Division", "Scholarship", and "Foundation" to induce students and parents into thinking that they are federal agencies or grant-giving foundations.

Beware of any scholarship that requires an application fee, even a low one like \$2, \$5 or \$10. If the "foundation" receives a few thousand applications, they can pay out a scholarship or two and still pocket a hefty profit, if they happen to award any scholarships at all. Legitimate scholarship programs do not require an application fee.

Guaranteed winnings and loose eligibility requirements also are good warning signs. "Scholarship sponsors do not hand out awards to students simply for breathing,"

Kantrowitz explained. "Other tip-offs include typing and spelling errors, use of a mail drop for a return address, and omitting a telephone number for inquiries."

Also beware of low-interest educational loans that require you to pay money up front. Verify the legitimacy of the lender before handing over your money. Real student loans deduct the origination and insurance fees upon disbursement, not application.

Dana Lesemann, a staff attorney with the Federal Trade Commission, adds, "The Federal Trade Commission encourages students to use caution when evaluating any opportunity that requires payment of up-front fees, especially those that guarantee a specific result. These promises sound very familiar to the advanced fee loan scams we saw a couple of years ago. It's important to remember one cardinal rule: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is."

Scholarship search services charge a fee to compare your profile with a database of scholarship opportunities and report a list of matching awards. They do not provide awards directly to applicants, nor do they help you apply for the awards.

The guarantees offered by these services are usually worthless, and refunds are difficult or impossible to get. Read the fine

print before paying money for a scholarship search.

Most scholarship search services are franchises of a handful of large national databases. Before using a scholarship search service, ask them whether they compile their own database. If they don't, find out the name of their database provider.

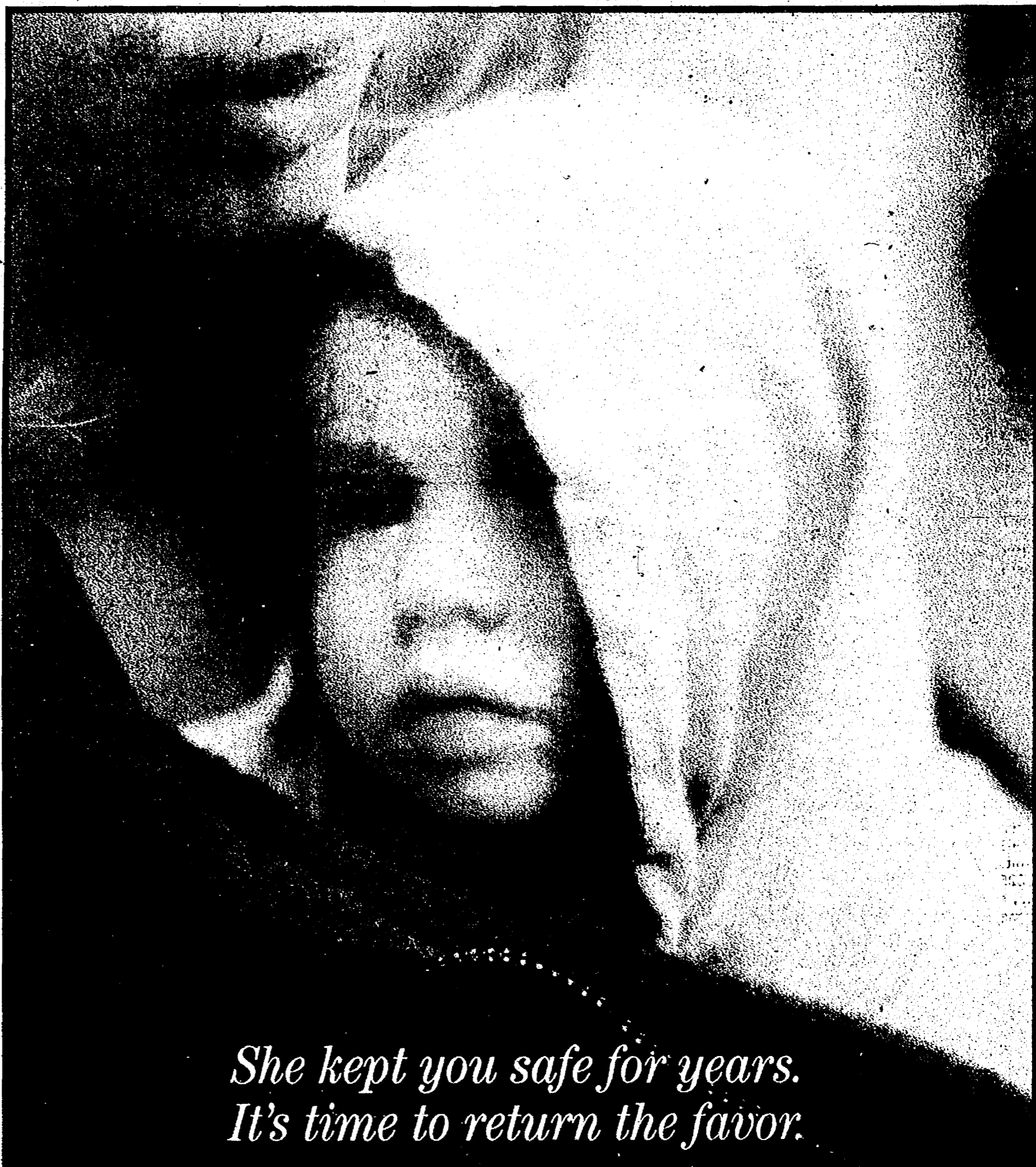
If two franchises use the same database, the cheaper one will report the same matches as the more expensive one. Charging a fee of more than \$50 for a search is excessive.

The success rates reported by scholarship search services usually refer to successfully finding a match in their database, not successfully winning a scholarship.

Ask the scholarship search service how many students have actually won scholarships as a result of using their service, and if they can give references.

"Very few students receive money as a result of using a scholarship search service," notes Kantrowitz. "Less than one percent of the financial aid awarded each year comes from the private sector."

"Don't believe claims that \$6.6 billion in student aid goes unclaimed every year. Such figures are based on an estimate of untapped employee tuition benefits that was published in a study over ten years ago."

INVITING IDEAS

"Picnic!" includes more than 25 carefully orchestrated picnic menus and over 120 recipes for \$9.95. With Dee Dee's kind permission, I am includ-

ing two recipes from her book.

FRESH TOMATO ASPIC WITH LEMON DILL SAUCE

Ingredients for Aspic:

- 2 tablespoons unflavored gelatin
 - 2 tablespoons cold water
 - 1/2 cup boiling water
 - 2 cups tomato juice
 - 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 - 1/2 teaspoon finely cut fresh dill
 - 1 cup seeded and chopped tomatoes
- Ingredients for Lemon Dill Sauce:
- 1 tablespoon finely cut fresh dill
 - 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 - 3 tablespoons mayonnaise
 - 1/4 cup plain yogurt

In a small bowl, dissolve the gelatin in the cold water. Add the boiling water and stir until gelatin is totally dissolved.

Add the remaining ingredients and mix well. Pour the aspic into two 1/2-cup molds and one 1-quart mold and chill for 2 hours. Cover the two small molds with aluminum foil and pack in your insulated bag when it is time to leave.

To make the sauce, combine all the ingredients in a small bowl and gently whisk until they are just combined. Pour about 1/4 cup of the sauce in a small jar with a tight-fitting lid and chill until time to put in your insulated bag. Chill the remaining sauce in another container to serve with the larger mold later.

Preparation time: 15 minutes, chilling time 2 hours. Serves 8.

CHOCOLATE-DIPPED STRAWBERRIES

- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips, melted (Do not let the chocolate get hot, around 110 degrees F, is perfect. A microwave oven is useful for this step)
- 2 tablespoons melted butter
- 3 tablespoons Grand Marnier liqueur
- 1/4 cup Confectioners' sugar
- 1 tablespoon water
- Selected large fresh strawberries, washed and patted dry

Combine the chocolate, butter, and Grand Marnier in a small bowl and whisk together.

Add the confectioners' sugar and water and continue whisking until smooth.

Dip the strawberries about three-quarters of the way into the chocolate. Let them drain on wax paper and sit until the chocolate has set. Pack them carefully in a small-lidded tin, lined with wax paper. They don't keep for long - make them the day you plan to have your picnic. Yield 1 cup. Preparation time: 30 minutes.

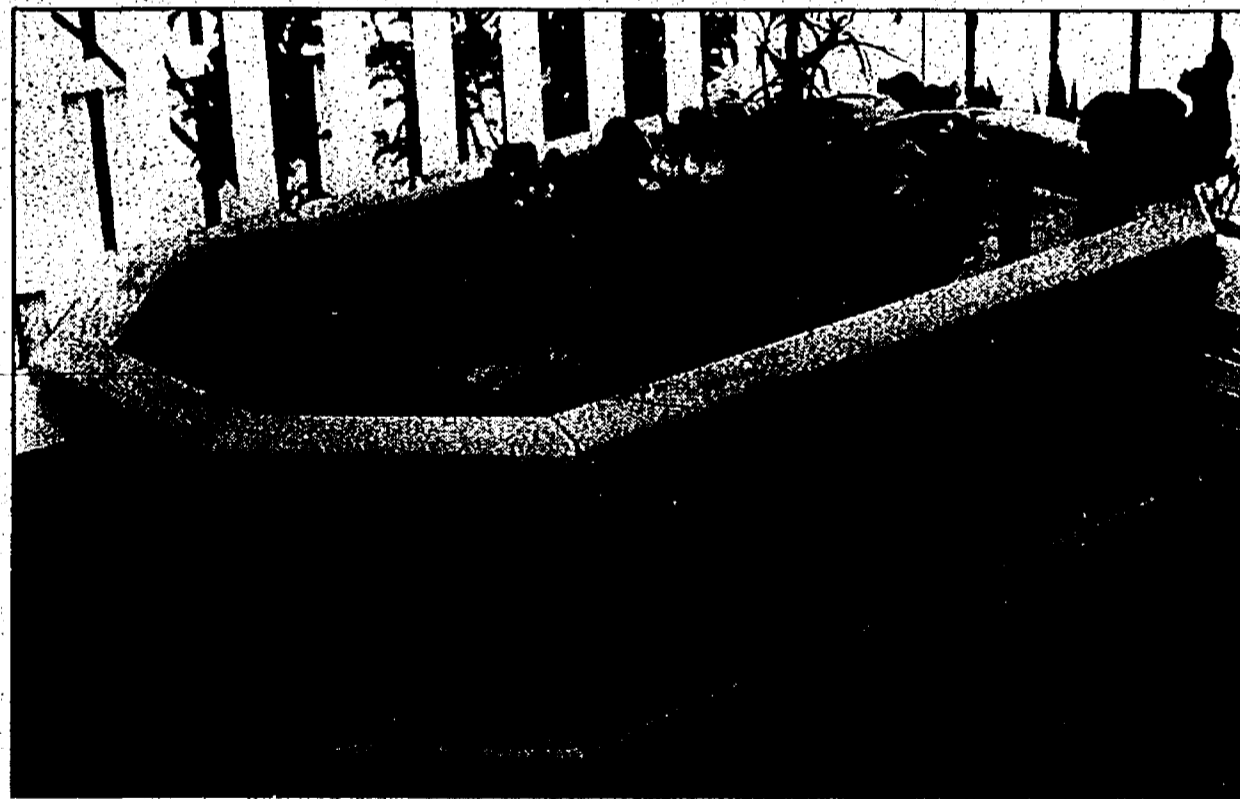

GARDEN SPOT

Books help plan growing season



MARTY FIGLEY

Winter weather had certainly kept us indoors where we had time to study gardening books and plan for the coming season. The following books contain new information as well as advice from long ago.

We enjoyed the birds and their antics at the feeders this winter. We saw black-capped chickadees, nuthatches, finches, cardinals, a red-bellied woodpecker and others. "The National Audubon Society North American Bird Feeder Handbook," Robert Burton (\$24.95), contains 80 portraits of many North American species. It is a new edition with updates for the '90s and is an excellent guide. Cross references make it user-friendly. It includes habitat and nesting information, and food preferences.

"The National Audubon Society The Bird Garden," Stephen Kress (\$24.95), deals with plants that will attract birds in the garden so they will visit all during the year. Large trees to ground covers all play a part in a bird's life and the book details them all -- shrubs, perennials, etc.-- and food sources such as the seeds and berries they produce. It also includes information about barriers, how to control predators and protect the feeders. The regional guide will help to pinpoint a particular section of the country.

Plant information

"The Herb Society of America Encyclopedia of Herbs and Their Uses," Deni Brown (Dorling Kindersley, \$39.95), is filled with information about these plants. Descriptions and photos of herb plants from around the world, how they are used in a specific country, and more, make this an invaluable guide.

The Herb Catalog portion contains portraits of a wide range of herbs accompanied by horticulture information and photographs. Another section, The Herb Dictionary, gives detailed information on the uses of every species listed, instructions for growing, etc. Design, propagation, harvesting and storing round out the book. A fine reference work that will provide much valuable information.

Malcolm Hillier's "Color Garden: A Year-round Guide to Creating Imaginative Color Combinations" (Dorling Kindersley, \$29.95) has taken an innovative approach in illustrating how colors can be used to the best advantage. Each season of the year is highlighted with specific flowers that will be complementary. He talks of harmonizing

and opposite colors, how colors are affected by their neighbors, then explains with succinct text and many colorful illustrations. Another beautiful book by Hillier.

Updates

Timber Press has just released two books from its new Royal Horticulture Classic Garden Writers series, which are reprints of previously published works. They have been edited by Graham Stuart Thomas, a noted British plantsman, and contain information with the latest changes in plant names.

The first, "Colour in the Flower Garden," Gertrude Jekyll (\$22.95), was first published in 1908. Jekyll relates her definite opinions on gardening as she leads us through her numerous gardens and tells how and why she used particular plants, especially for color. We must remember a small garden for her could have been an acre!

The second, "We Made a Garden," Margery Fish (\$19.95), first published in 1956, describes how Fish and her husband created a typical cottage garden. Her writing is smooth and personal; she tells of successes as well as failures and shares her good advice freely. I believe she studied, worked and learned in her garden as long as possible.

Clarification

The Jan. 11 column should have read: Anti-transpirant should be sprayed on broadleaf evergreens when the temperature is above 32 degrees for 24 hours.

TIMELY GARDEN TIPS

If you can't plant bare-root shrubs or trees right away after purchase, set them in a shallow trench and cover roots with soil. Before planting, soak them overnight in a bucket of muddy water.

When you cut long sprays of lilacs for indoors, keep the shape of the bush in mind.

Have your lawn mower blade sharpened if you didn't do it earlier.

Plant seeds directly into the garden.

FOCUS ON PHOTOGRAPHY

Frame your photos from the inside



MONTE NAGLER

We'll all agree that a properly selected and assembled frame will add greatly to the overall presentation of a piece of art work, including photographs.

But did you know there's another kind of frame you can apply to your photographs, one that can make your

pictures much stronger? I'm referring to a technique called "framing" through the viewfinder as you compose your shot. As a compositional tool, framing can turn an otherwise plain scene into one that contains impact and strength.

How do you begin to use framing techniques? Begin by looking through, around, over and under a foreground object that totally or partially frames a more important subject behind.

For example, hanging branches will add interest to the sky and will give emphasis to the landscape or seascape in the background. An overhanging roof adds accent to a street scene. An archway will direct attention to the subject inside and a foreground rock formation will give substance and foundation to an overall scene. Even portraits can be made more dramatic when a window is used as an impromptu frame.

Often, framing effects are so natural that you may not be aware of them in a photograph. Yet if the framing were absent, it would be missed and the picture would lose impact.

Look for unusual frames such as a car door, an outstretched arm or a twisting river or fence. Frames that contrast with the area they surround, either in color or tonal values, will be most exciting.

Because many of the "frames" you'll be using will be close to the camera, you will have to pay close attention to depth-of-field. Oftentimes, a small aperture (f-11 to f-22) will be needed to maximize depth-of-field so that foreground objects and background subjects will both be in focus in the final picture. By using your camera's depth-of-field scale and depth preview button, you'll be able to achieve the zone of sharpness that your shot requires.

Switching to a wide angle lens will increase depth-of-field even further and will help you to get foreground objects in the scene.

There may be times when you want to blur the foreground intentionally to obtain a misty, almost romantic effect. Just adjust the depth-of-field accordingly.

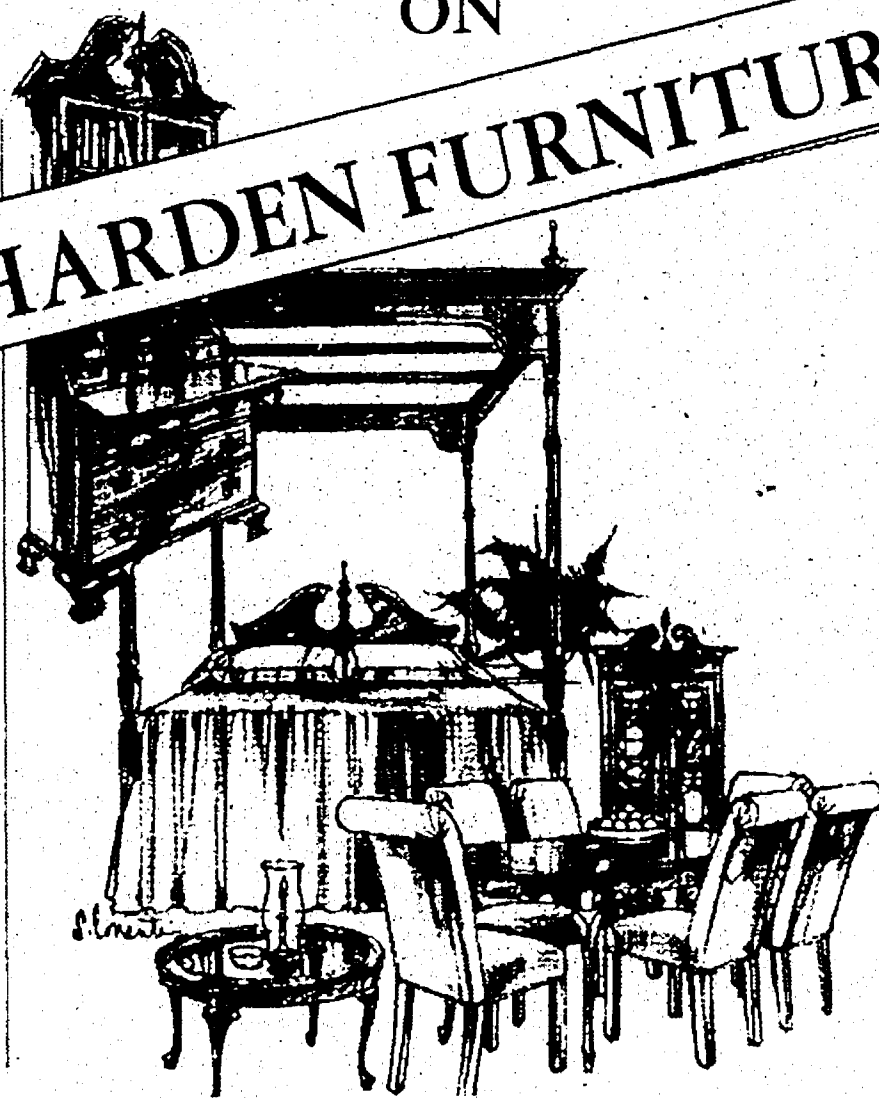
Experiment with different camera angles, too, and you'll be surprised with the many objects you can use as frames. Really look through the viewfinder and compose carefully, giving thought to your final image. Your pictures will get framed and you'll get the payoff.

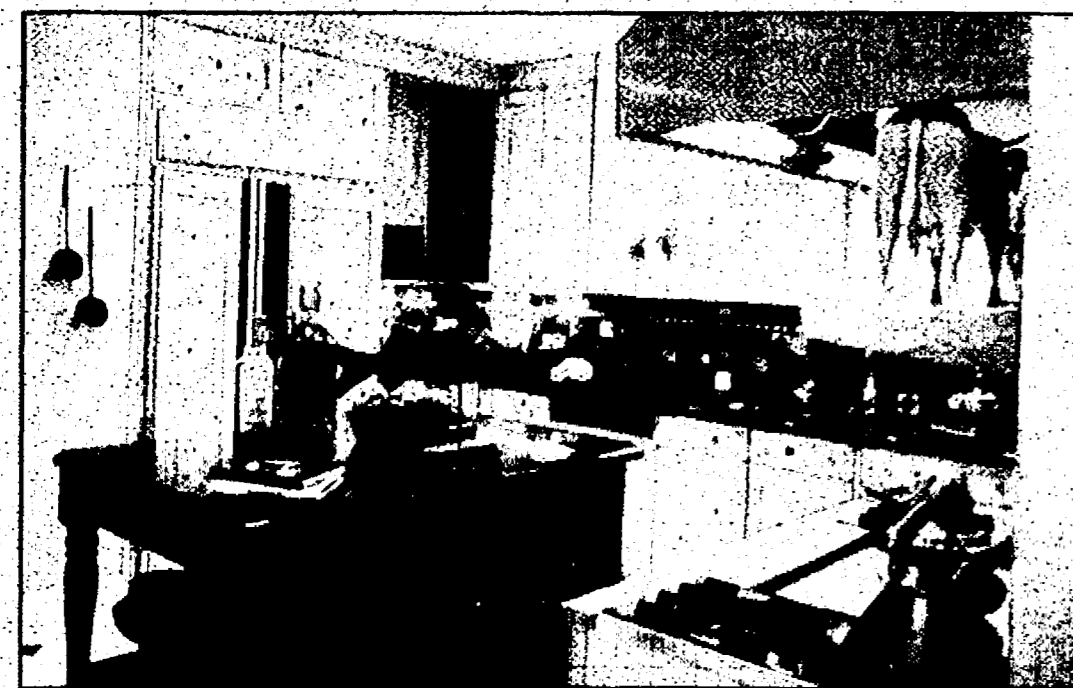

The kitchen ranks as the favorite room in Dana and Jim Selis' Birmingham home. It's easy to see why. Designed by Liz

Friebaugh, formerly with Kitchen and Co. of Petoskey, the airy space features distressed pine cupboards by William Oh's of Denver sandwiching a backsplash created by the craftsmen of historic Pewabic Pottery in Detroit. Dark green granite countertops provide strong contrast to the light cabinetry. A butler's pantry off to the side continues the dynamic concept.

"We probably spend the most time in the kitchen and family. I like it because it's so open. I don't feel cut off from the rest of the family. I can cook and the kids can do their homework at the kitchen table," said Dana Selis.

Built in 1926, the French Normandy home is topped by a slate Mansard roof that supports 14-inch thick outer walls. When Dana and Jim moved in four years ago with their two children, they began renovations retaining the traditional theme. Designer Bob Endres of Perlmutter Friewald in Franklin directed the project. Using new furniture bought for the Selises' previous home, he went to work custom designing a black and white wool rug for one of two living rooms adjoined by a see-through fireplace.

"The trick was making existing furniture work in the new home. In the living room, we added a cowhide covered French chair because it's an expressive piece of furniture," Endres said.

By design

Among the highlights of the Selis home is an American Country Pine Hutch with hand-painted accents in the dining area of the kitchen. A collection of decorative objects, some chosen by Endres and some bought during the Selises' travels, are rearranged by Endres as the number of rabbits and other accessories grows.

In the formal dining room, a floor-to-ceiling bay window provides plenty of light to view a six-panel Oriental screen decorating one entire wall. A train layout built by Jim Selis serves as the focal point for the second floor play room painted by Jeff Scissors. Selis, a radiologist, spent several months creating the layout complete with buildings and trees.

Throughout the Selis home, wall treatments add richness and texture. In the office/den, khaki-colored linen walls do double soundproofing the work space.

Steve Templeton of Templeton Building Co. in Birmingham did the work on the house.

All of the Selises' design ideas and more are yours for the asking at the Birmingham Spring House Tour noon to 5 p.m.

"It's important to have a good turnout because we're trying to build a community park," Corey said.

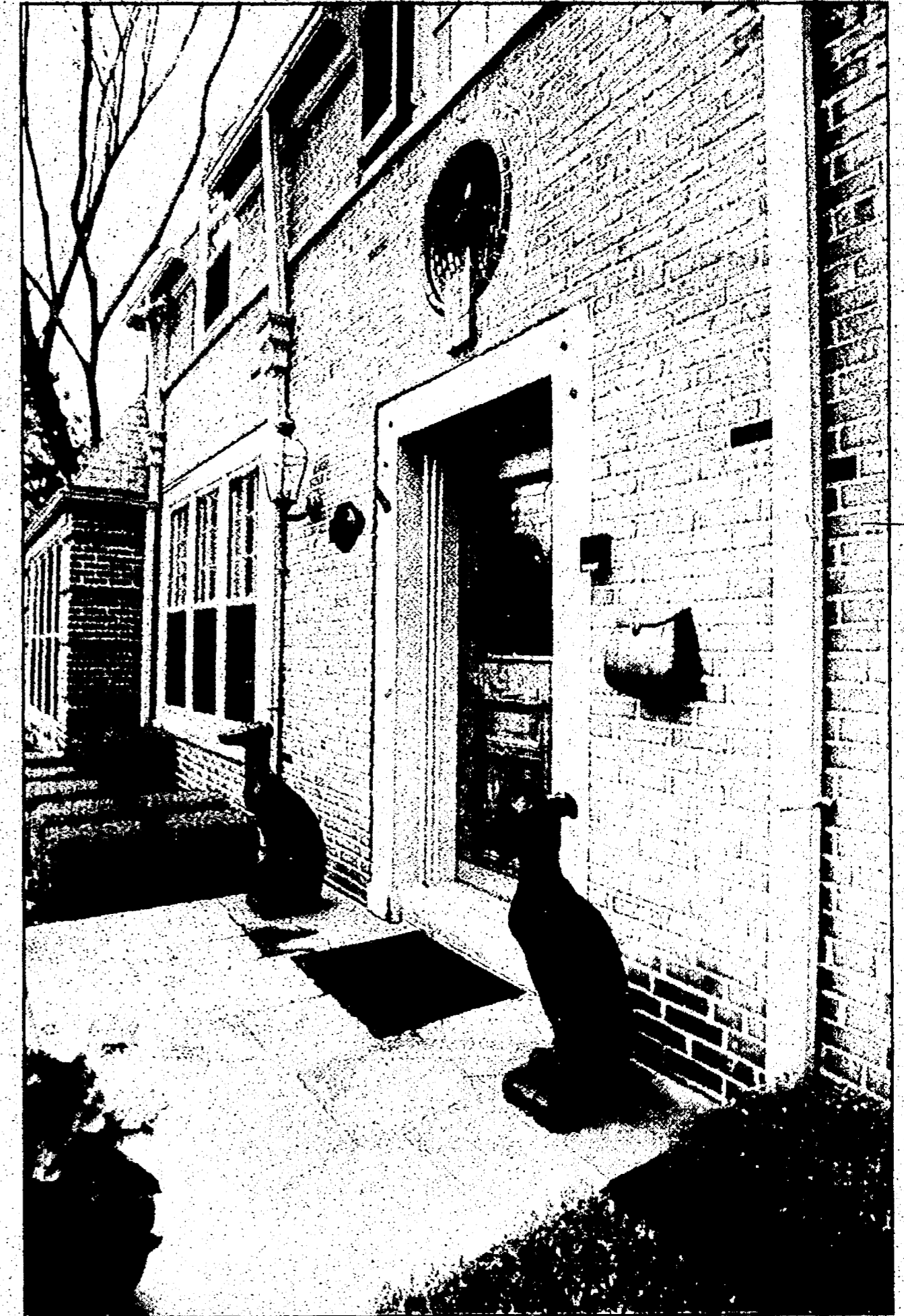
Highlights

Four of the homes on the tour were decorated by Sara Scott Cullen. Other highlights include a completely renovated contemporary home with strong use of color and decorative painting by owner Kim Curran of Haus Works. Architectural remnants are used as accents on first level. Not to be missed is the school bus yellow dining room with bright red table and distressed wooden chairs. Hawkins Ferry and Herbert Trix.

Unusual art glassware up for auction May 25

The last time fine art glass maker Steuben produced anything like this, Herbert Hoover was president and Hitler was a year away from seizing power in Germany.



Sentinel: This one-of-a-kind piece of Steuben art glass will be one of the items at auction.

But Saturday, May 25, right here in southeastern Michigan, a one-of-a-kind piece of colored Steuben art glass will be auctioned to the public. Steuben hasn't used color in its art glass since 1932.

The Steuben gem will be auctioned at Rhapsody in Red III, the gala fund-raising event of the Southeastern Michigan Chapter of the American Red Cross, at the Ritz Carlton in Dearborn.

"This is just a fabulous item for us to have for auction," said gala chairwoman Anne Tremain. "Steuben's glassware is among the most cherished in the world."

Tremain anticipates interest from Steuben collectors across the country, she said. Arrangements are being made to facilitate outside bidding on the night of the gala.

The Steuben piece, called Sentinel, has been especially crafted for the Southeastern Michigan Chapter of the Red Cross, and is expected to fetch between \$15,000 and \$20,000, helping to boost the gala's net earnings to \$175,000. Sentinel will be on public display for the first time at Neiman Marcus at the Somerset Collection in Troy Tuesday, May 14, at a party for patrons and sponsors of Rhapsody in Red III.

Designed by Steuben artist David Dowler, it is a 10.5-inch clear crystal sculpture consisting of two vertical columns, softly folded together, representing the benevolence of the American Red Cross. Between the column is a solid red glass sphere, representing the earth and the global aspect of the Red Cross. The sculpture rests on a painted wooden base, appearing to

float in space.

Dowler's works have been exhibited in and are part of the permanent collections of many museums and galleries worldwide.

Among the artists who have designed for Steuben are Henri Matisse, Georgia O'Keeffe and Salvador Dali.

Rhapsody in Red organizers hope to attract 500 guests to the Ritz Carlton for entertainment by the Nelson Riddle Orchestra. The event will be emceed by WJBK anchor Rich Fisher and feature local

celebrity guests.

Michigan Sen. Spencer Abraham and his wife, Jane, a Red Cross volunteer, will be among the guests, as well as Oakland County Executive L. Brooks Patterson.

All funds raised support Red Cross disaster relief in southeastern Michigan, helping victims of fires, tornados, floods and other calamities in the tri-county area. Last year the Southeastern Michigan Chapter helped 945 families, disbursing \$373,000 in assistance.

Noted Bloomfield Hills portrait artist Patricia Hill Burnett is working on a floral painting that she is donating for auction at the gala.

Auctioneer Frank Boos will also be taking bids on dinner at the Ritz Carlton and a luxury trip to Chicago, including two nights at the Whitehall Hotel, limousine ride from the airport and dinner at Scozzi.

Tickets to the gala are \$200, \$300 and \$500. The \$300 and \$500 tickets include an invitation to the May 14 patrons preview party and the VIP reception on the night of the gala. Tax deductions can be taken on ticket purchases, excluding \$100 of the ticket price.

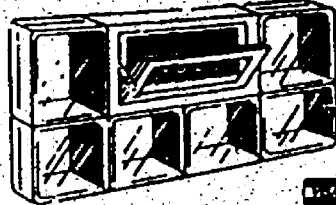

Appliance repair bill now in hearings

Last October I wrote a column about the need for regulation of the appliance service industry and the involvement of State Rep. Lyn Bankes. I asked for your help by contacting your state representative and asking for support for this proposed bill called the Appliance

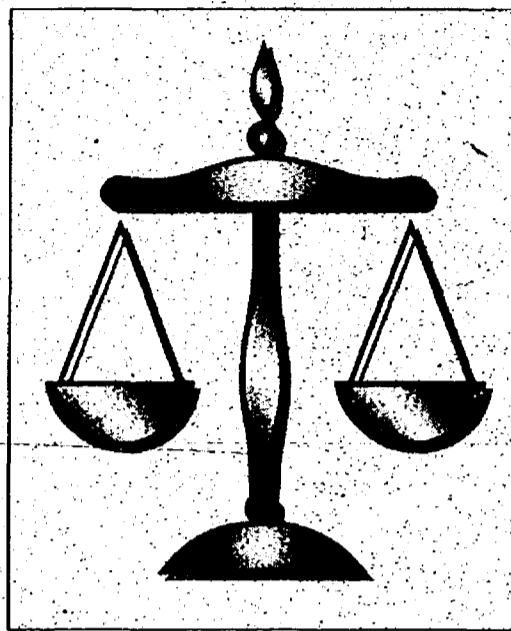
standards which would benefit consumers. Instead, it has let the few rotten apples sour the image of the whole industry with excessive overcharges and incompetency which are almost unbelievable. It is the belief of many in the industry who now feel we have no choice but to ask the government to intervene on our behalf. Most important, consumers who are more aware than ever, are fed up with the discovery that they were ripped off, the last time they had service on their major home appliance.

Repair Act.

I would like to thank all of you for helping both Rep. Bankes and myself in making this happen in Lansing. We now have a bill number assigned to the Appliance Repair Act, number 5833, which is now in the hands of the Regulatory and Affairs Committee. There will be hearings in the next few weeks, which I will be attending and I wish to invite any of you who would like to come to the state capital with me to please get in touch with me as soon as possible. Seating will be limited.

Some of you may be asking why we would need regulatory measures imposed on the appliance repair industry, and I will answer the question this way. My industry in this State of Michigan has never governed itself or set

In a past column, I wrote about the Attorney General of the State of New York renting a home and inviting 65 service companies into the home to service products. Of these companies, 25 were arrested under criminal charges for ripping off the Attorney General of



New York. The hidden cameras throughout the house were the only evidence needed to bring forth these charges.

At about the same time that you are reading this column; WXYZ, Channel 7 will be doing an expose of the same sort as New York. Keep an eye open for the

News Hawk reporter Joe Ducey as he explains how several appliance service technicians diagnose what's wrong with a refrigerator. Enough said, I can give away the whole plot, you'll just have to watch the news.

honest service technician really is to their pocketbook. As the bill becomes law, many will adjust their thinking when they know they have to call someone to repair a product in their home. The good guys will be pleased to explain their service charges and hourly rates, while the bad guys will try to conceive new ways to disguise their excessive labor and parts charges. One thing is certain, my dear friends, once you take away the mystery of how these excessive charges are pushed onto consumers, the consumer is a much more aware consumer and a smarter shopper.

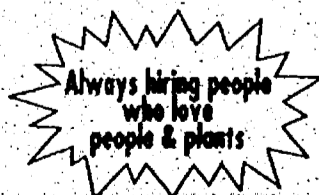

A Different Reason Every Season

Michigan ranks 3rd in floriculture sales

Michigan placed third nationally in value of wholesale sales of floriculture products in 1995, according to the Federal/State Michigan Agricultural Statistics Service. Only California and Florida reported larger sales than Michigan.

Reports from Michigan's 566 commercial growers indicated an estimated wholesale value of over \$184 million for all surveyed floriculture crops, up 10 percent from last year. This estimate includes summarized sales data as reported by growers with \$100,000 or more in sales plus a calculated wholesale value of sales for operations with sales from \$10,000 to \$99,999. Crop category breakdowns for Michigan operations with over \$100,000 in sales and the percent change from 1994 were as follows:

First, bedding/garden plants with \$131 million in sales, up 12 percent;

second, flowering potted plants with \$26.2 million in sales, up 7 percent; third, cut flowers with \$10.2 million in sales, down 6 percent; and fourth, foliage for indoor or patio use with \$3.8 million in sales, up 5 percent.

Michigan leads the nation in value of sales for five floriculture crops. They are:

■ Potted geraniums (seed) with 18.8 million pots sold, valued at \$13.7 million.

■ Potted geraniums (cuttings) with 5.7 million pots sold, valued at \$9.4 million.

■ ☆□▼▼** Easter lilies with 1.4 million pots sold, valued at \$4.6 million.

■ Geranium hanging baskets with 411,000 baskets sold, valued at \$2.6 million.

■ Impatiens hanging baskets with

349,000 baskets sold, valued at \$1.9 million.

Other notable Michigan crops that ranked second in value of sales nationally were:

■ Bedding impatiens with 2.1 million flats sold, valued at \$12.7 million.

■ Bedding petunias with 1.3 million flats sold, valued at \$7.4 million.

■ Cut gladioli with nearly 34 million spikes sold, valued at \$5.4 million.

■ Bedding geraniums with 469,000 flats sold, valued at \$3.7 million.

■ New Guinea impatiens hanging baskets with 410,000 baskets sold, valued at \$2.6 million.

■ Bedding New Guinea impatiens with 102,000 flats sold, valued at \$961,000.

■ Cut sweetheart roses with 1.5 million blooms sold, valued at \$741,000.

Total greenhouse cover for all opera-

tions in the state rose 3 percent to 32.1 million square feet. This includes both rigid and film plastic greenhouses as well as glass greenhouses. Only California and Florida have more total greenhouse cover.

Nationally, the value of floriculture crops continued to increase in 1995 but at a slower pace. The total value of all crops at wholesale for all growers over \$10,000 of sales is estimated at \$3.27 billion for 1995 compared to \$3.25 billion in 1994. Area in production for the 36 states totaled 843 million square feet over cover area and 27,155 acres of open ground in 1995. The largest valued products were bedding and garden plants which increased 3 percent in 1995. At \$1.32 billion, this category contributed 44 percent of the total wholesale value of production for operations over \$100,000 in size.

Rest easy: Change mattress every 10 years

(NU) - There have been many changes made in the construction of bedding in recent years. For that reason, the American Innerspring Manufacturers, a non-profit trade association, urges homeowners to replace their mattress and box springs at the 10-year mark.

Innerspring manufacturers and mat-

tress makers are constantly engaged in research and development. As a result, today's mattresses are made with more uniform steel and wire, with better coil and innerspring design and improved insulator pad design and manufacture. They also feature a much broader range of upholstery materials.

Despite such advancements, don't

assume the useful life of a new mattress will be 20 or more years. Generally speaking, the industry advises shoppers to replace mattress and box spring set every 10 years.

This call for early replacement of mattresses is underscored by a recent survey conducted for AIM by National Family Opinion Research Inc.

The average age of mattresses in use by the 1,025 families surveyed was slightly over eight years, 39 percent of the homeowners surveyed slept on mattresses five to 10 years old and 21 percent slept on mattresses more than 10 years old.

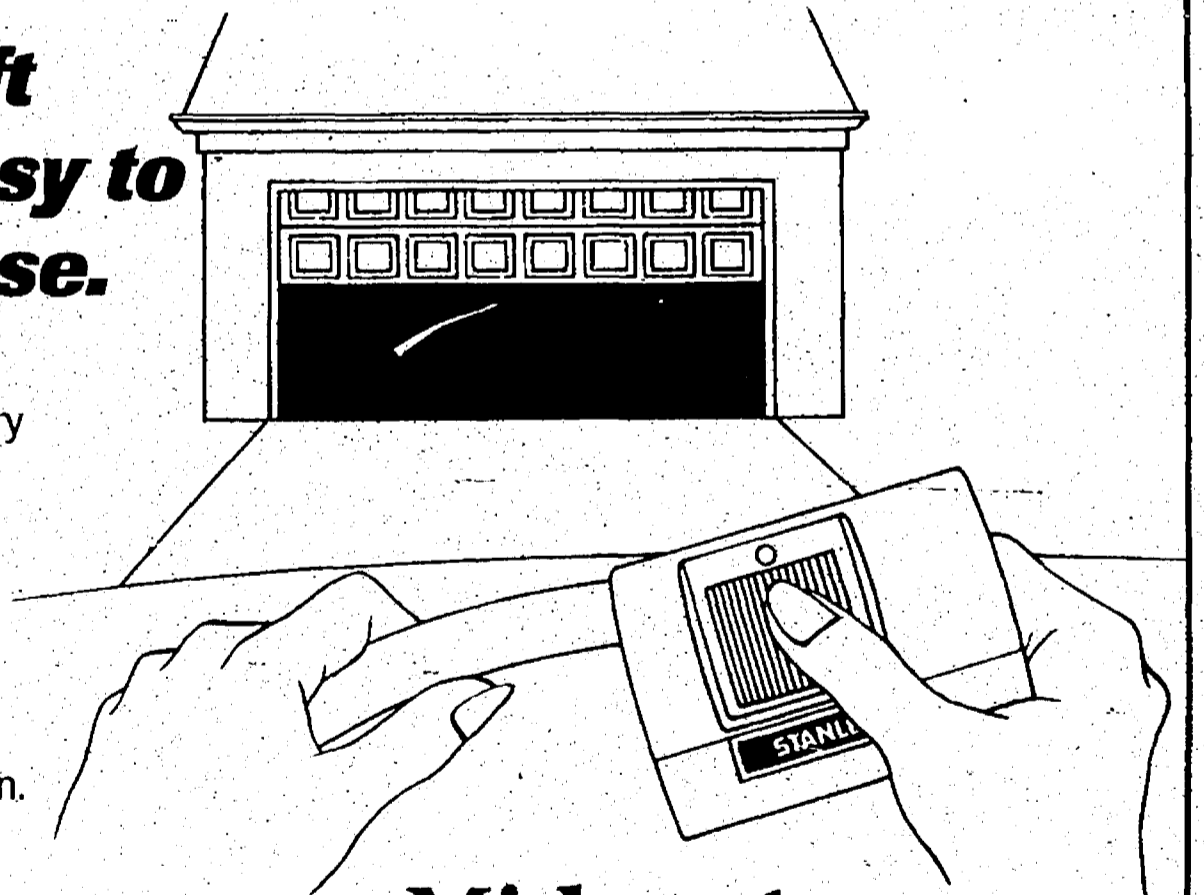

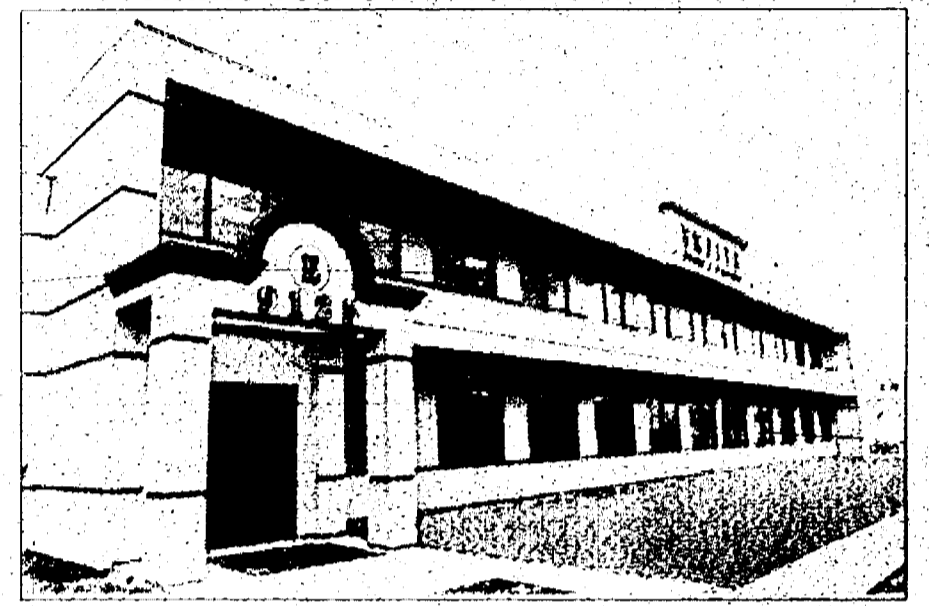

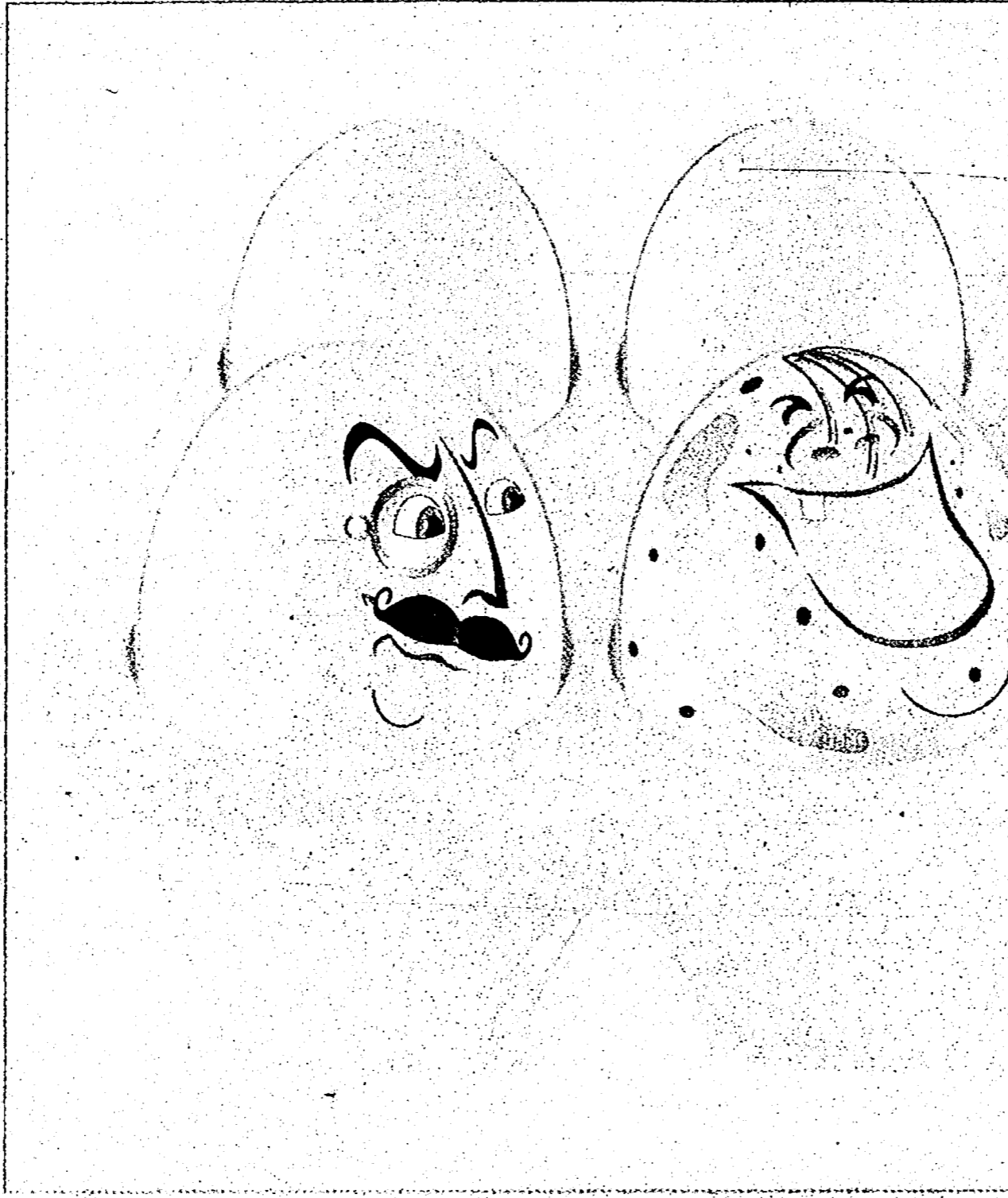

**Ready to sell
and living
next door to a
not-so-good
egg**

What to do, what to do? You want to sell, but the condition of your neighbor's property seems to be scaring away buyers.

It doesn't happen very often, fortunately, but when it does, it can present one sticky situation.

You want to sell and move on. You fix up, clean up and paint up your property so it sparkles. Then there's your neighbor who isn't going anywhere and doesn't necessarily share your standards of care. Dog poop decomposes in the yard. A clunker car sits on cinder blocks. Paint is peeling off the garage. Twigs and papers have blown up against the fence. The grass hasn't been mowed in weeks.

"I know buyers kind of have a concern when they see other homes in an area that aren't as well maintained," said Denise Wayne, a Realtor with Cranbrook Realtors in Birmingham.

"If you pull in to show a house and the surrounding real estate is in poor condition, it definitely has an impact on value, no doubt about it," said Doug Mason, a Realtor with Coldwell Banker Preferred in Plymouth.

Courtesy counts big time in a situation like this. Style matters as much as substance.

"If you have good neighborly relations, you can say something like,

"Would it be possible to ...? If there has never been good relations, you might want to ignore it altogether. You might make it worse," Mason said.

Susie Hadjinian, a Realtor with Realty World Robert Olson Realtors in Canton, suggests that you talk with neighbors and let them know what you're doing before planting the for-sale sign on the front lawn.

"Why have hard feelings?" Hadjinian said. "Approach them before you put the home on the market. Ask if they could clean up a little bit."

Sometimes, it's an unawareness rather than defiance that causes bad feelings.

Perhaps it's never occurred to your neighbors to store their trash cans somewhere else. Maybe you've never thought to call your neighbor before a showing and ask them to take their dogs inside while prospects visit.

Communication is a two-way street. But if there's a problem with the message, you may need to involve a more powerful messenger.

Zoning and public nuisance laws protect the health, safety and welfare of everyone in a neighborhood. Clutter can attract animals. It also tends to expand unless checked.

"I know where I live, they don't allow trailers in a subdivision more than 48 hours," Hadjinian said. "Usually, cities are really good on that."

They're also usually good about not allowing inoperable vehicles to

be stored in yards and grass or weeds from growing too high.

However, going the formal complaint route may take some time.

The direct, personal approach usually is a good approach, said Derrick Brown, a Realtor with RE/MAX Executive Properties in Farmington Hills.

"I've taken it upon myself to cut grass down on a vacant house next door," he said. "You try to get them (owners) to do it first. You try to talk to them diplomatically."

"I had a guy once whose neighbor didn't keep his house up well," Brown said. He was pretty reasonable. He said, "I'm selling. I need to move. Please keep up your house. If you need help, I'll help."

"I had a guy tell the people next door, 'I'll pay you a bonus if you keep your property up,'" Brown said with a laugh. "I don't know what happened on that one."

Remember the objective. "Maybe you can help your neighbor clean their yard if it would help you sell your house," Hadjinian said. "Bring some other neighbors over and help clean up on a weekend. Everybody likes to help other people."

That offer might be appreciated by older folks who don't have the stamina to do the work themselves. And it could make for a regular job opportunity for a kid in the neighborhood.

Ronald G. Oglesby, a Farmington lawyer who specializes in real estate, said he believes it would be

extremely difficult to prove losses or damages against a messy neighbor in a civil lawsuit.

His advice - enforcement of neighborhood association deed restrictions or municipal blight ordinances.

"You're wrestling with a problem that may not have an answer," Oglesby said. "The story is out there. Maybe it's better to market in the winter when snow covers a lot of that stuff."

After all, he said, property disclosure statements are required only on the seller's property, not the neighbors'.

Most stories eventually have a happy ending.

Mason recalled the time an open house he once hosted was sabotaged by neighbors. They deliberately threw a party that got out of hand.

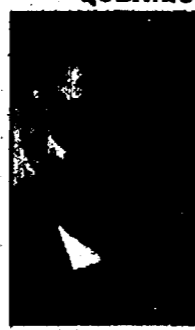
"It got quite loud, people parked on the front lawn," Mason recounted. "People came through, kind of looked at the neighbors and said, 'What is this?' It was a wasted day. After that party, we just didn't have open houses. It eventually sold as a result of a Realtor showing."

Wouldn't it make sense to cooperate to get a sale and neighborhood peace even if there were a personal conflict?

"A lot of feuds aren't based on common sense," Mason said. "Human behavior isn't always rational."

Following the law may help get deposit back

Q: I have just terminated my lease and am wondering whether I am advised to provide the landlord with my forwarding address so as to require him to provide me with my security deposit. He has told me verbally that the money will not be returned because of certain damages which he is claiming.

A: You should obviously comply with the law and to that extent provide your landlord with a forwarding address. If so, the landlord cannot keep the security deposit unless the tenant is told in writing why the money will not be returned. In fact, the tenant would be entitled to damages equal to twice the amount of the deposit withheld if the landlord did not timely sue to retain the deposit. If, to the extent, you owe the landlord rent, he would be able to use that as an offset. In essence, if a landlord wrongfully withholds a security deposit by not strictly complying with the law he or she can subject him or herself to damages for wrongfully withholding the security deposit. You

should protect your rights, of course, at all times.

Q: Are you aware of a case where individual unit owners sued the association for unauthorized acts, whereupon the association levied a special assessment against the owners to raise the necessary funds in order to pay the judgment obtained by the unit owners against the condominium association. In effect, could the owners be assessed to pay themselves and their attorney?

A: Based upon a recent Florida Supreme Court case, the answer is yes. In that situation, the association levied a special assessment of \$1500 against the unit owners to raise funds to purchase certain property. Some of the unit owners then sued to have the purchase declared invalid as beyond the powers of the association. The suit was successful whereupon the association needed to raise sufficient funds to refund the \$1500 special assessment and pay the attorney fee of \$194,000 in connection with the lawsuit. The association was able to rescind the invalid purchase and recover the purchase price and would also receive the settlement from its insurance carrier. To raise the balance of the funds, the association imposed a special assessment of \$500 on each unit

owner which resulted in a lawsuit. The state supreme court held the assessment proper. In the minds of the Florida court, since a condominium can be sued and a judgment may be entered against it which would render the common elements of the condominium subject to execution and levy, any lien on the common elements should be treated as a common expense and therefore the association has the right to levy the assessment, even though the judge knew the creditors were some of the units owners, themselves. Of course, the Florida statute allowed the creditors to execute on the common elements of the condominium which is not necessarily the case here is Michigan, although the result would be the same.

Lenders set rules on qualifying for a mortgage

One easy way to find out how much you can afford is to get pre-qualified by a mortgage lender. Many lenders will be happy to tell you how large a mortgage they might offer you. At the pre-qualification stage, you do not need to obligate your-

self by paying an application fee and actually applying for the mortgage. However, keep in mind that lender pre-qualifications are only "ballpark" ranges

of your buying power and don't obligate the lender to approve your loan. Only you can decide how much you feel comfortable borrowing - and what type of mortgage is best for you. You may have heard that if you can pay rent and have cash for a down payment, you can afford to buy. You may have also heard that most individuals or families can afford to borrow up to 2 1/2 times their gross annual household income (income before any deductions are made for taxes, etc.) Following this rule of thumb, a couple with a combined annual income of \$30,000 should be able to borrow up to \$75,000.

Like other rules of thumb, this one is handy, easy to calculate,

and give you a ballpark guess of how large a mortgage you can afford. But, because it is so simple, it doesn't take into account many other pieces of information that help determine whether you'll feel comfortable with this financial obligation.

All mortgages have two features in common. The first feature is the mortgage principal, which is the actual amount of money you borrow. So, if you take out a \$70,000 mortgage, your mortgage principal is \$70,000.

The second feature is the mortgage interest, which is the money you pay for use of the money you borrow. The interest you pay on your mortgage can be

deducted from your taxes, which is one of the many benefits of homeownership.

How much money do you have saved for a downpayment? You may have more than you know. Use the following list as a guide to prepare a list of all your present assets.

A. Assets available for a down payment: savings account, checking account, cash value of life insurance, proceeds from sale of current home, if applicable, gift from relative, other assets that can be sold to obtain funds.

B. Upcoming new home expenses: moving expenses, new home repairs, home decorating, major appliance purchases, estimated closing costs at settlement

(usually 3-6 percent of your loan amount), other major purchases in next six months unrelated to new home (car, etc.). Subtract A-B to get your Total Down Payment Available. Remember, lenders may require you to have two months of mortgage payments in reserve when you go to closing. Be sure to consider this in your cash needs for the next six months.

Lenders use two guidelines to determine the amount of money they will lend. The first guideline says that a household should spend no more than 28 percent of its gross monthly income (income before taxes) on monthly housing expenses. Monthly housing expenses include mortgage principal and interest, hazard insurance, real estate taxes and private mortgage insurance, if applicable. Lenders do not include monthly utility bills in your monthly housing expense ration. The second guideline says that monthly housing expenses and other long term debts combined generally should not be more than 36 percent of total monthly income. That means that your monthly mortgage principal and interest payments, real estate taxes, hazard insurance, car loan, credit card payments, and other long-term debts combined generally may not exceed 36 percent of your gross monthly income.

Using this information as a

starting point, you can determine how much home you can really afford which, in turn, will help you direct your housing search to the home in the right price range for your and your budget.

Q: Where do I look for mortgage loans?

A: Mortgage loans are available from a number of sources, including: mortgage companies, savings and loans associations, commercial banks, federal credit unions and other financial institutions. The real estate section of your local newspaper often includes comparative mortgage rate charts and may even offer a mortgage rate hotline that can be very helpful in your search. Your real estate agent will also know about local mortgage lenders and the mortgage products they offer. Lots, housing value are Fox Chase draws

Families love Fox Chase, a single family site condominium community built by the Irvine Group in White Lake Township.

The 100-acre development is in the heart of north Oakland County recreational country off White Lake Road east of Ormond Road. It features three-quarter acre lots and open spaces unimpeded by fences between the 70 units.

"I think the biggest attraction is the large home sites," said Todd Craft, sales representative. "It's attracting a lot of young families looking for a place for their kids to play."

"There's 30 acres of protected wetlands back there," Craft added. "There's 100-foot tall oaks completely mature."

"Here, you've got great lots, natural areas that have been preserved, you've got a peaceful, quiet community," said Norm Finkelstein, partner with the Irvine Group.

"We're tending to see people who just don't want to live on top of their neighbors, who want rural but close to main roads," Finkelstein said. "There's real good access to M-59."

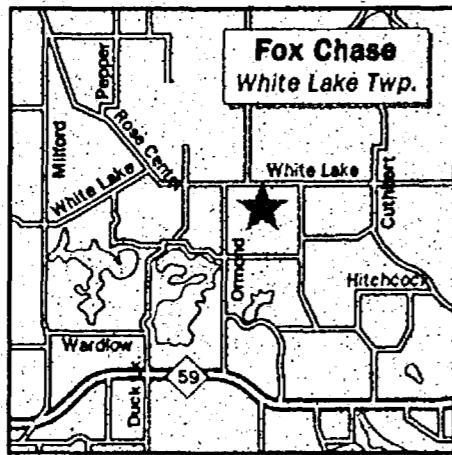
"Several parks are around here," Craft said. "Indian Springs has a 13-mile bike path through the woods and an 18-hole public golf course. White Lake has public access here a mile down the road."

"Highland Recreation Area it at M-59. Stables are there so they can go horseback riding," Craft said.

Irvine offers five floor plans ranging from a story and a half of 1,908 square feet with three bedrooms and 2-1/2 baths for \$159,900 to a two story of 2,380 square feet with four bedrooms and 2-1/2 baths for \$198,900.

All plans include at standard price two-car, side-entry garage, fireplace, first floor laundry, range and dishwasher, and basement.

Air conditioning (\$2,150) and a



whirlpool tub (\$2,250) are options.

Two models are open and another is under construction.

The Barton, a story-and-a-half of 1,840 square feet, features a two-story foyer, a study with cathedral ceiling, a great room with sloped ceiling, dining room/eating nook and the master on the main floor.

The master, with pan ceiling, has a separate tub and shower and a walk-in closet.

Two bedrooms and a full bath are upstairs.

Base price is \$174,900. The model, with upgrades, is priced at \$199,900.

The Manchester, a traditional three-bedroom colonial of 1,908 square feet, has a living room, dining room, kitchen/nook and family room with cathedral ceiling.

The upstairs master has a sloped ceiling with two walk-in closets. Buyers can choose either a combination tub/shower or a shower only.

Two other bedrooms and a bath are in the finished model.

Base price is \$159,900, the model \$189,900.

An optional fourth bedroom is available for an additional \$5,000 and a separate tub and shower in the master for an additional \$1,700.

The Manchester under construction will have both.

"This is one of our hottest sellers for price point and square footage," Craft said.

A ranch plan - 1,690 square feet with three bedrooms and two baths - is available for \$169,900.

Exteriors are brick with vinyl siding.

Each lot at Fox Chase has its own well and septic tank. The sub is within the Holly school district. There are no sidewalks.

The property tax rate is currently \$25.57 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation, half of market value. That means the owners of a \$166,000 condo there would pay about \$2,120 the first year.

The township charges an

annual trash collection fee of \$125, the condominium association \$125 per year for maintenance of common areas.

Denis Potvin and Annie Duplessie-Potvin, along with daughters, Mallory and Courtney, moved into a Regency Deluxe, a four-bedroom two story.

"We wanted to move out from the congestion of Novi," Duplessie-Potvin said. "We were really most impressed with the large lots you get."

"We don't have sidewalks, but it seems people are out walking, riding bikes or rollerblading," she said. "It's quiet enough you can take kids walking in the street."

And the model, itself?

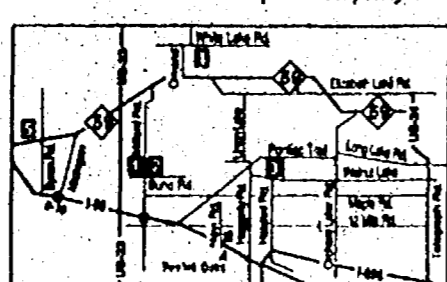

Just like people, houses need regular checkups by professionals

Most people take better care of their car than they do the home they live in. According to a survey by the American Society of Home Inspectors (ASHI), the leading association for home inspection professionals in the United States and Canada, "poor overall maintenance" was rated one of the top five problems most frequently found during home buyers' purchase inspections.

Yet just as cars need regular oil changes and tune ups to run smoothly and prevent major engine problems, so do houses need periodic preventive maintenance.

Regular preventive maintenance preserves the structural and mechanical systems of the home, as well as its general cosmetic appearance, say the home inspectors. It can also greatly reduce the cost of repairs. They report that many home owners end up hiring contractors to perform major and costly repairs for problems that could easily have been avoided through preventive maintenance.

Keeping the home in good physical condition also enhances its financial value as an investment. Real estate agents agree that well-maintained homes sell more quickly and at higher prices than poorly maintained ones.

One of the obstacles to regular maintenance for many home owners is the task of figuring out what needs to be done. If you have a wet basement or leaky roof, for example, you know that something needs to be done, but there might be several alternatives. Do you buy an expensive waterproofing system or do you simply fix the gutters? Do you buy a new roof or merely install better chimney flashing?

Other conditions are not always so obvious. Overloaded circuits might

be slowly heating up the wiring and building a potential fire hazard. Galvanized steel pipes, corroded with age, might be serviceable today but cause a plumbing nightmare just down the road. Yet if symptoms such as these aren't readily apparent, how do you know you even have a problem?

When the list of maintenance options becomes confusing, or when you don't know where to begin, it's time to call in a professional home inspector, advises Ron Passaro, a spokesman for the home inspectors' association. Trained and experienced in the visual examination of a home, the inspector can help a home owner focus attention on the tasks that need to be performed in order to bring a home into top physical condition.

While examining the attic, for example, an inspector might detect subtle evidence of water penetration through the roof. Allowing for the age and condition of the roofing material, he would then be able to recommend either the installation of a new roof or perhaps some simple flashing repairs. In either case, serious water damage to the house can be avoided.

Similarly, an inspector's recommendation to install a power vent in the attic (\$150-\$200) in order to reduce the head load might well double the lifespan of a shingle roof (\$2,000-\$3,000).

If a home has aluminum wiring, periodic preventive maintenance inspections are essential. This condition of wire connections at the outlets and switches must be monitored so that corrective measures can be taken if necessary. An inspector will note plumbing leaks and aging water heaters and indicate whether there is need for repair or replacement to prevent failure or flooding. Improper-

ly graded soil around the house, or defective gutters, the most common causes of water in the basement/cellar, would be marked for correction.

Passaro cautions homeowners not to attempt to do all maintenance chores themselves, especially items like electrical or roof top work.

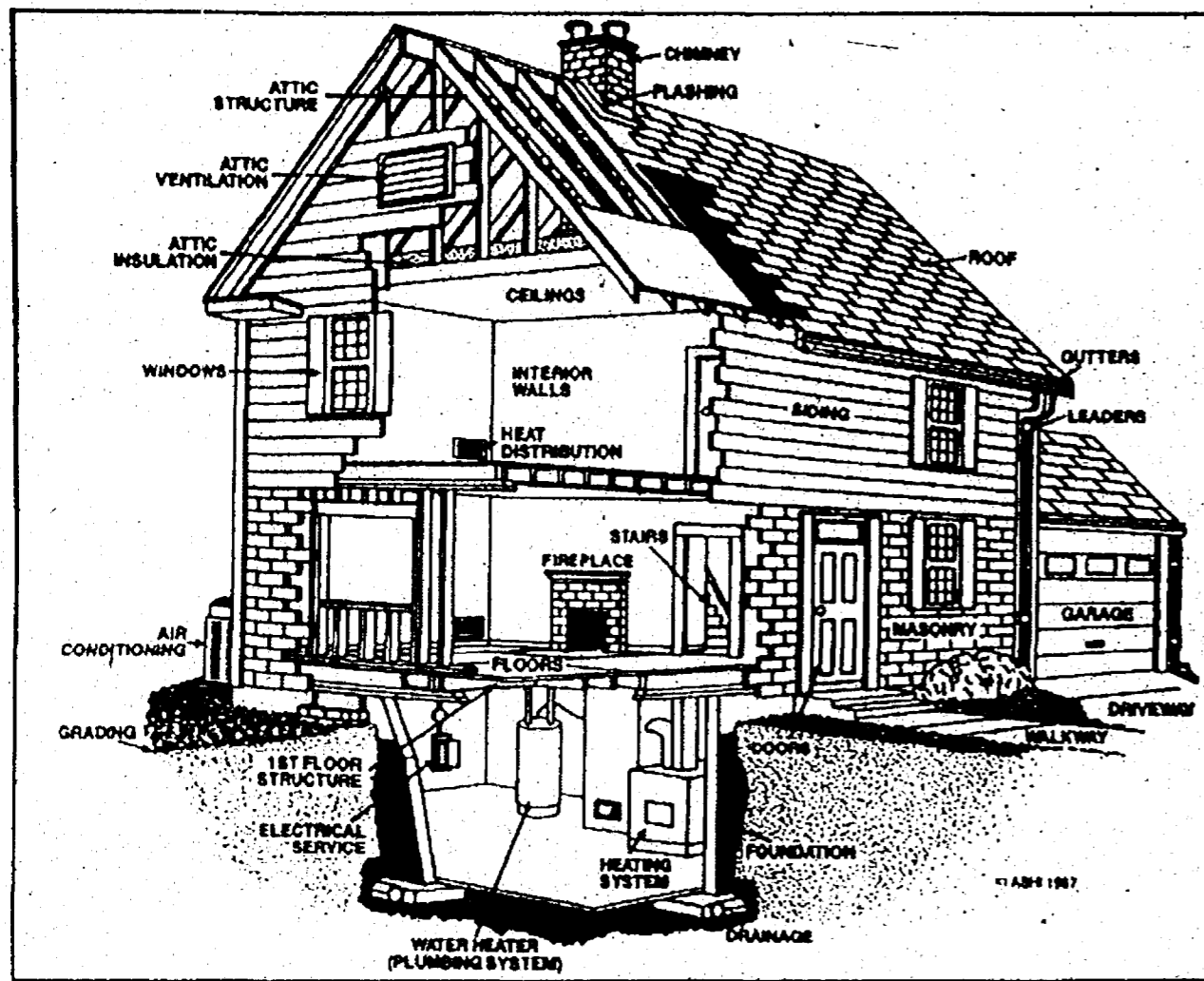
"Today, with our busy lifestyles, it is important to be realistic about whether one has the time, not to mention the ability and the tools, to perform all the necessary tasks.

"I recommend that individuals first decide what they think they can accomplish themselves and then hire professional contractors to do the rest. This is the most efficient way of ensuring that preventive maintenance is actually carried out."

How often should a comprehensive inspection be performed? ASHI recommends a schedule of once every two to five years to keep a home in good physical condition. Individual house components, such as heating, air conditioning and septic systems for example, require annual or semi-annual inspections and servicing by qualified tradesmen or service technicians.

"Intervals of 15 and 20 years are also important," Passaro said, "because that is the lifespan of many of a home's systems and materials, such as furnaces and roof coverings. Home owners can anticipate some heavy maintenance at times."

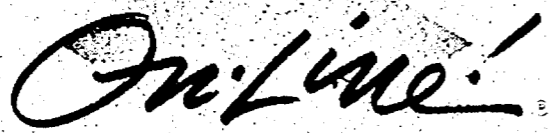

Here's how to fix furniture nicks

(AP) Repairing wood furniture is easier than you might expect, and materials, available at your local paint store or home center, are inexpensive. Here are some touch-up tips:

Small gouges and holes can be easily filled with shellac sticks. You can get special burn-in shellac sticks, in a variety of colors, through woodworking supply outlets. Other materials you'll need that are available through the same source include a burn-in knife (you can substitute a grapefruit knife), an alcohol lamp, 400-grit waterproof abrasive paper, a felt block and leveling solvent (usually alcohol).

To use the stick, heat the tip of the knife over the alcohol lamp. Hold the hot knife over the gouge, and press the stick against the blade

until the shellac melts into the gouge. Reheat the blade, wipe it clean with fine steel wool, and spread the shellac level.

Avoid touching the surrounding finish. If some melted shellac does get on the surrounding surface let it get firm, but not hard, then gently scrape it off. Remove any residue with a piece of cloth moistened with alcohol.

Moisten the felt block with leveling solvent and rub it briskly over the hardened shellac. Dry-sand the area with 400-grit paper, and use a felt-tip marker to draw in grain lines. Seal the patch with shellac and apply finish.

To remove white spots or rings on a shellacked surface left from a wet glass, simply rub some toothpaste over the spot with the tip of

your finger. If this doesn't do the trick, rub the surface with a soft cloth lightly moistened with denatured alcohol or lacquer thinner. Then apply paste wax and buff.

A cigarette burn, or any other deep localized burn, is repaired by patching with wood filler. Scrape away charred wood using a razor knife with a curved blade. Clean the depression with a cloth dampened with paint thinner, then pack it with a filler that's colored to match the wood, or stain the filler to match. When the patch is dry, sand it smooth and level to the surrounding surface. Use a felt marker to draw in grain lines, seal the spot and apply top finish.

A veneer blister may be flattened by heating it and pressing it down. The finish on and around the blister may have been damaged as the blister formed. Gently scrape off any flaking or cracked finish before repairing.

Cut into the center of the blister, along the grain, with a razor knife to let the air escape. Heat the blister with a hair dryer to soften the adhesive. Then roll the blister flat with a veneer roller, weight it down, or clamp a small block of wood over it.

A blister that formed at the edge of a surface is easily repaired. Gently slide a little glue under the peeled section, and clamp a block over it.

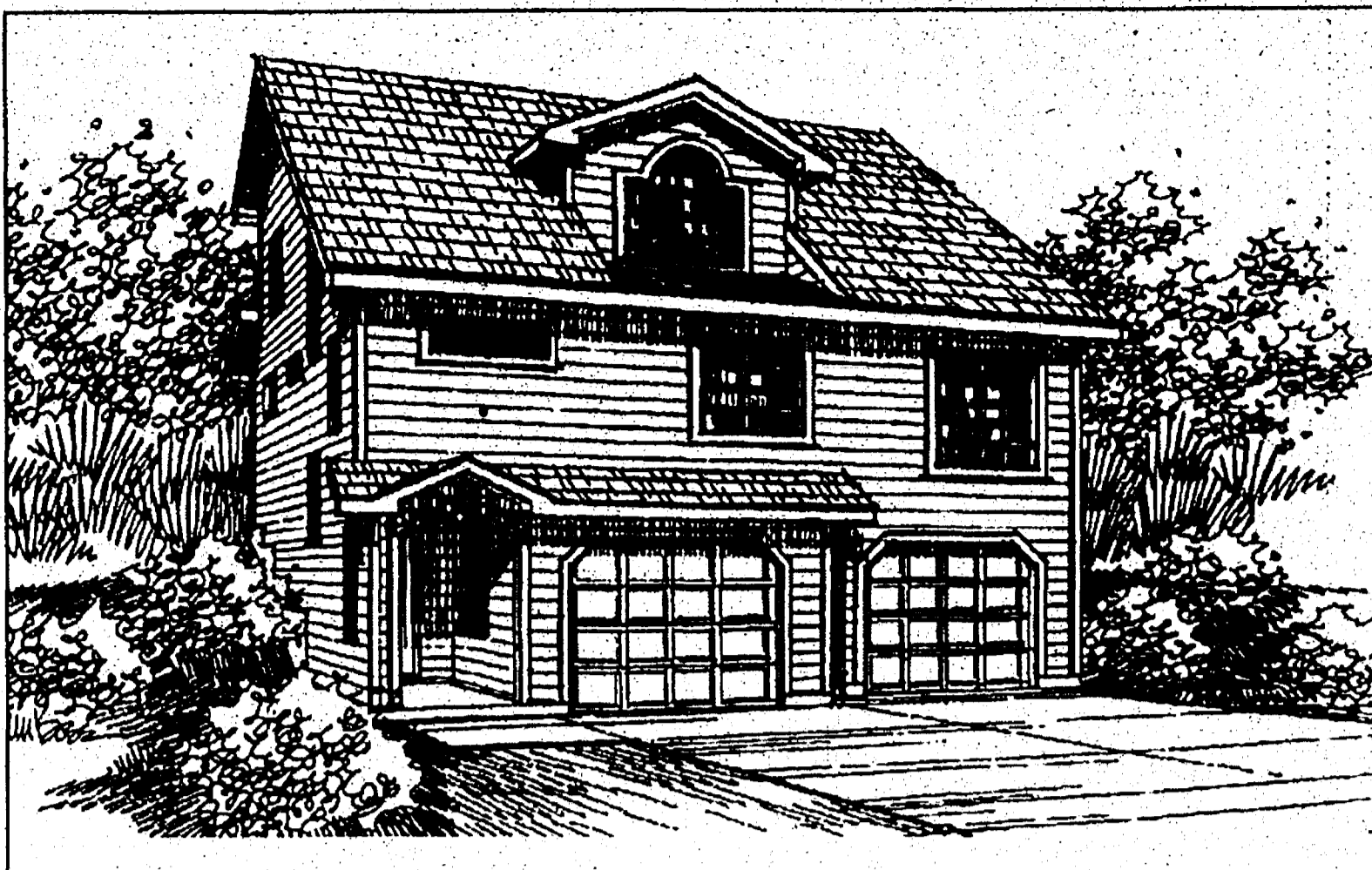
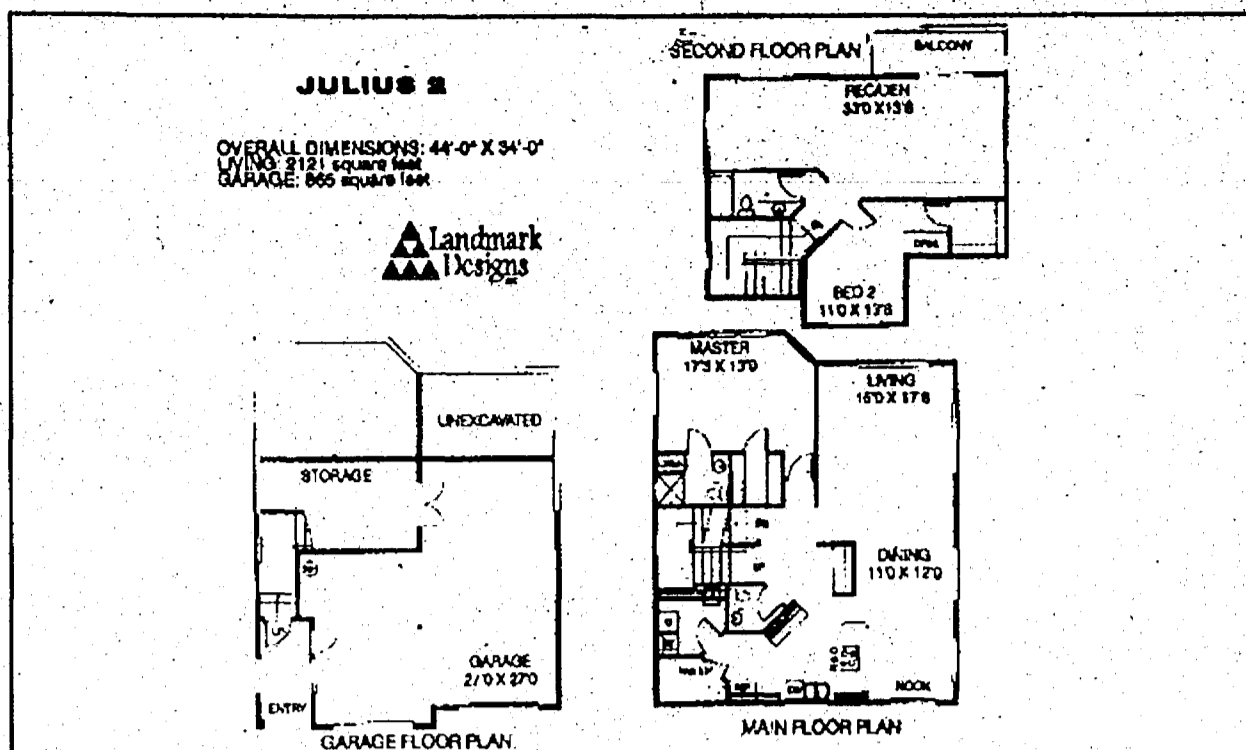

Moulding gives ceilings an elegant touch

"Moulding provides elegance, surprise, unexpected detail," said New York designer, Stan Hura. "It's like pearls - it dresses up a room."

Affordable and easy to install, hardwood mouldings transform an ordinary room into one rich in character, depth and definition. A touch of moulding establishes mood, emphasizes architecture and creates a focal point.

"Mouldings are an easy way to add character and they don't have to be used traditionally," said Atlanta designer Charles Gandy. "I just designed a bedroom with traditional moulding, but I let it float away from the ceiling to create a space for cover lighting."

Mouldings and decorative woodwork direct the eye, add pleasing changes in scale within a room and can unify or divide a space.

"Setting off one area with different mouldings can give you definition between rooms where you may not have any walls," says Chicago interior designer Marlene Rimland. "All it may take is a change of moulding on the ceiling or at floor level."

When shopping for hardwood moulding, you'll find a wide range of choices to fit any budget. You can custom order decorative hardwoods through your architect, contractor or interior designer or through millwork houses, specialty shops and custom cabinet shops. You can find them, too, at local lumberyards and home centers or through mail-order specialty catalogs.

Oak, alder, ash, beech, birch, cherry, maple and walnut are among the most popular choices for hardwood mouldings. Poplar is a particularly option, since it's painted easily to flatter the wall color, window treatments or upholstery.

Moulding choices depend of the size and scale of your room. Crown mouldings, for example, work best in rooms where the ceilings are 8 feet or higher. Choose narrower mouldings for smaller rooms, wider ones for larger rooms.

Mouldings should be widest at the floor level, becoming progressively narrower as they approach the ceiling.

If you want visual continuity

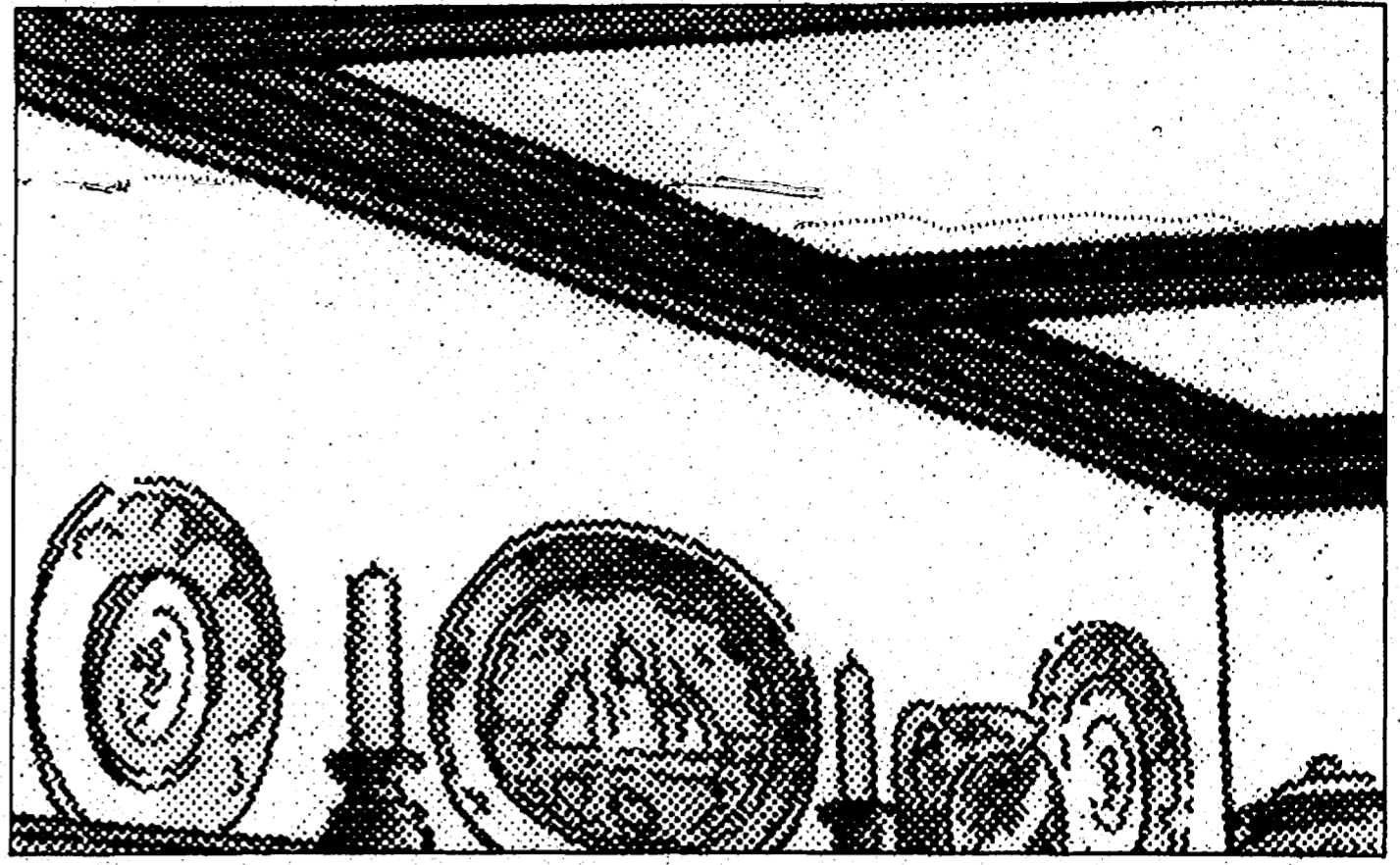
and flow, continue the same moulding pattern in adjacent rooms - especially if there's an uninterrupted view from room to room. For example, extend the entryway mouldings to your formal living room.

Hardwood mouldings add a touch of class even to a plain drywall ceiling. For example, crown moulding in classic dentil design embodies sophistication and elegance.

Running from 32 to 42 inches above the floor, chair rails protect walls from chair backs and can signal a change in wall covering. For instance, the upper half may be painted while the lower half is wallpapered.

Go ahead and mix grain patterns, tones and colors in your mouldings, flooring and furnishings.
