

## About our Guest Speaker

Tom joined the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay in 1965. Over the years he has held many positions in the Guild including serving as President six times. Tom has always been instrumental in encouraging and working with the BGTB members to present annual bromeliad shows, participating in community shows and sales to promote bromeliads, refurbishing bromeliad beds at Lowry Park Zoo, Eureka Springs Park, and Ybor City Museum State Park. Tom helps create displays at the Florida State Fair annually promoting bromeliads and club members pass out literature to thousands of attendees. Tom has served as Chairman of the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies several times. Tom was General Chairman of the successful 1992 World Bromeliad Conference, "Bromeliad Safari", hosted by the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay at Saddlebrook Golf & Tennis Resort. Because of Tom's leadership, the Club was able to make contributions to the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies,

the Evil Weevil Fund, funding for local parks, improvements to the Guild's meeting & library facilities as well as secure the financial future of the club. Tom became an accredited BSI Bromeliad Judge in 1982 and is now a Master Judge. He served on the BSI Board of Directors for 14 years serving as Director, Secretary, and 6 years as Vice President and 6 years as President. Tom is the only BSI President that has served two consecutive terms. Under Tom's leadership, the Board operated effectively and efficiently to serve its members. Tom is presently Chair of the World Headquarters Committee which is an effort to try and establish a permanent home for the Bromeliad Society International at The Marie Selby Botanical Gardens in Sarasota, Florida. The garden would make a perfect home for the BSI since The Mulford Foster Bromeliad Identification Center is already located there and the BSI Archive files are housed there.

Tom has designed and installed many residential and commercial landscapes featuring bromeliads. He is in demand as a speaker throughout Florida and the United States presenting programs on bromeliads to Garden Clubs, Bromeliad Clubs, and the University of South Florida Botanical Gardens. Tom has worked tirelessly through the years, providing leadership when needed, and promoting bromeliads on the local, state, national and international levels. He is presently serving as the President of the Tampa Bay Orchid Society and Director of the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay. His wife, Carol, is Vice President of the BGTB.

Tom and Carol live in Lutz and grow their bromeliads on their 2.5 acres of land and greenhouses. Carol photographs blooming bromeliads in their yard and greenhouses each month and has a collection of 13,000 plus bromeliad pictures. Some of her bromeliad photos were recently published in the Tampa Bay Magazine. Tom will be using some of these photos in a power point program as he shares his knowledge about them.

#### Editors Disclaimer

It must be the right conditions developed this years end in a still confused weather picture, to give us a most extraordinary show of blooming Billbergias. I am glad we did not travel during the Holidays and were present to record these beauties. Here are few of the pictures I took. I am sure you will appreciate the characteristics of the flowers, particularly the color of ovaries, sepals and petals which are quite variable in different Billbergias.



First, our B. Caramba' ('Manda's Othello' X 'Poquito Blanco'), its inflorescence characterized by blue tipped floral bracts and petals

Next, at right, is B. Pink Champagne', a very popular complex Carrone hybrid. The flower is very similar but for mostly green sepals with a tinge of pink.

Directly below are two of Don Beadle's hybrids. On the left B. 'Arriba' (Amoena V. rubra x 'Manda's Othello') shows an almost green flower except for the

blue típs. B. 'Muchacho' (horrída v. tígrína x vítata 'Colores') at ríght, ís a hard looking plant and its flowers are all green with strong ovary ridges.



B. 'Miz Mollie', an old Beadle hybrid of Amoena v. rubra x 'Muriel Waterman' is one of the largest non-pendant Billbergias. The very intense color of the plant contrasts with the almost green flower. Sepals are light green with just an edge of a darker green like the color of the petals.

With the well liked B. 'Hallelujah' (vitata 'Domingos Martins' x amoena 'Ed MacWiliams') on the left, Don Beadle obtained an enduring hybrid. It did not miss the show. The photo on the right correspond to one of the light colored Billbergias: 'Grace Goode'. Its tender inflorescence is almost completely light green lacking the intense violet of the 'Hallelujah' petals.







Finally, after almost six years waiting for it to bloom, Beadle's hybrid 1464, soon to be named 'El Zorro', exploded with most striking colors. Note the bright red pedicels and sepals crowned by violet petals against the black leaves.

#### Save our Bromeliads!

Although habitat destruction is a continual hazard for bromeliads in south Florida, the most immediate and serious threat they face is from an invasive, exotic weevil that is killing them on protected as well as private lands. The Mexican bromeliad weevil is referred to as the "Evil Weevil" by bromeliad growers and enthusiasts throughout Florida, because of the devastating effects it has had on bromeliads in private collections and in natural areas throughout south Florida. Current management efforts are concentrating on classical biological control and the collection of seeds of native bromeliads to ensure their survival. To learn more go to
