

Gov. Kemp, Commissioner Black continue pressing for disaster aid U.S. Sens. Isakson, Perdue sign on to \$13.6 billion recovery bill

ATLANTA - Georgia Gov. Brian Kemp and Agriculture Commissioner Gary Black met with the State House Press Corps on the threshold of the Governor's Office Feb. 27 to ask their help in keeping the spotlight on the plight of Georgia farmers and rural communities still struggling to overcome Hurricane Michael.

The press conference came one day after U.S. Sens. David Perdue and Johnny Isakson introduced a \$13.6 billion disaster aid package benefiting communities in several states that have been affected by recent hurricanes, wildfires and other natural disasters. U.S. Sens. Doug Jones of Alabama, Marco Rubio and Rick Scott of Florida, Tim Scott of South Carolina, Thom Tillis of North Carolina and Dan Sullivan of Alaska co-sponsored the bill.

Trump and Vice President Pence, with Senate leaders, with Governor Kemp and with Georgia

farmers about our desperately needed disaster aid legislation and how to get it moving as soon as possible," Isakson said in a press release announcing the introduction of the package.

'This legislation will provide critical funds to our farmers and producers who suffered significant losses in Georgia last year during Hurricane Michael. We are now close to planting season, and time is of the essence for the lives and livelihoods in the industry. We cannot overstate the importance of quickly

passing this legislation to restore our agriculture community in Georgia.'

Although five months have passed since the historic storm raked a path of destruction from Donalsonville to Augusta, those impacted by the storm - including local and state governments - are still awaiting federal disaster funds to complete clean-up and recovery.

While political disagreements in Washington, D.C., have

delayed action on disaster aid, the unprecedented nature of damage caused in Georgia is also complicating the appropriation process. The storm destroyed \$2.5 billion worth of crops most at maturity and ready for harvest. Nearly \$1 billion of that total is represented by timber.

"We've never been into a timber disaster package," Black said at the press conference. 'USDA has never considered that."

Black met with U.S. Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue in Washington two days before the press conference to discuss disaster aid, and said Perdue is considering a block grant program to assist growers impacted by Hurricane Michael.

"It's very likely that may come through us," Black said of the Georgia Department of Agriculture.

He said the state will work with the Georgia Bankers Association and the state's various agricultural commodity groups to develop an equitable plan to help as many people as possible when federal funds are released.

When pressed by reporters for more detail on the means of distributing those funds, Kemp said that will come. The first order of business, however, is getting the legislation approved.

"We've talked about how we do that with every available resource to get that money out as fast we can, but first we've got to get the bill passed and that's what we're focused on today. We appreciate you all helping to keep the attention going," he said.

Georgia Grown luncheon celebrates the legacy of Agriculture Commissioner Phil Campbell Jr.

The year James Philander "Phil" Campbell Jr. won his bid to serve as Georgia's 14th Commissioner of Agriculture was the first year that the number of tractors on American farms exceeded the number of horses and mules. It was 1954, and agriculture was finally poised to enter the industrial age. Georgia voters, however, still responded to the kind of grassroots election campaign one might expect from a lifelong farmer.

Headquarters for the Campbell campaign was the front porch of the family home in Watkinsville. Phil Campbell's wife, Elizabeth "Nan" McCreery Campbell, was campaign manager. The Campbell children - six in all - were her staff.

'Mama was signing his name on the campaign letters that were being mailed out and we would fold them and put them in the envelopes and lick them and seal them and put a stamp on them and send them out," eldest son Jay Campbell said. "I remember that all I got to lick was envelopes because stamps cost too much. To this day I can't stand the taste of an envelope because we didn't have a sponge. You couldn't go buy a sponge. Well, we couldn't afford it.'

Jay Campbell and three of his five siblings — along with their spouses, children and grandchildren - were guests of current Agriculture Commissioner Gary W. Black for a special Georgia

Grown luncheon at the Georgia Department of Agriculture's headquarters in Atlanta Feb. 28. Phil Campbell Jr. served as commissioner of the department for 14 years before President Richard Nixon appointed him undersecretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture in Washington, D.C. The luncheon honoring the Campbell family coincided with the 50th anniversary of that appointment.

The Campbell name is a distinguished one in Georgia agriculture. Phil Campbell Sr. was the first director of the Georgia agricultural extension service prior to passage of the Smith-Lever Act in 1915. He also served a USDA post during President Franklin Roosevelt's administration.





FORESTRY MATTERS: Preparing for spring

Georgia Forestry Commission

As winter eases toward spring, important seasonal forestry activities roll around once again. In all parts of the state, the Georgia Forestry Commission is working with forest landowners applying good stewardship practices.

Prescribed burning – Yes, soils are saturated throughout Georgia, however most upland sites that have good drainage will lend themselves to successful prescribed burns. Much of the fuel – such as leaves,

pine needles, limbs and even some of the live vegetation – will be available to burn where conditions are favorable. It's important to not become complacent with prescribed fires as they can burn rapidly and with increased intensity. Continue to plan ahead, have sufficient firebreaks and/or barriers to prevent fire escape and to never leave fires unattended. Call your local GFC county unit office for advice and assistance and don't forget to obtain a permit from GFC before you burn.

Pests and diseases – GFC pine beetle detection flights begin in March and some Southern Pine Beetle activity has already been confirmed in Glynn County. Please report any SPB signs to your local GFC office, where county foresters are available to help you with species identification. Also, two non-native invasive plants are of concern. Japanese climbing fern, whose infestations are on the rise, and cogongrass, which is easier to detect in spring. GFC Forest Health specialists can help you




GEORGIA FORESTRY identify destructive plants and will continue to spray all cogongrass, Japanese climbing fern, Callery pear, privet, tallowtree, and chinaberry at no cost to land-owners.

State Legislature – Our legislators are working through many initiatives at the state capitol that affect each of us. The relationship you have with the people who represent you is of utmost importance. If you haven't already ensured that he or she understands the issues of significance to you and your community, do so now. It matters.

Reforestation – Planting season continues, though the wet conditions have certainly hampered those activities for many people. A very limited supply of genetically improved seedlings may still be in supply through the GFC Nursery when you read this (season closes March 15). Call the nursery at 478.508.0056 if you're interested, and make a note to order for next year when sales open in June. The 2019-20 planting season supply is expected to be tight, due to reforestation efforts in Southwest Georgia due to Hurricane Michael.

Speaking of Michael, recovery, relief, and reforestation activities are continuing. As you know, these efforts are massive and have many, many moving parts. The state tax credit program is now underway and online applications are available on the Georgia Department of Revenue website. Whether you have been directly impacted or are supporting healing from anywhere else, know that your GFC partners are right there beside you.

Hello! I'm Georgie, the Georgia Grown mascot. I travel the state promoting our No. 1 industry, agriculture! Sometimes in life, you have to take the good with the bad. In South Georgia, fire ants are the "baddest" of the bad. They can build a mound in my yard overnight. Larry Munson even compared them to the 'Dawgs Offense once, though I seem to be the only one that remembers it. Did you know fire ants aren't from around here? The Red Imported Fire Ant most likely came from colonies in Argentina in the 1930s, stowed away in tons of dirt used to keep empty cargo ships upright while traveling the ocean. When the ships arrived in Mobile Bay from the Gulf of Mexico, they dumped the dirt out - along with the ants - and loaded up with cargo to take back home. COOK GEORGIA GROWN: Strawberries!

Strawberry Relish

2 Tbsps. chopped fresh cilantro 2 tsps. lime zest 2 Tbsps. fresh lime juice 2 Tbsps. balsamic vinegar 1 tsp. coarse salt

1 tsp. black pepper **Preparation:** Combine all ingredients, cover and chill for

8 hours.

UGA Food Product Innovation Center is often behind Flavor of Georgia winners

For the past 12 years, Georgia-based food companies have competed in the Flavor of Georgia Food Product Contest. Being named a finalist - or better, a winner - in one of the contest's categories is a great boost for companies seeking success in the competitive food industry. A few of last year's winners had one thing in common: they have worked with the University of Georgia's Food Product Innovation and Commercialization Center.

Held annually, Flavor of Georgia was created and is organized by the UGA College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences Center for Agribusiness and Economic Development in partnership with Gourmet Foods International, the Office of the Georgia Governor, the Georgia Department of Agriculture, Georgia Agribusiness Council and Nadine's Classic Cuisine.

Flavor of Georgia was created to showcase products to food industry experts and grocery buyers who serve as the contest's judges. Products are rated on flavor, innovation, use of a Georgia theme and market potential. Winners earn the right to add "Flavor of Georgia contest winner" to their packaging and promotion efforts.

UGA researchers at FoodPIC, located on the UGA Griffin campus, help food entrepreneurs with product development, packaging, food safety, consumer acceptance and marketing.

In 2018, New World Chocolate Milk won first place in the Flavor of Georgia dairy products category. Produced by Rock

House Creamery in Newborn, the chocolate concoction is the brainchild of Pike County High School student Nikki Dodson, who interned as a STEM student at FoodPIC.

"New World is a high-end gourmet chocolate milk with a hint of mocha; it's like a premium Starbucks coffee," said FoodPIC Director Kirk Kealey. "The idea was to create a very distinctive flavor profile that you don't quickly forget."

the first batch of the beverage, developed the nutrition facts panel and ran a shelf-life

ed hibiscus flowers, which are more commonly used as a beverage tea in the Middle East," Kealey said. "We took the fresh flowers and dried them and then used that to make a range of hibiscus products: jelly, jam, tea and chutney. The family submitted the jelly in the Flavor of Georgia contest."

three finalists in their category last year.

For the past four years, an expert from FoodPIC has served as a Flavor of Georgia contest judge.

"By helping judge the contest, we are networking with representatives of Georgia food companies, and that's how we make introductions," Kealey said. "We've met other judges who are now great resources for our future clients. They represent grocery stores, brokers and distributors. That's what impresses me about (the Flavor of Georgia contest). It's not just a food contest; it's a major networking event where entrepreneurs can meet the people they need to connect with in Georgia.'

The UGA Department of Food Science and Technology works with every new food product that enters the market, said UGA food scientist Anand Mohan, who leads the department's extension programs.

We make sure products meet the standard of identity as it is written by the FDA and the minimum state and federal food safety requirements," he said. "We also review labels so products are marketed correctly. We are the first screening gate for product food safety and regulatory requirements before the product is marketed in commerce. We look at all aspects of food safety including the formulation and packaging."

Next, the product must be approved by the Georgia Department of Agriculture.

Mohan and his team have assisted sev eral Flavor of Georgia winners, including Olympus Green Mountain Teas, whose Olympus Green Mountain Blueberry Citrus Tea won first place in the beverage category last year. The company has several Greek tea blends and Mohan suggested that they develop a blueberry-flavored tea using Georgia-grown blueberries.



In 1996, Congress named the USDA's Natural Resource Conservation research center in Watkinsville in his honor. The facility now belongs to the University of Georgia.

The mechanization of agriculture was just one of many pivotal advancements under his son's tenure as head of the GDA. Archival issues of the *Market Bulletin* document Phil Campbell Jr.'s work to increase marketing opportunities for Georgia farmers, including the \$10 million investment in construction of the Atlanta State Farmers Market on its current site in Forest Park. He also led the department's fight against livestock diseases such as brucellosis, tuberculosis and screwworm.

Throughout Campbell's tenure, the *Market Bulletin* boasted of Georgia's position as the nation's No. 1 producer of broilers, peanuts, protected forest lands, improved pecans, pimento peppers and naval stores.

And while he was all business when it came to Georgia's No. 1 industry, the family recalled that one of Campbell Jr.'s favorite jokes concerned an advertisement he'd spied in the *Market Bulletin*, placed by a farmer selling a well cut into post holes. His was a quick wit, even when matters turned serious.

For example, the Florida Department of Agriculture once put him on notice that every Georgia chicken entering Florida had to be inspected and tagged. Remember, poultry was – then as now – a leading commodity for Georgia.

"That was going to be a cost item to put a wing tag on every chicken going to or through the state," Jay Campbell said.

His father thought about it for "a minute," Jay Campbell said, and then made a counteroffer.

"He said, 'Well, I bet a lot more oranges and grapefruit come north out of Florida than chickens do going south. Maybe we ought to think about a stamp on every orange and grapefruit.""

The Florida folks reconsidered.

"He was always going to do what was right and never for his benefit, always what was good for the farmers and the people of Georgia," Jay Campbell said.

And except for the 40 days each year when the General Assembly was in session in Atlanta, Phil Campbell Jr. always made it home to spend the night with his family in Watkinsville, even if it meant traversing the entire state in one day. "The year I turned 16 I said, 'You know, Daddy, I'd like to drive for you,' because he always came home every night," Jay Campbell recalled.

His first day on the job, Jay rose in time to deliver his father to the GDA headquarters building in downtown Atlanta by 7:30 a.m. Even though the roads were all two-lane, the 70-mile trip from Watkinsville to Atlanta took just over an hour by car in those days.

That first day was a typical one, which is to say, busy.

"He had a lunch meeting in Calhoun. We were in Thomasville for a meeting that night and back in Watkinsville by midnight," Jay Campbell recalled.

That was more than 600 miles of driving, from one end of the state to the other and back again, in one day.

"When he came in the next morning and said, 'You gonna drive for me?' I said, 'I'm done.""

Phil Campbell Jr.'s drive was rooted in a deep love of agriculture, an industry he championed until his death at age 81 on June 22, 1998.

"He was a real farmer at heart," Jay Campbell said. "I remember him saying one time there was nothing like the sun rising on the blush of green on a sprouted field."

Georgia Department of Revenue is now accepting Timber Tax Credit applications from growers impacted by Hurricane Michael

ATLANTA – On March 1, the Georgia Department of Revenue began accepting applications for a Timber Tax Credit to assist growers in offsetting economic losses incurred during Hurricane Michael in October 2018.

The Georgia General Assembly enacted House Bill 4EX during a special session called by former Gov. Nathan Deal in the wake of the storm last November. Per the bill, eligible timber properties must be located in the disaster area established in Executive Order 11.06.18.01, which includes the following counties: Baker, Bleckley, Brooks, Calhoun, Clay, Colquitt, Decatur, Dodge, Dooly, Dougherty, Early, Grady, Laurens, Lee, Lowndes, Miller, Mitchell, Pulaski, Randolph, Seminole, Sumter, Terrell, Thomas, Tift, Turner, Wilcox and Worth.

Eligible taxpayers may apply electronically for preapproval via the department's online Georgia Tax Center at https://gtc.dor.ga.gov. A corporate, fiduciary, partnership/LLC or individual tax account is required.
