



Instruction for oral presentations

Scientific sessions will be held in the Conference Halls of Vitoshka Park Hotel.

The duration of the lectures is 20 min incl. 5 min for discussion.

- Participation: one person is allowed to give no more than two oral presentations and two posters as a presenting author.
- Technical equipment: please, specify in the online registration form what kind of equipment you need. Available facilities are:
 - Flipchart;
 - Multimedia;
 - Overhead;
 - Slide projector;
 - Internet connection.

Poster guidelines

Posters should stimulate discussion. The poster should include a brief overview of the study; it should only display the essentials; if your point can be made with fewer words, then edit your poster accordingly. (The less text on your poster, the larger your graphic element and your font can be.)

Size

Maximum poster size is 100 cm high and 90 cm wide. A poster printed on one large sheet is encouraged. Hand written posters are not accepted.

Layout

Posters should have a logical organization. Most posters have sequential sections (e.g. Background, Aim, Methods, Results, Conclusion). Avoid everything that can make your poster look excessively busy, such as boxes around graphs and tables, and long sentences.

Title

Aim for a short title. Size of the letters should be at least 30 pt. State authors and affiliations below the title, in a smaller font. Include mailing and e-mail addresses, telephone and fax numbers at the bottom of the poster. Grant sources supporting the study may also be included below the title or at the bottom.

Body text

The text is more digestible if it is split into logical sections interspersed with graphics

and the size of letters is at least 16 pt. Use bullet lists where possible. Minimize the amount of written text. Text should never dominate the poster.

Graphics

Graphics should be understandable without need for a detailed description. Aim for simplicity, not complexity. Title should inform about the content of the figures.

Tables

Avoid large tables. Make a selection of the most important results. Align decimal points. Title should inform about the information in the table.

Handouts

Handouts of posters are encouraged.

Instructions for abstracts preparation

extended to 28 February, 2006

Deadline for abstract submission: 15 February, 2006.

The abstract should include: Title, Authors, Institution and Abstract text. The abstracts will be accepted **only online** via the website of the Congress.

Abstract format

Use only the English alphabet and spelling. The text cannot exceed 1000 characters, excluding title and authors. No tables and graphics are allowed. No literature cited. The abstracts will not be edited, please, obtain language assistance before you submit your abstract.

The plenary lectures, oral presentations and posters can be published in a supplement volume of *Phytologia Balcanica* – an international journal issued by the Institute of Botany, Bulgarian Academy of Sciences. The authors who intend to publish their presentations in this way are kindly requested to submit an electronic version and one printed copy at the Registration Desk of the Congress by 25th June 2006. The papers will not be reviewed but only edited. However, the Editorial Board retains the right to reject papers that do not correspond to the standards and style of the Journal.



The city of Sofia

Sofia has a history that goes back thousands of years. Through the centuries, many peoples have inhabited it and added to its rich and diverse history. The Thracian Serdi tribe settled here in the 7th century BC and gave the first recorded name of Sofia: Serdica. The Byzantines called it Triaditsa and the Slavs, Sredets. The modern city of Sofia was named in the 14th century after the St. Sofia basilica. In the 3rd century AD, the Romans built strong walls around Serdica, their capital of Inner Dacia and an important stopping point on the Roman road from Naisus (present Nish, Serbia and Montenegro) to Constantinople. After the Hun invasion of 441, the town was rebuilt by the Byzantines. The Slavs gave Sredets a key role in the First Bulgarian Empire, then in 1018 the Byzantines regained Triaditsa. At the end of the 12th century, the Bulgarians returned and Sredets became a major trading center of the Second Bulgarian Empire. The Turks captured Sofia in 1382 and made it the center of the Rumelian Beylerbeyship. The city declined during feudal unrests of the 19th century, but with the establishment of the Third Bulgarian State in 1879, Sofia once again became the capital of Bulgaria. Today there are many archaeological sites in Sofia that display the city's rich history: the castle gates and towers of Serdica, public buildings and streets thousands of years old.

The city's image changed rapidly from Oriental into European. Today many streets, buildings, parks, and even whole neighborhoods preserve the architectural style from the turn of the 20th century. Between 1879 and 1939, the population of Sofia grew from 20 000 to 300 000, while today 1 250 000 people live in Sofia.

Since ancient times the city has been famous for the abundance of cold and thermal mineral water springs in and around it. The water is still available today and is praised for its numerous properties. Springs may be found in the city center, as well as in the neighbourhoods: Knyazhevo, Gorna Banya, Bankya, Ovcha Kupel and Ivanyane.

Travel information

Transport

Sofia is easily accessible by air, train, bus or car and the transportation means is your choice. The taxi fare from airport, the Central Train Station and Central Bus Station to the Hotel is ca. 5–6 Euro. When you decide to choose the taxi company we recommend the use of OK Super Trans. This company has a desk at the Airport. If you need a taxi, please, go to this Desk and order it. The same company can be also used from the train and bus stations. The Hotel Vitosha also maintains an official contract with the same company. To avoid overcharging, it is recommendable to use only this company to reach the Hotel.

Visa requirements

The entry formalities for Bulgaria vary according to the country of origin. For EU countries visa is not required. Please, contact your travel agent or the Bulgarian Embassy in your country for formalities. The Congress Secretariat will send you a letter of invitation upon request. It should be understood that this letter is only to help delegates to raise travel funds or to obtain a visa and is not a commitment on the part of the organizers to provide any financial support. Applications for a letter of invitation should be received by the Congress Secretariat before 1st April, 2006. Please, note that visa application can take a lot of time.

Clothing/Weather

Early summer in Bulgaria is normally warm (25°C on average), but this period of the summer can also be rainy.

For the excursions and field trips you will need rain-protection clothes and shoes suitable for climbing.

Currency

The unit of currency in Bulgaria is the lev (BGN) (= 100 stotinki).

Exchange rate: the official bank exchange rate is 1 Euro = 1.955830 BGN. The exchange rate at the airport is relatively low. At the Hotel there is a bank desk where you can change your money during the working days. There is also an ATM (automatic telling machine) at the hotel that can operate with international credit cards.

Mid-Congress botanical excursion

Date: Friday, 23 June, 2006

Departure: from Vitosha Park Hotel – 9:00 to Aleko Tourist Centre

Return: from Vitosha Mountain to Vitosha Park Hotel at 5 p.m.

Participants: all participants in the Congress. The price is included in the registration fee.

Includes: transportation, boxed lunch and a botanist guide

Description and aims of the excursion:

Vitosha mountain is situated at approximately an hour's driving from Sofia. The highest peak is Cherni Vruh at 2290 m a. s. l., together with nine more peaks above 2000 m. The mountain shelters century old broadleaved and spruce forests, specific subalpine communities, together with their quite diverse flora of over 1480 species of vascular plants. During the excursion, the group will visit the high-mountain belt between 2000 and 2290 m, where a significant amount of endemic species could be seen, such as the Balkan endemics *Leontodon rilaensis*, *Hesperis dinarica*, *Lilium jankae*, *Aquilegia aurea*, *Angelica pancicii*, *Festuca valida*, *Dianthus microlepis*, *Senecio pancicii*, *Silene roemeri*, *Pinguicula balcanica*, *Sesleria comosa*, *Geum coccineum*, *Primula farinosa* ssp. *exigua*; as well as rare plants, such as *Lathyrus alpestris*, *Geranium coeruleatum*, *Gentiana punctata*, *Gentiana lutea*, *Anemone narcissiflora*, *Jovibarba heuffelii*, *Swertia perennis* etc. Orchids are also expected to be seen: *Traunsteinera globosa*, *Dactylorhiza cordigera*, *Pseudorchis albida*, *Nigritella nigra*, etc.

The walking is light to medium difficult. The starting and the final point of the route are the same, and suitable rest-stops and view points are planned on the way.

Southeast Bulgaria, Mt Strandzha

Prices: for a group of 10–16 people, 230 Euro for accommodation in double rooms. For accommodation in a single room: an additional charge of 20 Euro. For a group of 16–40 people, 210 Euro for accommodation in double rooms. For accommodation in a single room: an additional charge of 20 Euro.

The price includes: transportation by bus, 3 nights full-board accommodation (including boxed lunches for the field trips) and an extra lunch for the return trip, a botanist trip guide.

The price does not include: flights to and from Sofia; accommodation for 29th June, 2006.

Itinerary: The itinerary will cross Bulgaria in the east-southeast direction (about 410 km). It will pass through the fertile Thracian Lowland (near Plovdiv) and at the town of Sliven will turn parallel to the southern slopes of the Balkan Range. From Bourgas it will go southwards for 60 km and will reach the Primorsko town, a famous Black Sea resort. On the second and third day short trips (about 100 km) will be organized to the inner parts of

Strandzha mountain. On the way back to Sofia the group will stop for a short visit at the Sinite Kamuni (Blue Rocks) Nature Park (the Balkan Range). The participants can see there high-mountain vegetation on a limestone base.

Description and aims of the field trip: Acquaintance with different plant communities and flora of the sand dunes at the South Black Sea Coast near Primorsko. South Euxinian flora and vegetation could be seen at Mt Strandzha.

Prevailing plants and plant communities:

Psamophytic vegetation: about 60 typical psamophytic and some halophytic plant species, including: *Elymus elongatus*, *Leymus racemosus* ssp. *sabulosus*, *Linum tauricum* ssp. *bulgaricum*, *Eryngium maritimum*, *Ammophila arenaria*, *Aurinia uechtritziana*, *Cionura erecta*, etc.

South Euxinian flora and vegetation: forests of *Fagus orientalis* and *Quercus polycarpa*, *Quercus hartwissiana* with *Rhododendron ponticum*, *Daphne pontica*, *Laurocerasus officinalis*, *Ilex colchica*, and of the herbaceous plant species *Fritillaria pontica*, *Primula acaulis* ssp. *rubra*, *Anemone blanda*, *Cyclamen coum*, *Scilla bithynica*, *Trachystemon orientalis*.

Special attention: Mt Strandzha is a risk region for ticks. Please, be prepared with suitable clothes and repellents.

Southwest Bulgaria, river Strouma valley and Rila and Pirin mountains

Prices: for a group of 10–16 people, 145 Euro for accommodation in double rooms; for a group of 16–40 people, 140 Euro for accommodation in double rooms. For accommodation in a single room: an additional charge of 20 Euro.

The price includes: transportation by bus, 2 nights full-board accommodation (including boxed lunches for the field trips) and an extra lunch for the return trip, a botanist trip guide.

The price does not include: flights to and from Sofia; accommodation for 28th June, 2006.

Itinerary: Sofia – Kresna – Breznitza – Bansko – peak Vichren – Bansko – Rila Monastery – lake Suhoto – Sofia.

Description and aims of the field trip: The field trip is aimed to present the varied flora and plant communities of the river Strouma valley, the hilly area of Southwest Bulgaria (alt. 300–400 m), up to the alpine vegetation in Rila and Pirin mountains (alt. 2700–2915 m).

Prevailing plants and plant communities:

Main landscapes and vegetation types are: the plantain (*Platanus orientalis*) woods in the Strouma valley; the Mediterranean communities of *Juniperus excelsa*, with the presence of *Juniperus oxycedrus*, *Pistacia terrebinthus*, *Phillyrea latifolia*, *Colutea arborescens*, *Coronilla emerus*, *Hypericum olympicum*, etc.; the altitudinal zonation of the vegetation on limestone and silicate base (mountain forests, the timberline and the alpine flora and vegetation in Rila and Pirin mountains is the richest in endemics area for Bulgaria). The botanical trip to the Pirin Mts passes through forests of endemic pines *Pinus peuce* and *P. heldreichii* and through subalpine formations of *Pinus mugo* and *Juniperus sibirica*. The following endemic species occur in the subalpine and alpine zones: *Daphne kosaninii*, *Centaurea kellereri*, *Saxifraga ferdinandi-coburgi*, *S. spruneri*, *Oxytropis urumovii*, *Papaver degenii*, *Cyanus achtarovii*, *Erigeron vichrensis*, *Poa pirinica*, etc. In the Rila Mts acidophilus *Picea* forests and subalpine and alpine flora complexes can be seen. Among the numerous endemic species are: *Acer heldreichii*, *Lilium jankae*, *Geum bulgaricum*, *Rheum rhaponticum*, *Aubrieta gracilis*, *Cyanus orbelicus*, etc.

South Bulgaria, Western Rhodopi Mountains

Prices: for a group of 10–16 people, 150 Euro for accommodation in double rooms; for a group of 16–40 people, 135 Euro for accommodation in double rooms. For accommodation in a single room: an additional charge of 20 Euro.

The price includes: transportation by bus, 2 nights full-board accommodation (including boxed lunches for the field trips) and an extra lunch for the return trip, a botanist trip guide.

The price does not include: flights to and from Sofia; accommodation for 28th June, 2006.

Itinerary: Sofia – Pamporovo Resort – Trigrad – Devin – Beglika – Sofia.

Description and aims of the field trip: The field trip presents an opportunity for having a glimpse of the magnificence of “the snow-clad mountain of the Thracians”, as Homer called the Rhodopes. The Rhodopes are part of the extensive Traco-Macedonian massif at the heart of the Balkan Peninsula. The mountain has a complicated geological history and constitutes of a host of ridges with different orientation, deep valleys and plateaus. The average altitude is 785 m and the highest peak is Perelik (2191 m).

Prevailing plants and plant communities:

The Rhodopes are the richest floristic region in Bulgaria. More than 2500 species grow here, among which many Balkan and Bulgarian endemics, including the relic endemics *Haberlea rhodopensis* and *Lathraea rhodopea*. Forests prevail as a vegetation type: *Pinus silvestris*, *Picea abies* and *Abies borisii-regis* are the dominant species, the latter in the southern parts of the mountain. Deciduous forests (mainly of beech and oak, but also mixed forests with a number of other deciduous species) dominate the northern slopes and eastern part of the mountain. Extensive pastures and meadows have existed since the Thracian times. Along river Chepelarska (Chaya) one can visit the “locus classicus” of some species described by Josef Velenovsky (*Verbascum decorum*, *Seseli rhodopeum*, etc.). The itinerary reaches the Pamporovo Resort. It is situated among a splendid mosaic of coniferous forests and meadows (in full bloom at that season!). The second day is fully devoted to the carst area near Trigrad village, well known for the famous Trigrad gorge. The richness of the flora is amazing: *Abies borisii-regis*, *Haberlea rhodopensis*, *Scabiosa rhodopensis*, *Arenaria rhodopaea*, *Saxifraga stribrnyi*, *Campanula orphanidea*, *Chondrilla urumoffii*, *Marrubium frivaldskyanum*, *Crataegus orientalis*, *Morina persica*, and many others. During the last day the group will stop in the Beglika Nature Reserve with century-old spruce forests. Here boreal elements like *Galium boreale*, *Potentilla palustris*, *Potentilla fruticosa*, etc. grow together with the endemics *Viola rhodopeia*, *Geum rhodopaeum*. On the adjacent marble screes and slopes one can encounter *Astragalus alopecurus*, *Saponaria bellidifolia*, *Saxifraga sempervivum*.

History: the Boyana Church was built in three stages: in the late 10th and early 11th, the mid-13th, and the mid-19th centuries. The oldest section (the eastern part of the church) is a small, one-apse cross-vaulted building with inbuilt cruciform supports. It was erected in the late 10th and early 11th century. The second part, which adjoins the eastern section, was commissioned by Sebastocrator Kaloyan and his wife Dessislava in the mid-13th century. This building is of the two-floor tomb-church type. It consists of a ground-floor family sepulchre with a semi-cylindrical vault and two arcosolia on the northern and southern walls, and an upper-floor family chapel identical in design to the eastern section. The exterior is decorated with ceramic ornaments. The church is a UNESCO heritage site.

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
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
