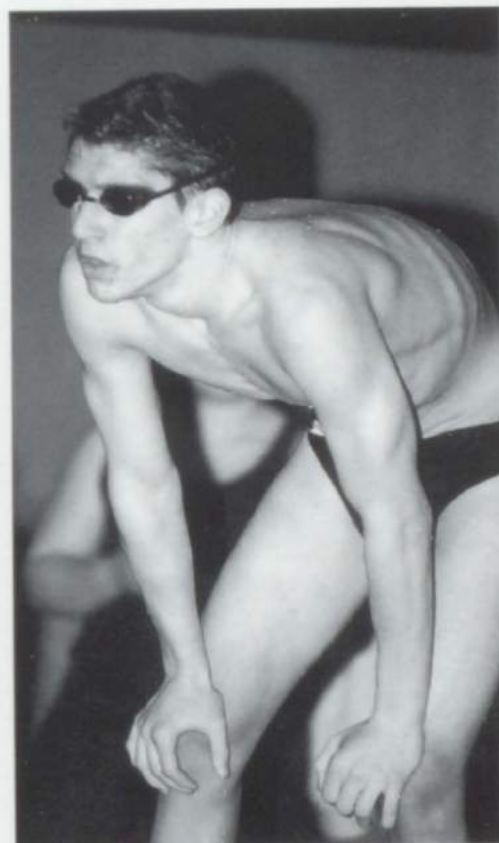
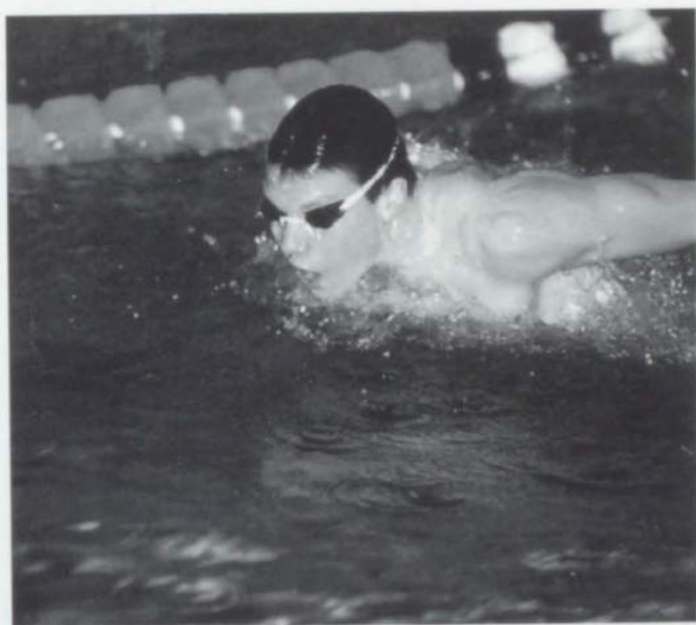


# Swimming
