# Head Table Camellias

This, our fourth year of tabulating camellia varieties appearing at the head table of representative camellia shows throughout the southeastern states, revealed no major changes. Prior surveys are reported in *Carolina Camellias*; Vol. XXII—No. 3, pp. 26-28; Vol. XXIII—No. 3, pp. 12-14; and Vol. XXIV—No. 3, pp. 21-24.

Without distinguishing the type of award, i.e., Best-In-Show, Runner-Up Best, Court of Honor, etc., a total of 114 japonica varieties were represented on the head tables of eleven individual camellia shows. Nineteen varieties appeared at the head table on three or more occasions, with 'TOMORROW PARK HILL' heading the list of most appearances, as shown in Table 1.

The Best-In-Show award for large japonica camellias grown with protection was bestowed upon a different variety at each of the eleven shows. 'HARRIET BISBEE' and 'SAWADA'S DREAM' were each granted the Best Medium japonica award twice, 'MAN SIZE' was judged the Best Miniature japonica twice, and 'CHARLIE BETTES' and 'GUS MENARD' were each given the Best White japonica award on two occasions. Other varieties receiving such honors in the Grown-Protected category are shown in Table 2.

The number of japonica blooms grown without protection and exhibited in the shows we attended increased markedly this year due to less harsh weather during most of the camellia season. As a result, a greater number of varieties were in evidence at the head table. 'ELEGANS SUPREME' and 'VILLE DE NANTES' were each bestowed the Best-In-Show award for unprotected blooms on three occasions. Many of the varieties normally exhibited in the Crown-Protected category are quite prominent in the list of winners for the unprotected varieties because of the more favorable climatic conditions, as shown in Table 4.

This show should be viewed by thousands of visitors to the State Fair. We urge all camellia growers to please come and bring your blooms. Interest in camellias has declined during the past few years. The show should help to re-stimulate that interest and we hope will gain many new members for our State and National Camellia societies.

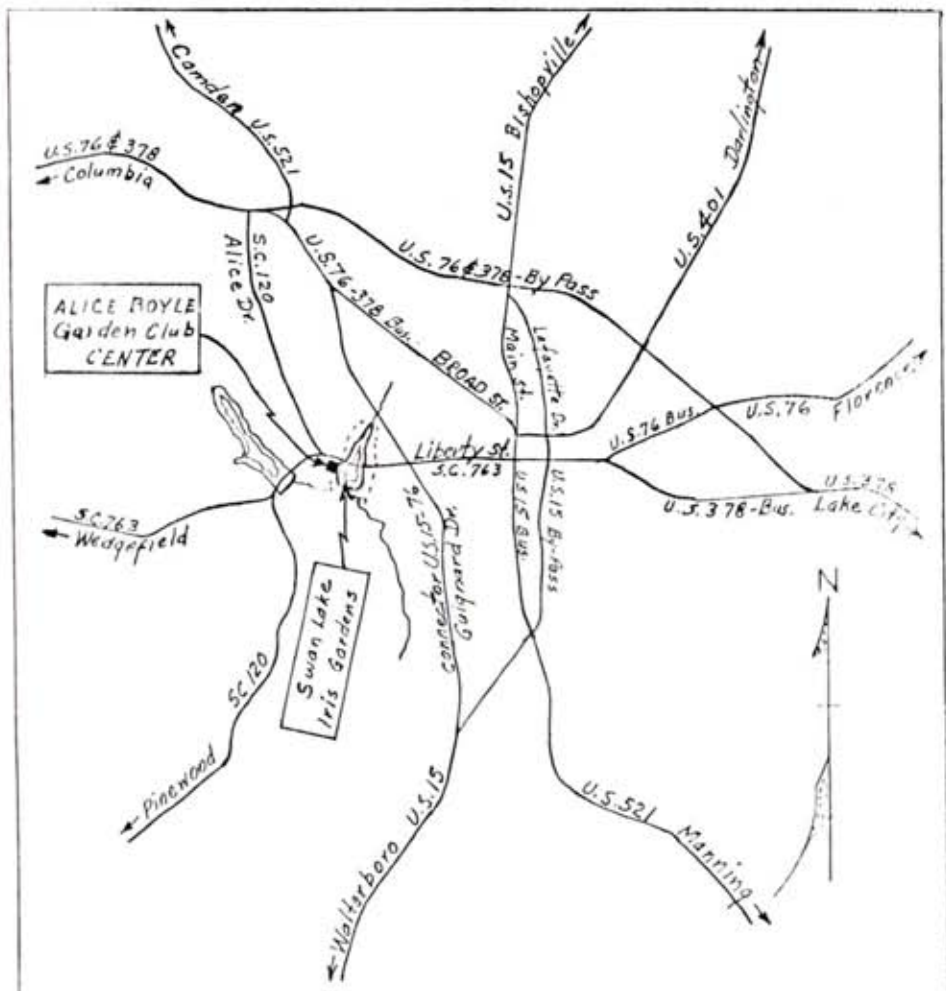

I have been asked to tell you how easy it is to photograph your camellia blooms so we can enjoy them the year round. Not only is it easy but it is also a lot of fun.

## FOR 35 MM SLIDES

First, lets get the correct film. For black and white we suggest that you use Plus X which is a fine grain film. But why use black and white when you can use color film? When using color film we suggest that you use KODACHROME TWO. We have no stock in Eastman Kodak Company and are not trying to sell film. We just want you to get true color that will last and last. If you are going to make your pictures under artificial light, we suggest you use Type A Kodachrome (professional). If you use Type A film you can also use it for daylight exposures by using an 85 filter to correct from artificial light to daylight. But if you are going to make all your pictures by daylight, use DAYLIGHT KODACHROME II.

## CAMERA TYPE

You can use most any make 35 MM camera; all will make good pictures but the most convenient type for amateurs is a REFLEX camera and you can see on the ground glass just what your lens sees and it can be framed perfectly. Most camera lens will focus within two and a half to three and a half feet. To fill the negative with just the bloom you can use a one, two

or three plus attachment to fit over your regular lens. In using any of the plus lens, you will have a very shallow depth of field, so in order to get a sharp overall picture you must use a small diaphragm opening, at least f:11 or f:16 is better. In using such a small opening you will have to allow more time for the shutter to allow enough light for the proper exposure. In using a slow shutter speed it is a MUST to use a tripod. You should always use a tripod on any shutter speed from twenty-fifty of a second or slower shutter speed.

If your camera is the type that has a removable lens, then you can use a bellows or extension tubes to make your closeups. This type is preferred by me over all others. But say your camera is not a reflex or that the lens cannot be removed to use a bellows or extension tubes, then you get a set of one, two or three plus lens. Each lens has a chart giving the exact measurements in inches that the subject will be in focus and be sure that your measurements are correct or you will have a picture that is out of focus. You may also have trouble with your paralax correction working so close to the subject and the way to correct this is by removing the back from the camera (after film has been removed) and use a piece of cleansing tissue or milk glass placed at back of camera to focus on, after you have a sharp focus, using the plus lens of your choice, make a wire



frame from a clothes hanger or smaller wire if you prefer and frame the subject of the picture (see diagram), attach with a single strand of wire to your camera the proper distance from camera to subject, then it will be so easy to frame the flower you want to photograph without measuring every time and then, too, your picture will always be framed properly.

Correct exposure is most important. If you have a light meter use it on each exposure because a light color needs less exposure than a dark color. If you do not have a light meter and do not want to invest in one, make three exposures; make the first one that is recommended by the film manufacturer, the second one stop over their recommendation and the next one stop under. Be sure to make a

note of each exposure and in the future use the exposure that produces the best picture. For example, if the film manufacturer says make the picture at a twenty-fifty of a second at F:8. For one stop over that use the next slower shutter speed on your camera and for a stop under instead of using a twenty-fifth shutter speed use a fiftieth shutter speed or use a twenty-fifth shutter speed and use F:11. We recommend the latter as your picture will be sharper.

We like to use a solid background for a single bloom, black is our preference. By using a solid background you have nothing to detract from the beauty of the bloom. Get out the old camera and get shutter-happy. It is a lot of fun and you will never tire of looking at the pictures.

# Further Studies On Dieback Control

## A Progress Report\*\*

The camellia disease dieback and canker is caused by a strain of the fungus *Glomerella cingulata*. This disease attacks the stem primarily, although occasionally green seed pods and very tender leaves are affected. The fungus survives from year to year in dead lesions (cankers) on camellia stems and in the spring, when the combination of moisture and temperature conditions is suitable, spores are produced on the cankers in abundance during an extended time period, usually from late April through early July. The spores characteristically are disseminated randomly from these cankers by splashing raindrops. During this period, young succulent camellia growth develops and also old leaves fall throughout this time period from both *Camellia japonica* and *C. sasanqua*. The fallen leaf creates a leaf scar wound which temporarily serves as a means through which the fungus can gain entry since the fungus typically cannot enter nonwounded tissue. Since *Glomerella cingulata* is a wound parasite, any wounds created by man, such as during pruning, grafting, or propagation by cuttings, affords a potential source for fungal entry. Once the fungus is internal there is no satisfactory means of "curing" the plant other than to cut out all diseased

(discolored) wood. Inoculations (placement of laboratory grown spores onto camellia surfaces under suitable environmental conditions) made on pruning wounds and to leaf scar wounds and allowed an incubation period of 24 hours cannot be eradicated by chemical means.

One point that deserves mentioning concerns infection on certain cultivars of both *Camellia japonica* and *C. sasanqua*. On these special cultivars, infection does take place and if the stem is smaller than pencil-size, the entire stem usually dies. However, on larger stems cankers develop within 4 to 8 weeks after infection occurs, but then the progress of the disease is stopped and after a year or so the cankers heal completely. This is particularly true with cultivars such as 'PROFESSOR SARGENT', GOVERNOR MOUTON', and 'SETSUGEKKA'.

It was reasoned that control might be achieved then by protecting natural and artificial camellia wounds by spraying or dipping with one or more fungicide(s) that has good biological activity against the fungal spores.

An evaluation of available fungicides in the laboratory revealed that dodine (trade name Cyprex) is biologically active against this fungus in that 1000 ppm ai completely killed all

fungus spores within 50 minutes (Table 1). Triphenyl tin hydroxide (trade name Du-Ter) was almost as effective. Benomyl (trade name Benlate) did not kill spores, but in a separate test (Table 2) it was inhibitory to spore germination and to growth of the fungus in culture at concentrations as low as 1 ppm ai. Benomyl thus is fungistatic but not fungicidal (cide—to kill), and it is a very persistent compound, both on and in plant tissue and also in the soil. In an effort to combine the fungicidal effectiveness of dodine and the fungistatic and persistent capabilities of benomyl, the two chemicals were mixed and used at rates of 1 pound and  $\frac{1}{2}$  pound per 100 gallons of water of dodine and benomyl, respectively.

Studies using this mixture of chemicals whereby both scions and cuttings were soaked for 50 minutes indicated that there were no toxic effects.

Parallel studies using sodium hypochlorite (trade name Chlorox) at 100 ppm ai ( $1\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoonful/gallon water) revealed that fungus spores are instantly killed when exposed to this solution. Tools used in grafting, in pruning, and in preparation of cuttings should be dipped frequently in this solution.

Field studies were conducted with both benomyl and dodine sprayed onto new spring foliage of cultivars of both *Camellia japonica* and *C. sasanqua* at a rate of 10,000 ppm ai singly and in combination without causing any detectable injury. These

rates are at least tenfold greater than that recommended for use with either of these chemicals. Sprays directed to such tender foliage should provide a test adequately severe so that if plant toxicity is to be found it would occur under these conditions. Similarly, toxicity tests were conducted with applications of sodium hypochlorite (100 ppm ai) sprayed onto camellias as well as to several other plant species. At this level the material was not toxic. Since this material is very corrosive to metals, it should be used with caution. However, this level (100 ppm ai) is less than that used by most housewives in their laundry and therefore it should be safe to skin.

Benomyl is relatively persistent and thus adds insurance to the dodine which kills any exposed *Glomerella*

spores. However, neither chemical can penetrate down deeply into the bud scales, but, as the new growth of scions emerges, the benomyl should still give suppressive action against any newly exposed *Glomerella* spores which had failed to be exposed to and killed by the dodine at the time of treatment. Actually, benomyl prevents spore germination and the injured plant parts (cuttings, scions, or understock) will thus heal, which prevents infection from occurring during the postgraft period unless a new injury is sustained by the camellia.

One very serious limitation to this method of controlling camellia die-back is that it is strictly preventative in scope. No control has resulted when either or both of these chemicals have been applied to plants after they are

infected. Therefore, any time that camellias are wounded as in pruning, a spray using these two chemicals applied in combination must be used the same day that the plants sustained the wounds. After infection takes place, the chemical cannot reach the fungus and the disease therefore progresses. Disease, of course, occurs only if the fungus gets into wounds of susceptible varieties in the proper environment. If the conditions of the environment are hot and dry as sometimes occurs in August or if the temperature is very low (less than 60 F), as usually occurs during late February or early March, then the plants can be wounded (pruned) without much danger of infection occurring through the pruning wounds. The plants should not be pruned dur-

ing October, November, December, January or early February because of the danger of cold injury.

None of these practices should be construed as substitutes for sound horticultural management practices. At no time should known diseased cuttings, scions, or understock be used for propagative purposes.

We, therefore, have no real answer yet for plants which have cankers already on them. But for new grafts or cuttings, a preventative program as herein outlined should aid in efforts to grow healthier and better camellias.

*Benomyl and dodine have not been cleared by EPA for use on camellias and therefore cannot be recommended or used at this time.* Both of them, however, are quite safe to humans, animals and plants and have been

cleared for use on various food or ornamental crops such as dodine on apples and benomyl on peanuts and roses.

Further work is in progress on means to provide a penetration mechanism for dodine into the crevices and bud scales.

### Summary

Dodine is highly fungicidal to spores of the strain of *Glomerella cingulata* pathogenic to camellias. Benomyl has excellent fungistatic properties against this organism. No toxicity to either camellia cuttings, scions, or plants with young, tender foliage was noted from a combination of the two chemicals at the rates studied. Spores of all

isolates were killed by dodine at 1200 ppm ai for 5 minute exposures and all isolates were completely suppressed when benomyl was added to carrot juice agar (the growth medium used for *Glomerella*) at concentrations as low as 1 ppm ai. (This concentration is equivalent to adding a drop of liquid to 13.2 gallons of water.)

Disinfest tools used in preparation of cuttings, scions, and understock for propagation purposes in a solution of sodium hypochlorite (1½ teaspoonful per gallon water).

The procedures outlined herein offer promise of giving effective control of camellia dieback and canker when they are used in conjunction with good cultural practices.
